CHAPTER-1

INCIDENT AND RATE OF COGNIZABLE CRIME IN HIMACHAL PRADESH

1.1 General:

The Himachal Pradesh is a hilly and peaceful State. There are sporadic incidents of crime taking place, but no particular area of any district of this State is notorious for any class or category of crime. There has not been any abnormal fluctuation in the incident of crime in the State.

The crime situation has remained peaceful and well under control during the year 2017 throughout the State of Himachal Pradesh. No alarming increase was noticed under any major head of crime.

1.2. The Parameters for Review and Analysis of Crime:-

The following parameters have been adopted while analyzing the crime for the year 2017:-

- Geographical spread.
- Reasons for commission of crime especially in offences against persons.
- Investigative process followed.
- Recovery of property.
- Profile of criminals.

1.3. Reported Incidents of Cognizable Crimes:

The ten years trends of incident and rate of total cognizable crime under Indian Penal Code (IPC) and Local and Special Laws (2016-2017) is presented in Table-1.2 at the end of the chapter. A total of 17804 cognizable crime cases were reported during the year 2017. These comprise of 13015 cases under IPC and 4789 cases under (SLL) Special & Local Law. (Table-1.1 and Chart-1.1 & 1.2)

FOR THE LAST 10 YEARS (2008-2017)





CHART-1.2

1.4. Crime Trends:

1.4.1. Crime Incidents:

During the year 2017, cases of cognizable crime have increased by 3.2 % (555) as compared to the registration of cognizable crime cases of the corresponding year. The registration in IPC crimes have recorded a decrease of 2.78% and Special & Local Laws crime

have recorded an increase of 24% in 2017 as compared to the previous year 2016.

Total 13015 IPC cases were reported in the State during 2017, as against 13386 cases of 2016 (2.78% decrease). District Kangra, Shimla and Mandi have recorded crime incident between 1500 to 2500 IPC cases in each, district Una and Bilaspur have recorded crime between 1000 to 1500 IPC cases each, Baddi, Chamba, Hamirpur, Kullu, Sirmaur and Solan have recorded crime between 500 to 1000 IPC cases each. The crime in districts Kinnaur, Lahaul & Spiti, Railway & Traffic Unit and CID Unit have remain below the figure of 200 cases. The district wise detailed volume of crime is depicted in the Table-1.3.

1.4.2. District-wise IPC Crime Trends:

The highest occurrence of IPC cases was reported in Kangra (2313 cases) followed by Mandi (1951), Shimla (1810), Una (1119), Bilaspur (1029), Sirmaur (930), Solan (834), Kullu (806), Hamirpur (693), Chamba (648), Baddi (583), Kinnaur (190), Lahaul & Spiti (84), PS CID (12), GRP (11) and Cyber PS (2). The detail of number of districts falling under different ranges with incidents of IPC crimes during the year 2017 are presented in Table-1.3.

1.5. Crime Pattern: (IPC Crimes)

As compared to 2016, this year incidents of Murder, Rape, Robbery, Burglary, Rioting, Grievous Hurt, Assault on women, Cruelty to Women, Accident and other IPC cases have shown a decrease while Attempt to Murder, Culpable Homicide, Kidnapping & Abduction and Theft cases have reported an increase.


1.6. Crime Rate:

The Crime Rate, District wise is presented in Table-1.4. The average IPC Crime Rate in the State for 2017 was 189.8. The highest Crime Rate districts are Bilaspur (269.3) followed by Lahaul & Spiti (266.4) Solan (260.3), Baddi (227.5), Kinnaur (225.4), Shimla (222.5), Una (214.8) and Mandi (195.2), the lowest are found in Kullu

(184.2), Sirmaur (175.4), Kangra (153.5), Hamirpur (152.5) and Chamba (124.9). (Chart-1.3) and Table 1.4.

1.7. Head Wise Analysis of IPC Offences:

The head wise analysis of IPC offences is presented in Table-1.5. The head wise statistics indicates the following trends:-


(i) Murder: (Decrease 1.98 %)

The incidents of murder (99) in 2017 decreased by 1.98% as compared to the previous year 2016. Highest incidents of murder was reported in Kangra (19 cases) district, contributing 0.1 % of the total cases. Other districts which reported more than 10 cases are Shimla (16), Una (13) and Mandi (11). The lowest Incidents of murder are reported in Kullu (9), Baddi, Sirmaur (7 cases each), Solan (5), Bilaspur, Chamba and Kinnaur (4 each). No Incidents under this

head was reported in Hamirpur and Lahaul & Spiti. Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.4.

The analysis of the causes has revealed that no organized gang was operating in the State. In most of these cases, crime is committed due to land disputes or murder for gain or personal enmity. Generally, sudden provocation or minor altercations were the reasons for commission of most of the murders. There was no class or caste factor involved in the commission of murder.


CHART-1.4

Attempt to commit Murder: (Increase 4.5%)

The incidents (69) of Attempt to Commit Murder during this year has increased by 4.5%. The higher Incidents under this head was reported in Kangra (16) followed by Shimla (14), Bilaspur, Una (9 each), Mandi (5), Hamirpur (4), Kullu, Sirmaur (3 each), Chamba, Solan (2 each) and Baddi, Kinnaur (1 each). No Incident under this head was reported in Lahaul & Spiti. Previous 10 years (2008-2017) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.5.


CHART-1.5

(iii). C.H. not Amounting to Murder: (Increase 166.7%)

8 cases of Culpable Homicide not amounting to Murder were reported during 2017, showing an increase of 166.7 percent over the previous year (3 cases). The highest incidents 2 cases each in Shimla, Sirmaur and 1 in Baddi, Kangra, Mandi and Solan was reported. No incidents under this head was reported in remaining districts of the State. Previous 10 years (2008-2017) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.6.



(iv).Rape: (Decrease 1.2%)

Total 249 cases of Rape were reported which has shown a decrease of 1.2 percent during 2017 over previous year 2016 (252 cases). The highest incidents of rape were reported in Mandi (38) followed by Kangra (37) Shimla (29), Sirmaur (26), Bilaspur (25), Kullu, Solan (19 each), Hamirpur (18), Una (14), Baddi, Chamba (10 each), Kinnaur (3) and Lahaul & Spiti (1). Previous 10 years (2008-2017) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1. 7.


CHART-1.7

(v). Kidnapping and Abduction: (Increase 16.9 %)

During the year 2017 a total number of 339 cases of Kidnapping and Abduction were reported with an increase of 16.9% as compared to previous year 2016. The highest incidents were reported in Mandi (62) followed by Shimla (60), Kangra (53), Bilaspur, Sirmaur (29 each), Chamba (23), Kullu (21), Solan, Una (19 each), Hamirpur (11) and Baddi (8). The lowest number of cases was reported in Kinnaur (4) and Lahaul & Spiti (1). Previous 10 years (2008-2017) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.8.

DURING (2008-2017)




(vi). Dacoity

3 cases of Dacoity were reported during the year 2017 in Baddi, Kinnaur and Shimla (1 each) as compared to 3 cases of previous year also. No Incidents under this head were reported in remaining districts of the State. Previous 10 years (2008-2017) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.9.

(vii). Robbery

During the year 2017, 8 cases of Robbery were registered in the State as compared to 11 case of previous year. The highest Incidents were reported in Baddi, Mandi, Shimla (2 each) followed by Bilaspur and Sirmaur (1 each). No case under this head was reported in rest of the districts of the State. Previous 10 years (2008-2017) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.9.

(viii). Burglary: (Decrease 1.08%)

The Incidents of Burglary (549) recorded a decrease with 1.08% during the year 2017 as compared to 2016. The highest number of Burglary cases (106) were reported in Kangra followed by Una (78), Mandi (56), Shimla (54), Solan (43), Sirmaur (39), Baddi (37), Hamirpur (35), Bilaspur (33), Kullu (31). The remaining districts have reported less than 30 cases under this head. Highest crime rate was 22.5% in Kinnaur district and the lowest at 3.2% in Lahaul & Spiti as against the State average of 8.0%. Previous 10 years (2008-2017) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.10.

(ix). Theft: (increase 23.75%)

The Incidents of Theft (594) recorded an increase of 23.75% during the year 2017 over the previous year. Shimla has reported highest incidents (82 cases) followed by Solan (77), Kangra (75), Una (68), Baddi (58), Mandi and Sirmaur (56 each) and remaining districts have reported less than 50 cases. No incident under this head was reported in Lahaul & Spiti. The highest crime rate was in Solan (24.0) and the lowest (1.3) in Chamba as against the

State average of 2.7. Previous 10 years (2008-2017) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.11.

INCIDENTS OF BURGLARY DURING (2008-2017)





CHART-1.11
INCIDENTS OF THEFT DURING (2008-2017)




(x). Riots: (Decrease 14.2%)

Incidents of Riots (339) registered during the year 2017 recorded a decrease of 14.2% over the previous year 2016. The highest incidents was reported in Kangra (72) followed by Sirmaur (47), Shimla (45), Baddi, Mandi, Una (32 each), Bilaspur (22), Solan (19) and Chamba (17). The lowest number of cases were reported in Hamirpur (14), and Kullu (7). No Incidents under this head were

reported in Kinnaur and Lahaul & Spiti. Previous 10 years (2008-2017) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.12.

(xi). Grievous Hurt (decrease 8.7%)

A total number of 339 cases under head Grievous Hurt were reported during 2017 recorded a decrease of 8.7% over the previous year 2016. Kangra has reported the highest Incidents (80) under head 'Grievous Hurt' followed by Sirmaur (41), Chamba (38), Una (37), Mandi (33), Shimla (28), Hamirpur (25), Bilaspur (18), Kullu (16) and Solan (10). The least number of cases were reported in Baddi (7) and Kinnaur (6). No Incident under this head was reported in Lahaul & Spiti. Previous 10 years (2008-2017) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.13.

INCIDENTS OF HURT DURING (2008-2017)






CHART-1.14

(xii). Dowry Death

Only 3 cases under this head were reported each in Baddi, Mandi and Solan as compare to 3 cases of previous year. Previous 10 years (2008-2017) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.14.

(xiii). Assault on Women: (Decrease 3.2 %)


397 cases were reported during the year, showing a decrease of 3.2% over the previous year. 80 cases were reported in Kangra followed by Mandi (64), Shimla (48), Sirmaur, Una (38 each), Bilaspur (37), Hamirpur, Kullu (25 each), Chamba (15), Solan (12) and Baddi (7). The lowest number of cases were reported in Lahaul & Spiti, GRP (1 each). Previous 10 years (2008-2017) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.15.

(xiv). Cruelty to women: (Decrease 10.7%)

191 cases were reported during the year, showing a decrease of 10.7 % over the previous year. 44 cases were reported in Mandi followed by Kangra (31), Una (25), Sirmaur (20), Bilaspur (16), Shimla (15), Baddi, Kullu (12 each), Chamba (7), Hamirpur (5) and Solan (4). No Incidents under this head were reported in Kinnaur and Lahaul & Spiti. Previous 10 years (2008-2017) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.16.


INCIDENTS OF CRUELTY TO WOMEN DURING (2008-2017)



(xv). Accidents: (increase 1.07%)

3119 cases were reported during the year, showing decrease of 1.07% as compared to the previous year. 524 cases were reported in Kangra followed by Shimla (480), Mandi (424) Sirmaur (305), Una (292), Solan (252), Bilaspur (196), Baddi (179), Kullu (168), Hamirpur (120) and Chamba (118). The lowest number of cases were reported in Kinnaur (34), Lahaul & Spiti (25) and GRP (2). Previous 10 years (2008-2017) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.17.

(xvi). Other IPC Crimes: (Decrease 5.2 %)

Cognizable IPC Crime which do not fall under any of the above specified categories are termed as "Other IPC Crime". As many as 6709 other IPC crime accounting for 51.6% of the total IPC crimes were registered in the State during 2017.

Incidents of IPC Crime (Head-wise) along with percentage share is presented in Table-1.6. Ten year trend in percentage change (head-wise) is presented in Table-1.7. District-wise and head wise details of IPC offences are available in Table-1.8 and Table-1.9. Previous 10 years (2008-2017) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.18 and percentage of Other IPC cases against IPC cases for the last 10 years is presented in Chart. 1.19.

INCIDENTS OF OTHER IPC DURING (2008-2017)



IPC FOR THE LAST 10 YEAR (2008-2017)




1.8 Crime Under Local and Special Laws:

A list of Special and Local Laws is available at Annexure-1. Incidents and rate of cognizable Local & Special Law crimes during 2008 to 2017 are presented in Table-1.10.

A total of 4789 cognizable Local & Special Law (SLL) crimes were registered in the State during 2017. The head-wise percentage distribution of various cognizable crimes under Local & Special Law for 10 years from 2008 to 2017 is presented in Table-1.11. There is an increase of 24% in registration over the previous year.

The crime head-wise Incidents and rate of cognizable Local & Special Law crimes in different districts are presented in Table-1.12.

Incidents of Local & Special Law cases under important Special and Local Laws is elaborated below:-

1.8.1 Head Wise Analysis of SLL Offences:

(i). Arms Act

During 2017, 10 cases of Arms Act have been registered. The highest Incidents (4) under this head was reported in Kangra followed by Hamirpur (2), Bilaspur, Kinnaur, Sirmaur and Una (1 each). No case under this act was reported in rest of the districts of the State.

(ii). Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act (ND&PS) : (Increase 8.7%)


The total cases i.e registered (1010) under ND&PS Act showed an increase of 8.7% over 2016. Cases under this act constituted 21% against the total Local & Special Law reported cases during 2017. The highest Incidents (245) under this head were reported in Kangra followed by Kullu (134), Shimla (131), Mandi (127), Una (81), Chamba (60), Sirmaur (50), Bilaspur (49), Hamirpur (39), Kinnaur (31), Solan (30), Baddi (22), CID (8), and Lahaul & Spiti (3).

The main concentration on the incidents registered under this act remains in Kangra, Kullu and Shimla with 50.5 % of the total registered cases. The analysis reveals that the main sources/ areas of drugs are Kullu, Mandi, Kangra, Shimla and Chamba. Further, carriers of contraband are mostly agriculturists, laborers and poor people.

Of the total persons apprehended under this Act, 86% belong to Himachal Pradesh and 14% were outsiders. Study of age profile shows that mostly adults between 18-30 years of age are involved (51.6%). About 37.3% were in the age group of 30-45 years. Above 45 years were 10.6%.

The participation of children below 18 years is negligible (0.4%). Only sixteen foreigners (male 15, female 1) were involved in this activity. Previous 10 years (2008-2017) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.21.

(iii). Gambling Act


The Incidents (320) under the Gambling Act has been registered during, 2017. The highest cases (97) were reported in Una followed by Shimla (58), Baddi (39), Kullu (34), Kangra (32), Sirmaur

(20), Kinnaur (12), Chamba (8), Mandi (7) and Solan (6). The lowest incidents under this Act was seen in Lahaul & Spiti (5) and Hamirpur, (2). No Incident under this head was reported in Bilaspur.

(iv) Excise Act: (Increase 36.6%)

The incidents (2795) under the Excise Act showed an increase of 36.6% over 2016. Cases under this act contributed 58.4% against the total Local & Special Law (SLL) reported cases during 2017. The highest incidents (669) cases were reported in Kangra followed by Shimla (384), Mandi (319), Una (311), Chamba (244), Kullu (182), Baddi (138), Sirmaur (131), Solan (120), Bilaspur (95) and Hamirpur (90). The lowest incidents under this act was seen in Lahaul-Spiti (56), Kinnaur (51) and CID (5). Previous 10 years (2008-2017) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.22.

DETECTION UNDER EXCISE ACT DURING (2008-2017)




□ DETECTION UNDER EXCISE ACT

(v). Forest Act: (Increase 7.6%)

The incidents (169) under the Forest Act showed an increase of 7.6% over 2016. Sirmaur district has reported the highest incidents (40) followed by Una (20), Kangra, Kullu (19 each), Mandi (18), Chamba (17), Shimla (11), Baddi (8), Bilaspur (6) and Solan (4). The lowest incidents under this act were seen in Lahaul & Spiti (3), Hamirpur (2) Kinnaur and CID (1 each).

The analysis reveals that majority of cases have been registered in Sirmaur, Una, Kangra, Kullu, Mandi and Chamba. Therefore cases involve in encroachment on forest land, forest produce such as timber, fuel wood, Guchhi, Resin, Walnut Bark, Brich Bark, Brahmi leaves and other herbal plants etc. Previous 10 years (2008-2017) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.23.

(vi). Protection of Civil Rights Act.

No case under this Act was reported in the State. However, previous 10 years (2008-2017) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.24.

(vii) SC/ST (Prevention of Atrocities) Act.

91 cases were registered under the SC/ST Prevention of Atrocities Act as against 102 cases of previous year. The highest numbers of (23) cases were reported in Mandi followed by Kangra (20), Shimla (13), Hamirpur (9), Bilaspur, Una (7 each) and Kullu (5). The lowest incidents under this act was seen in Solan (4), Chamba, Kinnaur and Sirmaur (1 each). No incidents under this act were reported in Baddi and Lahaul & Spiti.


The analysis reveals that crime under this head is high in Mandi, Kangra, Shimla Hamirpur, Bilaspur and Una. The most common reason for registering cases under these acts is a feeling of being hurt when one is called by derogatory name. This comprises 67% of the total cases registered. 28% of the cases were registered because of land and water disputes. 3% were registered due to not

allowing access to temples. The remaining were for election related matters and miscellaneous reasons. Previous 10 years (2008-2017) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.24.

(viii) Other Local & Special Law Cases: (including Wild life Act, PDP Act, EC Act etc.)

394 Local & Special Law cases reported under the acts mentioned above. These have shown an increase of 28% over the previous year. The highest incident was reported from district Kangra (84).

During 2017 total number of 4789 cognizable crimes were reported in the State under various heads of (SLL) Local & Special Laws which shows an increase of 24% of the previous year.

It is observed that 8 specified crime heads accounted for 92 % of the total SLL crimes while the remaining 8% were clubbed as other SLL crimes. Previous 10 years (2008-2017) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.25

CASES DURING (2008-2017)










CHAPTER-2

INCIDENCE OF CRIME AGAINST PROPERTY AND PERSONS IN HIMACHAL PRADESH

2.1 Crime against Property:

Offences under this head include the cases of **Theft**, **Burglary**, **Robbery & Dacoity**. The head wise analysis of crime against property has been done for the year 2017 and given as under:-

(i) Theft and Burglary:

During the year 2017, 594 cases of theft and 549 cases of burglary were registered which showed an increase of 114 cases in theft and 39 cases in burglary over the year 2016. The cases of both these heads have been categorized under major head namely:- Auto theft, theft of Cash and Jewellery, Cable theft, theft of electronic component and theft of other materials.

Incidences of theft cases is concentrated mostly in the 4 districts i.e Kangra, Mandi, Una and Shimla. The analysis further shows that most of the cases occurred in rural areas, Kangra being an exception where 71 % of the persons involved in these crimes were local residents.

As far as the age profile goes, 59 % of those involved in theft cases are in the age group of 18 to 30 years. 41% involved in burglary are also of the same age group.

(ii) Robbery:

During the year 2017, 8 cases of robbery were found registered which showed a decrease of 3 cases over previous year. Highest incidences under this head was reported in Baddi, Mandi, Shimla (2 each) followed by Bilaspur and Sirmaur (1 each). No case under this head was reported in rest of the districts.

(iii). Dacoity:

03 cases of dacoity were registered in Baddi, Kinnaur & Shimla.

2.2 Value of Property Stolen and Recovered:

During the year 2017, property valued 1802.0 lakhs was reported stolen in 1156 cases as compared to 1956.5 lakhs in 1049 cases for the corresponding year.


Property worth Rs. 854.71 lakhs was recovered during 2017. The percentage of recovery is 46.5%. The value of property recovered showed an increase of 3% over the previous year.

The details of property stolen and recovered along with percentage of recovery from the last 10 years (2008 to 2017) and variation are given in Table 2.1.

The Chart 2.1 depicts the value of property stolen and recovered during 2008 to 2017.

VALUE OF PROPERTY STOLEN AND RECOVERED DURING THE PERIOD 2008-2017



Shimla reported the highest value of property stolen (Rs. 3,35,45,787/-) followed by Baddi (Rs. 2,67,85,505/-, Solan (Rs.2,53,18,105/-), Kangra (Rs. 2,02,07,756/-), Una (Rs. 1,48,59,590/-), Sirmaur (Rs.1,30,88,214/-),Mandi (Rs. 1,17,35,408/-) and Bilaspur (Rs. 1,03,98,795/-). Rest of districts reported less than 1 crore value of property stolen.


The highest value of recovery was seen in Shimla (Rs. 1,58,06,065/-) followed by Solan (Rs. 1,47,91,554/-), Una (Rs. 1,07,79,557/-) and Baddi (Rs. 1,02,74,283/-).

In Lahual & Spiti district 100% of the stolen property was recovered followed by Una (72.5%), Solan (58.4%), Mandi (58.3%) and Chamba (57.3%).

2.3 Category of Offences (Incidence and Value):

Among 4 different types of property crimes, the maximum value of property (Rs.911.14 Lakhs) and share (50.6%) were seen under head Theft. The minimum value of Rs. 12.83 Lakhs and share (0.7%) was seen under the category of crime under Robbery.

The maximum value of property was recovered in Theft cases (67%) followed by Burglary (24.5%), Dacoity (97%) and Robbery (64%). The Dacoity cases have shown a high recovery percentage (100%) followed by Robbery (50%), Theft (47.5%) and Burglary (27%). The crime head-wise value of property stolen and recovered over the last 10 years (2008 to 2017) is presented in Table 2.4.

2.4 Nature of Property:

Nature of property under head theft and burglary have been classified into four different categories viz. Auto Theft, Theft of Cash and Jewellery, Cable Theft, Theft of electronic items, Chain Snatching/other snatching. Properties other than the above specified categories are clubbed as Other Theft. The category wise number of cases in which property was found stolen and recovered therein and percentage thereof has been calculated and presented in Table 2.5.

CRIME HEAD WISE PERCENTAGE OF PROPERTY RECOVERED DURING THE YEAR 2017





(WORKED OUT) -2017






2.6 Crime against Persons:-

The crime against persons includes 10 different types of crime heads viz. Murder, Culpable Homicide not amounting to Murder, Attempt to Murder, Rape, Kidnapping & Abduction, Hurt, Rioting, Cruelty to Women, Molestation and Dowry Deaths.

The analysis reveals that total 2755 cases of crime against persons have occurred during 2017 which shows 21.2% of the total IPC crime. The highest percentage of crime against persons over the total IPC recorded in Una with 35.5 % followed by Sirmaur (35.1%), Solan (25.3%), Kinnaur (24.2%), Chamba (22.7%), Kangra (21.8%), Hamirpur (18.5%), Lahaulu & Spiti (17.9%). The district-wise detail has been calculated and presented in Table 2.7. The district-wise incidents and their percentage over the IPC crime is depicted in Chart 2.5.

CRIME AGAINST PERSONS FOR THE 10 YEARS (2008-2017)




The incidences of crime against persons have been recorded highest in Kangra (504) followed by Una (397), Sirmaur (326), Shimla (320), Mandi (291), Solan (211), Bilaspur (160), Chamba (147), Hamirpur (128), Kullu (112), Baddi (97), Kinnaur (46), Lahaul & Spiti

(15) and GRP (1) The District-wise detail has been calculated and presented in Table 2.8.

The head-wise comparative analysis of incidences of crime against persons for the last 10 years (2008 to 2018) has been reviewed. During 2017, 2755 incidences have been recorded which showed an increase of 650 cases over the previous year. The head-wise detailed figures for the last 10 years are depicted in Table 2.9. Chart 2.6 shows the total crime against persons and its percentage over the total IPC crime.

The head-wise reported incidences of crime against persons and its review over the previous year has been analyzed which is given as under:-

(i) Murder:

During the year 2017, 99 incidences of 'Murder' were reported which showed a decrease of 2 cases over the previous year. Analysis of the cases have revealed that no organized gang was operating in the State. In most of these cases, crime was committed due to land disputes or murder for gain or personal enmity. Generally, sudden provocation or minor altercation was the reason for commission of most of the murders. There was no class or caste factor involved in the commission of murder.

(ii) Attempt to Murder:

69 incidences of 'Attempt to Murder' were reported during the year 2017 against the annual average of about 64 cases. The motive for the commission of this crime is also the same as mentioned under head 'Murder'

(iii) C.H. not amounting to Murder:

8 incidences of "C.H. not amounting to Murder" were reported during the year 2017 which showed an increase of 5 cases over the previous year.

(iv) Rape:

249 cases of "Rape" were reported during the year 2017 which showed a decrease of 3 cases over the previous year.

(v) Kidnapping and Abduction:-

During 2017, 339 cases were registered which showed an increase of 49 cases over the previous year. The analysis shows that about 51.6% cases of "Kidnapping & Abduction" are reported in Shimla, Hamirpur and Mandi. The remaining 48.4% cases were reported in rest districts of the State.

(vi) Grievous Hurt:

Total 339 incidences of "Grievous Hurt" were reported during 2017. The analysis shows that about 46.9% incidences of "Grievous Hurt" are reported in Kangra, Chamba and Sirmaur. The remaining 53.1% cases were reported in the rest districts of the State.

(vii) Rioting:

During the year 2017, 339 incidences of "Rioting" were reported in the State against 395 cases of previous year which showed a decrease of 56 cases over the year 2016. The analysis shows that about 48.4% incidences of rioting are reported in Kangra, Sirmaur and Shimla. The remaining 51.6% cases were reported in the rest districts of the State.

(viii) Cruelty to Women:

A total of 191 cases of "Cruelty to Women" were reported in the State during the year 2017 thus showing a decrease of 23 cases over the year 2016. The incident under this head has been reviewed in detail in the separate chapter "Crime against Women".

(ix) Assault on women:

During the year 2017, 397 incidences of "Molestation" were reported in the State as against the 434 incidences of previous year which showed a decrease of 13 cases over the year 2016. The cases under this head have been reviewed in detail in the separate chapter "Crime against Women"

(x) Dowry Deaths:

During the year 2017, 03 cases of "Dowry Deaths" were reported in Baddi, Mandi and Solan (01 each) against 03 cases of previous year, 2016. The incidences under this head have been reviewed in detail in the separate chapter "Crime against Women".


2.7 Overall Review of Crime against Person:

The overall review on the incidences of crime against persons are more in Kangra, Una, Shimla and Mandi as compared to the other districts of the State. The reasons for commission of offences under this category are family disputes, land disputes, enmity with neighbours/villagers, domestic violence & sudden provocation.

Some of the facts that have come out during the study review are:-

- (i) Offences of murder have taken place in the entire State with no specific concentration.
- (ii) 91% of the persons involved are locals
- (iii) 1.1% of the accused in this crime are in the age-group below 18 years, 52% of the persons involved in the commission of this crime are in the age group of 18 to 30 years, 34% belong to the category of 30-45 years and the remaining 12% are more than 45 years in age.

CHAPTER-3

TRENDS IN DISPOSAL OF IPC CRIMES AND SLL CRIMES BY POLICE AND COURTS

3.1 Disposal by Police


3.1.1 Cases under IPC:

During 2017 total number of 16092 cases including cases pending from the previous years were under investigation. Out of these, approximately 12069 cases were disposed by the police during the year and 4023 cases remain pending for investigation.

Table-3.1 presents the details of crime head wise police disposal during 2017. Tables-3.2 & 3.3 give district wise details of disposal and percentage of disposal respectively. The percentage and type of disposal of under investigation (IPC) cases by police during 2017 is depicted in Chart-3.1.

3.1.2 Pendency:

On an average, 25% cases remained under investigation. In the following districts, pendency was the highest and the disposal lowest:-

3.1.3 Case under SLL:

The disposal of SLL cases by police under different crime heads is available at Table-3.4. of the total 5672 cases (including pending cases from the previous year) pending investigation, police disposed 78.5 % cases. Chart-3.3 presents the type of disposal of SLL cases.

BY POLICE DURING 2017





DISPOSAL OF SLL CASES BY POLICE (PENDENCY PERCENTAGE) DURING -2017 DISTRICT WISE




3.2 Disposal By Courts

3.2.1 Cases under IPC:

Disposal of IPC cases by the courts during 2017 is available in Table 3.7. During 2017 there were 88368 cases pending trial (including the pending cases from the previous years). 81742 of IPC cases remained pending trial at end of the year. The percentage of disposals during the year was 5.79% (excluding cases compound/withdrawn by court).

The District wise disposal figures available in Table-3.8 and percentage of disposal is available in Table-3.9. The highest pendency percentage of cases is seen in Kangra (98.3%). The largest number of cases are also pending trial in Kangra (19548) which has a pendency of 24% of state level. Chart-3.5 depicts percentage disposal of IPC cases by the courts during 2017.

BY COURTS DURING-2017.




3.2.2 Cases under SLL:-

Head wise disposal of SLL cases by the courts during 2017 is available in Table-3.10. There were 24561 cases pending trial (including the pending cases from the previous years) at the beginning of 2017. Cases which remained pending trial at end of the year were 21058. The percentage of disposals is 14%.

DISPOSAL OF (IPC) CASES BY POLICE DURING 2017



DISPOSAL OF (SLL) CASES BY POLICE DURING 2017





CONVICTED CASES (IPC) DURING 2017



MAP-3.4 CONVICTED CASES (SLL) DURING 2017



CHAPTER-4

CRIMES AGAINST WOMEN

4.1 General:

Crime which are directed specifically against women are characterized as Crime against Women. They may be broadly classified under following two categories:-

1. Crimes against Women identified under the Indian Penal Code (IPC)

- (i) Murder Sec 302,303 IPC)
- (ii). Dowry Deaths (Sec304B IPC)
- (iii) Abetment to Commit Suicide (Sec. 306 IPC)
- (iv) Acid Attack
- (v) Cruelty to Women (Sec. 498A IPC)
- (vi) Kidnapping & Abduction (Sec. 363,366, IPC)
- (vii) Rape
- (viii) Attempt to Commit Rape
- (ix) Assault on Women with intend to outrage her modesty Sec.354 IPC)
- (x) Insult to the modesty of Women (Sec. 509 IPC)

2. Crimes against Women Identified under the Special and Local Laws(SLL)

Although all laws are not gender specific, the provision of law affecting women significantly have been reviewed periodically and amendments carried out to keep pace with the emerging requirements. Some acts which have special provisions to safeguard women and their interests are

- (i) Immoral Traffic (Prevention) Act
- (ii) Dowry Prohibition Act, 1961
- (iii) The Child Marriage Restrain Act.
- (iv) Protection of women from Domestic violence
- (v) Sati Prevention Act.

The Crimes against Women are being closely monitored in the State. Several measures have been undertaken to tackle this social menace. On one hand, special attention is being paid towards prevention of crimes against women by increased police vigil and by harnessing the resources of the community.

Crime against women has minor increase during the year 2017 in comparison to the previous year, 2016. However, last 10 years annual average of crime against women is 1404. During the year 2016, 1756 cases of crime against women have been registered in the state. As compared to 10 years state average, this increase is due to the fact that in past the women usually hesitated to report the unfortunate incidents, which took place with them and also due to change of law. But now on account of increased awareness and change in social values, ethos and social reassurances being provided by the society, free registration of cases, opening of Women Police Stations and Suvidha Yojna started by the HP Police Department, women are more often coming forward to report the offences taking place against them.

HP Police Department has initiated many steps in the recent years to ensure better police response to the malaise. Women Police Stations have been opened in all districts except Kinnaur and Lahaul & Spiti to monitor quick disposal of cases of crime against women. A Women Crime Unit has also been constituted at State CID Hdqrs. 02 AHTU's have also been established in Shimla & Kangra in first phase. No particular area is prone to crime against women in the state. No special organized gang is operative in the state to commit crime against women. In a nutshell, a complete sense of security is prevailing among women folk and they are performing their daily chores without any fear.

4.2 Incidents of Crime against Women:

Head wise incidents of reported Crimes against Women during 2016 and 2017 along with percentage variation are given below has been calculated and presented in Table 4.1.

The cases of assault on women with intent to outrage her modesty and cruelty to women together constitute the largest chunk of crime against women (47.1%). There were substantial number of instances (20%) of rape and (19.4 %) Kidnapping and abduction of women and girls.

The district wise incidents and rate of crimes against women during 2017 is presented in Table 4.2 and Chart 4.3 and Chart 4.4.

WOMEN DURING 2017




DURING 2017






CHART 4.4

From the analysis of Crime against Women reported in districts, it is seen that cases of Kidnapping and Abduction, Attempt to Commit Rape, Insult to the modesty of women, Immoral Trafficking against women are reported more in the State during the year 2017. Such occurrence happened in Kangra, Mandi, Shimla, Sirmaur and Bilaspur. The cases of murder reported to be highest in Kangra, Mandi and Bilaspur.

The district which indicates the lowest incidents of crime against women are Lahaul-Spiti (05) Kinnaur (13), Baddi (39), Solan (51), Chamba (55) and Hamirpur (71).

4.3 Head wise incidents of Crime against Women:

The brief explanation of head wise status of Crime against Women during 2017 is given as under:

(i) Murder: (decrease 25%)

Incidents of Murder cases (21) registered during the year 2017 showed a decrease of 25% over the previous year. Kangra, reported the highest incidents of Murder (06) under this head followed by Mandi, Bilaspur (03 each) Baddi, Sirmaur, Una (02 each), Chamba, Shimla and Solan (01each). No incidents under this head was reported in rest of the districts.

Reasons:-

- 1. Property disputes amongst family and relationship to capture the property of women.
- 2. Land disputes, Enmity with the villagers or other family members.
- 3. Domestic violence, Torture by In-laws due to various reasons.
- 4. Illicit love affairs especially in hotels etc to destroy/elope the evidences after rape.
- 5. Sudden provocation during scuffle.

(ii) Culpable Homicide:

Under this head only one incident was reported in Lahaul & Spiti in the year 2017 throughout the state.

(iii). Rape: (Decrease 1.2%)

Total 249 cases of Rape were reported which has shown a minor decrease of 1.2% during 2017 over previous year 2016 (252 cases). The highest incidents of rape were reported in Mandi (38) followed by Kangra (37), Shimla (29), Sirmaur (26), Bilaspur (25), Kullu, Solan (19 each), Hamirpur (18) Una (14), Baddi, Chamba (10 each), Kinnaur (03) and Lahaul & Spiti (01).

Reasons:-

- 1. Illicit love affairs, intimacy and friendship between both parties and discloser of affairs.
- 2. Alluring for marriage and later on due to refusal of parents, refusal for marriage, resulting in registration of cases.
- 3. Due to enmity, fake registration of rape cases.
- 4. Consensual relationship reached in firstly with the consent and later on when caught.
- 5 Registration of minor rape cases are committed forcibly.

(iv). Dowry Deaths:

Under this head 03 incidents were reported in Baddi, Mandi and Solan. No incidents under this head was reported in rest of the districts.

(v). Kidnapping & Abduction: (Increase 20.3%)

During the year 2017, 242 incidents of Kidnapping & Abduction were registered which showed an increase of 20.3% over the previous year. Mandi reported the highest incidents (41 cases) under this crime head followed by Kangra (40 cases), Shimla (36), Sirmaur (26), Bilaspur (25), Chamba (18), Kullu (17), Una (13), Solan (11), Hamirpur (07), Baddi (04), Kinnaur (03) and Lahaul-Spiti district (01).

(vi) Assault on women with intend to outrage her modesty (Sec.354) (Decrease 3.2%)

397 cases of Assault on women with intend to outrage her modesty were registered during the year 2017 showed a decrease of 3.2% over the previous year. Kangra recorded the highest (80 cases) followed by Mandi (64), Shimla (48), Una, Sirmaur (38 each), Bilaspur

(37) Hamirpur, Kullu (25 each, Chamba (15), Solan (12), Baddi (07), Kinnaur (06) and GRP, Lahaul & Spiti (01 each).

(vii) Abetment to Commit Suicide: (Decrease 16.7%)

The decreasing trend is seen under this head with 16.7% over the previous year. The highest number of cases were registered in Kangra (16) followed by Mandi (13), Hamirpur (06), Una (05), Baddi, Bilaspur, Chamba (03 each), Shimla, Sirmaur (02 each), Kinnaur and Lahaul Spiti (01 each). No incident was reported under this head in Solan district.

(viii) Cruelty to Women: (Decrease 10.7%)

191 cases of Cruelty to Women were registered during the year 2017. This head showed a decrease of 10.7 % over the previous year. The analysis revealed that highest number of cases (44) were registered in Mandi followed by Kangra (31), Una (25), Sirmaur (20), Bilaspur (16), Shimla (15), Baddi, Kullu (12 each), Chamba (07), Hamirpur (05) Solan (04) and. No incidents was reported under this head in Kinnaur and Lahaul & Spiti.

Reasons:

- 1. Torture of married women for the purpose of dowry, her ill health etc.
- 2. Harassment and torture of women by her in laws i.e. husband, mother in law, father in law etc.
- 3. Harassment of women in family that she is not capable to do the house hold and agriculture activities.
- 4. Harassment/torture of women by husband due to the illicit relationship of the husband with other woman in the family or relationship.
- 5. Torture/harassment of women by husband or other male member of the family under the influence of liquor.
- 6. Love marriage without the consent of the other family members i.e. father in law and mother in law of the victims.

(ix) Insult to the modesty of Women (Sec. 509 IPC): (Increase: 4%)

The increasing trend is seen under this head by 4% over the previous year. The highest number of cases were registered in Kangra (18), followed by Mandi (15), Bilaspur, Hamirpur (06 each), Kullu (04) Una (02) and Chamba (01). No case was reported under this head in rest of the districts.

(x) Immoral Trafficking (Increase 14.3%)

08 cases of Immoral Trafficking were registered during the year 2017, showed an increase of 14.3% over the previous year. The analysis revealed that highest number of cases (04) were registered in Kangra followed by, Shimla (02) and Sirmaur, Solan (01 each). No case under this head was reported in rest of the districts of the State during the year.

INCIDENTS OF CRIMES AGAINST WOMEN DURING-2017



CHAPTER-5

5.1 General:

Includes violations under certain sections of Indian Panel Code. For the purpose of this chapter, the following categories of crimes involving child victims have been included under this head:-

- i). Murder
- ii). Infanticide
- iii). Exposure and Abandonment
- iv). Rape
- v). Kidnapping and abduction
- vi). Assault on Women
- vii). Abetment to Suicide
- viii). Protection of Children from sexual Offences
- ix). Juvenile Justice (Care & Protection of Children) Act, 2000
- x). Prohibition of Child Marriage Act
- xi). Other crimes committed against Children

5.2 Trends of Crime against Children:

Table 5.1 and Chart 5.1 depicts the percentage distribution of crimes against children during 2017.

AGAINST CHILDREN DURING 2017







CHART 5.2

5.3 Incident:

Table 5.1 shows the incidents and rate of Crime against Children, district wise including its rank.

Totally 527 cases were reported in the State under various sections of IPC. "Kidnapping & Abduction" constituted the largest category 258 cases (49%) were reported during the year. The maximum number of 'Kidnapping & Abduction' cases were reported in Shimla district (47 cases), followed by Kangra, (41), Mandi (36), Sirmaur (27), Chamba (21), Kullu (20), Solan (16), Una (15), Bilaspur (14), Hamirpur (10), Baddi (07), Kinnaur (03) and Lahaul Spiti (01).

The second most prevalent Crime against Children was Rape with POCSO Act which accounted for 142 cases (26.9%). The "Rape" cases were reported highest in Districts Kangra (27), followed by Shimla (20), Mandi (18), Bilaspur, Sirmaur (15 each), Kullu (12), Hamirpur (10), Solan (08), Una (06), Chamba (05), Baddi (04) and Kinnaur, Lahaul-Spiti (01 each).

Total 09 cases {Baddi, Shimla 02 each, Bilaspur, Kullu, Sirmaur, Solan and Una 01 each were reported in the State under head "Murder" of Children.

The incident and percentage contribution of State regarding crimes against children head and district wise presented in Table.5.2.

CHAPTER-6

ARRESTS

6.1 ARRESTS:

Total 18441 persons (13082 under IPC & 5359 under Local & Special Laws) were arrested during the year 2017 in 17804 cases (13015 IPC + 4789 Local & Special Laws) which is a decrease of 20.3 % when compared with the arrests of 23137 persons ((18088 under IPC & 5049 under Local & Special Laws) in 2016.

(i) PERSONS ARRESTED UNDER IPC CASES:

During the year 2017 as many as 13082 persons were arrested in 13015 cases registered under IPC as against 18088 persons in 2016. Chart 6.1 depicts persons arrested under IPC crimes during 2015-2017.

PERSONS ARRESTED UNDER IPC DURING 2015-2017




Table 6.1 gives details of arrests made under IPC crime during the last 3 years 2015-2017.

Table 6.2 gives age-group wise and gender wise break up of persons arrested in districts.

Kangra tops in arresting 2170 persons in 2313 cases during 2017 followed by Shimla by arresting 1824 persons in 1810 cases and Sirmaur by arresting 1329 persons in 930 cases.

In Bilaspur 1029 cases were registered and 1529 persons arrested. District Solan has registered 834 cases and arrested 1045 persons, Kinnaur 232 persons were arrested against the registration of 190 cases during the year 2017. The details of persons arrested under IPC crime head wise & gender wise are presented in Table 6.3.

Chart 6.2 depicts age group wise persons arrested under IPC crime during the years 2017 and Chart 6.3 depicts district wise persons arrested under IPC crime cases during the year 2017 in descending order.

DURING 2017





(ii) Persons arrested under SLL cases:

PERSONS ARRESTED UNDER SLL CRIMES DURING 2015-2017



Kangra has arrested the highest number (1180) persons with 1073 cases registered during the year 2017 followed by Shimla by arresting (1178) persons in (664) cases, Kullu (657) persons in (407) cases and Una (552) in (538) cases registered.

Sirmaur has registered 264 cases with 356 persons arrested, Solan 187 cases with 228 persons arrested and Bilaspur has registered 203 cases with 248 persons arrested.

DISTRICT WISE PERSONS ARRESTED UNDER SLL CRIMES DURING 2017








CHAPTER-7

CRIME AGAINST WEAKER SECTIONS OF SOCIETY (SC/ST)

7.1 General:

A complete harmony among different sections of society is prevailing in the State. No particular area of the State is notorious for the commission of offences against the SCs/STs. However sporadic incidents of violence against the members of these communities do take place off and on.

India is a welfare State. It is committed to the welfare and development of its people in general and of vulnerable sections in particular. Equality of status and opportunity to all citizens of the country are guaranteed by the constitution of India which also provides that no individual shall be discriminated against on grounds of religion, caste or sex. Fundamental rights and specific provisions, namely, Articles 38, 39 and 46 in the constitution of India stand testimony to the commitment of the State towards its people. The strategy of the State is to secure distributive justice and allocation of resources to support programmes for social, economic and educational to advancement of the weaker section in general and those of Scheduled Casts and Scheduled Tribes.

7.2 Constitutional Rights:

The Indian Constitution vide Article 15 lays down that no citizen shall on grounds of religion, race, sex or place of birth be subjected to any disability or restriction. It also guarantees that every citizen shall have equality of status and opportunity.

7.3. Legal Rights:

To uphold the constitutional mandate and to safeguard the interests of this section of the society, special social enactments have come into force from time to time including privileges by way of reservations for them.

The major legal enactment sponsored by Centre is:

- (i) Protection of Civil Rights Act, 1955; and
- (ii) SC/ST (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989

The Protection of Civil Rights Act, 1955 was enacted in furtherance of Article 17 of the constitution by which untouchability was abolished and its practice in any form is forbidden. Further, in order to check and deter crimes against SC/STs by persons belonging to other communities, the Scheduled Casts and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989 was brought into force from 30th January, 1990. These enactments have extended the positive discrimination in favour of SCs and STs to the field of criminal law in as much as they prescribe penalties that are more stringent than for corresponding offences under Indian Penal Code (IPC) and other laws.

In addition, in pursuance of the Constitution 65th Amendment Act, 1990, National Commission for SCs and STs was constituted w.e.f. 12th March, 1992 with wide functions and powers of Civil Courts to take up matters which are of vital importance for socio-economic development of SCs and STs.

7.4 The Crimes identified under the Indian Penal Code (IPC) and Local & Special Laws):

- (i) Murder
- (ii) Rape
- (iii) Kidnapping & Abduction
- (iv) Dacoity
- (v) Robbery

- (vi) Arson
- (vii) Hurt
- (viii) PCR Act
- (ix) SC/ST(POA) Act
- (x) Others (Other classified IPC crimes)

7.4.1 Under Special & Local Laws (SLL):

- (i) Protection of Civil Rights Act: 1955
- (ii) The SC/STs (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989.

The crime under IPC such as 'Murder', 'Hurt', 'Rape etc. or under Special Acts such as PCR Act & SC/ST (P) Act are already included in overall crimes reported under IPC and SLL respectively and have been discussed in details in the preceding chapters. The data specific to crimes against SC/ST discussed in the following paragraphs is a part and parcel of total crimes but analyzed separately for better comprehension.

Population:


As per 2011 census of Himachal Pradesh, the Scheduled Castes constituted 28.30 % of total population in the State while Scheduled Tribes constituted only 4.08 %. Kangra with the highest population share (22.03%) also represented the highest share of Scheduled Caste (18.60%) followed by Mandi (17.39%) and Shimla with (12.50%) while Chamba represented significantly high share of Scheduled Tribes (72.59%) followed by Kinnaur (23%) and Lahaul & Spiti (9.90%).

7.5 Incident of Crimes against Weaker Section (SC/ST):

The incident of these crimes (IPC+SLL) were reported to be 112 cases in the State during 2017. Head wise details of crime against weaker section for the last 3 years including percentage change over the previous years is presented in Table 7.1. Chart 7.1 depicts the head wise pictorial position of the crime incidents. The district wise and head wise incidents including the rate of crime has been calculated and presented in Table 7.2.

The above data reflects that the incidents of most of the SC/ST (POA) Act and other crimes have increased.

7.6 Head-wise Crime:

Under most of the heads of IPC no incident has been registered during the year 2017. The head wise detailed analysis of all crime heads under which the cases have been registered during the year are given below:

(i) Murder:

During the year 2017, no incident was reported under head murder against weaker sections in the state.

(ii) Rape:

During the years 2016, 11 incidents of rape were reported in the State. Highest incidents under this head were reported in Mandi (06) followed by Bilaspur (04) and Solan (01). No case under this head was registered in rest of the districts.

(iii). SC/ST Protection of Civil Rights Act:

During the year 2017, only 1 incidents of PCR Act was reported in Kinnaur under this head. No case under this head was registered in rest of the districts.

(iv). SC/ST (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989:

During the years 2017, 96 incidents were reported under this head which showed a decrease of (06) cases over the previous year 2016. Highest incidents under this head were reported in Mandi (23) followed by Kangra (20), Shimla (13), Hamirpur, Solan (09 each), Bilaspur, Una (07 each), Kullu (05), Chamba Sirmaur, Lahaul and Spiti (01 each). No incident under this head was reported in rest of the districts.

SUICIDAL DEATHS


8.1 General:

According to Oxford dictionary, 'suicide' means 'the act of killing oneself intentionally'. The 'suicide' word has its origin from Latin word 'sui' (of oneself) plus 'cardere' [kill]. It is a step which is taken by one normally in an emotionally or mentally weak moment when he or she feels coping with life is impossible

The number of suicides reported in Himachal Pradesh during 2017 was 591 as against 642 in 2016 indicating a decrease of 7.9%.

Kangra recorded the highest number of suicides during 2017 (156) followed by Mandi (89), Una (67), Shimla (63), Solan (46), Hamirpur (43), Baddi (30), Bilaspur (27), Kullu and Sirmaur (24). Suicides during 2008-2017 is presented in Chart 8.1


CHART 8.1

From the above table it is revealed that there has been a decrease of over 7.9% (from 642 to 591) in suicide cases during the year 2017 over the year 2016. The minor increase has been witnessed in Solan (from 37 to 46), Kangra (from 148 to 156), Kinnaur (02 to 04). However, there has been decrease in rest of the districts of the State.

The analysis of the above table reveals that percentage of suicide deaths in Baddi, Bilaspur, Hamirpur, Kangra, Mandi, Solan and Una has remained higher than the percentage of the population of the district concerned during 2016 & 2017. In other words, these 07 districts have higher rated of suicidal deaths as compared to other 06 districts of state.


It is revealed from the above table that the number of males committing suicide outnumber the females (58.5% males as against 41.5% females in 2017 and 64.6% males as against 35.4% females in 2016).

It is further revealed that there has been decrease of 16.6%

in the male suicide cases (from 415 to 346) as against 7.9 % increase in the number of female suicides (227 to 245) during the year 2017 as compared to year 2016.



%AGE AGAINST TOTAL CASES DURING -2016 & 2017







The causes that top the list which led to suicides are Family problems (35.6% in 2016), and (43.14% in 2016), followed by illness (11.7% in 2016 and 11.9% in 2017).



The analysis shows that the age profile of most of the suicide victims both men and women falls into two age-groups of 18-30 and 30-45 years. Thus it can be said that most people who commit suicide do so in the prime of their lives between 18 to 45 years of age (69.5% in 2016) and (72.4% in 2017) This fact can be further co-related to the reasons for suicide i.e. 'family problems' and 'illness'.



Another aspect that is brought forth is that those who committed suicide were mostly **Professional/Salaried persons** (17.5%) in case of males and **housewives** in case of females (24.7%). This fact can again be co-related to the age profile falling within 18-45 years.



The means adopted for committing suicide range over several methods from drinking too much to jumping from high places. However, the maximum number have committed suicide by **consuming poison**. (54.6% in 2016 and 50.08% in 2017.) This is followed by hanging (33.4% in 2016 and 37.4% in 2017).

8.11. Conclusions:

- (i) There has been an increase in the suicide cases by women and decrease in suicide committed by men during the year 2017 as against the year 2016.
- (ii) Kangra, Mandi, Shimla, Una and Hamirpur reported more suicidal deaths as compared to the other 08 districts of the state.
- (iii) The major cause of suicides remained 'family problems' followed by 'illness'. 'Unemployment' is certainly not one of the major causes of suicides as it contributes less than 15 % of total suicide cases.
- (iv) Most of the women suicide victims were house-wives. The farmers/agriculturists do not form major group of suicide victims as this group contributes only 2.8% to total suicide cases.
- (v) The majority of the suicide victims were married and in the age group of 18 to 45 years.

(vi) The most popular means for committing suicide remained taking 'poison' followed by 'hanging'.

MAP-8.1 SUICIDES - 2017





CHAPTER-9

ACCIDENTAL DEATHS

9.1 General:

Incidents of road accidents in Himachal Pradesh show fluctuating trends. The break-up of accidents for the last ten years is shown in Table-9.1

Car/Jeep/Taxi/Tempo account for the largest number of accidents. During the year 2017, 52.3 % of the road accidents were attributed to Car/Jeep/Taxi/Tempo. District wise comparative statement of road accidents during 2016-2017 is presented in Table-9.2. 3119 road accidents were reported during the year 2017 out of which in 702 accidents were fatal and 1203 persons died in these cases.

9.2 Accidental Deaths:

Car/Jeep/Taxi/Tempo were responsible for 53% of accidental deaths during 2016. Out of 1166 persons who died due to accidents, as many as 347 were involved in accidents with these type of vehicles. Table-9.2 gives details of road accidental deaths for the year 2016 with break-up of types of

vehicles and due to other reasons. Shimla reported the highest (202) numbers of accidental deaths followed by Mandi (137) Kullu (104), Una (101) and Sirmaur (95). Chart-9.1 depicts road accidents occurred during 2008–2017.

Percentage of road accidental deaths according to type of vehicles during the years 2017 is presented in Chart-9.2.

NUMBER OF ROAD ACCIDENTS (2008-2017)



PERCENTAGE OF ROAD ACCIDENTAL DEATHS (ACCORDING TO TYPE OF VEHICLES DURING 2017)



ROAD ACCIDENTAL DEATHS DURING -2017



(FATAL AND NON FATAL DURING 2017)



CHAPTER-10

CYBER CRIME

10.1. Definition of Cyber Crime:

"Any illegal action in which a computer is a tool or object of crime, in other words, any crime, the means or purpose of which is to influence the function of computer."

Computer and Tele-communications are the key areas of cyber crimes. In cybercrimes, computer is used in the following two ways:-

- i.) Computer as a target
- ii.) Computer as a tool

The computer becomes a target of cyber crime when, by way of hacking or intrusion, the criminals access a computer with a motive to impair, damage or alter the system. The hacking can evolve into other substantive violations, for example, alteration of accounts, drawl of money etc. by cyber intrusion into a bank.

Computer becomes a tool for cyber crime when it becomes a convenient method to commit crimes affecting large scale net-works and programmes such as introducing virus into large scale reservation or financial network or unauthorizedly obtaining classified information from data stored in defense and security computers.

10.2 Classification of computer crimes:

The most accepted classification of computer crimes is as follows:

- (i) Computer related frauds.
- (ii) Computer forgery.
- (iii) Damage to computer data of computer programmes.
- (iv) Computer sabotage.

- (v) Unauthorized access.
- (vi) Unauthorized interception
- (vii) Unauthorized reproduction of a protected computer programmes
- (viii) Unauthorized reproduction of a topography
- (ix) Alteration of computer data or computer programmes
- (x) Computer espionage
- (xi) Unauthorized use of a computer
- (xii) Unauthorized use of a protected computer programmes.

10.3. Incident of Computer Crime:

During the year 2017, 56 cases under Cyber Crimes (IT Act only) were registered in the State and during 2016 this figure was 23. Chart 10.1 depicts the incidents of Cyber Crimes reported from 2015-2017. Table 10.1 carries the district-wise details of cases registered under IT Act. Table 10.2 gives the details of Cyber Crimes registered and persons arrested under I.T. Act during 2015-2017:-

CHART-10.1



CHAPTER-11

DETECTION UNDER NARCOTIC DRUGS & PSYCHOTROPIC SUBSTANCE (ND&PS) ACT

11.1 Drug Menace in Himachal Pradesh

The State of Himachal Pradesh is well known for its natural beauty and is one of its natural beauties and is one of the most popular tourist destinations in the world. Unfortunately, this beautiful state has also come to known for wide spread illicit cultivation of cannabis and opium poppy cultivation. Illicit drug produced in the state attract drug traffickers from all over the world. Generally, the youth seems to be the target of this drug menace and its abuse. Considerable drug addiction, particularly among the local youth has been noticed at high rate and the situation is alarming due to unchecked cultivation and spread of drug abuse over the years in the state. Drug abuse and the drug menace is the illicit, non- medical use of limited number of substance, most of drugs which have the properties of altering the mental state of a being in ways that are considered by social norms and defined by statute to be inappropriate, undesirable, harmful threatening to the life of the user and to the society at large. Alcohol, heroin, cocaine, opium, Charas, are some of the drugs abused.

In Himachal Pradesh there are 17495 villages out of which 402 villages of the following five Districts are the natural habitants of cannabis where it grows naturally. Analysis reveals that these five districts of the State have been identified by the drug traffickers for cultivation and transporting of Cannabis at national and international level.

11.2 Narcotic Drugs:

In general, Narcotics drug can be defined as an awareness of sensory impulses, especially pain, by the brain. In large doses it cause of stupor (condition of insensibility), coma or convulsion. These would include:

- (i) Cannabis preparations like Bhang, Ganja and Charas.
- (ii) Opium and Opium alkaloids like morphine.
- (iii) Coca alkaloids like Cocaine.
- (iv) Synthetic narcotic drugs like pethidine.

11.3 Psychotropic Drugs:

The Greek word Psycho means "Soul" and "Trope" means "Turning', and drug having peculiar affinity for or effect on mind (Mind altering). The term psychotropic drug include:

- 1) Hallucinogens: There are both natural and synthetic Drugs like LSD (Lysergic acid Diethylamide) and tetrahydrocannabinols.
- 2) Hypnotics: Secobarbitone, Phenobarbitone.

- 3) Stimulants: These drugs induce and excitement in the body like amphetamines cocaine.
- 4) Tranquillizers: Methaqualone, Mandrax, etc.
- 5) Depressants: Under this class would fall drugs which are pain killers, analgesics, sedatives, like barbiturates, opiates.



The drug-wise detection during the year 2017 according to the above mentioned table is presented in the chart 11.1. The major detection of poppy husk (715.62 Kgs) has been made during the year 2017 followed by Charas (305.928 Kgs.), Ganja (148.278 Kgs), Opium 26.935 Kgs. Detection of other drugs i.e. Smack/ Brown Sugar 704.471 gms, has been made during the year 2017.

11.6 Detailed Analysis:


The Incidence of (1010) under the ND&PS Act showed an increase of 8.72% over 2016. Cases under this act constituted 21% against the total Local & Special Law reported cases during the year 2017. The highest incidents (245) under this head were reported in Kangra followed by Kullu (134), Shimla (131), Mandi (127), Una (81), Chamba (60), Sirmaur (50), Bilaspur (49), Hamirpur (39), Kinnaur (31), Solan (30), Baddi (22), CID (08) and Lahaul & Spiti (03).

The main concentration on the incidents registered under this act remains on Kangra, Kullu and Shimla with 50.49% of the total registered cases. The analysis reveals that the main source/area of drugs are Kullu, Mandi, Kangra, Shimla and Chamba. Further, carriers of this contraband are mostly agriculturists, laborers and poor people.

Of the total persons apprehended under this Act 85.6% belong to Himachal Pradesh. Study of age profile shows that mostly adults between 18-30 years of age are involved (49.2%). About 36.5% were in the age group of 30-45 years. Above 45 years were 13.8%.

The participation of children below 18 years is negligible (0.6%). Only six Foreigners were involved in this activity. Previous 10 years (2008-2017) crime under this head is presented in Chart-11.1

CHAPTER-12 POLICE STRENGTH, INFRASTRUCTURE AND EXPENDITURE

12.1 Police Strength:

The sanctioned strength of the Police personnel in the Himachal Pradesh during the year 2017 was 18927 while actual strength is 16724. Total strength of (GOs) Class-I is 317, which includes 94 IPS and 181 HPS. Total Class-II GOs are 30. The strength of executive force is 17424 which includes 2147 NGOs Grade-I: Inspectors (279), Sub-Inspectors (706) Assistant Sub-Inspectors (1162). The strength of Head Constables and Constables is 15277, (HCs-2944 and Const.-12333). The strength of ministerial staff (Class-III) is 619, Class-IV 539 and other Whole time, Daily Wagers and Part Timers) is 176. The rank wise detailed sanctioned position and actual strength is presented in Table 12.1.

12.2 Police Districts and Sub-divisions:

During the year 2017, there were 1 Zone, 3 Ranges (Northern, Southern & Central), 13 Districts (including one Police District at Baddi), 34 Police Sub-Divisions, 138 Police Stations (including 2 Police Stations of GRP and two Police Stations of CID. Detailed summary is given in Table 12.2.

12.3 Police Housing:

The details of different types of available Police housing are depicted in Table 12.3.

12.4 Police Budget:

The budget allocation for Police department in Himachal Pradesh for the last 3 years is depicted in Table 12.4. During the budget year 2017-2018 Himachal Pradesh Police Budget account for 2.5 % of the total budget for Himachal Pradesh.

12.5 Equipment & Transport:

The district wise number and type of available equipment with Himachal Pradesh, during 2017 are presented in Table 12.5. There are 78 HF Sets, 975 VHF Sets, 1512 Willkie Talkies and 17 other equipment available with the Himachal Police Department.

At present the total available (fleet) strength in Himachal Pradesh Police is 474 Motor Cycles, 200(Gypsy/Jeep/Bolero/Tata Mobiles), 145 Heavy Vehicles and 32 Vans & others. The district wise detail summary is given in Table 12.6.

GLOSSARY

Arrest Rate:

Number of arrests per lakh of population.

Charge sheeting Rate:

Percentage of cases charge sheeted to cases in which investigations were completed.

Cognizable Offences:

A cognizable case means a case in which, a police officer may in accordance with the first schedule of the Code of Criminal Procedure 1973 or under any other Law for the time being in force, arrest without warrant.

Conviction Rate:

Percentage of cases that resulted in conviction to the number of cases in which trials were completed during a year.

Crime Against Women:

Rape, Dowry deaths, molestation, Cruelty by husband and relatives, Sexual harassment, Kidnapping & abduction of women and girls, dowry Prohibition Act.

Crime Rate:

Incidence of crime per lakh of population.

Disposal Rate by Police:

Percentage of cases investigated and challaned to total cases meant for investigation during the year.

Disposal Rate by Courts:

Percentage of cases disposed to total cases pending/trial during a year.

Indian Penal Code:

A Penal Code for India listing out the offences and their punishments (Act No. XLV of 1860).

Local Law:

A law applicable only to a particular state/part of India.

Offence:

The word offence means any act or omission made punishable by any law for the time being in force.

Property Offence:

Include Burglary, Theft, Dacoity and Robbery.

Special law:

A law applicable to a particular subject.
