CHAPTER-1

INCIDENT AND RATE OF COGNIZABLE CRIME IN HIMACHAL PRADESH

1.1 General:

The Himachal Pradesh is a hilly and peaceful State. There are sporadic incidents of crime taking place, but no particular area of any district of this State is notorious for any class or category of crime. There has not been any abnormal fluctuation in the incident of crime in the State.

The crime situation has remained peaceful and well under control during the year 2019 throughout the State of Himachal Pradesh. No alarming increase was noticed under any major head of crime.

1.2. The Parameters for Review and Analysis of Crime:-

The following parameters have been adopted while analyzing the crime for the year 2019:-

- Geographical spread.
- Reasons for commission of crime especially in offences against persons.
- ➡ Investigative process followed.
- Recovery of property.
- Profile of criminals.

1.3. Reported Incidents of Cognizable Crimes:

The ten years trends of incident and rate of total cognizable crime under Indian Penal Code (IPC) and Local and Special Laws (2018-2019) is presented in Table-1.2 at the end of the chapter. A total of 19924 cognizable crime cases were reported during the year 2019. These comprise of 14480 cases under IPC and 5444 cases under (SLL) Special & Local Law. (Table-1.1 and Chart-1.1 & 1.2)

FOR THE LAST 10 YEARS (2010-2019)





CHART-1.2

1.4. Crime Trends:

1.4.1. Crime Incidents:

During the year 2019, cases of cognizable crime have increased by 1.7% (330) as compared to the registration of cognizable crime cases of the corresponding year. The registration in IPC crimes have recorded minor decrease of 0.8% and Special & Local Laws crime have recorded an increase of 8.3% in 2019 as compared to the previous year 2018.

Total 14480 IPC cases were reported in the State during 2019, as against 14604 cases of 2018 (0.8% decrease). District Kangra, Shimla and Mandi have recorded crime incident between 2000 to 3000 IPC cases in each, district Bilaspur and Sirmour have recorded crime between 1000 to 1500 IPC cases each, Kullu, Una, Chamba, Hamirpur, Solan and Baddi have recorded crime between 500 to 1000 IPC cases each. The crime in districts Kinnaur, Lahaul & Spiti, Railway & Traffic Unit and CID Unit have remain below the figure of 250 cases. The district wise detailed volume of crime is depicted in the Table-1.3.

1.4.2. District-wise IPC Crime Trends:

The highest occurrence of IPC cases was reported in Kangra (2771 cases) followed by Mandi (2155), Shimla (2088), Bilaspur (1203), Sirmour (1086), Kullu (976), Una (871), Chamba (758), Hamirpur (752), Solan (731), Baddi (714), Kinnaur (214), Lahaul & Spiti, CID (74 each) and GRP (13). The detail of number of districts falling under different ranges with incidents of IPC crimes during the year 2019 are presented in Table-1.3.

1.5. Crime Pattern: (IPC Crimes)


As compared to 2018, this year incidents of Culpable Homicide, Rape, Robbery, Grievous Hurt, Cruelty to women have shown an increases while Murder, Attempt to Murder, Kid & Abduction, Burglary, Theft, Rioting and Accident have reported a decrease.

1.6. Crime Rate:

The Crime Rate, District wise is presented in Table-1.4. The average IPC Crime Rate in the State for 2019 was 211.2. The highest Crime Rate districts are Bilaspur (314.9) followed by Baddi (278.7), Shimla (256.7), Kinnaur (253.9), Lahual and Spiti (234.7), Solan (228.1) and Kullu (223.1), Mandi (215.6), Sirmour (204.8), Kangra (183.8) Una (167.2) and Hamirpur (165.5). The lowest crime rate was found in Chamba (146.1). (Chart-1.3) and Table 1.4.

1.7. Head Wise Analysis of IPC Offences:


The head wise analysis of IPC offences is presented in Table-1.5. The head wise statistics indicates the following trends:-

(i) Murder (Decrease 29%):

The incidents of murder (70) in 2019 decreased by 29% as compared to the previous year 2018. Highest incidents of murder was reported in Kangra (15 cases) district, contributing 0.10 % of the total cases. Other districts which reported more than 8 cases are Chamba (10) and Shimla (9). The lowest Incidents of murder are reported in Baddi (7), Kullu, Mandi (5 each), Una (4), Bilaspur, Kinnuar, Sirmaur and Solan (3 each), Hamirpur (2) and GRP (1). Bilaspur and Kinnaur (2 each). No Incidents under this head was reported in CID, Cyber PS and Lahaul & Spiti. Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.4.

The analysis of the causes has revealed that no organized gang was operating in the State. In most of these cases, crime is committed due to land disputes or murder for gain or personal enmity. Generally, sudden provocation or minor altercations were the reasons for commission of most of the murders. There was no class or caste factor involved in the commission of murder.

INCIDENTS OF MURDER DURING (2010-2019)




(ii). Attempt to commit Murder (Decrease 6.9%)

The incidents (54) of Attempt to Commit Murder during this year has decrease by 6.9 %. The higher Incidents under this head was reported in Shimla (9) followed by Kullu, Mandi (8 each), Kangra (6),

Hamirpur (5), Chamba, Sirmaur, Solan, Una (4 each) and Bilaspur (2). No Incident under this head was reported in Baddi, Kinnaur and Lahaul & Spiti districts. Previous 10 years (2010-2019) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.5.


CHART-1.5

(iii). C.H. not amounting to Murder (Increase 171.4%)

19 cases of Culpable Homicide not amounting to Murder were reported during 2019, showing an increase of 171.4 percent over the previous year (7 cases). The highest incidents 5 cases were reported in Kangra district followed by Kullu, Sirmaur, Solan, Una (3 each) and Mandi (2). No incidents under this head was reported in remaining districts of the State. Previous 10 years (2010-2019) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.6.


CHART-1.6

(iv). Rape (Increase 4.4%)

Total 359 cases of Rape were reported which has shown an increase of 4.4 percent during 2019 over previous year 2018 (344 cases). The highest incidents of rape were reported in Shimla (62) followed by Mandi (52) Sirmaur (40) Kangra (39), Solan (31), Kullu (30), Baddi (20), Bilaspur (19), Chamba, Hamirpur, Una (18 each) and Kinnaur (12). No incident was reported in Lahaul & Spiti district under this head. Previous 10 years (2010-2019) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1. 7.



(v). Kidnapping and Abduction (Decrease 4.2 %)

During the year 2019 a total number of 455 cases of Kidnapping and Abduction were reported with a decrease of 4.2% as compared to previous year 2018. The highest incidents were reported in Shimla (90) followed by Mandi (74), Kangra (71), Sirmour (37), Bilaspur, Solan (34 each), Kullu (32), Hamirpur, Una (22 each), Chamba (17), Baddi (16). The lowest number of cases was reported in Kinnaur (5) and Lahaul & Spiti (1). Previous 10 years (2010-2019) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.8.


CHART-1.8

(vi). Dowry Death

The incidents of Dowry Death (4) is equal as compared to the previous year 2018. Highest incidents of Dowry Death was reported in Kangra (2), followed by Bilaspur, Hamirpur (1 each). No incident under this head was reported in rest of the districts. Previous 10 years (2010-2019) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.9.

(vii). Dacoity


The incident of Dacoity (1 case in Kangra district) is equal as compared to the previous year 2018. No Incidents under this head were reported in remaining districts of the State. Previous 10 years (2010-2019) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.10.

(viii). Robbery (Increase 33%)

During the year 2019, 12 cases of Robbery were registered in the State as compared to 9 cases of previous year. The highest Incidents were reported in Baddi (4) followed by Chamba, Solan (2 each) Kangra, Kullu, Sirmaur and Una (1 each). No case under this head was reported in rest of the districts of the State. Previous 10 years (2010-2019) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.10.

(ix). Burglary (Decrease 29%)

The Incidents of Burglary (452) recorded a decrease with 29% during the year 2019 as compared to 2018. The highest number of Burglary cases (103) were reported in Shimla followed by Kangra (82), Mandi, Sirmaur (47 each) and Baddi, Una (36 each). The remaining districts have reported less than 30 cases under this head. Highest crime rate was 12.7% in Shimla district and the lowest at Chamba 2.3% as against the State average of 6.6%. Previous 10 years (2010-2019) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.11.

(x). Theft (Decrease 33.2%)

The Incidents of Theft (477) recorded a decrease of 33.2% during the year 2019 over the previous year. Shimla has reported highest incidents (71 cases) followed by Baddi (67), Kangra (59) Solan (58), Sirmaur (50) and remaining districts have reported less than 50 cases. The highest crime rate was in Baddi (26.1) and the lowest (3.5) in Hamirpur as against the State average of 7.0. Previous 10 years (2010-2019) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.12.

INCIDENTS OF BURGLARY DURING (2010-2019)





CHART-1.12
INCIDENTS OF THEFT DURING (2010-2019)




(xi). Riots: (Decrease 7.9%)

Incidents of Riots (372) registered during the year 2019 recorded a decrease of 7.9% over the previous year 2018. The highest incidents was reported in Shimla (58) followed by Mandi (56), Kangra (54), Sirmaur (40), Baddi, Una (31 each), Kullu (23), Chamba (20) Bilaspur (19),

Solan (18) and Hamirpur (16). The lowest number of cases were reported in Kinnuar (4) and GRP (2). No incident was reported in Lahaul & Spiti district. Previous 10 years (2010-2019) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.12.



(xii). Grievous Hurt (Increase 20.6%)

A total number of 416 cases under head Grievous Hurt were reported during 2019 recorded a minor increase of 20.6% over the previous year 2018. Kangra has reported the highest Incidents (99) under head 'Grievous Hurt' followed by Mandi (60), Hamirpur (41), Sirmaur (39), Chamba (32), Shimla (30), Una (27), Kullu (23), Bilaspur (20), Solan (17) and Baddi (14). The least number of cases were reported in Kinnaur (13) and Lahaul & Spiti (1). Previous 10 years (2010-2019) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.14.



(xiii). Assault on Women (Decrease 2.9%)

498 cases were reported during the year, showing a decrease of 2.9% over the previous year. 91 cases were reported in Mandi followed by Kangra (87), Shimla (68), Sirmaur (54), Hamirpur (36), Bilaspur (32), Chamba (30), Kullu (26), Baddi, Solan (24 each) and Una (20). The lowest number of cases were reported in Kinnaur (5) and Lahual & Spiti (1). Previous 10 years (2010-2019) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.15.


CHART-1.15

(xiv). Cruelty to women (Increase 24.5%)

228 cases were reported during the year, showing an increase of 24.5 % over the previous year. 46 cases were reported in Mandi followed by Una (34), Kangra (30), Sirmaur (27), Bilaspur (19), Hamirpur (18), Shimla (14), Baddi (11), Solan (10), Kullu (8), Chamba (7), Kinnaur (3) and Lahaul & Spiti (1). Previous 10 years (2010-2019) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.16.


CHART-1.16

(xv). Accidents (Decrease 7.14%)

A total of 2896 cases of accident were registered during the year 2019 as against 3119 cases in the previous year. The highest number of accident cases were registered in Shimla with 520 cases followed by Kangra (497), Mandi (357), Sirmaur (273), Una (268), Kullu (212), Baddi (169), Solan (167), Bilaspur (150), Chamba and Hamirpur (116 each). The lowest number of cases were reported in Kinnaur (40), Lahaul & Spiti (9) and GRP (2). Previous 10 years (2010-2019) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.17.

(xvi). Other IPC Crimes (Increase 6.1 %)

Cognizable IPC Crime which do not fall under any of the above specified categories are termed as "Other IPC Crime". As many as 8167 other IPC crime accounting for 56.4% of the total IPC crimes were registered in the State during 2019.

Incidents of IPC Crime (Head-wise) along with percentage share is presented in Table-1.6. Ten year trend in percentage change (head-wise) is presented in Table-1.7. District-wise and head wise details of IPC offences are available in Table-1.8 and Table-1.9. Previous 10 years (2010-2019) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.18 and percentage of Other IPC cases against IPC cases for the last 10 years is presented in Chart. 1.18.

INCIDENTS OF OTHER IPC DURING (2010-2019)



FOR THE LAST 10 YEAR (2010-2019)




1.8 Crime under Local and Special Laws:

A list of Special and Local Laws is available at Annexure-1. Incidents and rate of cognizable Local & Special Law crimes during 2010 to 2019 are presented in Table-1.10.

A total of 5444 cognizable Local & Special Law (SLL) crimes were registered in the State during 2019. The head-wise percentage distribution of various cognizable crimes under Local & Special Law for 10 years from 2010 to 2019 is presented in Table-1.11. There is an increase of 9.1% in registration over the previous year.

The crime head-wise Incidents and rate of cognizable Local & Special Law crimes in different districts are presented in Table-1.12.

Incidents of Local & Special Law cases under important Special and Local Laws is elaborated below:-

1.8.1 Head Wise Analysis of SLL Offences:

(i). Arms Act

During 2019, 17 cases of Arms Act have been registered. The highest Incidents (5) under this head was reported in Kangra followed by Shimla (4), Kullu (3), Baddi, Hamirpur, Mandi, Solan and Una with 1 case each. No case under this act was reported in remaining districts.

(ii). Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act (ND&PS) (Increase 7.2%)


A total of 1439 cases were registered under Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act in the year 2019 has compared to 1342 cases during 2018, showing an increase of 7.2% over 2018. Cases under this act constituted 26.4% against the total Local & Special Law reported cases during 2019. The highest Incidents (259) under this head were reported in Kangra followed by Kullu (226), Mandi (181), Shimla (173), Bilaspur (120), Solan (108), Una (90), Chamba, Sirmaur (66 each) Baddi (65), Hamirpur (52), Kinnaur (25) CID (7) and Lahaul & Spiti (1).

The main concentration on the incidents registered under this act remains in Kangra, Kullu, Mandi and Shimla with 58.3 % of the total registered cases. The analysis reveals that the main sources/ areas of drugs are Kullu, Mandi, Kangra, Shimla and Chamba. Further, carriers of contraband are mostly agriculturists, laborers and poor people.

Of the total persons apprehended under this Act, 88% belong to Himachal Pradesh and 12% were outsiders. Study of age profile shows that mostly adults between 18-30 years of age are involved (56%). About 34.3% were in the age group of 30-45 years. Above 45 years were 9.3%.

The participation of children below 18 years is negligible (0.04%). Only ten foreigners were involved in this activity. Previous 10 years (2010-2019) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.21.

(iii). Gambling Act


The Incidents (410) under the Gambling Act has been registered during, 2019. The highest cases (146) were reported in Una followed by Baddi (48), Kullu (41), Kangra (39), Shimla (36), Chamba,

Kinnaur (21 each), Sirmaur (18), Mandi (17), Solan (12), Lahaul & Spiti (9). The lowest incidents under this Act was seen in Bilaspur and Hamirpur (1 each). No Incident under this head was reported in CID and GRP.

(iv). Excise Act (Increase (12.8%)

The incidents (2916) under the Excise Act showed an increase of 12.8% over 2018. Cases under this act contributed 53.5% against the total Local & Special Law (SLL) reported cases during 2019. The highest incidents (688) cases were reported in Kangra followed by Mandi (431), Kullu (333), Chamba (302), Shimla (251), Sirmaur (176), Una (165), Solan (128), Baddi (111), Hamirpur (102) and Bilaspur (100). The lowest incidents under this act was seen in Kinnaur (72), Lahaul-Spiti (57). Previous 10 years (2010-2019) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.22.

(v). Forest Act (Decrease 32.9%)


The incidents (161) under the Forest Act showed a decrease of 32.9% over 2018. Shimla district has reported the highest incidents (35) followed by Mandi (30), Sirmaur (26), Chamba (16), Kangra (14), Kullu (11), Una (9), Solan (6), Hamirpur (5). The lowest incidents under this act

were seen in Baddi and Bilaspur (4 each) and Kinnaur (1). No Incident

under this head was reported in Lahaul & Spiti, CID, Cyber PS and GRP.

The analysis reveals that majority of cases have been registered in Shimla, Mandi and Sirmaur. Therefore cases involve in encroachment on forest land, forest produce such as timber, fuel wood, Guchhi, Resin, Walnut Bark, Brich Bark, Brahmi leaves and other herbal plants etc. Previous 10 years (2010-2019) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.23.

(vi). Protection of Civil Rights Act.

4 cases under this Act was reported in the State. 3 cases were reported in Kinnaur and 1 case was reported in Kangra district. However, previous 10 years (2010-2019) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.24.

(vii). SC/ST (Prevention of Atrocities) Act. (Increase 65.9%)


156 cases were registered under the SC/ST Prevention of Atrocities Act as against 94 cases of previous year. The highest numbers of (54) cases were reported in Mandi followed by Shimla (31), Kangra (24), Una (17), Kullu (8), Sirmaur, Hamirpur (7 each). The lowest incidents

under this act was seen in Chamba (4), Bilaspur (3), and Solan (1). No incidents under this act were reported in Baddi, Kinnaur, CID, Cyber PS and Lahaul & Spiti.

The analysis reveals that crime under this head is high in Mandi, Shimla, Kangra, and Una. The most common reason for registering cases under these acts is a feeling of being hurt when one is called by derogatory name. This comprises 80% of the total cases registered under this head. 31% of the cases were registered because of land and water disputes. 5% were registered due to not allowing access to temples. The remaining were for election related matters and miscellaneous reasons. Previous 10 years (2010-2019) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.24.

(viii). Other Local & Special Law Cases (including Wild life Act, PDP Act, EC Act etc.)

341 Local & Special Law cases reported under the acts mentioned above. These have shown a decrease of 12.5 % over the previous year. The highest incident was reported from district Shimla (56).

During 2019 total number of 5444 cognizable crimes were reported in the State under various heads of (SLL) Local & Special Laws which shows an increase of 9.1% of the previous year.

It is observed that 8 specified crime heads accounted for 93.7 % of the total SLL crimes while the remaining 6.3% were clubbed as other SLL crimes. Previous 10 years (2010-2019) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.25

DURING (2010-2019)




(IPC+SLL) DURING -2019



RATE OF COGNIZABLE CRIMES (IPC) DURING – 2019







CHAPTER-2

INCIDENCE OF CRIME AGAINST PROPERTY AND PERSONS IN HIMACHAL PRADESH

2.1 Crime against Property:

Offences under this head include the cases of **Theft, Burglary, Robbery & Dacoity.** The head wise analysis of crime against property has been done for the year 2019 and given as under:-

(i) Theft and Burglary:

During the year 2019, 477 cases of theft and 452 cases of burglary were registered which showed a decrease of 238 cases in theft and 185 cases in burglary over the year 2018. The cases of both these heads have been categorized under major head namely: - Auto theft, theft of Cash and Jewellery, Cultural Property theft, theft of electronic component and theft of other materials.

Incidences of theft cases is concentrated mostly in the 4 districts i.e. Shimla, Solan, Baddi and Sirmaur. The analysis further shows that most of the cases occurred in rural areas, Shimla being an exception where 72 % of the persons involved in these crimes were local residents.

As far as the age profile goes, 59 % of those involved in theft cases are in the age group of 18 to 30 years. 56.6% involved in burglary are also of the same age group.

(ii) Robbery:

During the year 2019, 12 cases of robbery were found registered which showed an increase of 3 case over previous year. Highest incidences under this head was reported in Baddi (4), followed by Chamba, Solan (2 each), Kangra, Kullu, Sirmaur and Una (1 each). No case under this head was reported in rest of the districts.

(iii) Dacoity:

Only 01 case of dacoity was registered in District Kangra.

2.2 Value of Property Stolen and Recovered:

During the year 2019, property valued 1280.39 lakhs was reported stolen in 946 cases as compared to 1794.33 lakhs in 1362 cases for the corresponding year.


Property worth Rs. 722.6 lakhs was recovered during 2019. The percentage of recovery is 56.4%. The value of property recovered showed an increase of 18% over the previous year.

The details of property stolen and recovered along with percentage of recovery from the last 10 years (2010 to 2019) and variation are given in Table 2.1.

The Chart 2.1 depicts the value of property stolen and recovered during 2010 to 2019.

VALUE OF PROPERTY STOLEN AND RECOVERED DURING THE PERIOD 2010-2019



Shimla reported the highest value of property stolen (Rs. 2,40,80,281/-) followed by Baddi (Rs. 2,40,01,296/-, Kangra (Rs.1,90,97,988/-) and Solan (Rs. 1,12,14,650/-). Rest of districts reported less than 1 crore value of property stolen.


The highest value of recovery was seen in Shimla (Rs. 1, 19, 99,524 /-) followed by Baddi (Rs. 1, 74, 40,495/-).

The highest recovery percentage of stolen property was seen in Baddi (72.7%) followed by Mandi (68.9%), Bilaspur (65.8%), Kullu (64%) and Kinnaur (62.6%).

2.3 Category of Offences (Incidence and Value):

Among 4 different types of property crimes, the maximum value of property (Rs.733.45 Lakhs) and share (57.28%) were seen under head Burglary. The minimum value of Rs. 1.5 Lakhs and share (0.11%) was seen under the category of crime under Dacoity.

The maximum value of property was recovered in Dacoity (100%) followed by Theft (66.8%), Burglary (49%) and Robbery (44%). The crime head-wise value of property stolen and recovered over the last 10 years (2010 to 2019) is presented in Table 2.4.

2.4 Nature of Property:

Nature of property under head theft and burglary have been classified into four different categories viz. Auto Theft, Theft of Cash and Jewellery, theft of Cultural Property, Theft of electronic items, Household articles/furniture. Properties other than the above specified categories are clubbed as other kind of property. The category wise number of cases in which property was found stolen and recovered therein and percentage thereof has been calculated and presented in Table 2.5.

RECOVERED DURING THE YEAR 2019





PERCENTAGE OF PROPERTY CASES DETECTED (WORKED OUT) -2019






2.6 Crime against Persons:-

The crime against persons includes 10 different types of crime heads viz. Murder, Culpable Homicide not amounting to Murder, Attempt to Murder, Rape, Kidnapping & Abduction, Hurt, Rioting, Cruelty to Women, Molestation and Dowry Deaths.

The analysis reveals that total 2475 cases of crime against persons have occurred during 2019 which shows 17.09% of the total IPC crime. The highest percentage of crime against persons over the total IPC recorded in Sirmour with 22.7% followed by Hamirpur (21.1%), Kinnaur (21%), Solan (19.7%), Una (18.7%), Mandi (18.3%), Chamba (18.2%), Baddi (17.2%), Shimla (16.3%), Kullu (16.2%), Kangra (14.7%), Bilaspur (12.4%) and Lahaul & Spiti (5.4%). The district-wise detail has been calculated and presented in Table 2.7. The district-wise incidents and their percentage over the IPC crime is depicted in Chart 2.5.

CRIME AGAINST PERSONS FOR THE 10 YEARS (2010-2019)




The incidences of crime against persons have been recorded highest in Kangra (408) followed by Mandi (394), Shimla (340), Sirmour

(247), Una (163), Hamirpur (159), Kullu (158), Bilaspur (149), Solan (144), Chamba (138), Baddi (123), Kinnuar (45), Lahaul & Spiti (4) and GRP (3). The District-wise detail has been calculated and presented in Table 2.8.

The head-wise comparative analysis of incidences of crime against persons for the last 10 years (2010 to 2019) has been reviewed. During 2019, 2475 incidences have been recorded which showed an increase of 43 cases over the previous year. The head-wise detailed figures for the last 10 years are depicted in Table 2.9. Chart 2.6 shows the total crime against persons and its percentage over the total IPC crime.

The head-wise reported incidences of crime against persons and its review over the previous year has been analyzed which is given as under:-

(i) Murder:

During the year 2019, 70 incidences of 'Murder' were reported as compared to 99 cases of previous year. Analysis of the cases have revealed that no organized gang was operating in the State. In most of these cases, crime was committed due to land disputes or murder for gain or personal enmity. Generally, sudden provocation or minor altercation was the reason for commission of most of the murders. There was no class or caste factor involved in the commission of murder.

(ii) Attempt to Murder:

54 incidences of 'Attempt to Murder' were reported during the year 2019 against the annual average of about 62 cases. The motive for the commission of this crime is also the same as mentioned under head 'Murder'

(iii) C.H. not amounting to Murder:

19 incidences of "C.H. not amounting to Murder" were reported during the year 2019 which showed an increase of 12 cases over the previous year.

(iv) Rape :-

359 cases of "Rape" were reported during the year 2019 which showed an Increase of 15 cases over the previous year.

(v) Kidnapping and Abduction:-

During 2019, 455 cases were registered which showed a decrease of 20 cases over the previous year. The analysis shows that

about 51.7% cases of "Kidnapping & Abduction" are reported in Shimla, Mandi and Kangra. The remaining 48.4% cases were reported in rest districts of the State.

(vi) Grievous Hurt:

Total 416 incidences of "Grievous Hurt" were reported during 2019. The analysis shows that about 57.5% incidences of "Grievous Hurt" are reported in Kangra, Hamirpur, Mandi and Sirmaur. The remaining 42.5% cases were reported in the rest districts of the State.

(vii) Rioting:

During the year 2019, 372 incidences of "Rioting" were reported in the State against 404 cases of previous year which showed a decrease of 32 cases over the year 2018. The analysis shows that about 55.9% incidences of rioting are reported in Mandi, Shimla, Sirmaur and Kangra. The remaining 44.09% cases were reported in the rest districts of the State.

(viii) Cruelty to Women:

A total of 228 cases of "Cruelty to Women" were reported in the State during the year 2019 thus showing an increase of 55 cases over the year 2018. The incident under this head has been reviewed in detail in the separate chapter "Crime against Women".

(ix) Assault on women:

During the year 2019, 498 incidences of "Molestation" were reported in the State as against the 513 incidences of previous year which showed a decrease of 15 cases over the year 2018. The cases under this head have been reviewed in detail in the separate chapter "Crime against Women"

(x) Dowry Deaths:

During the year 2019, 04 cases of "Dowry Deaths" were reported in Bilaspur (1), Hamirpur (1) and Kangra (2). The incidences under this head have been reviewed in detail in the separate chapter "Crime against Women".

2.7 Overall Review of Crime against Person:

The overall review on the incidences of crime against persons are more in Kangra, Shimla and Mandi as compared to the other districts of the State. The reasons for commission of offences under this category are family disputes, land disputes, enmity with neighbors/villagers, domestic violence & sudden provocation.

Some of the facts that have come out during the study review are:-

- (i) Offences of murder have taken place in the entire State with no specific concentration.
- (ii) 92% of the persons involved are local.
- (iii) 1.2% of the accused in this crime are in the age-group below 18 years, 36.2% of the persons involved in the commission of this crime are in the age group of 18 to 30 years, 42.3% belong to the category of 30-45 years and the remaining 21.0% are more than 45 years in age.

(DISTRICT WISE)



CHAPTER-3

TRENDS IN DISPOSAL OF IPC CRIMES AND SLL CRIMES BY POLICE AND COURTS

3.1 Disposal by Police

3.1.1 Cases under IPC:


During 2019 total number of 18708 cases including cases pending from the previous years were under investigation. Out of these, approximately 15343 cases were disposed by the police during the year and 3365 cases remain pending for investigation.

Table-3.1 presents the details of crime head wise police disposal during 2019. Tables-3.2 & 3.3 give district wise details of disposal and percentage of disposal respectively. The percentage and type of disposal of under investigation (IPC) cases by police during 2019 is depicted in Chart-3.1.

3.1.2 Pendency:

On an average, 18% cases remained under investigation. In the following districts, pendency was the highest and the disposal lowest:-

3.1.3 Cases under SLL:

The disposal of SLL cases by police under different crime heads is available at Table-3.4. of the total 6501 cases (including pending cases from the previous year) pending investigation, police disposed 82.7% cases. Chart-3.3 presents the type of disposal of SLL cases.

BY POLICE DURING 2019






3.2 Disposal By Courts

3.2.1 Cases under IPC:


Disposal of IPC cases by the courts during 2019 is available in Table 3.7. During 2019 there were 100053 cases pending trial (including the pending cases from the previous years). 93918 of IPC cases remained pending trial at end of the year. The percentage of disposals during the year was 6.1%.

The District wise disposal figures available in Table-3.8 and percentage of disposal is available in Table-3.9. The highest pendency

percentage of cases is seen in Kangra (98.3%). The largest number of cases are also pending trial in Kangra (23407) which has a pendency of 25% of state level. Chart-3.5 depicts percentage disposal of IPC cases by the courts during 2019.

3.2.2 Cases under SLL:-

Head wise disposal of SLL cases by the courts during 2019 is available in Table-3.10. There were 28311 cases pending trial (including the pending cases from the previous years) at the beginning of 2019. Cases which remained pending trial at end of the year were 24483. The percentage of disposals is 13.5%.

Table 3.11 Shows district wise pendency and its share in the state pendency, Distt. Kangra (11286) followed by Shimla (2080), Kullu (2077) and Mandi (1751) cases. Chart-3.6 Shows percentage disposal of SLL cases by the court during 2019.

BY COURTS DURING 2019





DISPOSAL OF (IPC) CASES BY POLICE DURING 2019





CONVICTED CASES (IPC) DURING 2019



CONVICTED CASES (SLL) DURING 2019



CHAPTER-4

CRIMES AGAINST WOMEN

4.1 General:

Crime which are directed specifically against women are characterized as Crime against Women. They may be broadly classified under following two categories:-

1. Crimes against Women identified under the Indian Penal Code (IPC)

- (i) Murder (Sec. 302,303 IPC)
- (ii). Dowry Deaths (Sec. 304B IPC)
- (iii) Abetment to Commit Suicide (Sec.306 IPC)
- (iv) Acid Attack
- (v) Cruelty to Women (Sec. 498A IPC)
- (vi) Kidnapping & Abduction (Sec. 363, 366 IPC)
- (vii) Rape
- (viii) Attempt to Commit Rape
- (ix) Assault on Women with intend to outrage her modesty Sec.354 IPC)
- (x) Insult to the modesty of Women (Sec. 509 IPC)

2. Crimes against Women Identified under the Special and Local Laws(SLL)

Although all laws are not gender specific, the provision of law affecting women significantly have been reviewed periodically and amendments carried out to keep pace with the emerging requirements. Some acts which have special provisions to safeguard women and their interests are

- (i) Immoral Traffic (Prevention) Act
- (ii) Dowry Prohibition Act, 1961
- (iii) The Child Marriage Restrain Act.
- (iv) Protection of women from Domestic violence
- (v) Sati Prevention Act.

The Crimes against Women are being closely monitored in the State. Several measures have been undertaken to tackle this social menace. On one hand, special attention is being paid towards prevention of crimes against women by increased police vigil and by harnessing the resources of the community.

Crime against women has a minor decrease during the year 2019 in comparison to the previous year, 2018. However, last 10 years annual average of crime against women is 1370. During the year 2018, 1646 cases of crime against women have been registered in the state. As compared to 10 years state average, this increase is due to the fact that in past the women usually hesitated to report the unfortunate incidents, which took place with them and also due to change of law. But now on account of increased awareness and change in social values, ethos and social reassurances being provided by the society, free registration of cases, opening of Women Police Stations and Suvidha Yojna started by the HP Police Department, women are more often coming forward to report the offences taking place against them.

HP Police Department has initiated many steps in the recent years to ensure better police response to the malaise. Women Police Stations have been opened in all districts except Kinnaur and Lahaul & Spiti to monitor quick disposal of cases of crime against women. A Women Crime Unit has also been constituted at State CID Hdqrs. 02 AHTU's have also been established in Shimla & Kangra in first phase. No particular area is prone to crime against women in the state. No special organized gang is operative in the state to commit crime against women. In a nutshell, a complete sense of security is prevailing among women folk and they are performing their daily chores without any fear.

4.2 Incidents of Crime against Women:

Head wise incidents of reported Crimes against Women during 2018 and 2019 along with percentage variation are given below has been calculated and presented in Table 4.1.

The cases of assault on women with intent to outrage her modesty and cruelty to women together constitute the largest chunk of crime against women (30.4%). There were substantial number of instances (21.9%) of rape and (20.6 %) Kidnapping and abduction of women and girls.

The district wise incidents and rate of crimes against women during 2019 is presented in Table 4.2 and Chart 4.3 and Chart 4.4.

WOMEN DURING 2019




DURING 2019






CHART 4.4

The head and district wise incidents, their rate and percentage has been calculated and presented in Table 4.3.

The total figures of crime against women for the last 10 years (2010-2019) are presented in Table 4.4 and Chart 4.5.





From the analysis of Crime against Women reported in districts, it is seen that cases of Kidnapping and Abduction, Rape, Assault on women and cruelty to women are reported more in the State during the year 2019. Such occurrence happened in Kangra, Mandi, Shimla, Sirmaur and Bilaspur.

The district which indicates the lowest incidents of crime against women are Lahaul-Spiti (02) Kinnaur (27), Baddi (78) and Chamba (84).

4.3 Head wise incidents of Crime against Women:

The brief explanation of head wise status of Crime against Women during 2018 is given as under:

(i) Murder: (Decrease 40.9%)

Incidents of Murder cases (13) registered during the year 2019 showed a decrease of 40.9% over the previous year. Kangra, reported the highest incidents of Murder (05) under this head followed by Chamba (3), Kullu (2), Baddi, GRP and Kinnaur (01 each). No incidents under this head was reported in rest of the districts.

Reasons:-

- 1. Property disputes amongst family and relationship to capture the property of women.
- 2. Land disputes, Enmity with the villagers or other family members.
- 3. Domestic violence, Torture by In-laws due to various reasons.
- 4. Illicit love affairs especially in hotels etc. to destroy/elope the evidences after rape.
- 5. Sudden provocation during scuffle.

(ii) Rape: (Increase 4.3%)

Total 359 cases of Rape were reported which has shown an increase of 4.3% during 2019 over previous year 2018 (344 cases). The highest incidents of rape were reported in Shimla (62) followed by Mandi (52), Sirmaur (40), Kangra (39), Solan (31), Kullu (29), Baddi (20), Bilaspur (19), Chamba, Hamirpur and Una (18 each) and Kinnaur (12).

Reasons:-

- 1. Illicit love affairs, intimacy and friendship between both parties and discloser of affairs.
- 2. Alluring for marriage and later on due to refusal of parents, refusal for marriage, resulting in registration of cases.

- 3. Due to enmity, fake registration of rape cases.
- 4. Consensual relationship reached in firstly with the consent and later on when caught.
- 5 Registration of minor rape cases are committed forcibly.

(iii) Dowry Deaths:

Under this head 04 incidents were reported in Hamirpur, Kangra and Bilaspur. No incidents under this head was reported in rest of the districts.

(iv) Kidnapping & Abduction: (Decrease 1.2%)

During the year 2019, 337 incidents of Kidnapping & Abduction were registered which showed a decrease of 1.2% over the previous year. Shimla reported the highest incidents (62 cases) under this crime head followed by Mandi (58 cases), Kangra (56), Sirmour (31), Bilaspur (27), Solan (24), Kullu and Hamirpur (16 each), Chamba and Una (15 each) Baddi (14) and Kinnaur (03).

(v) Assault on women with intend to outrage her modesty (Sec.354) (Decrease 2.92%)

498 cases of Assault on women with intend to outrage her modesty were registered during the year 2019 showed a decrease of 2.92% over the previous year. Mandi recorded the highest (91 cases) followed by Kangra (87), Shimla (68), Sirmaur (54), Hamirpur (36), Bilaspur (32), Chamba (30), Kullu (26), Baddi, Solan (24 each), Una (20), Kinnaur (05) and Lahaul & Spiti (01).

(vi) Abetment to Commit Suicide: (Decrease 17.6 %)

The Decreasing trend is seen under this head with 17.6% over the previous year. The highest number of cases were registered in Kangra (15) followed by Mandi (08), Chamba (07), Una (06), Baddi,

Hamirpur (5 each), Bilaspur, Shimla (04 each), Solan (03), Kullu (02) and Kinnaur, Sirmaur (1 each). No incidence under this head was reported in Lahaul & Spiti district.

(vii) Cruelty to Women: (Increase 24.6 %)

228 cases of Cruelty to Women were registered during the year 2019. This head showed an increase of 24.6 % over the previous year. The analysis revealed that highest number of cases (46) were registered in Mandi followed by Una (34), Kangra (30), Sirmaur (27), Bilaspur (19), Hamirpur (18), Shimla (14), Baddi (11), Solan (10), Kullu (08), Chamba (07), Kinnaur (03) and Lahaul & Spiti (01).

Reasons:

- 1. Torture of married women for the purpose of dowry, her ill health etc.
- 2. Harassment and torture of women by her in laws i.e. husband, mother in law, father in law etc.
- 3. Harassment of women in family that she is not capable to do the house hold and agriculture activities.
- 4. Harassment/torture of women by husband due to the illicit relationship of the husband with other woman in the family or relationship.
- 5. Torture/harassment of women by husband or other male member of the family under the influence of liquor.
- 6. Love marriage without the consent of the other family members i.e. father in law and mother in law of the victims.

(viii) Insult to the modesty of Women (Sec. 509 IPC): (Decrease 7.7%)

The decreasing trend is seen under this head by 7.7% over the previous year. The highest number of cases were registered in

Mandi (16), Bilaspur, Kangra (12), Shimla (09), Hamirpur (07), Kullu (06), Chamba (03), Kinnaur, Sirmour (04), Solan (02 each) and Baddi (01). No case was reported under this head in Lahaul & Spiti and Una districts.

(ix) Immoral Trafficking

10 cases of Immoral Trafficking were registered during the year 2019. The analysis revealed that highest number of cases (02 each) were registered in Kullu, Mandi, Sirmaur districts followed by Kangra, Shimla, Solan and Una (01 each). No case under this head was reported in rest of the districts of the State during the year.



5.1 General:

- i. Murder
- ii. Abetment to Suicide
- iii. Infanticide
- iv. Exposure and Abandonment
- v. Hurt/Grievous Hurt
- vi. Kidnapping and abduction
- vii. Rape
- viii. Attempt to commit Rape
 - ix. Assault on Women
 - x. Insult to the modesty of women
 - xi. Protection of Children from sexual Offences
- xii. Juvenile Justice (Care & Protection of Children) Act, 2000
- xiii. Prohibition of Child Marriage Act
- xiv. Other crimes committed against Children

AGAINST CHILDREN DURING 2019





CHART 5.2 INCIDENTS OF CRIMES COMMITTED AGAINST CHILDREN DURING 2019

5.3 Incident:

Table 5.1 shows the incidents and rate of Crime against Children, district wise including its rank.

Totally 748 cases were reported in the State under various sections of IPC. "Kidnapping & Abduction" constituted the largest category 411 cases (54.9%) were reported during the year. The maximum number of 'Kidnapping & Abduction' cases were reported in Shimla district (83 cases), followed by Mandi (69), Kangra, (60), Solan (34),

Sirmaur (32), Kullu, Bilaspur (28 each), Hamirpur, Una (20 each), Chamba (17), Baddi (16), and Kinnaur (4).

The second most prevalent Crime against Children was Rape with POCSO Act which accounted for 197 cases (26.3%). The "Rape" cases were reported highest in District Shimla (36), followed by Mandi (27), Sirmaur (21), Kangra (19), Kullu (18), Solan (17), Bilaspur (12), Baddi, Chamba, Hamirpur and Una (10 each) and Kinnaur (07). No case of Rape is reported in Lahaul & Spiti.

Total 05 cases 1 each in Baddi, Chamba, Kangra, Kullu and Una were reported in the State under head "Murder" of Children.

The incident and percentage contribution of State regarding crimes against children head and district wise presented in Table.5.2.

CHAPTER-6

ARRESTS

6.1 ARRESTS:

Total 18805 persons (13578 under IPC & 5227 under Local & Special Laws) were arrested during the year 2019 in 19924 cases (14480 under IPC & 5444 Local & Special Laws) which is a decrease of 6.9% when compared with the arrests of 20206 persons (14815 under IPC & 5391 under Local & Special Laws) in 2018.

(i) PERSONS ARRESTED UNDER IPC CASES:

During the year 2019 as many as 13578 persons were arrested in 14480 cases registered under IPC as against 14815 persons in 2018. Chart 6.1 depicts persons arrested under IPC crimes during 2017-2019.

PERSONS ARRESTED UNDER IPC DURING 2017-2019




Table 6.1 gives details of arrests made under IPC crime during the last 3 years 2017-2019.

Table 6.2 gives age-group wise and gender wise break up of persons arrested in districts.

Mandi tops in arresting 3570 persons in 2155 cases during 2019 followed by Shimla by arresting 2821 persons in 2088 cases and Sirmaur by arresting 1571 persons in 1086 cases.

In Una 871 cases were registered and 1441 persons arrested. District Kullu has 976 registered cases and arrested 1194 persons, Baddi 990 persons were arrested against the registration of 714 cases during the year 2019. The details of persons arrested under IPC crime head wise & gender wise are presented in Table 6.3.

Chart 6.2 depicts age group wise persons arrested under IPC crime during the years 2019 and Chart 6.3 depicts district wise persons arrested under IPC crime cases during the year 2019 in descending order.

DURING 2019




DISTRICT WISE PERSONS ARRESTED UNDER IPC CRIMES DURING 2019





DURING 2017-2019



Mandi has arrested the highest number (1052) persons with 762 cases registered during the year 2019 followed by Kullu by arresting (1038) persons in (663) cases, Shimla (787) persons in (586) cases and Una (526) in (449) cases registered.

DISTRICT WISE PERSONS ARRESTED UNDER SLL CRIMES DURING 2019



PERSONS ARRESTED UNDER (IPC) CRIMES - 2019







CHAPTER-7

CRIME AGAINST WEAKER SECTIONS OF SOCIETY (SC/ST)

7.1 General:

A complete harmony among different sections of society is prevailing in the State. No particular area of the State is notorious for the commission of offences against the SCs/STs. However sporadic incidents of violence against the members of these communities do take place off and on.

India is a welfare State. It is committed to the welfare and development of its people in general and of vulnerable sections in particular. Equality of status and opportunity to all citizens of the country are guaranteed by the constitution of India which also provides that no individual shall be discriminated against on grounds of religion, caste or sex. Fundamental rights and specific provisions, namely, Articles 38, 39 and 46 in the constitution of India stand testimony to the commitment of the State towards its people. The strategy of the State is to secure distributive justice and allocation of resources to support programmes for social, economic and educational to advancement of the weaker section in general and those of Scheduled Casts and Scheduled Tribes.

7.2 Constitutional Rights:

The Indian Constitution vide Article 15 lays down that no citizen shall on grounds of religion, race, sex or place of birth be subjected to any disability or restriction. It also guarantees that every citizen shall have equality of status and opportunity.

7.3. Legal Rights:

To uphold the constitutional mandate and to safeguard the interests of this section of the society, special social enactments have come into force from time to time including privileges by way of reservations for them.

The major legal enactment sponsored by Centre is:

- (i) Protection of Civil Rights Act, 1955; and
- (ii) SC/ST (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989

The Protection of Civil Rights Act, 1955 was enacted in furtherance of Article 17 of the constitution by which untouchability was abolished and its practice in any form is forbidden. Further, in order to check and deter crimes against SC/STs by persons belonging to other communities, the Scheduled Casts and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989 was brought into force from 30th January, 1990. These enactments have extended the positive discrimination in favour of SCs and STs to the field of criminal law in as much as they prescribe penalties that are more stringent than for corresponding offences under Indian Penal Code (IPC) and other laws.

In addition, in pursuance of the Constitution 65th Amendment Act, 1990, National Commission for SCs and STs was constituted w.e.f. 12th March, 1992 with wide functions and powers of Civil Courts to take up matters which are of vital importance for socio-economic development of SCs and STs.

7.4 The Crimes identified under the Indian Penal Code (IPC) and Local & Special Laws):

- (i) Murder
- (ii) Rape
- (iii) Kidnapping & Abduction
- (iv) Dacoity

- (v) Robbery
- (vi) Arson
- (vii) Hurt
- (viii) PCR Act
- (ix) SC/ST(POA) Act
- (x) Others (Other classified IPC crimes)

7.4.1 Under Special & Local Laws (SLL):

- (i) Protection of Civil Rights Act:1955
- (ii) The SC/STs (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989.

The crime under IPC such as 'Murder', 'Hurt', 'Rape etc. or under Special Acts such as PCR Act & SC/ST (P) Act are already included in overall crimes reported under IPC and SLL respectively and have been discussed in details in the preceding chapters. The data specific to crimes against SC/ST discussed in the following paragraphs is a part and parcel of total crimes but analyzed separately for better comprehension.

Population:


As per 2011 census of Himachal Pradesh, the Scheduled Castes constituted 25.19 % of total population in the State while Scheduled Tribes constituted only 5.7 %. Kangra with the highest population share (22.03%) also represented the highest share of Scheduled Caste (21.15%) followed by Mandi (17%) and Shimla with (12.47%).

7.5 Incident of Crimes against Weaker Section (SC/ST):

The incident of these crimes (IPC+SLL) were reported to be 190 cases in the State during 2019. Head wise details of crime against weaker section for the last 3 years including percentage change over the previous years is presented in Table 7.1. Chart 7.1 depicts the head wise pictorial position of the crime incidents. The district wise and head wise incidents including the rate of crime has been calculated and presented in Table 7.2.

The above data reflects that the incidents of most of the SC/ST (POA) Act and other crimes have increased.

7.6 Head-wise Crime:

Under most of the heads of IPC no incident has been registered during the year 2019. The head wise detailed analysis of all crime heads under which the cases have been registered during the year are given below:

(i) Murder:

During the year 2019, one incident was reported in Una district under head murder against weaker sections in the state.

(ii) Rape:

During the years 2019, 10 incidents of rape were reported in the State. Highest incidents under this head were reported in Kangra (06), followed by Mandi (03) and Solan (01). No case under this head was registered in rest of the districts.

(iii) SC/ST Protection of Civil Rights Act:

During the year 2019, only 4 incidents of PCR Act were reported in Kangra (01) and Kinnaur (03) districts under this head. No case under this head was registered in rest of the districts.

(iv) SC/ST (Prevention of Atrocities) Act 1989 only:

During the years 2019, 156 incidents were reported under this head which showed an increase of (62) cases over the previous year 2018. Highest incidents under this head were reported in Mandi (54) followed by Shimla (31), Kangra (24), Una (17), Kullu (08), Hamirpur & Sirmaur (07 each), Chamba (04), Bilaspur (03) and Solan (01). No incident under this head was reported in rest of the districts.

CHAPTER-8 SUICIDAL DEATHS


8.1 General:

According to Oxford dictionary, 'suicide' means 'the act of killing oneself intentionally'. The 'suicide' word has its origin from Latin word 'sui' (of oneself) plus 'cardere' [kill]. It is a step which is taken by one normally in an emotionally or mentally weak moment when he or she feels coping with life is impossible

The number of suicides reported in Himachal Pradesh during 2019 was 584 as against 740 during 2018 indicating a decrease of 21%.

Mandi recorded the highest number of suicides during 2019 (90) followed by Hamirpur (73), Solan (66), Kangra (65), Shimla (63), Sirmaur (58), Una (40), Bilaspur (35). Suicides during 2010-2019 is presented in Chart 8.1

SUICIDE CASES (MALE AND FEMALE) DURING 2010-2019



From the above table it is revealed that there has been a decrease of over 21% (from 740 to 584) in suicide cases during the year 2019 over the year 2018. The minor increase has been witnessed in Chamba (from 16 to 27), Kinnaur (from 2 to 12), Kullu (13 to 24) and Solan (53 to 66). However, there has been decrease in rest of the districts of the State.

The analysis of the above table reveals that percentage of suicide deaths in Baddi, Bilaspur, Hamirpur, Kinnaur, Mandi, Sirmaur and Solan has remained higher than the percentage of the population of the district concerned during 2018 & 2019. In other words, these 07 districts have higher rated of suicidal deaths as compared to other 06 districts of state.


It is revealed from the above table that the number of males committing suicide outnumber the females (66.6% males as against 35.5% females in 2019) and (66.6% males as against 33.5% females in 2018.

It is further revealed that there has been decrease of 23.6% in

the male suicide cases (from 493 to 377) and also decrease of 16.2% in the number of female suicides cases (from 247 to 207) during the year 2019 as compared to year 2018.



%AGE AGAINST TOTAL CASES DURING -2018 & 2019







The causes that top the list which led to suicides are Family problems (24.4% in 2018) and (34.8% in 2019), followed by illness (8.7% in 2018 and 15.06% in 2019).



The analysis shows that the age profile of most of the suicide

victims both men and women falls into two age-groups of 18-30 and 30-45 years. Thus it can be said that most people who commit suicide do so in the prime of their lives between 18 to 45 years of age (66.2 % in 2018) and (69.8% in 2019) this fact can be further co-related to the reasons for suicide i.e. 'family problems' and 'illness'.



Another aspect that is brought forth is that those who committed suicide were mostly **Professional/Salaried persons** (16.3%) in case of males and **housewives** in case of females (24.3%). This fact can again be co-related to the age profile falling within 18-45 years.



The means adopted for committing suicide range over several methods from drinking too much to jumping from high places. However, the maximum number have committed suicide by **consuming poison**. (54.05% in 2018 and 47.9% in 2019). This is followed by hanging (37.83% in 2018 and 47.08 in 2019).


8.11. Conclusions:

- i) There has been a decrease in the suicide cases committed by men during the year 2019 as against the year 2018.
- (ii) Mandi, Hamirpur, Kangra, Shimla, Sirmour and Solan reported more suicidal deaths as compared to the other 07 districts of the state.
- (iii) The major cause of suicides remained 'family problems' followed by 'illness'. 'Unemployment' is certainly not one of the major causes of suicides as it contributes less than 20% of total suicide cases.
- (iv) Most of the women suicide victims were house-wives. The farmers/agriculturists do not form major group of suicide victims as this group contributes only 2.7% to total suicide cases.
- (v) The majority of the suicide victims were married and in the age group of 18 to 45 years.
- (vi) The most popular means for committing suicide remained taking 'poison' followed by 'hanging'.

MAP-8.1 SUICIDES - 2019





CHAPTER-9

ACCIDENTAL DEATHS

9.1 General:

Incidents of road accidents in Himachal Pradesh show fluctuating trends. The break-up of accidents for the last ten years is shown in Table-9.1

Car/Jeep/Taxi/Tempo account for the largest number of accidents. During the year 2019, 48.7 % of the road accidents were attributed to Car/Jeep/Taxi/Tempo. District wise comparative statement of road accidents during 2018-2019 is presented in Table-9.2. 2896 road accidents were reported during the year 2019 out of which 930 accidents were fatal and 1124 persons died in these cases.

9.2 Accidental Deaths:

Car/Jeep/Taxi/Tempo were responsible for 48.7% of accidental deaths during 2019. Out of 1124 persons who died due to accidents, as many

as 547 were involved in accidents with these type of vehicles. Table-9.2 gives details of road accidental deaths for the year 2019 with break-up of types of vehicles and due to other reasons. Shimla reported the highest (186) numbers of accidental deaths followed by Kangra (155) Kullu (135), Una (133) and Sirmaur (109). Chart-9.1 depicts road accidents occurred during 2010–2019.

Percentage of road accidental deaths according to type of vehicles during the years 2019 is presented in Chart-9.2.

NUMBER OF ROAD ACCIDENTS (2010-2019)



PERCENTAGE OF ROAD ACCIDENTAL DEATHS (ACCORDING TO TYPE OF VEHICLES DURING 2019)



ROAD ACCIDENTAL DEATHS DURING -2019



CHART-9.3 DISTRICT WISE TOTAL ACCIDENTS (FATAL AND NON FATAL DURING 2019)



CHAPTER-10

CYBER CRIME

10.1. Definition of Cyber Crime:

"Any illegal action in which a computer is a tool or object of crime, in other words, any crime, the means or purpose of which is to influence the function of computer."

Computer and Tele-communications are the key areas of cyber crimes. In cybercrimes, computer is used in the following two ways:-

- i.) Computer as a target
- ii.) Computer as a tool

The computer becomes a target of cyber crime when, by way of hacking or intrusion, the criminals access a computer with a motive to impair, damage or alter the system. The hacking can evolve into other substantive violations, for example, alteration of accounts, drawl of money etc. by cyber intrusion into a bank.

Computer becomes a tool for cyber crime when it becomes a convenient method to commit crimes affecting large scale net-works and programmes such as introducing virus into large scale reservation or financial network or unauthorizedly obtaining classified information from data stored in defense and security computers.

10.2 Classification of computer crimes:

The most accepted classification of computer crimes is as follows:

- (i) Computer related frauds.
- (ii) Computer forgery.

(iv) Computer sabotage.

(iii)

- (v) Unauthorized access.
- (vi) Unauthorized interception
- (vii) Unauthorized reproduction of a protected computer programmes

Damage to computer data of computer programmes.

- (viii) Unauthorized reproduction of a topography
- (ix) Alteration of computer data or computer programmes
- (x) Computer espionage
- (xi) Unauthorized use of a computer
- (xii) Unauthorized use of a protected computer programmes.

10.3. Incident of Computer Crime:

During the year 2019, 76 cases under Cyber Crimes (IT Act only 69 cases, IPC with IT act 7 cases) were registered in the State and during 2018 this figure was 68. Chart 10.1 depicts the incidents of Cyber Crimes reported from 2017-2019. Table 10.1 carries the district-wise details of cases registered under IT Act. Table 10.2 gives the details of Cyber Crimes registered and persons arrested under I.T. Act during 2017-2019:-



CHAPTER-11

DETECTION UNDER NARCOTIC DRUGS & PSYCHOTROPIC SUBSTANCE (ND&PS) ACT

11.1 Drug Menace in Himachal Pradesh

The State of Himachal Pradesh is well known for its natural beauty and is one of its natural beauties and is one of the most popular tourist destinations in the world. Unfortunately, this beautiful state has also come to known for wide spread illicit cultivation of cannabis and opium poppy cultivation. Illicit drug produced in the state attract drug traffickers from all over the world. Generally, the youth seems to be the target of this drug menace and its abuse. Considerable drug addiction, particularly among the local youth has been noticed at high rate and the situation is alarming due to unchecked cultivation and spread of drug abuse over the years in the state. Drug abuse and the drug menace is the illicit, non- medical use of limited number of substance, most of drugs which have the properties of altering the mental state of a being in ways that are considered by social norms and defined by statute to be inappropriate, undesirable, harmful threatening to the life of the user and to the society at large. Alcohol, heroin, cocaine, opium, Charas, are some of the drugs abused.

In Himachal Pradesh there are 17495 villages out of which 402 villages of the following five Districts are the natural habitants of cannabis where it grows naturally. Analysis reveals that these five districts of the State have been identified by the drug traffickers for cultivation and transporting of Cannabis at national and international level.

11.2 Narcotic Drugs:

In general, Narcotics drug can be defined as an awareness of sensory impulses, especially pain, by the brain. In large doses it cause of stupor (condition of insensibility), coma or convulsion. These would include:

- (i) Cannabis preparations like Bhang, Ganja and Charas.
- (ii) Opium and Opium alkaloids like morphine.
- (iii) Coca alkaloids like Cocaine.
- (iv) Synthetic narcotic drugs like Pethidine.

11.3 Psychotropic Drugs:

The Greek word Psycho means "Soul" and "Trope" means "Turning', and drug having peculiar affinity for or effect on mind (Mind altering). The term psychotropic drug include:

- 1) Hallucinogens: There are both natural and synthetic Drugs like LSD (Lysergic acid Diethylamide) and tetrahydrocannabinols.
- 2) Hypnotics: Secobarbitone, Phenobarbitone.

- 3) Stimulants: These drugs induce and excitement in the body like amphetamines cocaine.
- 4) Tranquillizers: Methaqualone, Mandrax, etc.
- 5) Depressants: Under this class would fall drugs which are pain killers, analgesics, sedatives, like barbiturates, opiates.



The drug-wise detection during the year 2019 according to the above mentioned table is presented in the chart 11.1. The major detection of poppy husk (1307.024 Kgs) has been made during the year 2019 followed by Charas (327.4 Kgs.), Ganja (21.372 Kgs), Opium 17.968 Kgs. Detection of other drugs i.e. Smack/ heroin etc. has also been made during the year 2019.



11.6 Detailed Analysis:

The Incidence of (1439) under the ND&PS Act showed an increase of 7.2% over 2018. Cases under this act constituted 26.43% against the total Local & Special Law reported cases during the year 2019. The highest incidents (259) under this head were reported in Kangra followed by Kullu (226), Mandi


(181), Shimla (173), Bilaspur (120), Solan (108), Una (90), Chamba, Sirmaur (66 each), Baddi (65), Hamirpur (52), Kinnaur (25), CID (07) and Lahaul & Spiti (1).

The main concentration on the incidents registered under this act remains on Kangra, Kullu and Mandi with 46.28% of the total registered cases. The analysis reveals that the main source/area of drugs are Kullu, Mandi, Kangra, Shimla and Chamba. Further, carriers of this contraband are mostly agriculturists, laborers and poor people.

Of the total persons apprehended under this Act 83.6% belong to Himachal Pradesh. Study of age profile shows that mostly adults between 18-30 years of age are involved (53.7%). About 36.6% were in the age group of 30-45 years. Above 45 years were 9.8%.

The participation of children below 18 years is negligible (0.8%). Only seven Foreigners were involved in this activity. Previous 10 years (2010-2019) crime under this head is presented in Chart-11.1

CHAPTER-12

POLICE STRENGTH, INFRASTRUCTURE

AND EXPENDITURE

12.1 Police Strength:

The sanctioned strength of the Police personnel in the Himachal Pradesh during the year 2019 was 19457 while actual strength is 17987. Total strength of (GOs) Class-I is 325, which includes 94 IPS and 185 HPS. Total Class-II GOs are 28. The strength of executive force is 17733 which includes 2191 NGOs Grade-I: Inspectors (289), Sub-Inspectors (714) Assistant Sub-Inspectors (1188). The strength of Head Constables and Constables is 15542, (HCs-2986 and Const.-12556). The strength of ministerial staff (Class-III) is 637, Class-IV 542 and other Whole time, Daily Wagers and Part Timers) is 176. The rank wise detailed sanctioned position and actual strength is presented in Table 12.1.

During the year 2019, there were 1 Zone, 3 Ranges (Northern, Southern & Central), 13 Districts (including one Police District at Baddi), 34 Police Sub-Divisions, 136 Police Stations (including 2 Police Stations of GRP and two Police Stations of CID. Detailed summary is given in Table 12.2.

12.3 Police Housing:

The details of different types of available Police housing are depicted in Table 12.3.

12.4 Police Budget:

The budget allocation for Police department in Himachal Pradesh for the last 3 years is depicted in Table 12.4. During the budget year 2019-2020 Himachal Pradesh Police Budget account for 2.86 % of the total budget for Himachal Pradesh.

12.5 Equipment & Transport:

The district wise number and type of available equipment with Himachal Pradesh, during 2019 are presented in Table 12.5. There are 78 HF Sets, 975 VHF Sets, 1512 Willkie Talkies and 17 other equipment available with the Himachal Police Department.

At present the total available (fleet) strength in Himachal Pradesh Police is 493 Motor Cycles, 226(Gypsy/Jeep/Bolero/Tata Mobiles), 169 Heavy Vehicles and 32 Vans & others. The district wise detail summary is given in Table 12.6.

GLOSSARY

Arrest Rate:

Number of arrests per lakh of population.

Charge sheeting Rate:

Percentage of cases charge sheeted to cases in which investigations were completed.

Cognizable Offences:

A cognizable case means a case in which, a police officer may in accordance with the first schedule of the Code of Criminal Procedure 1973 or under any other Law for the time being in force, arrest without warrant.

Conviction Rate:

Percentage of cases that resulted in conviction to the number of cases in which trials were completed during a year.

Crime Against Women:

Rape, Dowry deaths, molestation, Cruelty by husband and relatives, Sexual harassment, Kidnapping & abduction of women and girls, dowry Prohibition Act.

Crime Rate:

Incidence of crime per lakh of population.

Disposal Rate by Police:

Percentage of cases investigated and challaned to total cases meant for investigation during the year.

Disposal Rate by Courts:

Percentage of cases disposed to total cases pending/trial during a year.

Indian Penal Code:

A Penal Code for India listing out the offences and their punishments (Act No. XLV of 1860).

Local Law:

A law applicable only to a particular state/part of India.

Offence:


The word offence means any act or omission made punishable by any law for the time being in force.

Property Offence:

Include Burglary, Theft, Dacoity and Robbery.

Special law:

A law applicable to a particular subject.
