CHAPTER-1

INCIDENT AND RATE OF COGNIZABLE CRIME IN HIMACHAL PRADESH

1.1 General:

Himachal Pradesh is a hilly and a peaceful State. There are sporadic incidents of crime taking place, but no particular area of any district of this State is notorious for any class or category of crime. There has not been any abnormal fluctuation in the incidence of crime in the State.

The crime situation has remained peaceful and well under control during the year 2022 throughout the State of Himachal Pradesh. No alarming increase was noticed under any major head of crime.

1.2. The Parameters for Review and Analysis of Crime:-

The following parameters have been adopted while analyzing crime for the year 2022:-

- ➡ Geographical spread.
- ➡ Reasons for commission of crime, especially in offences against persons.
- ➡ Investigation process followed.
- ➡ Recovery of property.
- ➡ Profile of criminals.

1.3. Reported Incidents of Cognizable Crimes:

The ten years trends of incidence and rate of total cognizable crime under Indian Penal Code (IPC) and Local & Special Laws (2013-2022) is presented in **Table-1.2** at the end of the chapter. A total of 19053 cognizable crime cases were reported during the year 2022. These comprise 13231 cases under IPC and 5822 cases under (SLL) Special & Local Laws. (**Table-1.1** and **Chart-1.1 & 1.2**)

FOR THE LAST 10 YEARS (2013-2022)

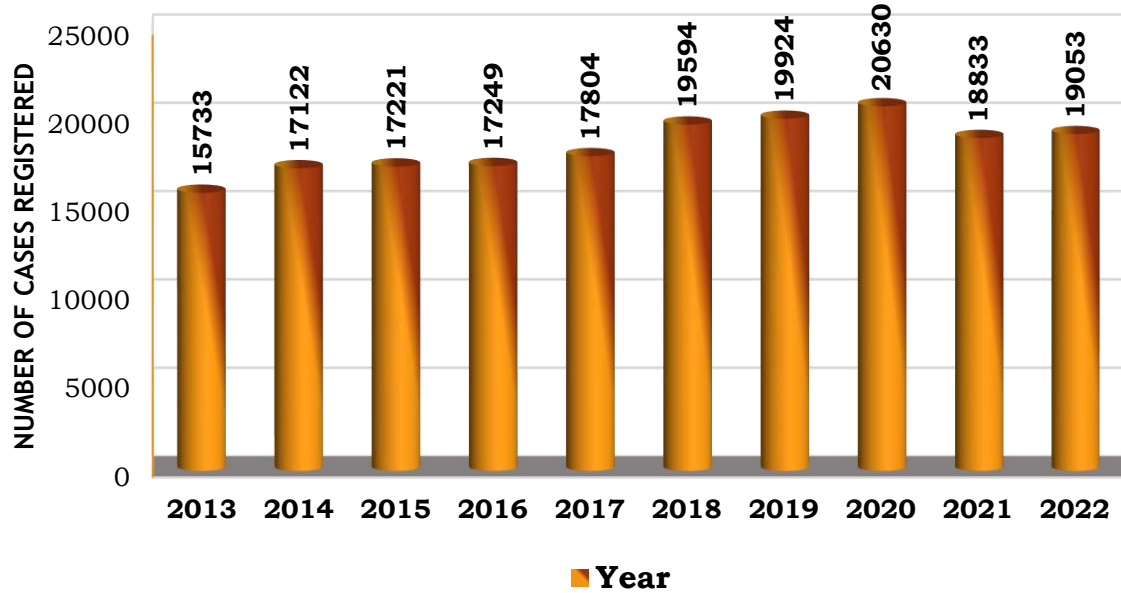
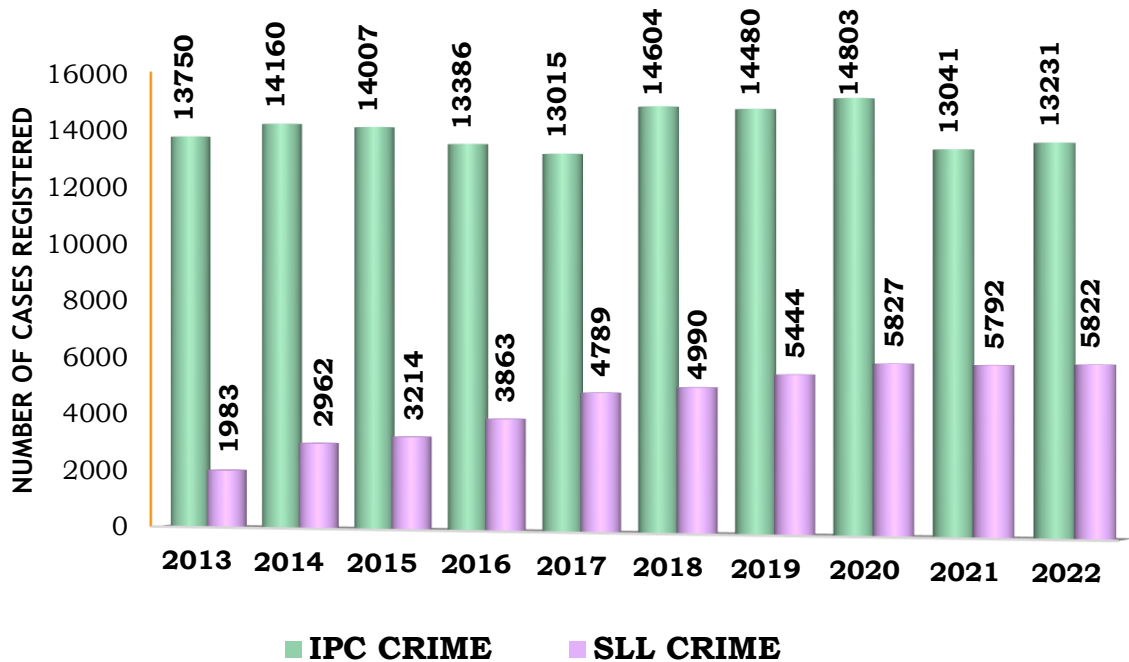


CHART-1.2

1.4. Crime Trends:

1.4.1. Crime Incidents:

During the year 2022, cases of cognizable crime have increased by **1.16% (+220)** as compared to the registration of cognizable crime cases of the corresponding year. The registration in IPC crimes has recorded an increase of **1.45%** and Special & Local Laws crime has recorded a increase of **0.51%** in 2022 as compared to the previous year.

A total of 13231 IPC cases were reported in the State during 2022, as against 13041 cases in 2021 (**1.45% increase**). District Kangra has recorded crime incidents between 2001 to 3000 IPC cases. Kullu, Mandi, Shimla & Sirmour districts have recorded crime incidents between 1001 to 2000 IPC cases. Baddi, Bilaspur, Chamba, Hamirpur, Solan & Una districts have recorded crime incidents between 501 to 1000 IPC cases. The crime incidents in districts Kinnaur, Lahaul & Spiti, Railway & Traffic Unit, CID and Cyber Units have remained below the figure of 500 cases. The district

wise volume of crime is depicted in **Table 1.3**.

1.4.2. District-wise IPC Crime Trends:

The highest occurrence of IPC cases was reported in Kangra (2454 cases) followed by Mandi (1810), Shimla (1743), Sirmour (1030), Kullu (1001), Bilaspur (949), Solan (863), Una (851), Hamirpur (773), Baddi (712), Chamba (641), Kinnaur (250), Lahaul & Spiti (118), CID (18), GRP (114) and Cyber PS (4). The details of number of districts falling under different ranges of incidents of IPC crimes during the year 2022 are presented in **Table 1.3**.

1.5. Crime Pattern: (IPC Crimes)

As compared to 2021, this year the incidents of Attempt to Murder, Culpable Homicide, Burglary, Theft, Rioting, Grievous Hurt, Assault on Women, Accident have shown an increases, while incidents of Murder, Kidnapping & Abduction, Dacoity, Dowry Deaths, Cruelty to women and other IPC have shown a decrease. There is no

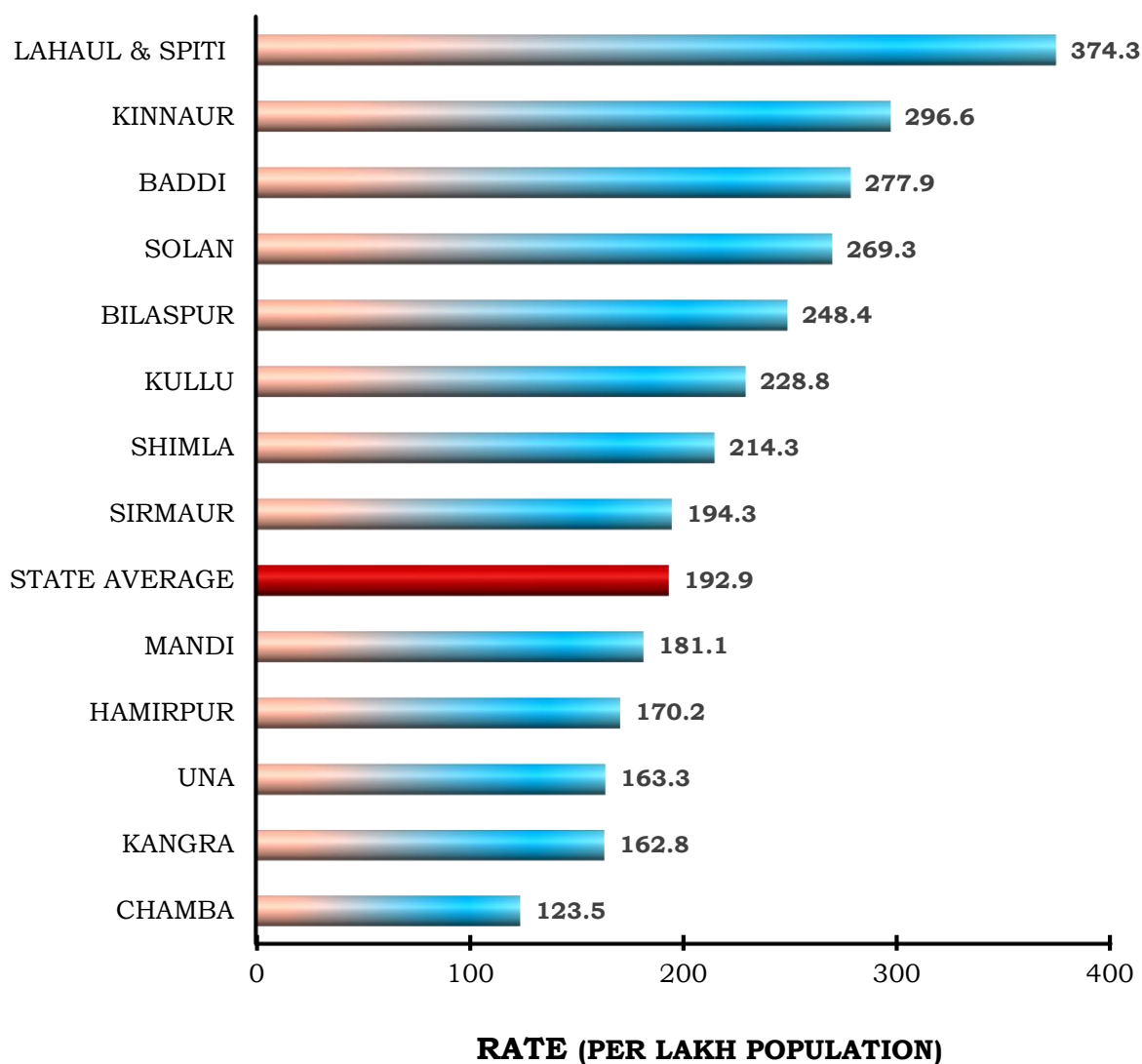
increase or decrease in Robbery cases.

1.6. Crime Rate:

The District wise Crime Rate is presented in **Table-1.4**. The average IPC Crime Rate in the State for 2022 was 192.9. The highest

Crime Rate districts are Lahaul & Spiti (374.2) followed by Kinnaur (296.5), Solan (265.5), Bialspur (248.3), Kullu (228.8), Shimla (214.2), Sirmaur(194.2), Mandi (181), Hamirpur (170.1), Una (163.3), Kangra (162.8) and Chamba (123.4).

Head Wise Analysis of IPC Offences:

The head wise analysis of IPC offences is presented in Table-1.5. The head wise statistics shows the following trends:-

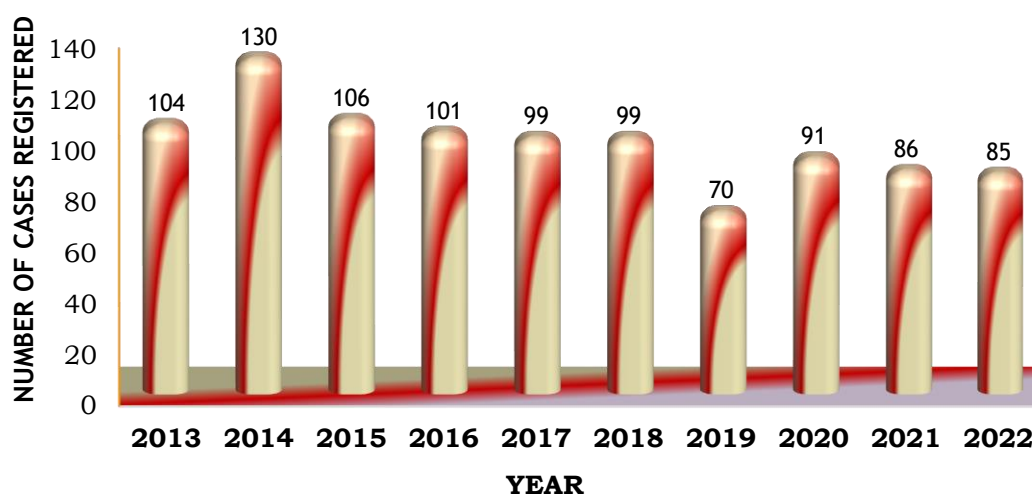
(i) Murder: (Decrease of 1.16 %)

The incidents of murder (85) in 2022 decreased by 1.16% as compared to the previous year. The highest incidents of murder were reported in Kangra & Shimla (15 each), Kullu (10), contributing 52.94 % of the total cases. Other districts which reported more than 4 cases are Baddi & Mandi (8 each), Sirmaur (7), Una (6), Solan & Bilaspur (04 each)

The lowest number of incidents of murder were reported in Chamba, (03), Kinnaur & Lahaul & Spiti (2 each) Hamirpur (01). No Incident under this head was reported in CID, GRP & Cyber. The number of cases registered in the previous 10 years (2013-2022) under this head are presented in Chart-1.4.

The analysis of the causes has revealed that no organized gang was operating in the State. In most of these cases, crime is committed due to various types of disputes or murder for gain or personal enmity, love affairs and illicit relationships. There was no class or caste factor involved in the commission of murders.

INCIDENTS OF MURDER DURING (2013-2022)

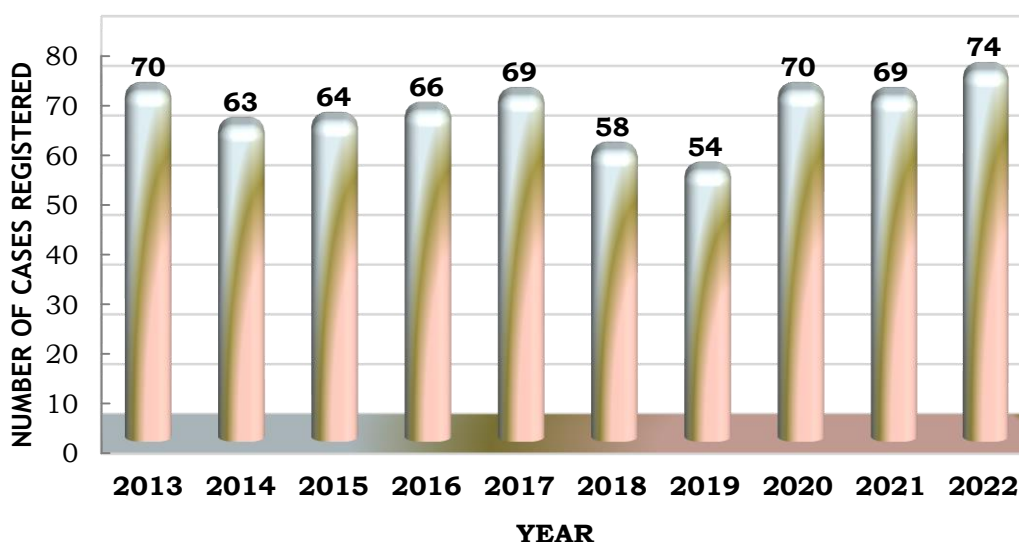


(ii). Attempt to commit**Murder: (Increase of 7.24%)**

The incidents of Attempt to Commit Murder (74) reported during this year have increased by 7.24 %. The highest incidents under this head were reported in districts Kangra and Mandi (16 each), followed by Baddi, Hamirpur & Shimla (8 each),

Bilaspur (6), Una (4) Kullu (3) Sirmaur (2), Chamba, L&S, and Solan (1 each). No incident under this head was reported in Kinnaur district, GRP, CID & Cyber Units. Previous 10 years (2013-2022) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.5](#).

INCIDENTS OF ATTEMPT TO MURDER DURING (2013-2022)

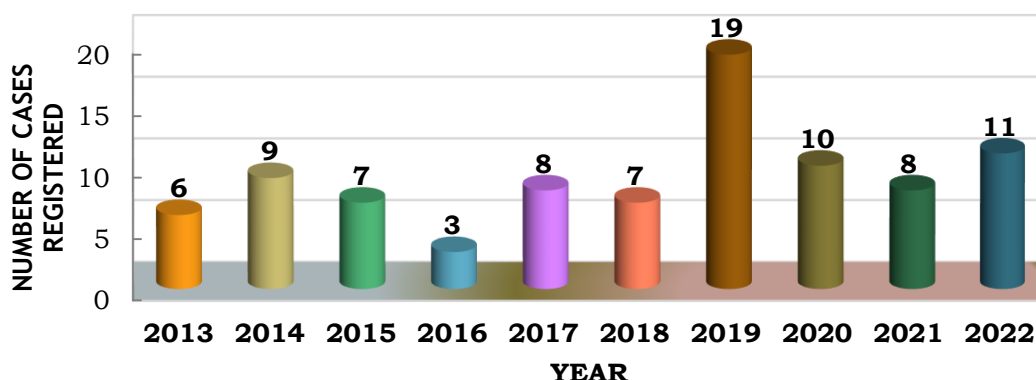


(iii). Culpable Homicide not amounting to Murder: (Increase of 37.5%)

Total 11 cases of Culpable Homicide not amounting to Murder were reported during 2022, showing an increase of 37.5% over the previous year (8 cases). The highest number of incidents 03

were reported in Hamirpur & Mandi districts, followed by Sirmaur (2), Bilaspur, Shimla & Una (1 each). No incident under this head was reported in the remaining districts/Units of the State. Previous 10 years (2013-2023) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.6](#).

DURING (2013-2022)

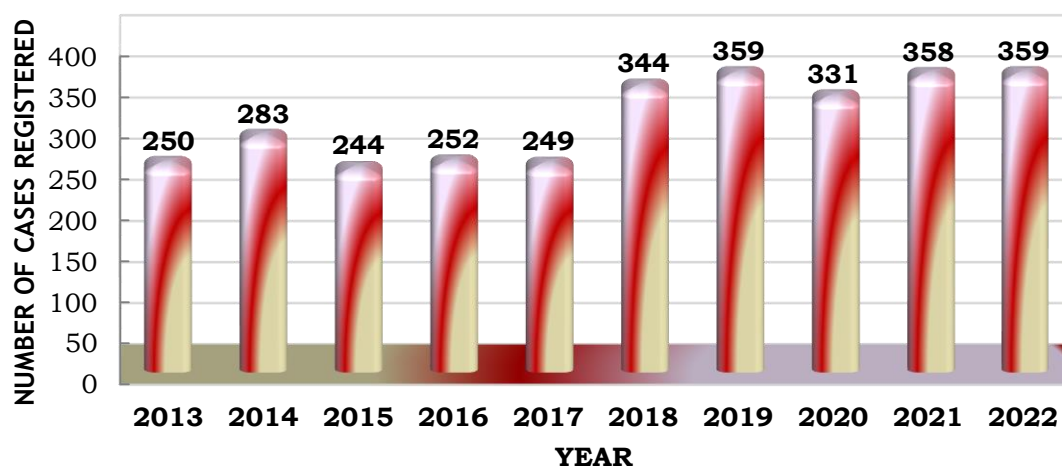


(iv). Rape: (Increase of 0.27%)

Total 359 cases of Rape were reported during 2022; an increase of 0.27% over the previous year (358 cases). The highest incidents of Rape were reported in district Mandi (58), followed by

Kangra (53), Shimla (57 each), Sirmaur (48), Shimla (38), Baddi (36), Kullu (30), Una (24), Solan (17), Bilaspur (13), Kinnaur (11), Hamirpur (6) L&S (1). Previous 10 years (2013-2022) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.7](#).

INCIDENTS OF RAPE DURING (2013-2022)

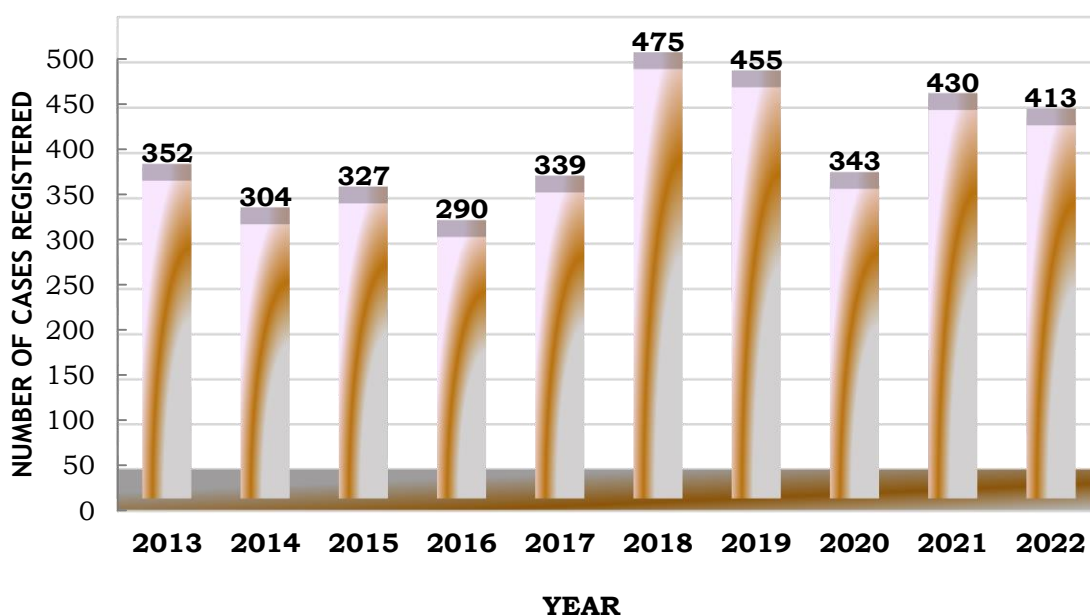


(v). Kidnapping and Abduction:
(Decrease of 3.95 %)

During the year 2022, a total number of 413 cases of Kidnapping and Abduction were reported; a decrease of 3.95% as compared to the previous year. The highest number of incidents were reported in district Kangra (63), followed by Shimla (54),

Mandi (49), Solan (46), Kullu (44), Sirmaur (34), Una (25), Hamirpur, (24), Chamba (23), Bilaspur (22), baddi (18) and Kinnaur (11). No incidents reported in Kinnaur district and other units. Previous 10 years (2013-2022) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.8](#).

DURING (2013-2022)

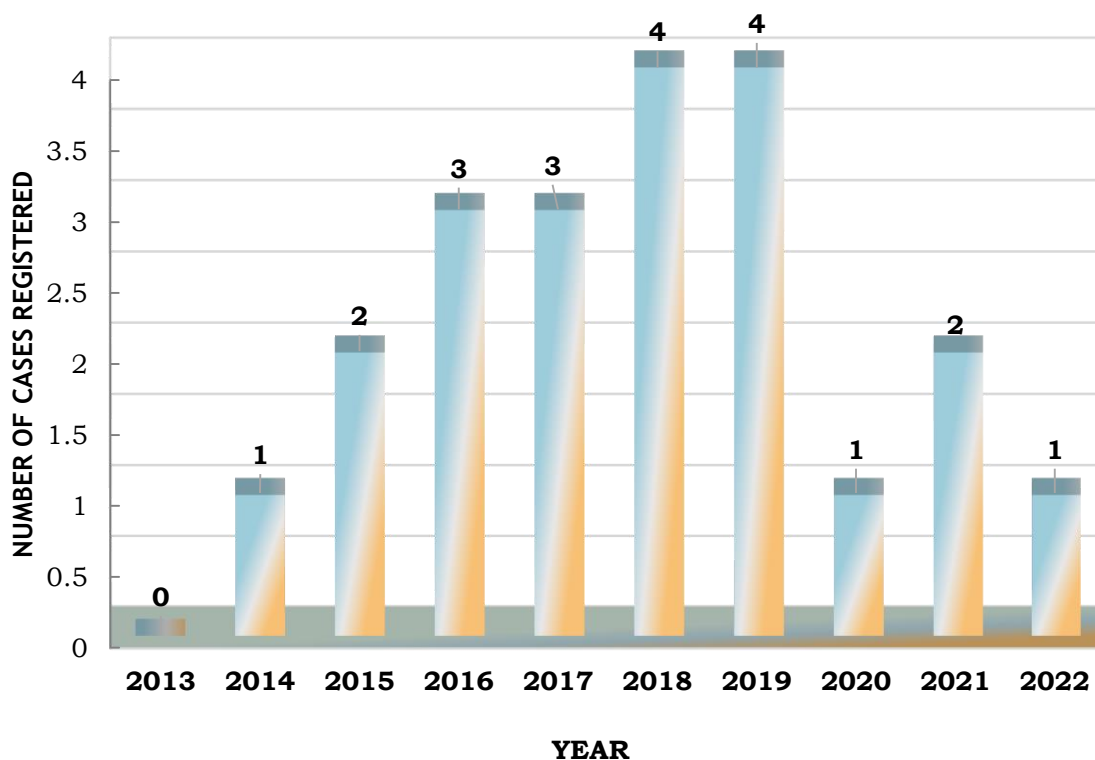


(vi). Dowry Death: (Decrease of 50%)

1 incidents of Dowry Death in district Kangra was reported during the year 2022, as compared to 2 incidents during the previous

year. No incident of dowry death was reported in the other districts. Previous 10 years (2013-2022) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.9](#).

DURING (2013-2022)



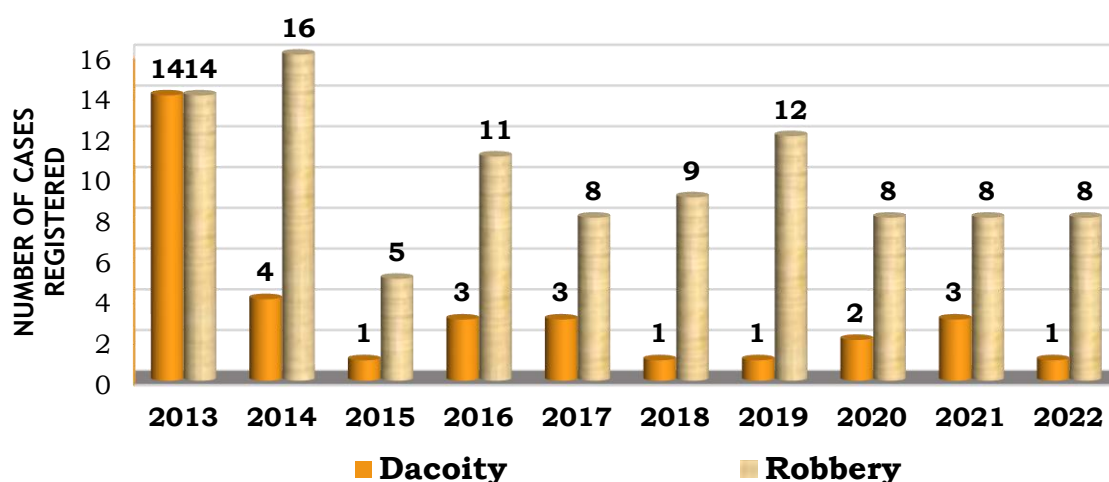
(vii). Dacoity: (Decrease of 50%)

During the year 2022, a total number of 1 case in districts Kangra with the decrease of 66.6% as compared to the previous year, have been registered. No incident under this head was reported in the remaining districts of the State. The previous 10 years (2013-2022) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.10](#).

(viii). Robbery: (Variation 0%)

During the year 2022, 8 cases of Robbery were registered in the State. The highest number of incidents were reported in district Shimla & Kangra (2 each), followed by Kullu, Mandi, Solan & Una (1 each). No case under this head was reported in rest of the districts of the State. Previous 10 years (2013-2022) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.10](#).

INCIDENTS OF DACOITY AND ROBBERY DURING (2013-2022)

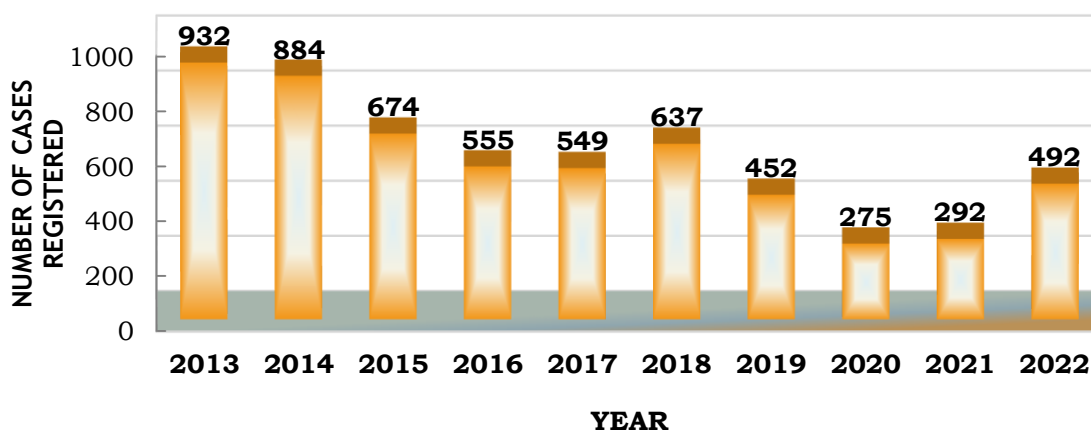


(ix). Burglary: (Increase of 68.49%)

The incidents of Burglary (492) recorded an increase with 68.49% during the year 2022 as compared to the previous year. The highest number of Burglary cases were reported in district Kangra (128), followed by Sirmaur (55), Shimla (49), Solan (42), Una (38), Baddi (37), Bilaspur & Mandi

(33 each), Kullu (27), Hamirpur (25), Chamba (13) Kinnaur (10), L&S (2). No case under this head was reported in rest of the units of the State. The highest crime rate under this head was 14.4 in Baddi district and the lowest in Chamba 2.5, as against the State average of 8.49. Previous 10 years (2013-2022) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.11](#).

INCIDENTS OF BURGLARY DURING (2013-2022)

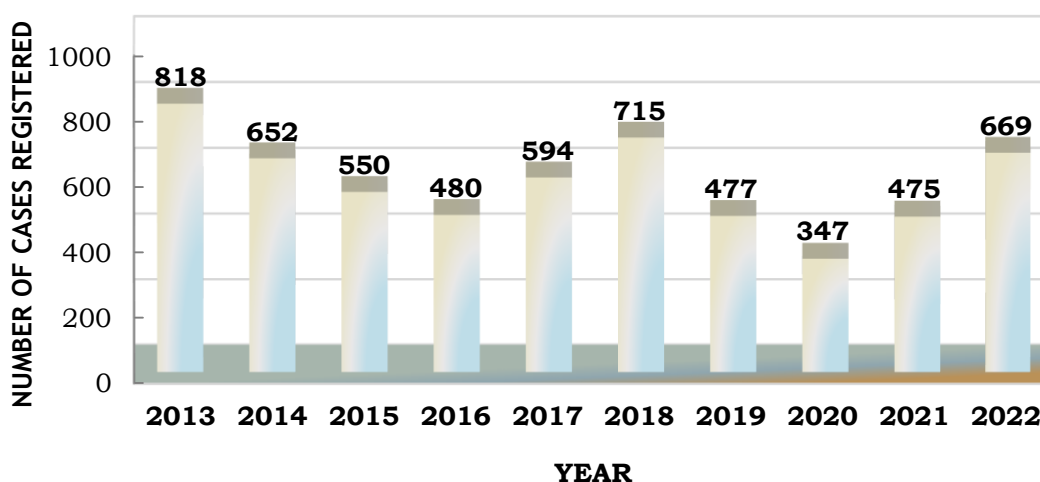


(x). Theft: (Increase of 40.84%)

The Incidents of Theft (669) recorded an increase of 40.84% during the year 2022 over the previous year. Kangra district has reported the highest incidents (131 cases), followed by Solan (89), Shimla (82), Sirmaur (76), Baddi (67), Bilaspur (47), Mandi (45), Una (43), Kullu (34), Hamirpur (23),

Chamba (22), Kinnaur (05), Lahaul & Spiti (4) and GRP (01). The highest crime rate under this head was in Solan district (27.8) and the lowest (4.2) in Chamba district as against the State average of 8.69%. Previous 10 years (2013-2022) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.12.

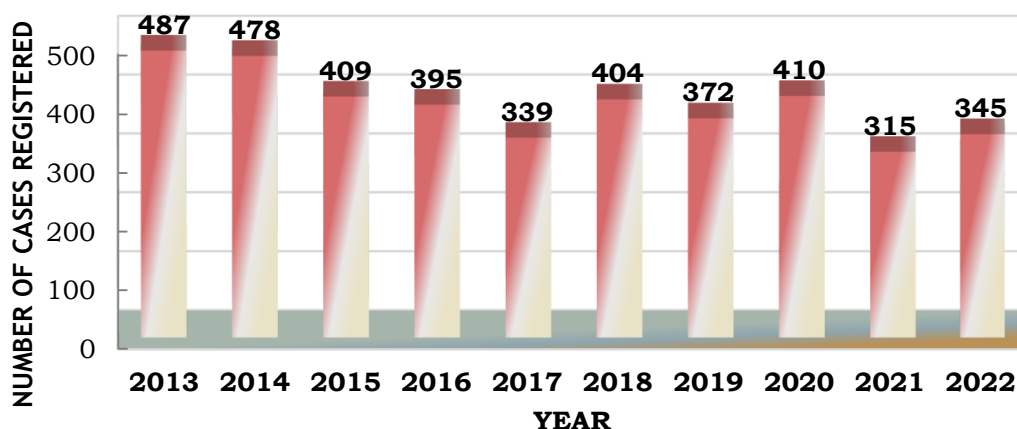
CHART-1.12

**(xi). Riots: (Increase of 9.52%)**

Incidents of Riots (345) registered during the year 2022 recorded an increase of 9.52% over the previous year. The highest number of incidents were reported in district Sirmaur (66), followed by Kangra (65), Una (37), Shimla (35),

Baddi (33), Kullu (31), Mandi (20), Solan (19), Bilaspur (17), Chamba & Hamirpur (7 each) & Kinnaur (06). The lowest incidents were reported in district Lahaul-Spiti (02). Previous 10 years (2013-2022) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.13.

INCIDENTS OF RIOTING DURING (2013-2022)

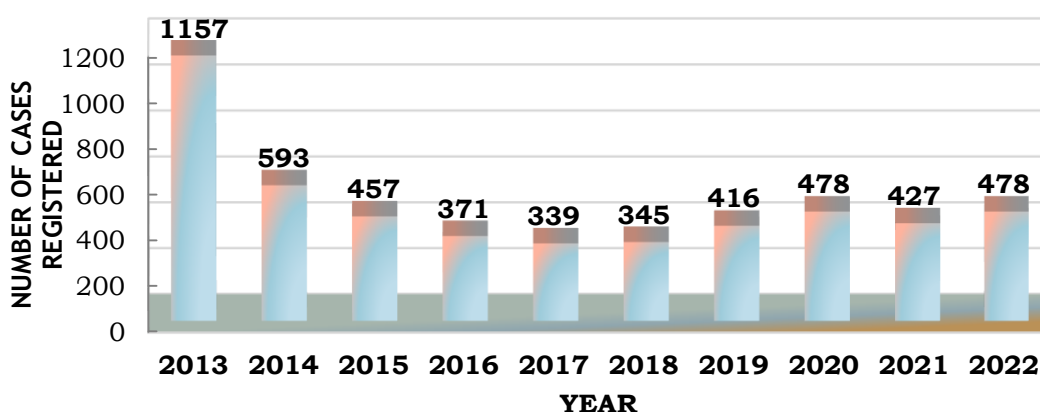


(xii). Grievous Hurt: (Increase of 11.94%)

A total number of 478 cases under the crime head Grievous Hurt were reported during 2022; an increase of 11.94% over the previous year. District Kangra has reported the highest number of incidents (112) under this head,

followed by Mandi (71), Shimla (59), Hamirpur (52), Sirmaur & Una (30 each), Baddi, Bilaspur & Chamba (25 each), Kullu (22), Solan (17) and the least number of cases were reported in district Kinnaur (8) and L&S (2). Previous 10 years (2013-2022) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.14](#).

INCIDENTS OF HURT DURING (2013-2022)

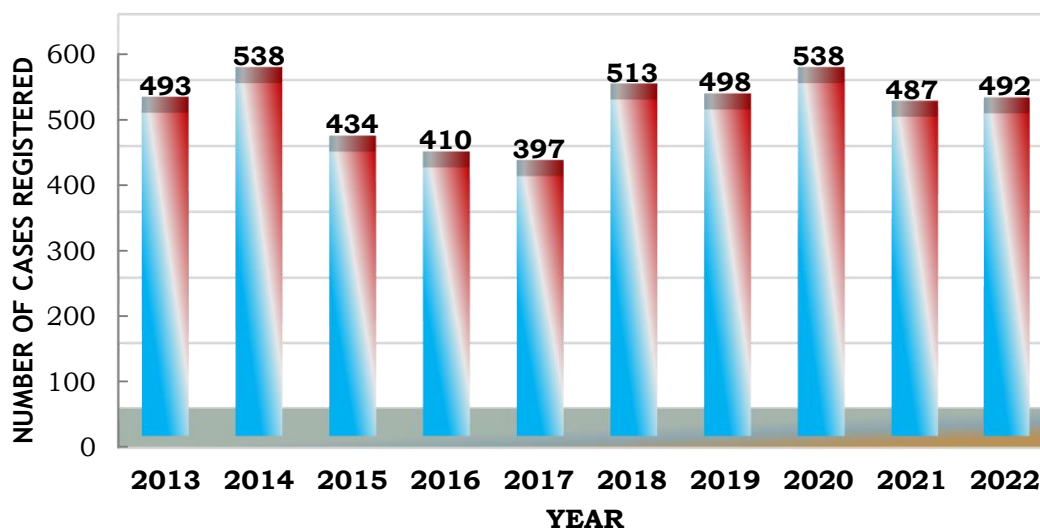


(xiii). Assault on Women:
(Increase of 1.02%)

A total of 492 cases were reported during the year, showing a decrease of 1.02% over the previous year. District Kangra has reported the highest number of incidents (101), followed by Mandi

(75), Sirmaur (54), Shimla (46), Hamirpur (41), Bilaspur & Chamba (32 each), Kullu & Una (31 each), Baddi (22), Solan (19) and Kinnaur (7), Lahual & Spiti (1). Previous 10 years (2013-2022) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.15.

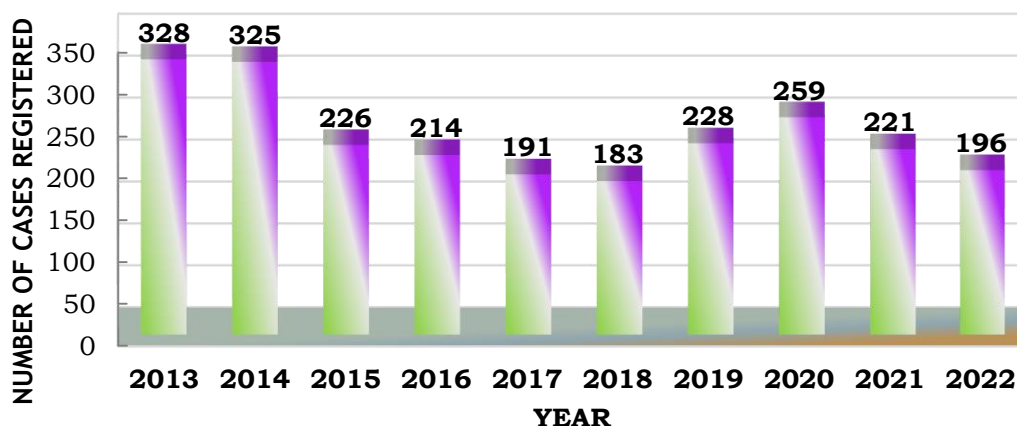
CHART-1.15

(xiv). Cruelty to women:
(Decrease of 11.31%)

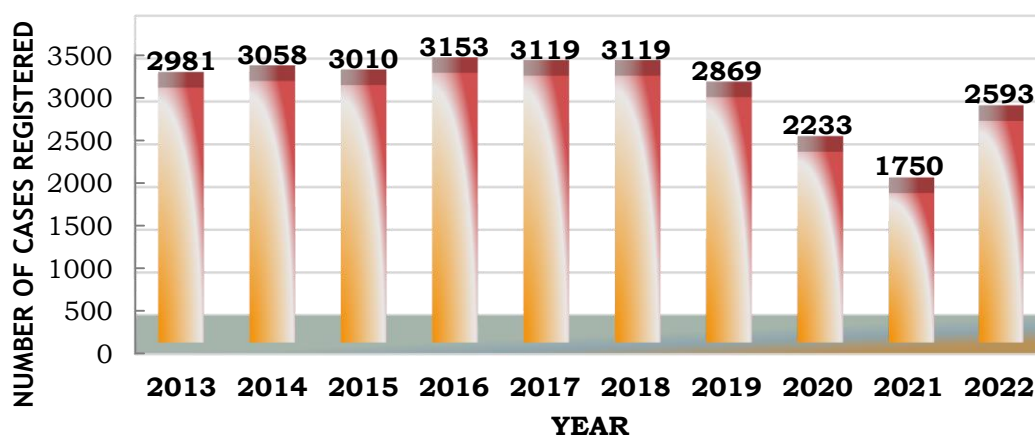
A total of 196 cases were reported during the year, showing a decrease of 11.31% over the previous year. 38 cases were reported in district Kangra, followed by Mandi (29), Una (24),

Sirmaur (21) Bilapur (18), Chamba (16), Shimla (14), Hamirpur (13), Baddi (11), Kullu (5), Solan (4) & Kinnaur (3). No incident reported in Lahul & Spiti district. Previous 10 years (2013-2022) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.16.

A total of 2593 cases of accident were registered during the year 2022 showing an increase of 48.17% over the previous year. The highest number of accidents were registered in district Kangra with 424 cases, followed by Shimla (355),

Mandi (324), Sirmaur (267), Una (235), Kullu (218), Solan (178), Bilaspur (171), Baddi (151), Hamirpur (109) Chamba (98). The lowest number of cases were reported in Kinnaur (37), Lahaul & Spiti (26). Previous 10 years (2013-2022) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.17.

(xvi). Other IPC Crimes (Decrease of 15.62 %)

Cognizable IPC Crimes which do not fall under any of the above specified categories are termed as “Other IPC Crime”. As many as 7014 other IPC crimes, accounting for 53.01% of the Total IPC crimes, were registered in the State during 2022.

Incidents of IPC Crime (Head-wise), along with percentage

share, are presented in Table-1.6. The ten year trend in percentage change (head-wise) is presented in Table-1.7. District-wise and head wise details of IPC offences are available in Table-1.8 and Table-1.9. Previous 10 years (2013-2022) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.18 and percentage of Other IPC cases against IPC cases for the last 10 years is presented in Chart. 1.18.

INCIDENTS OF OTHER IPC CRIMES DURING (2013-2022)

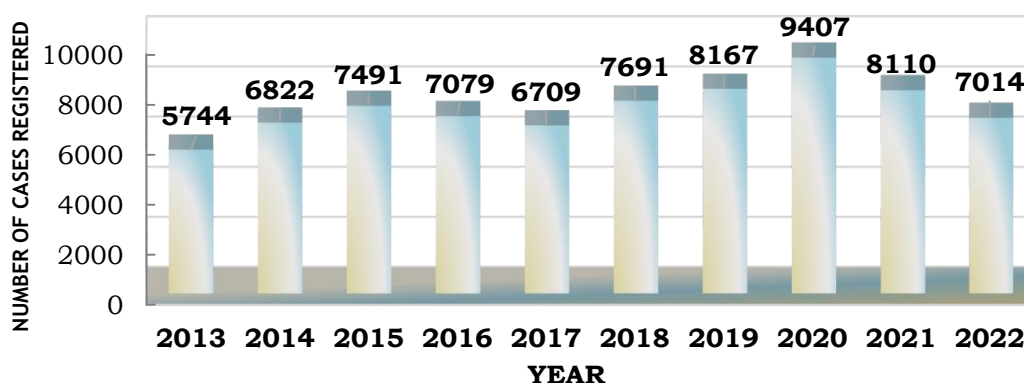

PERCENTAGE OF OTHER IPC CASES AGAINST TOTAL IPC FOR THE LAST 10 YEARS (2013-2022)

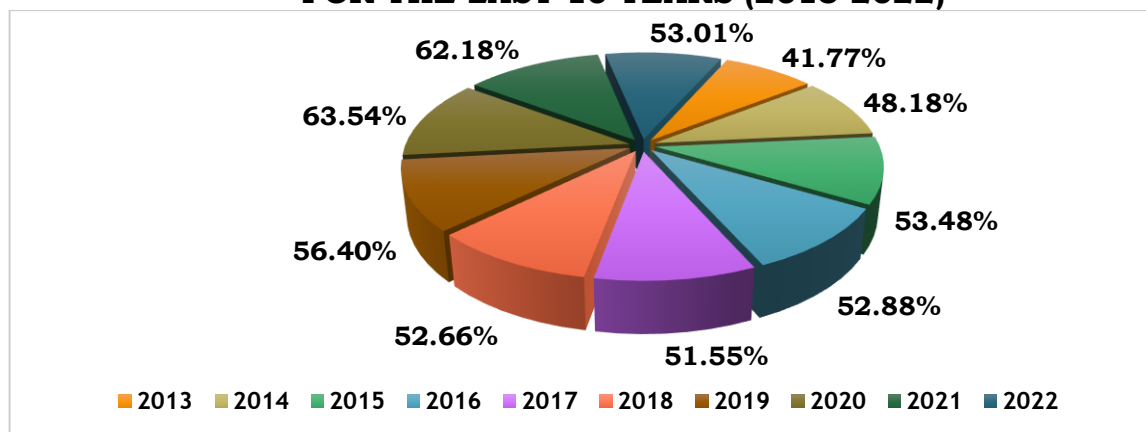
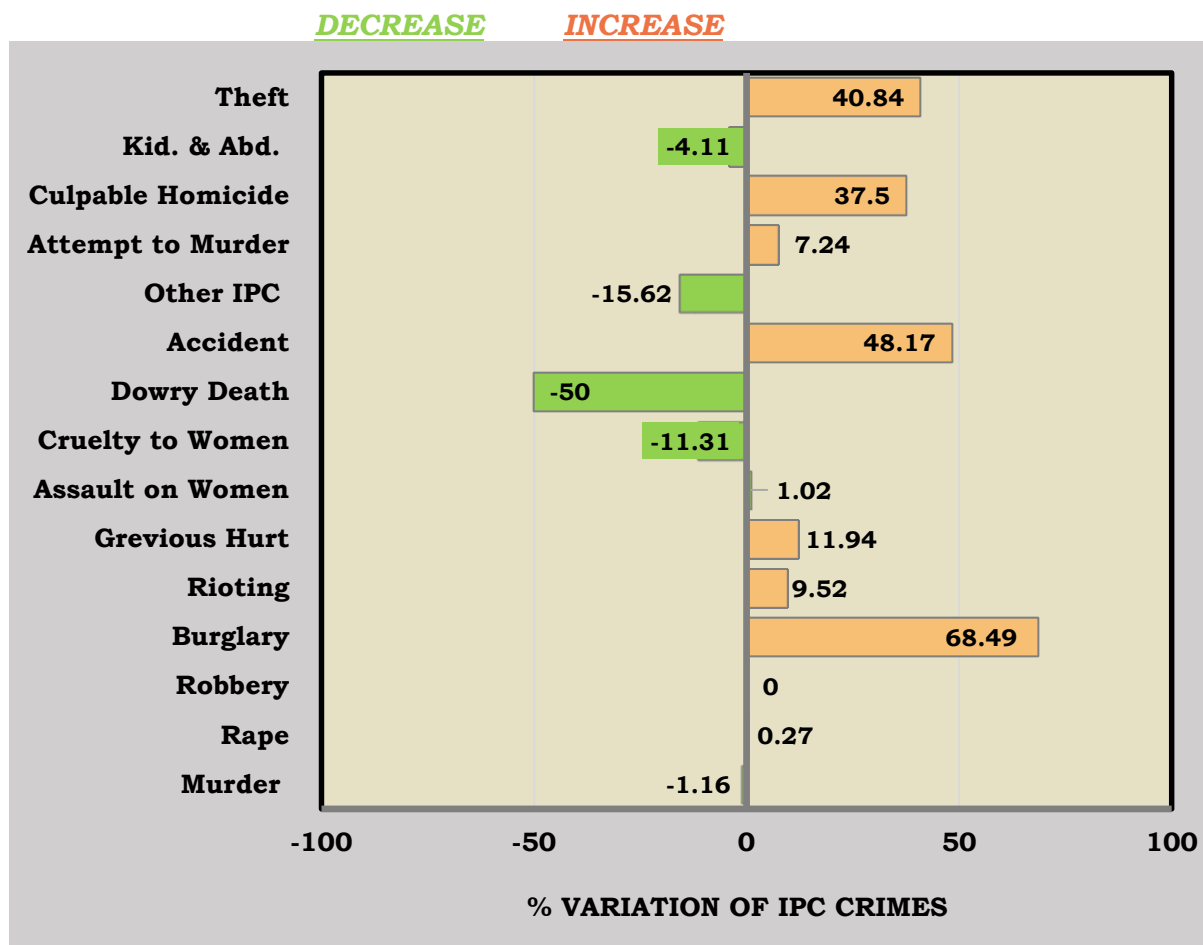


CHART-1.20

1.8 Crime under Local and Special Laws:

A list of Special and Local Laws is available at Annexure-II. Incidents and rate of cognizable Local & Special Law crimes during 2013 to 2022 are presented in [Table-1.10](#).

A total of 5822 cognizable Local & Special Law (SLL) crimes were registered in the State during 2022. The head-wise

percentage distribution of various cognizable crimes under Local & Special Law for 10 years from 2013 to 2022 is presented in [Table-1.11](#). There is an increase of 0.51% in registration over the previous year.

The crime head-wise incidents and rate of cognizable Local & Special Law crimes in different districts are presented in [Table-1.12](#).

Incidents of Local & Special Law cases under important Special and Local Laws are elaborated below:-

1.8.1 Head Wise Analysis of SLL Offences:

(i). Arms Act: (Increase of 38.09%)

During this year, 29 cases of Arms Act have been registered, depicting an increase of 38.09% over the previous year. The highest number of incidents under this head were reported in district Bilaspur & Kangra (6 each), followed by Kullu (4), Shimla (5) Hamirpur & Mandi (3 each), Sirmaur (2) Baddi, Chamba, Kullu and Solan (1 each). No case under this Act was reported in the remaining districts.

(ii). Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act (ND&PS): (Decrease of 1.36%)

A total of 1516 cases were registered under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act in the year 2022, as compared to 1537 cases during previous year, showing a decrease of 1.36%. Cases under this Act constituted 26.03% against the total Local & Special Law cases reported during 2021. The highest number of incidents under this head were reported in district Shimla (239), followed by

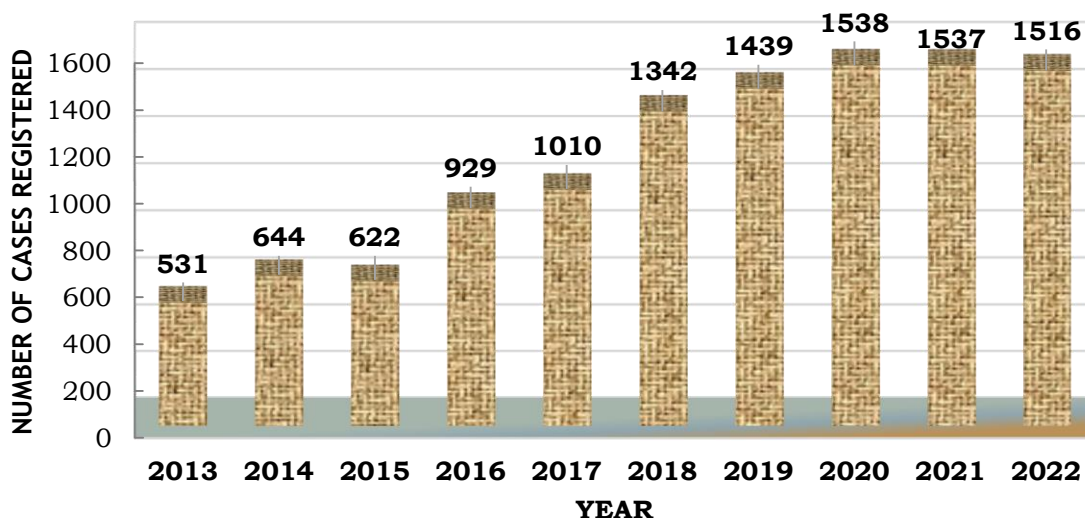
Mandi (212), Bilaspur (192), Kullu (186), Kangra (170) Solan (90) Chamba (89), Una (84), Sirmaur (81), Hamirpur (79), Baddi (54) Kinnaur (34) and Lahaul & Spiti (6).

The main concentration on incidents registered under this Act remains in Shimla, Mandi, Bilaspur, Kullu and Kangra districts, with 65.89% of the total registered cases. Analysis reveals that the main sources/areas of drugs are Shimla, Mandi, Bilaspur, Kullu and Kangra district. Further, carriers of contraband are mostly peasants, laborers and poor people.

Study of age profile of the accused shows that mostly adults between 18-30 years of age are involved (49.10%). About 42.56% were in the age group of 30-45 years. Those above 45 years were 8.32%.

The participation of children below 18 years is negligible (0.64%). 46 foreigners were involved in this activity, which include 09 African, European (06) and 31 Asian (Nepalese). Previous 10 years (2012-2021) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.21](#).

(iii). Gambling Act: (Decrease of 1.07%)

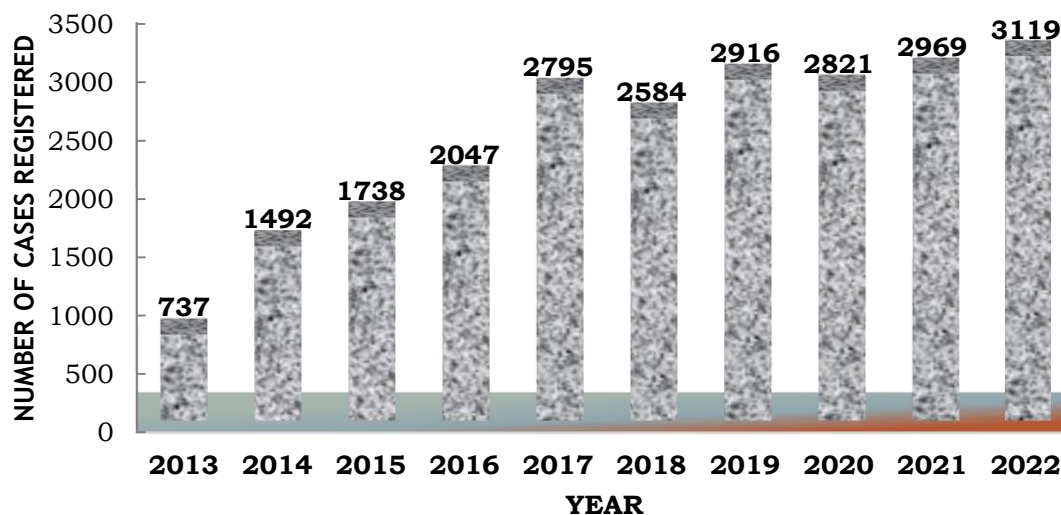
A total of 550 cases under the Gambling Act have been registered during 2022. The highest number of cases were reported in district Una (169), followed by Baddi (131), Sirmaur (75) Kinnaur (37), Shimla (33), Kullu (31) Chamba (23), Solan (14), L&S (11), Mandi (10), Kangra (9), Hamirpur (4), Bilaspur (3). No incident under this head was reported in CID, GRP and Cyber.

(iv). Excise Act: (Increase of 5.05%)

The cases registered (3119) under the Excise Act showed

an increase of 5.05% over the previous year. Cases under this Act contributed 53.57% against the total cases under Local & Special Law (SLL) reported during 2022. The highest number (616) of cases were reported in district Kangra, followed by Mandi (415), Kullu (378), Chamba (360) Shimla (331), Sirmaur (173), Baddi (160), Una (157), Kinnaur (131), Bilapur (120) Solan (103) and Hamirpur (102). The lowest number of cases under this Act were registered in Lahaul-Spiti (73). Previous 10 years (2013-2022) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.22.

DETECTION UNDER EXCISE ACT DURING 2013-2022



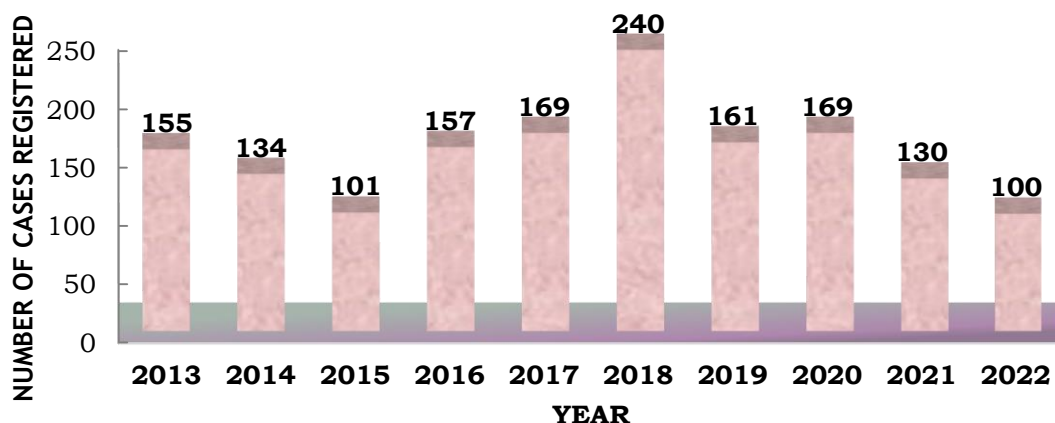
(v). Forest Act: (Decrease of 23.07%)

The number of cases (100) registered under the Forest Act showed a decrease of 23.07% over the previous year. Shimla district has reported the highest number of cases (23), followed by Mandi (15), Sirmaur (14), Kangra (13), Chamba & Una (9 each), Kullu (6), Bilaspur, Hamirpur and Solan (3 each). The lowest registration under this Act was seen in Baddi (2). No case under this head was reported in districts,

Lahaul & Spiti, and in CID, GRP and Cyber.

The analysis reveals that majority of the cases have been registered in districts Shimla, Mandi, Sirmaur & Kangra. These cases involve encroachment on forest land, smuggling of forest produce such as Timber, Fuel wood, Guchhi, Resin, Walnut Bark, Birch Bark, Brahmi leaves and other herbal plants etc. Previous 10 years (2013-2022) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.23](#).

(vi). Protection of Civil Rights Act: (Variation 0%)

During the year 2022, 1 incident under the PCR Act was reported in Kinnaur district. No case under this head was registered in rest of the districts. Previous 10 years (2013-2022) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.24.

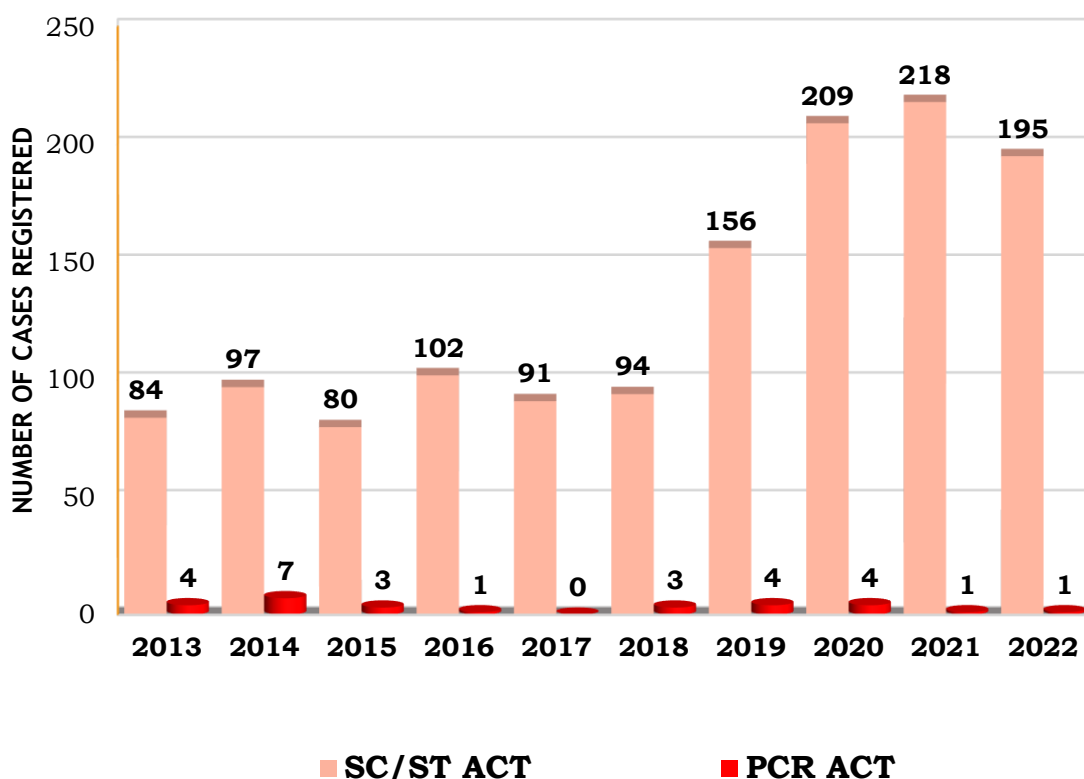

(vii). SC/ST (Prevention of Atrocities) Act: (Decrease of 10.55%)

A total of 195 cases were registered under the SC/ST Prevention of Atrocities Act, as against 218 cases during the previous year; a decrease of 10.55%. The highest numbers of (45) cases were reported in district Mandi,

The analysis reveals that crime under this head is high in Mandi, Hamirpur, Kangra, Shimla, and Una districts. The most common reason for registering cases under this Act is a feeling of hurt when one is called by derogatory names. Previous 10 years (2013-2022) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.24.

(viii). Other Local & Special Law Cases (including Wild life Act, PDP Act, EC Act etc.)
(Decrease of 13.33%)

A total of 312 Other Local & Special Law cases were reported under the Acts mentioned above. These have shown a decrease of 13.33% over the previous year (360 cases). The highest number of cases were reported from district Kangra (50).

During 2022, a total of 5822 cognizable crimes were

reported in the State under various heads of Local & Special Laws (SLL), which shows an increase of 0.51% over the previous year.

It is observed that 7 specific crime heads accounted for 94.64% of the total SLL crimes while the remaining 5.35% were clubbed as other SLL crimes. Previous 10 years (2013-2022) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.25](#).

DURING 2013-2022

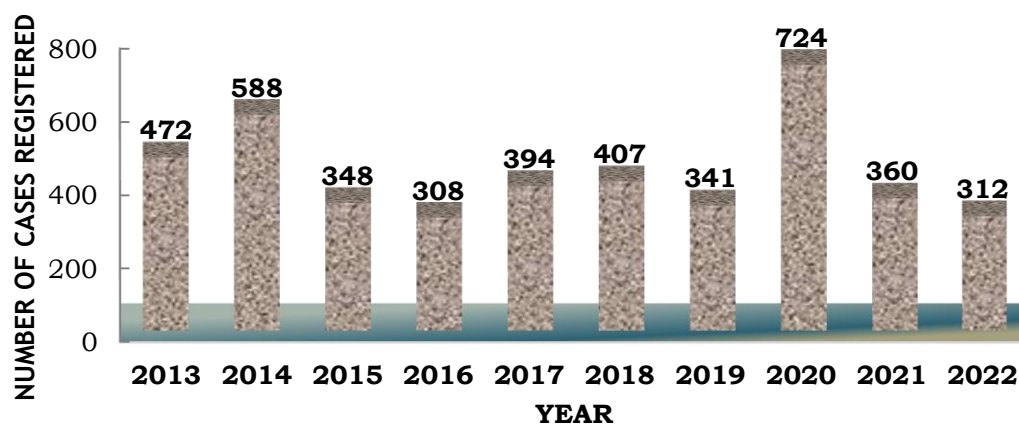
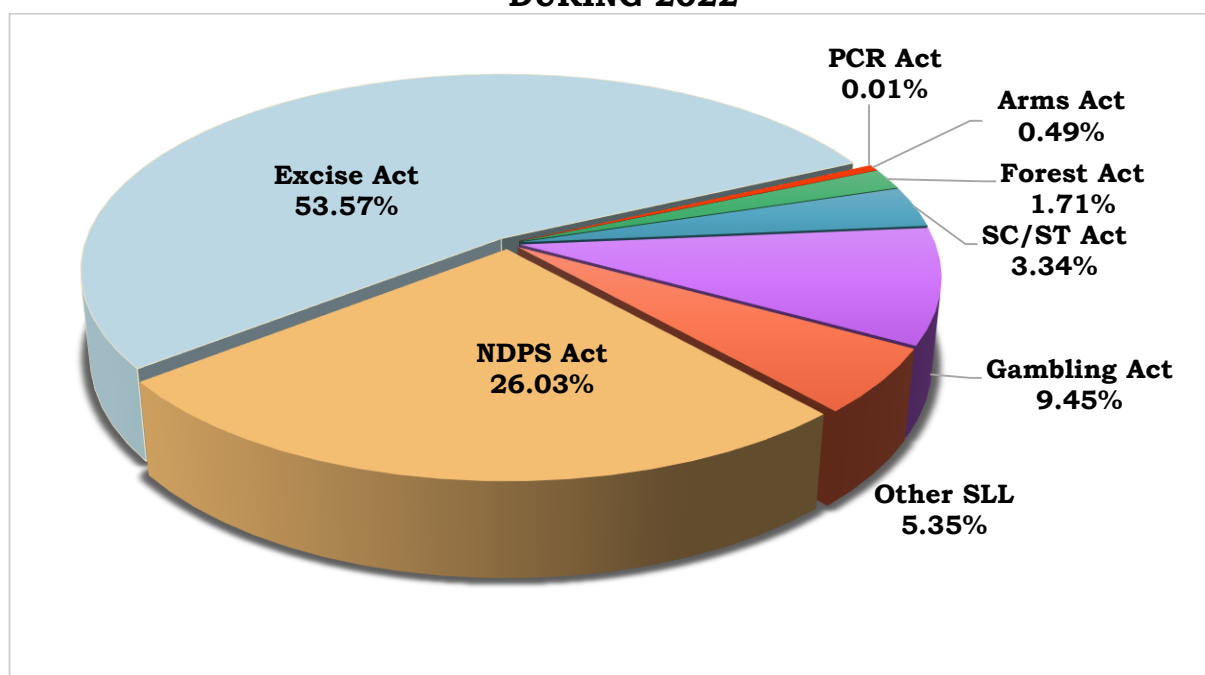

INCIDENCE OF CRIME AGAINST PROPERTY AND PERSONS IN HIMACHAL PRADESH

2.1 Crime against Property:

Offences under this head include the cases of **Theft, Burglary, Robbery & Dacoity**. The head wise analysis of crime against property for the year 2022 is as under:-

(i) Theft and Burglary:

(Increase of 40.84 % & 68.49% respectively)

During the year 2022, 669 cases of theft and 492 cases of burglary were registered, which is an increase of 194 cases in theft and 200 cases in burglary over the previous year. The cases of both these heads have been categorized under major heads namely: - Auto theft, theft of Cash & Jewelry, Cultural Property theft, theft of electronic components and theft of other materials.

Incidence of theft cases is concentrated mostly in the 7 districts i.e. Kangra, Solan, Shimla, Sirmaur, Baddi, Bilaspur and Mandi.

(ii) Robbery: **No increase**

During the year 2022, 8 cases of Robbery were registered in

the State as compared to 8 cases during the previous year. The highest number of incidents were reported in district Kangra & Shimla (2 each), followed by Kullu, Mandi, Solan and Una (1 each). No case under this head was reported in rest of the districts of the State.

(iii) Dacoity: **Decrease of 66.66%**

During the year 2022, 1 case of Dacoity was registered; a decrease of 2 case over the previous year. One case under this head was registered in district Kangra.

2.2 Value of Property Stolen and Recovered:

Recovery increased by 5.74%

During the year 2022, property worth Rs.1722.91 lakhs was reported stolen in 1170 cases, as compared to Rs. 1309.67 lakhs in 778 cases during the previous year.

Property worth Rs. 855.61 lakhs was recovered during

2022. The percentage of recovery is 49.29%. The value of property recovered showed an increase of 5.74% over the previous year.

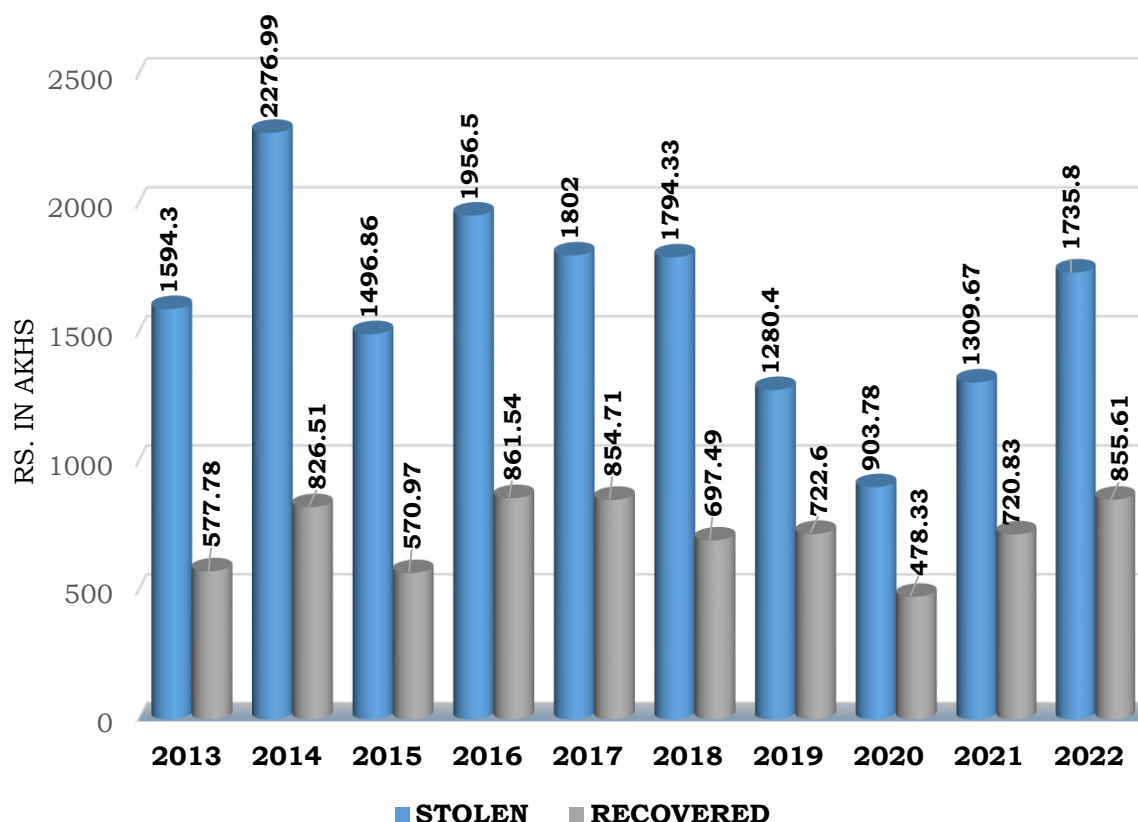

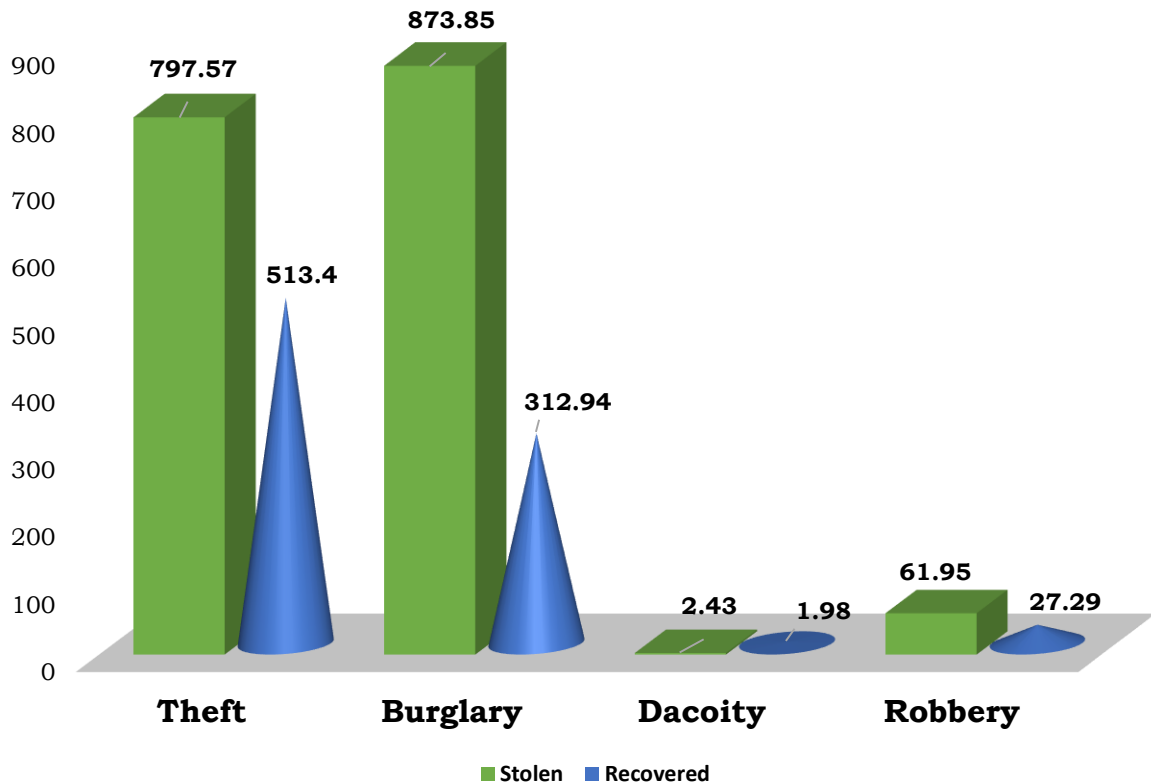
VALUE OF PROPERTY STOLEN AND RECOVERED DURING THE PERIOD 2013-2022

Crime head and district wise value of property stolen recovered, including percentage of recoveries, is presented in **Table 2.3**.

Kangra district reported the highest value of property stolen (Rs. 3,64,84,123/-) followed by Shimla (Rs. 2,46,51,166/-, Baddi (Rs.1,92,48,208/-) and Sirmaur (Rs. 1,05,07,867). Rest of the districts reported less than 1 crore value of property stolen.

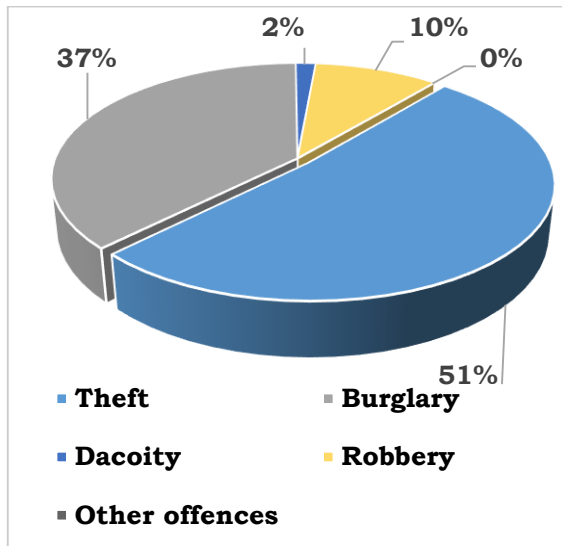
The highest value of recovery was seen in District Kangra (Rs. 1,99,26,896 /-).

The highest recovery percentage of stolen property was seen in district Lahaul & Spiti (97.47%), followed by Bilaspur (81.47%), PD Baddi (76.22%), Kinnaur (75.17%), Kullu (74.52%) and Mandi (66.94%).

2.3 Category of Offences (Incidence and Value):

Among the four different types of property crimes, the maximum stolen value of property (Rs.673.47 Lakhs) and share (51%) were seen under the head Theft. The minimum stolen value of Rs. 12.70 Lakhs and share (2%) was seen under the head Robbery.

The maximum value of property was recovered in Dacoity (97.52%), followed by Theft (67.90%), Robbery (56.27%) and Burglary (35.23%). The crime head-wise value of property stolen and recovered over the last 10 years

(2013 to 2022) is presented in [Table 2.4](#).

2.4 Nature of Property :

Nature of property under heads Theft and Burglary have been classified into four different categories viz. Auto Theft, Theft of Cash and Jewelry, theft of Cultural Property, Theft of electronic items, Household articles/furniture. Properties other than the above specified categories are clubbed as 'other kind of property'. The category wise number of cases in which property was found stolen and recovered therein and percentage thereof has been calculated and presented in [Table 2.5](#).

DURING THE YEAR 2022**

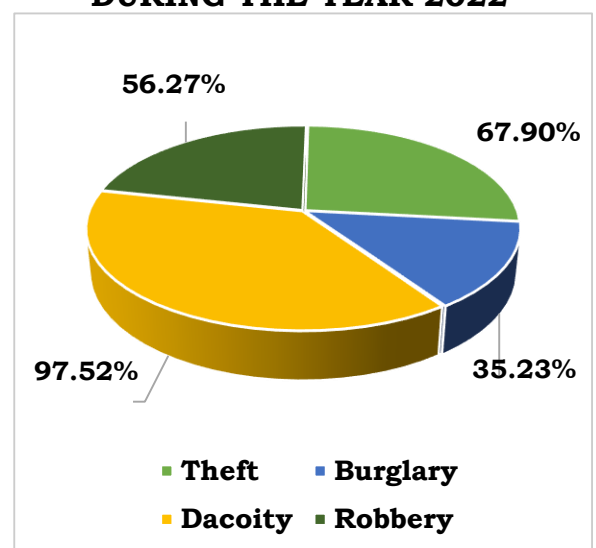

(WORKED OUT) -2022**

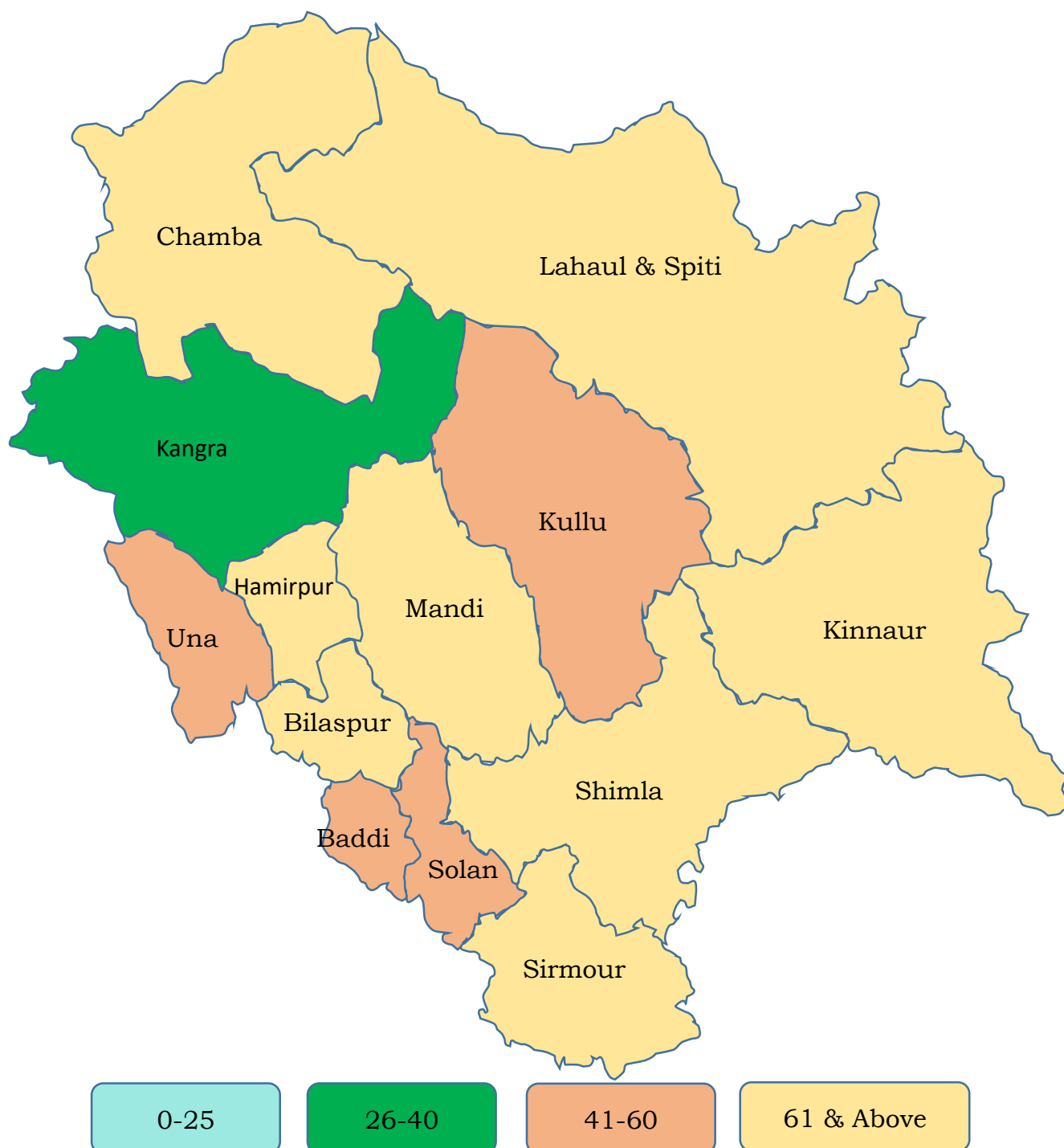

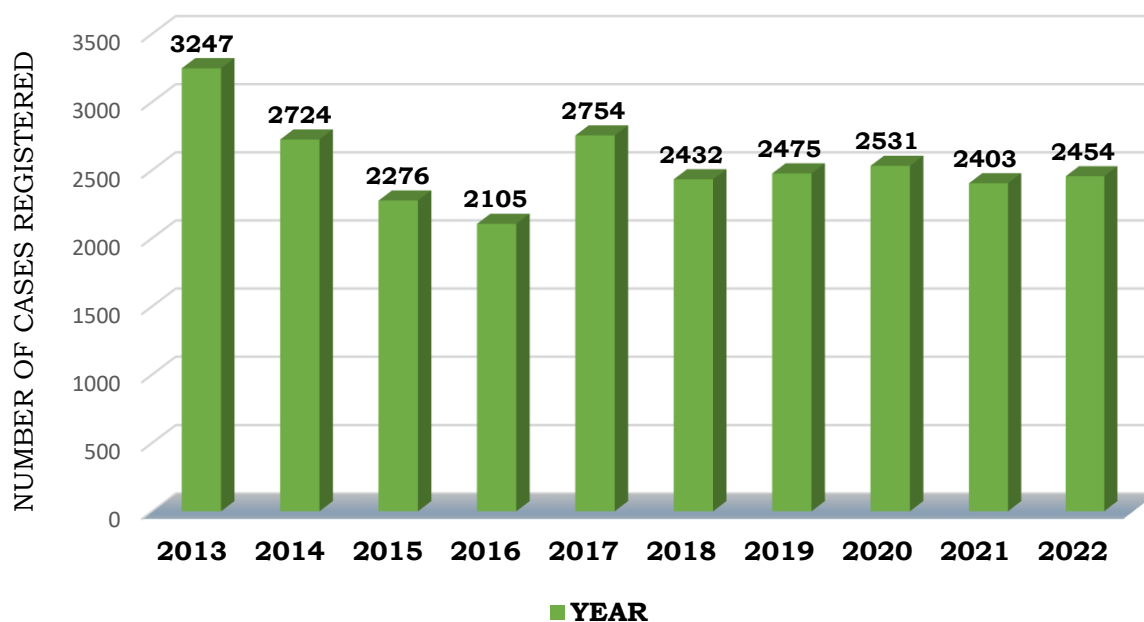
2.6 Crime against Persons:-

Crime against persons includes 10 different types of crime heads viz. Murder, Culpable Homicide not amounting to Murder, Attempt to Murder, Rape, Kidnapping & Abduction, Hurt, Rioting, Cruelty to Women, Molestation and Dowry Deaths.

The analysis reveals that a total of 5957 cases of crime against persons have occurred during 2022, which comprises 45.02% of the total IPC crime. The

highest percentage of crime against persons over the total IPC crimes was recorded in districts Hamirpur (60.80%), Chamba (58.66%), Mandi (53.98%), Kullu (47.55%), Kinnaur (45.20%), Una (44.65%), Bilaspur (44.57%), Sirmaur (43.40%), Kangra (41.77%), Baddi (40.31%), Shimla (37.58%), Solan (34.53%), L&S (25.42%). The district-wise details have been calculated and presented in **Table 2.7**. The district-wise incidents and their percentage over the IPC crime is depicted in **Chart 2.6**.

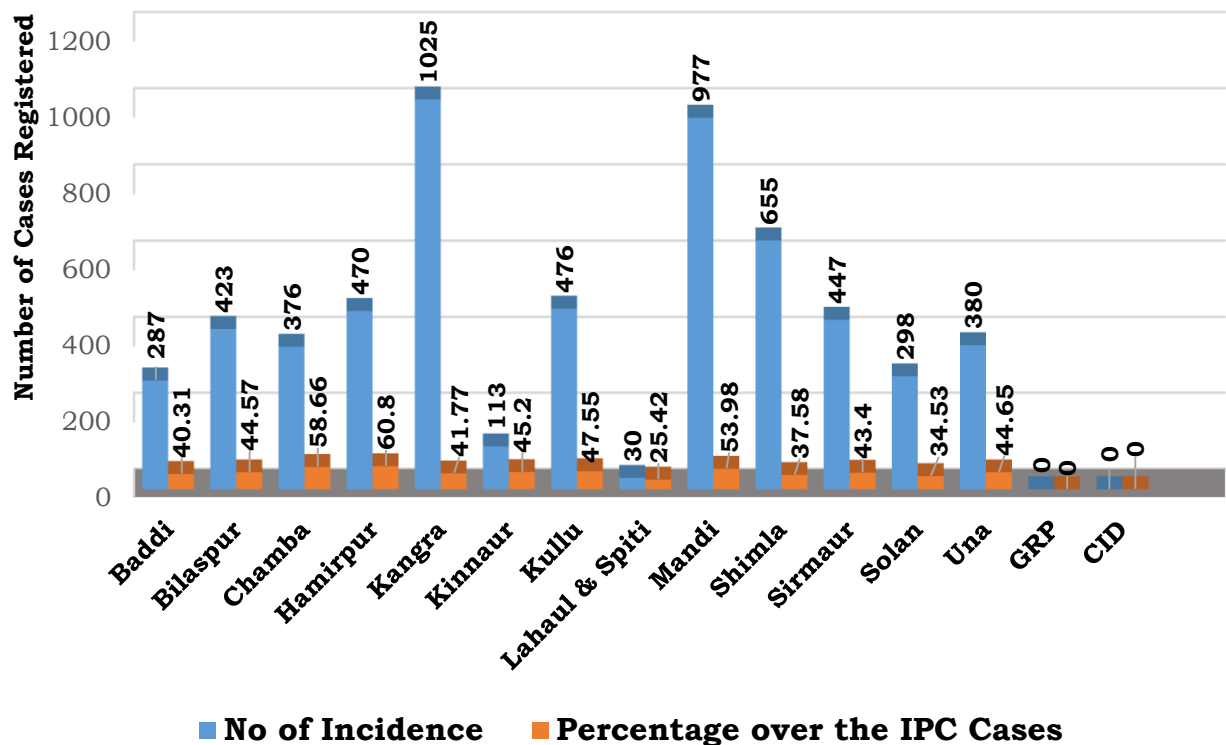
CHART 2.5

The highest number of incidents of crime against persons have been recorded in district Kangra (1025), followed by Mandi (977), Shimla (655), Kullu (476), Hamirpur (470), Sirmour (447), Bilaspur (423), Una (380), Chamba (376), Solan (298), Baddi (287), Kinnaur (113), Lahaul & Spiti (30). No case were reported in CID, GRP & Cyber PS. The District-wise details have been calculated and presented in [Table 2.8](#).

The head-wise comparative analysis of incidences of crime against persons for the last 10 years (2013 to 2022) has been reviewed. During the year 2022, 5957 incidents have been recorded; a decrease of 159 cases over the previous year. The head-wise figures for the last 10 years are presented in [Table 2.9](#). [Chart 2.6](#) shows the total crime against persons and its percentage over the total IPC crime.

The head-wise reported incidences of crime against persons and their comparison with those of the previous year is as under:-

(i) Murder: Decrease of 1.16%

During the year 2022, 85 incidents of Murder were reported, as compared to 86 cases of the previous year. Analysis of these cases has revealed that no organized gang is operating in the State. In most of these cases, crime is committed due to various types of disputes, murder for gain, personal enmity, love affairs and illicit relationships. There was no class or caste factor involved in the commission of these murders.

(ii) Attempt to Murder: Increase of 7.24%

74 incidents of Attempt to Murder were reported during the year 2022 as compared to 69 cases during the previous years. The motive for the commission of this crime is also the same as mentioned under the head 'Murder'

(iii) Culpable Homicide not amounting to Murder: Increase of 37.5%

11 incidents of Culpable Homicide not amounting to Murder

were reported during the year 2022, an increase of 3 cases over the previous year.

(iv) Rape: Increase of 0.27%

359 cases of Rape were reported during the year 2022, an increase of 1 case over the previous year.

(v) Kidnapping and Abduction: Decrease of 3.95%

During 2022, 413 cases were registered; a decrease of 17 cases over the previous year. Analysis shows that 40.19% cases of Kidnapping & Abduction were reported in districts Kangra, Shimla and Mandi.

(vi) Grievous Hurt: Increase of 11.94%

A total of 478 incidents of Grievous Hurt were reported during 2022. Analysis shows that 61.50% incidents of Grievous Hurt were reported in districts Kangra, Mandi, Shimla and Hamirpur.

(vii) Rioting: Increase of 9.52%

During the year 2022, 345 incidents of Rioting were reported in the State, as against 315 cases

during the previous year; a decrease of 30 cases. Analysis shows that 58.84% incidents of rioting were reported in districts Sirmaur, Hamirpur, Una and Shimla.

(viii) Cruelty to Women:

Decrease of 11.31%

A total of 196 cases of Cruelty to Women were reported in the State during the year 2022, a decrease of 25 cases over the previous year. The incidents under this head have been reviewed in detail in the separate chapter “Crime against Women”.

(ix) Assault on women:

Increase of 1.02%

During the year 2022, 492 incidents of Molestation were reported in the State, as against the 487 incidents of the previous year; a

decrease of 5 cases. The cases under this head have been reviewed in detail in the separate chapter “Crime against Women”

(x) Dowry Deaths:

Decrease of 50%

During the year 2022, 1 case of Dowry Death reported in district Kangra. The incidents under this head have been reviewed in detail in the separate chapter “Crime against Women”.

2.7 Overall Review of Crime against Person:

The incidence of crime against persons is higher in districts Kangra, Mandi, Shimla and Kullu as compared to the other districts of the State. Offences of murder have however taken place in the entire State with no specific concentration.

TRENDS IN DISPOSAL OF IPC CRIMES AND SLL CRIMES BY POLICE AND COURTS

3.1 Disposal by Police

3.1.1 Cases under IPC:

During 2022, a total of 16022 cases including cases pending from the previous years, were under investigation. Out of these, 12555 cases were disposed by the police during the year and 3467 cases remained pending for investigation.

Table-3.1 presents the details of crime head wise Police disposal during 2022. Tables-3.2 & 3.3 give district wise details of disposal and percentage of disposal respectively. The percentage and type of disposal of under investigation (IPC) cases by police during 2022 is depicted in Chart-3.1.

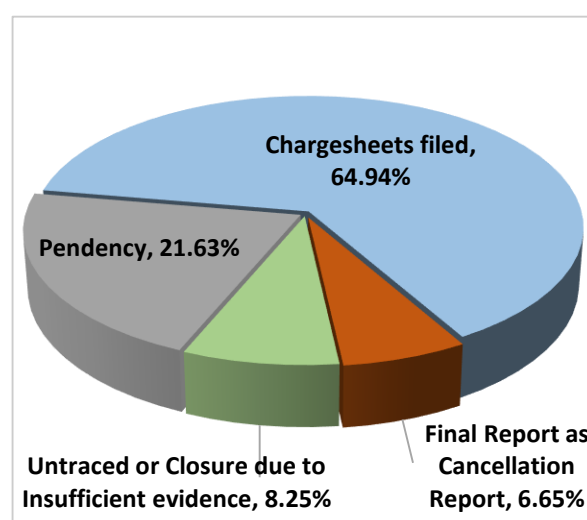
3.1.2 Pendency:

On an average, 21.63% cases remained under investigation. In the following units/districts, pendency was the highest:

3.1.3 Cases under SLL:

The disposal of SLL cases by police under different crime heads is available at **Table-3.4** of the total 6725 cases (including pending

cases from the previous year) pending investigation, police disposed 86.95% cases. **Chart-3.3** presents the type of disposal of SLL cases.

BY POLICE DURING 2022

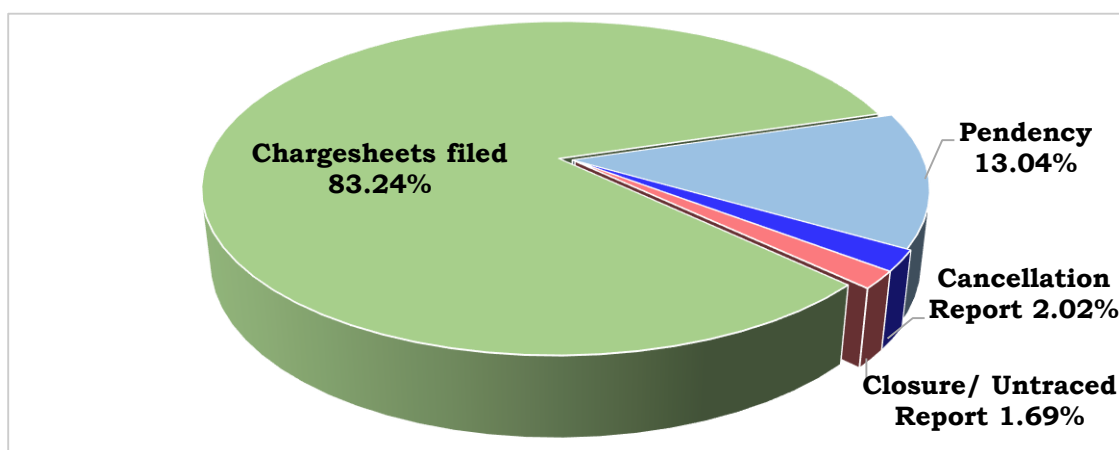
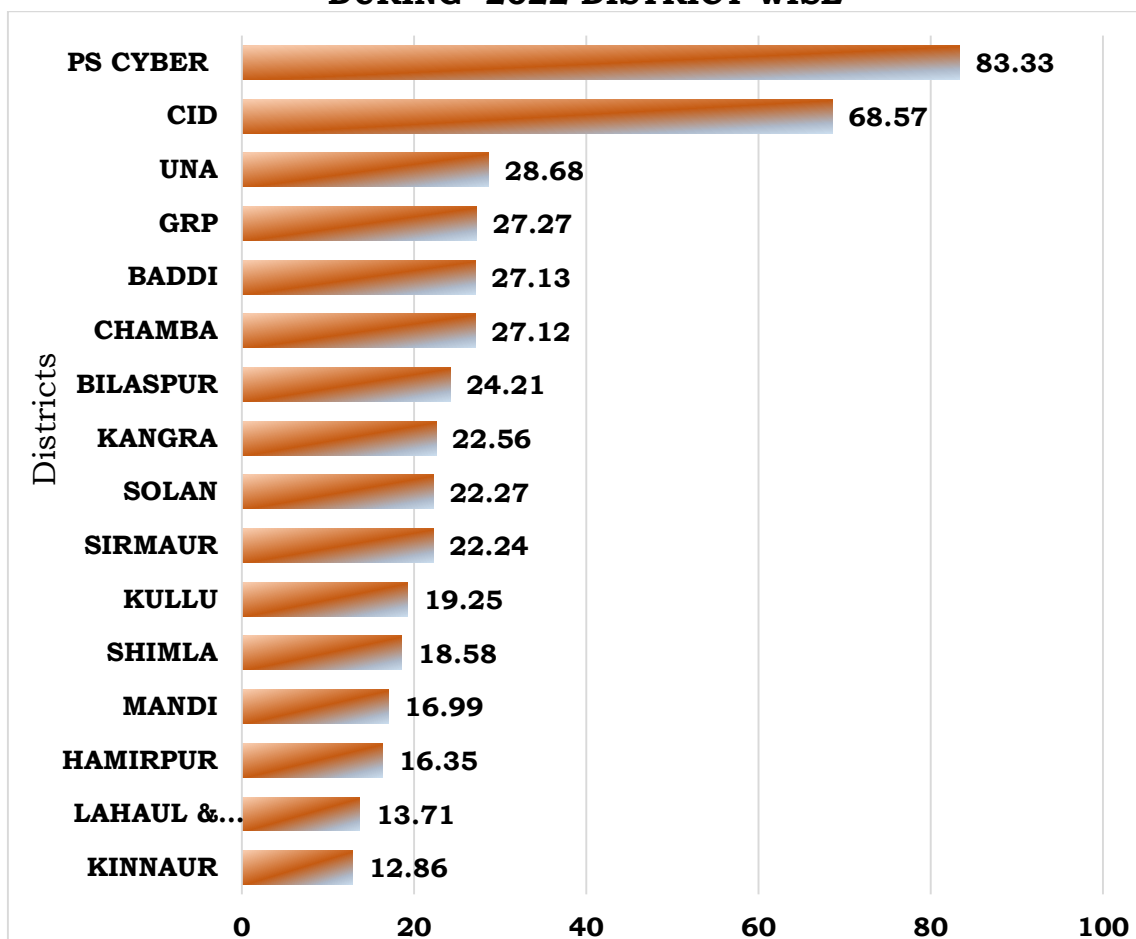

Disposal of IPC cases by the courts during 2022 is presented in [Table 3.7](#). During 2022 there were 121339 cases pending trial (including pending cases from the previous years). 115213 of IPC cases remained pending trial at end of the year. The percentage disposal during the year was 5.04%.

The District wise disposal figures are presented in [Table-3.8](#) and percentage of disposal is presented in [Table-3.9](#). The highest pendency percentage of cases is seen in Distt. Kangra (99.56), followed by CID (97.10%). The largest number of cases are also pending trial in Kangra district (28982), which has a pendency of 23.88% of state level.

Chart-3.5 depicts percentage disposal of IPC cases by the courts during 2022

3.2.2 Cases under SLL:-

Head wise disposal of SLL cases by the courts during 2022 is presented in **Table-3.10**. There were 34713 cases pending trial (including pending cases from the previous years) at the beginning of 2022. Cases which remained pending trial at end of the year were 30609. The percentage of disposal is 11.82%.

PERCENTAGE DISPOSAL OF IPC CASES BY COURTS DURING 2022

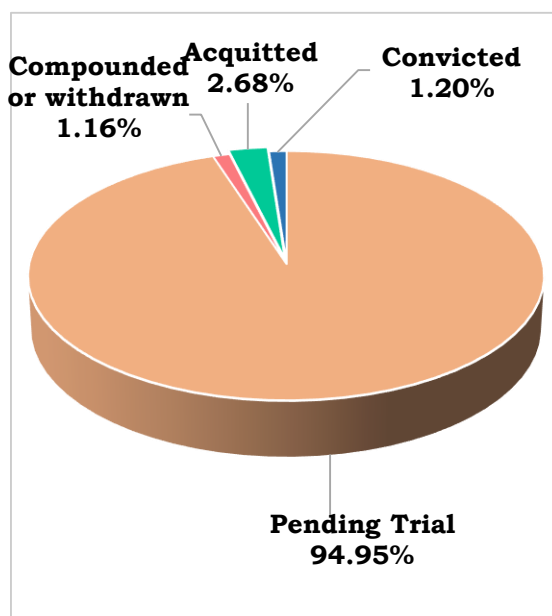

PERCENTAGE DISPOSAL OF SLL CASES BY COURTS DURING 2022

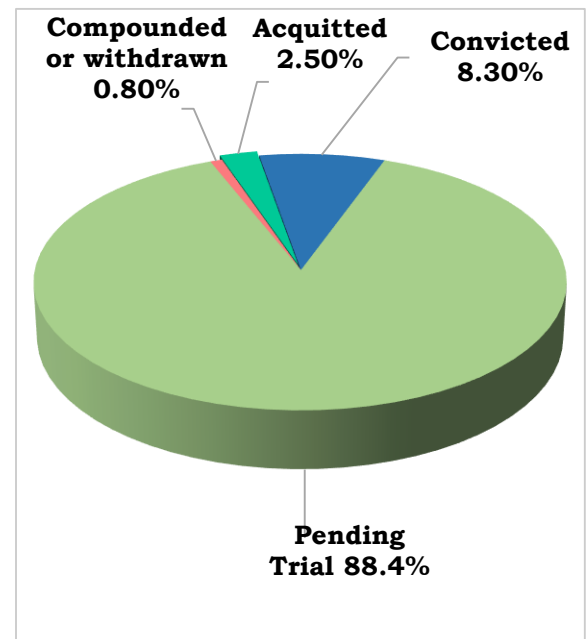

CHAPTER-4

CRIMES AGAINST WOMEN

4.1 General:

Crimes which are directed specifically against women are characterized as Crimes against Women. They may be broadly classified under the following two categories:-

1. Crimes against Women identified under the Indian Penal Code (IPC)

- (i) Murder (Sec. 302, 303 IPC)
- (ii). Dowry Deaths (Sec. 304B IPC)
- (iii) Abetment to Commit Suicide (Sec.306 IPC)
- (iv) Cruelty to Women (Sec. 498A IPC)
- (v) Kidnapping & Abduction (Sec. 363, 366 IPC)
- (vi) Rape
- (vii) Attempt to Commit Rape
- (viii) Assault on Woman with intend to outrage her modesty (Sec.354 IPC)
- (ix) Insult to the modesty of Women (Sec.509 IPC)

2. Crimes against Women Identified under the Special and Local Laws (SLL)

Although all laws are not gender specific, the provisions of laws affecting women significantly have been reviewed periodically and amendments carried out to keep pace with the emerging requirements. Some Acts which have special provisions to safeguard women and their interests are:-

- (i) Immoral Traffic (Prevention) Act, 1956
- (ii) Dowry Prohibition Act, 1961
- (iii) The Child Marriage Restraint Act, 1929
- (iv) Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act, 2005
- (v) Commission of Sati (Prevention) Act, 1987

Crimes against Women are being closely monitored in the State. Several measures have been undertaken to tackle this social menace. Special attention is being paid towards prevention of crimes against women by increased police

vigil and by harnessing the community resources.

Crime against women witnessed a minor decrease during the year 2022 in comparison to the previous year. The last 10 years annual average of crime against women is 1565. During the year 2022, 1551 cases of crime against women have been registered in the state. As compared to the 10 years state average, this increase is due to the fact that in past the women usually hesitated to report incidents which took place with them and there have also been certain changes of law. But now on account of increased awareness and change in social values, ethos and social reassurances being provided by the society, free registration of cases, opening of Women Police Stations and Suvidha Yojna started by the HP Police Department, women are more often coming forward to report the offences taking place against them.

The HP Police Department has initiated many steps in the recent years to ensure better police response. Women Police Stations have been opened in all districts except Kinnaur and Lahaul & Spiti to monitor quick disposal of cases of

crime against women. A Women Crime Unit has been constituted at the State CID Hdqrs. 06 Anti Human Trafficking Units (AHTU's) have also been established in Shimla, Kangra, Sirmaur, Kullu, Solan & Chamba. No particular area is prone to crime against women in the State. No special organized gang is operative in the State to commit crime against women.

4.2 Incidents of Crime against Women:

Decrease of 3.0%

Head wise incidents of reported Crimes against Women during 2021 and 2022, along with percentage variation are presented in **Table 4.1**.

The cases of assault on women with intent to outrage modesty and cruelty to women together constitute the largest chunk of crime against women (44.36%). There were also a number of instances (23.14%) of rape and (21.01 %) Kidnapping and Abduction of women and girls.

The district wise incidents and rate of crimes against women during 2022 are presented in **Table 4.2**, **Chart 4.3** and **Chart 4.4**.

PERCENTAGE DISTRIBUTION OF CRIME AGAINST WOMEN DURING 2022

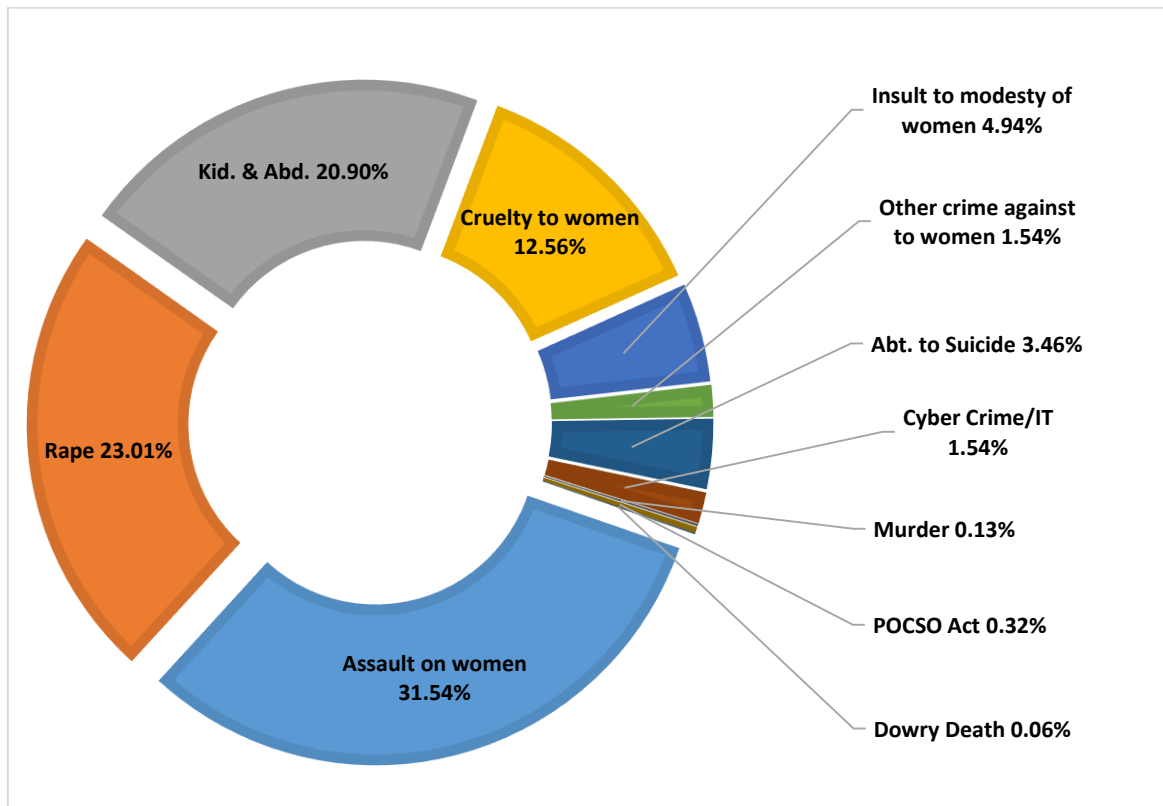


CHART 4.2
VARIATION OF CRIMES AGAINST WOMEN DURING 2022 OVER 2021

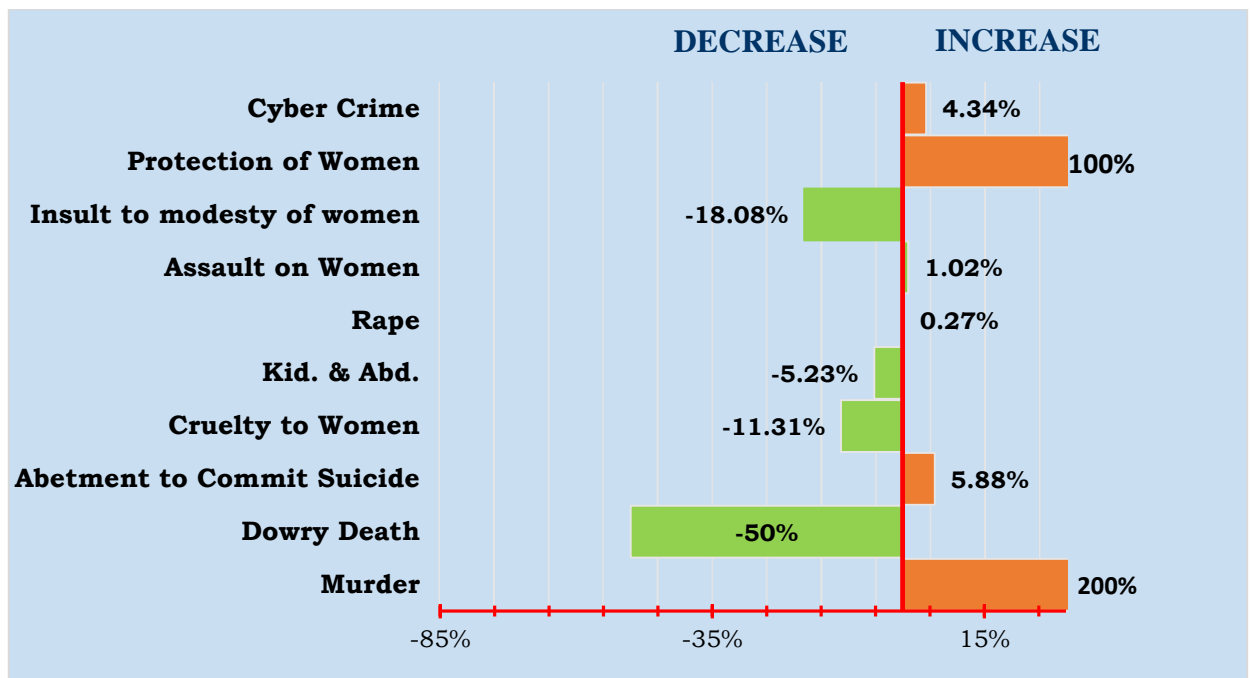
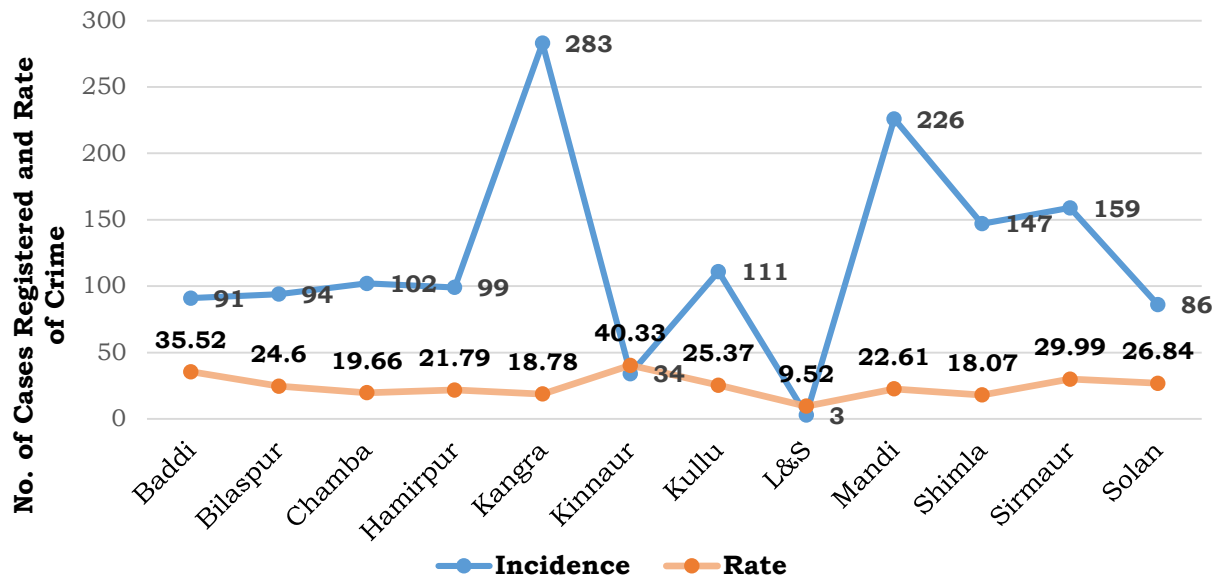
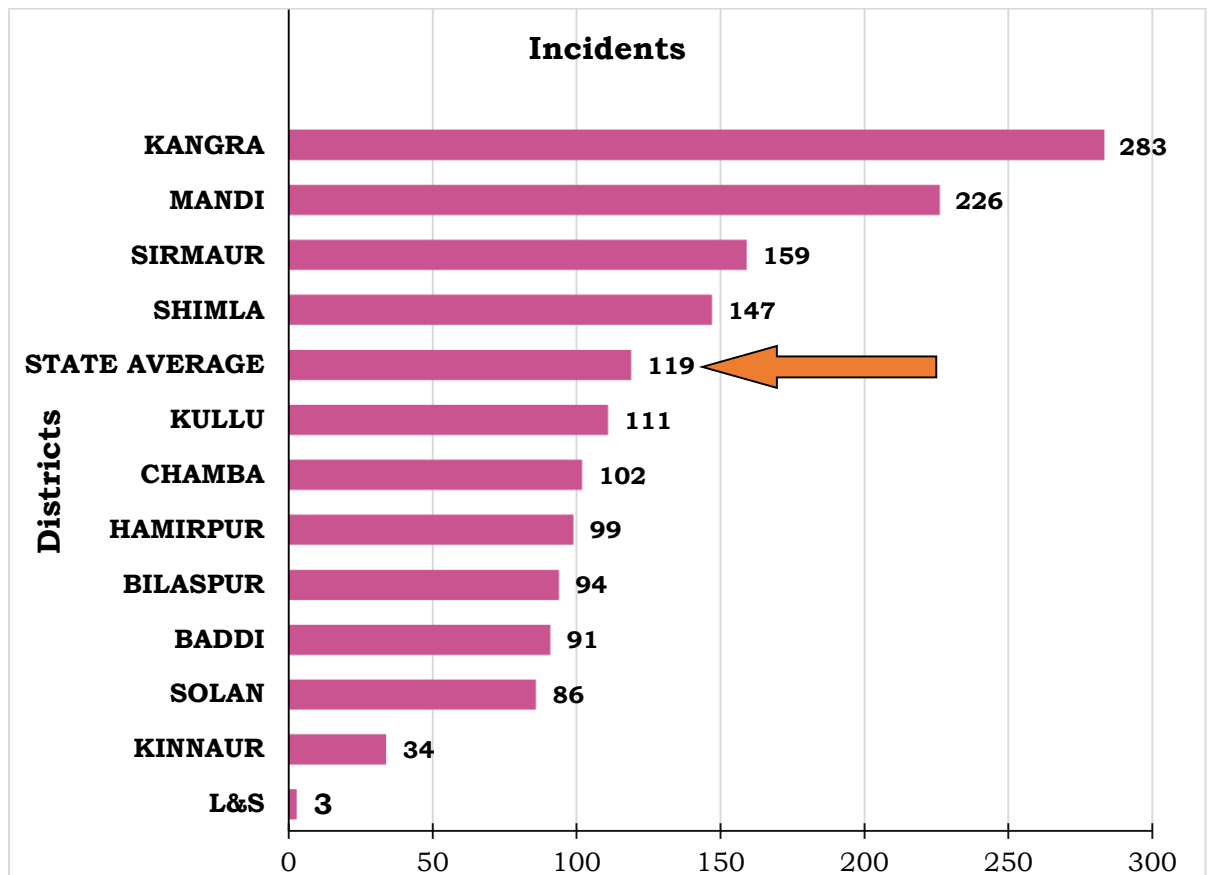
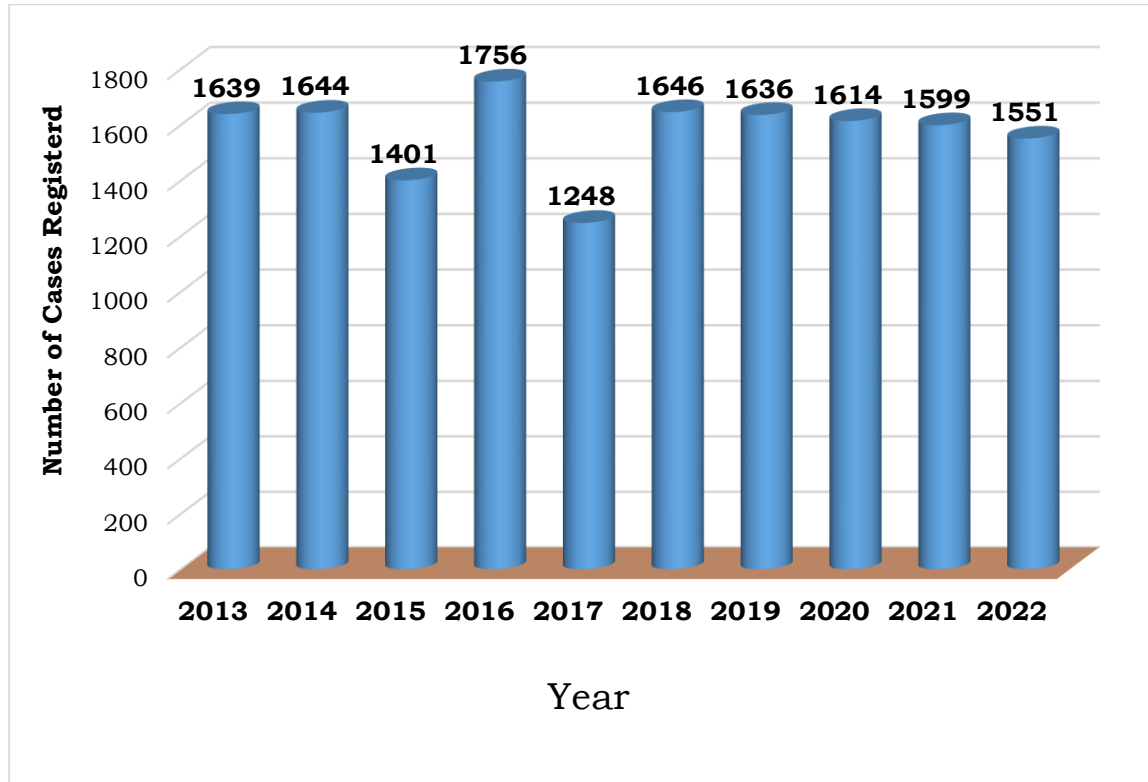

The head and district wise incidents, their rate and percentage has been calculated and presented in Table 4.3.

The total figures of crime against women for the last 10 years (2013-2022) are presented in Table 4.4 and Chart 4.5.

From the analysis of Crime against Women reported in districts, it is seen that registration of cases of Rape, Kidnapping & Abduction insult to outrage modesty, immoral trafficking was higher during the year 2022 as compared to the previous year.

The districts which reported the lowest incidents of crime against women are Lahaul-

Spiti (03) Kinnaur (34), Solan (86) Baddi (91) Bilaspur (94).

4.3 Head wise incidents of Crime against Women:

The brief of head wise status of Crime against Women during 2022 is as under:

(i) Murder: (Increase of 200%)

2 Cases under this head were reported in District Sirmaur.

(ii) Rape: (Increase of 0.27%)

A total of 359 cases of Rape were reported, which is an increase of 0.27% over the previous year (358 cases). The highest incidents of rape were reported in district Mandi (57), Kangra (53), Siramur (48), Shimla (38), Baddi (36), Kullu (30), Chamba (25), Una (24), Solan (17), Bilaspur (13), Kinnaur (11), Hamirpur (6) and Lahaul & Spiti (1).

Reasons:-

1. Revelation of illicit love affairs, intimacy and friendship between both parties leading to registration of cases.
2. Alluring for marriage and later on due to refusal of parents, refusal for marriage, resulting in registration of cases.
3. False registration due to enmity.
4. Rapes of minors.

(iii) Dowry Deaths:

(Decrease of 50%)

Under this head 01 incident was reported in Kangra. No

incidents under this head were reported in rest of the districts.

**(iv) Kidnapping & Abduction:
(Decrease of 5.23%)**

During the year 2022, 326 incidents of Kidnapping & Abduction were registered; a decrease of 5.23% over the previous year (344 cases). Kangra district reported the highest incidents (53) under this crime head, followed by Shimla (37), Mandi & Solan (35 each), Sirmaur, Chamba (23), Bilaspur and Kullu (19 each), (Baddi (16) and Kinnaur (10).

**(v) Assault on women with
intent to outrage
modesty (Sec.354)
(Increase of 1.02%)**

492 cases of Assault on women with intent to outrage modesty were registered during the year 2022; an increase of 1.02% over the previous year. Kangra district recorded the highest (101 cases), followed by Mandi (75), Sirmaur (54), Shimla (46), Hamirpur (41), Bilaspur & Chamba (32 each), Kullu & Una (31 each), Baddi (32), Solan, (19), Kinnaur (7) and Lahaul & Spiti (1).

(vi) Abetment to Commit Reasons:-**Suicide (Increase of 5.88 %)**

An increasing trend is seen under this head with a 5.88% increase over the previous year. The highest number of cases were registered in Kangra district (15), followed by Mandi (10), Una (8), Bilaspur (7), Hamirpur (4), Baddi & Sirmaur (3 each), Solan (2), Chamba and Shimla (1 each). No incidence under this head was reported in Kinnaur, Lahaul & Spiti and Kullu districts.

1. Torture of married women for the purpose of dowry, her ill health etc.
2. Harassment and torture of women by her in-laws i.e. husband, mother-in-law, father-in-law etc. on the pretext that she is not capable to doing house hold and agriculture activities.
3. Harassment/torture of women by husband due to illicit relationship of the husband with another woman.
4. Torture/ harassment of women by husband or other male member of the family under the influence of liquor.
5. Love marriage without the consent of the other family members i.e. father-in-law and mother-in-law of the victims.

**(vii) Cruelty to Women:
(Decrease of 11.31%)**

196 cases of Cruelty to Women were registered during the year 2022. This head showed a decrease of 11.34% over the previous year. The highest number of cases were registered in Kangra (38) district, followed by Una (24), Sirmaur (21), Bilaspur (18, Chamba (16), Shimla (14) Hamirpur (13), Baddi (11), Kullu (5), Solan (4) & Kinnaur (3) and no incident under this was reported in Lahual & Spiti district.

(viii) Insult to the modesty of Women (Sec. 509 IPC): (Decrease of 18.1%)

There was a decrease in registration under this head by 18.1% over the previous year. The

CHAPTER-5

CRIME AGAINST CHILDREN

5.1 General:

Crime against children includes violations under certain sections of the Indian Penal Code. For the purpose of this chapter, the following categories of crimes involving child victims have been included under this head:-

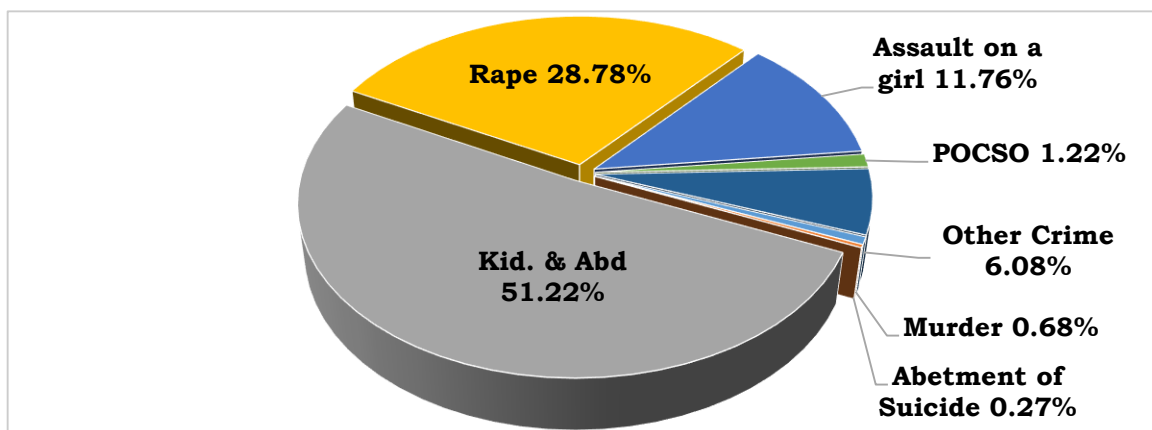
- i. Murder
- ii. Abetment to Suicide
- iii. Infanticide
- iv. Exposure and Abandonment
- v. Hurt/Grievous Hurt
- vi. Kidnapping and abduction
- vii. Rape
- viii. Attempt to commit Rape
- ix. Assault on girl

- x. Insult to the modesty of a girl
- xi. Protection of Children from sexual offences
- xii. Juvenile Justice (Care & Protection of Children) Act, 2000
- xiii. Prohibition of Child Marriage Act
- xiv. Other crimes committed against Children

5.2 Trends of Crime against Children:

Table 5.1 and **Chart 5.1** depicts the percentage distribution of crimes against children during 2022. **Chart 5.2** depicts the district-wise distribution of crimes against children during 2013-2022.

5.3 Incidents:

Table 5.1 shows the incidents and rate of Crime against Children, district wise including its rank.

A total of 740 cases were reported in the State under various sections of IPC. Kidnapping & Abduction constituted the largest category with 379 cases (51.22%) reported during the year. The maximum number of 'Kidnapping & Abduction' cases were reported in Kangra District (58) followed by Shimla (53), Solan & Mandi (45 each), Kullu (35), Sirmaur (28), Una (24), Hamirpur (22), Bilaspur & Chamba (21 each) Baddi (17), Kinnaur (10) and no incident under this head was reported in district Lahaul & Spiti.

The second most prevalent Crime against Children

was Rape along with POCSO Act, which accounted for 213 cases (28.78%). The highest number of Rape cases were reported in District Mandi (33), Sirmaur (27), Shimla & Baddi (24 each), Kangra (22), Kullu & Una (18 each), Chamba (16), Solan (11), Bilaspur & Kinnaur (8 each), Hamirpur (4) and no incident under this head was reported in District Lahaul & Spiti.

05 cases under the head Murder of Children were reported in the State. 1 each in Kinnaur, Kullu, Mandi, Sirmaur and Una Districts. No case of Murder of children has been reported in rest of the districts of the State.

The incidence and percentage contribution of crimes against children head and district wise is presented in **Table.5.2**.

Total No. of Incidence = 740

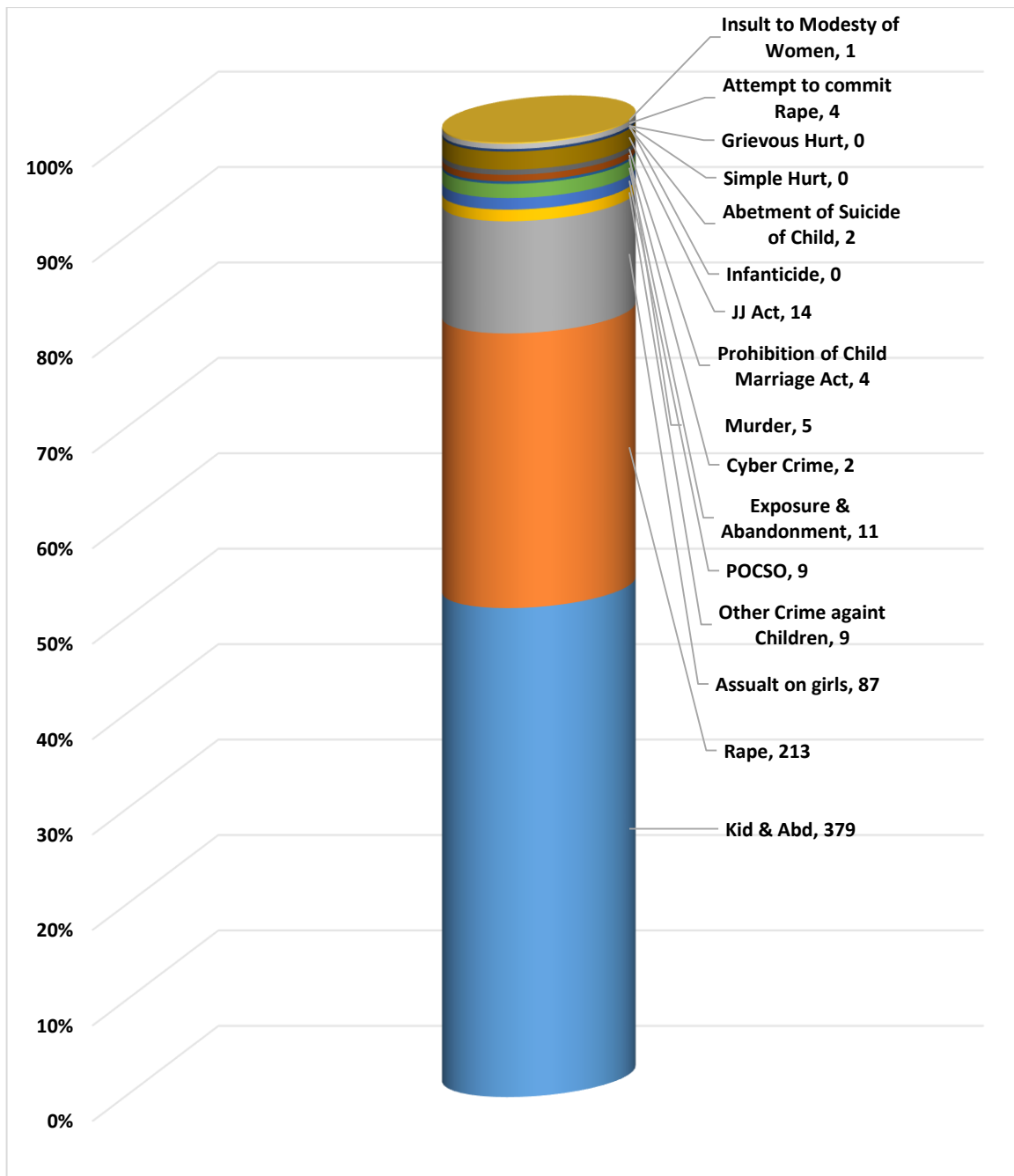

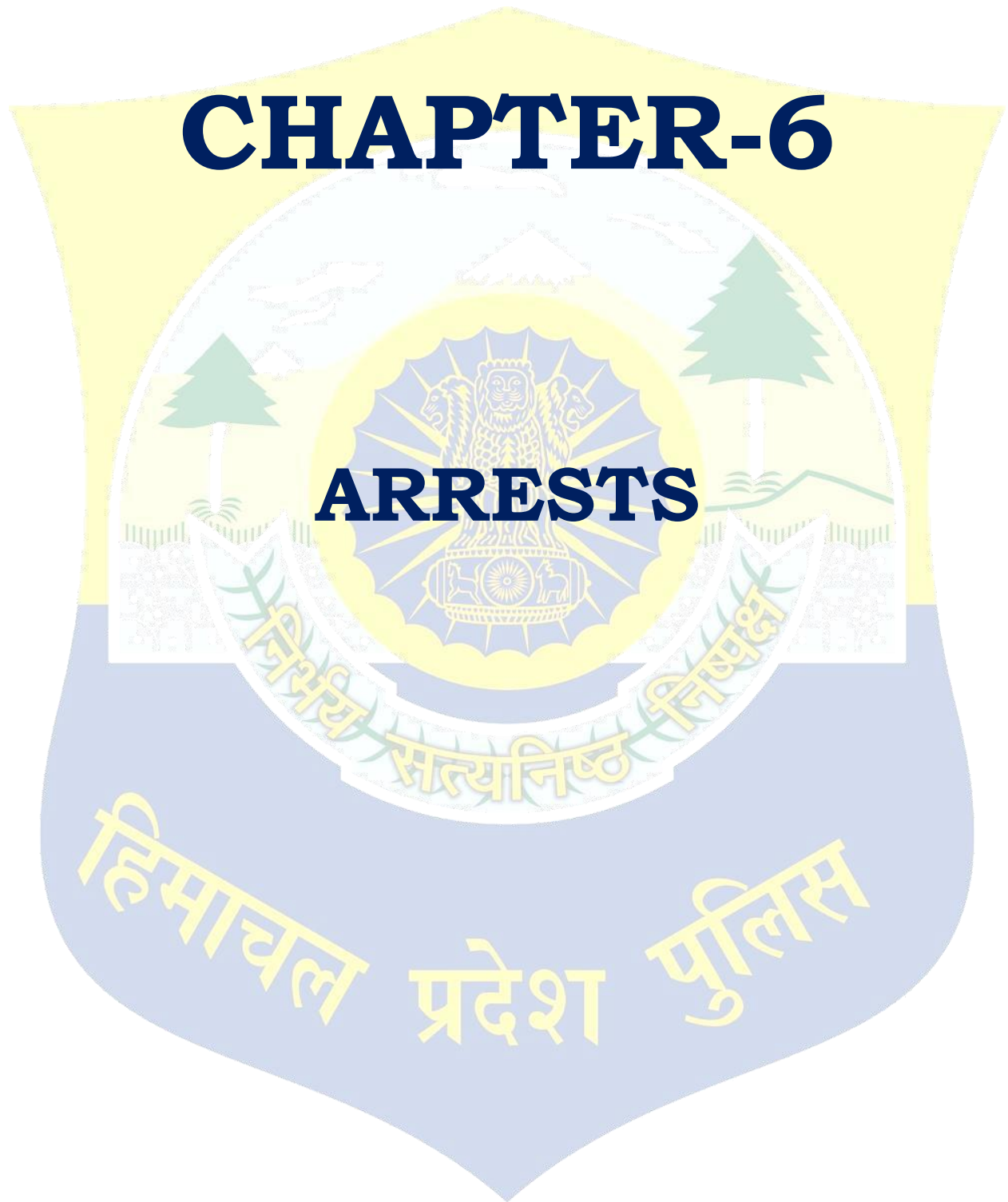

ARRESTS

6.1 ARRESTS:

A total of 14548 persons (9914 under IPC & 4634 under Local & Special Laws) were arrested during the year 2022 in 19053 cases (13231 under IPC & 5822 Local & Special Laws), which is a decrease of 18.27% when compared with the arrests of 17802 persons (11693 under IPC & 6109 under Local & Special Laws) in the year 2021.

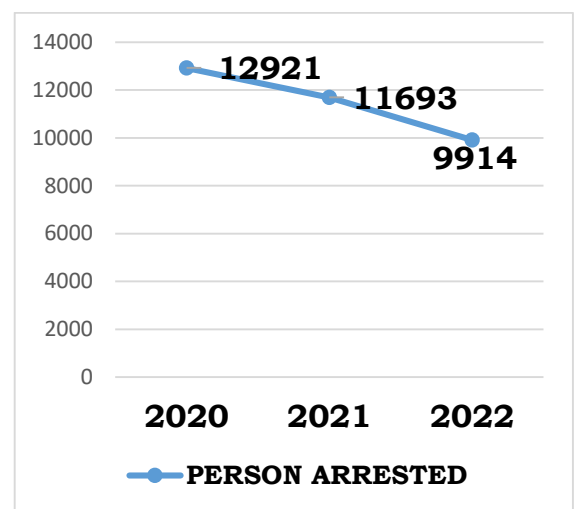
During the year 2022 as many as 9914 persons were arrested in 13231 cases registered under IPC, as against 11693 persons in 2021. This is due to the reason that some cases registered in State fall under petty offences in which accused are released under section 41(A) Cr.PC. **Chart 6.1** depicts persons arrested under IPC crimes during 2020-2022.

District Shimla tops in arresting 2580 persons in 1743 cases during 2022, followed by district Kullu by arresting 1468 persons in 1001 cases and Sirmaur by arresting 1444 persons in 1030 cases.

In Kangra 2454 cases were registered and 391 persons arrested. District Mandi has registered 1810 cases and arrested 239 persons, Bilaspur 208 persons were arrested against the

registration of 949 cases during the year 2022. The details of persons arrested under IPC crime head wise & gender wise are presented in **Table 6.3**.

DURING 2022**

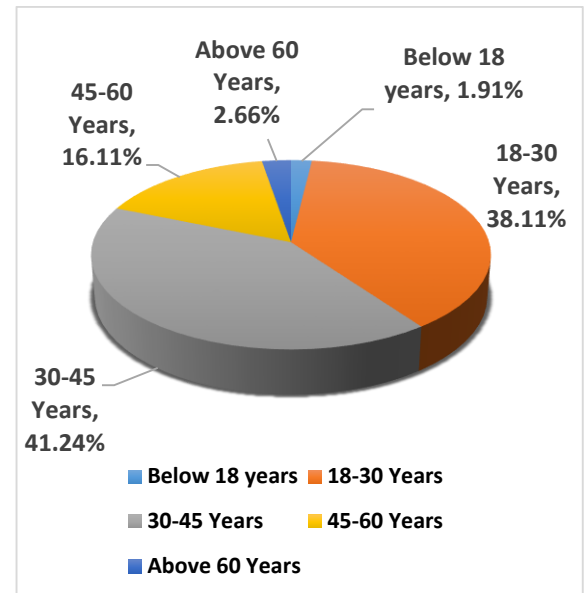
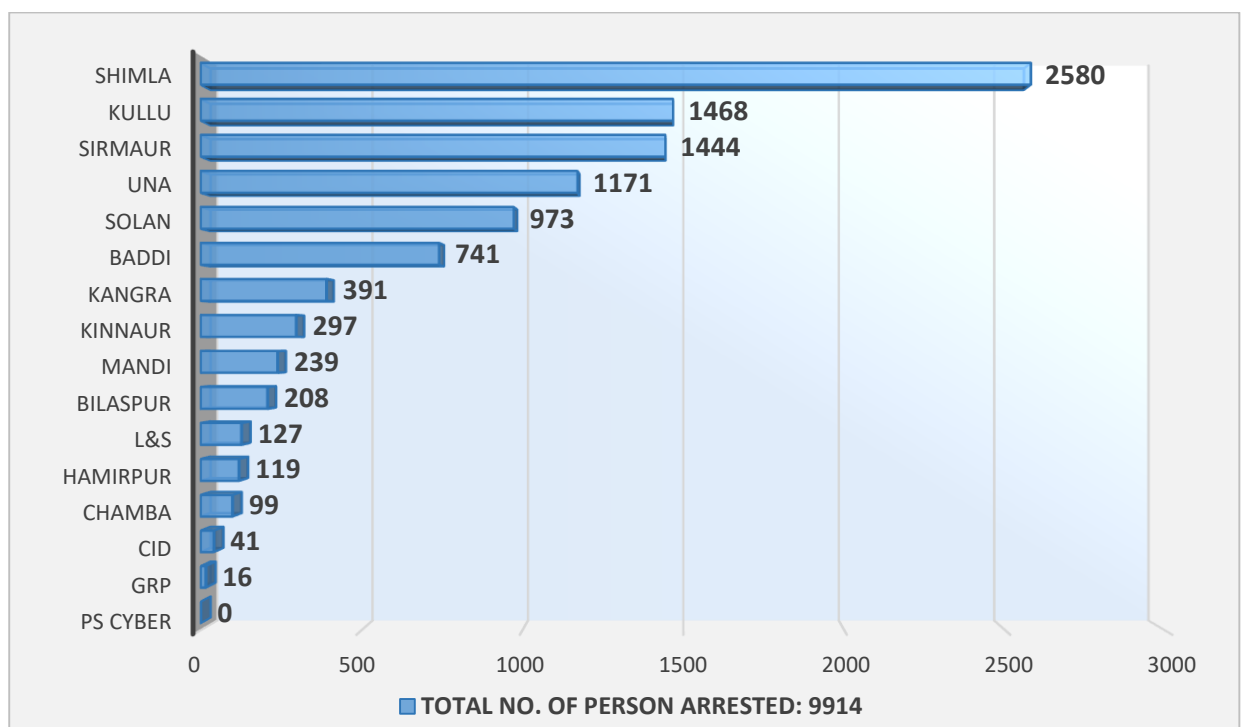

DISTRICT WISE PERSONS ARRESTED UNDER IPC CRIMES DURING 2022

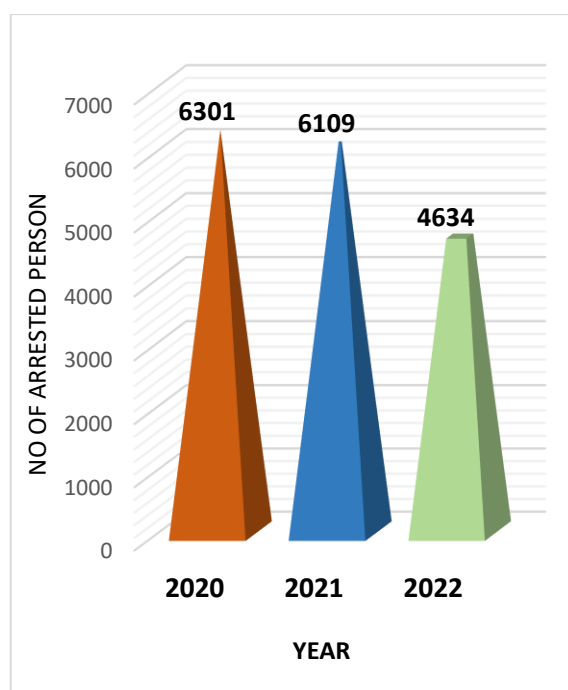


(ii) Persons arrested under SLL cases: (Decrease of 24.14%)

Chart 6.4 depicts persons arrested under SLL Crime during 2020-2022.

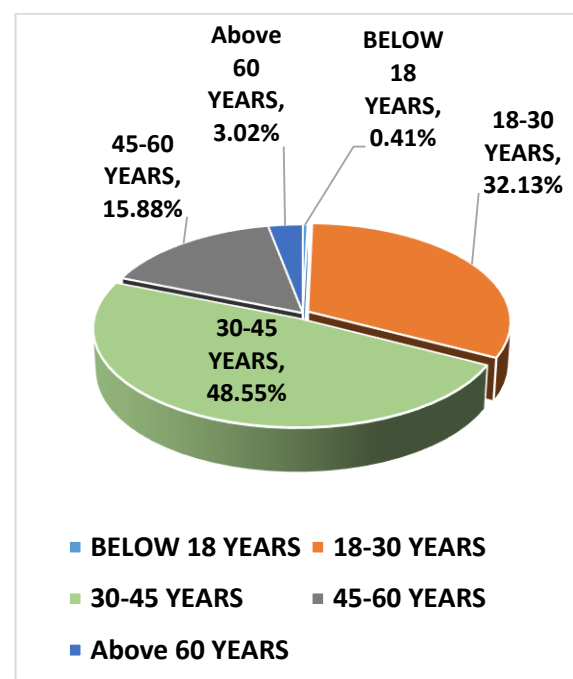
CHART 6.4

DISTRICT WISE PERSONS ARRESTED UNDER SLL CRIMES DURING 2022

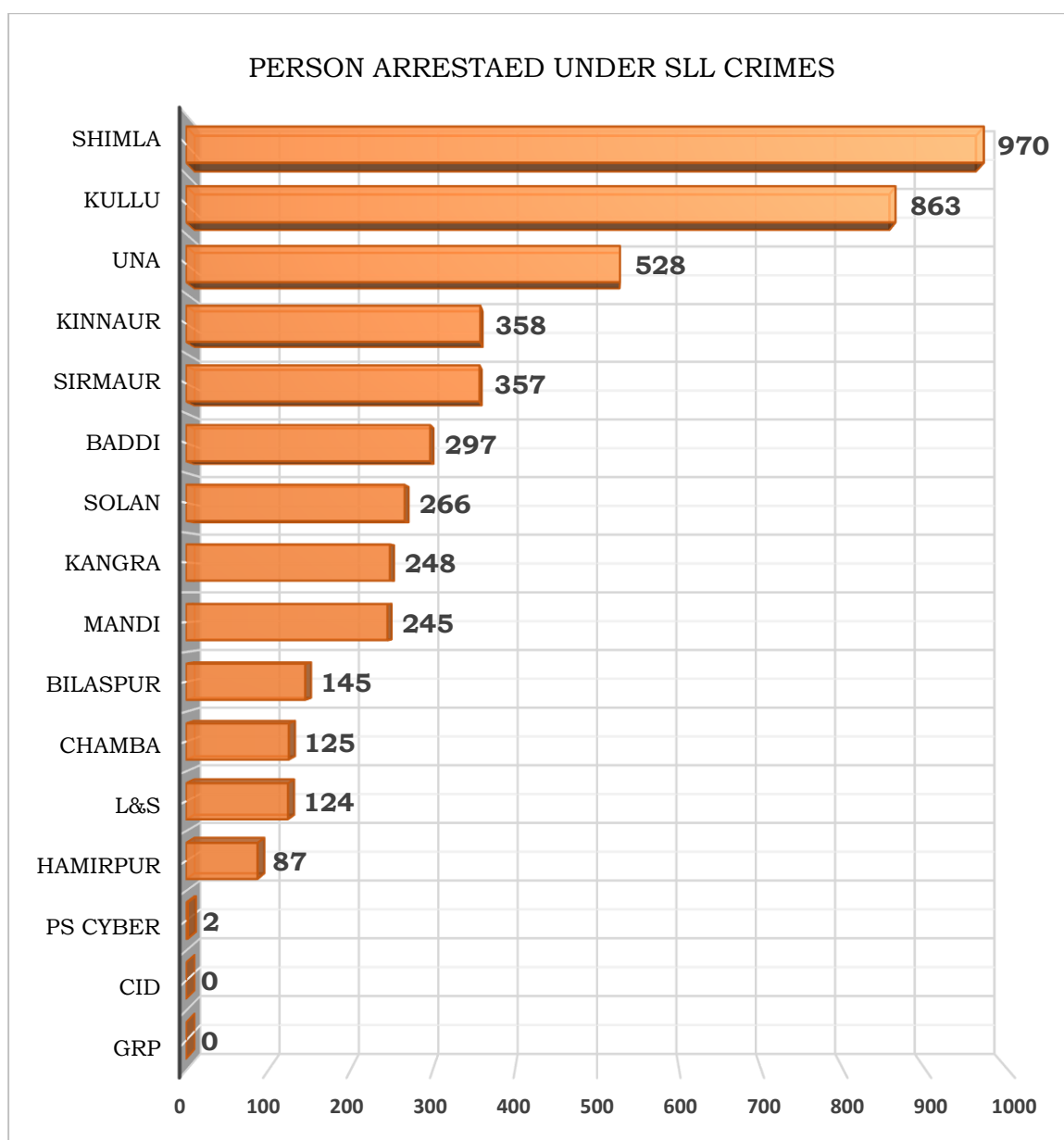

PERSONS ARRESTED UNDER (IPC) CRIMES – 2022

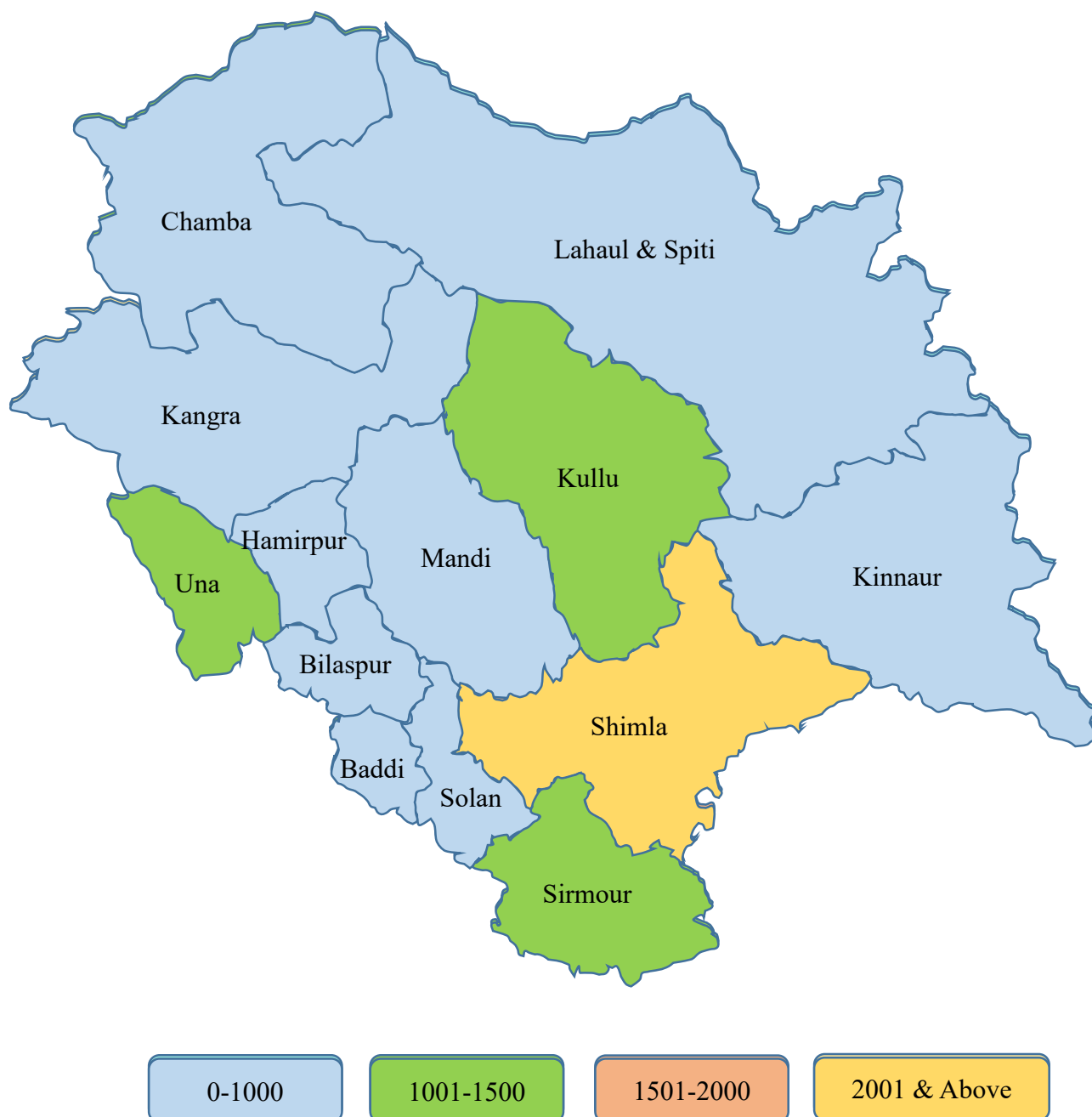

CHAPTER-7

CRIME AGAINST WEAKER SECTIONS OF SOCIETY (SC/ST)

7.1 General:

A complete harmony among different sections of society is prevailing in the State. No particular area of the State is notorious for the commission of offences against the SCs/STs. However, sporadic incidents of violence against the members of these communities do take place.

India is a welfare State. It is committed to the welfare and development of its people in general and of vulnerable sections in particular. Equality of status and opportunity to all citizens of the country are guaranteed by the constitution of India, which also provides that no individual shall be discriminated against on grounds of religion, caste or sex. Fundamental Rights and specific provisions, namely, Articles 38, 39 and 46 in the constitution of India stand testimony to the commitment of the State towards its people. The strategy of the State is to secure distributive justice and allocation of resources to

support programmes for social, economic and educational advancement of the weaker section in general and those of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in particular.

7.2 Constitutional Rights:

The Indian Constitution vide Article 15 lays down that no citizen shall on grounds of religion, race, sex or place of birth be subjected to any disability or restriction. It also guarantees that every citizen shall have equality of status and opportunity.

7.3. Legal Rights:

To uphold the constitutional mandate and to safeguard the interests of this section of the society, special social enactments have come into force from time to time, including privileges by way of reservations.

Following are two of the major legal enactments sponsored by Centre:

- (i) Protection of Civil Rights Act, 1955; and
- (ii) SC/ST (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989

The Protection of Civil Rights Act, 1955 was enacted in furtherance of Article 17 of the Constitution by which untouchability was abolished and its practice in any form is forbidden. Further, in order to check and deter crimes against SC/STs by persons belonging to other communities, the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989 was brought into force from 30th January, 1990. These enactments have extended the positive discrimination in favour of SCs and STs to the field of criminal law in as much as they prescribe penalties that are more stringent than for corresponding offences under the Indian Penal Code (IPC) and other laws.

In addition, in pursuance of the Constitution 65th Amendment Act, 1990, the National Commission for SCs and STs was

constituted w.e.f 12th March, 1992 with wide functions and powers of Civil Courts to take up matters which are of vital importance for socio-economic development of SCs and STs.

7.4 The Crimes against weaker sections identified under the Indian Penal Code (IPC) and Special & Local Laws (SLL):

- (i) Murder
- (ii) Rape
- (iii) Kidnapping & Abduction
- (iv) Dacoity
- (v) Robbery
- (vi) Arson
- (vii) Hurt
- (viii) Others (Other classified IPC crimes)

7.4.1 Under Special & Local Laws (SLL):

- (i) Protection of Civil Rights Act:1955
- (ii) The SC/STs (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989.

The crimes under IPC such as 'Murder', 'Hurt', 'Rape etc. or under Special Acts such as PCR Act & SC/ST (P) Act are already included in overall crimes reported under IPC and SLL respectively and have been

discussed in details in the preceding chapters. The data specific to crimes against SC/ST discussed in the following paragraphs is a part and parcel of total crimes but analyzed separately for better comprehension.

Population:

As per 2011 census of Himachal Pradesh, the Scheduled Castes constituted 25.19% of the total population in the State, while Scheduled Tribes constituted only 5.7%. District Kangra with the highest population share (22.03%) also represented the highest share of Scheduled Castes (21.15%), followed by Mandi (17%) and Shimla with (12.47%).

7.5 Incidents of Crimes against Weaker Section (SC/ST):

The incidents of these crimes (IPC+SLL) were reported to be 214 cases in the State during 2022. Head wise details of crime against weaker sections for the last 3 years, including percentage change over the previous years, is presented in **Table 7.1**. **Chart 7.1** depicts the head wise position of the crime incidents. The

district wise and head wise incidents including the rate of crime has been calculated and presented in **Table 7.2**.

The above data reflects that the incidents of most of the SC/ST (POA) Act and other crimes have increased.

7.6 Head-wise Crime:

Under most of the heads of IPC no incident has been registered during the year 2021. The head wise detailed analysis of all crime heads under which the cases have been registered during the year 2022 are given below:

(i) Murder: (Decrease of 50%)

During the year 2022, 1 incidents was reported in Mandi district under the head Murder against weaker sections in the state.

(ii) Rape: (Decrease of 38.46%)

During the year 2022, 8 incidents of rape were reported in the State. The highest numbers of incidents under this head were reported in district Una & Mandi (3 each), followed by Kullu & Baddi (1 each) No case under this head was registered in rest of the districts.

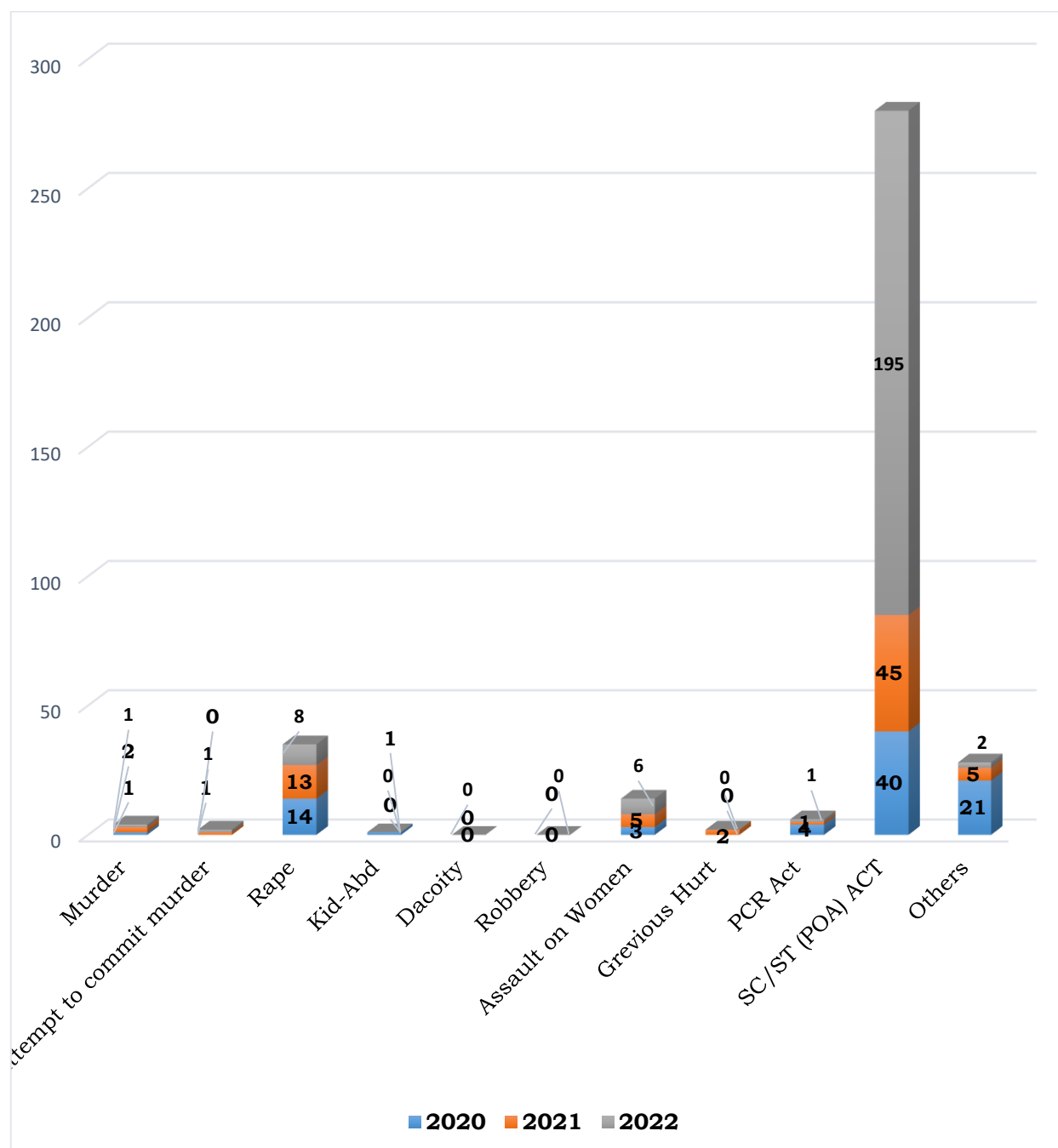
(iii) SC/ST Protection of Civil Rights Act: (No variation)

During the year 2022, 1 incident of PCR Act was reported in

Kinnaur district under this head. No case under this head was registered in rest of the districts.

(iv) SC/ST (Prevention of Atrocities) Act 1989 only:**(Decrease of 12.16%)**

During the year 2022, 195 incidents were reported under this head; a decrease of 56 cases over the previous year. The highest

number of incidents under this head were reported in district Mandi (45), followed by Hamirpur (35), Kangra (30), Shimla (18), Una (16), Bilaspur (14), Kullu (13) Sirmaur (8) Solan (6), Baddi (5), Chamba & Kinnaur (1 each) and L&S (1).

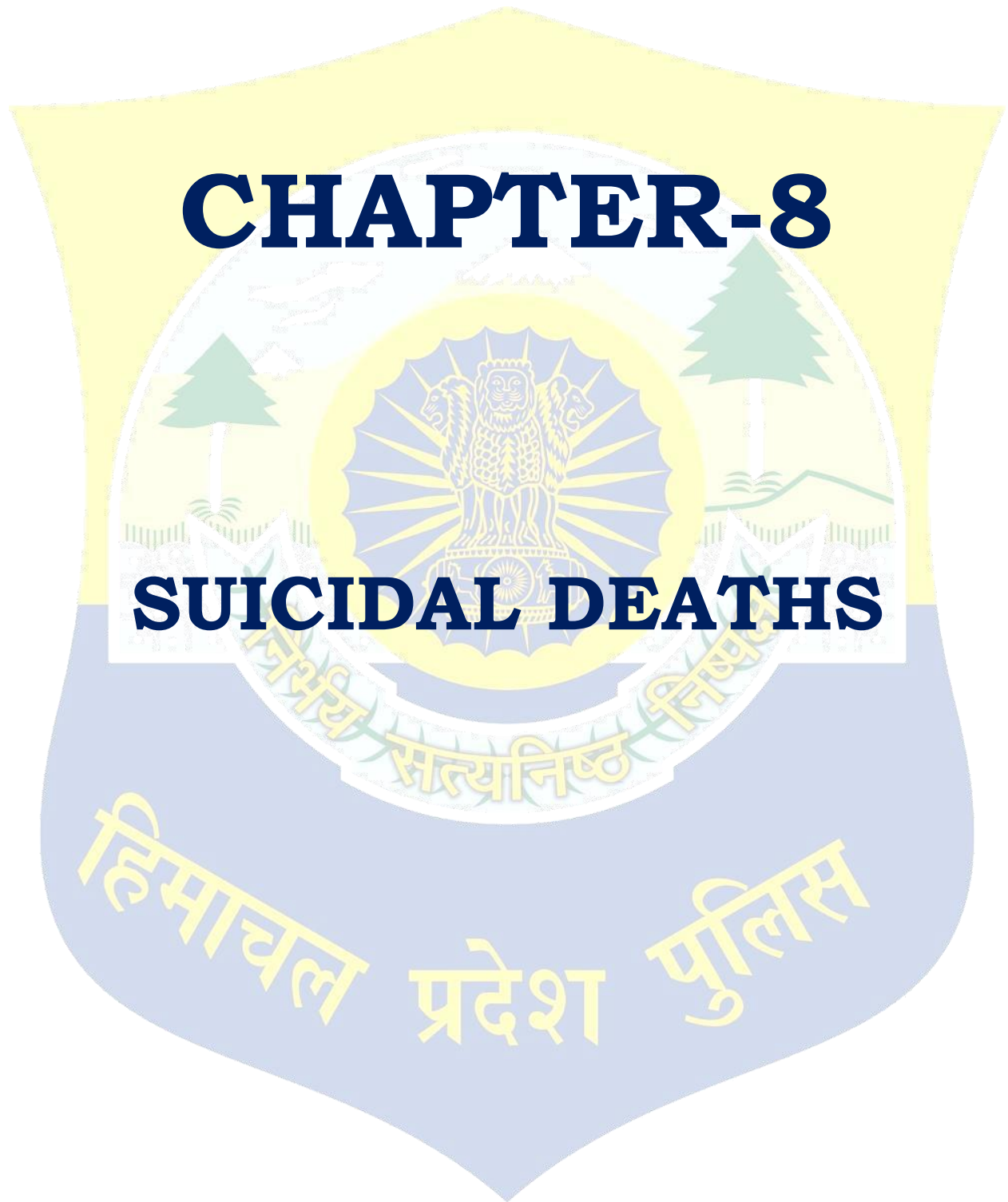

SUICIDAL DEATHS

8.1 General:

According to the Oxford dictionary, 'suicide' means 'the act of killing oneself intentionally'. The word 'suicide' has its origin in the Latin word 'sui' (of oneself) plus 'caedere' [kill]. It is a step which is generally taken by one in an emotionally or mentally weak moment, when he or she feels that coping with life is impossible.

The number of suicides reported in Himachal Pradesh during 2022 was 758, as against 889 during 2021, indicating a decrease of 14.73%.

Kangra district recorded the highest number of suicides during

2022 (167), followed by Mandi (112), Una (85), Shimla (77), Hamirpur (69), Sirmour (59), Solan (48), Baddi (46), Bilaspur (45), Chamba & Kullu (17 each), Kinnaur (14) and Lahaul-Spiti (2). Suicides during the period 2013-2022 are presented in [Chart 8.1](#)

District-wise break-up of suicides during 2022 is presented in [Table 8.1](#). Comparative suicidal deaths for the last 10 years (2013-2022) including male and female is presented in [Chart 8.1](#). [Chart 8.2](#) depicts the district wise incidence of suicidal deaths during 2022.

SUICIDE CASES (MALE AND FEMALE) DURING 2013-2022

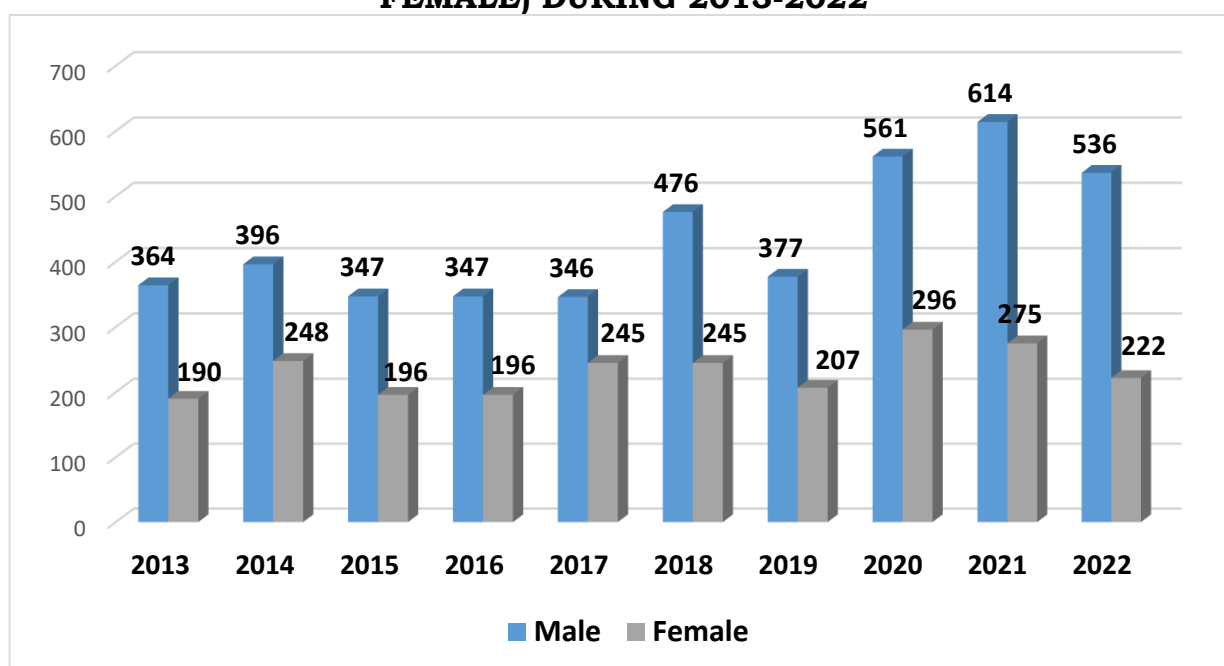
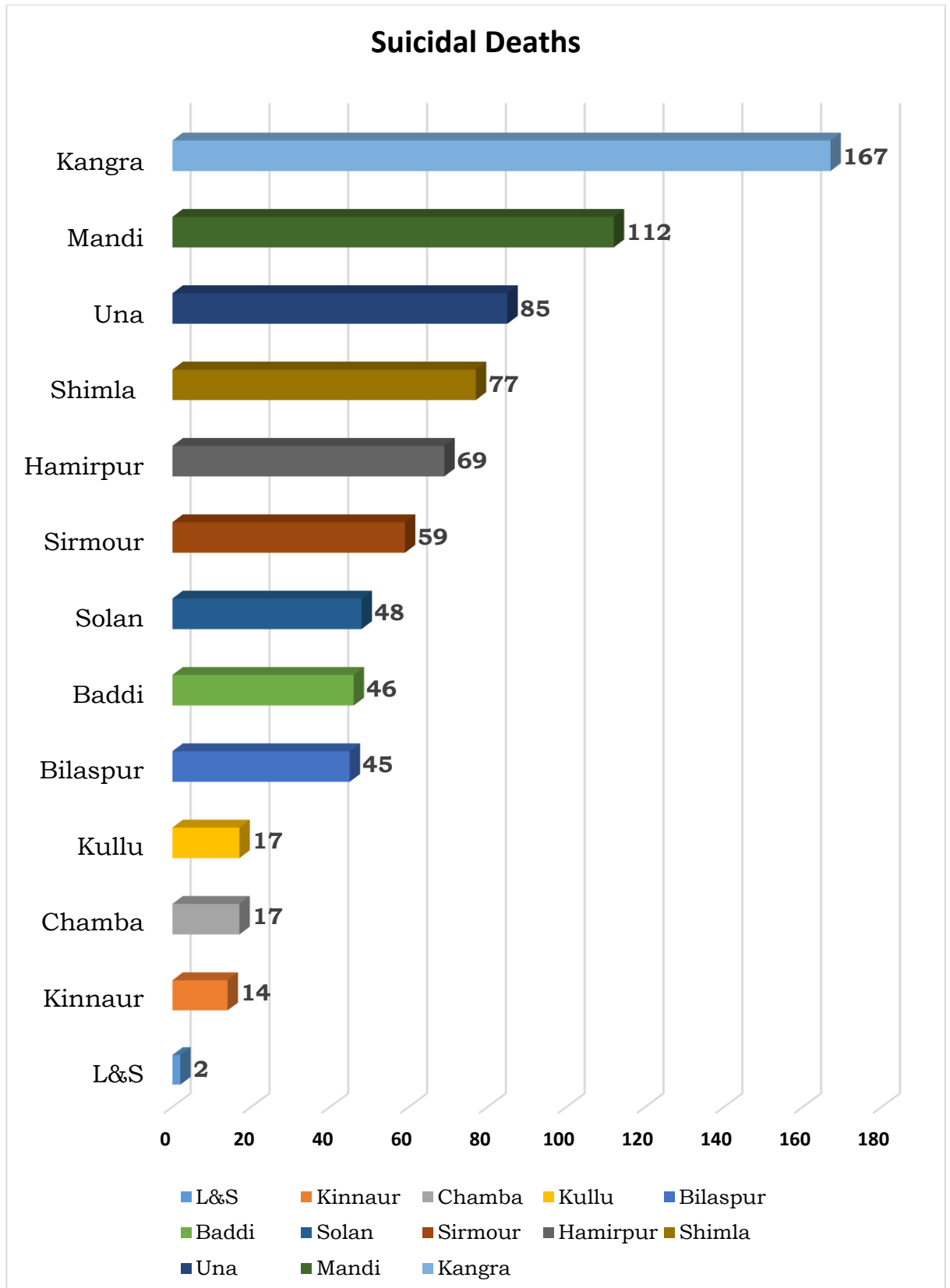


CHART-8.2

From the above table it is revealed that there has been a decrease of 1.86% (from 889 to 758) in suicide cases during the year 2022 over the year 2021. The increase has been witnessed in Hamirpur (65 to 69), Kinnaur (13 to 14) and Una (71 to 85). However,

there has been a decrease in rest of the districts of the State.

The analysis of the above table reveals that percentage of suicide deaths in Baddi, Solan, Bilaspur, Hamirpur, Una, Kangra, and Sirmour has remained higher than the percentage of the population of the district concerned during the years 2021 & 2022. In other words, these 07 districts have higher rates of

suicidal deaths as compared to the other districts of the State.

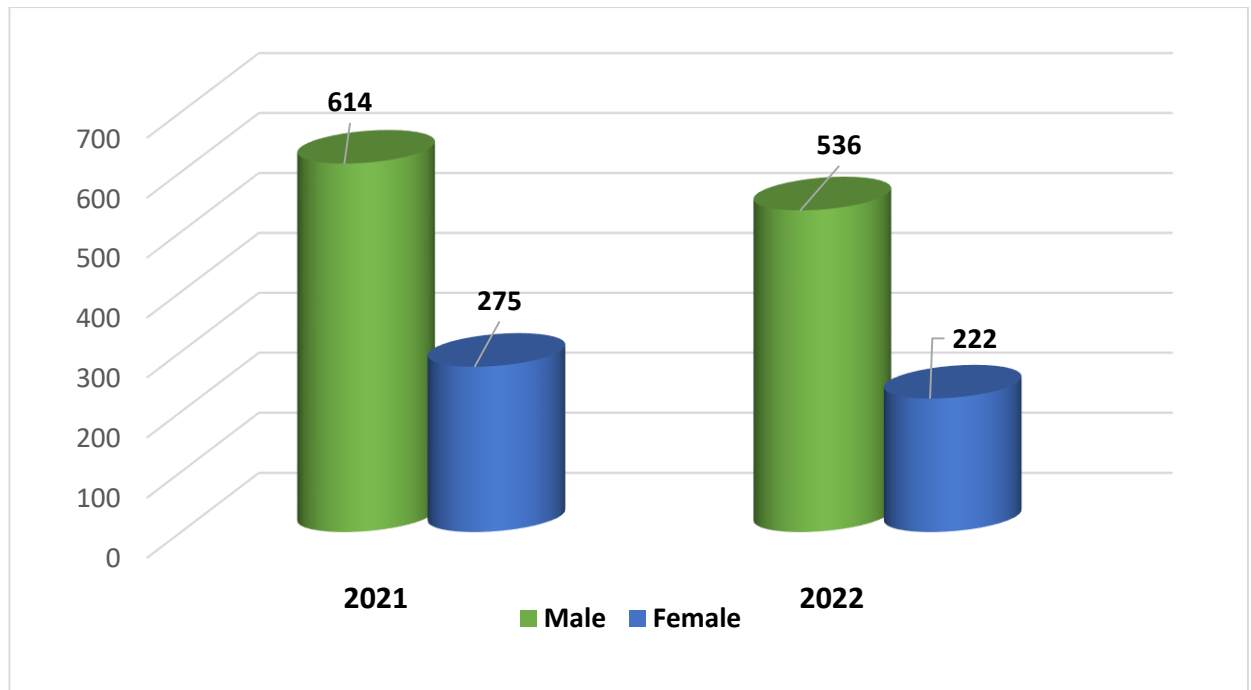

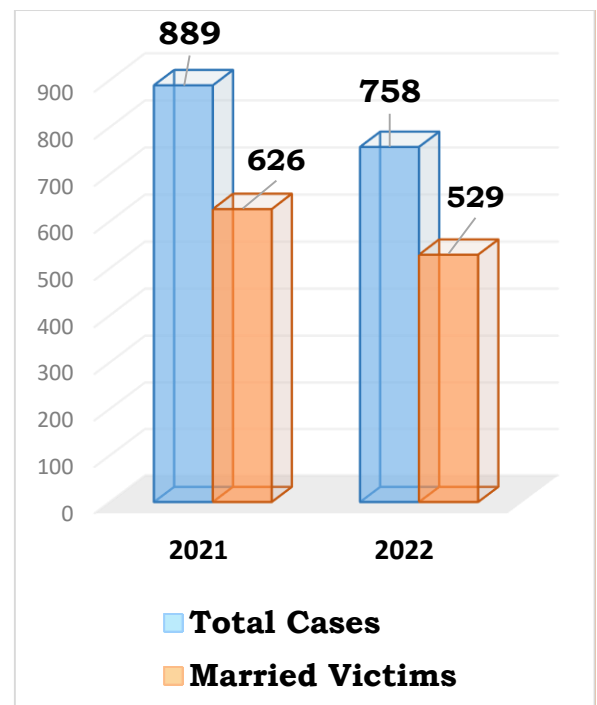

The causes that top the list which led to suicides are Family problems (46.6% in 2021) and

(43.66% in 2022), followed by illness (25.87% in 2021 and 18.20% in 2022).

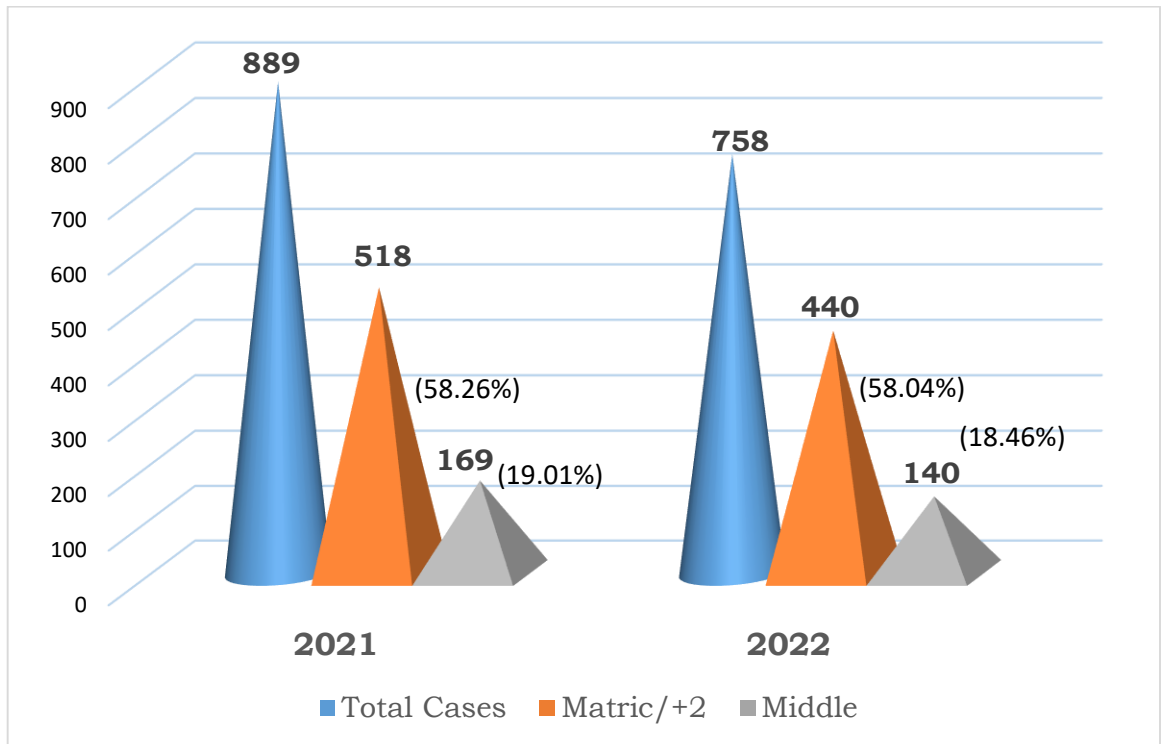
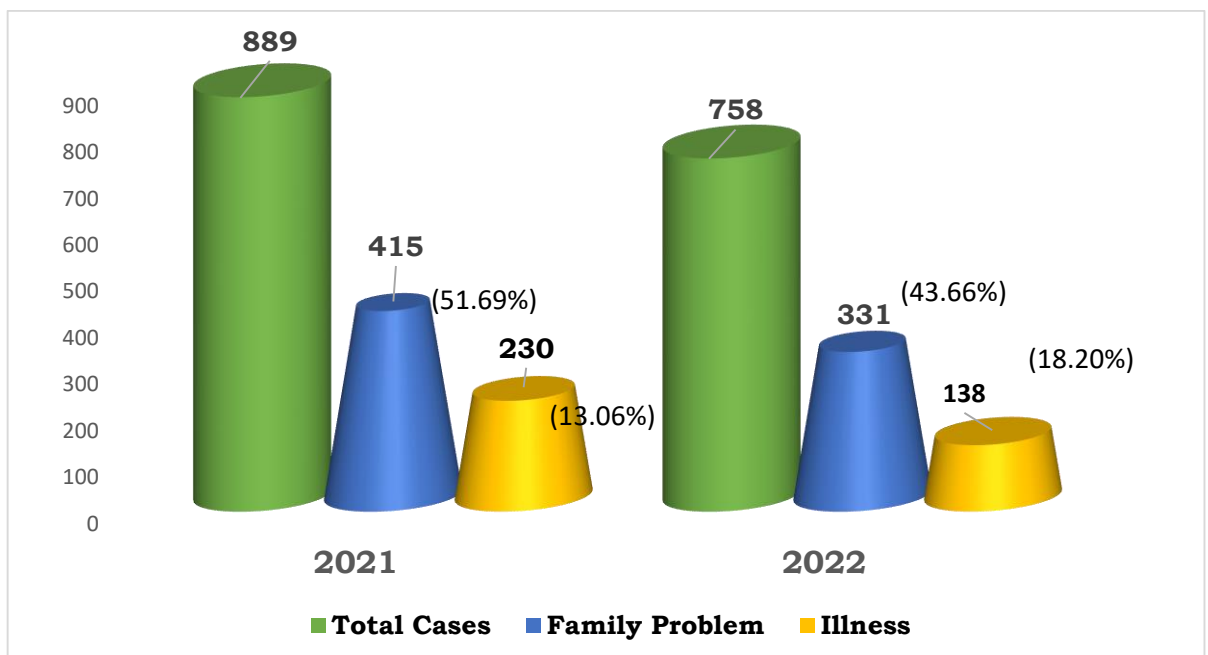

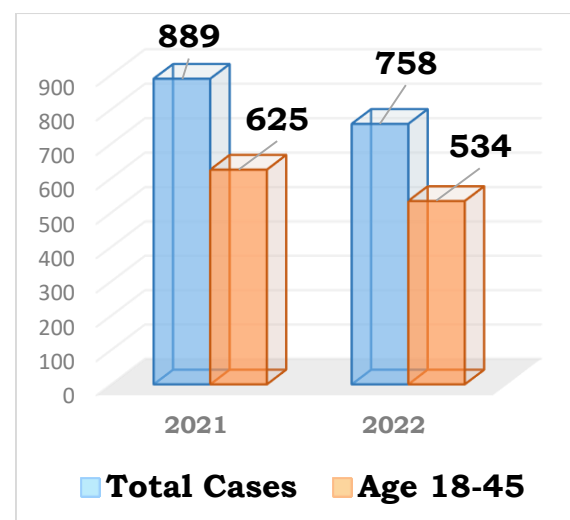

The analysis shows that the age profile of most of the suicide victims both men and women falls into two age-groups of 18-30 and 30-45 years. Thus, it can be said that most people who commit suicide do so in the prime of their lives between 18 to 45 years of age (70.30% in 2021 and 70.44% in 2022). This fact can be further co-related to the reasons for suicide i.e. 'family problems' and 'illness'.

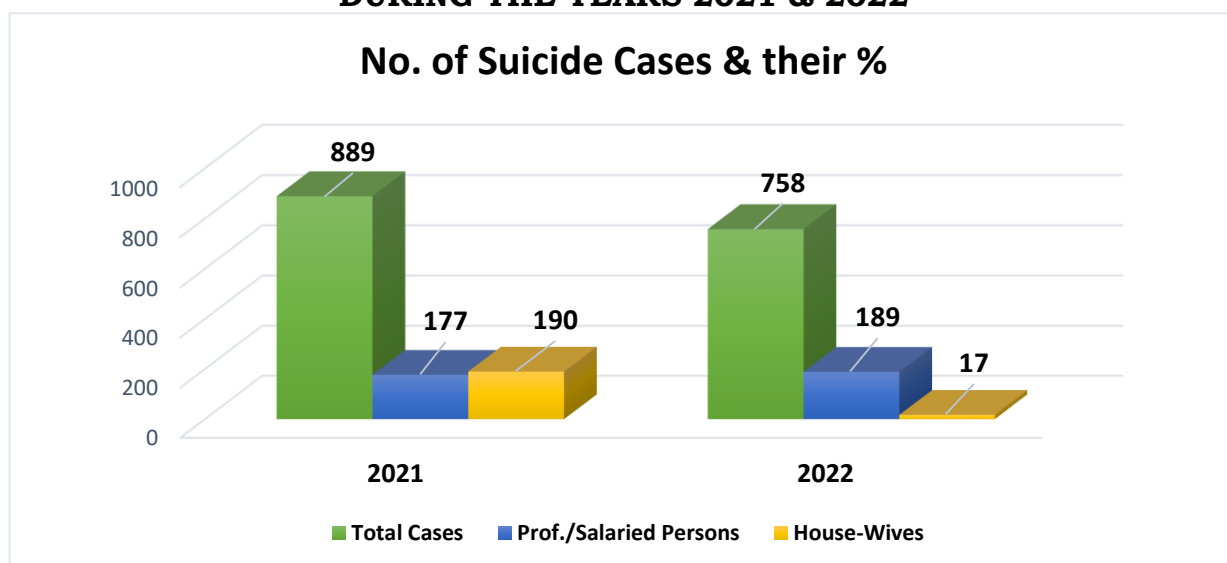

Another aspect that is brought forth is that those who committed suicide were mostly **Professional/Salaried persons** (24.93%) in case of males

and **housewives** in case of females (20.44%). This fact can again be correlated to the age profile falling within 18-45 years.

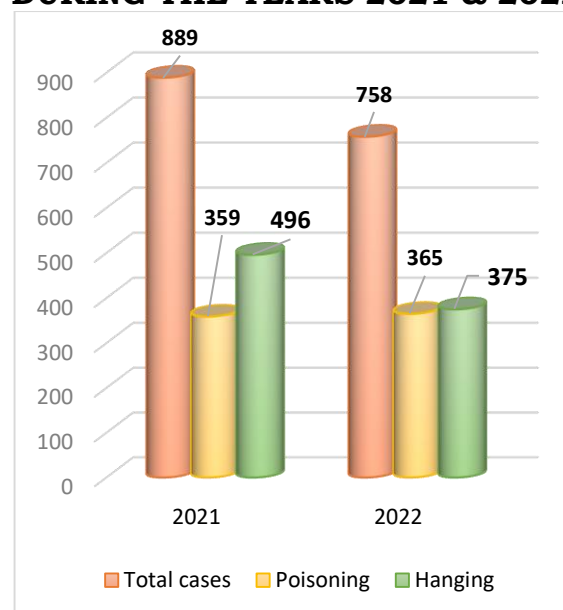

The means adopted for committing suicide range over several methods from drinking too much to jumping from high places. However, the maximum number have committed suicide by **hanging**. (55.79% in 2021 and 49.47% in 2022). This is followed by **consuming poison** (40.38% in 2021 and 48.15% in 2022).

8.11. Conclusions:

- i) There has been a decrease in the suicide cases committed by men during the year 2022 as against the year 2021.
- ii) Kangra, Mandi, Una, Shimla Hamirpur, Sirmour & Solan reported more suicidal deaths as compared to the other 06 districts of the State.
- iii) The major cause of suicides remained 'family problems', followed by 'illness'. 'Unemployment' is certainly not one of the major causes of suicides as it contributes less than 20% of total suicide cases.
- iv) Most of the women suicide victims were house-wives. The farmers/agriculturists do not form a major group of suicide victims as this group contributes only 0.5% to the total suicide cases.
- v) The majority of the suicide victims were married and in the age group of 18 to 45 years.
- vi) The most common means for committing suicide in the year 2022 was 'hanging' followed by taking 'poison'.

SUICIDES – 2022

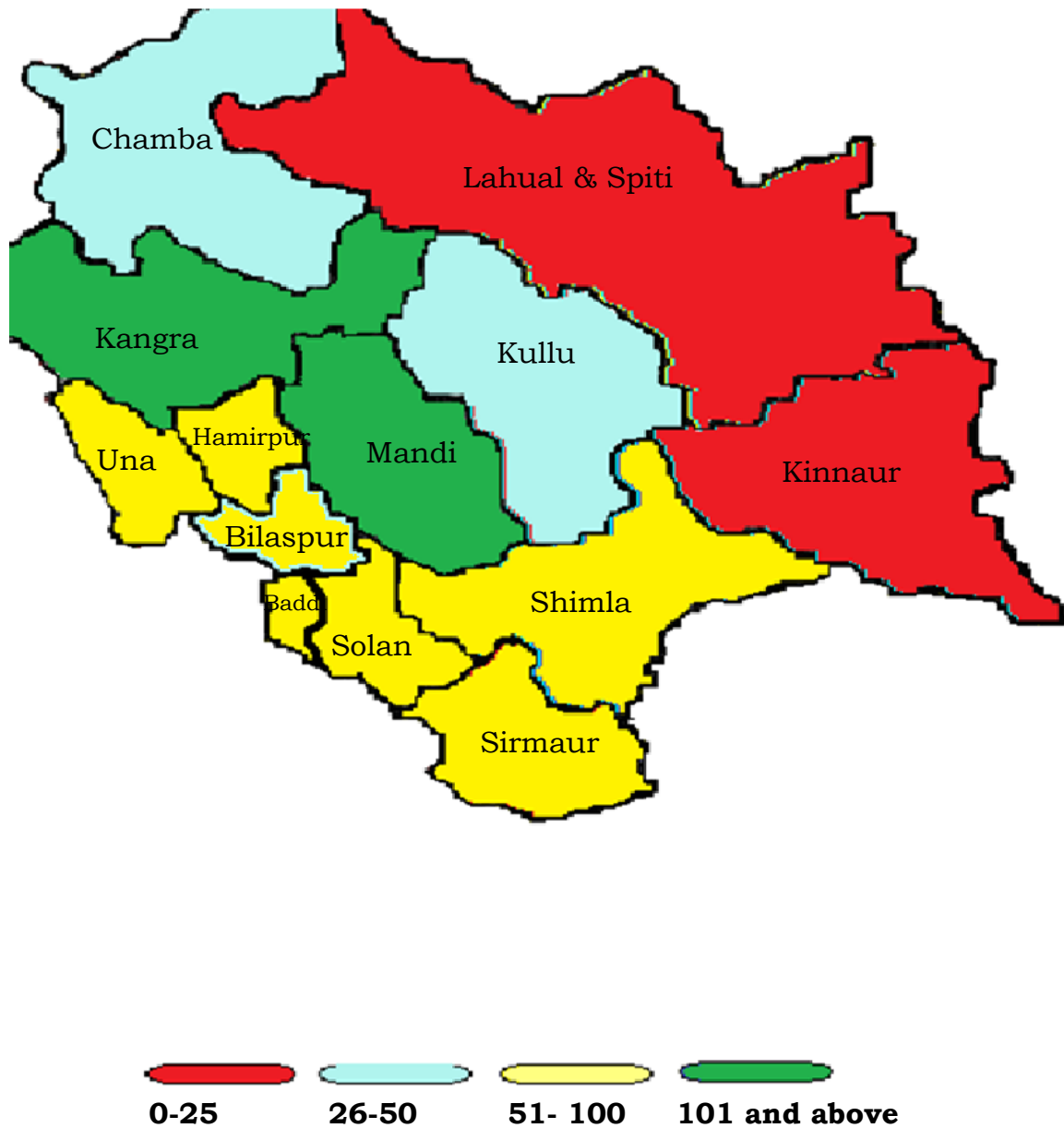
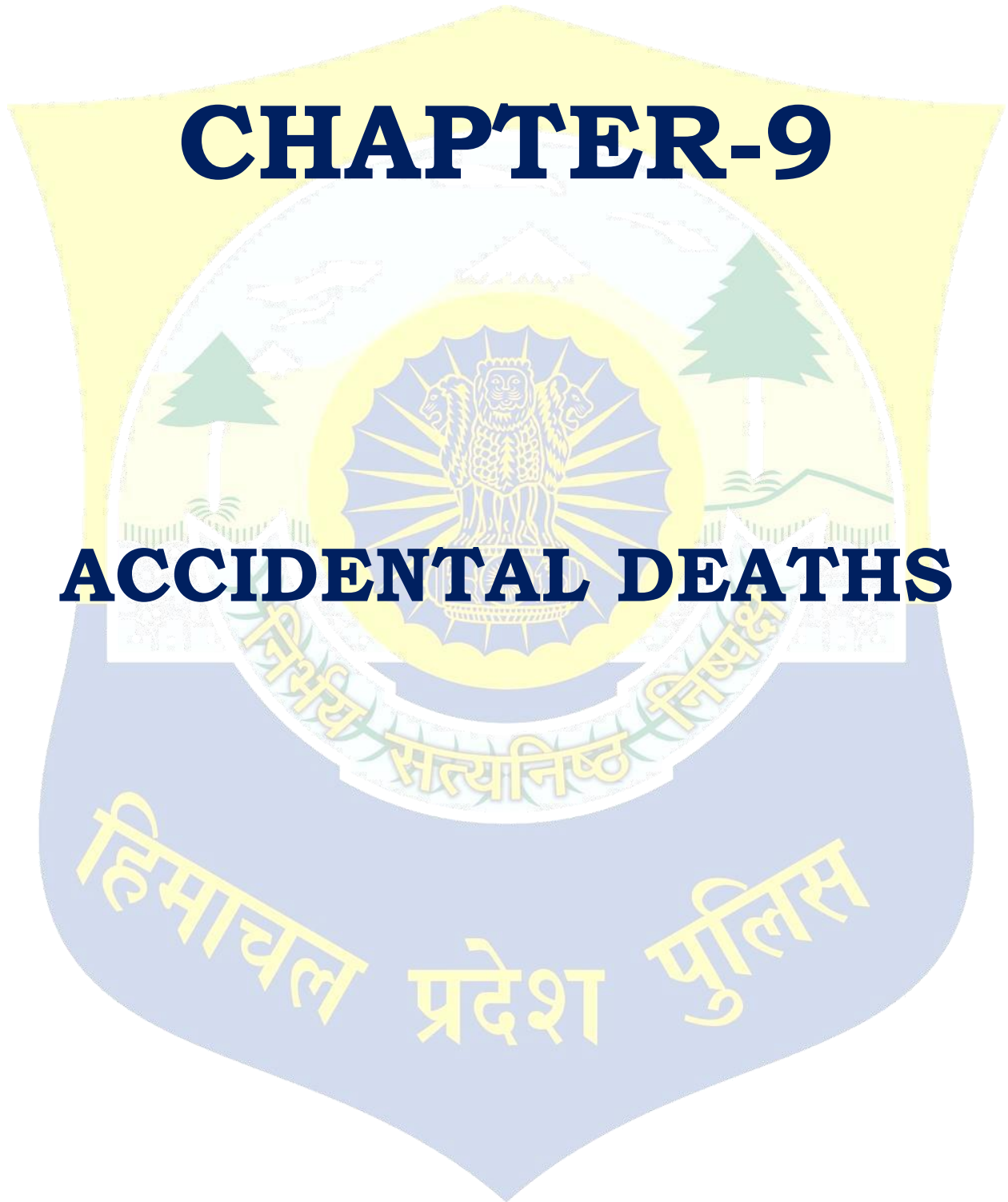

ACCIDENTAL DEATHS

9.1 General:

Incidents of road accidents in Himachal Pradesh show fluctuating trends. The break-up of accidents for the last ten years is shown in [Table-9.1](#)

Car/ Jeep/ Taxi/ Tempo account for the largest number of

accidents. During the year 2022, 46.01% of persons died/injured in road accidents were attributed to Car/Jeep/Taxi/Tempo. District wise comparative statement of road accidents during 2022 is presented in [Table-9.2](#). 2592 road accidents were reported during the year 2022 out of which 1010 accidents were fatal.

Accidental Deaths:

Car/ Jeep/ Taxi/ Tempo were responsible for 47.92% of accidental deaths during 2022. Out of

the 1010 persons who died due to accidents, as many as 484 were involved in accidents with these types of vehicles. [Table-9.2](#) gives details of road accidental deaths for the year

2022 with break-up of types of vehicles and due to other reasons. District Shimla reported the highest (172) numbers of accidental deaths, followed by Kangra (119), Mandi (110), Sirmaur (107), Kullu (104), Una (91) and Baddi (76). **Chart-9.1** depicts road accidents that occurred during 2013–2022.

Percentage of road accidental deaths according to type of vehicles during the year 2022 is presented in **Chart-9.2**.

PERCENTAGE OF ROAD ACCIDENTAL DEATHS (ACCORDING TO TYPE OF VEHICLES DURING 2022)

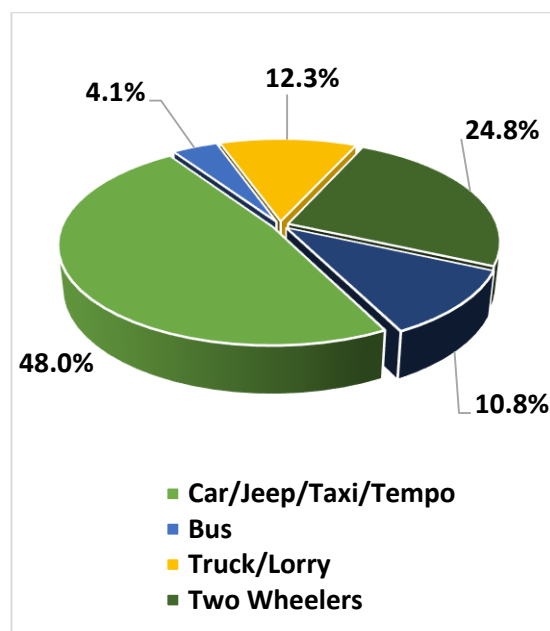

NUMBER OF ROAD ACCIDENTS (2013-2022)

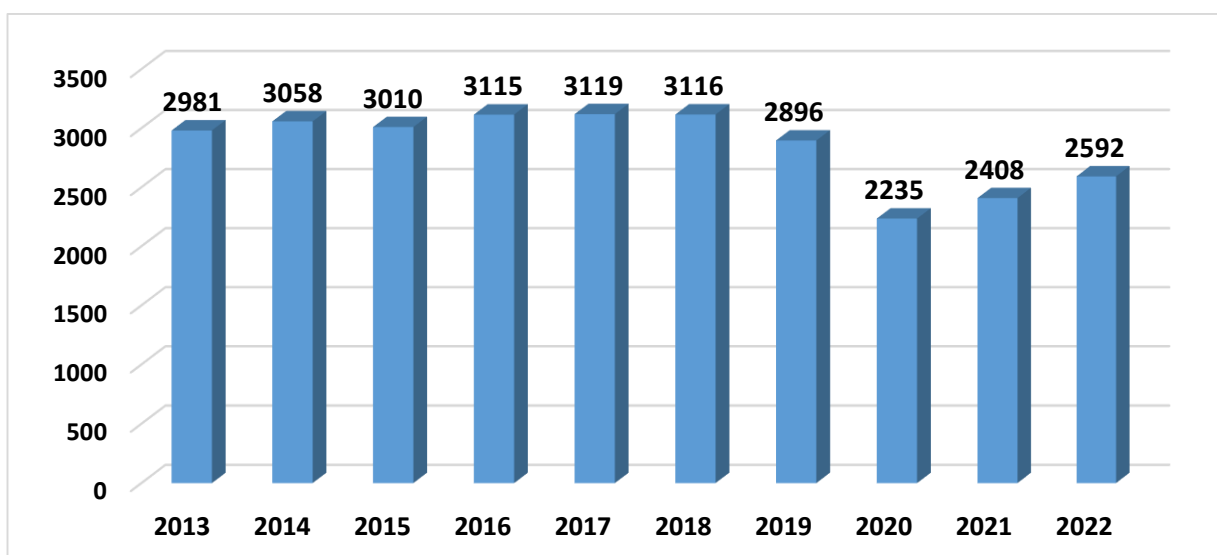

ROAD ACCIDENTAL DEATHS DURING-2022

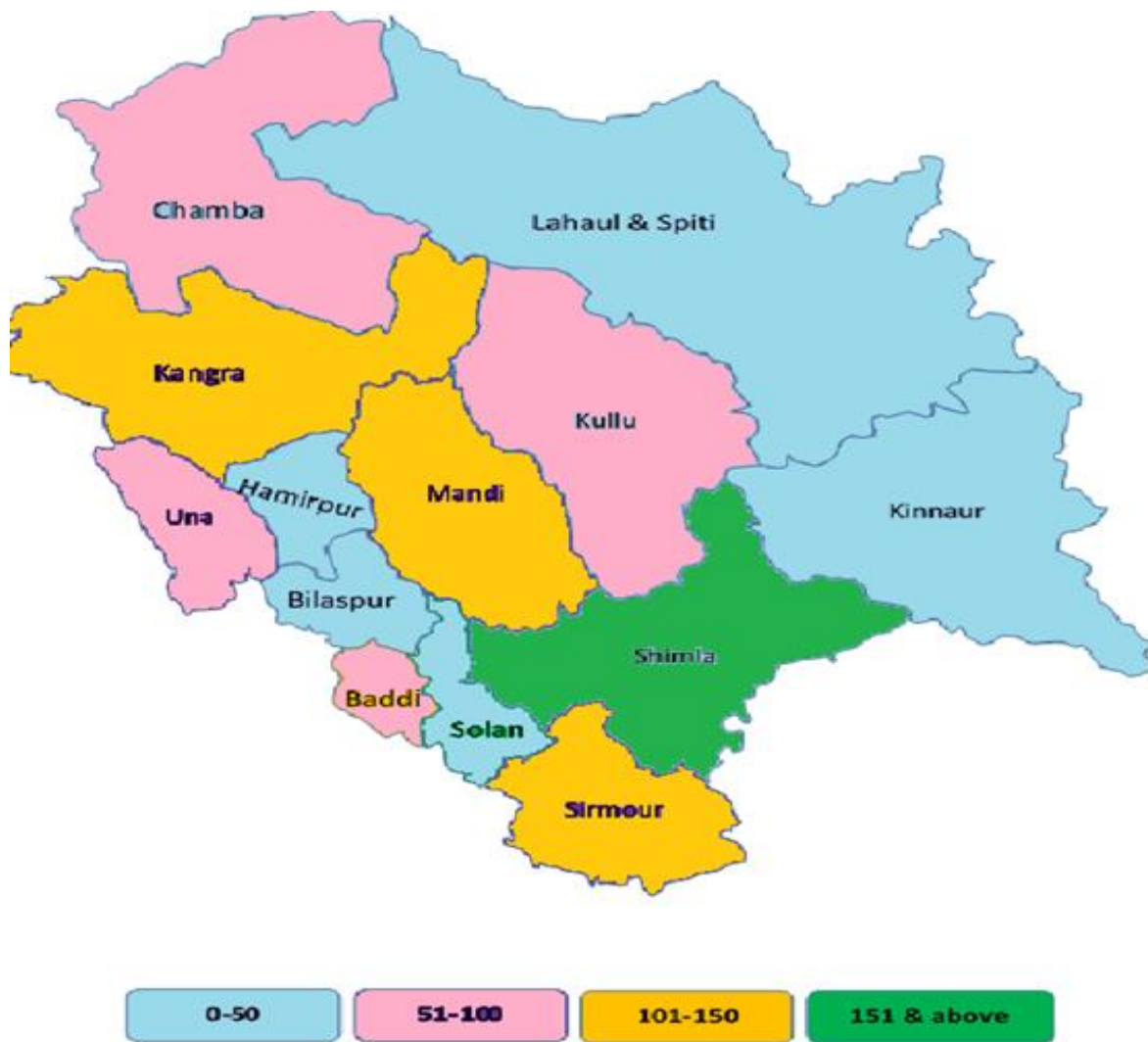

DISTRICT WISE TOTAL ACCIDENTS DURING 2022 (FATAL AND NON FATAL)

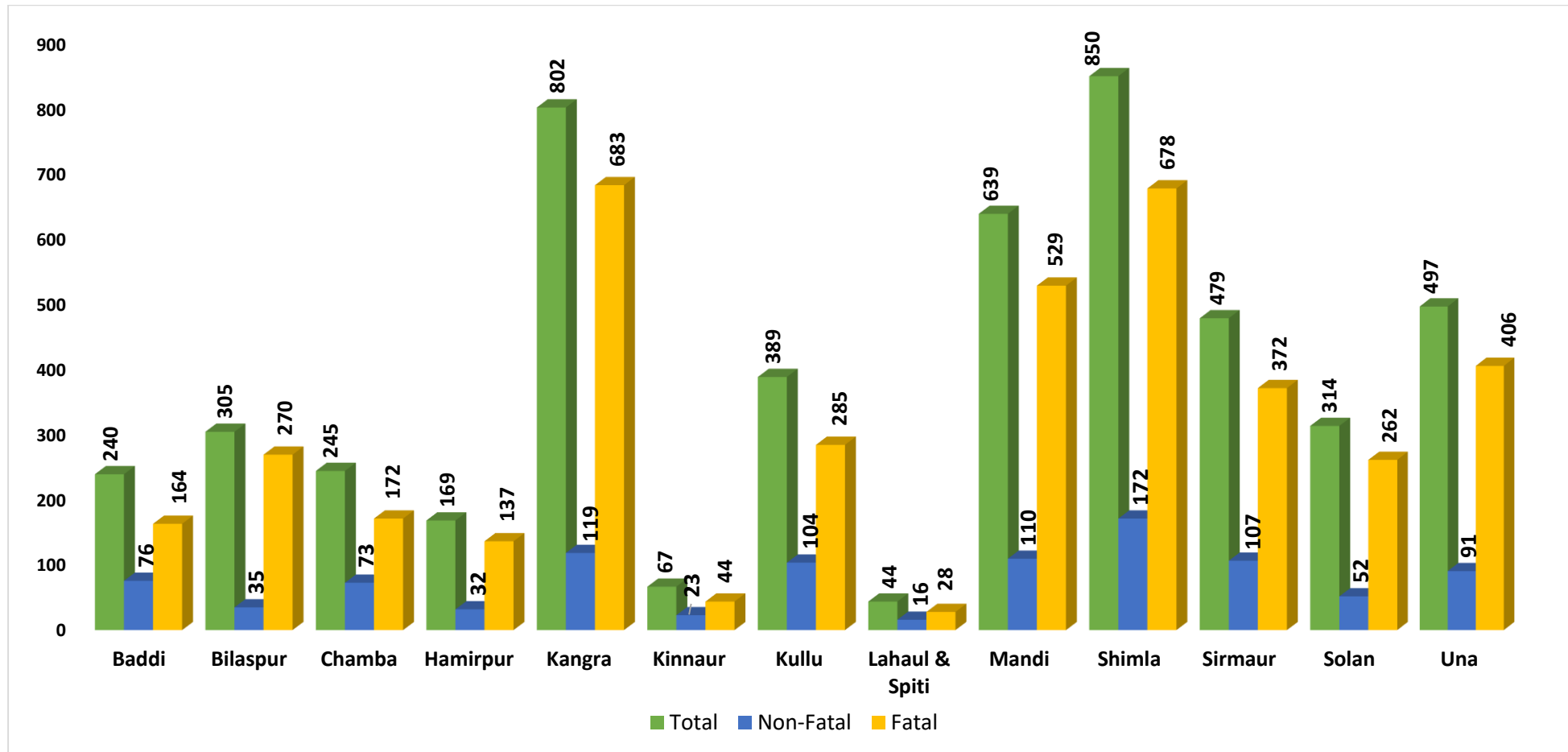

CHAPTER-10

CYBER CRIME

10.1 Definition of Cyber Crime:

“Any illegal action in which a computer is a tool or object of crime, in other words, any crime, the means or purpose of which is to influence the function of computer.”

Computer and Telecommunications are the key areas of Cybercrimes. In Cybercrimes, Computer is used in the following two ways:-

- i.) Computer as a target
- ii.) Computer as a tool

The computer becomes a target of Cybercrime when, by way of hacking or intrusion, the criminals access a Computer with a motive to impair, damage or alter the system. The hacking can evolve into other substantive violations, for example, alteration of accounts, drawl of money etc. by cyber intrusion into a bank.

Computer becomes a tool for Cybercrime when it becomes

a convenient method to commit crimes affecting large scale networks and programmes such as introducing virus into large scale reservation or financial network or unauthorizedly obtaining classified information from data stored in defense and security computers.

10.2 Classification of computer crimes:

The most accepted classification of computer crimes is as follows:

- (i) Computer related frauds.
- (ii) Computer forgery.
- (iii) Damage to computer data of computer programmes.
- (iv) Computer sabotage.
- (v) Unauthorized access.
- (vi) Unauthorized interception
- (vii) Unauthorized reproduction of a

- protected computer programmes.
- (viii) Unauthorized reproduction of a topography
 - (ix) Alteration of computer data or computer programmes
 - (x) Computer espionage
 - (xi) Unauthorized use of a computer
 - (xii) Unauthorized use of a protected Computer programmes.

10.3. Incidents of Computer Crime: (Increase of 7%)

During the year 2022, 77 cases under Cyber Crimes (IT Act only 56 cases, IPC with IT Act (21 cases) were registered in the State and during 2021 this figure was 70.

Chart 10.1 depicts the incidents of Cyber Crimes reported from 2020-2022. Table 10.1 carries the district-wise details of cases registered under the IT Act. Table 10.2 gives the details of Cyber Crimes registered and persons arrested under the I.T. Act during 2020-2022 :-

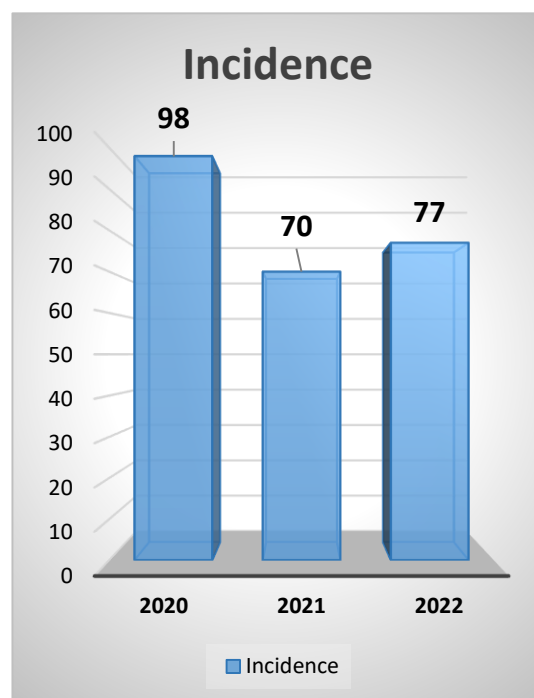

CHAPTER-11

DETECTION UNDER NARCOTIC DRUGS & PSYCHOTROPIC SUBSTANCES (ND&PS) ACT

11.1 Drug Menace in Himachal Pradesh:-

The State of Himachal Pradesh is well known for its natural beauty and is one of the most popular tourist destinations in the world. Unfortunately, this beautiful State has also come to be known for illicit cultivation of cannabis and opium poppy. Illicit drugs produced in the State attract drug traffickers. Generally, the youth seem to be the target of this drug menace and its abuse. Drug abuse and the drug menace is the illicit, non-medical use of limited number of substances. Most of such drugs have the properties of altering the mental state of a being in ways that are considered by social norms and defined by statute to be inappropriate, undesirable, harmful threatening to the life of the user and to the society at large. Heroin, cocaine, opium, Charas, are some of the drugs abused.

In Himachal Pradesh, there are 17495 villages out of which in 402 villages of the following five Districts cannabis grows naturally. Analysis reveals that these five districts of the State have been identified by the drug traffickers for cultivation and transporting of Cannabis:

Narcotic Drugs:

The term 'narcotic' originally referred medically to any psychoactive compound with numbing or paralyzing properties. In large doses, such drugs can cause stupor (condition of insensibility), coma or convulsion. These would include:

- (i) Cannabis preparations like Bhang, Ganja and Charas.
- (ii) Opium and Opium alkaloids like morphine.
- (iii) Coca alkaloids like Cocaine.
- (iv) Synthetic narcotic drugs like Pethidine.

11.2 Psychotropic Drugs:

The Greek word Psycho means "Soul" and "Trope" means 'Turning', and drug having peculiar affinity for or effect on mind (Mind altering). The psychotropic drugs include:

- 1) Hallucinogens: There are both natural and synthetic Drugs like LSD (Lysergic acid Diethylamide) and tetrahydrocannabinols.

- 2) **Hypnotics:** Secobarbitone, Phenobarbitone.
- 3) **Stimulants:** These drugs induce and excitement in the body like amphetamines cocaine.
- 4) **Tranquillizers:** Methaqualone, Mandrax, etc.

11.3 Depressants: Under this class would fall drugs which are pain killers, analgesics, sedatives, like barbiturates and opiates.

11.4 Important (ND&PS) Drugs:

- Opium
- Morphine
- Codeine
- Heroin
- Cocaine
- Cannabis
- Ganja
- Hashish
- Marijuana
- Synthetic Drugs
- LSD etc.

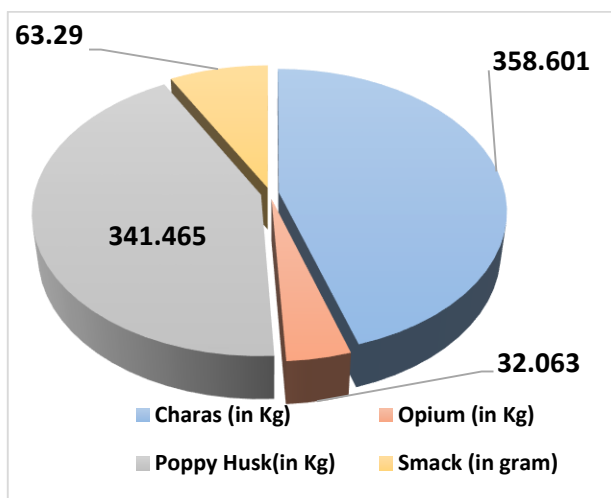

The drug-wise detection during the year 2022 according to the above mentioned table is presented in the **Chart 11.1**. The major detection of Charas (358.601 kgs.), has been made during the year 2022 followed by Poppy Husk (341.465 kgs), Ganja (165.826 kgs), Opium (32.063 kgs). Detection of other drugs i.e. Smack/ heroin etc. has also been made during the year 2022.

11.6 Detailed Analysis:

The incidence (1516) under the ND&PS Act showed a decrease of 1.36% over 2021. Cases under this Act contributed 26.03% against the total Local & Special Law reported cases during the year 2022. The highest number of cases (239) under this head were reported in

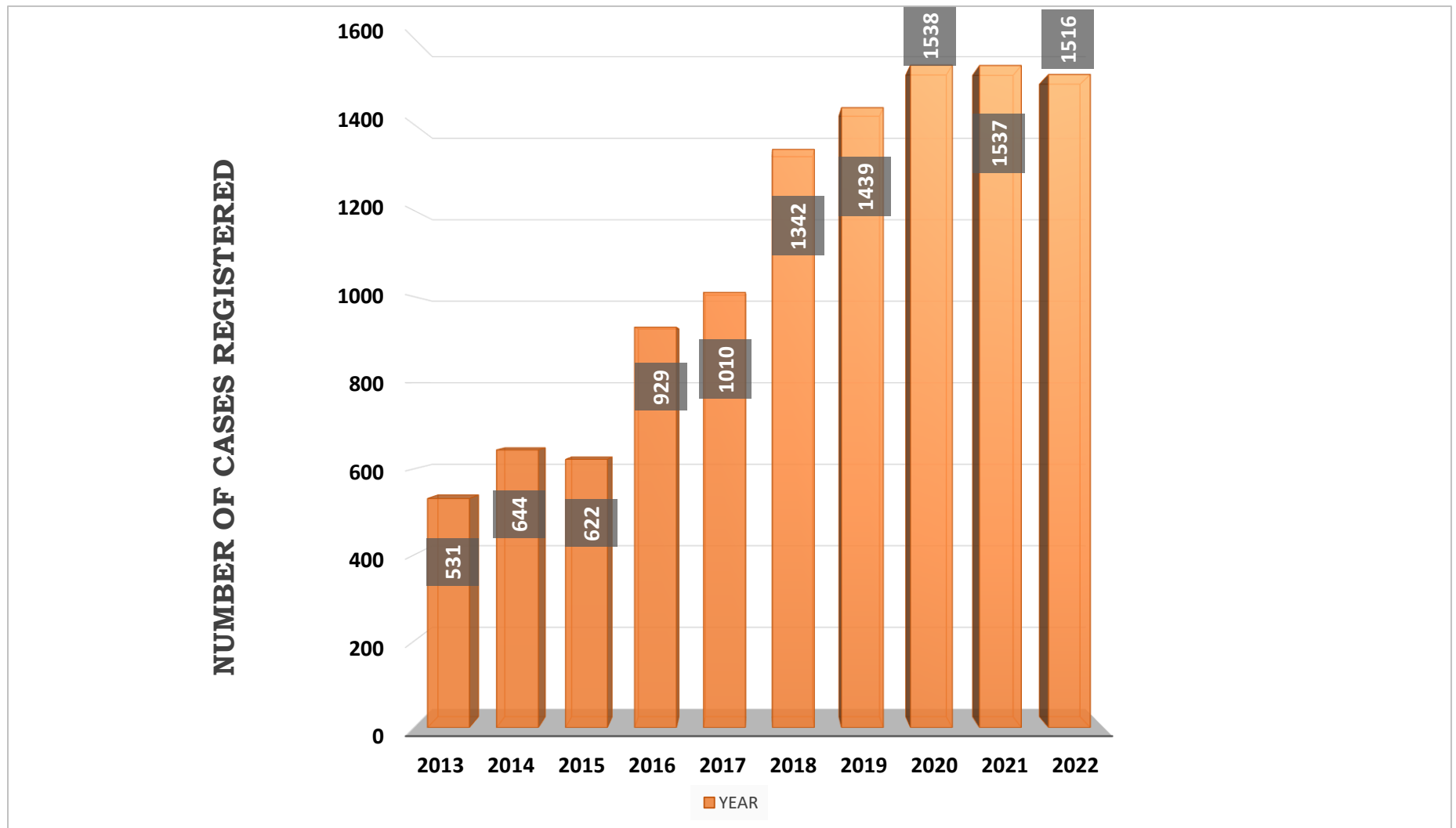
District Shimla, followed by Mandi (212), Bilaspur (192), Kullu (186), Kangra (170), Solan (90), Chamba (89), Una (84), Sirmaur (81), Hamirpur (79), Baddi (54), Kinnaur (34), Lahaul & Spiti (6).

The main concentration on the cases registered under this Act remains in Shimla, Kullu, Kangra and Mandi districts, with 54.64% of the total registered cases. The analysis reveals that the main source/area of drugs are districts Shimla, Mandi Bilaspur & Kullu. Further, carriers of this contraband are mostly agriculturists, laborers and poor people.

Study of age profile shows that mostly adults between 18-30 years of age are involved (48.79%). About 42.28% were in the age group of 30-45 years. Above 45 years were 8.27%.

The participation of children below 18 years is negligible (0.64%). Total 46 foreigners were involved in this activity. Previous 10 years (2013-2022) crime under this head is presented in **Chart-11.1**

POLICE STRENGTH, INFRASTRUCTURE AND EXPENDITURE

12.1 Police Strength:

The sanctioned strength of the Police personnel in Himachal Pradesh during the year 2022 was 20190, while actual strength is 17446. Total strength of (GOs) Class-I is 335, which includes 94 IPS and 193 HPS. Total Class-II GOs are 30. The strength of executive force is 18613, which includes 2294 NGOs Grade-I: Inspectors (307), Sub-Inspectors (771) Assistant Sub-Inspectors

(1216). The strength of Head Constables and Constables is 16309, (HCs-3114 and Const.-13145). The strength of ministerial staff (Class-III) is 371, Class-IV 558. The rank wise detailed sanctioned position and actual strength is presented in **Table 12.1**.

The strength of Women Police Inspector (18), Sub-Inspector (19), ASI (40), HC (97) and Constable (2213) is presented in **Table 12.2**.

12.2 Police Districts and Sub-divisions:

During the year 2022, there were 1 Zone, 3 Ranges (Northern, Southern & Central), 14 Districts (including two Police Districts at Baddi & Nurpur), 34 Police Sub-Divisions, 142 Police Stations (including 2 Police Stations of GRP and four Police Stations of CID. Detailed summary is given in [Table 12.2](#).

12.3 Police Budget:

The budget allocation for Police department in Himachal Pradesh for the last 3 years is depicted in [Table 12.3](#). During the budget year 2022-23, Himachal Pradesh Police Budget accounted for 2.87% of the total budget for Himachal Pradesh.

12.5 Equipment & Transport:

The district wise number and type of available equipment with Himachal Pradesh, during 2022 are presented in [Table 12.4](#). There are 51 HF Sets, 998 VHF Sets, 2171 Walkie Talkies and 108 other equipment's available with the Himachal Police Department.

At present the total available (fleet) strength in Himachal Pradesh Police is 561 Motor Cycles, 227 (Gypsy/ Jeep/ Bolero/ Tata Mobiles), 25 Heavy Vehicles and 08 Vans & others. The district wise details are given in [Table 12.5](#) and [Table 12.6](#).

The word offence means any act or omission made punishable by any law for the time being in force.

Property Offence:

Includes Burglary, Theft, Dacoity and Robbery.

Special law:

CHAPTER-1

INCIDENT AND RATE OF COGNIZABLE CRIME IN HIMACHAL PRADESH

1.1 General:

Himachal Pradesh is a hilly and a peaceful State. There are sporadic incidents of crime taking place, but no particular area of any district of this State is notorious for any class or category of crime. There has not been any abnormal fluctuation in the incidence of crime in the State.

The crime situation has remained peaceful and well under control during the year 2022 throughout the State of Himachal Pradesh. No alarming increase was noticed under any major head of crime.

1.2. The Parameters for Review and Analysis of Crime:-

The following parameters have been adopted while analyzing crime for the year 2022:-

- ➡ Geographical spread.
- ➡ Reasons for commission of crime, especially in offences against persons.
- ➡ Investigation process followed.
- ➡ Recovery of property.
- ➡ Profile of criminals.

1.3. Reported Incidents of Cognizable Crimes:

The ten years trends of incidence and rate of total cognizable crime under Indian Penal Code (IPC) and Local & Special Laws (2013-2022) is presented in **Table-1.2** at the end of the chapter. A total of 19053 cognizable crime cases were reported during the year 2022. These comprise 13231 cases under IPC and 5822 cases under (SLL) Special & Local Laws. (**Table-1.1** and **Chart-1.1 & 1.2**)

FOR THE LAST 10 YEARS (2013-2022)

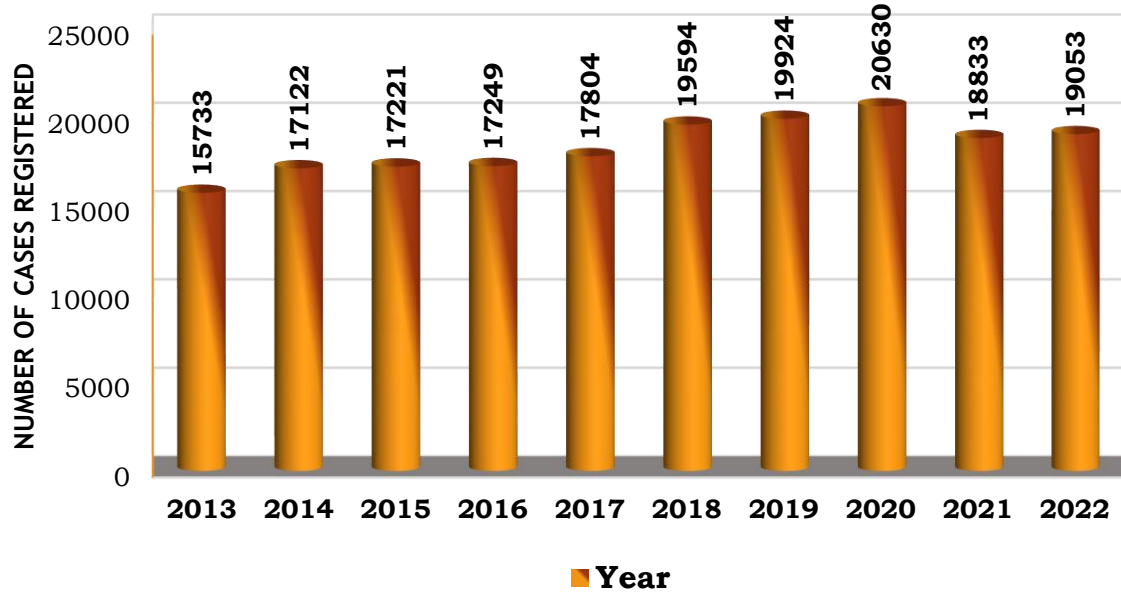
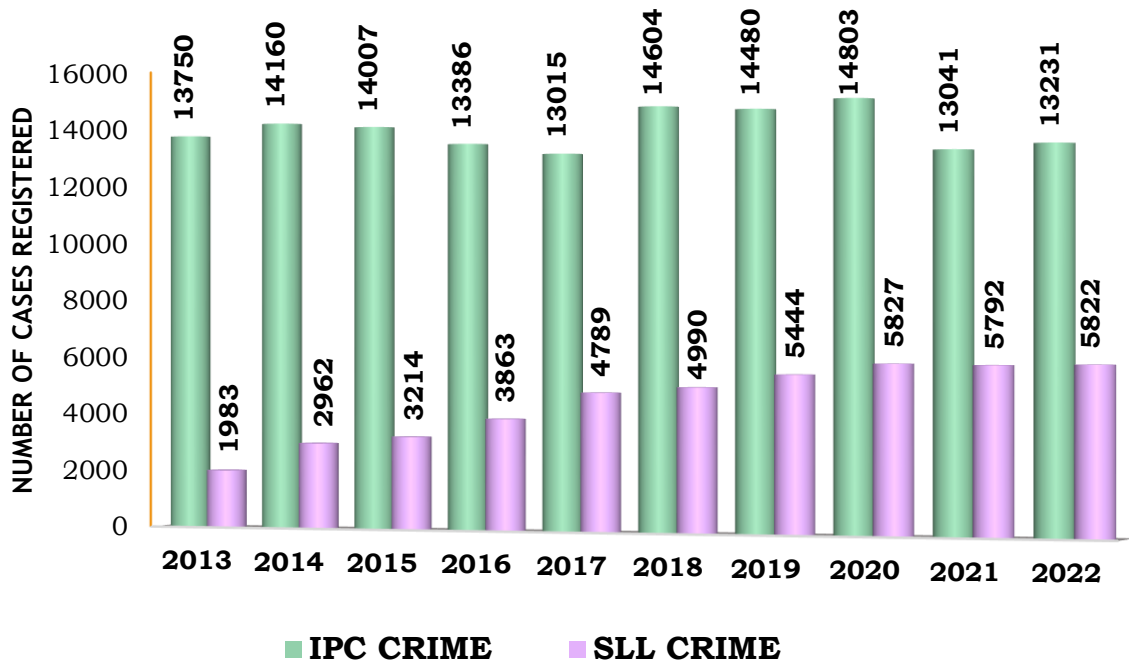


CHART-1.2

1.4. Crime Trends:

1.4.1. Crime Incidents:

During the year 2022, cases of cognizable crime have increased by **1.16% (+220)** as compared to the registration of cognizable crime cases of the corresponding year. The registration in IPC crimes has recorded an increase of **1.45%** and Special & Local Laws crime has recorded a increase of **0.51%** in 2022 as compared to the previous year.

A total of 13231 IPC cases were reported in the State during 2022, as against 13041 cases in 2021 (**1.45% increase**). District Kangra has recorded crime incidents between 2001 to 3000 IPC cases. Kullu, Mandi, Shimla & Sirmour districts have recorded crime incidents between 1001 to 2000 IPC cases. Baddi, Bilaspur, Chamba, Hamirpur, Solan & Una districts have recorded crime incidents between 501 to 1000 IPC cases. The crime incidents in districts Kinnaur, Lahaul & Spiti, Railway & Traffic Unit, CID and Cyber Units have remained below the figure of 500 cases. The district

wise volume of crime is depicted in **Table 1.3**.

1.4.2. District-wise IPC Crime Trends:

The highest occurrence of IPC cases was reported in Kangra (2454 cases) followed by Mandi (1810), Shimla (1743), Sirmour (1030), Kullu (1001), Bilaspur (949), Solan (863), Una (851), Hamirpur (773), Baddi (712), Chamba (641), Kinnaur (250), Lahaul & Spiti (118), CID (18), GRP (114) and Cyber PS (4). The details of number of districts falling under different ranges of incidents of IPC crimes during the year 2022 are presented in **Table 1.3**.

1.5. Crime Pattern: (IPC Crimes)

As compared to 2021, this year the incidents of Attempt to Murder, Culpable Homicide, Burglary, Theft, Rioting, Grievous Hurt, Assault on Women, Accident have shown an increases, while incidents of Murder, Kidnapping & Abduction, Dacoity, Dowry Deaths, Cruelty to women and other IPC have shown a decrease. There is no

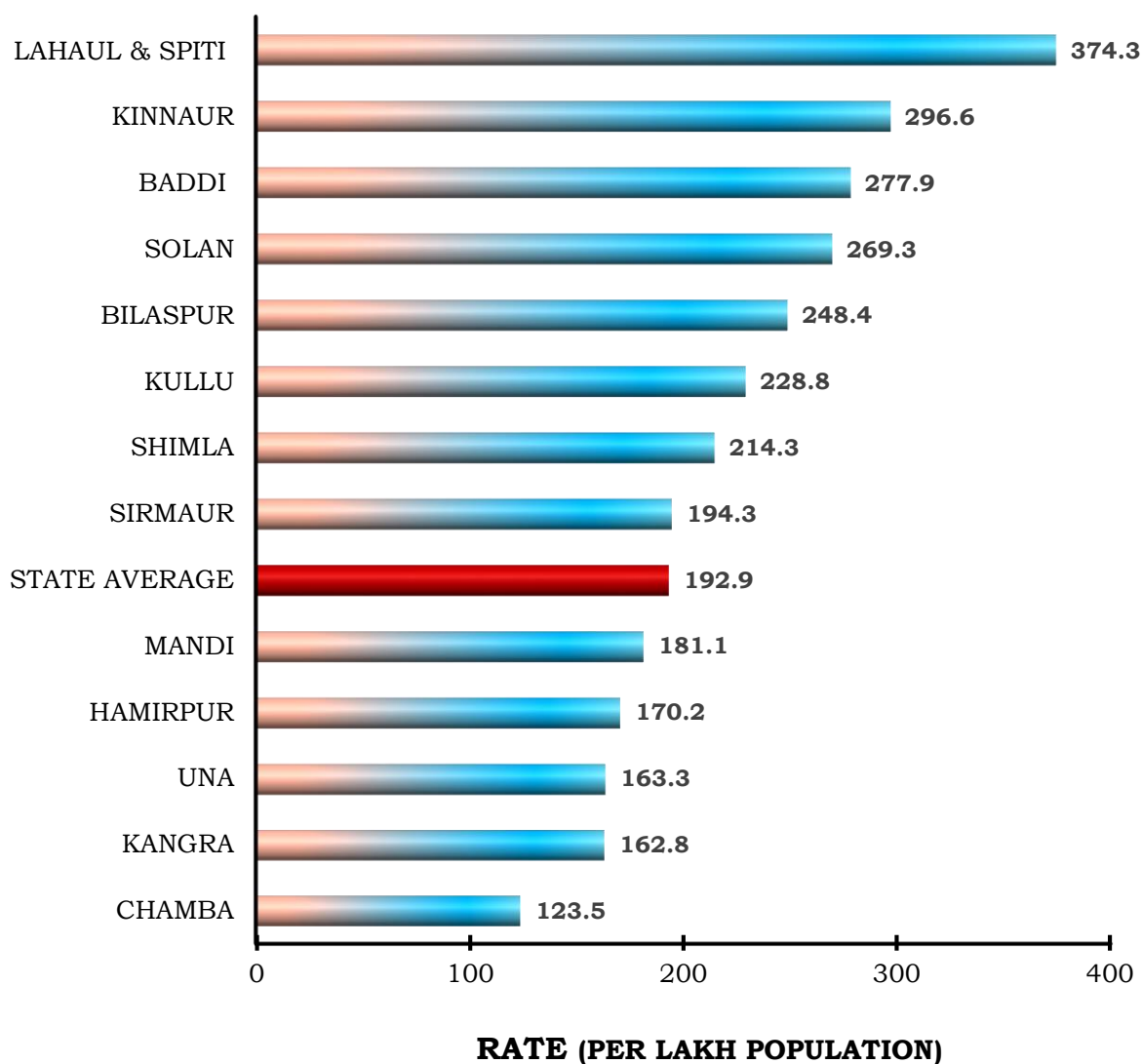
increase or decrease in Robbery cases.

1.6. Crime Rate:

The District wise Crime Rate is presented in Table-1.4. The average IPC Crime Rate in the State for 2022 was 192.9. The highest

Crime Rate districts are Lahaul & Spiti (374.2) followed by Kinnaur (296.5), Solan (265.5), Bialspur (248.3), Kullu (228.8), Shimla (214.2), Sirmaur(194.2), Mandi (181), Hamirpur (170.1), Una (163.3), Kangra (162.8) and Chamba (123.4).

Head Wise Analysis of IPC Offences:

The head wise analysis of IPC offences is presented in Table-1.5. The head wise statistics shows the following trends:-

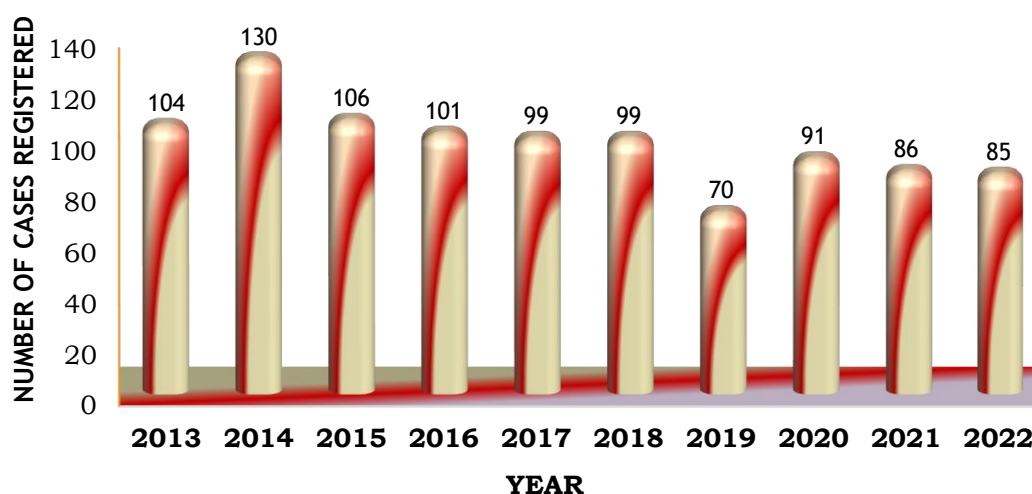
(i) Murder: (Decrease of 1.16 %)

The incidents of murder (85) in 2022 decreased by 1.16% as compared to the previous year. The highest incidents of murder were reported in Kangra & Shimla (15 each), Kullu (10), contributing 52.94 % of the total cases. Other districts which reported more than 4 cases are Baddi & Mandi (8 each), Sirmaur (7), Una (6), Solan & Bilaspur (04 each)

The lowest number of incidents of murder were reported in Chamba, (03), Kinnaur & Lahaul & Spiti (2 each) Hamirpur (01). No Incident under this head was reported in CID, GRP & Cyber. The number of cases registered in the previous 10 years (2013-2022) under this head are presented in Chart-1.4.

The analysis of the causes has revealed that no organized gang was operating in the State. In most of these cases, crime is committed due to various types of disputes or murder for gain or personal enmity, love affairs and illicit relationships. There was no class or caste factor involved in the commission of murders.

INCIDENTS OF MURDER DURING (2013-2022)

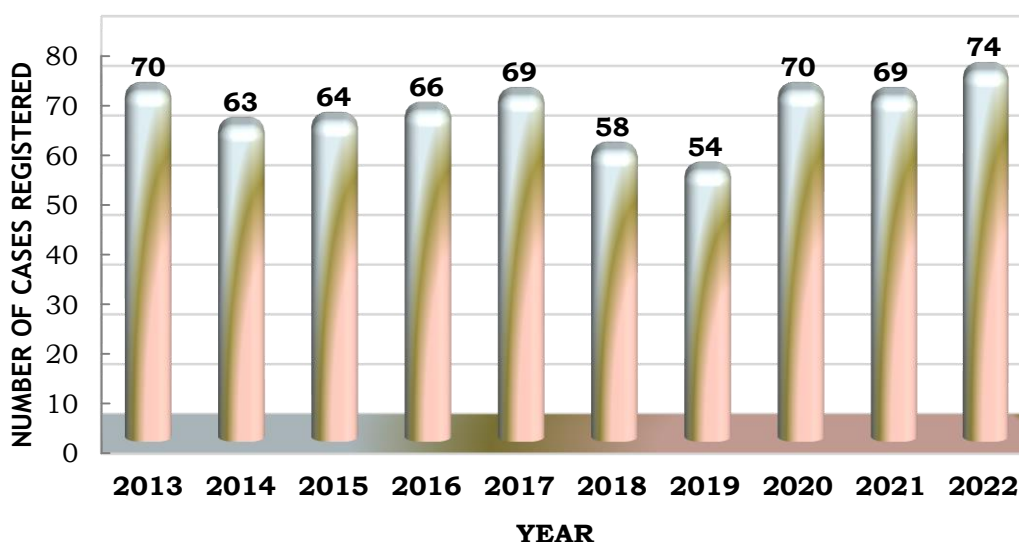


(ii). Attempt to commit**Murder: (Increase of 7.24%)**

The incidents of Attempt to Commit Murder (74) reported during this year have increased by 7.24 %. The highest incidents under this head were reported in districts Kangra and Mandi (16 each), followed by Baddi, Hamirpur & Shimla (8 each),

Bilaspur (6), Una (4) Kullu (3) Sirmaur (2), Chamba, L&S, and Solan (1 each). No incident under this head was reported in Kinnaur district, GRP, CID & Cyber Units. Previous 10 years (2013-2022) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.5](#).

INCIDENTS OF ATTEMPT TO MURDER DURING (2013-2022)

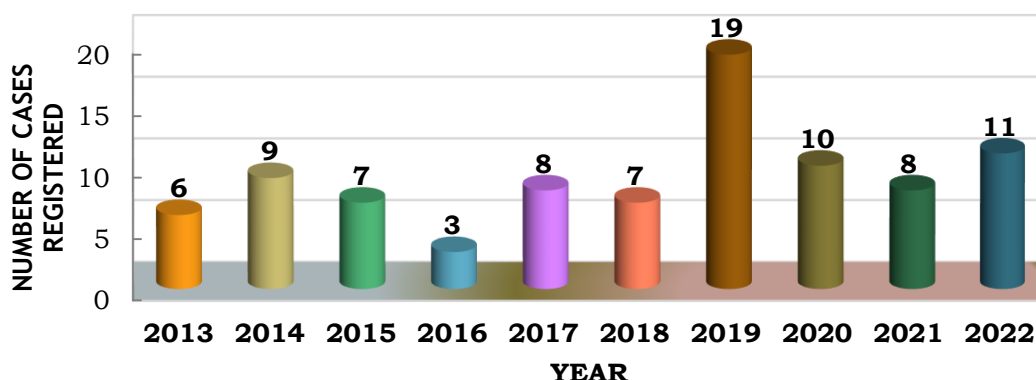


(iii). Culpable Homicide not amounting to Murder: (Increase of 37.5%)

Total 11 cases of Culpable Homicide not amounting to Murder were reported during 2022, showing an increase of 37.5% over the previous year (8 cases). The highest number of incidents 03

were reported in Hamirpur & Mandi districts, followed by Sirmaur (2), Bilaspur, Shimla & Una (1 each). No incident under this head was reported in the remaining districts/Units of the State. Previous 10 years (2013-2023) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.6](#).

DURING (2013-2022)

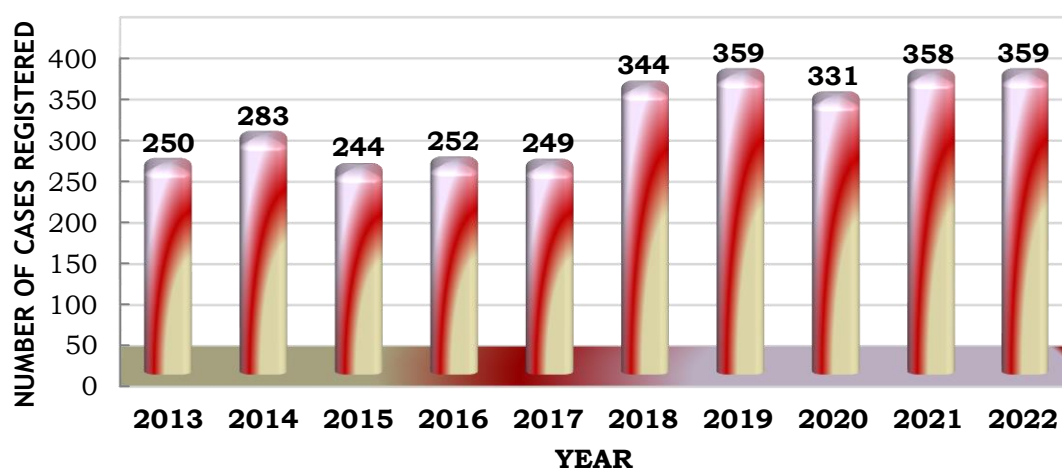


(iv). Rape: (Increase of 0.27%)

Total 359 cases of Rape were reported during 2022; an increase of 0.27% over the previous year (358 cases). The highest incidents of Rape were reported in district Mandi (58), followed by

Kangra (53), Shimla (57 each), Sirmaur (48), Shimla (38), Baddi (36), Kullu (30), Una (24), Solan (17), Bilaspur (13), Kinnaur (11), Hamirpur (6) L&S (1). Previous 10 years (2013-2022) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.7](#).

INCIDENTS OF RAPE DURING (2013-2022)

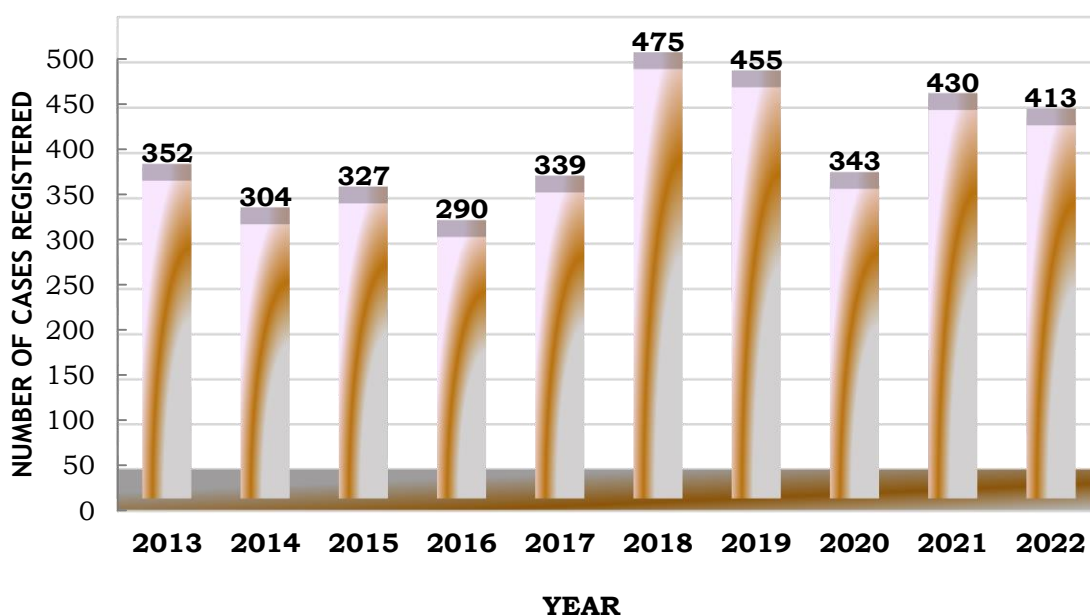


(v). Kidnapping and Abduction:
(Decrease of 3.95 %)

During the year 2022, a total number of 413 cases of Kidnapping and Abduction were reported; a decrease of 3.95% as compared to the previous year. The highest number of incidents were reported in district Kangra (63), followed by Shimla (54),

Mandi (49), Solan (46), Kullu (44), Sirmaur (34), Una (25), Hamirpur, (24), Chamba (23), Bilaspur (22), baddi (18) and Kinnaur (11). No incidents reported in Kinnaur district and other units. Previous 10 years (2013-2022) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.8](#).

DURING (2013-2022)

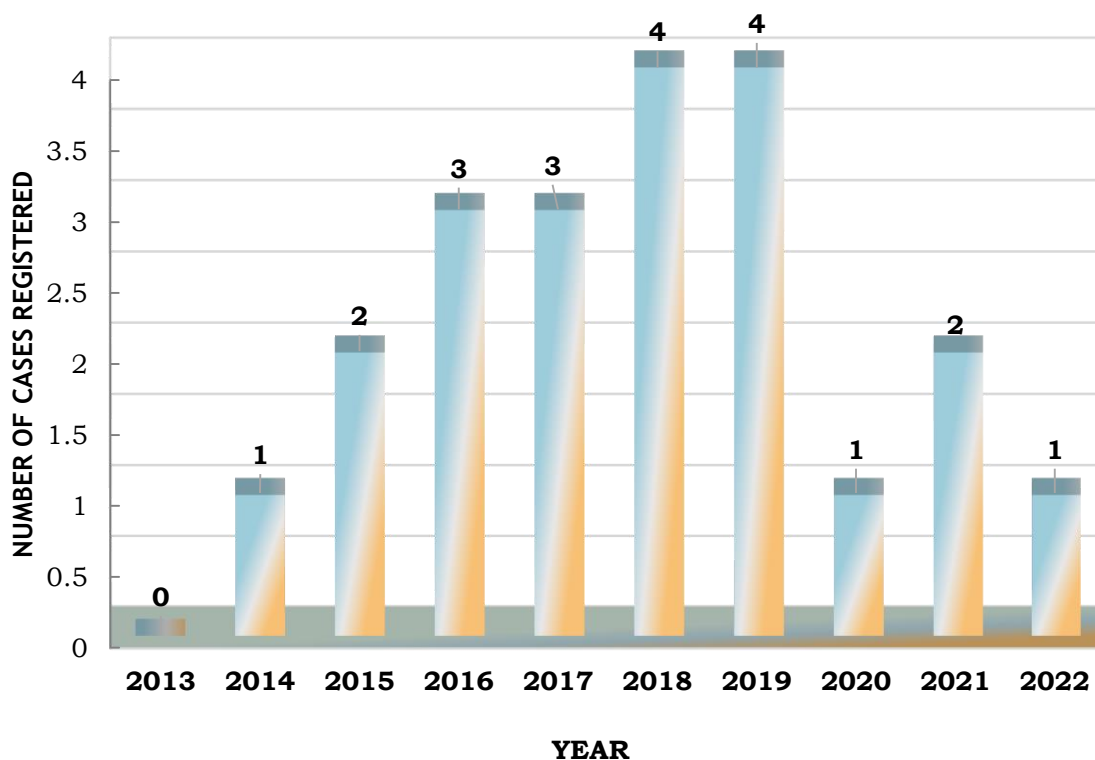


(vi). Dowry Death: (Decrease of 50%)

1 incidents of Dowry Death in district Kangra was reported during the year 2022, as compared to 2 incidents during the previous

year. No incident of dowry death was reported in the other districts. Previous 10 years (2013-2022) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.9](#).

DURING (2013-2022)



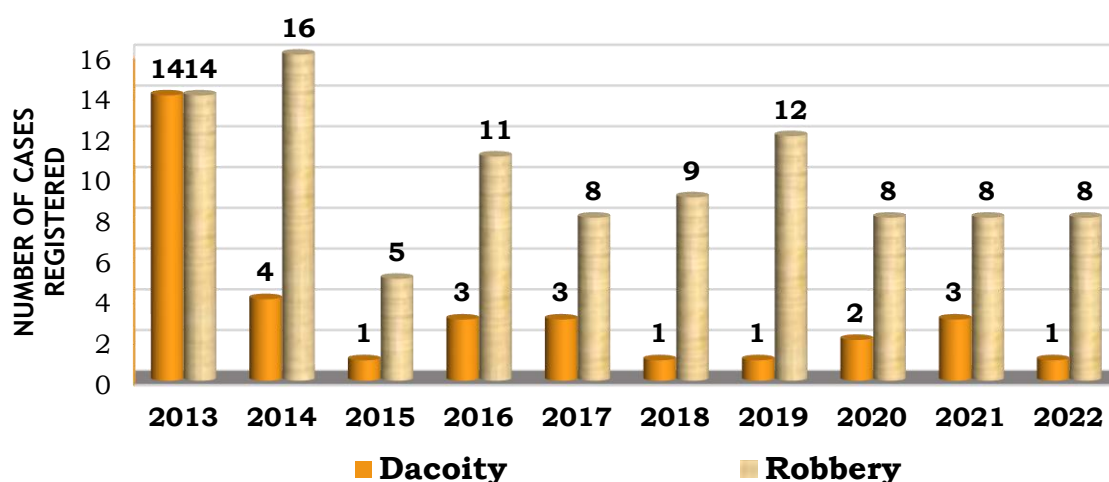
(vii). Dacoity: (Decrease of 50%)

During the year 2022, a total number of 1 case in districts Kangra with the decrease of 66.6% as compared to the previous year, have been registered. No incident under this head was reported in the remaining districts of the State. The previous 10 years (2013-2022) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.10.

(viii). Robbery: (Variation 0%)

During the year 2022, 8 cases of Robbery were registered in the State. The highest number of incidents were reported in district Shimla & Kangra (2 each), followed by Kullu, Mandi, Solan & Una (1 each). No case under this head was reported in rest of the districts of the State. Previous 10 years (2013-2022) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.10.

INCIDENTS OF DACOITY AND ROBBERY DURING (2013-2022)

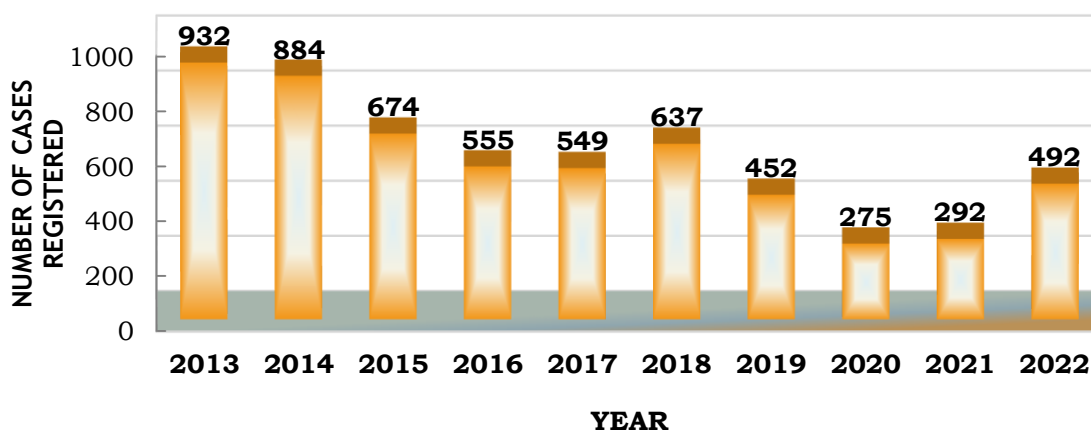


(ix). Burglary: (Increase of 68.49%)

The incidents of Burglary (492) recorded an increase with 68.49% during the year 2022 as compared to the previous year. The highest number of Burglary cases were reported in district Kangra (128), followed by Sirmaur (55), Shimla (49), Solan (42), Una (38), Baddi (37), Bilaspur & Mandi

(33 each), Kullu (27), Hamirpur (25), Chamba (13) Kinnaur (10), L&S (2). No case under this head was reported in rest of the units of the State. The highest crime rate under this head was 14.4 in Baddi district and the lowest in Chamba 2.5, as against the State average of 8.49. Previous 10 years (2013-2022) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.11](#).

INCIDENTS OF BURGLARY DURING (2013-2022)

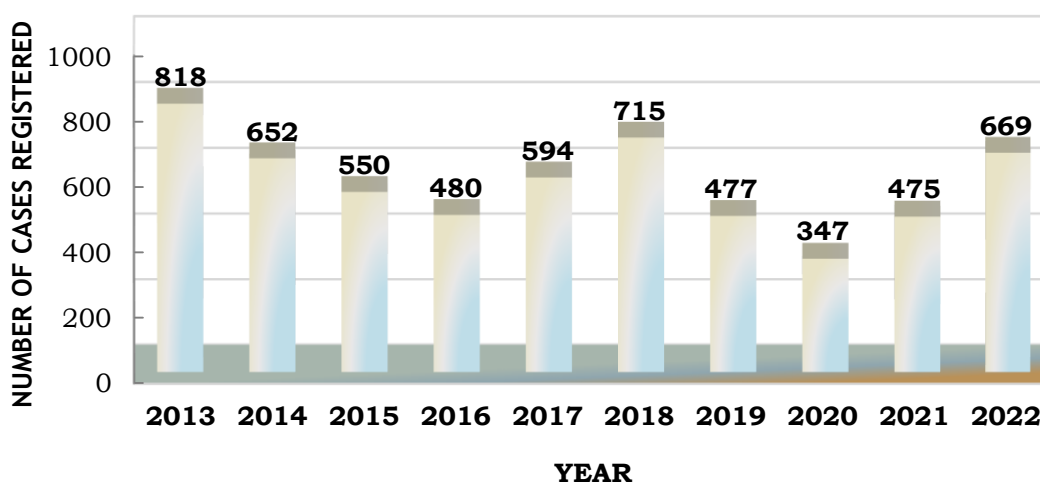


(x). Theft: (Increase of 40.84%)

The Incidents of Theft (669) recorded an increase of 40.84% during the year 2022 over the previous year. Kangra district has reported the highest incidents (131 cases), followed by Solan (89), Shimla (82), Sirmaur (76), Baddi (67), Bilaspur (47), Mandi (45), Una (43), Kullu (34), Hamirpur (23),

Chamba (22), Kinnaur (05), Lahaul & Spiti (4) and GRP (01). The highest crime rate under this head was in Solan district (27.8) and the lowest (4.2) in Chamba district as against the State average of 8.69%. Previous 10 years (2013-2022) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.12.

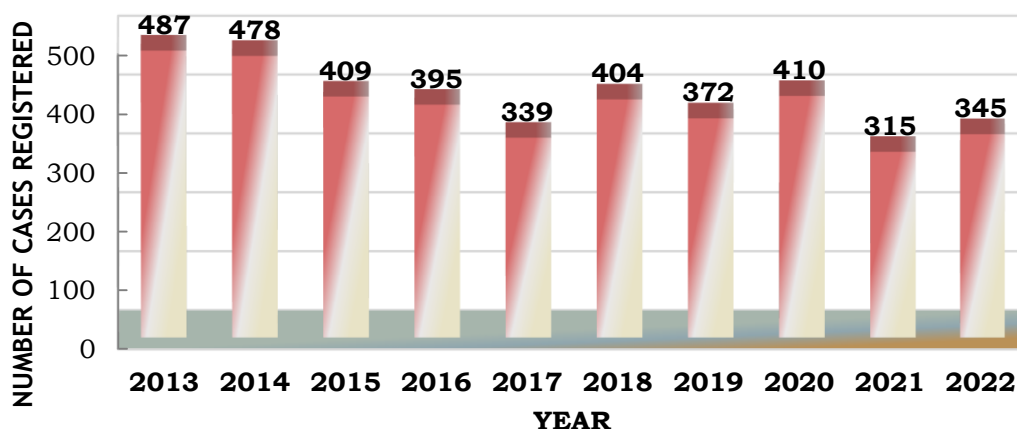
CHART-1.12

**(xi). Riots: (Increase of 9.52%)**

Incidents of Riots (345) registered during the year 2022 recorded an increase of 9.52% over the previous year. The highest number of incidents were reported in district Sirmaur (66), followed by Kangra (65), Una (37), Shimla (35),

Baddi (33), Kullu (31), Mandi (20), Solan (19), Bilaspur (17), Chamba & Hamirpur (7 each) & Kinnaur (06). The lowest incidents were reported in district Lahaul-Spiti (02). Previous 10 years (2013-2022) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.13.

INCIDENTS OF RIOTING DURING (2013-2022)

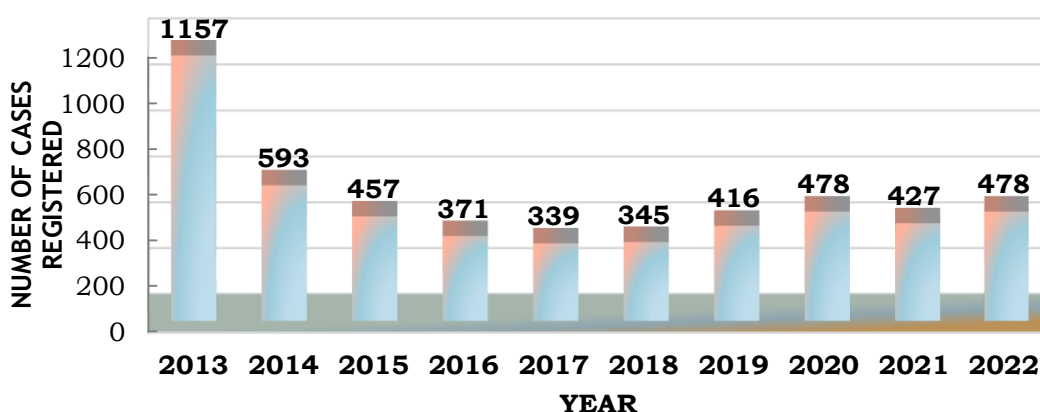


(xii). Grievous Hurt: (Increase of 11.94%)

A total number of 478 cases under the crime head Grievous Hurt were reported during 2022; an increase of 11.94% over the previous year. District Kangra has reported the highest number of incidents (112) under this head,

followed by Mandi (71), Shimla (59), Hamirpur (52), Sirmaur & Una (30 each), Baddi, Bilaspur & Chamba (25 each), Kullu (22), Solan (17) and the least number of cases were reported in district Kinnaur (8) and L&S (2). INCIDENTS OF HURT DURING (2013-2022)

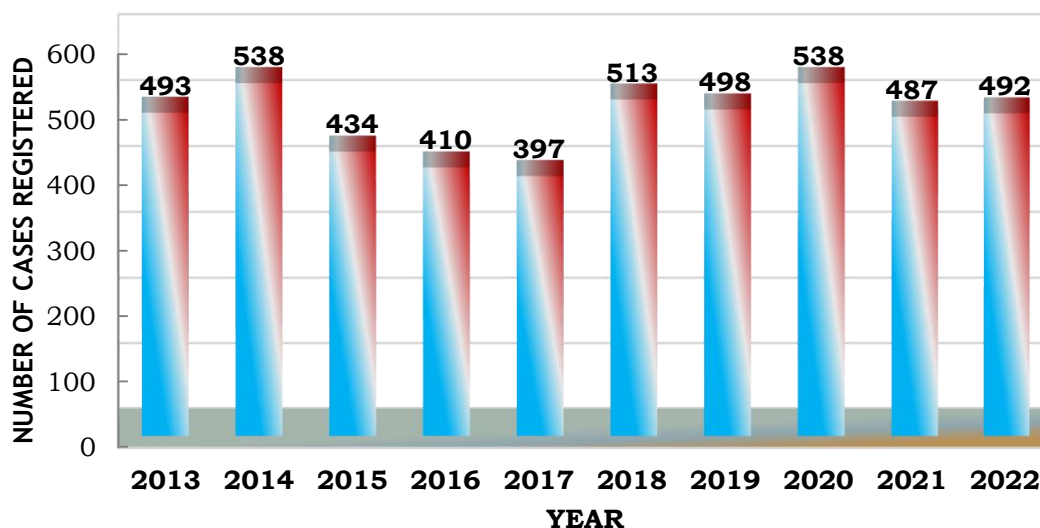


(xiii). Assault on Women:

A total of 492 cases were reported during the year, showing a decrease of 1.02% over the previous year. District Kangra has reported the highest number of incidents (101), followed by Mandi

(75), Sirmaur (54), Shimla (46), Hamirpur (41), Bilaspur & Chamba (32 each), Kullu & Una (31 each), Baddi (22), Solan (19) and Kinnaur (7), Lahual & Spiti (1). Previous 10 years (2013-2022) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.15.

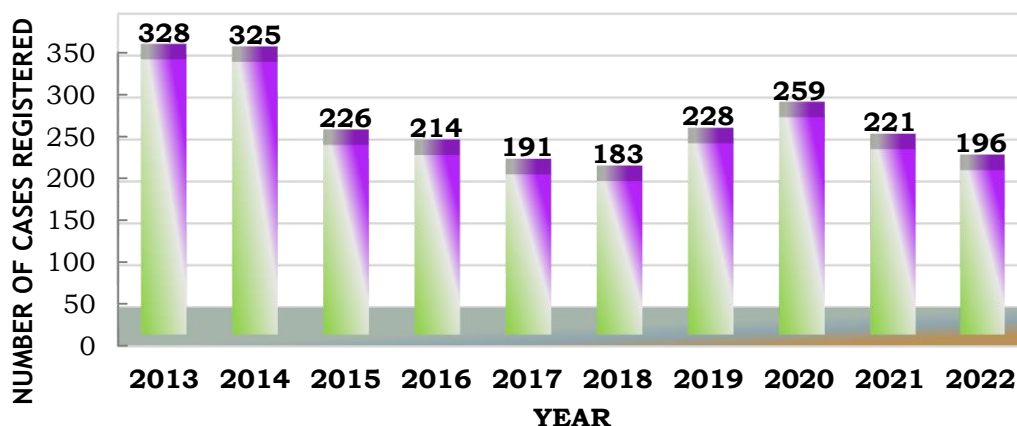
CHART-1.15

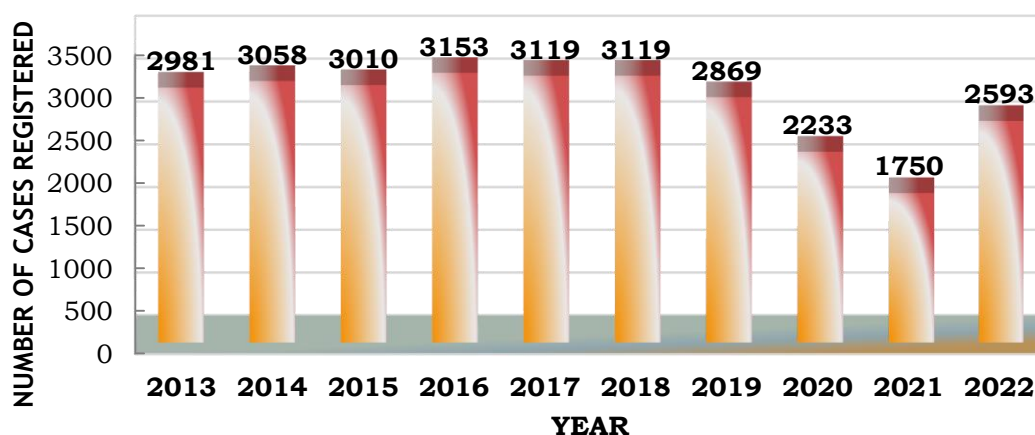

Sirmaur (21) Bilapur (18), Chamba (16), Shimla (14), Hamirpur (13), Baddi (11), Kullu (5), Solan (4) & Kinnaur (3). No incident reported in Lahul & Spiti district. Previous 10 years (2013-2022) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.16.

Mandi (324), Sirmaur (267), Una (235), Kullu (218), Solan (178), Bilaspur (171), Baddi (151), Hamirpur (109) Chamba (98). The lowest number of cases were reported in Kinnaur (37), Lahaul & Spiti (26). Previous 10 years (2013-2022) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.17.

(xvi). Other IPC Crimes (Decrease of 15.62 %)

Cognizable IPC Crimes which do not fall under any of the above specified categories are termed as “Other IPC Crime”. As many as 7014 other IPC crimes, accounting for 53.01% of the Total IPC crimes, were registered in the State during 2022.

Incidents of IPC Crime (Head-wise), along with percentage

share, are presented in Table-1.6. The ten year trend in percentage change (head-wise) is presented in Table-1.7. District-wise and head wise details of IPC offences are available in Table-1.8 and Table-1.9. INCIDENTS OF OTHER IPC CRIMES DURING (2013-2022)

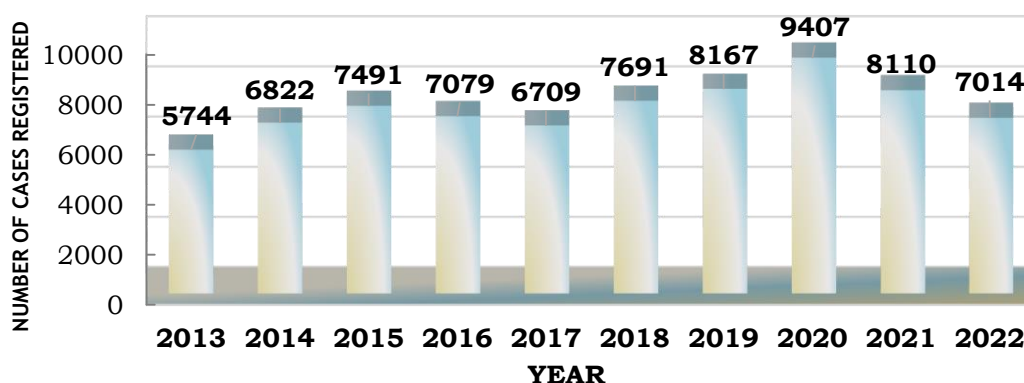

PERCENTAGE OF OTHER IPC CASES AGAINST TOTAL IPC FOR THE LAST 10 YEARS (2013-2022)

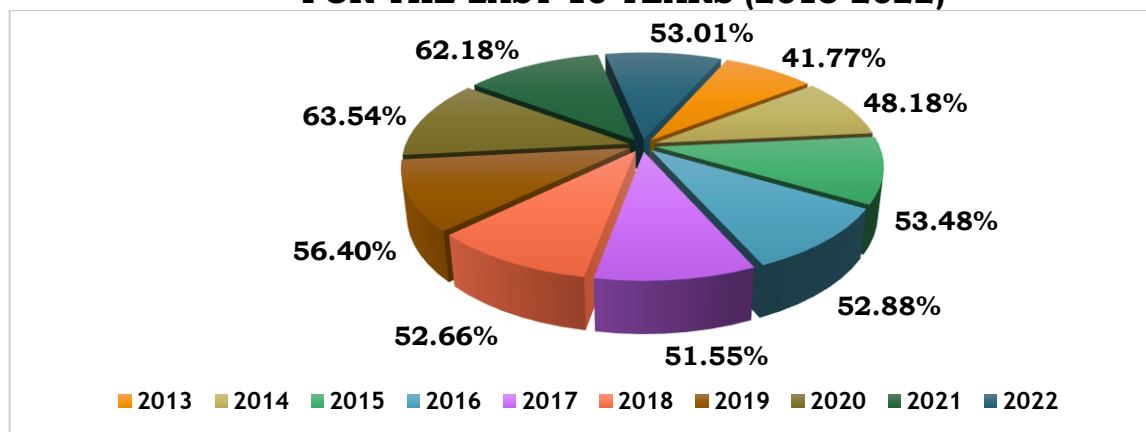
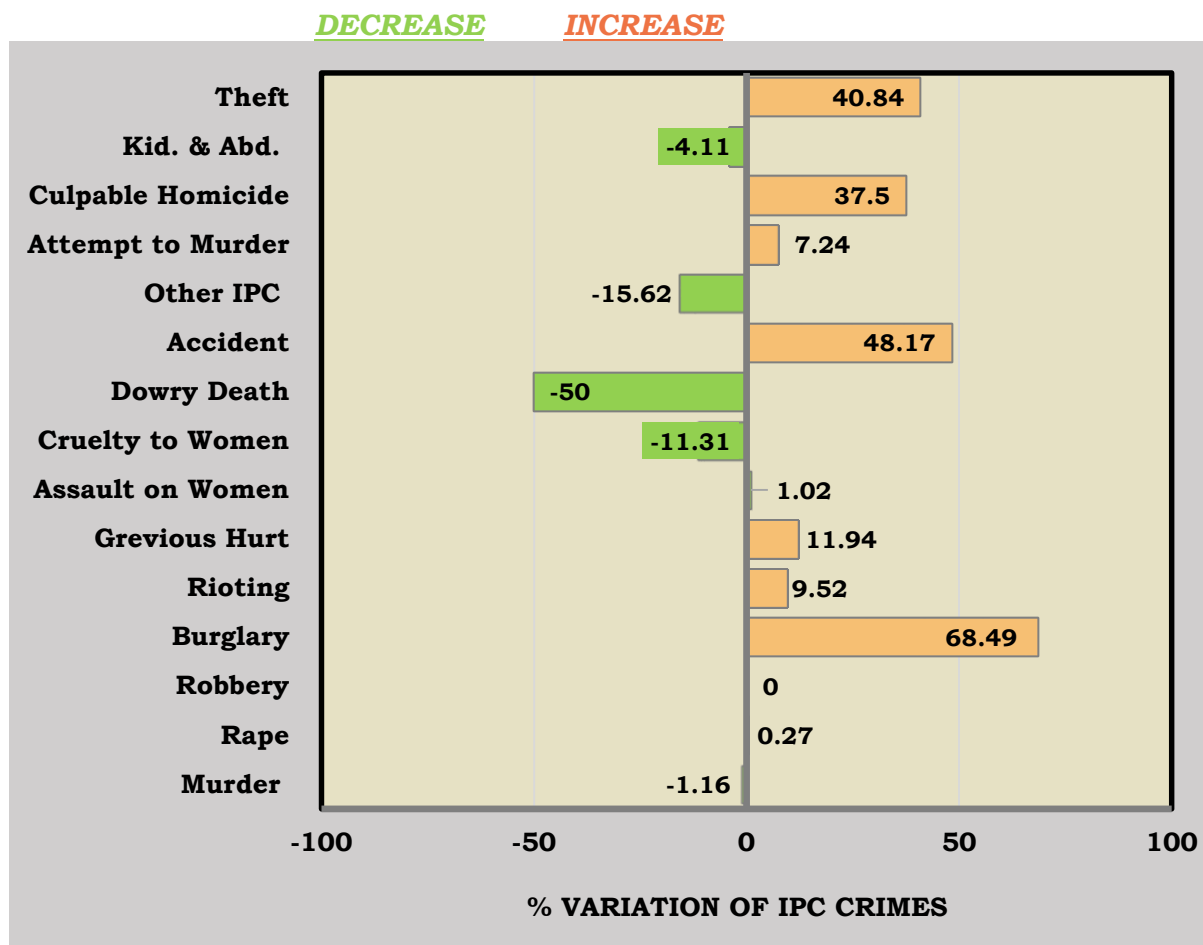

1.8 Crime under Local and Special Laws:

A list of Special and Local Laws is available at Annexure-II. Incidents and rate of cognizable Local & Special Law crimes during 2013 to 2022 are presented in [Table-1.10](#).

A total of 5822 cognizable Local & Special Law (SLL) crimes were registered in the State during 2022. The head-wise

percentage distribution of various cognizable crimes under Local & Special Law for 10 years from 2013 to 2022 is presented in [Table-1.11](#). There is an increase of 0.51% in registration over the previous year.

The crime head-wise incidents and rate of cognizable Local & Special Law crimes in different districts are presented in [Table-1.12](#).

Incidents of Local & Special Law cases under important Special and Local Laws are elaborated below:-

1.8.1 Head Wise Analysis of SLL Offences:

(i). Arms Act: (Increase of 38.09%)

During this year, 29 cases of Arms Act have been registered, depicting an increase of 38.09% over the previous year. The highest number of incidents under this head were reported in district Bilaspur & Kangra (6 each), followed by Kullu (4), Shimla (5) Hamirpur & Mandi (3 each), Sirmaur (2) Baddi, Chamba, Kullu and Solan (1 each). No case under this Act was reported in the remaining districts.

(ii). Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act (ND&PS): (Decrease of 1.36%)

A total of 1516 cases were registered under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act in the year 2022, as compared to 1537 cases during previous year, showing a decrease of 1.36%. Cases under this Act constituted 26.03% against the total Local & Special Law cases reported during 2021. The highest number of incidents under this head were reported in district Shimla (239), followed by

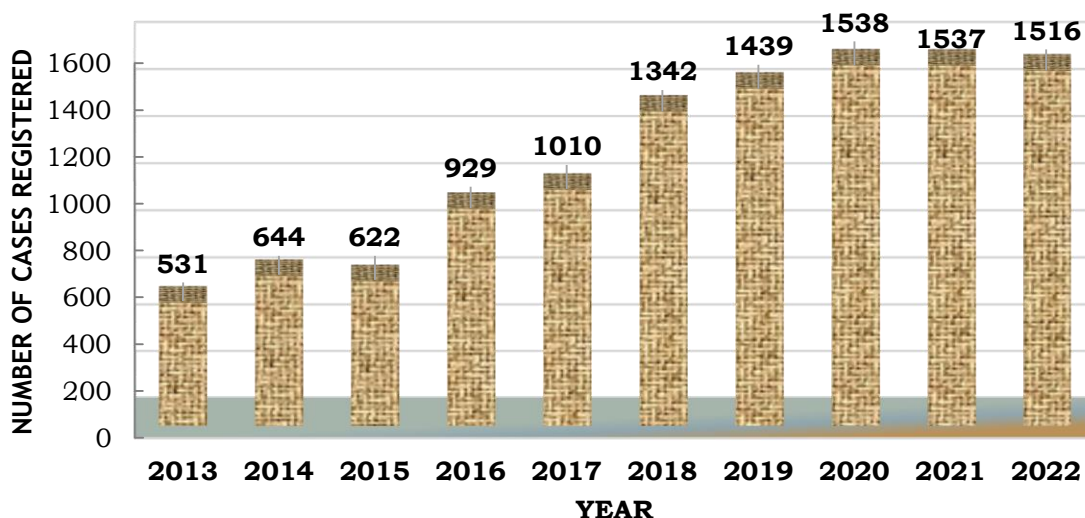
Mandi (212), Bilaspur (192), Kullu (186), Kangra (170) Solan (90) Chamba (89), Una (84), Sirmaur (81), Hamirpur (79), Baddi (54) Kinnaur (34) and Lahaul & Spiti (6).

The main concentration on incidents registered under this Act remains in Shimla, Mandi, Bilaspur, Kullu and Kangra districts, with 65.89% of the total registered cases. Analysis reveals that the main sources/areas of drugs are Shimla, Mandi, Bilaspur, Kullu and Kangra district. Further, carriers of contraband are mostly peasants, laborers and poor people.

Study of age profile of the accused shows that mostly adults between 18-30 years of age are involved (49.10%). About 42.56% were in the age group of 30-45 years. Those above 45 years were 8.32%.

The participation of children below 18 years is negligible (0.64%). 46 foreigners were involved in this activity, which include 09 African, European (06) and 31 Asian (Nepalese). Previous 10 years (2012-2021) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.21](#).

(iii). Gambling Act: (Decrease of 1.07%)

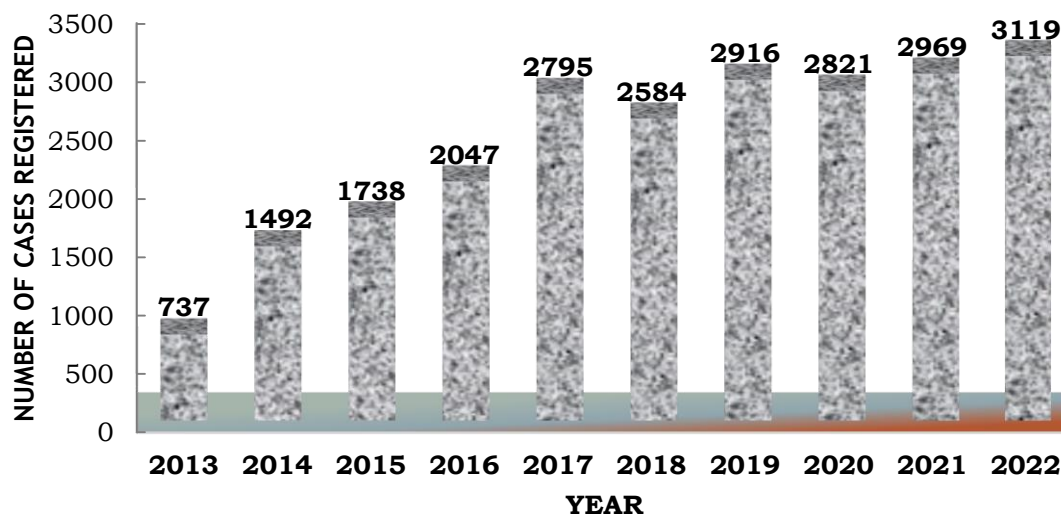
A total of 550 cases under the Gambling Act have been registered during 2022. The highest number of cases were reported in district Una (169), followed by Baddi (131), Sirmaur (75) Kinnaur (37), Shimla (33), Kullu (31) Chamba (23), Solan (14), L&S (11), Mandi (10), Kangra (9), Hamirpur (4), Bilaspur (3). No incident under this head was reported in CID, GRP and Cyber.

(iv). Excise Act: (Increase of 5.05%)

The cases registered (3119) under the Excise Act showed

an increase of 5.05% over the previous year. Cases under this Act contributed 53.57% against the total cases under Local & Special Law (SLL) reported during 2022. The highest number (616) of cases were reported in district Kangra, followed by Mandi (415), Kullu (378), Chamba (360) Shimla (331), Sirmaur (173), Baddi (160), Una (157), Kinnaur (131), Bilaspur (120) Solan (103) and Hamirpur (102). The lowest number of cases under this Act were registered in Lahaul-Spiti (73). Previous 10 years (2013-2022) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.22](#).

DETECTION UNDER EXCISE ACT DURING 2013-2022



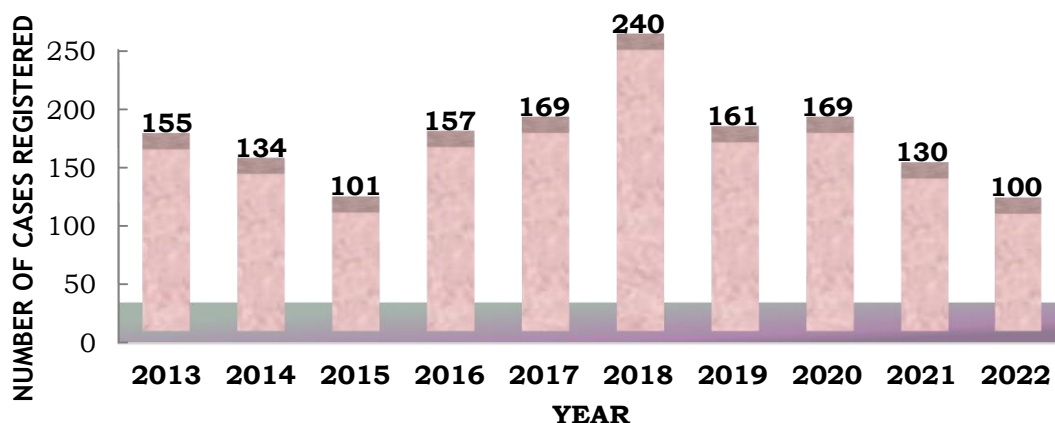
(v). Forest Act: (Decrease of 23.07%)

The number of cases (100) registered under the Forest Act showed a decrease of 23.07% over the previous year. Shimla district has reported the highest number of cases (23), followed by Mandi (15), Sirmaur (14), Kangra (13), Chamba & Una (9 each), Kullu (6), Bilaspur, Hamirpur and Solan (3 each). The lowest registration under this Act was seen in Baddi (2). No case under this head was reported in districts,

Lahaul & Spiti, and in CID, GRP and Cyber.

The analysis reveals that majority of the cases have been registered in districts Shimla, Mandi, Sirmaur & Kangra. These cases involve encroachment on forest land, smuggling of forest produce such as Timber, Fuel wood, Guchhi, Resin, Walnut Bark, Birch Bark, Brahmi leaves and other herbal plants etc. Previous 10 years (2013-2022) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.23](#).

(vi). Protection of Civil Rights Act: (Variation 0%)

During the year 2022, 1 incident under the PCR Act was reported in Kinnaur district. No case under this head was registered in rest of the districts. Previous 10 years (2013-2022) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.24.

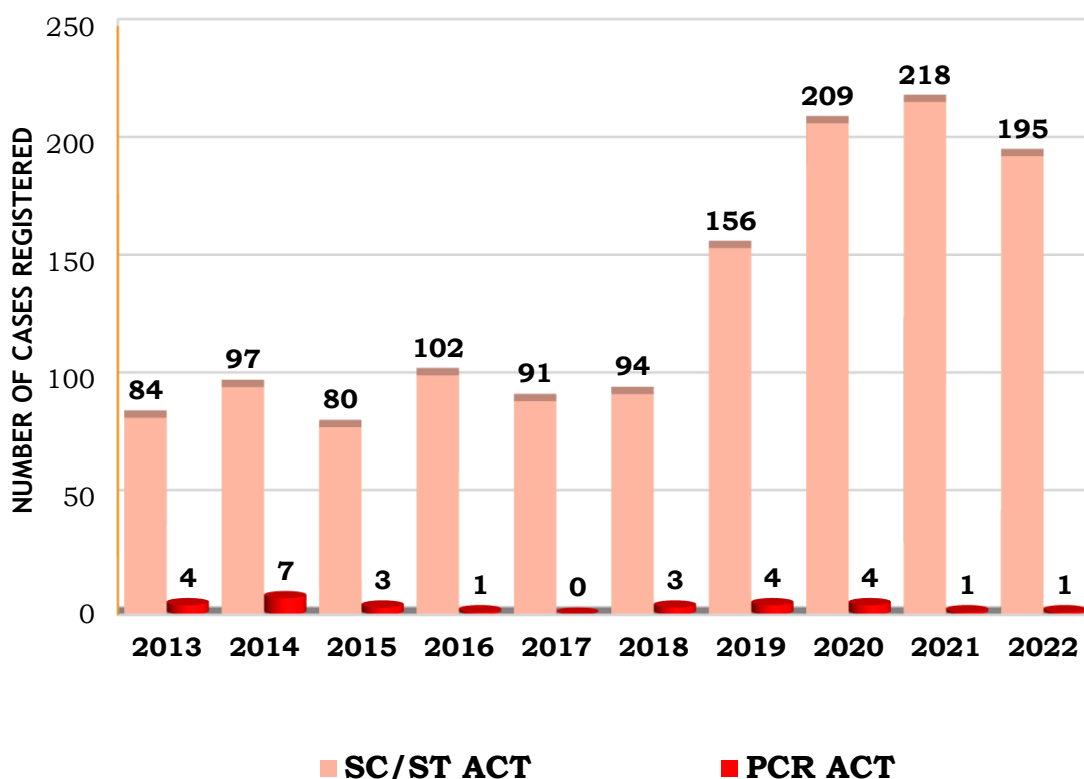

(vii). SC/ST (Prevention of Atrocities) Act: (Decrease of 10.55%)

A total of 195 cases were registered under the SC/ST Prevention of Atrocities Act, as against 218 cases during the previous year; a decrease of 10.55%. The highest numbers of (45) cases were reported in district Mandi,

The analysis reveals that crime under this head is high in Mandi, Hamirpur, Kangra, Shimla, and Una districts. The most common reason for registering cases under this Act is a feeling of hurt when one is called by derogatory names. Previous 10 years (2013-2022) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.24.

(viii). Other Local & Special Law Cases (including Wild life Act, PDP Act, EC Act etc.)
(Decrease of 13.33%)

A total of 312 Other Local & Special Law cases were reported under the Acts mentioned above. These have shown a decrease of 13.33% over the previous year (360 cases). The highest number of cases were reported from district Kangra (50).

During 2022, a total of 5822 cognizable crimes were

reported in the State under various heads of Local & Special Laws (SLL), which shows an increase of 0.51% over the previous year.

It is observed that 7 specific crime heads accounted for 94.64% of the total SLL crimes while the remaining 5.35% were clubbed as other SLL crimes. Previous 10 years (2013-2022) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.25](#).

DURING 2013-2022

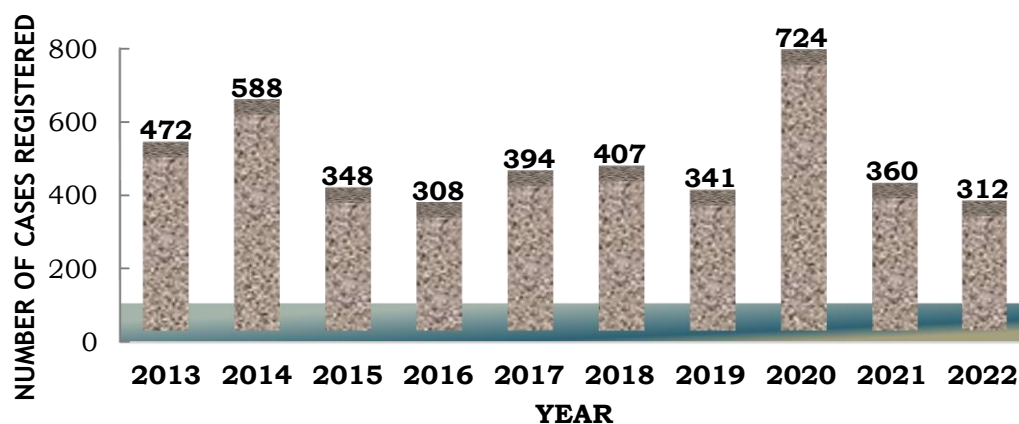
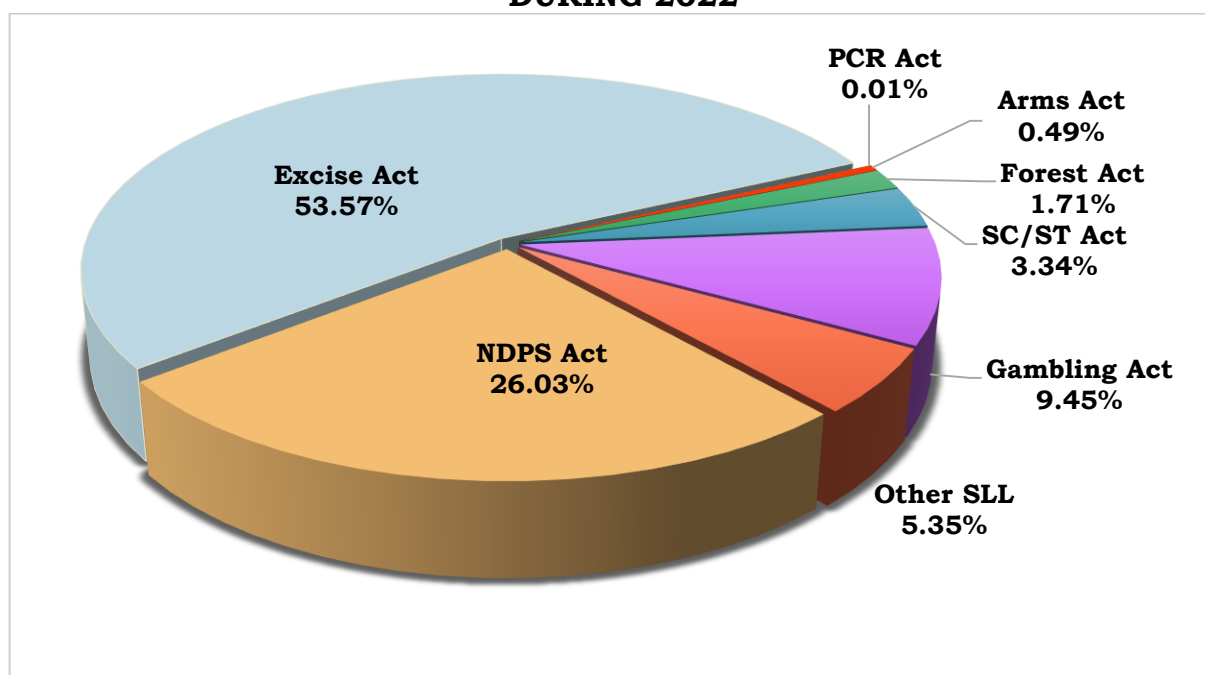

CHAPTER-2

INCIDENCE OF CRIME AGAINST PROPERTY AND PERSONS IN HIMACHAL PRADESH

2.1 Crime against Property:

Offences under this head include the cases of **Theft, Burglary, Robbery & Dacoity**. The head wise analysis of crime against property for the year 2022 is as under:-

(i) Theft and Burglary:

(Increase of 40.84 % & 68.49% respectively)

During the year 2022, 669 cases of theft and 492 cases of burglary were registered, which is an increase of 194 cases in theft and 200 cases in burglary over the previous year. The cases of both these heads have been categorized under major heads namely: - Auto theft, theft of Cash & Jewelry, Cultural Property theft, theft of electronic components and theft of other materials.

Incidence of theft cases is concentrated mostly in the 7 districts i.e. Kangra, Solan, Shimla, Sirmaur, Baddi, Bilaspur and Mandi.

(ii) Robbery: **No increase**

During the year 2022, 8 cases of Robbery were registered in

the State as compared to 8 cases during the previous year. The highest number of incidents were reported in district Kangra & Shimla (2 each), followed by Kullu, Mandi, Solan and Una (1 each). No case under this head was reported in rest of the districts of the State.

(iii) Dacoity: **Decrease of 66.66%**

During the year 2022, 1 case of Dacoity was registered; a decrease of 2 case over the previous year. One case under this head was registered in district Kangra.

2.2 Value of Property Stolen and Recovered:

Recovery increased by 5.74%

During the year 2022, property worth Rs.1722.91 lakhs was reported stolen in 1170 cases, as compared to Rs. 1309.67 lakhs in 778 cases during the previous year.

Property worth Rs. 855.61 lakhs was recovered during

2022. The percentage of recovery is 49.29%. The value of property recovered showed an increase of 5.74% over the previous year.

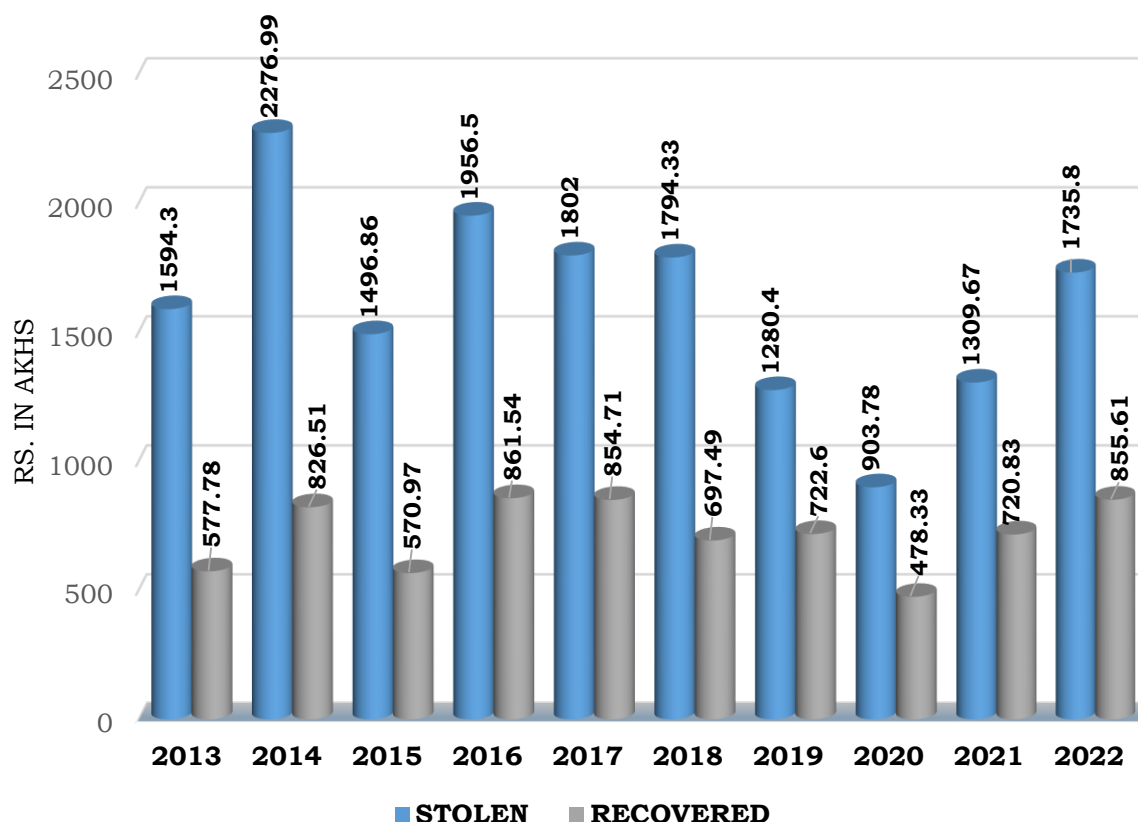

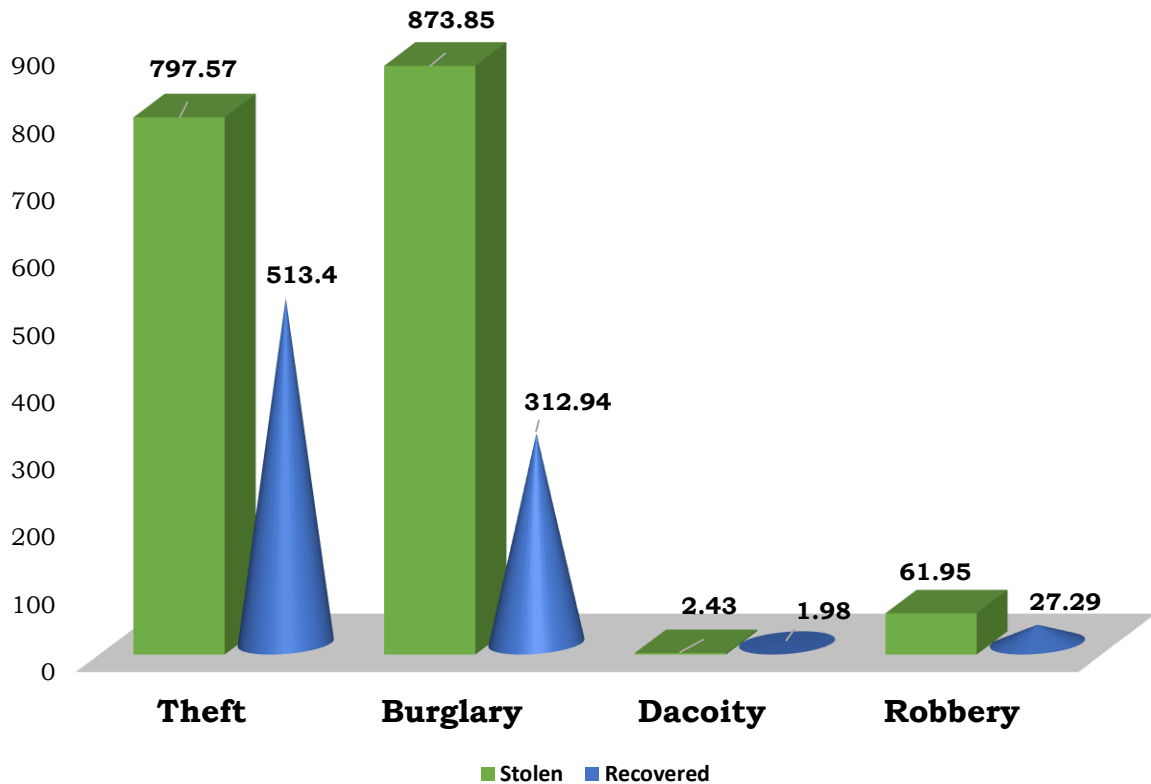
VALUE OF PROPERTY STOLEN AND RECOVERED DURING THE PERIOD 2013-2022

Crime head and district wise value of property stolen recovered, including percentage of recoveries, is presented in **Table 2.3**.

Kangra district reported the highest value of property stolen (Rs. 3,64,84,123/-) followed by Shimla (Rs. 2,46,51,166/-, Baddi (Rs.1,92,48,208/-) and Sirmaur (Rs. 1,05,07,867). Rest of the districts reported less than 1 crore value of property stolen.

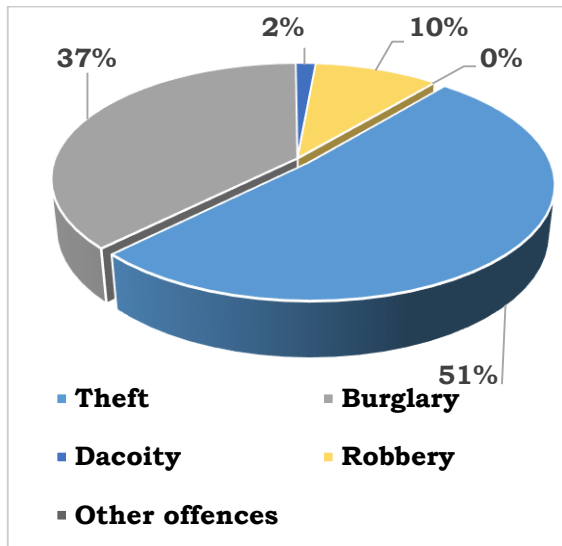
The highest value of recovery was seen in District Kangra (Rs. 1,99,26,896 /-).

The highest recovery percentage of stolen property was seen in district Lahaul & Spiti (97.47%), followed by Bilaspur (81.47%), PD Baddi (76.22%), Kinnaur (75.17%), Kullu (74.52%) and Mandi (66.94%).

2.3 Category of Offences (Incidence and Value):

Among the four different types of property crimes, the maximum stolen value of property (Rs.673.47 Lakhs) and share (51%) were seen under the head Theft. The minimum stolen value of Rs. 12.70 Lakhs and share (2%) was seen under the head Robbery.

The maximum value of property was recovered in Dacoity (97.52%), followed by Theft (67.90%), Robbery (56.27%) and Burglary (35.23%). The crime head-wise value of property stolen and recovered over the last 10 years

(2013 to 2022) is presented in [Table 2.4](#).

2.4 Nature of Property :

Nature of property under heads Theft and Burglary have been classified into four different categories viz. Auto Theft, Theft of Cash and Jewelry, theft of Cultural Property, Theft of electronic items, Household articles/furniture. Properties other than the above specified categories are clubbed as 'other kind of property'. The category wise number of cases in which property was found stolen and recovered therein and percentage thereof has been calculated and presented in [Table 2.5](#).

DURING THE YEAR 2022**

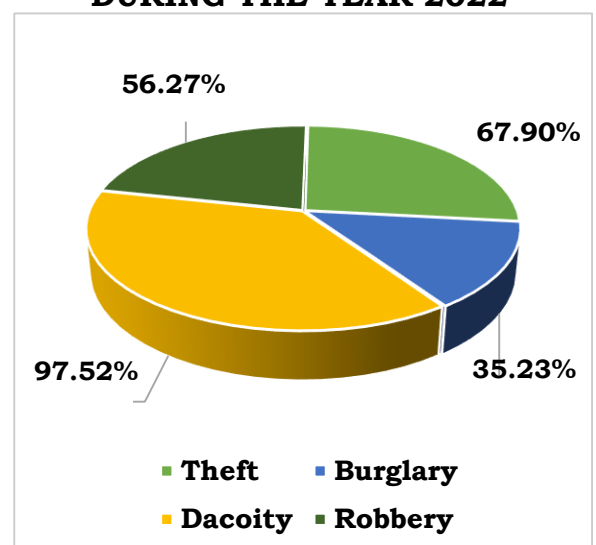

(WORKED OUT) -2022**

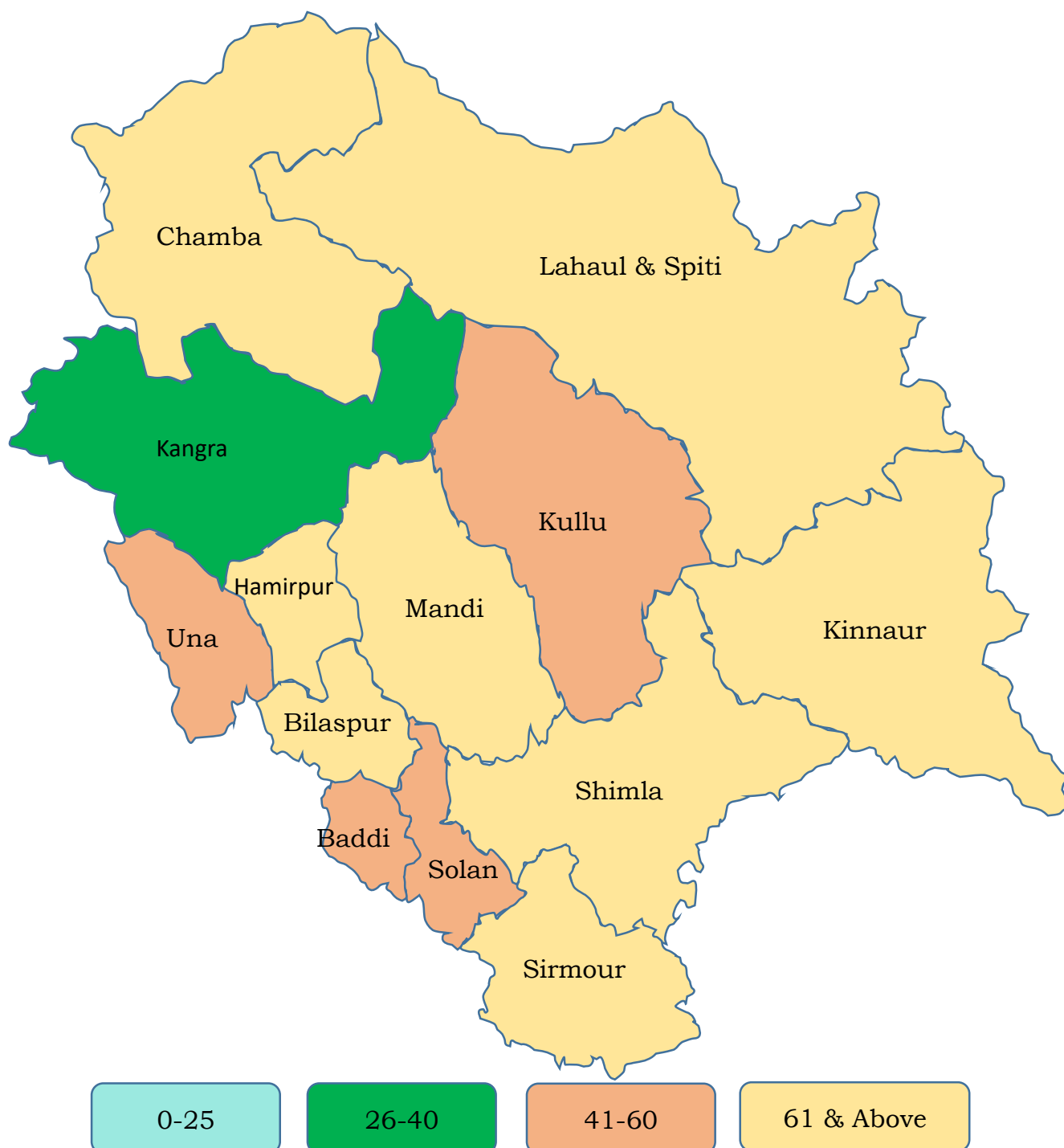

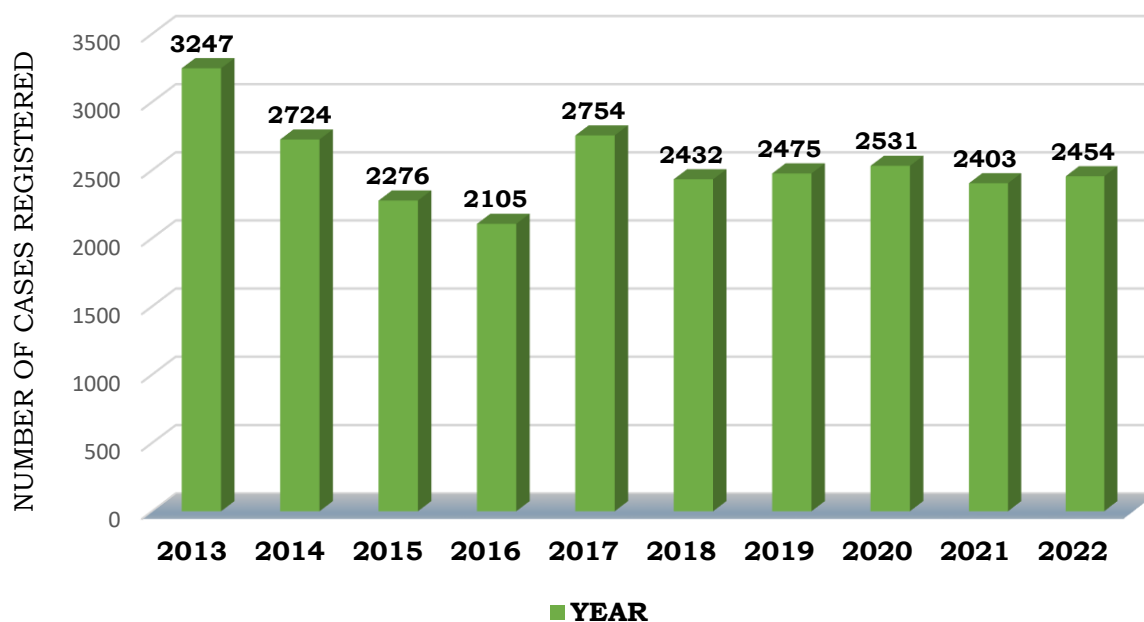
2.6 Crime against Persons:-

Crime against persons includes 10 different types of crime heads viz. Murder, Culpable Homicide not amounting to Murder, Attempt to Murder, Rape, Kidnapping & Abduction, Hurt, Rioting, Cruelty to Women, Molestation and Dowry Deaths.

The analysis reveals that a total of 5957 cases of crime against persons have occurred during 2022, which comprises 45.02% of the total IPC crime. The

highest percentage of crime against persons over the total IPC crimes was recorded in districts Hamirpur (60.80%), Chamba (58.66%), Mandi (53.98%), Kullu (47.55%), Kinnaur (45.20%), Una (44.65%), Bilaspur (44.57%), Sirmaur (43.40%), Kangra (41.77%), Baddi (40.31%), Shimla (37.58%), Solan (34.53%), L&S (25.42%). The district-wise details have been calculated and presented in **Table 2.7**. The district-wise incidents and their percentage over the IPC crime is depicted in **Chart 2.6**.

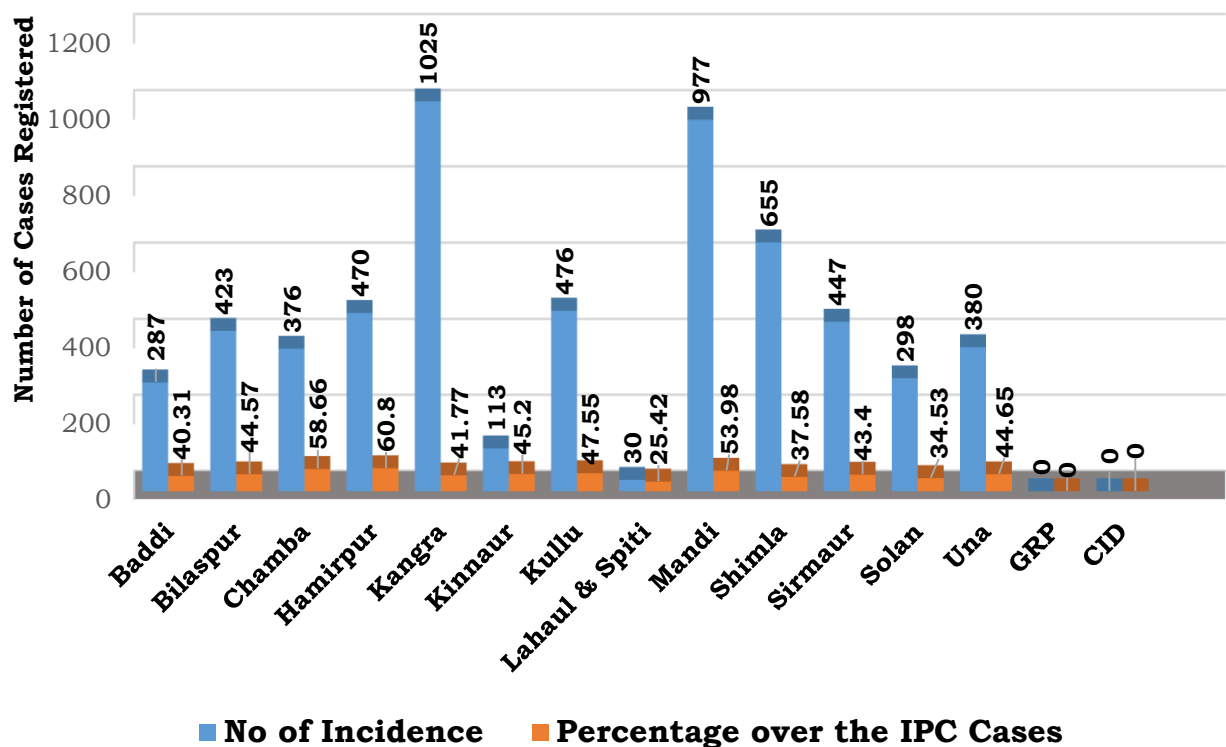
CHART 2.5

The highest number of incidents of crime against persons have been recorded in district Kangra (1025), followed by Mandi (977), Shimla (655), Kullu (476), Hamirpur (470), Sirmour (447), Bilaspur (423), Una (380), Chamba (376), Solan (298), Baddi (287), Kinnaur (113), Lahaul & Spiti (30). No case were reported in CID, GRP & Cyber PS. The District-wise details have been calculated and presented in [Table 2.8](#).

The head-wise comparative analysis of incidences of crime against persons for the last 10 years (2013 to 2022) has been reviewed. During the year 2022, 5957 incidents have been recorded; a decrease of 159 cases over the previous year. The head-wise figures for the last 10 years are presented in [Table 2.9](#). [Chart 2.6](#) shows the total crime against persons and its percentage over the total IPC crime.

The head-wise reported incidences of crime against persons and their comparison with those of the previous year is as under:-

(i) Murder: Decrease of 1.16%

During the year 2022, 85 incidents of Murder were reported, as compared to 86 cases of the previous year. Analysis of these cases has revealed that no organized gang is operating in the State. In most of these cases, crime is committed due to various types of disputes, murder for gain, personal enmity, love affairs and illicit relationships. There was no class or caste factor involved in the commission of these murders.

(ii) Attempt to Murder: Increase of 7.24%

74 incidents of Attempt to Murder were reported during the year 2022 as compared to 69 cases during the previous years. The motive for the commission of this crime is also the same as mentioned under the head 'Murder'

(iii) Culpable Homicide not amounting to Murder: Increase of 37.5%

11 incidents of Culpable Homicide not amounting to Murder

were reported during the year 2022, an increase of 3 cases over the previous year.

(iv) Rape: Increase of 0.27%

359 cases of Rape were reported during the year 2022, an increase of 1 case over the previous year.

(v) Kidnapping and Abduction: Decrease of 3.95%

During 2022, 413 cases were registered; a decrease of 17 cases over the previous year. Analysis shows that 40.19% cases of Kidnapping & Abduction were reported in districts Kangra, Shimla and Mandi.

(vi) Grievous Hurt: Increase of 11.94%

A total of 478 incidents of Grievous Hurt were reported during 2022. Analysis shows that 61.50% incidents of Grievous Hurt were reported in districts Kangra, Mandi, Shimla and Hamirpur.

(vii) Rioting: Increase of 9.52%

During the year 2022, 345 incidents of Rioting were reported in the State, as against 315 cases

during the previous year; a decrease of 30 cases. Analysis shows that 58.84% incidents of rioting were reported in districts Sirmaur, Hamirpur, Una and Shimla.

(viii) Cruelty to Women:

Decrease of 11.31%

A total of 196 cases of Cruelty to Women were reported in the State during the year 2022, a decrease of 25 cases over the previous year. The incidents under this head have been reviewed in detail in the separate chapter “Crime against Women”.

(ix) Assault on women:

Increase of 1.02%

During the year 2022, 492 incidents of Molestation were reported in the State, as against the 487 incidents of the previous year; a

decrease of 5 cases. The cases under this head have been reviewed in detail in the separate chapter “Crime against Women”

(x) Dowry Deaths:

Decrease of 50%

During the year 2022, 1 case of Dowry Death reported in district Kangra. The incidents under this head have been reviewed in detail in the separate chapter “Crime against Women”.

2.7 Overall Review of Crime against Person:

The incidence of crime against persons is higher in districts Kangra, Mandi, Shimla and Kullu as compared to the other districts of the State. Offences of murder have however taken place in the entire State with no specific concentration.

TRENDS IN DISPOSAL OF IPC CRIMES AND SLL CRIMES BY POLICE AND COURTS

3.1 Disposal by Police

3.1.1 Cases under IPC:

During 2022, a total of 16022 cases including cases pending from the previous years, were under investigation. Out of these, 12555 cases were disposed by the police during the year and 3467 cases remained pending for investigation.

Table-3.1 presents the details of crime head wise Police disposal during 2022. Tables-3.2 & 3.3 give district wise details of disposal and percentage of disposal respectively. The percentage and type of disposal of under investigation (IPC) cases by police during 2022 is depicted in Chart-3.1.

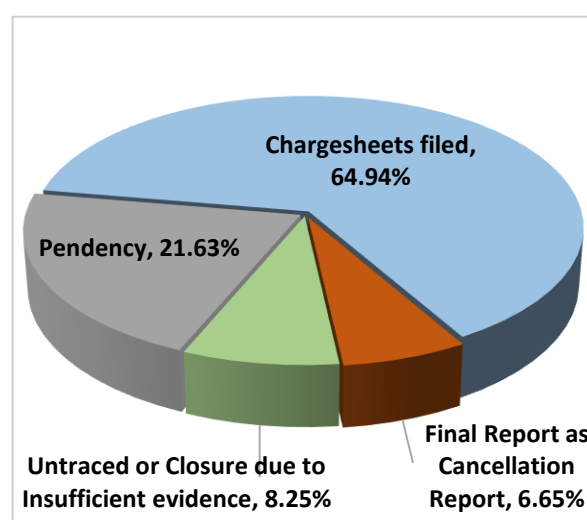
3.1.2 Pendency:

3.1.3 Cases under SLL:

The disposal of SLL cases by police under different crime heads is available at Table-3.4 of the total 6725 cases (including pending

cases from the previous year) pending investigation, police disposed 86.95% cases. Chart-3.3 presents the type of disposal of SLL cases.

BY POLICE DURING 2022

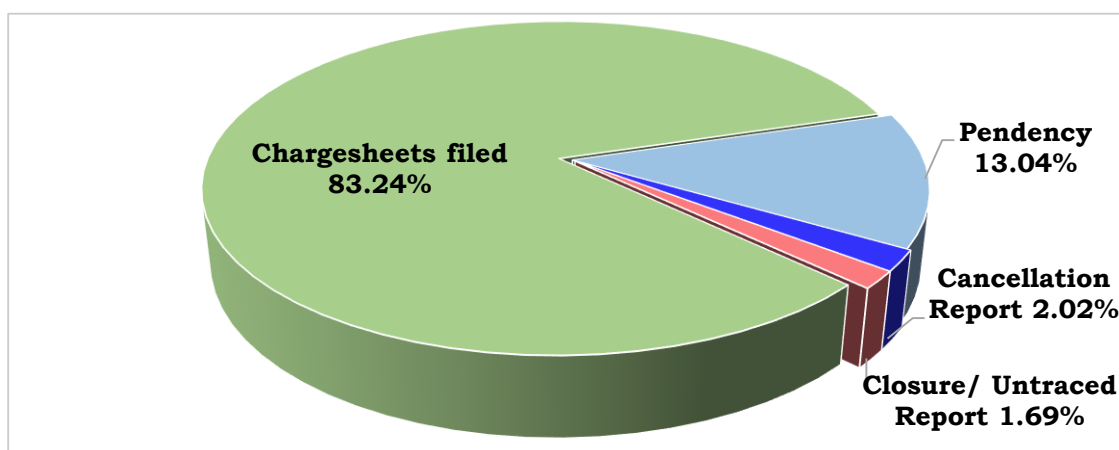

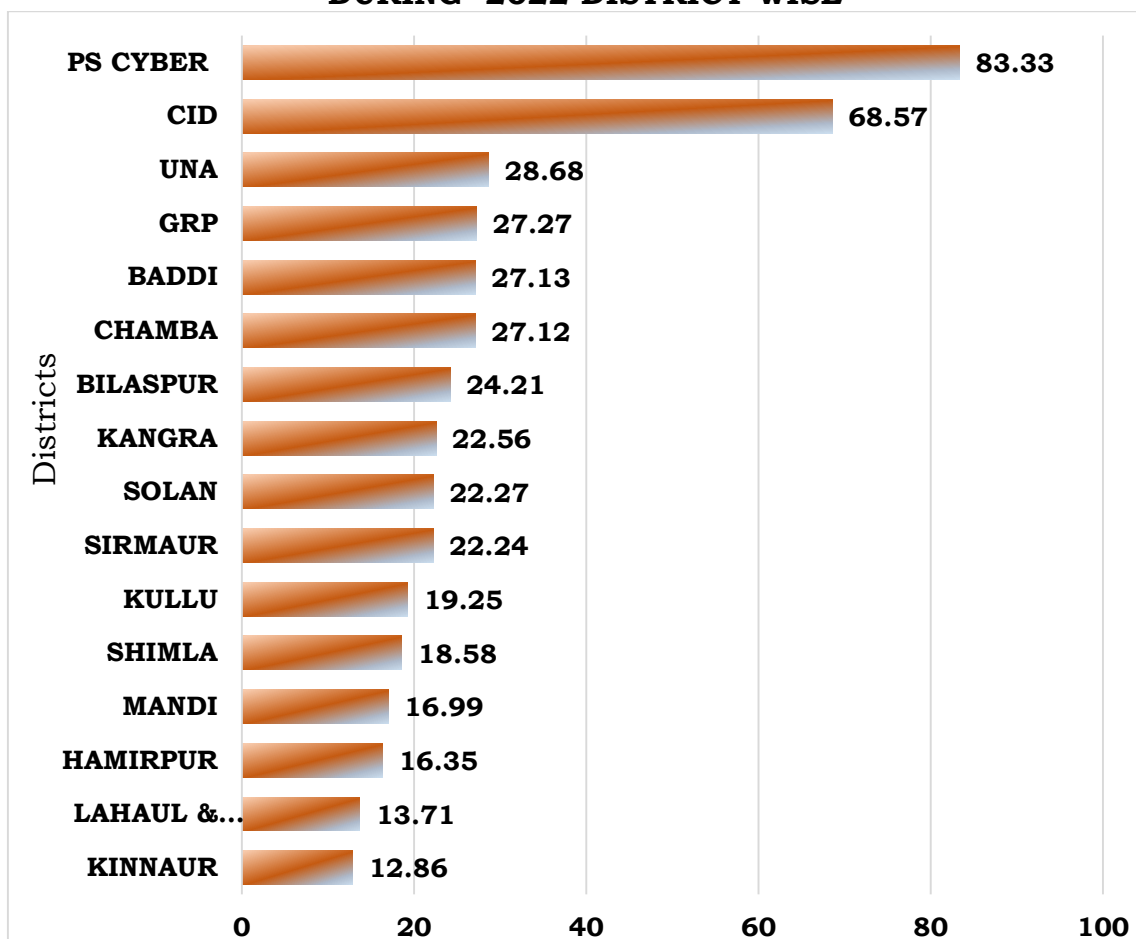

3.2 Disposal by Courts

3.2.1 Cases under IPC:

Disposal of IPC cases by the courts during 2022 is presented in [Table 3.7](#). During 2022 there were 121339 cases pending trial (including pending cases from the previous years). 115213 of IPC cases remained pending trial at end of the year. The percentage disposal during the year was 5.04%.

The District wise disposal figures are presented in [Table-3.8](#) and percentage of disposal is presented in [Table-3.9](#). The highest pendency percentage of cases is seen in Distt. Kangra (99.56), followed by CID (97.10%). The largest number of cases are also pending trial in Kangra district (28982), which has a pendency of 23.88% of state level.

Chart-3.5 depicts percentage disposal of IPC cases by the courts during 2022

3.2.2 Cases under SLL:-

Head wise disposal of SLL cases by the courts during 2022 is presented in **Table-3.10**. There were 34713 cases pending trial (including pending cases from the previous years) at the beginning of 2022. Cases which remained pending trial at end of the year were 30609. The percentage of disposal is 11.82%.

PERCENTAGE DISPOSAL OF IPC CASES BY COURTS DURING 2022

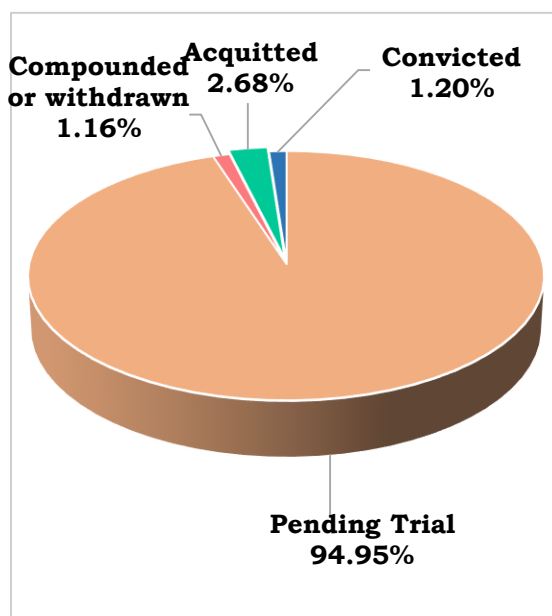

PERCENTAGE DISPOSAL OF SLL CASES BY COURTS DURING 2022

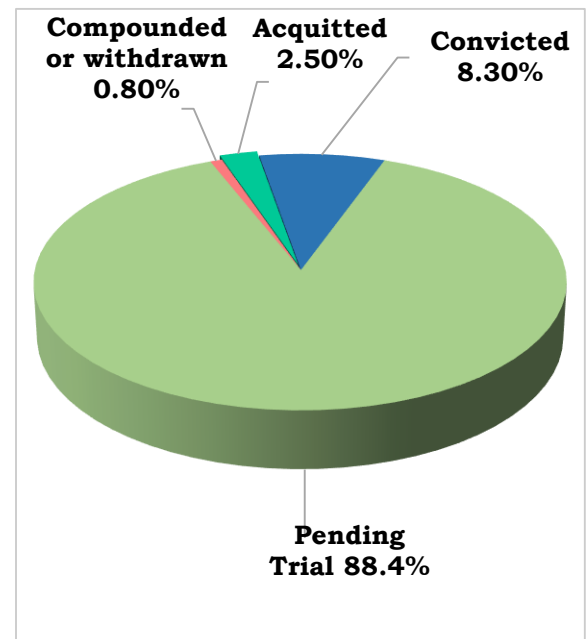

CHAPTER-4

CRIMES AGAINST WOMEN

4.1 General:

Crimes which are directed specifically against women are characterized as Crimes against Women. They may be broadly classified under the following two categories:-

1. Crimes against Women identified under the Indian Penal Code (IPC)

- (i) Murder (Sec. 302, 303 IPC)
- (ii). Dowry Deaths (Sec. 304B IPC)
- (iii) Abetment to Commit Suicide (Sec.306 IPC)
- (iv) Cruelty to Women (Sec. 498A IPC)
- (v) Kidnapping & Abduction (Sec. 363, 366 IPC)
- (vi) Rape
- (vii) Attempt to Commit Rape
- (viii) Assault on Woman with intend to outrage her modesty (Sec.354 IPC)
- (ix) Insult to the modesty of Women (Sec.509 IPC)

2. Crimes against Women Identified under the Special and Local Laws (SLL)

Although all laws are not gender specific, the provisions of laws affecting women significantly have been reviewed periodically and amendments carried out to keep pace with the emerging requirements. Some Acts which have special provisions to safeguard women and their interests are:-

- (i) Immoral Traffic (Prevention) Act, 1956
- (ii) Dowry Prohibition Act, 1961
- (iii) The Child Marriage Restraint Act, 1929
- (iv) Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act, 2005
- (v) Commission of Sati (Prevention) Act, 1987

Crimes against Women are being closely monitored in the State. Several measures have been undertaken to tackle this social menace. Special attention is being paid towards prevention of crimes against women by increased police

vigil and by harnessing the community resources.

Crime against women witnessed a minor decrease during the year 2022 in comparison to the previous year. The last 10 years annual average of crime against women is 1565. During the year 2022, 1551 cases of crime against women have been registered in the state. As compared to the 10 years state average, this increase is due to the fact that in past the women usually hesitated to report incidents which took place with them and there have also been certain changes of law. But now on account of increased awareness and change in social values, ethos and social reassurances being provided by the society, free registration of cases, opening of Women Police Stations and Suvidha Yojna started by the HP Police Department, women are more often coming forward to report the offences taking place against them.

The HP Police Department has initiated many steps in the recent years to ensure better police response. Women Police Stations have been opened in all districts except Kinnaur and Lahaul & Spiti to monitor quick disposal of cases of

crime against women. A Women Crime Unit has been constituted at the State CID Hdqrs. 06 Anti Human Trafficking Units (AHTU's) have also been established in Shimla, Kangra, Sirmaur, Kullu, Solan & Chamba. No particular area is prone to crime against women in the State. No special organized gang is operative in the State to commit crime against women.

4.2 Incidents of Crime against Women:

Decrease of 3.0%

Head wise incidents of reported Crimes against Women during 2021 and 2022, along with percentage variation are presented in **Table 4.1**.

The cases of assault on women with intent to outrage modesty and cruelty to women together constitute the largest chunk of crime against women (44.36%). There were also a number of instances (23.14%) of rape and (21.01 %) Kidnapping and Abduction of women and girls.

The district wise incidents and rate of crimes against women during 2022 are presented in **Table 4.2**, **Chart 4.3** and **Chart 4.4**.

PERCENTAGE DISTRIBUTION OF CRIME AGAINST WOMEN DURING 2022

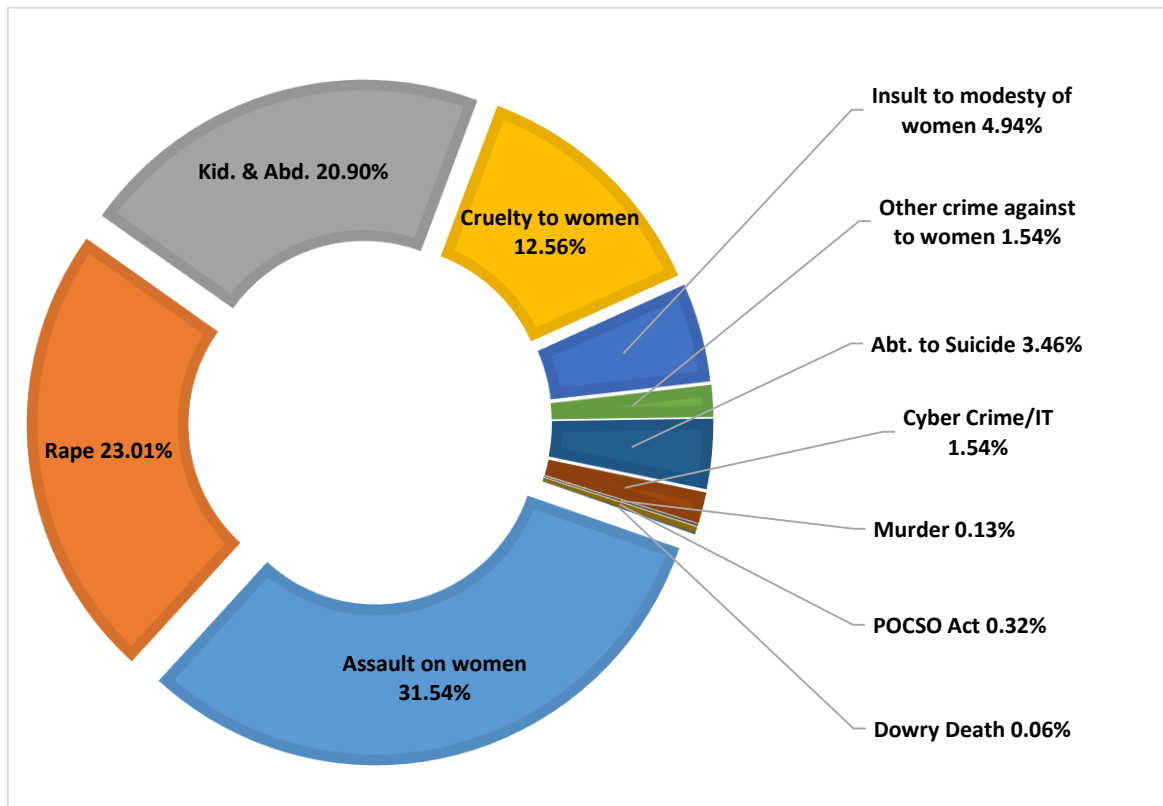


CHART 4.2
VARIATION OF CRIMES AGAINST WOMEN DURING 2022 OVER 2021

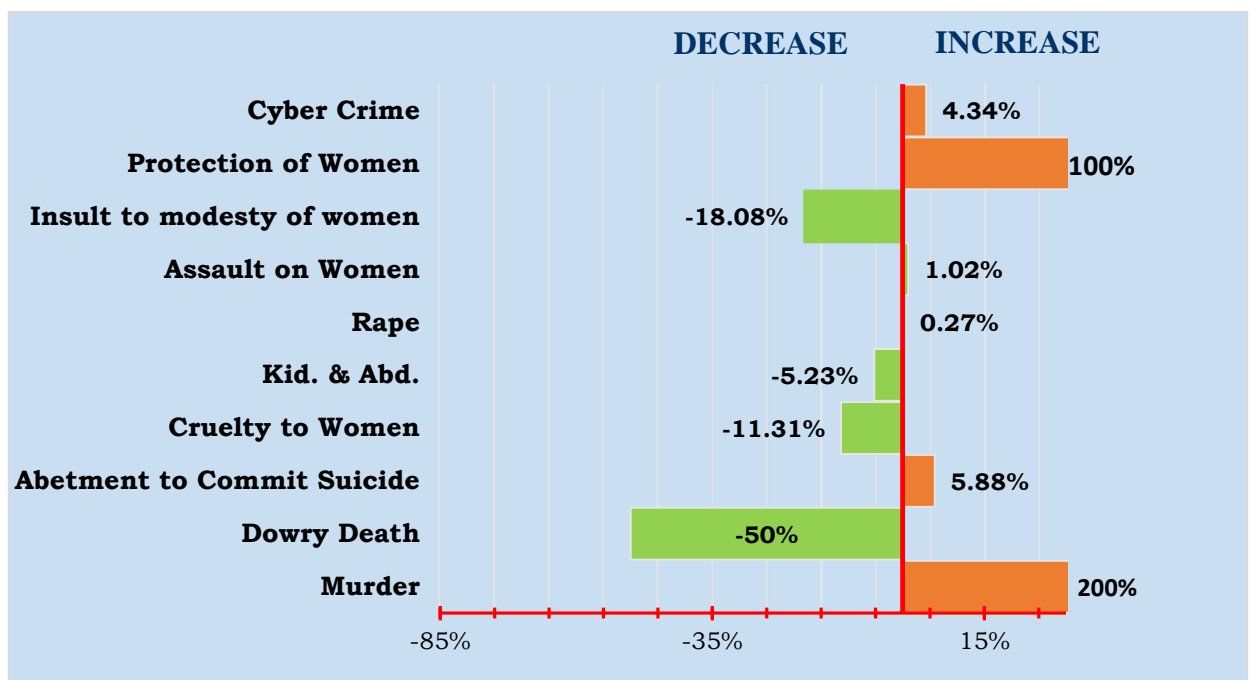
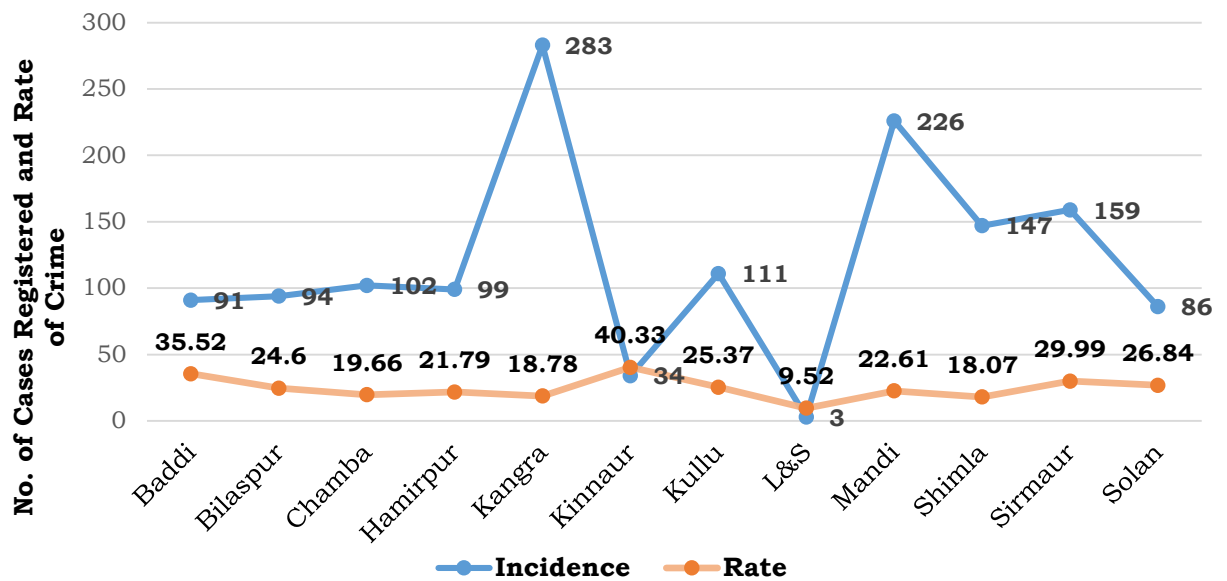
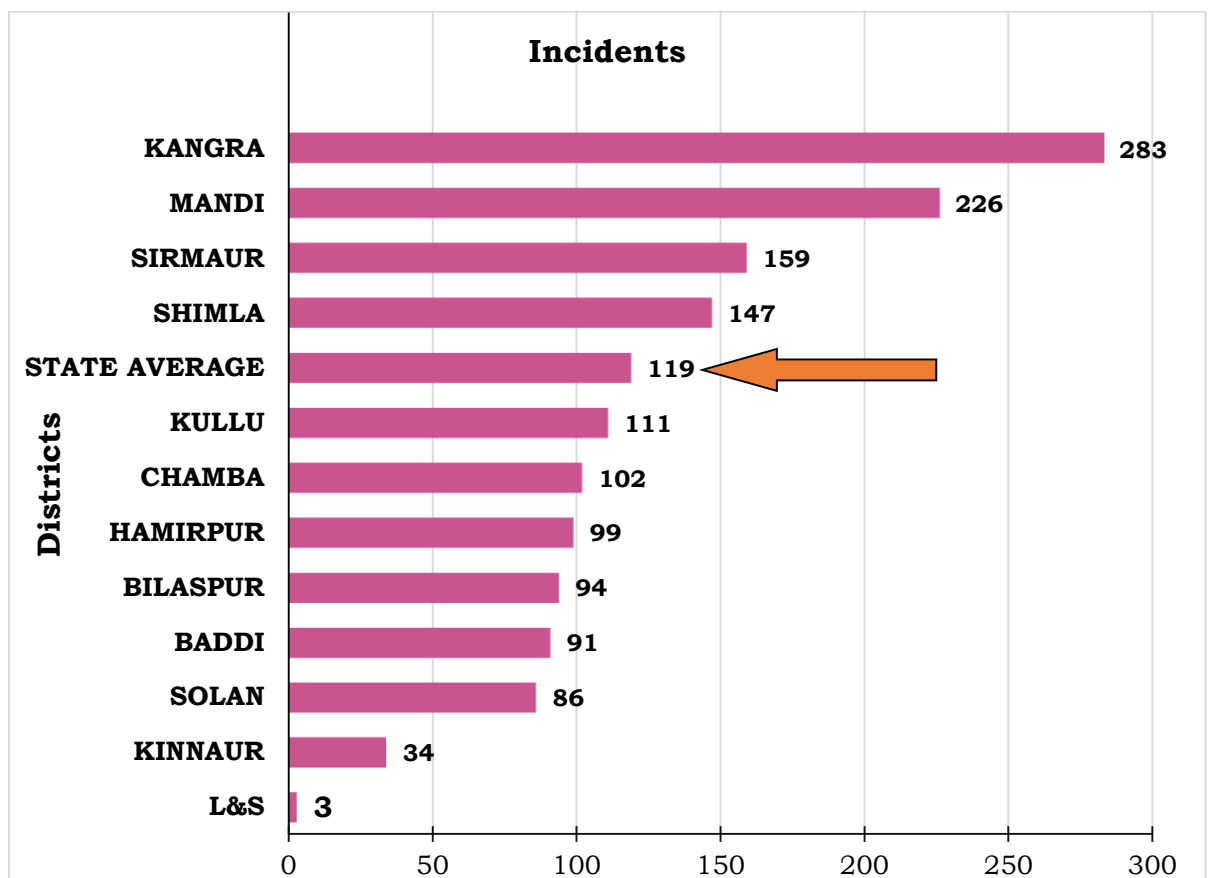
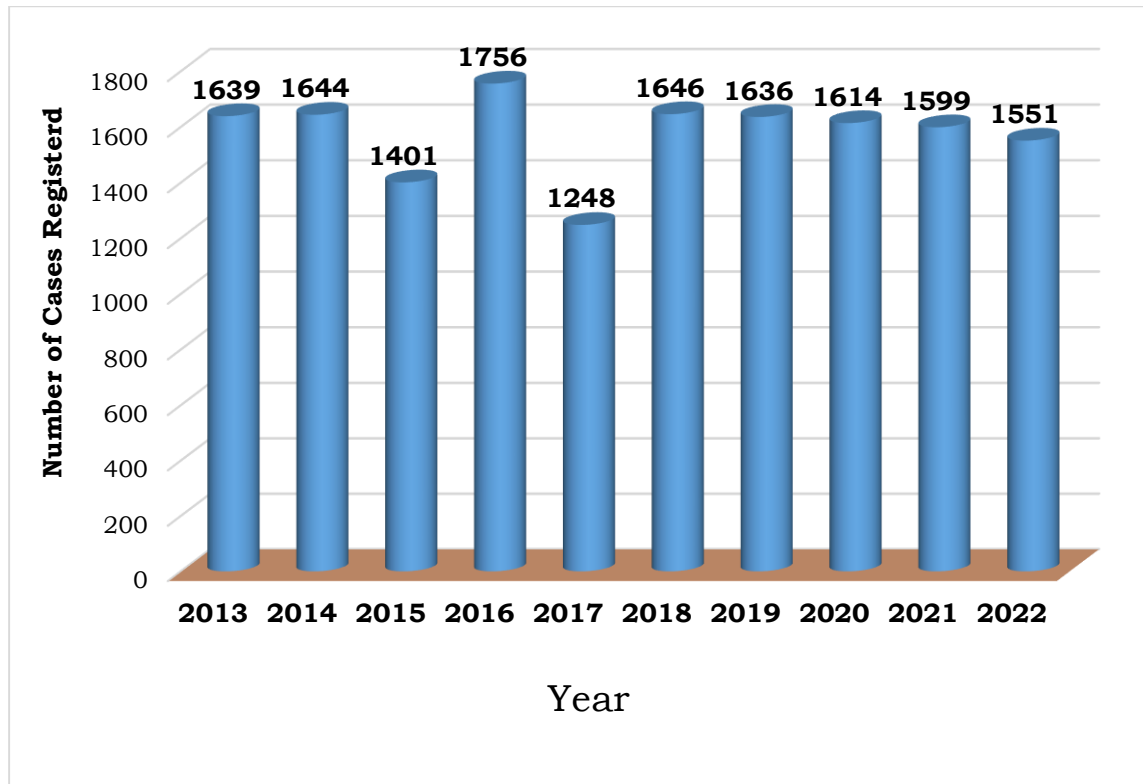

The head and district wise incidents, their rate and percentage has been calculated and presented in Table 4.3.

The total figures of crime against women for the last 10 years (2013-2022) are presented in Table 4.4 and Chart 4.5.

From the analysis of Crime against Women reported in districts, it is seen that registration of cases of Rape, Kidnapping & Abduction insult to outrage modesty, immoral trafficking was higher during the year 2022 as compared to the previous year.

The districts which reported the lowest incidents of crime against women are Lahaul-

Spiti (03) Kinnaur (34), Solan (86) Baddi (91) Bilaspur (94).

4.3 Head wise incidents of Crime against Women:

The brief of head wise status of Crime against Women during 2022 is as under:

(i) Murder: (Increase of 200%)

2 Cases under this head were reported in District Sirmaur.

(ii) Rape: (Increase of 0.27%)

A total of 359 cases of Rape were reported, which is an increase of 0.27% over the previous year (358 cases). The highest incidents of rape were reported in district Mandi (57), Kangra (53), Siramur (48), Shimla (38), Baddi (36), Kullu (30), Chamba (25), Una (24), Solan (17), Bilaspur (13), Kinnaur (11), Hamirpur (6) and Lahaul & Spiti (1).

Reasons:-

1. Revelation of illicit love affairs, intimacy and friendship between both parties leading to registration of cases.
2. Alluring for marriage and later on due to refusal of parents, refusal for marriage, resulting in registration of cases.
3. False registration due to enmity.
4. Rapes of minors.

(iii) Dowry Deaths:

(Decrease of 50%)

Under this head 01 incident was reported in Kangra. No

incidents under this head were reported in rest of the districts.

**(iv) Kidnapping & Abduction:
(Decrease of 5.23%)**

During the year 2022, 326 incidents of Kidnapping & Abduction were registered; a decrease of 5.23% over the previous year (344 cases). Kangra district reported the highest incidents (53) under this crime head, followed by Shimla (37), Mandi & Solan (35 each), Sirmaur, Chamba (23), Bilaspur and Kullu (19 each), (Baddi (16) and Kinnaur (10).

**(v) Assault on women with
intent to outrage
modesty (Sec.354)
(Increase of 1.02%)**

492 cases of Assault on women with intent to outrage modesty were registered during the year 2022; an increase of 1.02% over the previous year. Kangra district recorded the highest (101 cases), followed by Mandi (75), Sirmaur (54), Shimla (46), Hamirpur (41), Bilaspur & Chamba (32 each), Kullu & Una (31 each), Baddi (32), Solan, (19), Kinnaur (7) and Lahaul & Spiti (1).

(vi) Abetment to Commit Reasons:-**Suicide (Increase of 5.88 %)**

An increasing trend is seen under this head with a 5.88% increase over the previous year. The highest number of cases were registered in Kangra district (15), followed by Mandi (10), Una (8), Bilaspur (7), Hamirpur (4), Baddi & Sirmaur (3 each), Solan (2), Chamba and Shimla (1 each). No incidence under this head was reported in Kinnaur, Lahaul & Spiti and Kullu districts.

1. Torture of married women for the purpose of dowry, her ill health etc.
2. Harassment and torture of women by her in-laws i.e. husband, mother-in-law, father-in-law etc. on the pretext that she is not capable to doing house hold and agriculture activities.
3. Harassment/torture of women by husband due to illicit relationship of the husband with another woman.
4. Torture/ harassment of women by husband or other male member of the family under the influence of liquor.
5. Love marriage without the consent of the other family members i.e. father-in-law and mother-in-law of the victims.

**(vii) Cruelty to Women:
(Decrease of 11.31%)**

196 cases of Cruelty to Women were registered during the year 2022. This head showed a decrease of 11.34% over the previous year. The highest number of cases were registered in Kangra (38) district, followed by Una (24), Sirmaur (21), Bilaspur (18, Chamba (16), Shimla (14) Hamirpur (13), Baddi (11), Kullu (5), Solan (4) & Kinnaur (3) and no incident under this was reported in Lahual & Spiti district.

(viii) Insult to the modesty of Women (Sec. 509 IPC): (Decrease of 18.1%)

There was a decrease in registration under this head by 18.1% over the previous year. The

number of cases registered were Hamirpur & Kangra (12 each) Mandi (100), Kullu & Shimla (10 each), Una (12 each) Bilaspur, Chamba & Solan (4 each), Sirmour (3) Baddi & Lahaul & Spiti (1 each). No incident under this head was reported in Kinnaur district.

(ix) Immoral Trafficking
(Decrease of 50%)

Total of 3 cases of Immoral Trafficking were registered during the year 2022, as compared to 6 cases registered in the previous year.

CHAPTER-5

CRIME AGAINST CHILDREN

5.1 General:

Crime against children includes violations under certain sections of the Indian Penal Code. For the purpose of this chapter, the following categories of crimes involving child victims have been included under this head:-

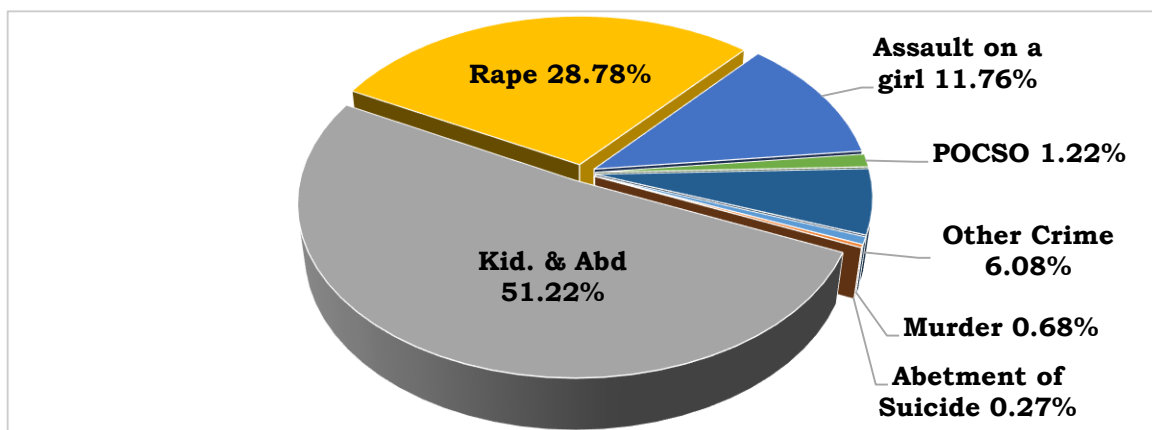
- i. Murder
- ii. Abetment to Suicide
- iii. Infanticide
- iv. Exposure and Abandonment
- v. Hurt/Grievous Hurt
- vi. Kidnapping and abduction
- vii. Rape
- viii. Attempt to commit Rape
- ix. Assault on girl

- x. Insult to the modesty of a girl
- xi. Protection of Children from sexual offences
- xii. Juvenile Justice (Care & Protection of Children) Act, 2000
- xiii. Prohibition of Child Marriage Act
- xiv. Other crimes committed against Children

5.2 Trends of Crime against Children:

Table 5.1 and **Chart 5.1** depicts the percentage distribution of crimes against children during 2022. **Chart 5.2** depicts the district-wise distribution of crimes against children during 2013-2022.

5.3 Incidents:

Table 5.1 shows the incidents and rate of Crime against Children, district wise including its rank.

A total of 740 cases were reported in the State under various sections of IPC. Kidnapping & Abduction constituted the largest category with 379 cases (51.22%) reported during the year. The maximum number of 'Kidnapping & Abduction' cases were reported in Kangra District (58) followed by Shimla (53), Solan & Mandi (45 each), Kullu (35), Sirmaur (28), Una (24), Hamirpur (22), Bilaspur & Chamba (21 each) Baddi (17), Kinnaur (10) and no incident under this head was reported in district Lahaul & Spiti.

The second most prevalent Crime against Children

was Rape along with POCSO Act, which accounted for 213 cases (28.78%). The highest number of Rape cases were reported in District Mandi (33), Sirmaur (27), Shimla & Baddi (24 each), Kangra (22), Kullu & Una (18 each), Chamba (16), Solan (11), Bilaspur & Kinnaur (8 each), Hamirpur (4) and no incident under this head was reported in District Lahaul & Spiti.

05 cases under the head Murder of Children were reported in the State. 1 each in Kinnaur, Kullu, Mandi, Sirmaur and Una Districts. No case of Murder of children has been reported in rest of the districts of the State.

The incidence and percentage contribution of crimes against children head and district wise is presented in **Table.5.2**.

Total No. of Incidence = 740

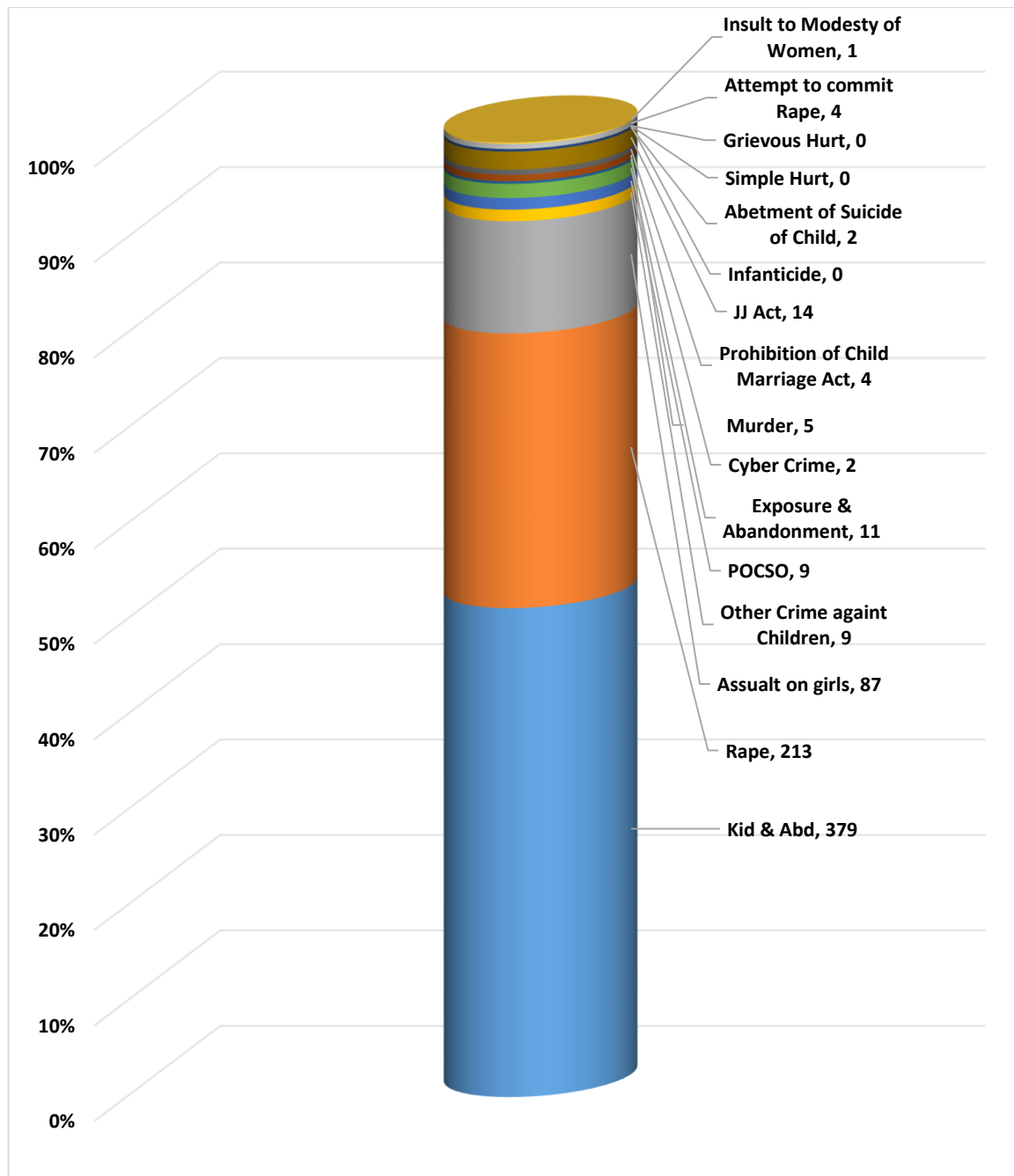

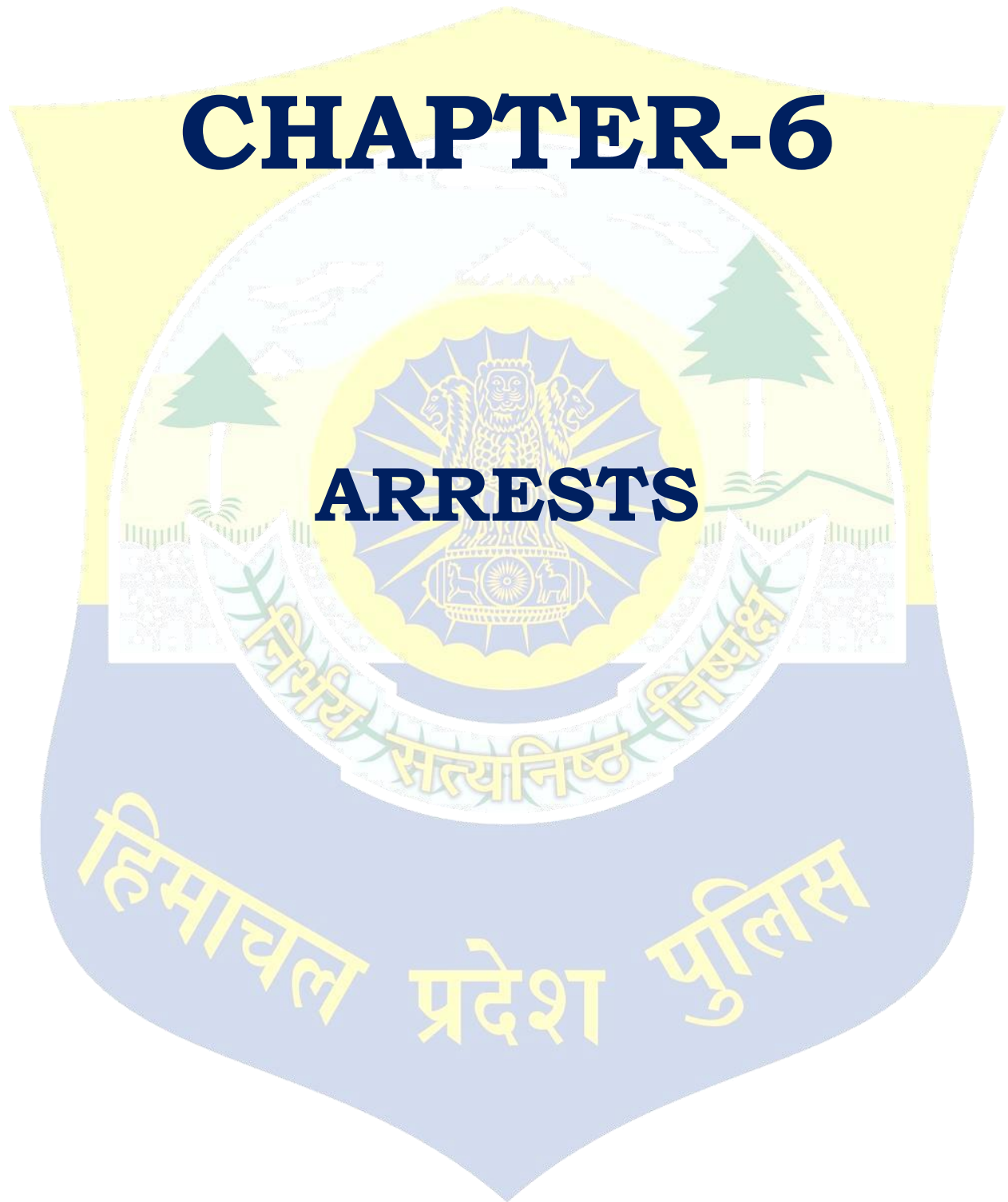

ARRESTS

6.1 ARRESTS:

A total of 14548 persons (9914 under IPC & 4634 under Local & Special Laws) were arrested during the year 2022 in 19053 cases (13231 under IPC & 5822 Local & Special Laws), which is a decrease of 18.27% when compared with the arrests of 17802 persons (11693 under IPC & 6109 under Local & Special Laws) in the year 2021.

(i) PERSONS ARRESTED UNDER IPC CASES:

(Decrease of 15.21%)

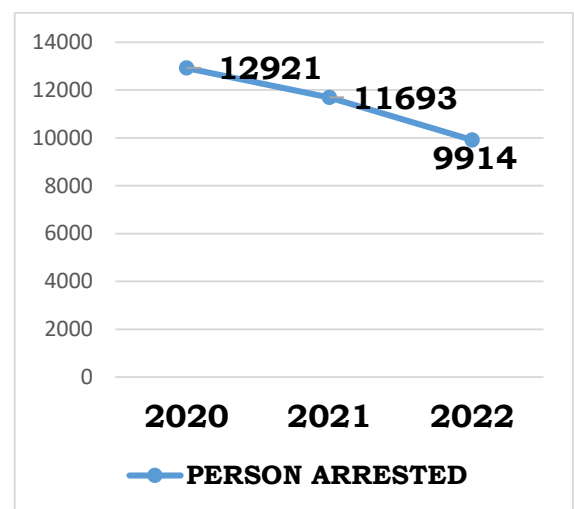
During the year 2022 as many as 9914 persons were arrested in 13231 cases registered under IPC, as against 11693 persons in 2021. This is due to the reason that some cases registered in State fall under petty offences in which accused are released under section 41(A) Cr.PC. **Chart 6.1** depicts persons arrested under IPC crimes during 2020-2022.

Table 6.1 gives details of arrests made under IPC crime during the last 3 years 2020-2022.

Table 6.2 gives age-group wise

and gender wise break up of persons arrested in districts.

District Shimla tops in arresting 2580 persons in 1743 cases during 2022, followed by district Kullu by arresting 1468 persons in 1001 cases and Sirmaur by arresting 1444 persons in 1030 cases.

In Kangra 2454 cases were registered and 391 persons arrested. District Mandi has registered 1810 cases and arrested 239 persons, Bilaspur 208 persons were arrested against the

registration of 949 cases during the year 2022. The details of persons arrested under IPC crime head wise & gender wise are presented in **Table 6.3**.

Chart 6.2 depicts age group wise persons arrested under IPC crime during the years 2022 and **Chart 6.3** depicts district wise persons arrested under IPC crime cases during the year 2022 in descending order.

Persons arrested crime head/gender wise are presented in **Table 6.4**. **Table 6.5** shows the district wise persons arrested during

AGE-GROUP WISE PERSONS ARRESTED UNDER IPC CRIMES DURING 2022

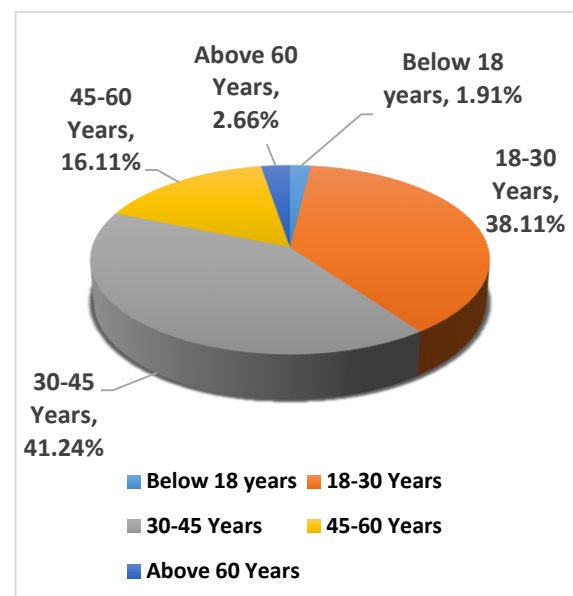
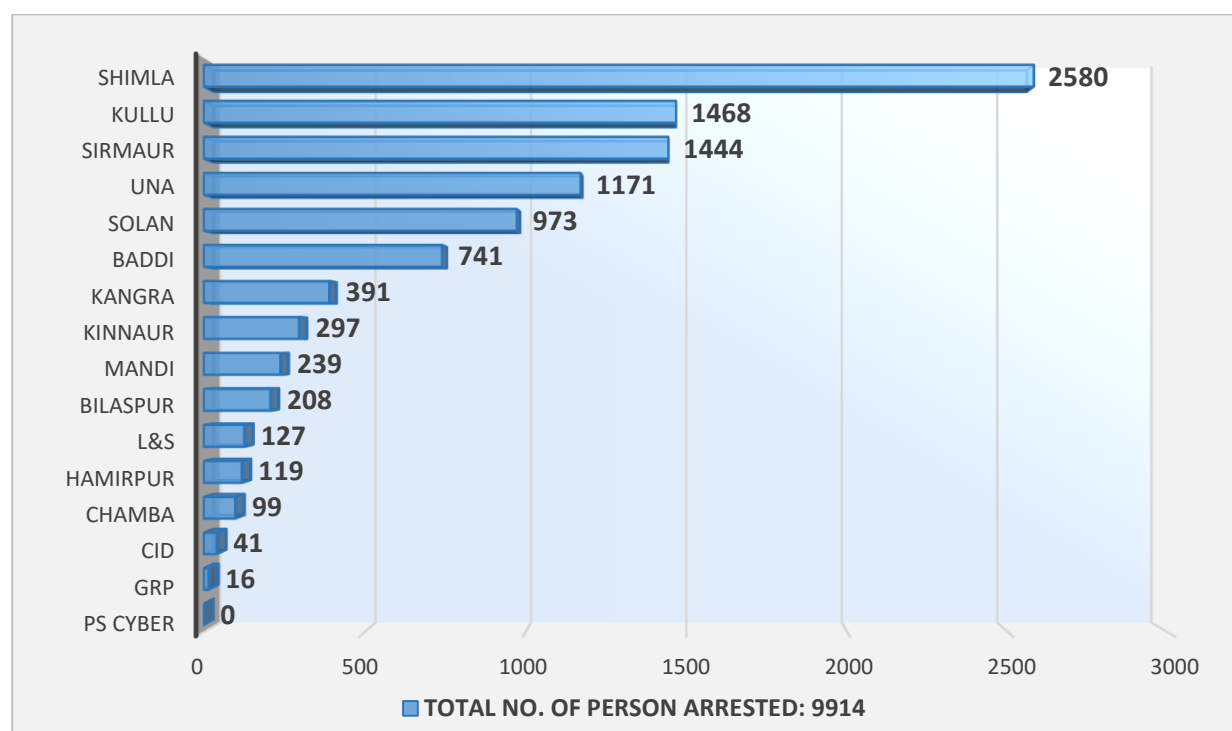

DISTRICT WISE PERSONS ARRESTED UNDER IPC CRIMES DURING 2022

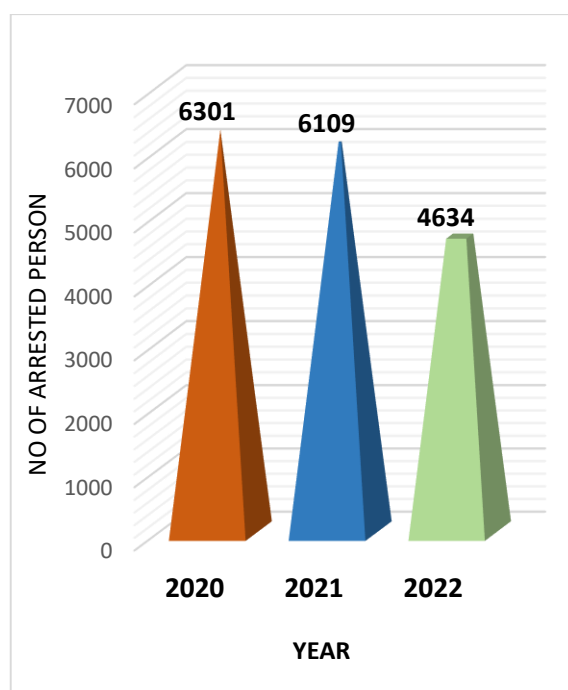


(ii) Persons arrested under SLL cases: (Decrease of 24.14%)

Total 4634 persons were arrested against 5822 SLL crimes during 2022, as compared to 6109 persons during the year 2021; a decrease of 24.14%. Persons arrested during 2020-2022 crime head wise and percentage variations (SLL) during 2022 over 2021 are presented in Table 6.6

Chart 6.4 depicts persons arrested under SLL Crime during 2020-2022.

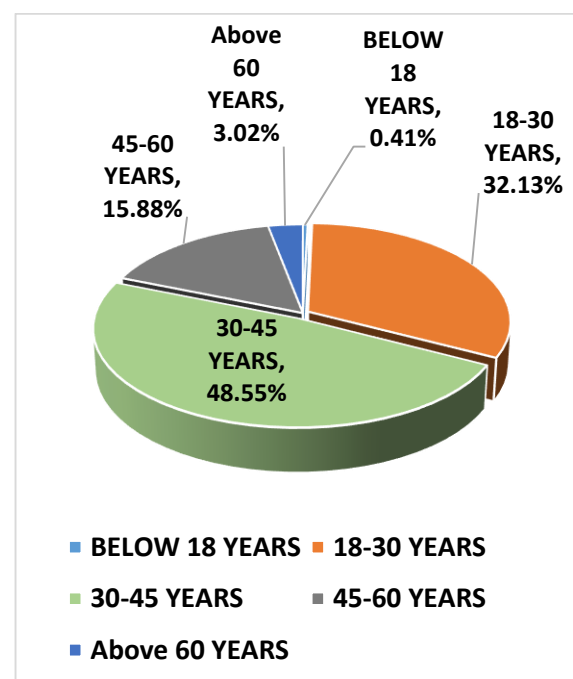
CHART 6.4

District Shimla has arrested the highest number (973) of persons with (683) cases registered during the year 2022, followed by district Kullu by arresting (866)

persons in (638) cases, Una (529) persons in (466) cases, Kinnaur (359) persons in (215) cases, Sirmaur (357) persons in (372) cases registered.

Baddi has registered 375 cases with 298 persons arrested,

Solan has 239 cases with 267 person arrested, Kangra 894 cases with 251 persons arrested, and Mandi 725 cases with 251 persons arrested.

DISTRICT WISE PERSONS ARRESTED UNDER SLL CRIMES DURING 2022

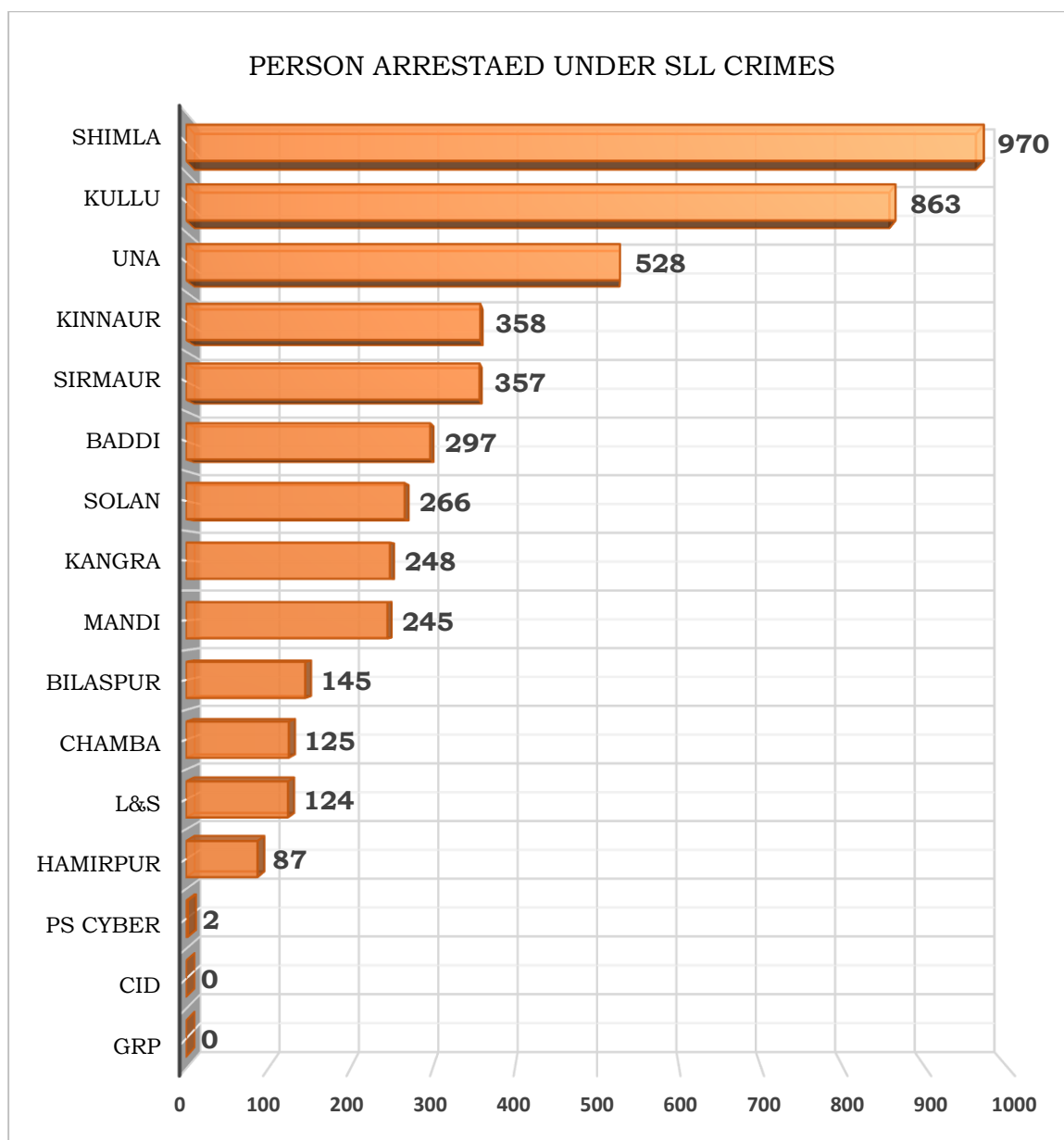

PERSONS ARRESTED UNDER (IPC) CRIMES – 2022

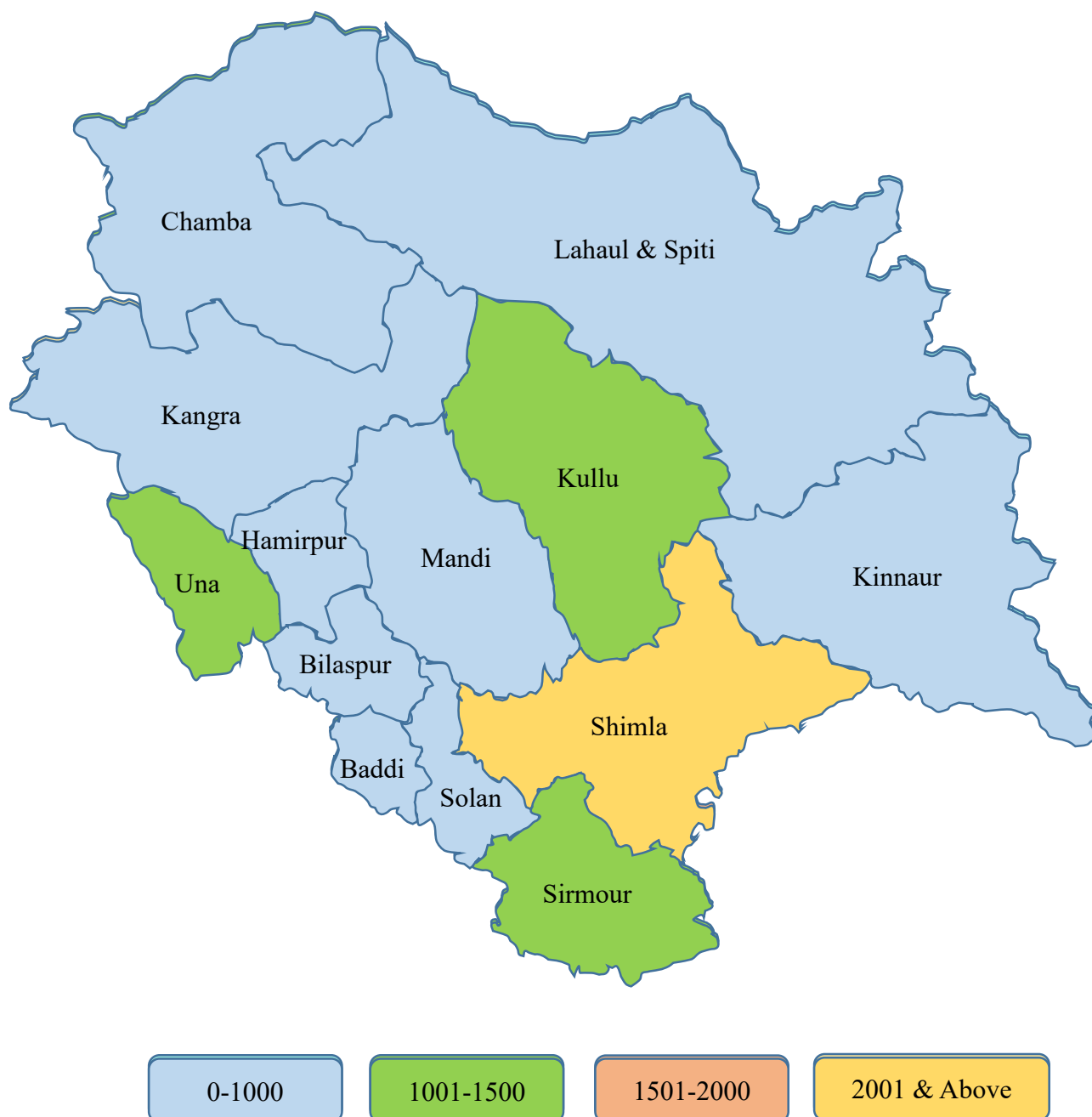

CHAPTER-7

CRIME AGAINST WEAKER SECTIONS OF SOCIETY (SC/ST)

7.1 General:

A complete harmony among different sections of society is prevailing in the State. No particular area of the State is notorious for the commission of offences against the SCs/STs. However, sporadic incidents of violence against the members of these communities do take place.

India is a welfare State. It is committed to the welfare and development of its people in general and of vulnerable sections in particular. Equality of status and opportunity to all citizens of the country are guaranteed by the constitution of India, which also provides that no individual shall be discriminated against on grounds of religion, caste or sex. Fundamental Rights and specific provisions, namely, Articles 38, 39 and 46 in the constitution of India stand testimony to the commitment of the State towards its people. The strategy of the State is to secure distributive justice and allocation of resources to

support programmes for social, economic and educational advancement of the weaker section in general and those of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in particular.

7.2 Constitutional Rights:

The Indian Constitution vide Article 15 lays down that no citizen shall on grounds of religion, race, sex or place of birth be subjected to any disability or restriction. It also guarantees that every citizen shall have equality of status and opportunity.

7.3. Legal Rights:

To uphold the constitutional mandate and to safeguard the interests of this section of the society, special social enactments have come into force from time to time, including privileges by way of reservations.

Following are two of the major legal enactments sponsored by Centre:

- (i) Protection of Civil Rights Act, 1955; and
- (ii) SC/ST (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989

The Protection of Civil Rights Act, 1955 was enacted in furtherance of Article 17 of the Constitution by which untouchability was abolished and its practice in any form is forbidden. Further, in order to check and deter crimes against SC/STs by persons belonging to other communities, the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989 was brought into force from 30th January, 1990. These enactments have extended the positive discrimination in favour of SCs and STs to the field of criminal law in as much as they prescribe penalties that are more stringent than for corresponding offences under the Indian Penal Code (IPC) and other laws.

In addition, in pursuance of the Constitution 65th Amendment Act, 1990, the National Commission for SCs and STs was

constituted w.e.f 12th March, 1992 with wide functions and powers of Civil Courts to take up matters which are of vital importance for socio-economic development of SCs and STs.

7.4 The Crimes against weaker sections identified under the Indian Penal Code (IPC) and Special & Local Laws (SLL):

- (i) Murder
- (ii) Rape
- (iii) Kidnapping & Abduction
- (iv) Dacoity
- (v) Robbery
- (vi) Arson
- (vii) Hurt
- (viii) Others (Other classified IPC crimes)

7.4.1 Under Special & Local Laws (SLL):

- (i) Protection of Civil Rights Act:1955
- (ii) The SC/STs (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989.

The crimes under IPC such as 'Murder', 'Hurt', 'Rape etc. or under Special Acts such as PCR Act & SC/ST (P) Act are already included in overall crimes reported under IPC and SLL respectively and have been

discussed in details in the preceding chapters. The data specific to crimes against SC/ST discussed in the following paragraphs is a part and parcel of total crimes but analyzed separately for better comprehension.

Population:

As per 2011 census of Himachal Pradesh, the Scheduled Castes constituted 25.19% of the total population in the State, while Scheduled Tribes constituted only 5.7%. District Kangra with the highest population share (22.03%) also represented the highest share of Scheduled Castes (21.15%), followed by Mandi (17%) and Shimla with (12.47%).

7.5 Incidents of Crimes against Weaker Section (SC/ST):

The incidents of these crimes (IPC+SLL) were reported to be 214 cases in the State during 2022. Head wise details of crime against weaker sections for the last 3 years, including percentage change over the previous years, is presented in **Table 7.1**. **Chart 7.1** depicts the head wise position of the crime incidents. The

district wise and head wise incidents including the rate of crime has been calculated and presented in **Table 7.2**.

The above data reflects that the incidents of most of the SC/ST (POA) Act and other crimes have increased.

7.6 Head-wise Crime:

Under most of the heads of IPC no incident has been registered during the year 2021. The head wise detailed analysis of all crime heads under which the cases have been registered during the year 2022 are given below:

(i) Murder: (Decrease of 50%)

During the year 2022, 1 incidents was reported in Mandi district under the head Murder against weaker sections in the state.

(ii) Rape: (Decrease of 38.46%)

During the year 2022, 8 incidents of rape were reported in the State. The highest numbers of incidents under this head were reported in district Una & Mandi (3 each), followed by Kullu & Baddi (1 each) No case under this head was registered in rest of the districts.

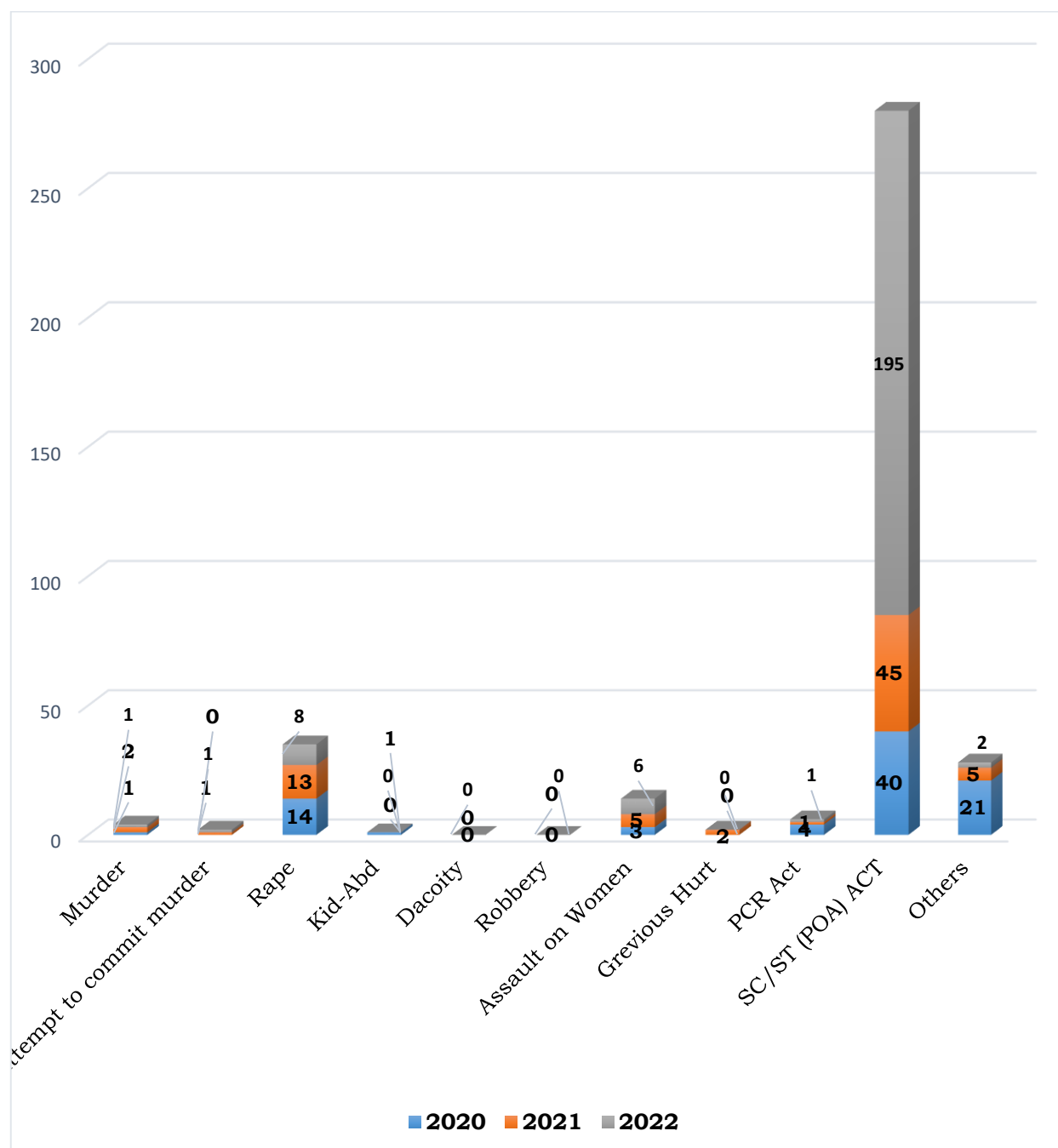
(iii) SC/ST Protection of Civil Rights Act: (No variation)

During the year 2022, 1 incident of PCR Act was reported in

Kinnaur district under this head. No case under this head was registered in rest of the districts.

(iv) SC/ST (Prevention of Atrocities) Act 1989 only:**(Decrease of 12.16%)**

During the year 2022, 195 incidents were reported under this head; a decrease of 56 cases over the previous year. The highest

number of incidents under this head were reported in district Mandi (45), followed by Hamirpur (35), Kangra (30), Shimla (18), Una (16), Bilaspur (14), Kullu (13) Sirmaur (8) Solan (6), Baddi (5), Chamba & Kinnaur (1 each) and L&S (1).

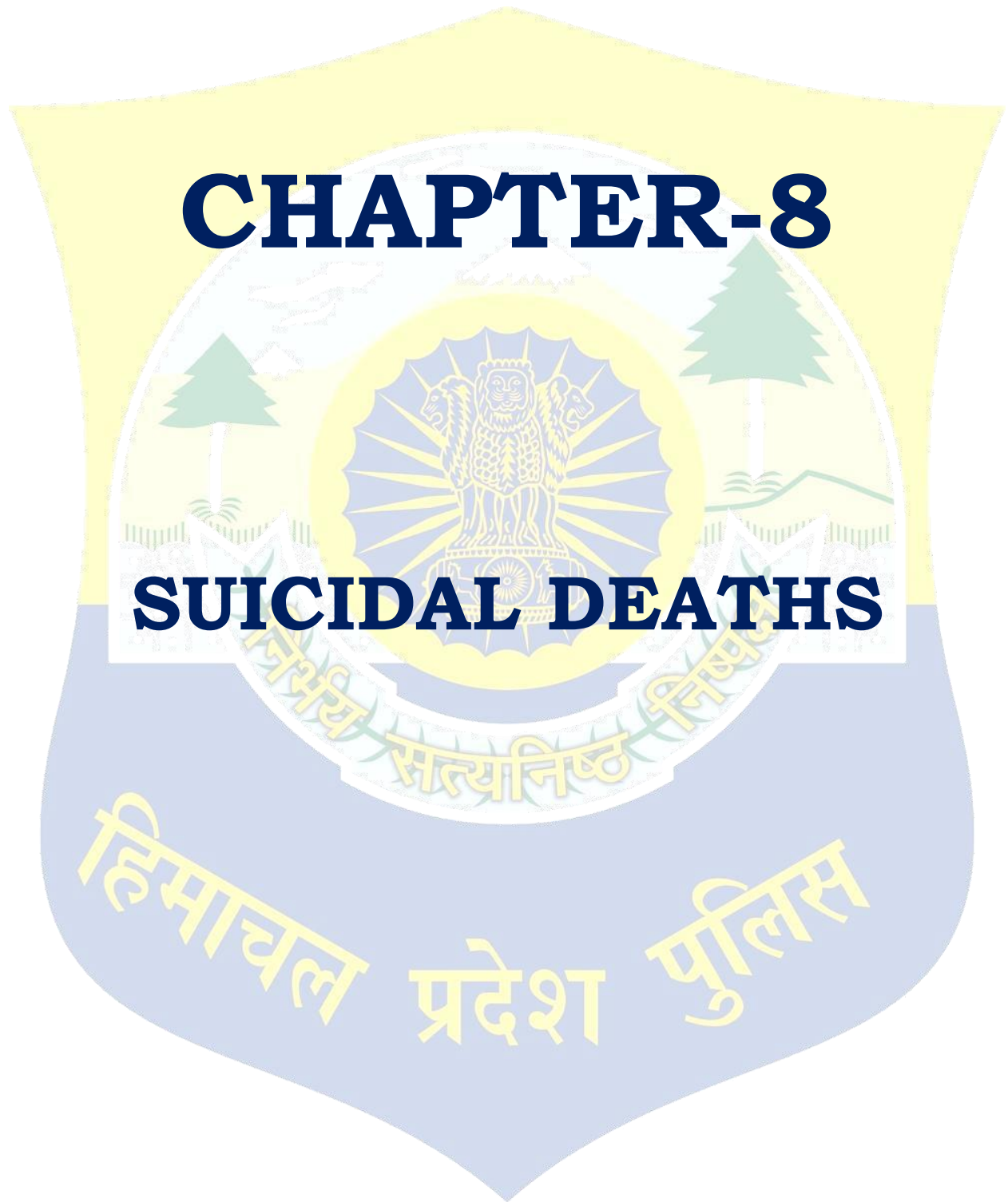

CHAPTER-8

SUICIDAL DEATHS

8.1 General:

According to the Oxford dictionary, 'suicide' means 'the act of killing oneself intentionally'. The word 'suicide' has its origin in the Latin word 'sui' (of oneself) plus 'caedere' [kill]. It is a step which is generally taken by one in an emotionally or mentally weak moment, when he or she feels that coping with life is impossible.

The number of suicides reported in Himachal Pradesh during 2022 was 758, as against 889 during 2021, indicating a decrease of 14.73%.

Kangra district recorded the highest number of suicides during

SUICIDE CASES (MALE AND FEMALE) DURING 2013-2022

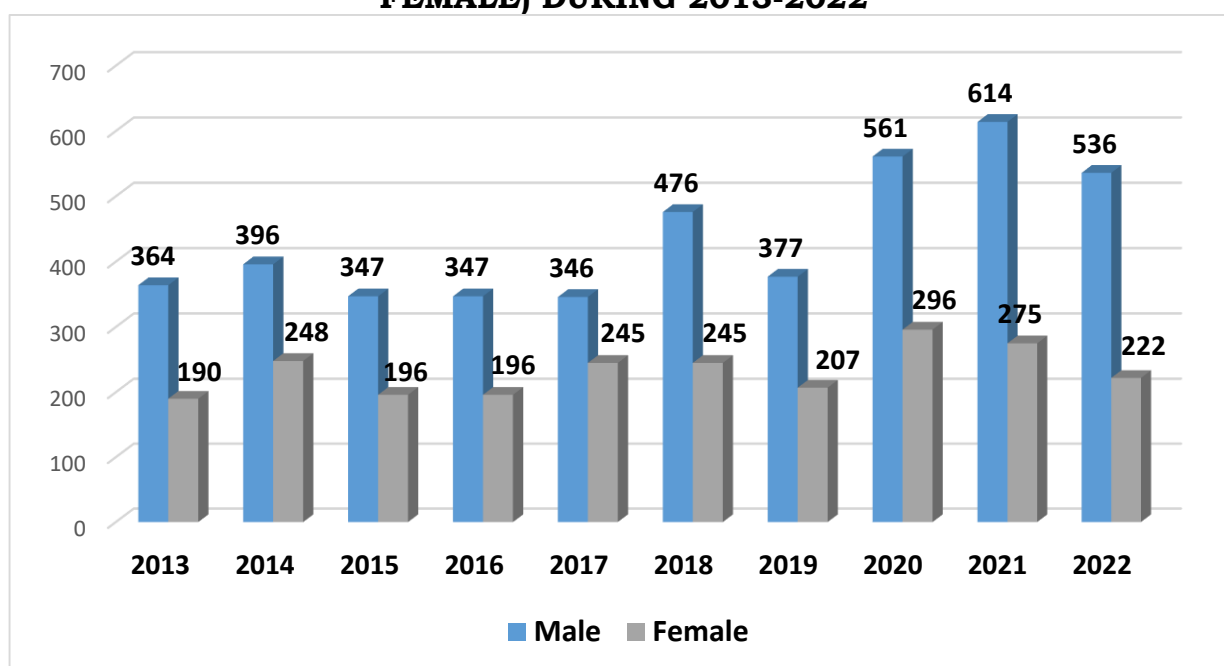
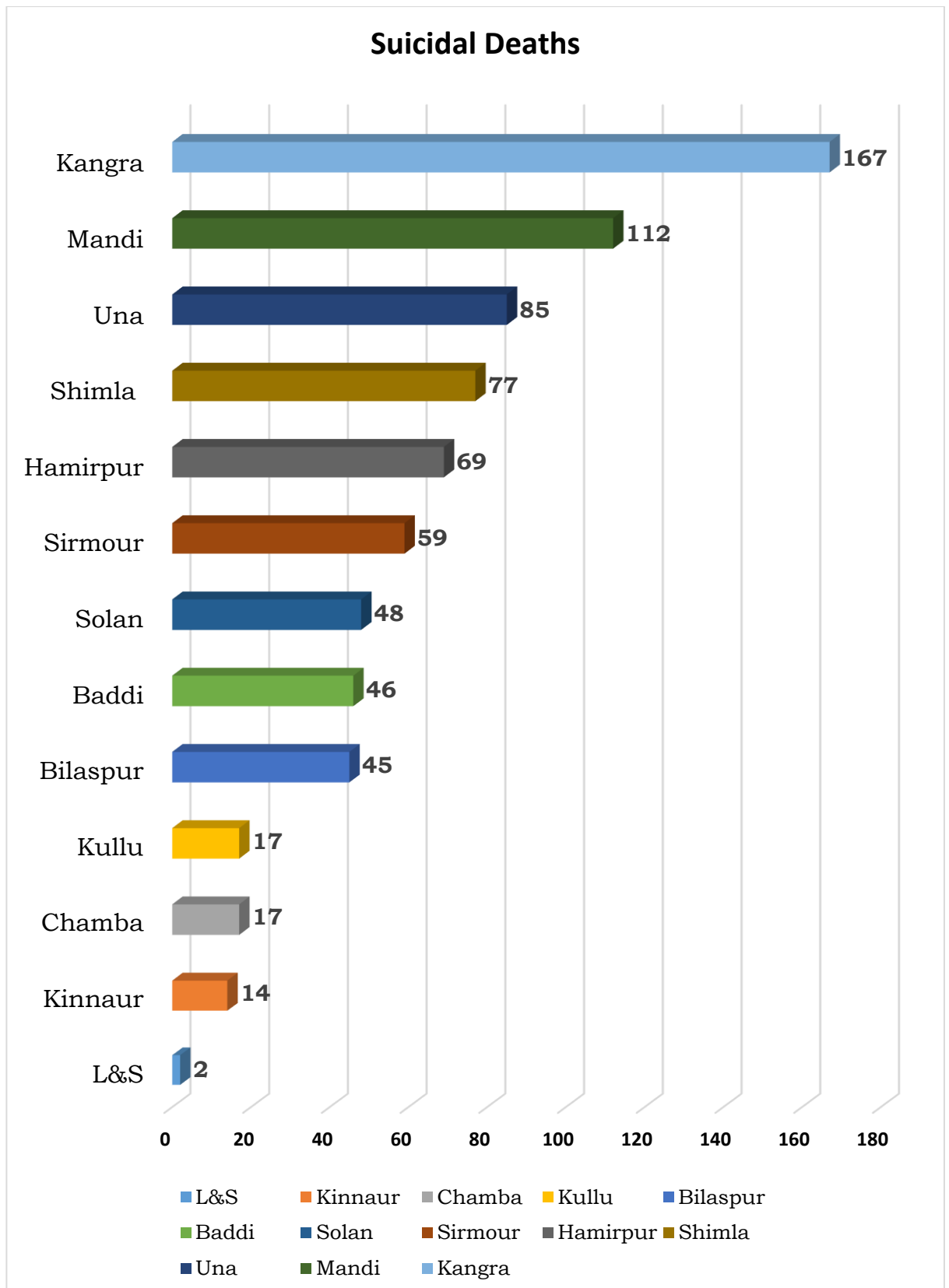


CHART-8.2

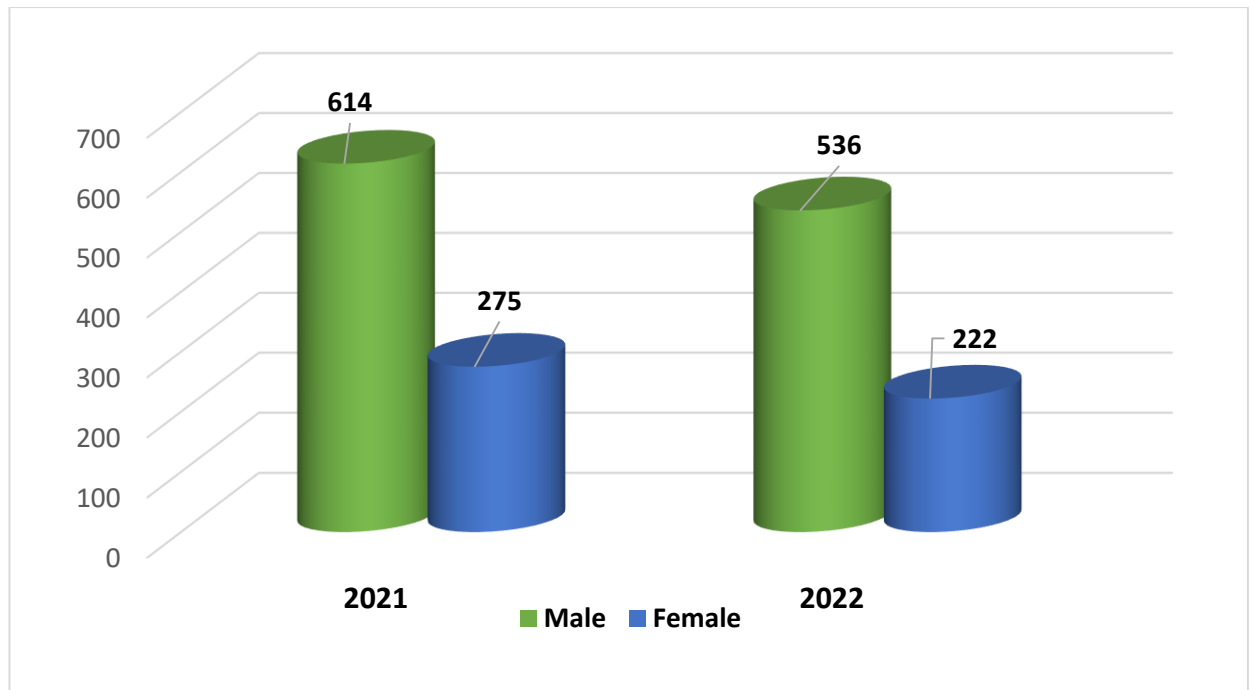

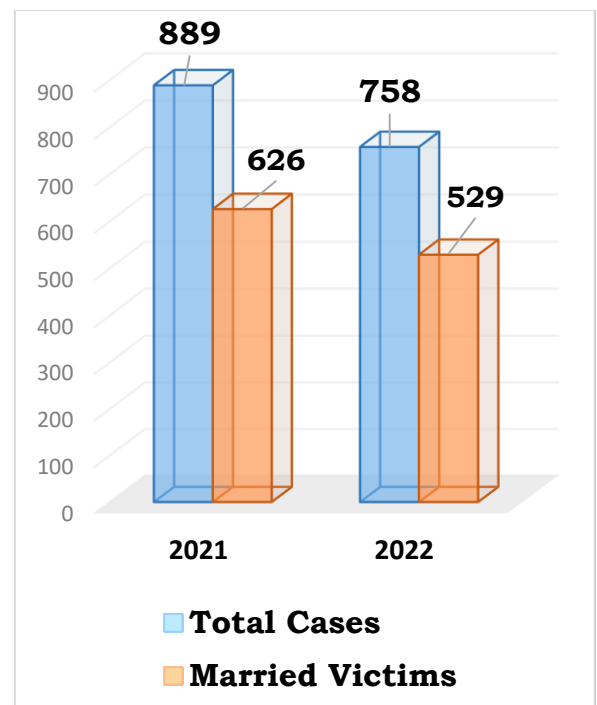

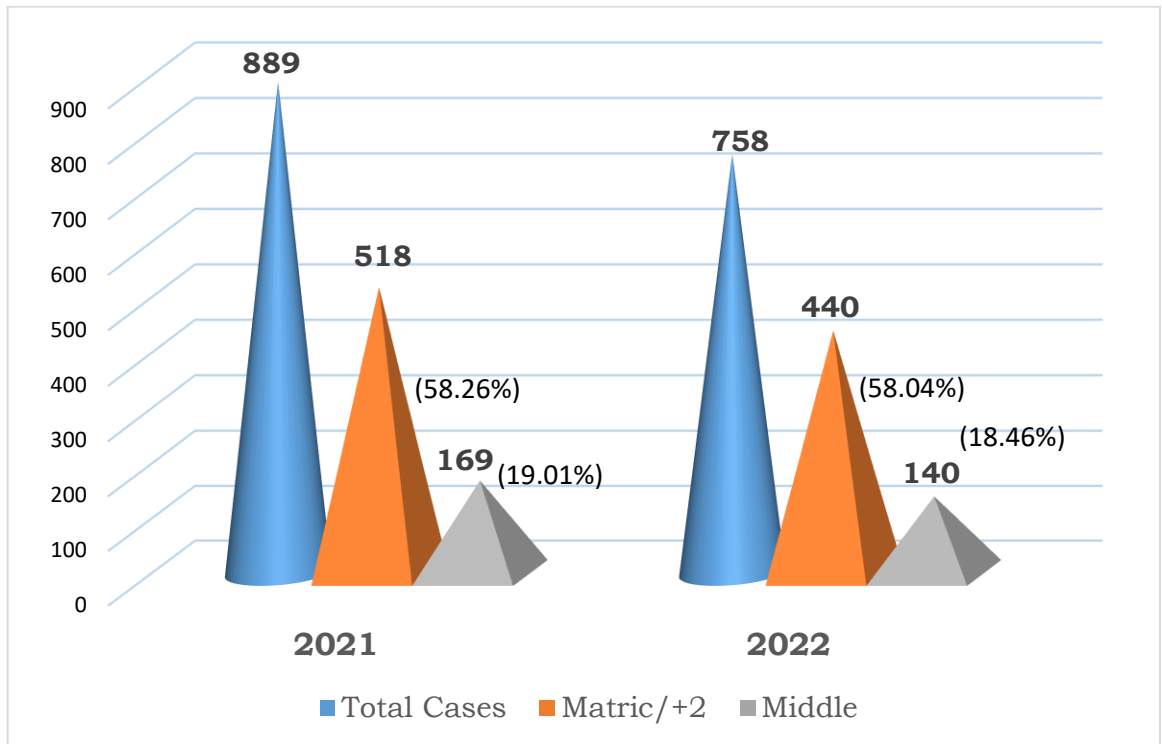
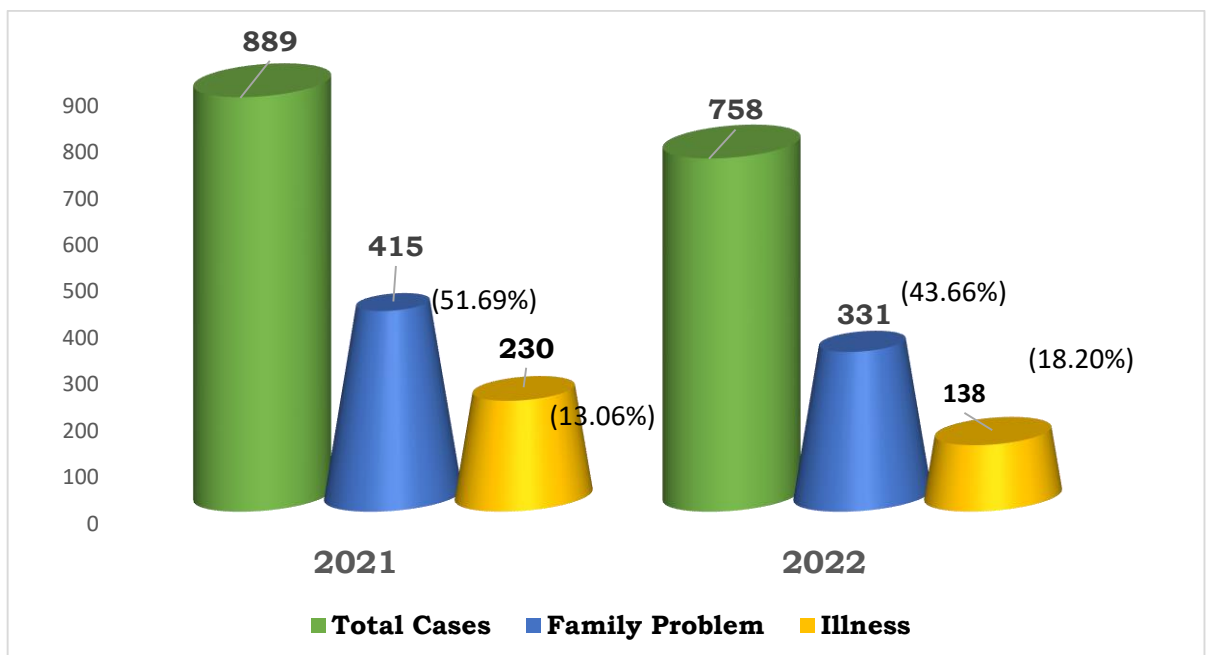

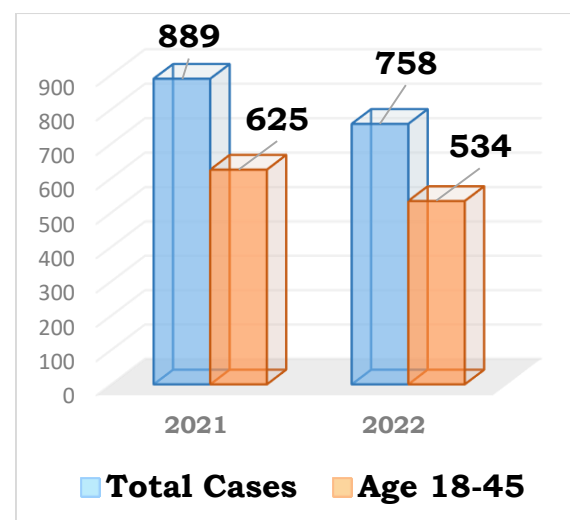

The analysis shows that the age profile of most of the suicide victims both men and women falls into two age-groups of 18-30 and 30-45 years. Thus, it can be said that most people who commit suicide do so in the prime of their lives between 18 to 45 years of age (70.30% in 2021 and 70.44% in 2022). This fact can be further co-related to the reasons for suicide i.e. 'family problems' and 'illness'.

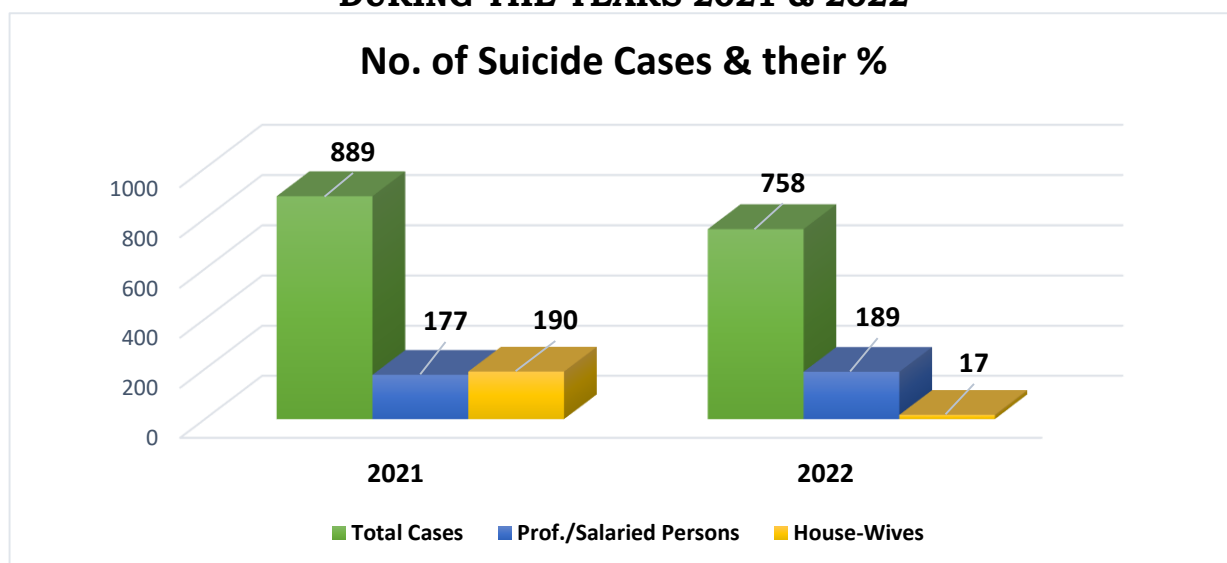

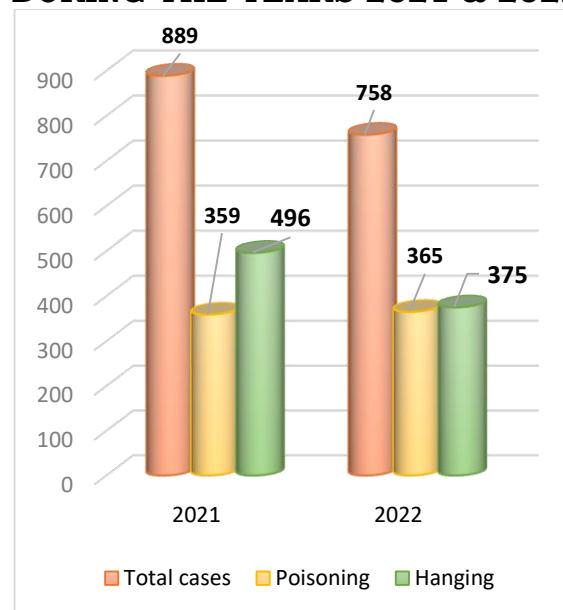

The means adopted for committing suicide range over several methods from drinking too much to jumping from high places. However, the maximum number have committed suicide by **hanging**. (55.79% in 2021 and 49.47% in 2022). This is followed by **consuming poison** (40.38% in 2021 and 48.15% in 2022).

8.11. Conclusions:

- i) There has been a decrease in the suicide cases committed by men during the year 2022 as against the year 2021.
- ii) Kangra, Mandi, Una, Shimla Hamirpur, Sirmour & Solan reported more suicidal deaths as compared to the other 06 districts of the State.
- iii) The major cause of suicides remained 'family problems', followed by 'illness'. 'Unemployment' is certainly not one of the major causes of suicides as it contributes less than 20% of total suicide cases.
- iv) Most of the women suicide victims were house-wives. The farmers/agriculturists do not form a major group of suicide victims as this group contributes only 0.5% to the total suicide cases.
- v) The majority of the suicide victims were married and in the age group of 18 to 45 years.
- vi) The most common means for committing suicide in the year 2022 was 'hanging' followed by taking 'poison'.

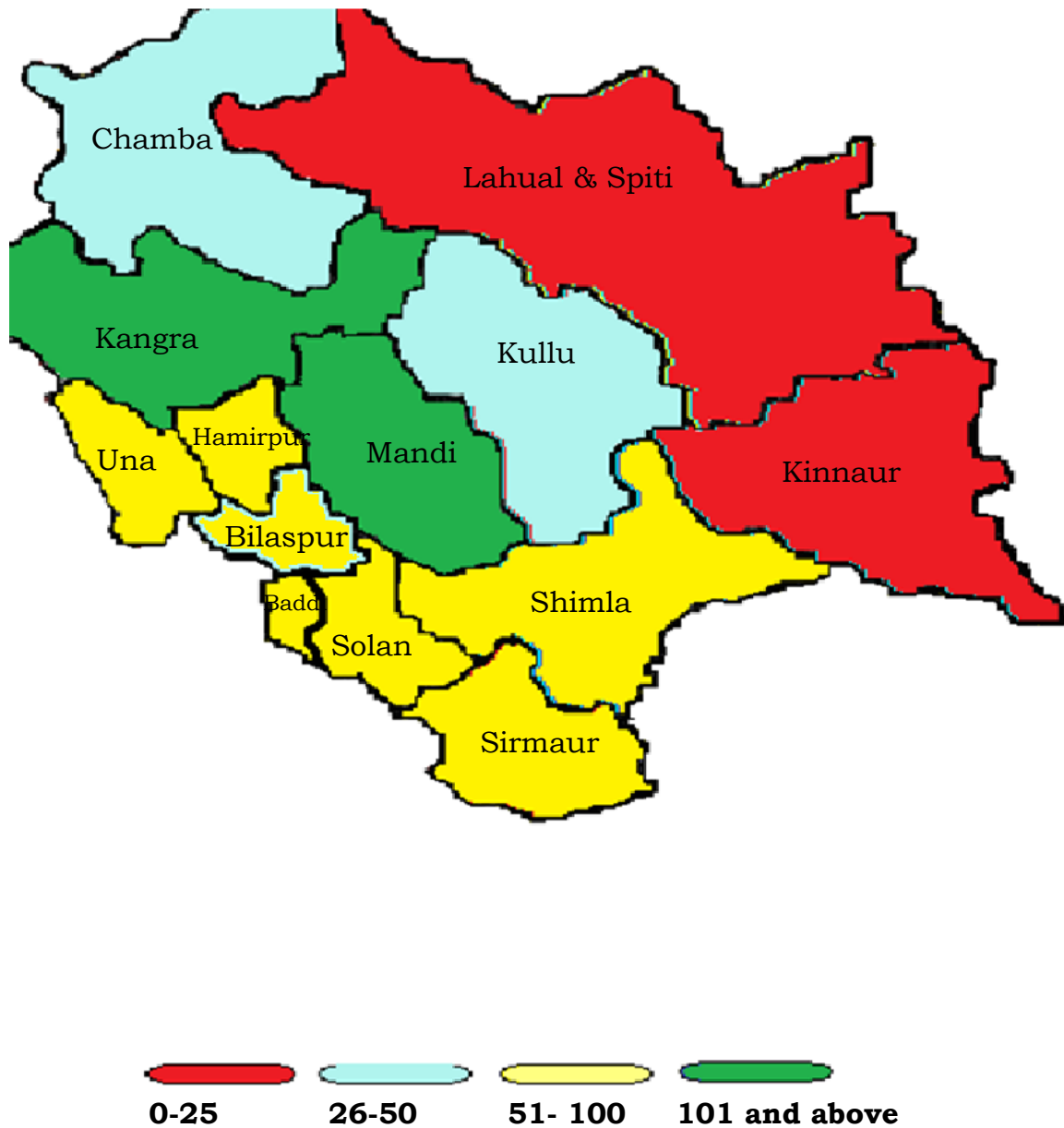
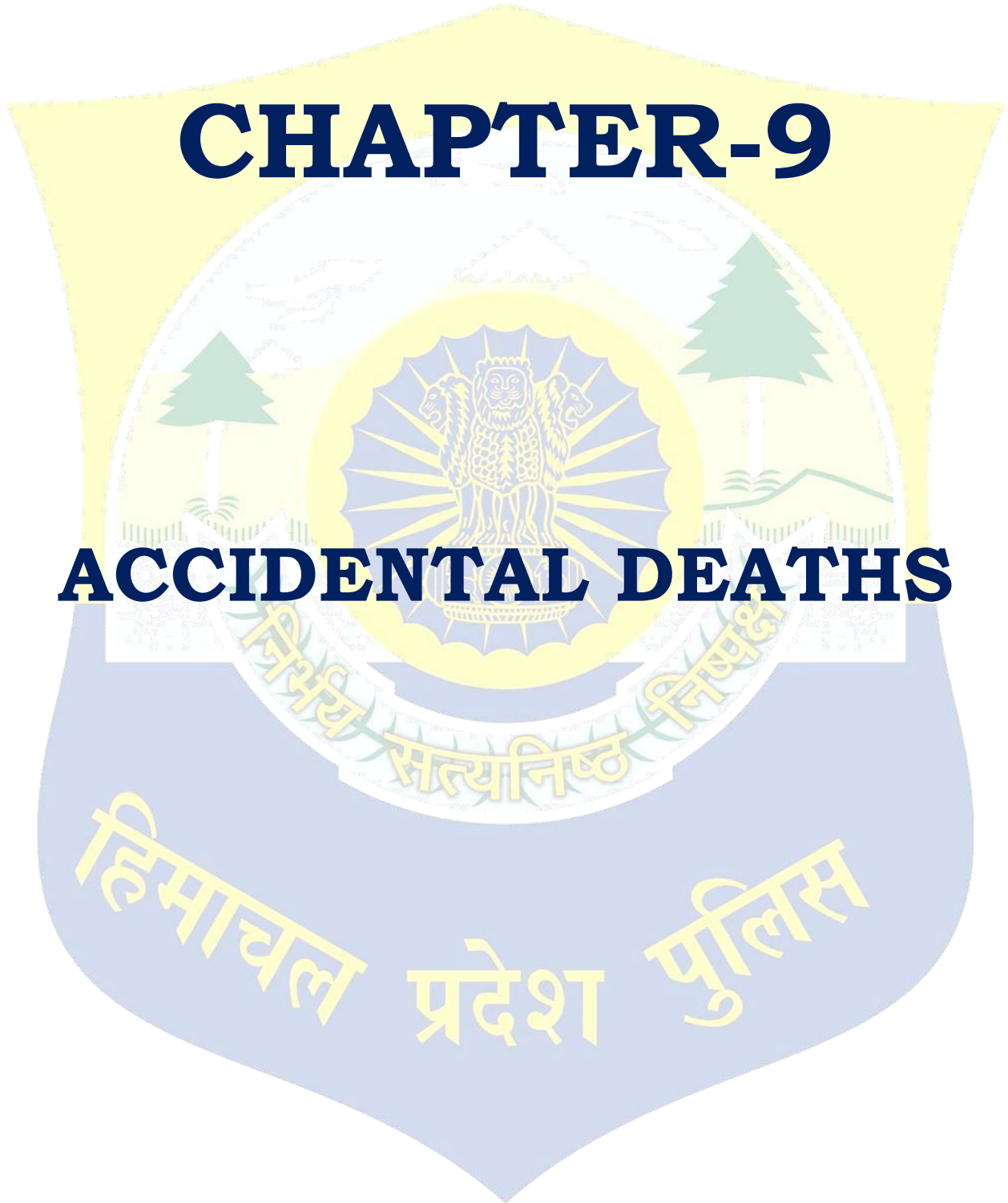

ACCIDENTAL DEATHS

9.1 General:

Incidents of road accidents in Himachal Pradesh show fluctuating trends. The break-up of accidents for the last ten years is shown in [Table-9.1](#)

Car/ Jeep/ Taxi/ Tempo account for the largest number of

accidents. During the year 2022, 46.01% of persons died/injured in road accidents were attributed to Car/Jeep/Taxi/Tempo. District wise comparative statement of road accidents during 2022 is presented in [Table-9.2](#). 2592 road accidents were reported during the year 2022 out of which 1010 accidents were fatal.

Accidental Deaths:

Car/ Jeep/ Taxi/ Tempo were responsible for 47.92% of accidental deaths during 2022. Out of

the 1010 persons who died due to accidents, as many as 484 were involved in accidents with these types of vehicles. [Table-9.2](#) gives details of road accidental deaths for the year

2022 with break-up of types of vehicles and due to other reasons. District Shimla reported the highest (172) numbers of accidental deaths, followed by Kangra (119), Mandi (110), Sirmaur (107), Kullu (104), Una (91) and Baddi (76). **Chart-9.1** depicts road accidents that occurred during 2013–2022.

Percentage of road accidental deaths according to type of vehicles during the year 2022 is presented in **Chart-9.2**.

PERCENTAGE OF ROAD ACCIDENTAL DEATHS (ACCORDING TO TYPE OF VEHICLES DURING 2022)

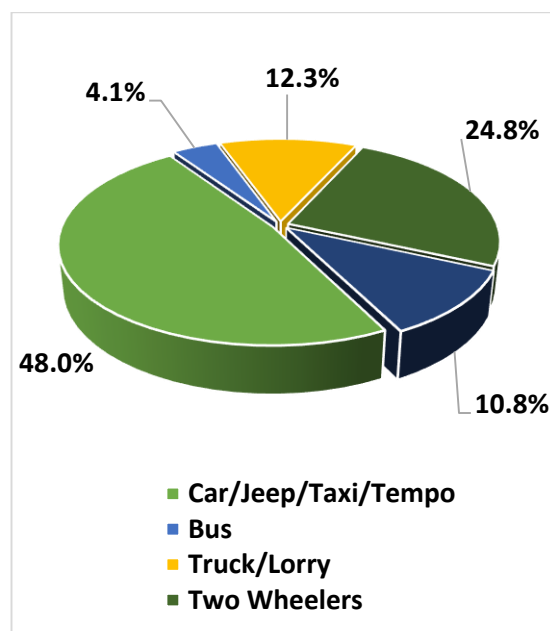

NUMBER OF ROAD ACCIDENTS (2013-2022)

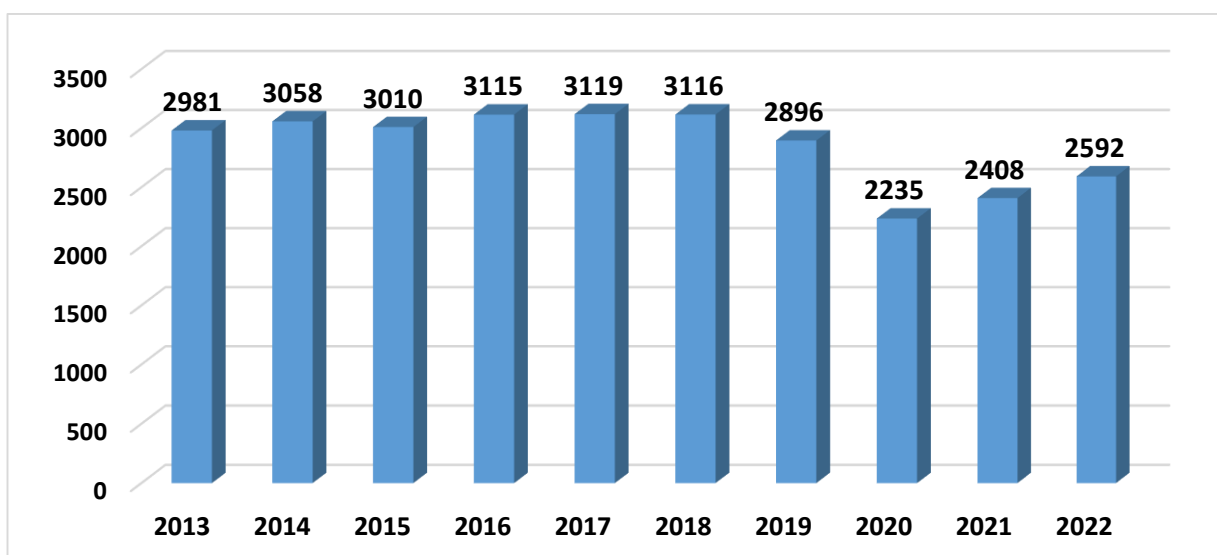

DISTRICT WISE TOTAL ACCIDENTS DURING 2022 (FATAL AND NON FATAL)

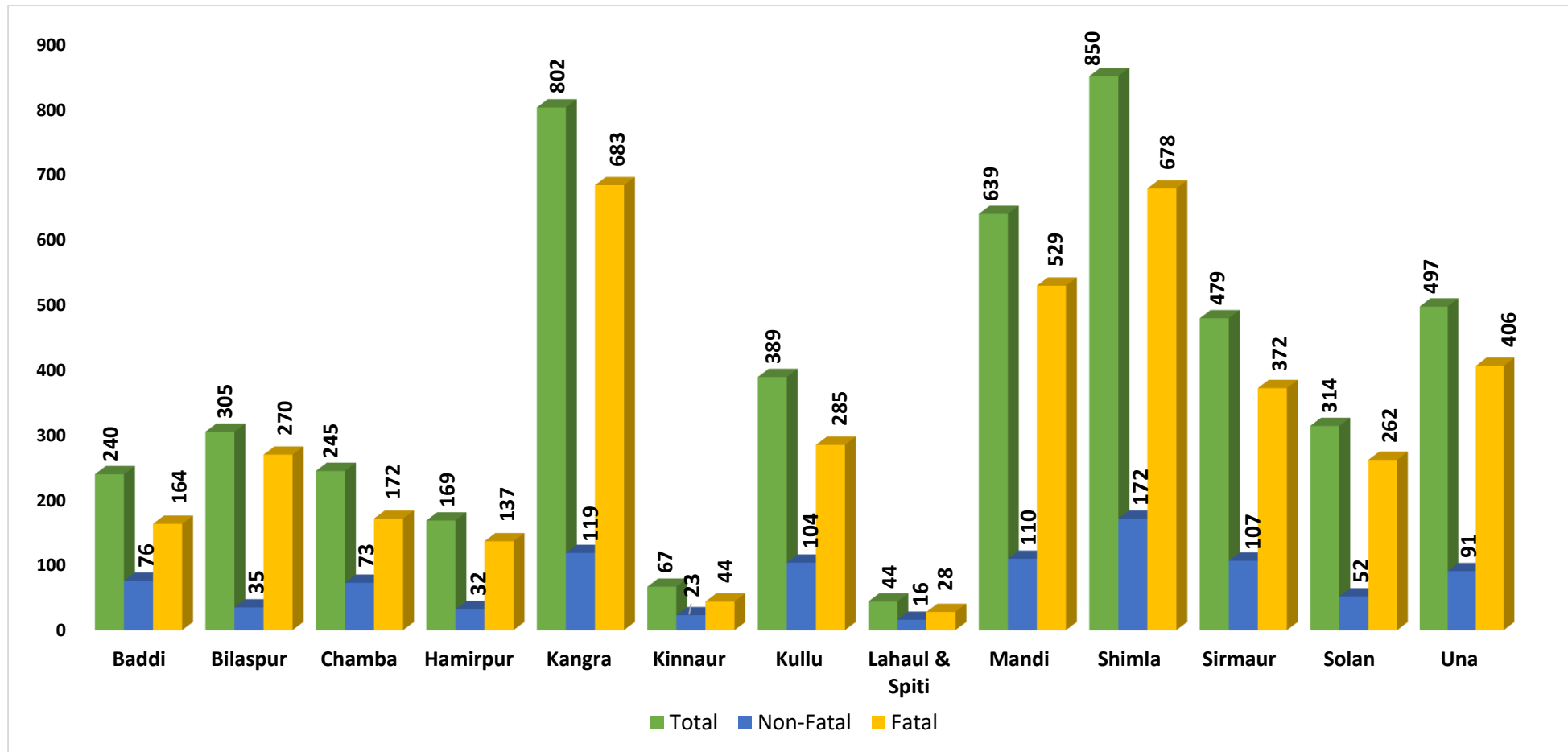

CHAPTER-10

CYBER CRIME

10.1 Definition of Cyber Crime:

“Any illegal action in which a computer is a tool or object of crime, in other words, any crime, the means or purpose of which is to influence the function of computer.”

Computer and Telecommunications are the key areas of Cybercrimes. In Cybercrimes, Computer is used in the following two ways:-

- i.) Computer as a target
- ii.) Computer as a tool

The computer becomes a target of Cybercrime when, by way of hacking or intrusion, the criminals access a Computer with a motive to impair, damage or alter the system. The hacking can evolve into other substantive violations, for example, alteration of accounts, drawl of money etc. by cyber intrusion into a bank.

Computer becomes a tool for Cybercrime when it becomes

a convenient method to commit crimes affecting large scale networks and programmes such as introducing virus into large scale reservation or financial network or unauthorizedly obtaining classified information from data stored in defense and security computers.

10.2 Classification of computer crimes:

The most accepted classification of computer crimes is as follows:

- (i) Computer related frauds.
- (ii) Computer forgery.
- (iii) Damage to computer data of computer programmes.
- (iv) Computer sabotage.
- (v) Unauthorized access.
- (vi) Unauthorized interception
- (vii) Unauthorized reproduction of a

- protected computer programmes.
- (viii) Unauthorized reproduction of a topography
 - (ix) Alteration of computer data or computer programmes
 - (x) Computer espionage
 - (xi) Unauthorized use of a computer
 - (xii) Unauthorized use of a protected Computer programmes.

10.3. Incidents of Computer Crime: (Increase of 7%)

During the year 2022, 77 cases under Cyber Crimes (IT Act only 56 cases, IPC with IT Act (21 cases) were registered in the State and during 2021 this figure was 70.

Chart 10.1 depicts the incidents of Cyber Crimes reported from 2020-2022. Table 10.1 carries the district-wise details of cases registered under the IT Act. Table 10.2 gives the details of Cyber Crimes registered and persons arrested under the I.T. Act during 2020-2022 :-

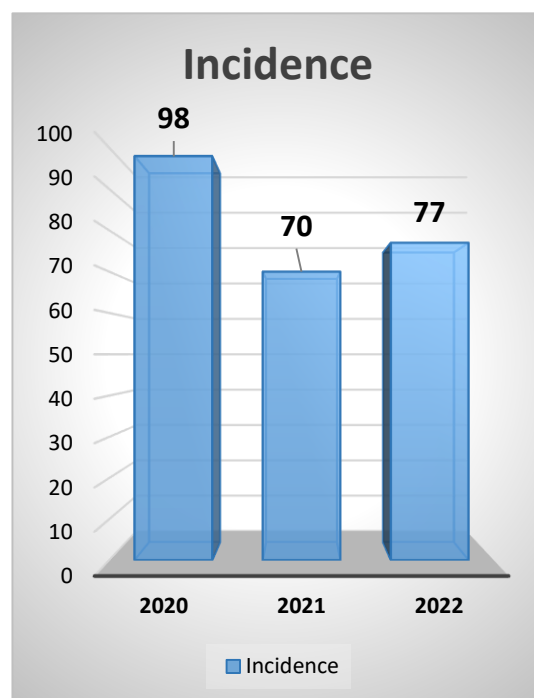

CHAPTER-11

DETECTION UNDER NARCOTIC DRUGS & PSYCHOTROPIC SUBSTANCES (ND&PS) ACT

11.1 Drug Menace in Himachal Pradesh:-

The State of Himachal Pradesh is well known for its natural beauty and is one of the most popular tourist destinations in the world. Unfortunately, this beautiful State has also come to be known for illicit cultivation of cannabis and opium poppy. Illicit drugs produced in the State attract drug traffickers. Generally, the youth seem to be the target of this drug menace and its abuse. Drug abuse and the drug menace is the illicit, non-medical use of limited number of substances. Most of such drugs have the properties of altering the mental state of a being in ways that are considered by social norms and defined by statute to be inappropriate, undesirable, harmful threatening to the life of the user and to the society at large. Heroin, cocaine, opium, Charas, are some of the drugs abused.

In Himachal Pradesh, there are 17495 villages out of which in 402 villages of the following five Districts cannabis grows naturally. Analysis reveals that these five districts of the State have been identified by the drug traffickers for cultivation and transporting of Cannabis:

Narcotic Drugs:

The term 'narcotic' originally referred medically to any psychoactive compound with numbing or paralyzing properties. In large doses, such drugs can cause stupor (condition of insensibility), coma or convulsion. These would include:

- (i) Cannabis preparations like Bhang, Ganja and Charas.
- (ii) Opium and Opium alkaloids like morphine.
- (iii) Coca alkaloids like Cocaine.
- (iv) Synthetic narcotic drugs like Pethidine.

11.2 Psychotropic Drugs:

The Greek word Psycho means "Soul" and "Trope" means 'Turning', and drug having peculiar affinity for or effect on mind (Mind altering). The psychotropic drugs include:

- 1) Hallucinogens: There are both natural and synthetic Drugs like LSD (Lysergic acid Diethylamide) and tetrahydrocannabinols.

- 2) **Hypnotics:** Secobarbitone, Phenobarbitone.
- 3) **Stimulants:** These drugs induce and excitement in the body like amphetamines cocaine.
- 4) **Tranquillizers:** Methaqualone, Mandrax, etc.

11.3 Depressants: Under this class would fall drugs which are pain killers, analgesics, sedatives, like barbiturates and opiates.

- Opium

- Codeine
- Heroin
- Cocaine
- Cannabis
- Ganja
- Hashish
- Marijuana
- Synthetic Drugs

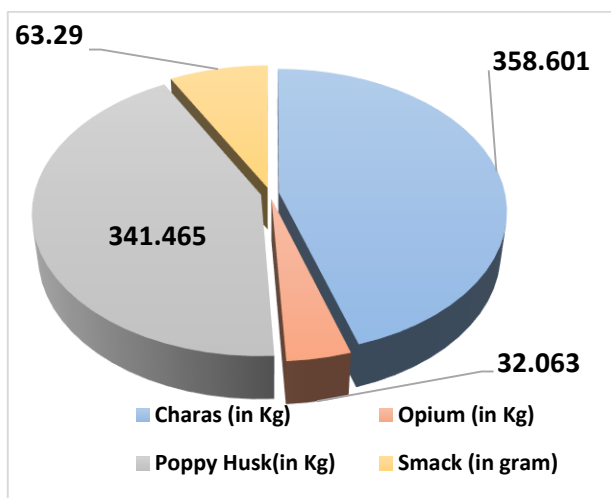

The drug-wise detection during the year 2022 according to the above mentioned table is presented in the **Chart 11.1**. The major detection of Charas (358.601 kgs.), has been made during the year 2022 followed by Poppy Husk (341.465 kgs), Ganja (165.826 kgs), Opium (32.063 kgs). Detection of other drugs i.e. Smack/ heroin etc. has also been made during the year 2022.

11.6 Detailed Analysis:

The incidence (1516) under the ND&PS Act showed a decrease of 1.36% over 2021. Cases under this Act contributed 26.03% against the total Local & Special Law reported cases during the year 2022. The highest number of cases (239) under this head were reported in

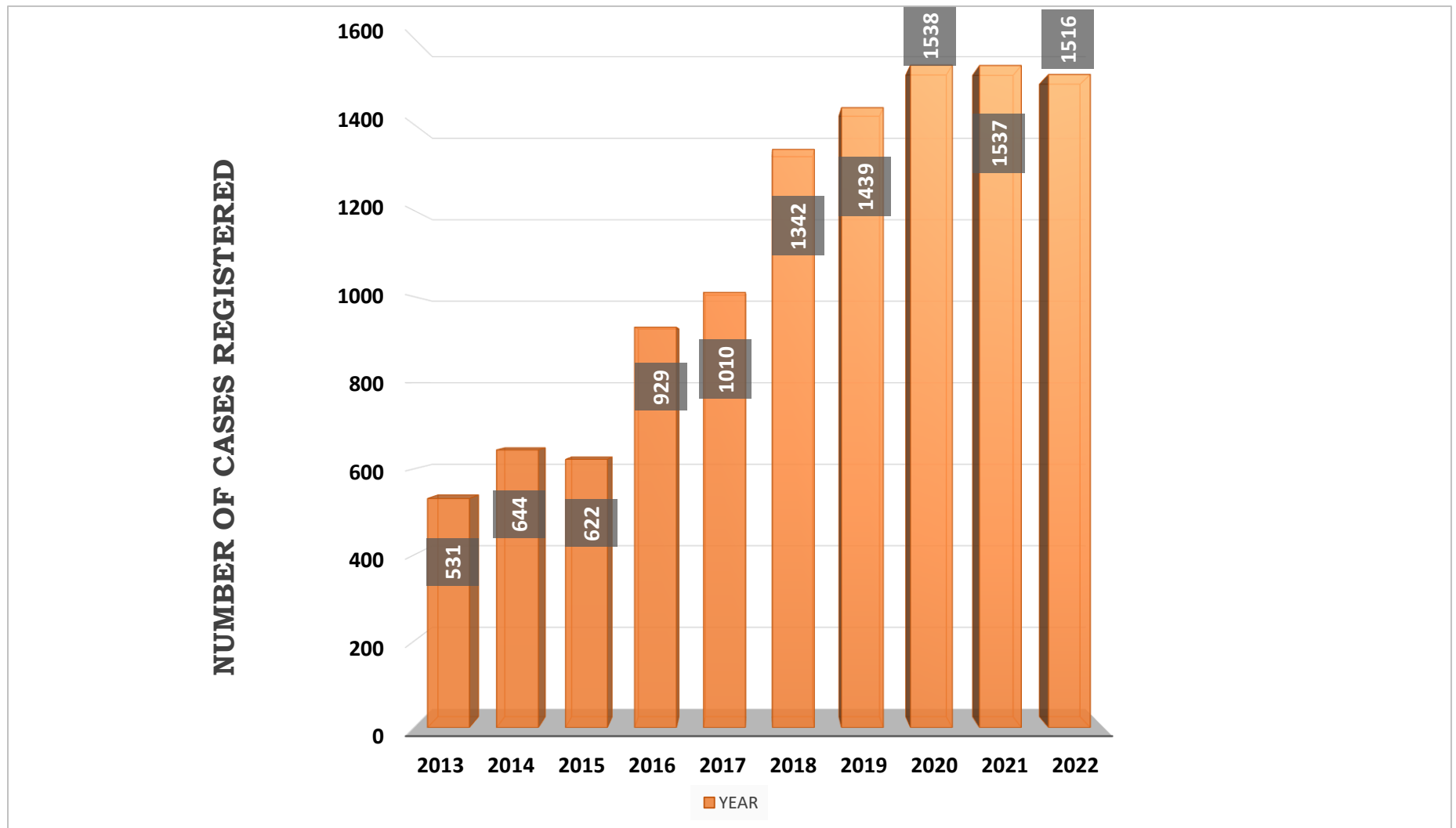
District Shimla, followed by Mandi (212), Bilaspur (192), Kullu (186), Kangra (170), Solan (90), Chamba (89), Una (84), Sirmaur (81), Hamirpur (79), Baddi (54), Kinnaur (34), Lahaul & Spiti (6).

The main concentration on the cases registered under this Act remains in Shimla, Kullu, Kangra and Mandi districts, with 54.64% of the total registered cases. The analysis reveals that the main source/area of drugs are districts Shimla, Mandi Bilaspur & Kullu. Further, carriers of this contraband are mostly agriculturists, laborers and poor people.

Study of age profile shows that mostly adults between 18-30 years of age are involved (48.79%). About 42.28% were in the age group of 30-45 years. Above 45 years were 8.27%.

The participation of children below 18 years is negligible (0.64%). Total 46 foreigners were involved in this activity. Previous 10 years (2013-2022) crime under this head is presented in **Chart-11.1**

POLICE STRENGTH, INFRASTRUCTURE AND EXPENDITURE

12.1 Police Strength:

The sanctioned strength of the Police personnel in Himachal Pradesh during the year 2022 was 20190, while actual strength is 17446. Total strength of (GOs) Class-I is 335, which includes 94 IPS and 193 HPS. Total Class-II GOs are 30. The strength of executive force is 18613, which includes 2294 NGOs Grade-I: Inspectors (307), Sub-Inspectors (771) Assistant Sub-Inspectors

(1216). The strength of Head Constables and Constables is 16309, (HCs-3114 and Const.-13145). The strength of ministerial staff (Class-III) is 371, Class-IV 558. The rank wise detailed sanctioned position and actual strength is presented in **Table 12.1**.

The strength of Women Police Inspector (18), Sub-Inspector (19), ASI (40), HC (97) and Constable (2213) is presented in **Table 12.2**.

12.2 Police Districts and Sub-divisions:

During the year 2022, there were 1 Zone, 3 Ranges (Northern, Southern & Central), 14 Districts (including two Police Districts at Baddi & Nurpur), 34 Police Sub-Divisions, 142 Police Stations (including 2 Police Stations of GRP and four Police Stations of CID. Detailed summary is given in **Table 12.2**.

12.3 Police Budget:

The budget allocation for Police department in Himachal Pradesh for the last 3 years is depicted in **Table 12.3**. During the budget year 2022-23, Himachal Pradesh Police Budget accounted for 2.87% of the total budget for Himachal Pradesh.

12.5 Equipment & Transport:

The district wise number and type of available equipment with Himachal Pradesh, during 2022 are presented in **Table 12.4**. There are 51 HF Sets, 998 VHF Sets, 2171 Walkie Talkies and 108 other equipment's available with the Himachal Police Department.

At present the total available (fleet) strength in Himachal Pradesh Police is 561 Motor Cycles, 227 (Gypsy/ Jeep/ Bolero/ Tata Mobiles), 25 Heavy Vehicles and 08 Vans & others. The district wise details are given in **Table 12.5** and **Table 12.6**.

GLOSSARY

Arrest Rate:

Number of arrests per lakh of population.

Charge Sheet Rate:

Percentage of cases charge sheeted to cases in which investigations were completed.

Cognizable Offences:

A cognizable case means a case in which, a police officer may in accordance with the first schedule of the Code of Criminal Procedure 1973 or under any other Law for the time being in force, arrest without warrant.

Conviction Rate:

Percentage of cases that resulted in conviction to the number of cases in which trials were completed during a year.

Crime Against Women:

Rape, Dowry deaths, molestation, Cruelty by husband and relatives, Sexual harassment, Kidnapping & abduction of women and girls, dowry Prohibition Act.

Crime Rate:

Incidence of crime per lakh of population.

Disposal Rate by Police:

Percentage of cases investigated and Final Report presented in court to total cases meant for investigation during the year.

Disposal Rate by Courts:

Percentage of cases disposed to total cases pending/trial during a year.

Indian Penal Code:

A Penal Code for India listing out the offences and their punishments (Act No. XLV of 1860).

Local Law:

A law applicable only to a particular state/part of India.

Offence:

The word offence means any act or omission made punishable by any law for the time being in force.

Property Offence:

Includes Burglary, Theft, Dacoity and Robbery.

Special law:

A law applicable to a particular subject.
