

CHAPTER-1

INCIDENCE AND RATE OF COGNIZABLE CRIMES IN HIMACHAL PRADESH

1.1 General:

The Himachal Pradesh is a hilly and peaceful state. There are sporadic incidents of crime taking place, but no particular area of any district of this State is notorious for any class or category of crime. There has not been any abnormal fluctuation in the incidence of crime in the State.

The crime situation has remained peaceful and well under control during the year 2014 throughout the State of Himachal Pradesh. No alarming increase was noticed under any major head of crime.

1.2. The Parameters for Review and Analysis of Crime:-

The following parameters have been adopted while analyzing the crime for the year 2014:-

- Geographical spread.
- Reasons for commission of crime especially in offences against persons.
- Investigative process followed.
- Recovery of property.
- Profile of criminals.

1.3. Reported Incidence of Cognizable Crimes:

The ten years trends of incidence and rate of total cognizable crime under Indian Penal Code (IPC) and Local and Special Laws (2013-2014) is presented in Table-1.2 at the end of the chapter Total numbers of 17122 cognizable crime cases were reported during the year 2014. This comprise of 14160 cases under IPC and 2962 cases under (SLL) Local & Special Law. (Table-1.1 and Chart-1.1 & 1.2)

FOR THE LAST 10 YEAR (2005-2014)




1.4. Crime Trends:

1.4.1. Crime Incidence:

During the year 2014, cases of cognizable crime have increased by 8.83% (1389) as compared to the registration of cognizable crime cases of the corresponding year. The registration in IPC crimes have recorded an increase of 3% and Special & Local Laws crime have recorded an increase of 49.4% in 2014 as compared to the previous year 2013.

Total 14160 IPC cases were reported in the State during the year 2014, as against 13750 cases of 2013 (3% increase). District Kangra, Mandi and Shimla have recorded crime incidence between 1500 to 3000 IPC cases in each, district Bilaspur and Una have recorded crime between 1000 to 1500 IPC cases each, Baddi, Chamba, Hamirpur, Kullu, Sirmaur and Solan have recorded crime between 500 to 1000 IPC cases each. The crime in districts Kinnaur, Lahaul & Spiti, Railway & Traffic Unit and CID Unit have remain below the figure of 300 cases. The district wise detailed volume of crime is depicted in the Table-1.3.

1.4.2. District-wise IPC Crimes Trends:

The highest incidence of IPC cases was reported in District Kangra (2698 cases) followed by Shimla (1957), Mandi (1939), Bilaspur (1185) Una (1083), Solan (947), Kullu (914), Sirmaur (872), Hamirpur (845), Chamba (761), Baddi (651), Kinnaur (211) and Lahaul & Spiti (84). The detail of number of districts falling under different ranges with incidence of IPC crimes during the year 2014 is presented in Table-1.3.

1.5. Crime Pattern: (IPC Crimes)

As compared to 2013, this year incidences of Murder, Culpable Homicide, Rape, Robbery, molestation, Dowry Death and Other IPC cases have shown increase while Attempt to murder,


Kidnapping & abduction, Dacoity, Burglary, Theft, Hurt and Rioting cases have reported a decrease.

1.6. Crime Rate:

The Crime Rate, District wise is presented in Table-1.4. The average IPC Crime Rate in the State for 2014 was 206.5. The Crime Rate was the highest in Bilaspur (310.2) followed by Solan(295.5), Lahaul & Spiti (266.4), Baddi (254.1), Kinnaur (250.3), Shimla (240.6), Kullu (208.9) and Una (207.8) The lowest crime rate were found to be in districts Chamba (146.7), Sirmaur (164.5), Kangra (179.0), Hamirpur (146.0) and Mandi (194.0). 1.7. Head Wise Analysis of IPC Offences:


The head wise analysis of IPC offences is presented in Table-1.5. The head wise statistics indicates the following trends:-

(i) Murder: (Increase 25 %)

The incidence of murder (130) in 2014 increased by 25 % as compared to the previous year 2013. Highest incidence of murder was reported in Kangra (30 cases) district, contributing 0.18 % of the total cases. Other districts which reported more than 10 cases were Shimla (18), Mandi (15), Baddi (13) and Hamirpur (12). The lowest incidence of murder was reported in districts Kullu and Una (9 each), Chamba (8), Sirmaur (6), Solan (5), Bilaspur (4), Kinnaur, Lahaul & Spiti (2 each) and GRP (1). Previous 10 Years (2005-2014) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.4.

The analysis of the causes has revealed that no organized gang was operating in the State. In most of these cases crime was committed due to land disputes or murder for gain or personal enmity. Generally, sudden provocation or minor altercations were the reasons for commission of most of the murders. There was no class or caste factor involved in the commission of murder.






(ii) Attempt to commit Murder: (Decrease 10%)

The incidence (63) of Attempt to Commit Murder during this year has decreased by 10 percent. The higher incidence of cases under this head was reported in Shimla (15) followed by Kangra (11), Bilaspur (9), Mandi (6) and Chamba (5). The lowest incidence under this head was reported in Hamirpur, Kullu (4 each), Baddi and Sirmaur (3 each), Una (2) and solan (1). No incidence under this head was reported in Kinnaur and Lahaul & Spiti districts. Previous 10 Years (2005-2014) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.5.

DURING (2005-2014)




(iii). C.H. not Amounting to Murder: (increased 50%)

9 cases of Culpable Homicide not Amounting to Murder were reported during the year, showing an increase of 50% percent over the previous year (6 cases). The highest incidence (3 cases) was reported in Shimla district followed by Kangra and Una (2 each), Chamba and Sirmaur (1 each). No incidence under this head was

reported in remaining districts of the state. Previous 10 Years (2005-2014) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.6.


CHART-1.6

(iv). Rape: (Increase 13.2%)

Total 283 cases of Rape were reported which has shown an increase of 13.2 percent during 2014 over previous year 2013 (250 cases). The highest incidence of rape was reported in Mandi (47) followed by Kangra (43), Shimla (39), Sirmaur (28), Chamba, Una (23 each), Kullu, Solan (16 each), Bilaspur (15), Hamirpur (13), Kinnaur (10), Baddi (9) and CID (1). No incidence under this head was reported in district Lahaul & Spiti. Previous 10 Years (2005-2014) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1. 7.



(v). Kidnapping and abduction: (Decrease 13.64 %)

During the year 2014 a total number of 304 cases of Kidnapping and Abduction were reported with a decrease of 13.64 percent as compared to previous year 2013. The highest incidences were reported in Bilaspur and Mandi (46 each) followed by Shimla (39), Kangra (32), Kullu, Solan (24 each), Chamba (20), (Sirmaur (19), Hamirpur (18), Una (16) and Baddi (14). The lowest number of cases was reported in Kinnaur (5) and Lahaul & Spiti (1). Previous 10 Years (2005-2014) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.8.

DURING (2005-2014)




(vi). Dacoity

Total 4 cases of Dacoity were reported during the year 2014 as compared to 14 cases of previous year. One each incidence under this head was reported in Kangra, Mandi, Solan and Una. No incidence under this head was reported in remaining districts of State. Previous 10 Years (2005-2014) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.9.

(vii). Robbery

During the year 2014, 16 cases of Robbery were registered in the State. The highest incidence was reported in Shimla (6) followed by Baddi (3), Kangra, Sirmaur (2 each), Chamba, Kinnaur and Una (1 each). No case under this head was reported in rest of the districts of State. Previous 10 Years (2005-2014) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.9.

(viii). Burglary: (Decrease 5.16%)

The incidence of Burglary (884) recorded a decrease with 5.16% during the year 2014 as compared with 2013. The highest number of Burglary cases (149) was reported in Shimla district followed by Kangra (141), Solan (104), Chamba (98), Mandi (76), Kullu (55) and Sirmaur (50). The remaining districts have reported less than 50 cases under this head. The crime rate was the highest at 47.45 in Kinnaur district and the lowest at 3017 in Lahaul & Spiti district as against the State average of 12.89. Previous 10 Years (2005-2014) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.10.

(ix). Theft: (Decrease 20.3%)

The incidence of Theft (652) recorded a decrease of 20.3% during the year 2014 over the previous year. Shimla district has reported highest incidence (116 cases) followed by Kangra (107),

Solan (73) and Mandi (57). The remaining districts have reported less than 50 cases. The crime rate was the highest in Solan (22.78) district

and the lowest (3.17) in Lahaul & Spiti district as against the State average of 9.51. Previous 10 Years (2005-2014) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.11.

INCIDENCE OF BURGLARY DURING (2005-2014)






CHART-1.11

(x). Riots: (Decrease 1.85%)

Incidence of Riots (478) registered during the year 2014 recorded a minor decrease of 1.85% over the previous year 2013. The highest incidence was reported from Shimla, Kangra (78 each) districts followed by Mandi (51), Baddi (42), Sirmaur (41), Chamba, Una (38 each), Bilaspur (36), Solan (30) and Kullu (26). The lowest number of cases was reported in Hamirpur (14) and Kinnaur (6). No incidence under this head was reported in Lahaul & Spiti district. Previous 10 Years (2005-2014) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.12.

(xi). Grievous Hurt

A total number of 593 cases under head Grievous Hurt were reported during 2014. However, 1157 cases of simple Hurt and Grievous hurt were registered during 2013. Kangra district has reported the highest incidence (117) under head grievous hurt followed by Una (67), Kullu (66), Mandi (65), Chamba (59), Bilaspur (54), Hamirpur (46), Shimla (35), Sirmaur (33), Solan (21) and Baddi (17). The least number of cases were reported in Kinnaur (12) and

Lahaul & Spiti (1). Previous 10 Years (2005-2014) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.13.

INCIDENCE OF HURT DURING (2005-2014)






CHART-1.14

(xii). Dowry Death

Only 1 case under this head was reported in Una district as compare to 2 cases of previous year. Previous 10 Years (2005-2014) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.14.

INCIDENCE OF MOLESTATION DURING (2005-2014)




(xiii). Molestation: (Increase 9.13 %)

538 cases were reported during the year, showing an increase of 9.13% over the previous year. 101 cases were reported in Mandi District followed by Kangra (79), Bilaspur (72), Shimla (64), Sirmaur (46), Kullu (35), Hamirpur (32), Solan, Una (31 each) and Chamba (27). The lowest number of cases were reported in Baddi (15) and Kinnaur (5). No incidence under this head was reported in Lahaul & Spiti District. Previous 10 Years (2005-2014) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.15.

(xiv). Cruelty to women: (Decrease 0.91%)

325 cases were reported during the year, showing a decrease of 0.91 % over the previous year. 62 cases were reported in Una district followed by Mandi (50), Kangra (46), Hamirpur, Shimla (27 each), Bilaspur (25), Sirmaur (24), Kullu (21), Baddi (19) and Solan (12). The lowest number of cases were reported in districts Chamba (9) and Kinnaur (3). No incidence under this head was reported in Lahaul & Spiti District. Previous 10 Years (2005-2014) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.16.

(xv). Accidents: (Increase 2.6%)

3058 cases were reported during the year, showing an increase of 2.6% as compared to the previous year. 511 cases were reported in Kangra district followed by Shimla (415), Mandi (401), Solan (283), Una (263), Sirmaur (238), Bilaspur (228), Baddi (200), Kullu (166) and Hamirpur (152). The lowest number of cases were reported in Chamba (139) followed by Kinnaur (48) and Lahaul &

Spiti (14). Previous 10 Years (2005-2014) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.17.

(xvi). Other IPC Crimes: (Increase 18.77 %)

Cognizable IPC Crimes which do not fall under any of the above specified categories are termed as "Other IPC Crimes". As many as 6822 other IPC crimes accounting for 48.2% of the total IPC crimes were registered in the State during 2014. Total 48.2% incidence of other IPC were reported in the State against the total IPC crime.

Incidence of IPC Crimes (Head-wise) along with percentage share is presented in Table-1.6. Ten year trend in percentage change (head-wise) is presented in Table-1.7. District-wise and head wise details of IPC offences are available in Table-1.8 and Table-1.9. Previous 10 Years (2005-2014) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.18 and percentage of Other IPC cases against IPC cases for the last 10 years is presented in Chart. 1.19.

INCIDENCE OF OTHER IPC DURING (2005-2014)



IPC FOR THE LAST 10 YEAR (2005-2014)




1.8 Crimes Under Local And Special Laws:

A list of Special and Local Laws is available at the Annexure-1. Incidence and rate of cognizable LOCAL & SPECIAL LAW crimes during 2005 to 2014 are presented in Table-1.10.

A total of 2962 cognizable LOCAL & SPECIAL LAW (SLL) crimes were registered in the State during 2014. The head-wise percentage distribution of various cognizable crimes under Local & Special Law for 10 years from 2005 to 2014 is presented in Table-1.11. There is an increase of 49.4% in registration over the previous year.

The crime head-wise incidence and rate of cognizable Local & Special Law crimes in different districts are presented in Table-1.12.

Incidence of Local & Special Law cases under important Special and Local Laws is discussed below:-

1.8.1 Head Wise Analysis of SLL Offences:

(i) Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act (ND&PS) : (Increase 21.3%)

The Incidence of (644) under the ND&PS Act showed an increase of 21.3% over 2013. Cases under this Act constituted 21.8% against the total Local & Special Law reported cases during the year 2014. The highest incidence (143) under this head were reported in Mandi district followed by Kullu (103), Shimla (72), Kangra (58), Chamba (56), CID (55), Sirmaur (40), Una (29), Baddi (26), Bilaspur (24), Hamirpur (23), Solan (12) and Kinnaur (3). No case under this Act was reported in Lahaul & Spiti District.


The main concentration on the incidence registered under this Act remains on District Mandi and Kullu with 38.2 % of the total registered cases. The analysis reveals that the main source / area of

drugs are Kullu, Mandi, Kangra, Shimla and Chamba. Further couriers of this contraband are mostly agriculturists, laborers and poor people.

Of the total persons apprehended under this Act, 78.2 % belong to Himachal Pradesh and 21.8% were outsiders. Study of age profile shows that mostly adults between 18-30 years of age are involved (47.8%). About 38.3% were in the age group of 30-45 years. Above 45 years were 13.9%.

The participation of children below 18 years is negligible (1.5%). Only two Foreigners were involved in this activity. Previous 10 Years (2005-2014) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.21

DETECTION UNDER ND&PS ACT DURING (2005-2014)




(ii). Excise Act: (Increase 102.4%)

The incidence (1492) under the Excise Act showed a huge increase of 102.4% over 2013. Cases under this Act contributed 50%

against the total LOCAL & SPECIAL LAW (SLL) reported cases during the year 2014. The highest incidence (315) cases were reported in Mandi district followed by Kangra (294), Kullu (153), Chamba (131), Sirmaur (101), Shimla (91), Una (76), Baddi (67), Hamirpur (62), Solan (58), Bilaspur (57), and PS CID (41). The lowest incidence under this Act was seen in Lahaul-Spiti (38), Kinnaur (7) and GRP (1). Previous 10 Years (2005-2014) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.22

DETECTION UNDER EXCISE ACT DURING (2005-2014)




□ DETECTION UNDER EXCISE ACT

(iii). Forest Act: (Decrease 13.55%)

The Incidence of (134) under the Forest Act showed a decrease of 13.55% over 2013. Chamba districts have reported the highest incidence (18) followed by Kullu (17), Kangra, Mandi (16 each), Sirmaur (11), Shimla (10), Bilaspur and Una (9 each), PS CID (8), Baddi (6) and Kinnaur (5). The lowest incidence under this Act was seen in Solan (4), Hamirpur, GRP (2 each) and Lahaul & Spiti (1),

The analysis reveals that majority of cases have been registered in Districts Chamba, Kullu Kangra, Mandi and Sirmaur. The encroachment on Forest Land, forest produce involved is timber, fuel wood, Guchhi, Resin, Walnut bark, Brich Bark, Brahmi leave and other herbal plants etc. Previous 10 Years (2005-2014) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.23.

(iv). Protection of Civil Rights Act.

7 cases were registered under Protection of Civil Rights Act in Bilaspur, Kinnaur, Mandi (2 each) and Baddi (1). No case under this Act was reported in rest of the districts of the State. Previous 10 Years (2005-2014) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.24.

(v) SC/ST (Prevention of Atrocities) Act.

97 cases were registered under the SC/ST Prevention of Atrocities Act as against 84 cases of previous year. The highest incidence (19 each) cases were reported in Mandi and Shimla districts followed by Kangra (13), Sirmaur(12), Hamirpur (11), Una (10), Bilaspur (5), Chamba, Kullu (3 each. The lowest incidence under this


Act was seen in Baddi and Solan districts (1 each). No incidence under this Act was reported in Kinnaur and Lahaul & Spiti districts.

The analysis reveals that crime under this head is high in districts Mandi, Shimla, Kangra, Sirmaur and Hamirpur. The most common reason for registering cases under these Acts is a feeling of being hurt when one is called by derogatory name. This comprises of 59% of the total cases registered. 17% of the cases were registered because of land and water disputes. 5% were registered due to not allowing access to temples. The remaining were for election related matters and miscellaneous reasons. Previous 10 Years (2005-2014) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.24.

(vi) Other Local & Special Law Cases: (including Arms Act, Gambling Act, Wild life Act, PDP Act, EC Act etc)

588 Local & Special Law cases reported come under the Acts mentioned above. These have shown an increase of 24.6% over the previous year. The highest incidence was reported from district Una (138).

During 2014 total number of 2962 cognizable crimes were reported in the state under various heads of (SLL) Local & Special Laws which shows an increase of 49.4% of the previous year.

It is observed that 5 specified crime heads accounted for 80 % of the total SLL crimes while the remaining 20% were clubbed as other SLL crimes. Previous 10 Years (2005-2014) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.25

CASES DURING (2005-2014)




RATE OF COGNIZABLE CRIMES (IPC) DURING – 2014



INCIDENCE OF COGNIZABLE CRIMES (IPC) DURING - 2014



INCIDENCE OF COGNIZABLE CRIMES (SLL) DURING – 2014



CHAPTER-2

INCIDENCE OF CRIME AGAINST PROPERTY AND PERSONS IN HIMACHAL PRADESH

2.1 Crime against Property:

Offences under this head include the cases of **Theft**, **Burglary**, **Robbery & Dacoity**. The head wise analysis of crime against property has been done for the year 2014 and given as under:-

(i) Theft and Burglary:

During the year 2014, 652 cases of theft and 884 cases of burglary were found registered which showed a decrease of 166 cases in theft and 48 cases in burglary over the year 2013. The cases of both these heads have been categorized under major head namely:-Auto theft, theft of Cash and Jewellery, Cable theft, theft of electronic items and theft of other materials.

Incidence of theft cases is concentrated mostly in the 4 districts i.e Shimla Kangra, Mandi, and Solan. The analysis further shows that most of the cases took place in rural areas, Shimla being an exception 62 % of the persons involved in these crimes were local residents, 38 % being outsiders.

As far as the age profile goes 53 % of those involved in theft cases are in the age group of 18 to 30 years. 47.3% involved in burglary are also of the same age group.

(ii) Robbery and Dacoity:

During the year 2014, 20 each cases of robbery and dacoity were found registered. The cases of robbery is concentrated only in 4 districts namely; Shimla (6), Baddi (3) Kangra and Sirmaur

(2 each). On the other hand dacoity is concentrated only in 4 districts namely; Kangra, Mandi, Solan and Una (1 each).

2.2 Value of Property Stolen and Recovered:

During the year 2014, property valued 2276.99 lakhs was reported stolen in 1556 cases as compared to 1594.30 lakhs in 1778 cases for the corresponding year.


Property worth Rs. 826.5 lakhs was recovered during 2014. The percentage of recovery is 36%. The value of property recovered showed an increase of 9% over the previous year.

The details of property stolen and recovered, along with the percentage of recovery from the last 10 years (2005 to 2014) and variation are given in Table 2.1.

The Chart 2.1 depicts the value of property stolen and recovered during 2005 to 2014.


VALUE OF PROPERTY STOLEN AND RECOVERED DURING THE PERIOD 2005-2014

District Kangra reported the highest value of property stolen (Rs. 4,82,77,729/-) followed by Baddi (Rs.3,84,31,558/-), Shimla (Rs. 3,16,04,450/-), Solan (Rs.2,43,13,986/-), Una (Rs. 1,97,57,785/-), Kullu (Rs. 1,58,38,583/-), Bilaspur (Rs.1,38,04,379/-) and Mandi (Rs. 1,1961,766/-). Rest of Districts reported less than 1 crore value of property stolen.


The highest value of recovery was seen from Police District Baddi (Rs. 2,18,86,938/-) followed by Shimla (Rs. 1,05,00,993/-), Kangra (Rs. 87,31,292/-), Solan (Rs. 86,47,975/-) and Bilaspur (Rs. 82,74,196/-).

In Lahaul Spiti District 100 % of the stolen property was recovered followed by Chamba (63%), Bilaspur (59.9 %), Baddi (57.0%) and Mandi (48.7%).

2.3 Category of Offences (Incidence and Value):

Among 4 different types of property crimes, the maximum value of property (Rs.1165.40 Lakhs) and share (51.20%) were seen under head Burglary. The minimum value of Rs. 4.58 Lakhs and share (0.6%) was seen under the category of crime under Robbery.

The maximum value of property was recovered in Theft cases (75.8%) followed by Burglary (23%) Dacoity (0.7%) and Robbery

(0.6%). The Theft cases have shown a high recovery percentage (57.8%) followed by Dacoity (38.2%), Robbery (35.3%) and Burglary (16.3%). The crime head-wise value of property stolen and recovered over the last 10 years (2005 to 2015) is presented in Table 2.4.

2.4 Nature of Property:

Nature of property under head theft and burglary have been classified into four different categories viz. Auto Theft, Theft of cash and Jewellery, Cable theft, Theft of electronic items. Properties other than the above specified categories are clubbed as Other theft. The category wise number of cases in which property was found stolen and recovered therein and percentage thereof has been calculated and presented in Table 2.5.

2.5 Cultural Property:

Total Rs 61.54 lakhs worth of Cultural Property was stolen during 2014 in 38 cases. This constitutes 2.7% of total property lost. Statistics of Cultural Property stolen during 2014 are available in Table 2.6. The highest incidence 18 cases were reported in Shimla district followed by Mandi and Solan (7 each), Sirmaur (5) and Kullu (1).

Cases, where the most valuable properties were stolen, were reported in Shimla District property worth (Rs.46,60,000/-) stolen in 18 cases). In Solan District, in 7 cases properties worth Rs.3,40,000/- were stolen.

The value of the property stolen by nature of property district wise during 2014, is presented in Table 2.6

CRIME HEAD WISE PERCENTAGE OF PROPERTY RECOVERED DURING THE YEAR 2014



(WORKED OUT) -2014




2.6 Crime Against Persons:-

The crime against persons includes occenfes 10 different types of crime heads viz. Murder, Culpable Homicide not Amounting to Murder, Attempt to Murder, Rape, Kid & Abd., Hurt, Rioting, Cruelty to Women, Molestation and Dowry deaths.

The analysis reveals that total 2724 incidence of crime against persons have occurred during the years 2013, which shows 19% of the total IPC Crime. The highest percentage of crime against persons over the total IPC recorded in district Chamba with 25 % followed by Sirmaur (23.2%), Una (23.1%), Bilaspur and Kullu (22% each), Kinnaur (20.4%), Baddi (20.3 %), Hamirpur and Mandi (19.6% each). The district-wise detail has been calculated and presented in Table 2.7. The district-wise incidence and their percentage over the IPC crime is depicted in Chart 2.5

CRIME AGAINST PERSONS FOR THE 10 YEARS (2005-2014)




The incidence crime against persons has been recorded highest in district Kangra (434) followed by district Mandi (381), Shimla (318), Bilaspur (261), Una (251), Sirmaur, Kullu (201 each), Chamba (190), Hamirpur (166), Solan (140), Baddi (132), Kinnaur (43) Lahaul & Spiti

(4), GRP and CID (1 each) The District-wise detail has been calculated and presented in Table 2.8.

The head-wise comparative analysis of incidence of crime against persons for the last 10 years (2005 to 2014) has been reviewed. During the year 2014, 2724 incidence has been recorded which showed a decrease of 523 cases over the previous year. The head-wise detailed figures for the last 10 years are depicted in Table 2.9. Chart 2.6 depicts the total crime against persons and its percentage over the total IPC Crime

The head-wise reported incidence of crime against persons and its review over the previous year has been analyzed and given as under:

(i) Murder:

During the year 2014, 130 incidence of "Murder" were reported which showed an increase of 26 cases over the previous year. Analysis of the causes has revealed that no organized gang was operating in the State. In most of these cases crime were committed due to land disputes or murder for gain or personal enmity. Generally, sudden provocation or minor altercation was the reasons for commission of most of the murders. There was no class or caste factor involved in the commission of murder.

(ii) Attempt to Murder:

63 incidence of "Attempt to Murder" were reported during the year 2014 against the annual average of about 66 cases. The motive for the commission of this crime is also the same as mentioned under head 'Murder'

(iii) C.H. not Amounting to Murder:

Only 9 incidence of "C.H. not Amounting to Murder" were reported during the year 2014 which showed an increase of 3 case over the previous year.

(iv) Rape:

283 incidence of "Rape" were reported during the year 2014 which showed an increase of 33 cases over the previous year.

(v) Kidnapping and Abduction:-

During the year 2013, 304 cases were registered which showed a decrease of 48 case over the previous year. The analysis shows that about 53.7% incidence of "Kid-Abd." are reported in 4 districts i.e. Bilaspur, Mandi, Shimla and Kangra. The remaining 46.3% cases were reported in the rest of 9 districts of the State.

(vi) Grievous Hurt:

Total 593 incidence of "Grievous Hurt" were reported during 2014. The analysis shows that about 53 % incidence of Grievous hurt are reported in 4 districts i.e. Kangra, Una, Kullu and Mandi. The remaining 47% cases were reported in the rest of 9 districts of the State.

(vii) Rioting:

During the year 2014, 478 incidence of "Rioting" were reported in the State against the 487 incidence of previous year which showed a decrease of 9 cases over the year 2013. The analysis shows that about 52 % incidence of rioting are reported in 4 districts i.e. Shimla, Kangra, Mandi and Baddi. The remaining 48% cases were reported in the rest of 9 districts of the State.

(viii) Cruelty to Women:

During the year 2014, 325 incidence of "Cruelty to Women" were reported in the State against the 328 incidence of previous year which showed a decrease of 3 cases over the year 2013. The incidence under this head has been reviewed in detail in the separate chapter "Crime against Women"

(ix) Molestation:

During the year 2014, 538 incidence of "Molestation" were reported in the State against the 493 incidence of previous year which showed an increase of 45 cases over the year 2013. The incidence under this head has been reviewed in detail in the separate chapter "Crime against Women"

(x) Dowry Deaths:

During the year 2014, 1 incidence of "Dowry Deaths" was reported in the State in Una district. No incidence under this head was reported in previous year. The incidence under this head has been reviewed in detail in the separate chapter "Crime against Women"

2.7 Overall Review of Crime Against Person:

The overall review on the incidences of crime against persons are more in districts Kangra, Mandi, Shimla and Bilaspur as compared to the other districts of the State. The reasons for commission of offences under this category are family disputes, land disputes, enmity with neighbours/villagers, domestic violence & sudden provocation.

Some of the facts that have come out during the study review are:-

- (i) Offences of murder have taken place in the entire State with no specific concentration
- (ii) 91% of the persons involved are locals, the remaining 9% being outsiders.
- (iii) 1.2% of the accused in this crime are in the age-group below 18 years, 44% of the persons involved in the commission of this crime are in the age group of 18 to 30 years, 34% belong to the category of 30-45 years and the remaining 20.8% are more than 45 years in age.

2014 (DISTRICT WISE)





TRENDS IN DISPOSAL OF IPC CRIMES AND SLL CRIMES BY POLICE AND COURTS


3.1 Disposal by Police

3.1.1 Cases under IPC:

During 2014 total number of 17088 cases including cases pending from the previous years were under investigation. Out of these, approximately 14296 cases were disposed by the Police during the year and 2792 cases remain pending for investigation.

Table-3.1 presents the details of crime head wise police disposal during 2014. Tables-3.2 & 3.3 give district wise details of disposal and percentage of disposal respectively. The percentage and type of disposal of Under Investigation (IPC) cases by police during 2014 is depicted in Chart-3.1.

Less than 58.5% of the cases relating to C.H. not amounting to murder, Cheating were disposed. They represent the lowest disposal rate. The heads under which disposal of cases remained the highest are Dowry Deaths (100%), Other IPC crimes (90.4%), Grievous Hurt (90.2%) Rape (87.6%), Cruelty by Husband & relatives (82.4% and Assaults on Women (82.1%)

3.1.2 Pendency:

On an average, 16.3% cases remained under investigation. In the following districts, pendency was the highest and the disposal lowest:-


3.1.3 Charge Sheeting Rate of IPC Crimes:

3.1.4 Case Under SLL:

BY POLICE DURING 2014





3.2.1 Cases Under IPC:

Disposal of IPC cases by Courts during 2014 is available in Table 3.7. During 2014 there were 79870 cases pending trial (including the pending cases from the previous years). 73039 of IPC

cases remained pending trial at end of the year. The percentage of disposals during the year was 8.6%.

The District wise disposal figures available in Table-3.8 and percentage of disposal is available in Table-3.9. The highest pendency percentage of cases is seen in Bilaspur District (95.2%). The largest number of cases is also pending trial in Kangra District (15422) which has a pendency of 94.7.0 %. Chart-3.5 depicts percentage disposal of IPC cases by the courts during 2014.

3.2.2 Cases Under SLL:-

Disposal of SLL cases by Courts during 2014 head wise is available in Table-3.10. There were 22510 cases pending trial (including the pending cases from the previous years) at the beginning

of 2014. Cases which remained pending trial at end of the year were 19859. The percentage of disposals is 11.8%.

Table 3.11 Shows district wise pendency and its share in the state pendency, Distt. Kangra (9085) followed by Kullu (2320), Shimla (1607) and Mandi (1423) cases. Chart-3.6 Shows percentage disposal of SLL cases by the Courts during 2014.

BY COURTS DURING 2014





DISPOSAL OF (IPC) CASES BY POLICE DURING 2014





CONVICTED CASES (IPC) DURING 2014



CONVICTED CASES (SLL) DURING 2014



CHAPTER-4

CRIMES AGAINST WOMEN

4.1 General:

Crime which are directed specifically against women are characterized as Crime against Women. They may be broadly classified under following two categories:-

1. Crimes against Women Identified under the Indian Penal Code (IPC)

- (i) Murder Sec 302,303 IPC)
- (ii) Culpable Homicide (Sec 304 IPC)
- (iii) Rape (Sec. 376 IPC)
- (iv) Dowry Deaths (Sec304B IPC)
- (v) Kidnapping & Abduction (Sec. 363,366, IPC)
- (vi) Assault on Women with intend to outrage her modesty Sec.354 IPC)
- (vii) Abetment to Commit Suicide (Sec.306 IPC)
- (viii) Cruelty to Women (Sec. 498A IPC
- (ix) Insult to the modesty of Women (Sec. 509 IPC)
- (x) Chain Snatching

2. Crimes against Women Identified under the Special and Local Laws(SLL)

Although all laws are not gender specific, the provision of law affecting women significantly have been reviewed periodically and amendments carried out to keep pace with the emerging requirements. Some Acts which have special provisions to safeguard women and their interests are

- (i) Immoral Traffic (Prevention) Act
- (ii) Dowry Prohibition Act, 1961
- (iii) The Child Marriage Restrain Act.
- (iv) Indecent Representation of Women (Prohibition) Act

(v) Satti Prevention Act.

The Crimes against Women are being closely monitored in the State. Several measures have been undertaken to tackle this social menace. On one hand, special attention is being paid towards prevention of crimes against women by increased police vigil and by harnessing the resources of the community.

Crime against women has minor increased during the year 2014 in comparison to the previous year. This is due to the fact that in past the women usually hesitated to report the unfortunate incidents, which took place with them and also due to change of law. But now on account of increased awareness and change in social values, ethos, social reassurances being provided by the society, free registration of cases and Suvidha Yojna started by the HP, Police Department, Women are more often coming forward to report the offences taking place against them.

HP Police Department has initiated many steps in the recent years to ensure better Police response to the malaise. Two Police Stations have been opened at Shimla and Dharamshala to monitor quick disposal of cases of crime against women. A Women Crime Unit has also been constituted at State CID Hdqrs. 2 AHTU's have also been established in Shimla & Kangra in first phase. No particular area is prone to the incidence of such crime in this state. No special organized gang is operative in the state to commit crime against women. In a nutshell, a complete sense of security is prevailing among women folk and they are performing their daily chores without any fear.

4.2 Incidence of Crime Against Women:

Head wise incidence of reported Crimes Against Women during 2013 and 2014 along with percentage variation are given below has been calculated and presented in Table 4.1. The cases of assault on Women with intend to outrage her modesty and Cruelty to Women together constitute the largest chunk of crime against women (52.5 %). There were substantial number of instances (17.2%) of rape and (13.8 %) Kidnapping and abduction of women and girls.

The district wise incidence and rate of crimes against women during 2014 is presented in Table 4.2 and Chart 4.3 and Chart 4.4.

WOMEN DURING 2014




DURING 2014





DISTRICT WISE CRIMES AGAINST WOMEN

From the analysis of Crime Against Women reported in districts, it is seen that cases of Assault on Women with intend to outrage her modesty (sec.354), Cruelty to Women, Rape, Kidnapping & Abduction, Abetment to Commit Suicide and abetment to suicide are found reported more in the State during the year 2014. The district remained most prevalent in these incidents is Kangra, Mandi,, Shimla, Bilaspur, Una, Sirmaur and Hamirpur. The cases of murder remained highest in the District Kangra, Mandi, Shimla and Una.

The district which indicate the lowest incidence of crime against women are Lahaul-Spiti (4) Kinnaur (23), Baddi (64) Kullu (79), Solan (84) & Chamba(95).

4.3 Head wise incidence of Crime Against Women:

The brief explanation of head wise status of crime against women during the years 2014 is given as under:

(i) Murder: (Increase 50%)

Incidence of Murder cases (42) registered during the year 2014 showed an increase of 50 % over the previous year. Kangra (11 cases) district reported the highest incidence of Murder under this head followed by Mandi (6), Shimla(5), Una (4), Baddi, Hamirpur (3 each), Bilaspur, Kullu, Sirmaur & Solan(2 each), Chamba & Lahaul-Spiti (1each). No incidence under this head was reported in Kinnaur district.

Reasons:-

- 1. Property disputes amongst family and relationship to capture the property of women.
- 2. Land disputes, Enmity with the villagers or other family members.
- 3. Domestic violence, Torture by In-laws due to various reasons.
- 4. Illicit love affairs especially in hotels etc to destroy/elope the evidences after rape.
- 5. Sudden provocation during scuffle.

(ii) Culpable Homicide:

Under this head only 2 incidence was reported in Kangra & Shimla districts (1 each) in the year 2014. No incidence under this head was reported in rest of the districts.

(iii). Rape: (Increase 13.2%)

Total 283 cases of Rape were reported which has shown an increase of 13.2% during 2014 over previous year 2013 (250 cases). The highest incidence of rape was reported in Mandi (47) followed by Kangra (43), Shimla (39), Sirmaur (28), Chamba & Una (23 each), Solan, Kullu (16 each), Bilaspur (15), Hamirpur (13), Kinnaur (10), Baddi (9) and CID (1). No incidence under this head was reported in Lahaul-Spiti district.

Reasons:-

- 1. Illicit love affairs, intimacy and friendship between both parties and later on matter disclosed.
- 2. Alluring for marriage and later on due to refusal of parents the matter of marriage do no reach to the compromise resulting in registration of cases.
- 3. Due to enmity fake registration of rape cases.
- 4. Rape cases firstly with the consent and later on when caught and seen by husband or any relative the case is registered.
- 5 Cases of minor girls rape cases are committed forcibly without consent of the girl.
- 6. In some cases of adult woman sexual intercourse with consent and friendship but case is reported when the matter comes in to the open.
- 7. Rape in relationship

(iv). Dowry Deaths:

Under this head one incidence was reported in Una district. No incidence under this head was reported in rest of the districts.

(v). Kidnapping & Abduction: (decrease 21%)

During the year 2014, 227 incidence of Kidnapping & Abduction were registered which showed a decrease of 21% over the previous year. Bilaspur district reported the highest incidence (43 cases) under this crime head followed by Mandi (33 cases), Shimla (32), Kangra (26), Chamba (19) Solan (18), Sirmaur (15), Hamirpur (13), Baddi, Una (10 each), Kullu (4) Kinnaur (3) & Lahaul-Spiti (1).

Reasons:-

- 1. Maximum cases are registered due to the reasons that during the young age boys and girls are indulged in love affairs and than the girl is subjected to kidnapping and abduction by the boys to alluring for marriage. Later on due to refusal of parents the matter is not settled, resulting the case is registered.
- 2. In the first instance the girls and boys are innocent about the consequences of the act of omission due to feeling of enjoyment provocation. Later on the matter of marriage is not settled, hence cases are registered.
- 3. In some cases boys and girls are fled away because their parents do not give their consent to marry.
- 4. In some cases kidnapping abduction is forcibly without consent of a girl where the girl is minor for the purpose of marriage or sexual intercourse.

(vi) Assault on women with intend to outrage her modesty (Sec.354) (Increase 9.1%)

538 Cases of Assault on women with intend to outrage her modesty were registered during the year 2014 showed an increase of 9.1% over the previous year. Mandi district recorded the highest (101 cases) followed by Kangra (79), Bilaspur (72), Shimla (64), Sirmaur (46), Kullu (35), Hamirpur (32), Una, Solan (31each), Chamba

(27), Baddi (15) Kinnaur (5). No incidence under this head was reported in Lahaul & Spiti district.

Reasons:

- 1. To outrage the modesty of women and girls.
- 2. Due to increasing trend of obscene films and literature in the market.
- 3. Due to obscene publication and presentation of material by print media.
- 4. Due to increasing educational activities, educational institutions and obscene activities by the anti- social elements near educational institutions and residential areas.

(vii) Abetment to Commit Suicide: (Decrease 19.5%)

The decreasing trend is seen under this head with 19.5% over the previous year. The highest number of cases were registered in Kangra (25) followed by Mandi (14), Baddi, Bilaspur, Shimla, Sirmaur & Una (5 each) and Solan (2). No incidence was reported under this head in rest the districts.

(viii) Cruelty to Women: (Decrease 0.9%)

325 cases of Cruelty to Women was registered during the year 2014, showed decrease of 0.9% over the previous year. The analysis revealed that highest number of cases (62) were registered in Una district followed by Mandi (50), Kangra (46), Hamirpur & Shimla (27 each), Bilaspur (25), Sirmaur (24), Kullu (21), Baddi (19), Solan (12), Chamba (9). The lowest incidence was seen in Kinnaur (3) district. No incidence was reported under this head in district Lahaul & Spiti.

Reasons:

- 1. Torture of married women for the purpose of dowry, her ill health etc.
- 2. Harassment and torture of women by her in laws i.e. husband, mother in law, father in law etc.

- 3. Harassment of women in family that she is not capable to do the house hold and agriculture activities.
- 4. Harassment/torture of women by husband due to the illicit relationship of the husband with other woman in the family or relationship.
- 5. Torture/harassment of women by husband or other male member of the family under the influence of liquor.
- 6. Love marriage without the consent of the other family members i.e. father in law and mother in law of the victims.

(ix) Insult to the modesty of Women (Sec.509 IPC): (decrease: 42.9%)

The decreasing trend is seen under this head by 42.9% over the previous year. The highest number of cases were registered in Kangra, Mandi, (15 each) districts followed by Hamirpur (14), Shimla (10). The lowest incidence was seen in Sirmaur (2), Baddi, Chamba, Una & Kinnaur (1 each). No case was reported under this head in rest of the districts.

(x) Chain Snatching: (Decrease: 75 %)

4 cases under this head were reported during the year as compared to the 16 cases registered during the previous year which showed 75% decrease. Only 1 each incidence under this head was reported in Kangra, Kullu, Shimla & Una. No case of chain snatching was reported in rest of the districts of the State during the year.

(xi) Dowry Prohibition Act:

2 cases in Shimla district under this head were reported during the year. No case under this head was reported in rest of the districts of the State during the year.

(xii) Immoral Trafficking:

5 Cases (Baddi, Kangra, Mandi, Sirmaur & CID 1 each) were registered under this head during the year 2014 as compare to 4 cases of previous year. No case under this head was reported in rest of the districts of the State during the year.

In view of the above, it is pertinent to mention here that the trends of offences pertaining to Crime against Women, do take place some times at various places in this state. Hence no particular districts/ area is prone for committing such offences. Also no specific gang is active / involved committing such offences.

INCIDENCE OF CRIMES AGAINST WOMEN DURING-2014



CHAPTER-5

CRIME AGAINST CHILDREN

5.1 General:

Includes violations under certain sections of Indian Panel Code. For the purpose of this chapter, the following categories of crimes involving child victims have been included under this head:-

- i). Murder
- ii). Infanticide
- iii). Rape
- iv). Kidnapping and abduction
- v). Foeticide
- vi). Abetment to Suicide
- vii). Exposure and abandonment
- viii). Procuration of minor girls (below 18)
- ix). Buying of minor girls for prostitution (below 18)
- x). Selling of minor girls for prostitution (below 18)
- x). Child Marriage Restraint
- xi). Other crimes committed against Children

5.2 Trends of Crime against Children:

PERCENTAGE DISTRIBUTION OF CRIME COMMITTED AGAINST CHILDREN DURING 2014







CHART 5.2

5.3 Incidence:

Table 5.1 shows the incidence and rate of Crime Against children, District wise including its rank.

Totally 467 cases were reported in the State under various sections of IPC. "Kidnapping & Abduction" constituted the largest category 210 cases (44.46%) were reported during the year. The maximum number of kidnapping & abduction was reported in Mandi district (33 cases), followed by Shimla (31), Kangra (24), Solan (19), Chamba, Kullu (18 each), Sirmaur (17), Baddi & Una (12 each), Bilaspur & Hamirpur (10 each), Kinnaur (5) & Lahaul-Spiti (1).

The second most prevalent crime against children was Rape which accounted for 135 cases (28.90%). The "Rape" cases were reported highest in Districts Kangra (26), followed by Mandi (22), Shimla (17 each), Una (16), Sirmaur (13 each), Chamba (10), Solan (7), Kullu (6), Baddi & Bilaspur (5 each), Kinnaur (4) Hamirpur (3), CID (1) No incidence reported in Lahaul-Spiti district.

Total 8 cases were reported in the State under head "Exposure and Abandonment" Shimla (4), Chamba, Mandi, Sirmaur, & Solan (1 each).

Total 7 cases were reported in the State under head "Murder" of Children, Shimla (2), Chamba, Kangra, Kullu, Lahaul-Spiti, & Solan (1 each).

Total 94 cases of "Other Crimes" against children were reported during the year. The highest incidence of other crimes were reported in Shimla district (24 cases) followed by Kangra & Mandi (15), Sirmaur (10), Bilaspur (7 each), Kullu & Solan (5 each), Chamba & Hamirpur (4 each), Baddi (3) & Una (2). No incidence under this head was reported in Kinnaur and Lahaul & Spiti districts.

During the year 2014, 4 cases (Mandi (2), Kangra & Una (1 each) of Child Marriage Restraint" were reported in the State during the year 2014.

3 incidence under "Procuration of Minor girls", Buying of Girls for Prostitution" and "Selling of Girls for Prostitution" was reported in Solan district. No incidence reported in rest of the districts.

The incidence and percentage contribution of State regarding crimes against children head wise and district wise presented in Table.5.2.

CHAPTER-6

ARRESTS

6.1 ARRESTS:

Total 23447 persons (19355 under IPC & 4092 under Local & Special Laws) were arrested during the year 2014 in 17122 cases (14160 IPC + 2962 Local & Special Laws) which is an increase of 12 % when compared with the arrests of 20920 persons ((18095 under IPC & 2825 under Local & Special Laws) in 2013.

(i) PERSONS ARRESTED UNDER IPC CASES:

During the year 2014 as many as 19355 persons were arrested in 14160 cases registered under IPC as against 18095 persons in 2013. Chart 6.1 depicts persons arrested under IPC crimes during 2012-2014.

PERSONS ARRESTED UNDER IPC DURING 2012-2014




Table 6.1 gives details of arrests made under IPC crime during the last 3 years 2012-2014.

Table 6.2 gives Age-group wise and gender wise break up of persons arrested in districts.

Kangra district tops in arresting 3417 persons in 2698 cases during 2014 followed by Mandi by arresting 2802 persons in 1939 cases and district Shimla by arresting 2336 persons in 1957 cases.

In Una district 1083 cases were registered and arrested 1625 persons. Chamba district has registered 761 cases and arrested 1432 persons, Kullu district 1398 persons were arrested against the registration of 914 cases during the year 2014. The details of persons arrested under IPC crime head wise & gender wise are presented in Table 6.3.

Chart 6.2 depicts age group wise persons arrested under IPC crime during the years 2014 and Chart 6.3 depicts district wise persons arrested under IPC Crime cases during the year 2014 in descending order.

AGE-GROUP WISE PERSONS ARRESTED UNDER IPC CRIMES DURING 2014.




DURING 2014





DURING 2012-2014



DISTRICT WISE PERSONS ARRESTED UNDER SLL CRIMES DURING 2014



PERSONS ARRESTED UNDER (IPC) CRIMES - 2014





-CHAPTER-7

CRIME AGAINST WEAKER SECTIONS OF SOCIETY (SC/ST)

7.1 General:

A complete harmony among different sections of society is prevailing in the State. No particular area of the State is notorious for the commission of offences against the SCs/STs. However sporadic incidents of violence against the members of these communities do take place of and on.

India is a welfare State. It is committed to the welfare and development of its people in general and of vulnerable sections in particular. Equality of status and opportunity to all citizens of the country are guaranteed by the constitution of India which also provides that no individual shall be discriminated against on grounds of religion, caste or sex. Fundamental rights and specific provisions, namely, Articles 38, 39 and 46 in the constitution of India stand testimony to the commitment of the State towards its people. The strategy of the State is to secure distributive justice and allocation of resources to support programmes for social, economic and educational to advancement of the weaker section in general and those of Scheduled Casts and Scheduled Tribes.

7.2 Constitutional Rights:

The Indian Constitution vide Article 15 lays down that no citizen shall on grounds of religion race, sex or place of birth be subjected to any disability or restriction. It also guarantees that every citizen shall have equality of status and opportunity.

7.3. Legal Rights:

To Uphold the constitutional mandate and to safeguard the interests of this section of the society, Special social enactments have come into force from time to time including privileges by way of reservations for them

The major legal enactment sponsored by Centre is:

- (i) Protection of Civil Rights Act, 1955; and
- (ii) SC/ST (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989

The Protection of Civil Rights Act, 1955 was enacted in furtherance of Article 17 of the Constitution by which untouchability was abolished and its practice in any from is forbidden. Further, in order to check and deter crimes against SC/STs by persons belonging to other communities, the Scheduled Casts and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989 was brought into force from 30th January, 1990. These enactments have extended the positive discrimination in favour of SCs and STs to the field of criminal law in as much as they prescribe penalties that are more stringent than for corresponding offences under Indian Penal Code (IPC) and other laws.

In addition, in pursuance of the constitution 65th amendment Act, 1990, National Commission for SCs and STs was constituted w.e.f. 12th March, 1992 with wide functions and powers of Civil Courts to take up matters which are of vital importance for socioeconomic development of SCs and STs.

- (i) Murder
- (ii) Rape
- (iii) Kidnapping & Abduction
- (iv) Dacoity
- (v) Robbery
- (vi) Arson
- (vii) Hurt
- (viii) PCR Act

- (ix) SC/ST(POA) Act
- (x) Others (Other classified IPC crimes)

7.4.1 Under Special & Local Laws (SLL):

- (i) Protection of Civil Rights Act:1955
- (ii) The SC/STs (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989.

The crime under IPC such as 'Murder', 'Hurt', 'Rape etc. or under Special Acts such as PCR Act & SC/ST (P) Act are already included in overall crimes reported under IPC and SLL respectively and have been discussed in details in the preceding chapters. The data specific to crimes against SC/ST discussed in the following paragraphs is a part and parcel of total crimes but analyzed separately for better comprehension.

Population:


As per 2011 census of Himachal Pradesh the Scheduled Castes constituted 28.30 % of total population in the State whiles Scheduled Tribes constituted only 4.08 %. Kangra district with the highest population share (22.03%) also represented the highest share of Scheduled Caste (18.60%) followed by Mandi (17.39%) and Shimla with (12.50%) while the Chamba district represented significantly high share of Scheduled Tribes (72.59%) followed by Kinnaur (23%) and Lahaul & Spiti (9.90%).

7.5 Incidence of Crimes against Weaker Section (SC/ST):

The incidence of these crimes (IPC+SLL) was reported to be 125 in the State during 2014. The Head wise details of crime against weaker section for the last 3 years including % change over the previous years is presented in Table 7.1. The Chart 7.1 depicts the head wise pictorial position of the crime incidence. The district wise and head wise incidence including the rate of crime has been calculated and presented in Table 7.2.

The above data reflects that the incidence of most of the SC/ST (POA)Act and other crimes has been increased.

7.6 Head-wise Crime:

Under most of the heads of IPC no incidence has been found registered during the year 2014. The head wise detailed analysis of all crime heads under which the cases have been found registered during the years are given below:

(i) Murder:

During the years 2014, 1 incidence was reported under head murder against weaker sections in the state.

(ii) Rape:

During the years 2014, 13 incidence of rape was reported under crime against weaker sections showed an increase of 17 cases over the previous year 2013. In Bilaspur, Sirmaur districts (4 each) followed by Shimla (2), Kangra, Mandi & Una (1 each). No case under this head was registered in rest of the districts.

(iii). SC/ST Protection of Civil Rights Act:

During the year 2014, 7 incidence of PCR Act was reported in Bilaspur, Kinnaur & Mandi (2 each), Baddi (1) districts under this head which showed an increase of 3 cases over the previous year 2013. No case under this head was registered in rest of the districts.

(iv). SC/ST(Prevention Of Atrocities) Act, 1989:

During the years 2014, 22 incidences were reported under this head showed a decrease of 1 case over the previous year 2013. Kangra (6) followed by Shimla (4 cases), Hamirpur & Mandi (3 each), Sirmaur (2 each), Baddi, Bilaspur, Solan & Una (1each). No incidence under this head was reported in rest of the districts.

(v) Other IPC:

During the years 2014, 78 incidences were reported under other heads against the 67 registration for the previous year. Total cases 16.41 % were found registered under this head during the year 2014. In districts Mandi (16) found registered with the highest followed by Shimla (14), Sirmaur (11), Una (10), Hamirpur & Kangra (7 each), Solan (4), Bilaspur, Chamba & Kullu (3 each). No case under this head was registered in rest of the districts.

SUICIDAL DEATHS


8.1 General:

According to Oxford dictionary, 'suicide' means 'the act of killing oneself intentionally'. The 'suicide' word has its origin from Latin word 'sui' (of oneself) plus 'cardere' [kill]. It is a step which is taken by one normally in an emotionally or mentally weak moment when he or she feels coping with life is impossible

The number of Suicides reported in Himachal Pradesh during 2013 was 644 as against 554 in 2013 indicating an increase of 16.2%.

Kangra District recorded the highest number of suicides during 2014 (172) followed by Mandi (111), Hamirpur, Shimla (69 each), Una (55). Remaining districts reported below 50 cases of suicides. Suicides during 2005-2014 is presented in Chart 8.1


CHART 8.1

From the above table it is revealed that there has been an increase of over 16.2% (from 554 to 644) in suicide cases during the year 2014 over the year 2013. The major increase has been witnessed in the districts of Mandi (from 62 to 111), Kangra (from 152 to 172), Una (from 43 to 55), Hamirpur (from 48 to 66) and Shimla (from 56 to 69). However, there has been decrease in Baddi (from 42 to 28) Bilaspur (from 29 to 26), Chamba (from 20 to 19), Kinnaur from 6 to 2) and Solan (from 43 to 40).

The analysis of the above table reveals that percentage of suicide deaths in the districts of Baddi, Hamirpur, Kangra, Mandi, Solan and Una has remained higher than the percentage of the population of the district concerned the years 2014. In other words, these 6 districts are more prone to suicidal deaths as compared to other 7 districts of state.



It is revealed from the above table that the number of males committing suicide outnumber the females (67.7 males as against 34.3% females in 2013 and 61.5 % males as against 38.5% females in 2014).

It is further revealed that there has been increase of 8.8% in the male suicide cases (from 364 to 396) as against 30.5 % increase in the number of female suicides (190 to 248) during the year 2014 as compared to the year 2013.



%AGE AGAINST TOTAL CASES DURING -2013 & 2014







The causes that top the list which led to suicides are Family problems (18.5% in 2013) and (17.4% in 2014), followed by illness (13.54% in 2013 and 17.7% in 2014).



The analysis shows that the age profile of most of the suicide victims both men and women falls into two age-groups of 18-30 and 30-45 years. Thus it can be said that most people who commit suicide do so in the prime of their lives between 18 to 45 years of age (73.46% in 2013 and (72.98% in 2014) This fact can be co-related to the reasons for suicide i.e. 'family problems' and 'illness'.



Another aspect that is brought forth is that those who committed suicide were mostly unemployed in case of males and **housewives** in the case of females (14.28% males were unemployed and 18.8% females were housewives). This fact can again be co-related to the age profile falling within 18-45 years.



The means adopted for committing suicide range over several methods from drinking too much to jumping from high places. However, the maximum number have committed suicide by **consuming poison**. (51.26% in 2013 and 48.4% in 2014.) This is followed by hanging (32.31% in 2013 and 32.3% in 2014).

8.11. Conclusions:


- (i) There has been an increase in the suicide cases, both in male & female cases during the year 2014 as against the year 2013.
- (ii) The districts of Kangra, Mandi Hamirpur, Shimla and Una were found more prone to suicidal deaths as compared to the other 8 districts of the state.
- (iii) The major cause of suicides remained 'family problems' followed by 'Illness'. 'Unemployment' is certainly not one of the major causes of suicides as it contributes less than 20 % to total suicide cases.
- (iv) Most of the female suicide victims were house-wives. The farmers/agriculturists do not form major group of suicide victims as this group contributes only 10% to total suicide cases.

- (v) The majority of the suicide victims were married and in the age group of 18 to 45 years.
- (vi) The most popular means for committing suicide remained taking 'poison' followed by 'hanging'.



CHAPTER-9

ACCIDENTAL DEATHS

9.1 General:

Incidents of road accidents in Himachal Pradesh show fluctuating trends. The break-up of accidents for the last ten years is shown in Table-9.1

CAR/JEEP/TAXI/TEMPO account for the largest number of accidents. During the year 2014, 36.6 % of the road accidents were attributed to CAR/JEEP/TAXI/TEMPO. During the year 2013, 37.6% road accidents involved light vehicles (LMVs). District wise comparative statement of road accidents during 2013-2014 is presented in Table-9.2. 3058 road accidents were reported during the year 2014 out of which 2317 fatalities, 741 accidents were fatal.

9.2 Accidental Deaths:

CAR/JEEP/TAXI/TEMPOS were responsible for 37.6% of accidental deaths during 2014. Out of 1215 persons who died due to accidents, as many as 457 were involved in accidents with these type of vehicles. Table-9.2 gives details of road accidental deaths for the year 2014 with break-up of types of vehicles and due to other reasons. Shimla District reported the highest (218) accidental deaths followed by Sirmaur (171), Mandi (128) and Kangra (107). Chart-9.1 depicts road accidents occurred during 2005–2014.

Percentage of road accidental deaths according to type of vehicles during the years 2014 is presented in Chart-9.2.

NUMBER OF ROAD ACCIDENTS (2005-2014)




ROAD ACCIDENTAL DEATHS DURING -2014



(FATAL AND NON FATAL DURING 2014)



CHAPTER-10

CYBER CRIMES

10.1. Definition of Cyber Crime:

"Any illegal action in which a computer is a tool or object of crime, in other words, any crime, the means or purpose of which is to influence the function of computer."

Computer and Tele-communications are the key areas of cyber crimes. In cyber crimes, the Computer is used in the following two ways:-

- i.) Computer as a target
- ii.) Computer as a tool

The computer becomes a target of cyber crime when, by way of hacking or intrusion, the criminals access a computer with a motive to impair, damage or alter the system. The hacking can evolve into other substantive violations, for example, alteration of accounts, drawl of money etc. by cyber intrusion into a bank.

Computer becomes a tool for cyber crime when it becomes a convenient method to commit crimes affecting large scale net-works and programmes such as introducing virus into large scale reservation or financial network or unauthorizedly obtaining classified information from data stored in defence and security computers.

10.2 Classification of computer crimes:

The most accepted classification of computer crimes is as follows:

- (i) Computer related frauds.
- (ii) Computer forgery.
- (iii) Damage to computer data of computer programmes.
- (iv) Computer sabotage.

- (v) Unauthorized access.
- (vi) Unauthorized interception
- (vii) Unauthorized reproduction of a protected computer programmes
- (viii) Unauthorized reproduction of a topography
- (ix) Alteration of computer data or computer programmes
- (x) Computer espionage
- (xi) Unauthorized use of a computer
- (xii) Unauthorized use of a protected computer programmes.

10.3. Incidence of Computer Crime:

During the year 2014 37 cases under Cyber Crimes (IT Act only) were registered in the State and during 2013 this figure was 33. Chart 10.1 depicts the incidence of Cyber Crimes reported from 2012-2014. Table 10.1 carries the district-wise details of cases registered under IT Act. Table 10.2 gives the details of Cyber Crimes registered and persons arrested under I.T. Act during 2012-2014:-



CHAPTER-11

DETECTION UNDER NARCOTIC DRUGS & PSYCHOTROPIC SUBSTANCE (ND&PS) ACT.

11.1 General:

A drug is a substance intended for use as a medicine for the alleviation of human and animal suffering either alone or in the form of a medical preparation. A drug when modify one or more of its functions. This would include not only medication meant for the treatment of the patients but also other pharmacologically active substances. In other words a drug is a substance that can cause change in man's body or way of thinking and feeling.

In Himachal Pradesh there are total 17495 villages out of which 402 villages of the following five Districts are the natural habitants of cannabis where it grows naturally. Analysis reveals that these five districts of the State have been identified by the drug traffickers for cultivation and transporting of Cannabis at national and international level.

11.2 Narcotic Drugs:

In general, Narcotics drug can be defined as a awareness of sensory impulses, especially pain, by the brain. In large doses it caused stupor (Condition of insensibility), coma or convulsion. These would include:

(i) Cannabis preparations like Bhang, Ganja and Charas.

- (ii) Opium and Opium alkaloids like morphine.
- (iii) Coca alkaloids like Cocaine.
- (iv) Synthetic narcotic drugs like pethidine.

11.3 Psychotropic Drugs:

The Greek word Phycho means "Soul" and "Trope" means "Turning', and drug having peculiar affinity for or effect on mind (Mind altering). The term psychotropic drug include:

- 1) Hallucinogens: There are both natural and synthetic Drugs like LSD (Lysergic acid Diethylamide) and tetrahydrocannabinals.
- 2) Hypnotics: Secobarbitone, Phenobarbitone.
- 3) Stimulants: These drugs induce and excitement in the body like amphetamines cocaine.
- 4) Tranquillizers: Methaqualone, Mandrax, etc.
- 5) Depressants: Under this class would fall drugs which are pain killers, analgesics, sedatives, like barbiturates, opiates.



The drug-wise detection during the year 2014 according to the above mentioned table is presented in the chart 11.1. The major detection of poppy husk (1192.059Kgs) has been made during the year 2014 followed by Charas (356.9 Kgs.) Opium 8.279 Kgs. Detection of other drugs i.e. Smack 206 gms, Brown Sugar 41 gms has been made during the year 2014

11.6 Detailed Analysis:

The Incidence of (644) under the ND&PS Act showed an increase of 21.3% over 2013. Cases under this Act constituted 21.8% against the total Local & Special Law reported cases during the year 2014. The highest incidence (143) under this head were reported in


Mandi district followed by Kullu (103), Shimla (72), Kangra (58), Chamba (56), CID (55), Sirmaur (40), Una (29), Baddi (26), Bilaspur (24), Hamirpur (23), Solan (12) and Kinnaur (3). No case under this Act was reported in Lahaul & Spiti District.

The main concentration on the incidence registered under this Act remains on District Mandi and Kullu with 38.2 % of the total registered cases. The analysis reveals that the main source / area of drugs are Kullu, Mandi, Kangra, Shimla and Chamba. Further couriers of this contraband are mostly agriculturists, laborers and poor people.

Of the total persons apprehended under this Act, 78.2 % belong to Himachal Pradesh and 21.8% were outsiders. Study of age profile shows that mostly adults between 18-30 years of age are involved (47.8%). About 38.3% were in the age group of 30-45 years. Above 45 years were 13.9%.

The participation of children below 18 years is negligible (1.5%). Only two Foreigner was involved in this activity. Previous 10 Years (2005-2014) Crime under this head is presented in Chart-11.1

CHAPTER-12

POLICE STRENGTH, INFRASTRUCTURE AND EXPENDITURE

12.1 Police Strength:

The sanctioned strength of the Police personnel in the Himachal Pradesh during the year 2014 was 18820 while actual strength is 15828. Total strength of (GOs) Class-I is 300, which includes 89 IPS and 169 HPS. Total Class-II GOs are 27. The strength of executive force is 16869 which includes 2055 NGOs: Inspectors (266), Sub-Inspectors (673) Asstt. Sub-Inspectors (1116). The strength of Head Constables and Constables is 14814, (HCs-2869 and Const.-11945). The strength of ministerial staff (Class-III is 632, Class-IV 565 and other Whole time, Daily Wagers and Part Timers) is 427. The rank wise detailed sanctioned position and actual strength is presented in Table 12.1.

12.2 Police Districts and Sub-divisions:

During the year 2014, there were 1 Zone, 3 Ranges (Northern, Southern & Central), 13 Districts (including one Police District at Baddi), 28 Police Sub-Divisions, 110 Police Stations (including 2 Police Stations of GRP and one Police Station of CID. Detailed summary is given in Table 12.2.

12.3 Police Housing:

The details of different types of available Police housing are depicted in Table 12.3.

12.4 Police Budget:

The budget allocation for Police department in Himachal Pradesh for the last 3 years is depicted in Table 12.4. During the budget year 2013-2014 Himachal Pradesh Police Budget account for 2.5 % of the total budget for Himachal Pradesh.

12.5 Equipment & Transport:

The district wise number and type of available equipments with Himachal Pradesh, during 2014 are presented in Table 12.5. There are 78 HF Sets, 975 VHF Sets, 1512 Willkie Talkies and 17 other equipments available with the Himachal Police Department.

At present the total available (fleet) strength in Himachal Pradesh Police is 474 Motor Cycles, 200 (Gypsy/Jeep/Bolero/Tata Mobiles), 145 Heavy Vehicles and 32 Vans & others. The district wise detail summary is given in Table 12.6.

GLOSSARY

Arrest Rate:

Number of arrests per lakh of population.

Charge sheeting Rate:

Percentage of cases charge sheeted to cases in which investigations were completed.

Cognizable Offences:

A cognizable case means a case in which, a police officer may in accordance with the first schedule of the Code of Criminal Procedure 1973 or under any other Law for the time being in force, arrest without warrant.

Conviction Rate:

Percentage of cases that resulted in conviction to the number of cases in which trials were completed during a year.

Crime Against Women:

Rape, Dowry deaths, molestation, Cruelty by husband and relatives, Sexual harassment, Kidnapping & abduction of women and girls, dowry Prohibition Act.

Crime Rate:

Incidence of crime per lakh of population.

Disposal Rate by Police:

Percentage of cases investigated and chalaned to total cases meant for investigation during the year.

Disposal Rate by Courts:

Percentage of cases disposed to total cases pending/trial during a year.

Indian Penal Code:

A Penal Code for India listing out the offences and their punishments (Act No. XLV of 1860).

Local Law:

A law applicable only to a particular state/part of India.

Offence:

The word offence means any act or omission made punishable by any law for the time being in force.

Property Offence:

Include Burglary, Theft, Dacoity and Robbery.

Special law:

A law applicable to a particular subject.
