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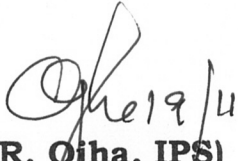
PREFACE

CHAPTER-1

INCIDENT AND RATE OF COGNIZABLE CRIME IN HIMACHAL PRADESH

1.1 General:

Himachal Pradesh is a hilly and a peaceful State. There are sporadic incidents of crime taking place, but no particular area of any district of this State is notorious for any class or category of crime. There has not been any abnormal fluctuation in the incidence of crime in the State.

The crime situation has remained peaceful and well under control during the year 2023 throughout the State of Himachal Pradesh. No alarming increase was noticed under any major head of crime.

1.2. The Parameters for Review and Analysis of Crime:-

The following parameters have been adopted while analyzing crime for the year 2023:-

- ➡ Geographical spread.
- ➡ Reasons for commission of crime, especially in offences against persons.
- ➡ Investigation process followed.
- ➡ Recovery of property.
- ➡ Profile of criminals.

1.3. Reported Incidents of Cognizable Crimes:

The ten years trends of incidence and rate of total cognizable crime under Indian Penal Code (IPC) and Local & Special Laws (2014-2023) is presented in **Table-1.2** at the end of the chapter. A total of 19987 cognizable crime cases were reported during the year 2023. These comprise 13505 cases under IPC and 6482 cases under Special & Local Laws (SLL). (**Table-1.1** and **Chart-1.1 & 1.2**)

FOR THE LAST 10 YEARS (2014-2023)

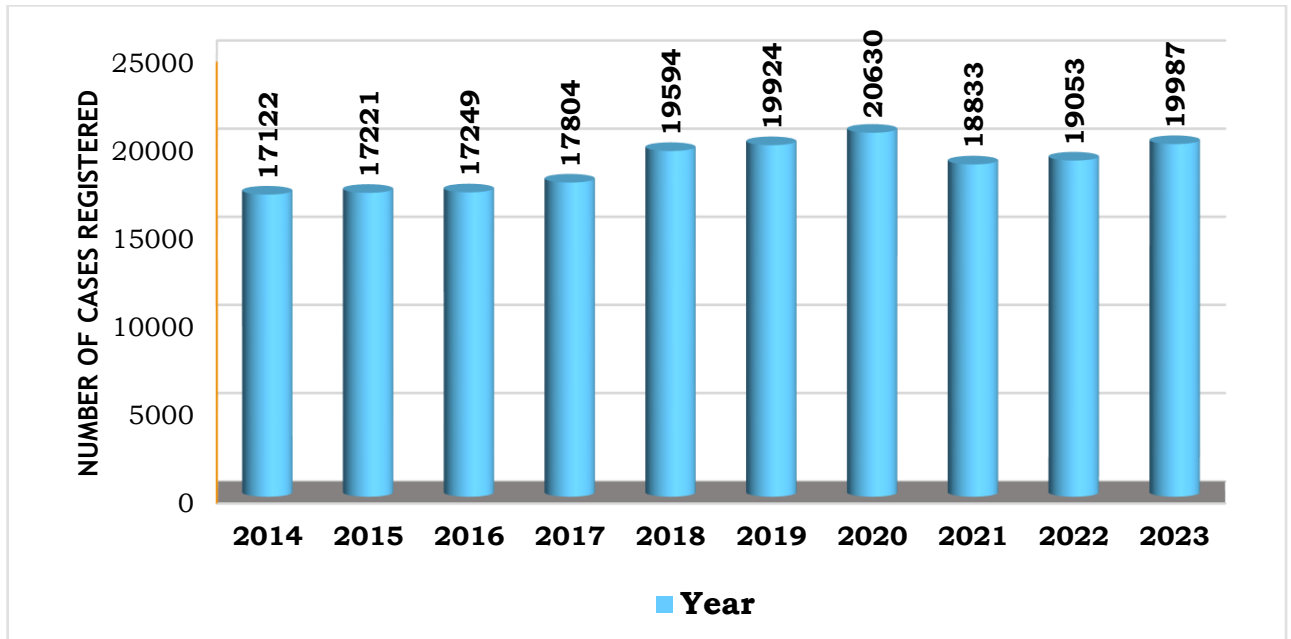
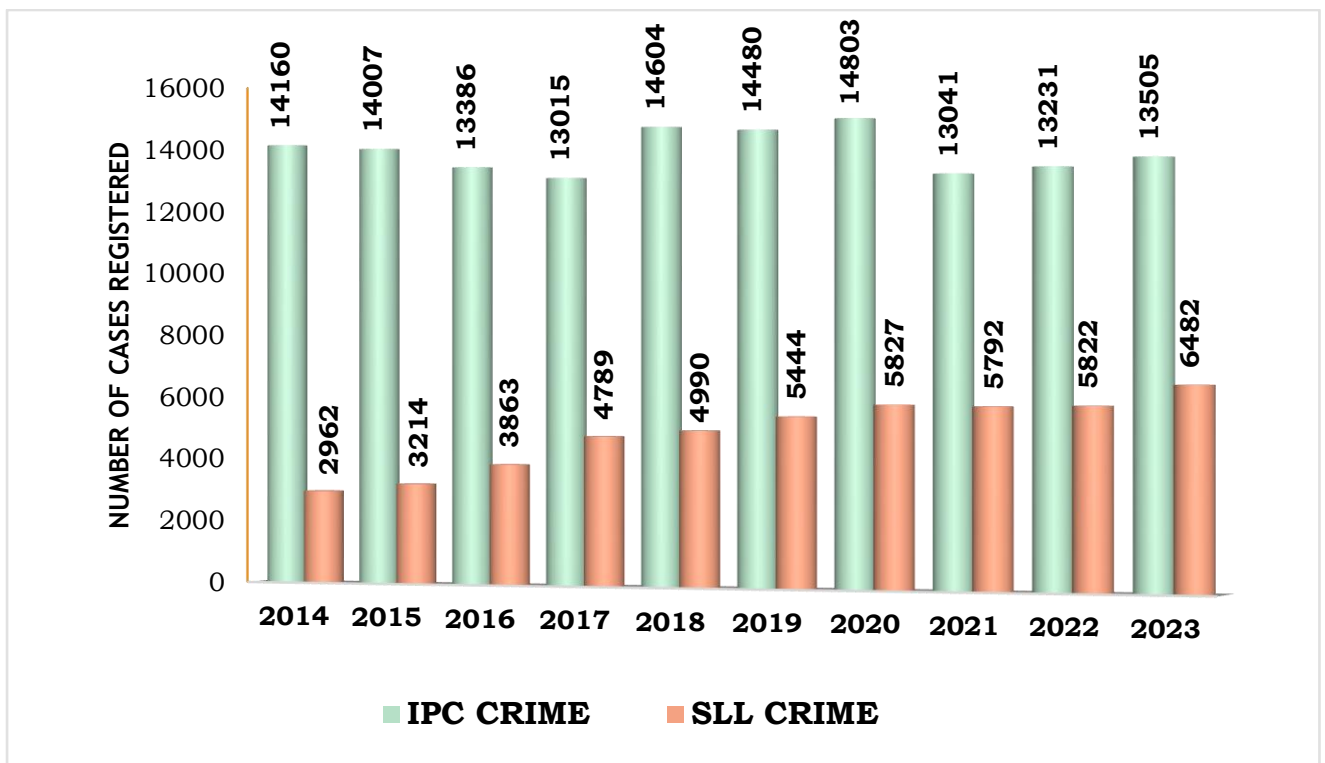


CHART-1.2

1.4. Crime Trends:

1.4.1. Crime Incidents:

During the year 2023, cases of cognizable crime have increased by **4.90% (+934)** as compared to the registration of cognizable crime cases of the corresponding year. The registration in IPC crimes has recorded an increase of **2.07%** and Special & Local Laws crime has recorded an increase of **11.33%** in 2023 as compared to the previous year.

A total of 13505 IPC cases were reported in the State during 2023, as against 13231 cases in 2022 (**2.07% increase**). Mandi, Kangra, Shimla, Bilaspur & Sirmaur districts have recorded crime incidents between 1001 to 2000 IPC cases. Solan, Una, Hamirpur, Kullu, Baddi, Nurpur and Chamba districts have recorded crime incidents between 501 to 1000 IPC cases. The crime incidents in districts Kinnaur, Lahaul & Spiti, Railway & Traffic Unit, Cyber Units and CID have remained below the figure of 500 cases. The district wise volume of crime is depicted in **Table 1.3**.

1.4.2. District-wise IPC Crime Trends:

The highest occurrence of IPC cases was reported in Mandi (1907 cases) followed by Kangra (1901) Shimla (1655), Bilaspur (1077), Sirmaur (1027), Solan (906), Una (881), Hamirpur (873), Kullu (811), Baddi (753), Nurpur (715), Chamba (597), Kinnaur (268), Lahaul & Spiti (80), GRP (19), Cyber PS (19) and CID (16). The details of number of districts falling under different ranges of incidents of IPC crimes during the year 2023 are presented in **Table 1.3**.

1.5. Crime Pattern: (IPC Crimes)

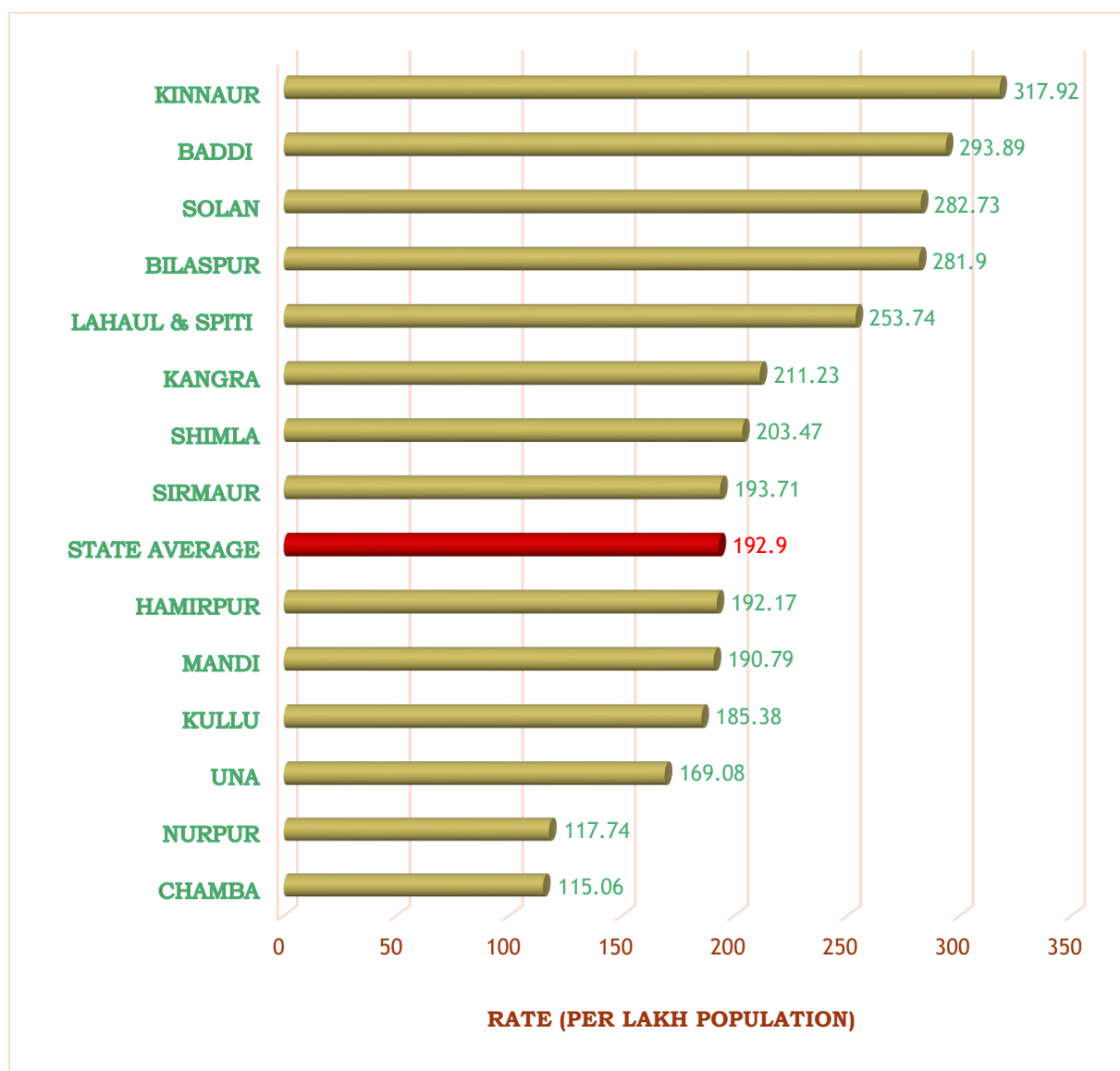
As compared to 2022, this year the incidents of Murder, Culpable Homicide, Burglary, Grievous Hurt, Assault on Women, Accident and other IPC have shown an increases, while incidents of Theft, Rioting, Dowry and Deaths have shown a decrease. There is no increase or decrease in Attempt to Murder and, Robbery cases.

1.6. Crime Rate:

The District wise crime rate is presented in Table-1.4. The average IPC crime rate in the State for 2023 was 192.9. The highest crime rate districts are Solan

(320.49) followed by Kinnaur (317.92), Sirmaur (312.17), Baddi (293.89), Bilaspur (281.90), Lahaul & Spiti (253.74), Hamirpur (192.17), Mandi (190.79), Kullu (185.38), Una (173.88), Kangra (171.08) Chamba (115.06) and Shimla (87.90).

Head Wise Analysis of IPC Offences:

The head wise analysis of IPC offences is presented in Table-1.5. The head wise statistics shows the following trends:-

(i) Murder: (Increase of 9.41%)

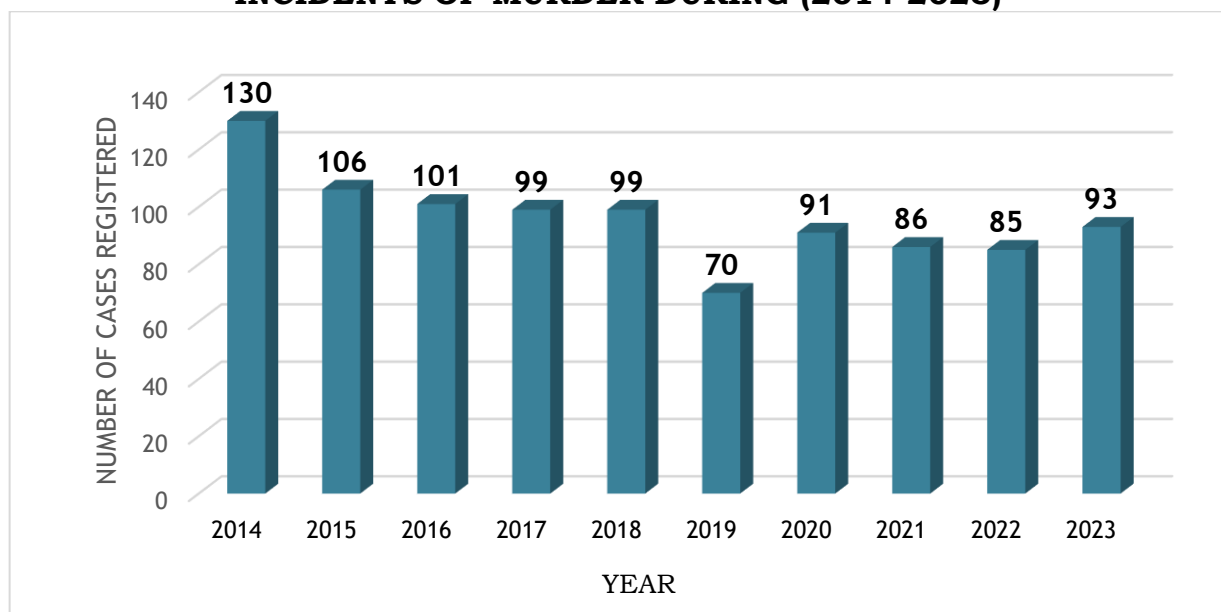
The incidents of murder (93) in 2023 increased by 9.41% as compared to the previous year. The highest incidents of murder were reported in Shimla (14) followed by Mandi (11), Kangra (9,) Chamba & Sirmaur (8 each), Baddi, Bilaspur, Kullu (7 each), Una (6), Solan (5), Nurpur (4). The lowest number of incidents of

murder were reported in Hamirpur (3), Kinnaur (2) and Lahaul & Spiti & GRP (1 each). No incident under this head was reported in CID & Cyber. The number of cases registered in the previous 10 years (2014-2024) under this head are presented in Chart-1.4.

The analysis of the causes has revealed that no organized gang was operating in the State. In most of these cases, crime is committed due to various types of disputes or murder for gain or personal enmity, love affairs and illicit relationships. There was no class or caste factor involved in the commission of murders.

INCIDENTS OF MURDER DURING (2014-2023)

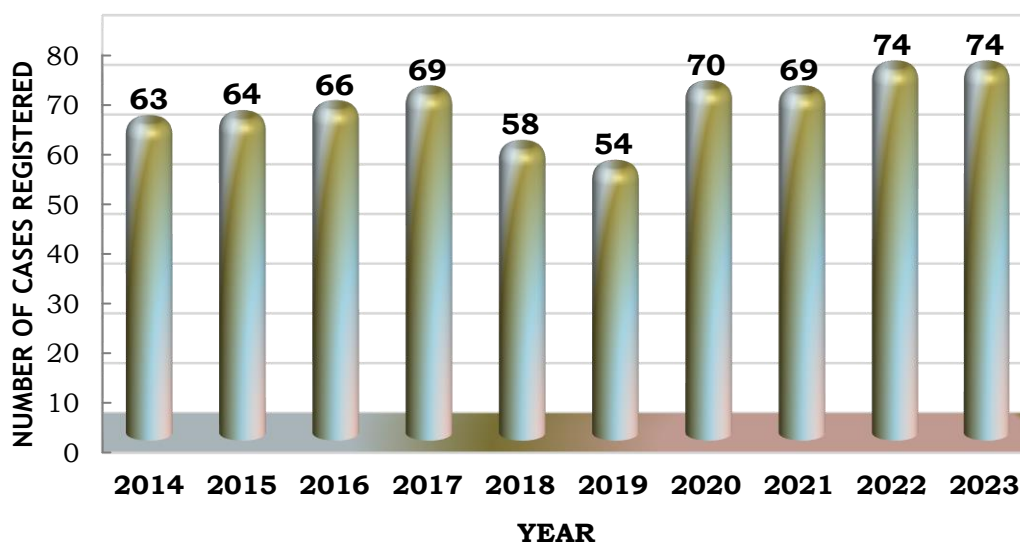


(ii). Attempt to commit**Murder: (Variation 0%)**

The incidents of Attempt to Commit Murder (74) reported during this year have no variation as compared to the previous year. The highest incidents under this head were reported in districts Mandi (12), followed by Kangra (10), Shimla (9),

Baddi (8), Bilaspur (7), Soland & Una (6 each), Sirmaur & Nurpur (5 each), Hamirpur (3), Kullu (2), Kinnaur (1), and Solan (1 each). No incident under this head was reported in Chamba, L&S, GRP, CID & Cyber Units. Previous 10 years (2014-2023) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.5](#).

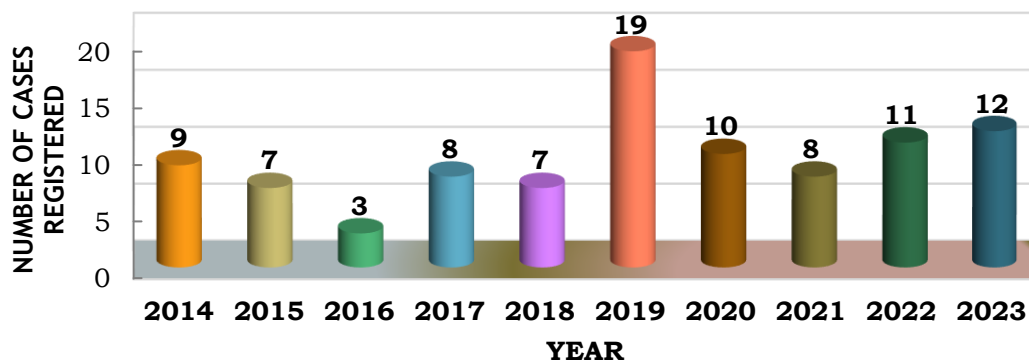
CHART-1.5

**(iii). Culpable Homicide not amounting to Murder: (Increase of 9.09 %)**

Total 12 cases of Culpable Homicide not amounting to Murder were reported during 2023, showing an increase of 9.09% over the previous year (11 cases). The highest number of incident 03 cases were reported in

Kangra district followed by Baddi & Hamirpur (2 each), Bilaspur, Kullu, Mandi, Solan & Una (1 each). No incident under this head was reported in the remaining districts/Units of the State. Previous 10 years (2014-2023) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.6](#).

DURING (2014-2023)

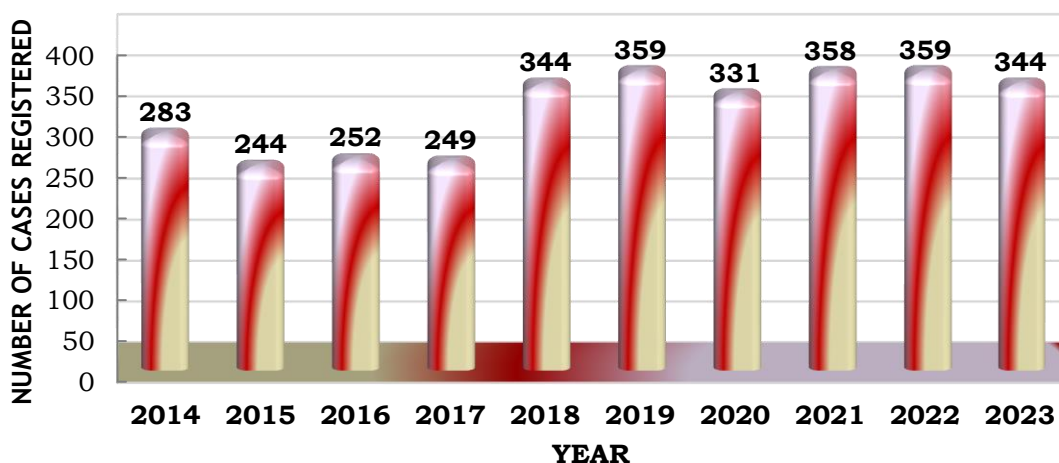


(iv). Rape: (Decrease of 4.17%)

Total 344 cases of Rape were reported during 2023; an decrease of 4.17 % over the previous year (359 cases). The highest incidents of Rape were reported in district Mandi (54), followed by Sirmaur (43), Kangra (39), Shimla (36), Baddi (33), Kullu

(25), Bilaspur (23), Solan & Chamba (21 each), Una (20), Nurpur (14) Kinnaur (9), Hamirpur (6). No incident under this head was reported in the remaining districts/Units of the State. Previous 10 years (2014-2023) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1. 7.

INCIDENTS OF RAPE DURING (2014-2023)

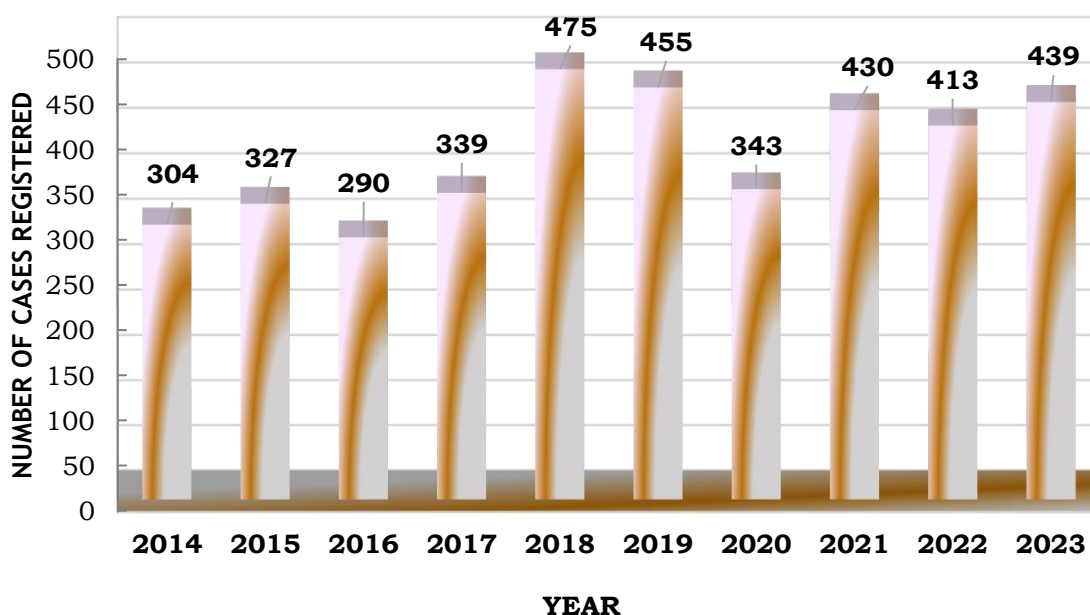


(v). Kidnapping and Abduction:
(Increase of 6.29 %)

During the year 2023, a total number of 439 cases of Kidnapping and Abduction were reported; an increase of 6.29 % as compared to the previous year. The highest number of incidents were reported in district Mandi (71), followed by Shimla (65),

Kangra (49), Kullu (37), Hamirpur, (33), Sirmaur (32), Solan & Una (30 each), Baddi & Bilaspur (21 each), Chamba (18), Nurpur (17), Kinnaur (14), Lahaul & Spiti (1). No incident under this head was reported in the remaining districts/Units of the State. Previous 10 years (2014-2023) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.8](#).

DURING (2014-2023)

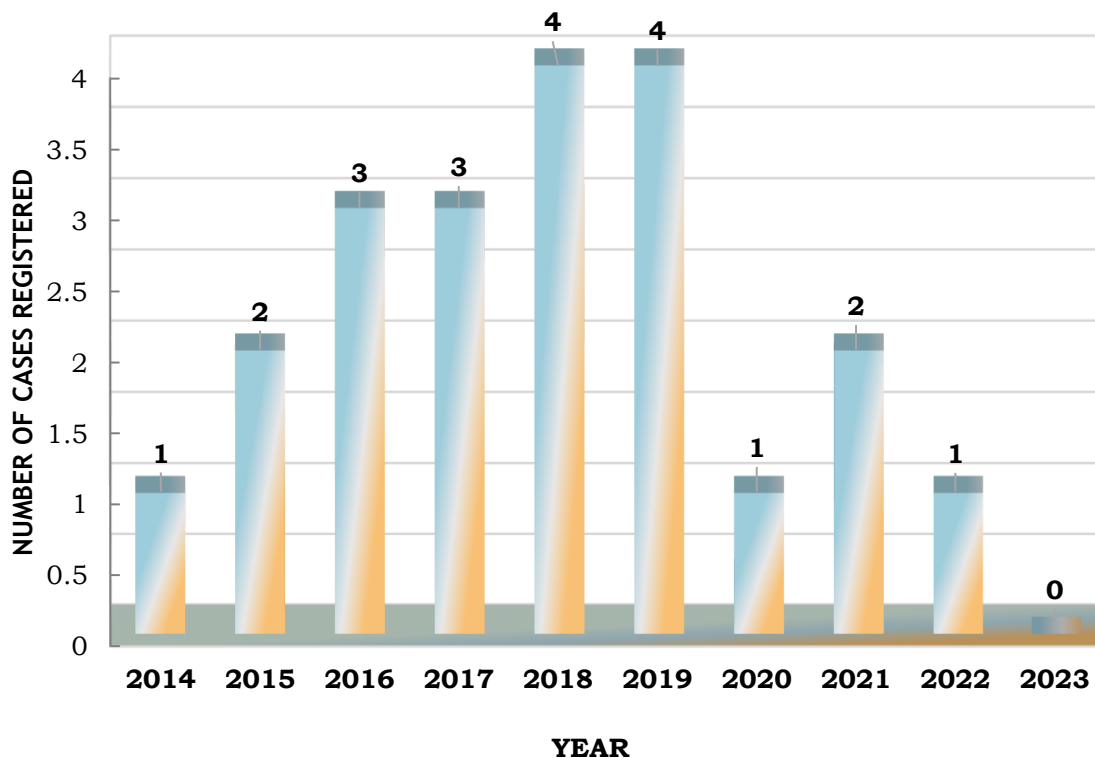


(vi). Dowry Death: (Decrease of 100%)

No incident under this head was reported 2023; a decrease of 100% in the State as compared to

the previous year. Previous 10 years (2014-2023) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.9](#).

DURING (2014-2023)



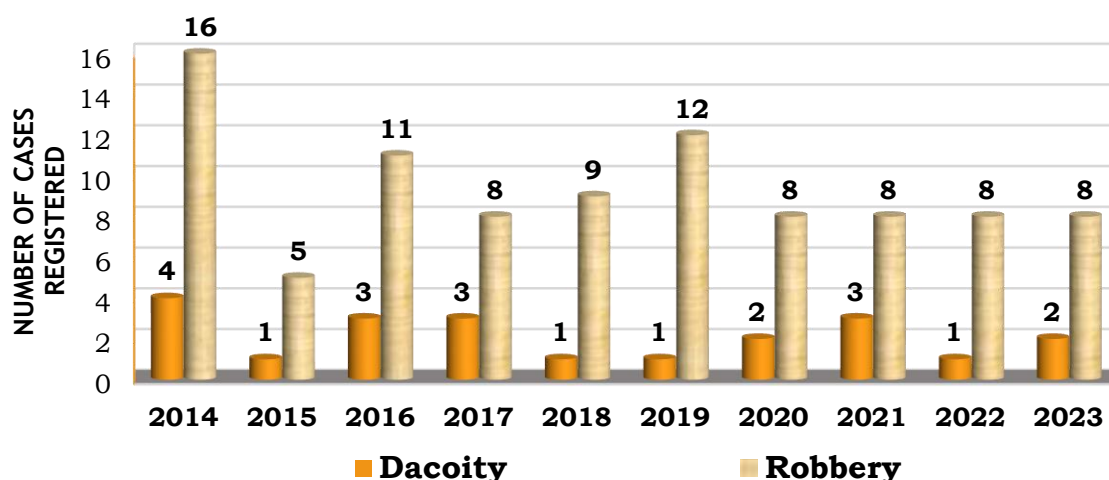
(vii). Dacoity: (Variation of 1 case over previous year)

During the year 2023, 2 cases were registered in the State as compared to the previous year (1 case). 1 case was registered in Solan and 1 in Una, no incident under this head was reported in the remaining districts/units of the State. The previous 10 years (2014-2023) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.10](#).

(viii). Robbery: (Variation 0%)

During the year 2023, 8 cases of Robbery were registered in the State. The highest number of incidents were reported in district Kangra, Mandi & Sirmaur (2 each), followed by Solan & Una (1 each). No case under this head was reported in rest of the districts of the State. Previous 10 years (2014-2023) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.10](#).

INCIDENTS OF DACOITY AND ROBBERY DURING (2014-2023)

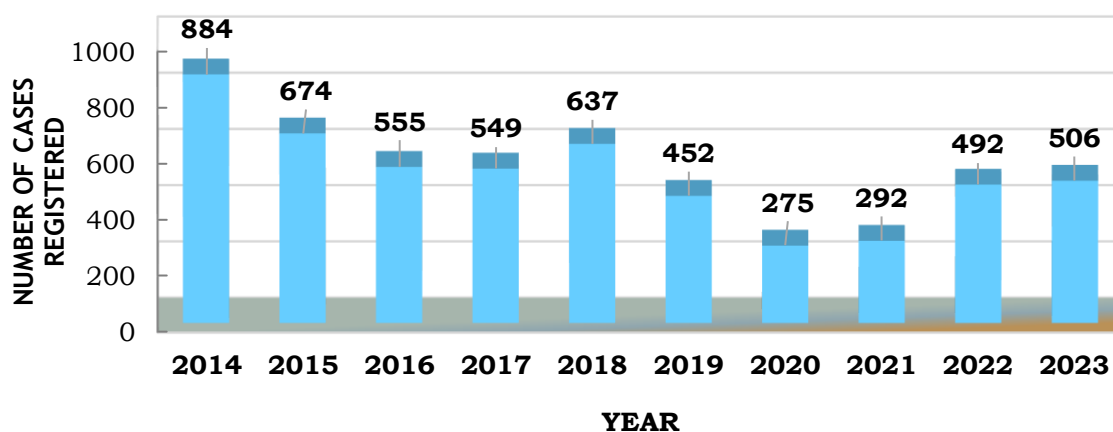


(ix). Burglary: (Increase of 2.84%)

The incidents of Burglary (506) recorded an increase with 2.84% during the year 2023 as compared to the previous year. The highest number of Burglary cases were reported in district Shimla (72), followed by Kangra (66), Solan (56), Una (52),

Baddi (51), Sirmaur (47), Mandi (43), Bilaspur (31), Nurpur & Kullu (25 each), Hamirpur (23), Chamba & Kinnaur (7 each) and Lahaul & Spiti (1). No case under this head was reported in rest of the units of the State. Previous 10 years (2014-2023) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.11](#).

INCIDENTS OF BURGLARY DURING (2014-2023)

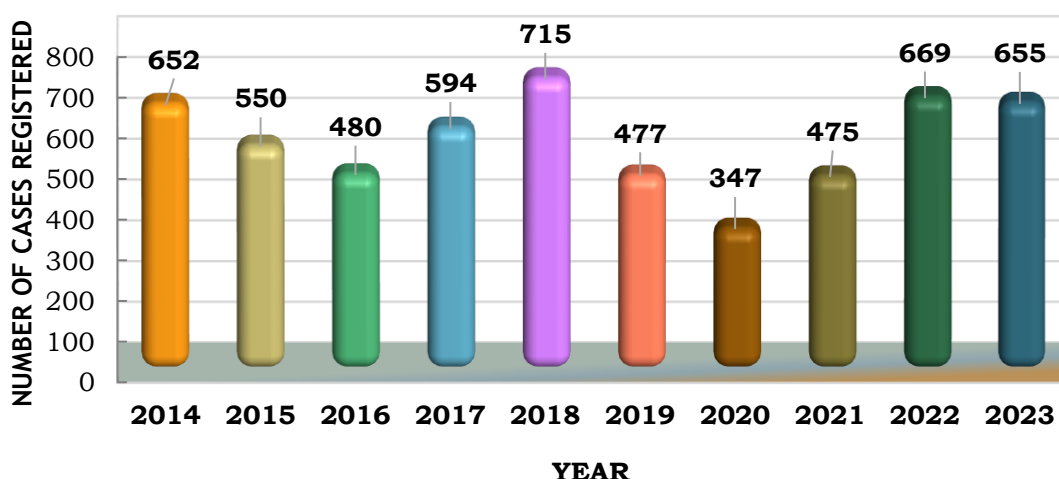


(x). Theft: (Decrease of 2.09%)

The incidents of Theft (655) recorded a decrease of 2.09% during the year 2023 over the previous year. Solan district has reported the highest incidents (91 cases), followed by Sirmaur (76), Una & Shimla (68 each), Bilaspur

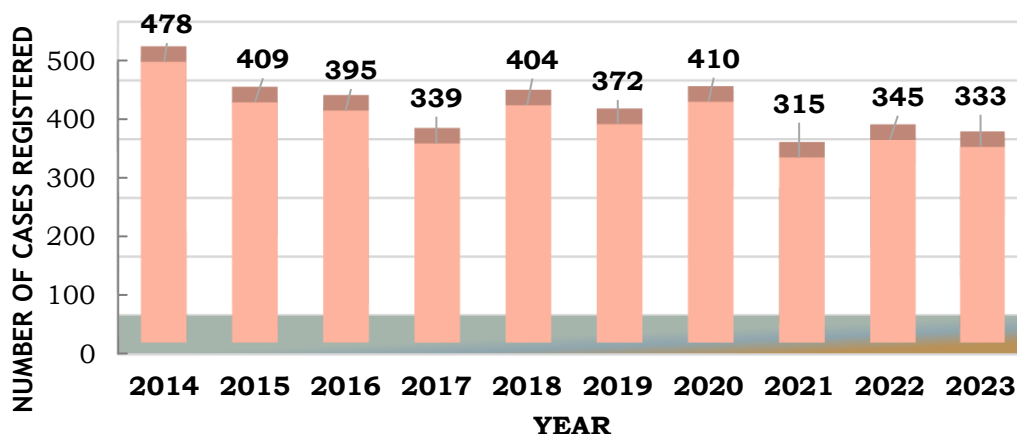
(66), Kangra & Baddi (62 each), Mandi (61), Hamirpur (32), Kullu (24), Nurpur (23), Chamba (17) Kinnaur & GRP (02 each) and Lahaul & Spiti (1). Previous 10 years (2014-2023) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.12.

**(xi). Riots: (Decrease of 3.47%)**

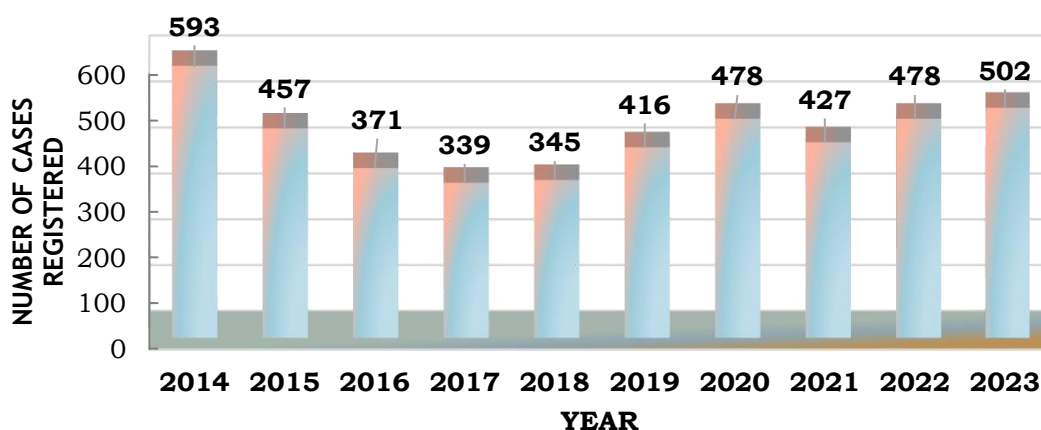
Incidents of Riots (333) registered during the year 2023 recorded a decrease of 3.47% over the previous year. The highest number of incidents were reported in district Sirmaur (47), followed by

Nurpur (38), Shimla (35), Una (31), Kangra (30), Mandi (29), Bilaspur (27), Kullu (26), Baddi (24), Solan (21), Hamirpur (13), Chamba (11), and Kinnaur (1). Previous 10 years (2014-2023) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.13.

A total number of 502 cases under the crime head Grievous Hurt were reported during 2023; an increase of 5.02% over the previous year. District Shimla has reported the highest number of incidents (71) under this

head, followed by Mandi & Kangra (64 each), Nurpur (49), Hamirpur (43), Sirmaur (36), Chamba (34), Bilaspur (31), Una (30), Solan (23), Kullu (21), Kinnaur (15), Baddi (11), Lahaul & Spiti (10). Previous 10 years (2014-2023) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.14](#).

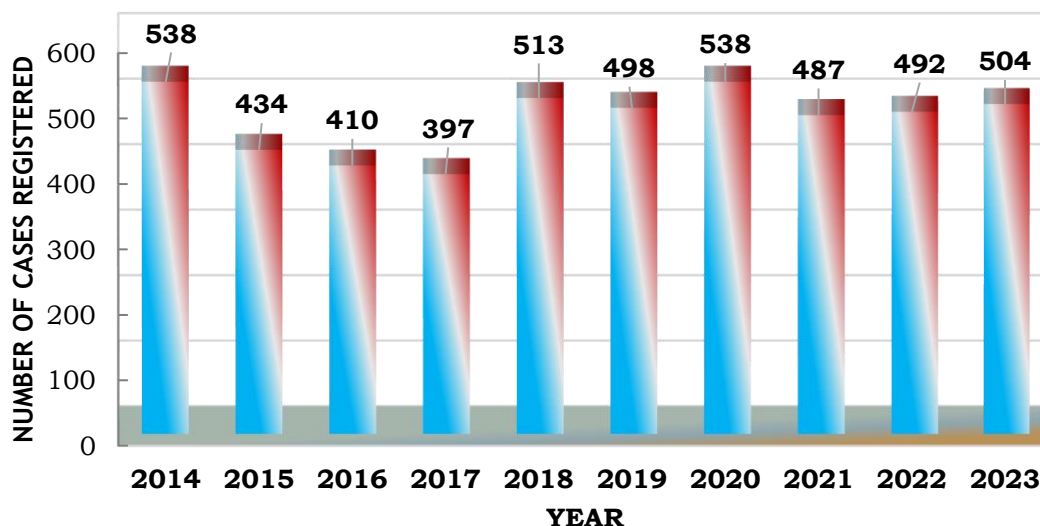
CHART-1.14**INCIDENTS OF HURT DURING (2014-2023)**

(xiii). Assault on Women:
(Increase of 2.43%)

A total of 504 cases were reported during the year, showing an increase of 2.43% over the previous year. District Kangra has reported the highest number of incidents (81), followed by Mandi (74), Shimla (57), Hamirpur (51),

Sirmaur (44), Una (32), Solan (30), Nurpur, Kullu & Chamba (28 each) Bilaspur (24), Baddi (18), Kinnaur (7) Lahual & Spiti (2). No incident reported in rest of the district/units. Previous 10 years (2014-2023) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.15](#).

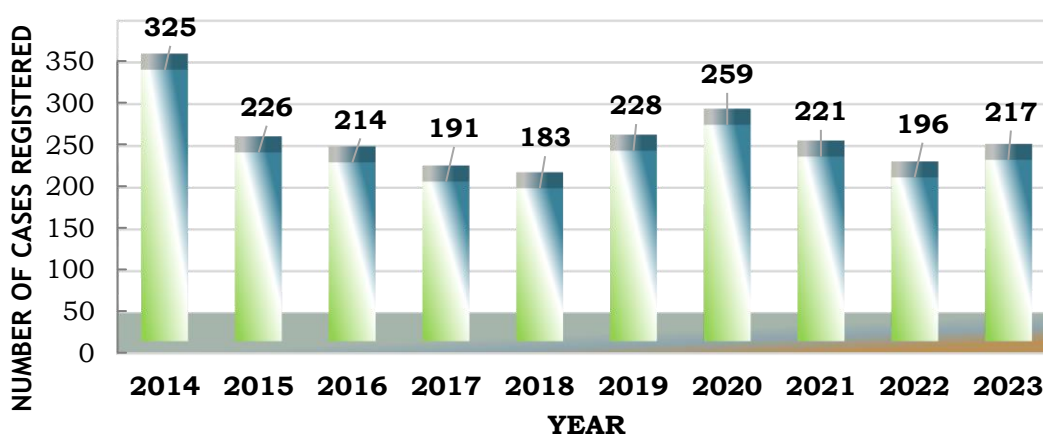
CHART-1.15

(xiv). Cruelty to women:
(Increase of 10.71%)

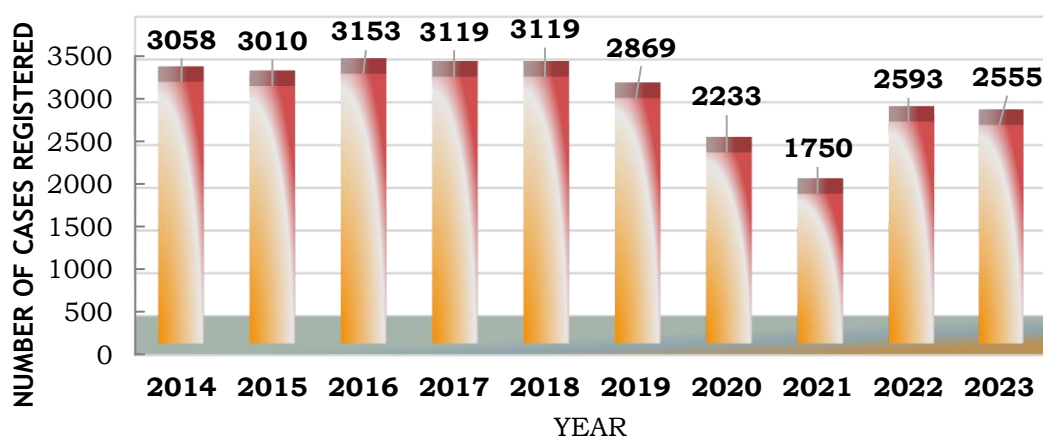
A total of 217 cases were reported during the year, showing an increase of 10.71% over the previous year. 32 cases were reported in district Mandi, followed by Kangra (28), Una (26),

Bilapur (25), Sirmaur (20), Shimla (17), Baddi (16), Hamirpur (15), Solan (14), Kullu & Kinnaur (7 each), Nurpur & Chamba (5 each). No incident reported in Lahul & Spiti district and other units in the State. Previous 10 years (2014-2023) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.16](#).

A total of 2255 cases of accident were registered during the year 2023 showing a decrease of 1.46% over the previous year. The highest number of accidents were registered in district Shimla with 300 cases, followed by Kangra

(295), Mandi (284), Sirmaur (207), Solan (180) Una (179), Baddi (168), Bilaspur (155), Kullu (144), Chamba (95), Hamirpur (93), Nurpur (87) Kinnaur (50), Lahaul & Spiti (18). Previous 10 years (2014-2023) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.17](#).

(xvi). Other IPC Crimes (Increase of 7.79 %)

Cognizable IPC Crimes which do not fall under any of the above specified categories are termed as “Other IPC Crime”. As many as 7561 other IPC crimes, accounting for 55.98% of the Total IPC crimes, were registered in the State during 2023.

Incidents of IPC Crime (Head-wise), along with percentage

share, are presented in Table-1.6. The ten year trend in percentage change (head-wise) is presented in Table-1.7. District-wise and head wise details of IPC offences are available in Table-1.8 and Table-1.9. Previous 10 years (2014-2023) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.18 and percentage of Other IPC cases against IPC cases for the last 10 years is presented in Chart. 1.18.

INCIDENTS OF OTHER IPC CRIMES DURING (2014-2023)

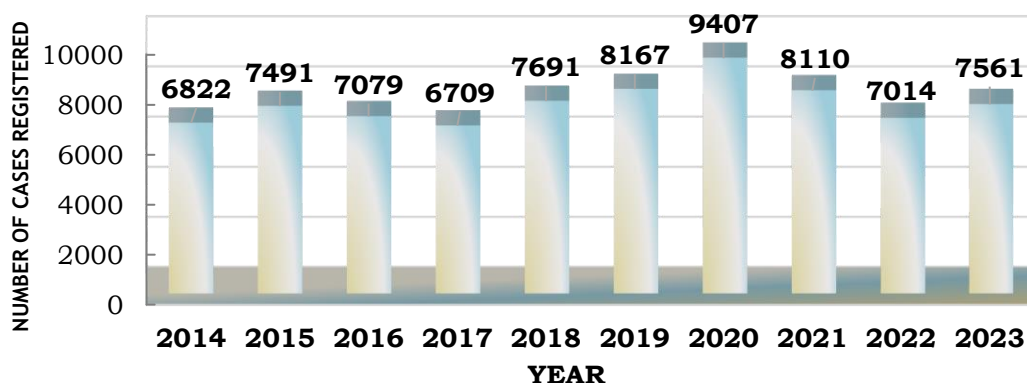

PERCENTAGE OF OTHER IPC CASES AGAINST TOTAL IPC FOR THE LAST 10 YEARS (2014-2023)

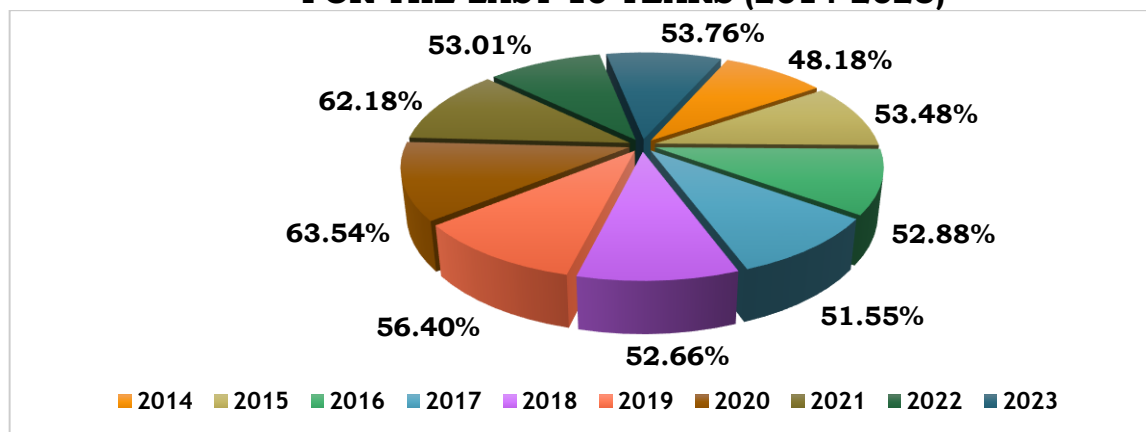
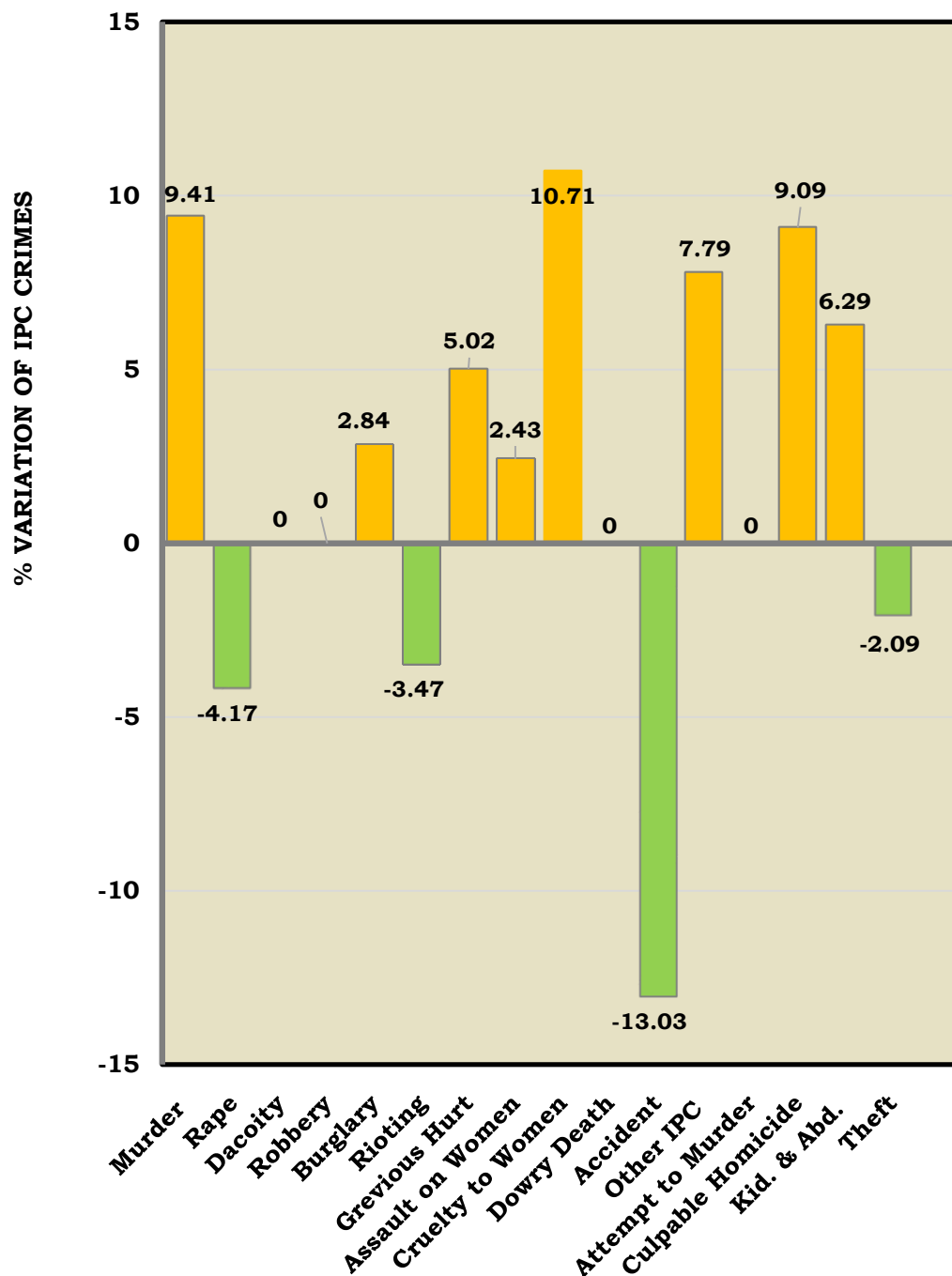

1.8 Crime under Local and Special Laws:

A list of Special and Local Laws is available at Annexure-II. Incidents and rate of cognizable Local & Special Law crimes during 2014 to 2023 are presented in Table-1.10.

A total of 6482 cognizable Local & Special Law (SLL) crimes were registered in the State during 2023. The head-wise percentage distribution of various cognizable crimes under Local & Special Law for 10 years from 2014 to 2023 is presented in Table-1.11. There is an increase of 11.33% in registration over the previous year.

The crime head-wise incidents and rate of cognizable Local & Special Law crimes in different districts are presented in Table-1.12.

Incidents of Local & Special Law cases under important Special and Local Laws are elaborated below:-

1.8.1 Head Wise Analysis of SLL Offences:

(i). Arms Act: (Decrease of 17.24%)

During this year, 24 cases of Arms Act have been

registered, depicting decrease of 17.24% over the previous year. The highest number of incidents under this head were reported in district Bilaspur (5), followed by Shimla & Una (4 each), Baddi (3), Kangra & Mandi (2 each), Solan, Sirmaur, Nurpur & Hamirpur (1 each). No case under this Act was reported in the remaining districts.

(ii). Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act (ND&PS): (Increase of 41.55%)

A total of 2146 cases were registered under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act in the year 2023, as compared to 1516 cases during previous year, showing an increase of 41.55%. Cases under this Act constituted 33.10% against the total Local & Special Law cases reported during 2023. The highest number of incidents under this head were reported in district Shimla (424), followed by Kullu (242), Mandi (227), Bilaspur (208), Kangra (183), Una (174), Nurpur (133), Sirmaur (131), Chamba (117), Solan (108) Hamirpur (87), Baddi (82), Kinnaur (24) and Lahaul & Spiti (6).

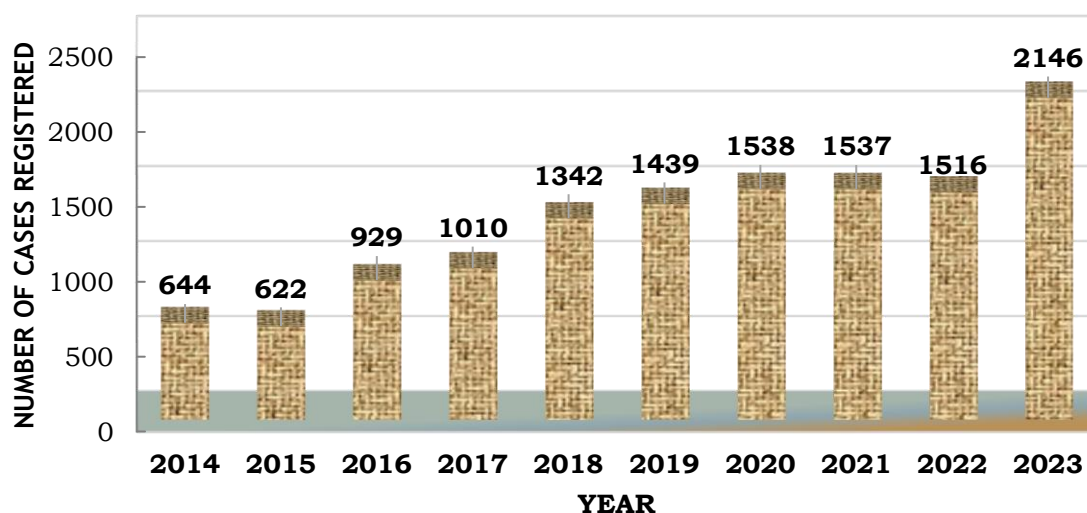
The main concentration on incidents registered under this Act remains in Shimla, Kullu, Mandi, Bilaspur, and Kangra districts, with 59.83 % of the total registered cases. Analysis reveals that the main sources/areas of drugs are Shimla, Mandi, Bilaspur, Kullu and Kangra district. Further, carriers of contraband are mostly peasants, laborers and poor people.

Study of age profile of the accused shows that mostly

adults between 18-30 years of age are involved (49.10%). About 42.56% were in the age group of 30-45 years. Those above 45 years were 8.32%.

The participation of children below 18 years is negligible (0.64%). 46 foreigners were involved in this activity, which include 09 African, European (06) and 31 Asian (Nepalese). Previous 10 years (2014-2023) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.21.

(iii). Gambling Act: (Increase of 9.27%)

A total of 601 cases under the Gambling Act have been registered during 2023. The highest

number of cases were reported in district Una (176), followed by Baddi (161), Sirmaur (93), Shimla (40), Kullu (38), Kinnaur (34), Chamba (17), L&S (15), Kangra (8),

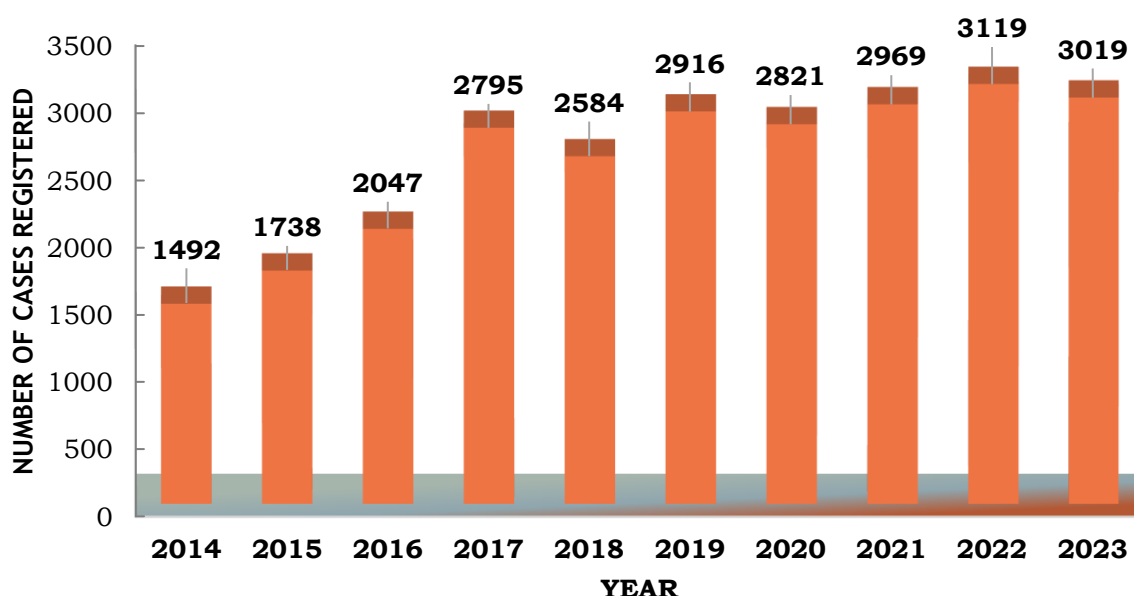
Nurpur & Solan (6 each), Mandi & Hamirpur (3 each), Bilaspur (1). No incident under this head was reported in CID, GRP and Cyber.

(iv). Excise Act: (Decrease of 3.2%)

The cases registered 3019 under the Excise Act showed decrease of 3.2% over the previous year. Cases under this Act contributed 46.57% against the total cases under Local & Special Law (SLL) reported during 2023.

The highest number of cases were reported in district Kangra 449), followed by Mandi (388), Chamba (364), Kullu (327), Shimla (274), Nurpur (267), Sirmaur (215), Una & Kinnaur (133), Baddi (121), Bilaspur (107), Hamirpur (94), Solan (77), L&S (69) and GRP (1). The lowest number of cases under this Act were registered in GRP (1). Previous 10 years (2014-2023) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.22](#).

DETECTION UNDER EXCISE ACT DURING 2014-2023



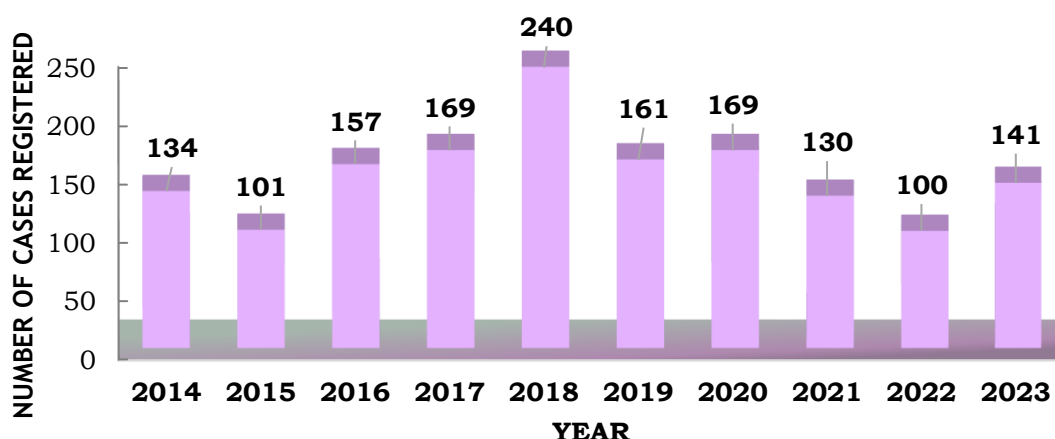
(v). Forest Act: (Increase of 41%)

The number of cases (141) registered under the Forest Act showed an increase of 41% over the previous year. Kullu district has reported the highest number of cases (25), Mandi (23), Shimla (18), Una (16), Chamba (15), Sirmaur (14), Baddi (9), Nurpur & Kangra (6 each), Solan & Bilaspur (3 each), Hamirpur (2) and Kinnaur (1). The

lowest registration under this Act was seen in Kinnaur (1). No case under this head was reported in districts/units.

The analysis reveals that majority of the cases have been registered in districts Kullu, Mandi, Shimla, Una, Chamba, Baddi, Sirmaur & Kangra. Previous 10 years (2014-2023) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.23](#).

**(vi). Protection of Civil Rights Act: (Variation 100%)**

During the year 2023, 2 incidents under the PCR Act was reported in Kinnaur district. No case under this head was registered in rest of the districts. Previous 10 years (2014-2023) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.24](#).

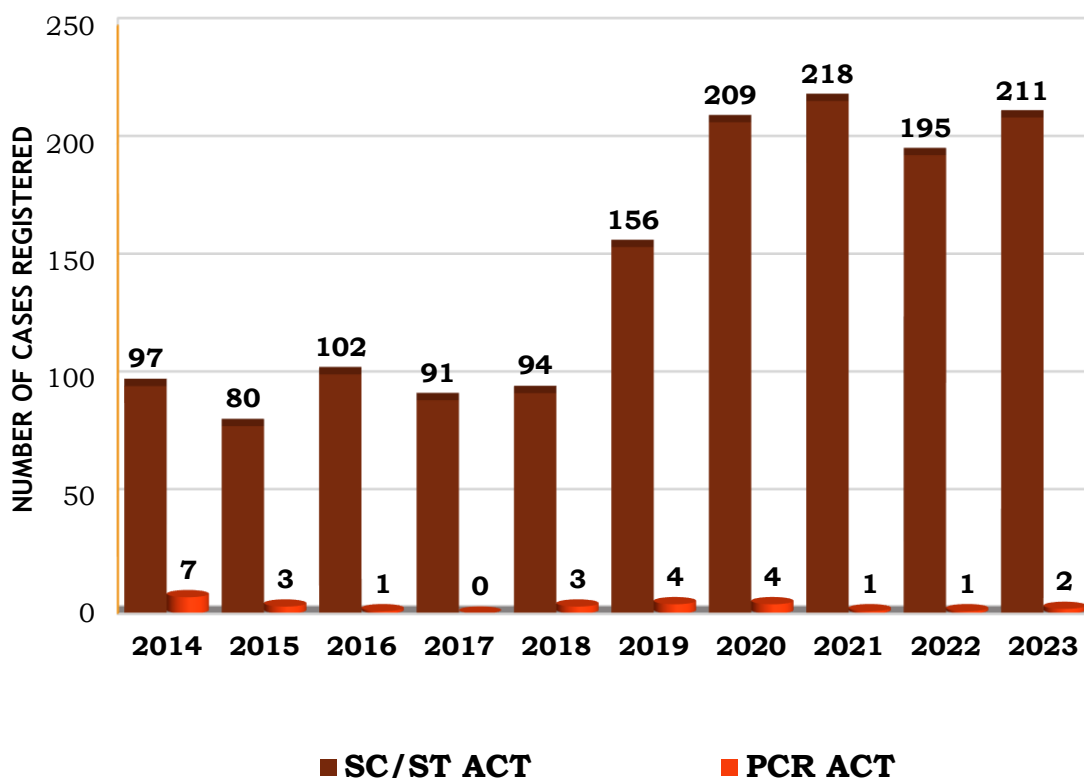
(vii). SC/ST (Prevention of Atrocities) Act: (Increase of 8.20%)

A total of 211 cases were registered under the SC/ST Prevention of Atrocities Act, as against 195 cases during the previous year; an increase of 8.20%. The highest numbers of (46) cases were reported in district Hamirpur, followed by Mandi (45),

Una & Shimla (20 each), Kangra (17), Nurpur (15) Bilaspur (12), Kullu (11), Sirmaur (08), Solan & Baddi (6 each) and Chamba (5). The lowest number of cases under this Act were registered in Kullu, Sirmaur, Solan, Baddi and Chamba. No incident under this Act was reported in Districts Kinnaur, L&S and CID, GRP and Cyber units.

The analysis reveals that crime under this head is high in Hamirpur, Mandi, Una, Shimla & Kangra. The most common reason for registering cases under this Act is a feeling of hurt when one is called by derogatory names. Previous 10 years (2014-2023) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.24.

(viii). Other Local & Special Law Cases (including Wild life Act, PDP Act, EC Act etc.)

(Increase of 8.33%)

A total of 338 Other Local & Special Law cases were reported under the Acts mentioned above. These have shown an increase of 8.33 % over the previous year (312 cases). The highest number of cases were reported from Cyber Crime (68).

During 2023, a total of 6482 cognizable crimes were

reported in the State under various heads of Local & Special Laws (SLL), which shows an increase of 11.33 % over the previous year.

It is observed that 7 specific crime heads accounted for 94.78% of the total SLL crimes while the remaining 5.21% were clubbed as other SLL crimes. Previous 10 years (2014-2023) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.25.

DURING 2014-2023

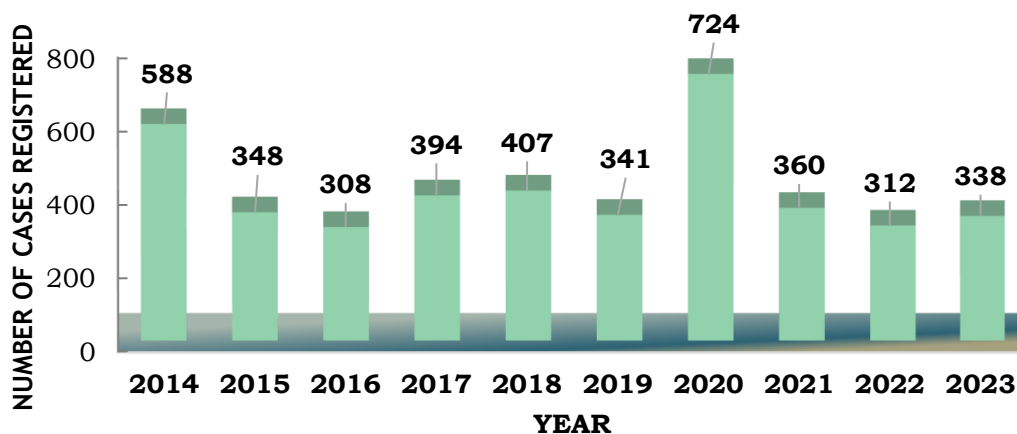
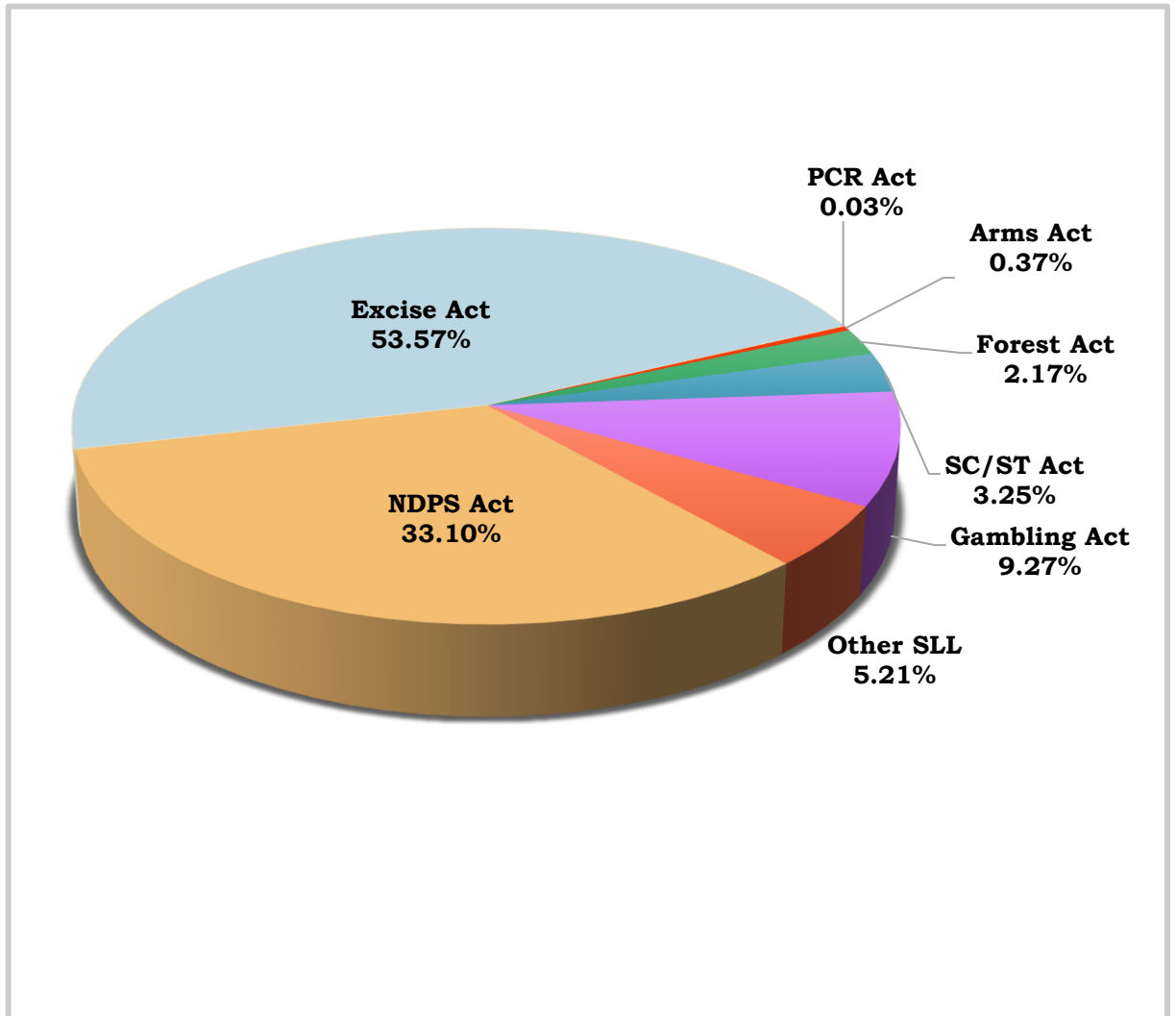

(IPC+SLL) DURING - 2023

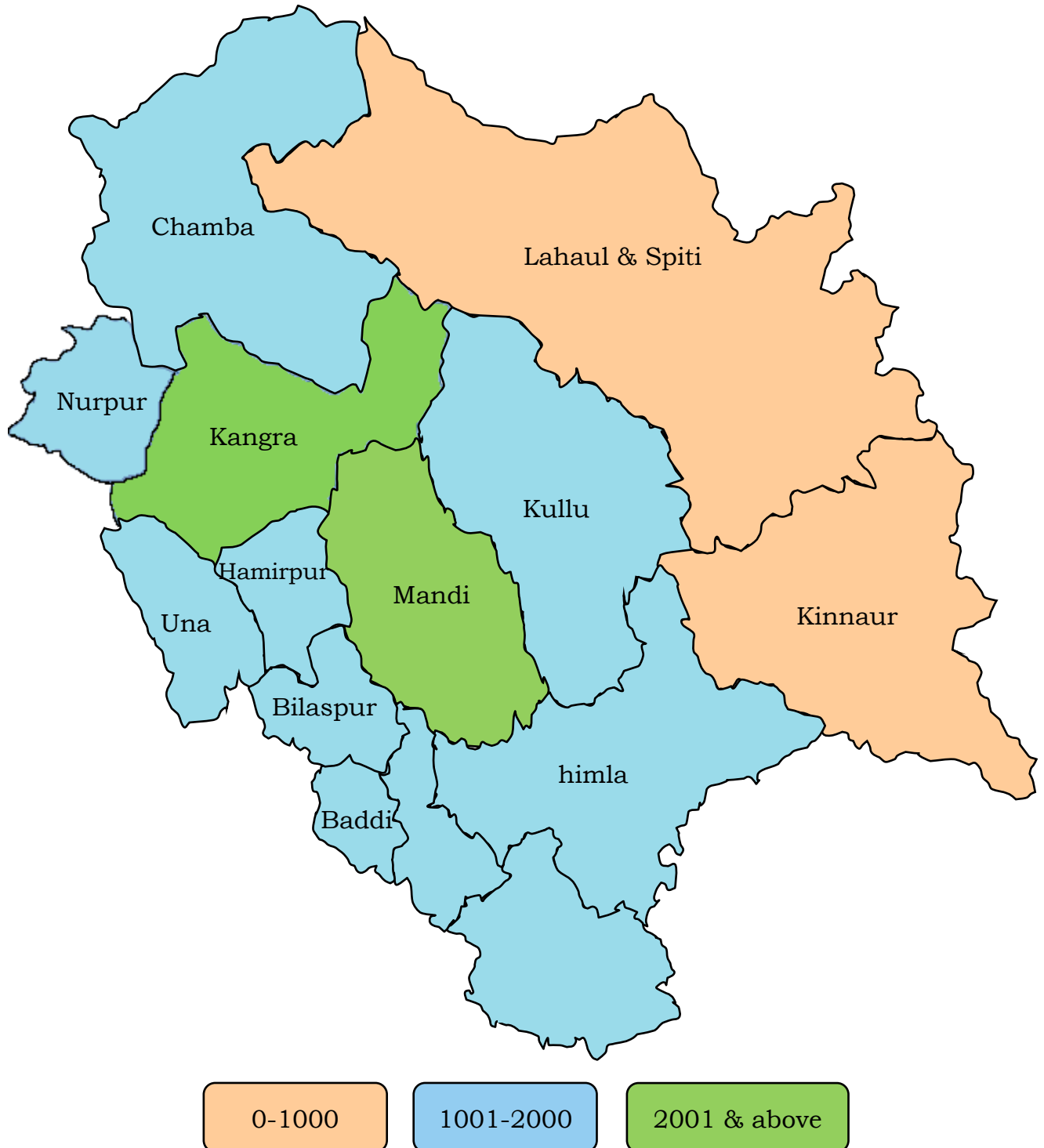

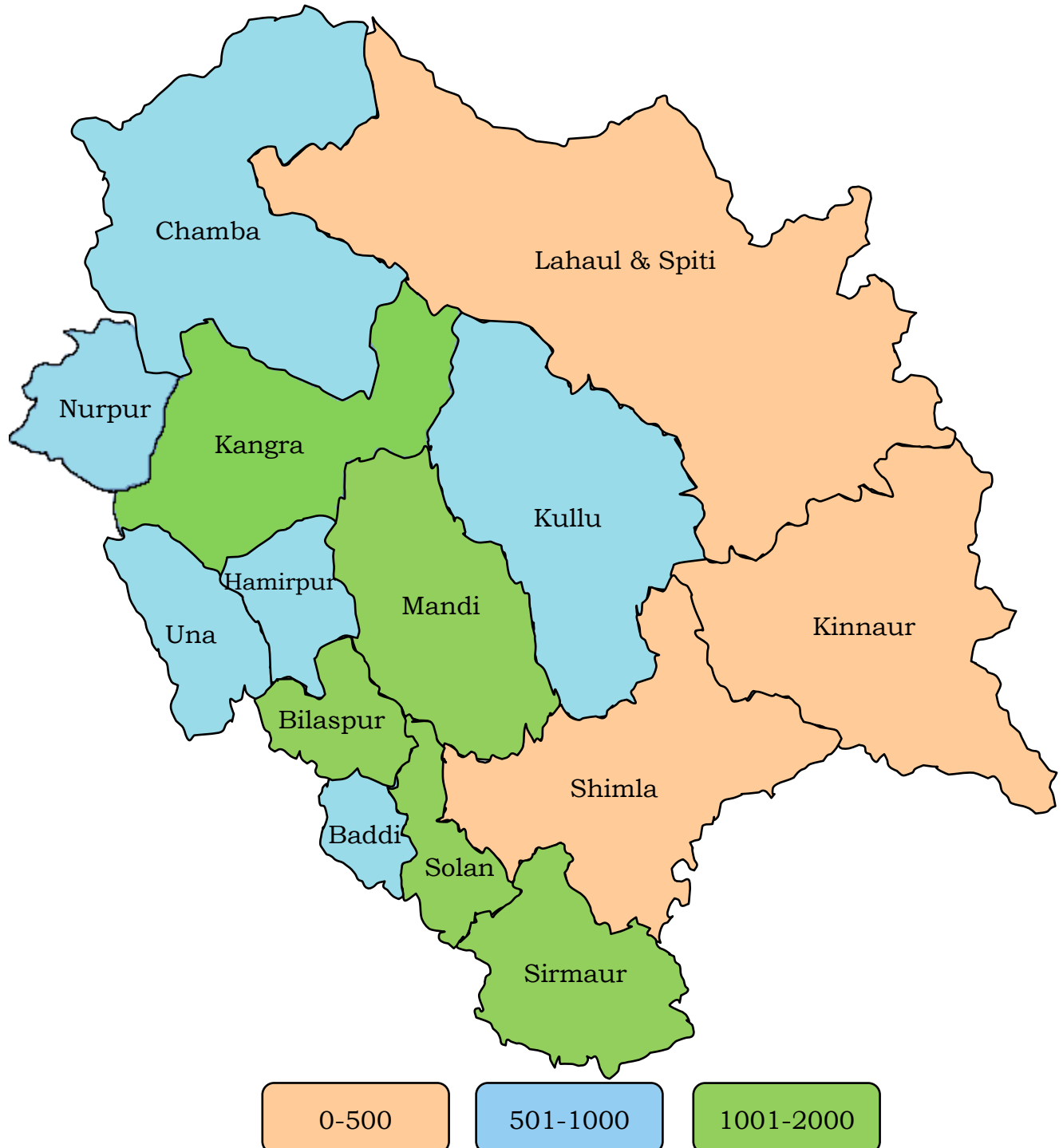

COGNIZABLE CRIMES (SLL) DURING - 2023

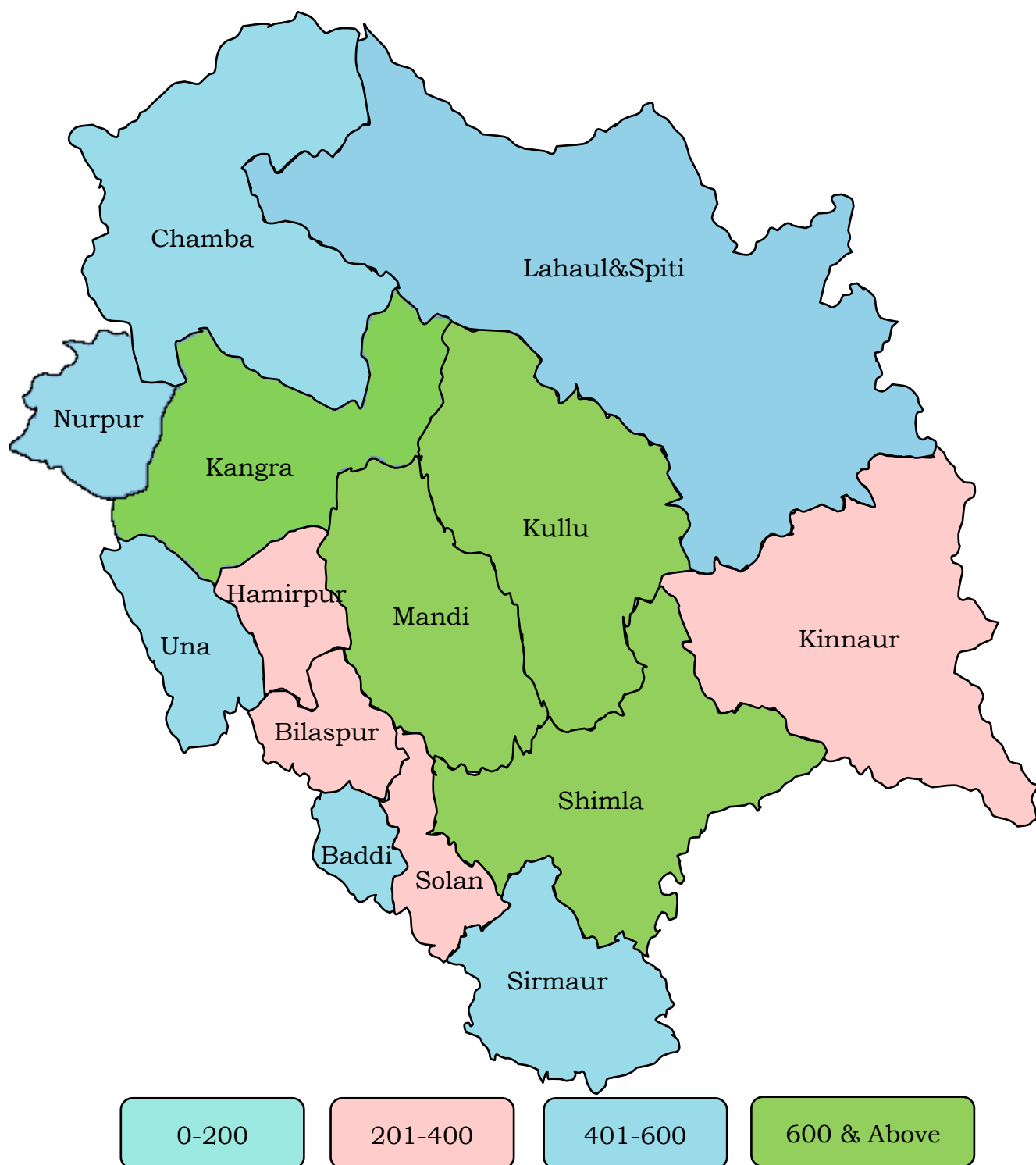
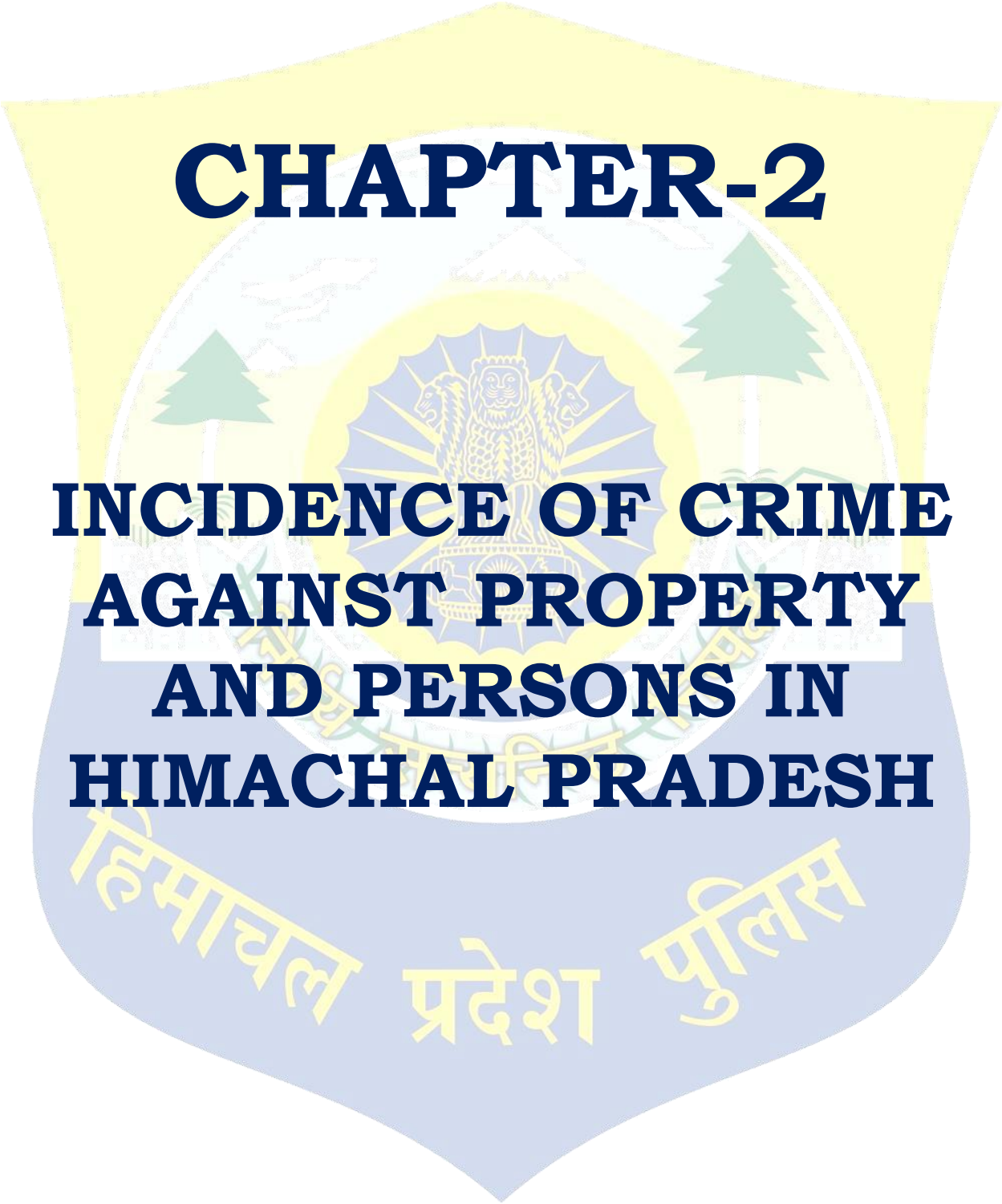

INCIDENCE OF CRIME AGAINST PROPERTY AND PERSONS IN HIMACHAL PRADESH

2.1 Crime against Property:

Offences under this head include the cases of **Theft, Burglary, Robbery & Dacoity**. The head wise analysis of crime against property for the year 2023 is as under:-

(i) Theft and Burglary:

(Decrease of 2.09% & Increase of 2.84% respectively)

During the year 2023, 655 cases of theft and 506 cases of burglary were registered, which is a decrease of 14 cases in theft and increase of 14 cases in burglary over the previous year. The cases of both these heads have been categorized under major heads namely: - Auto theft, theft of Cash & Jewelry, Cultural Property theft, theft of electronic components and theft of other materials. Incidence of theft cases is concentrated mostly in the 7 districts i.e. Solan, Sirmaur, Una, Shimla, Bilaspur, Kangra, Baddi and Mandi.

(ii) Robbery: **No increase**

During the year 2023, 8 cases of Robbery were registered in

the State as compared to 8 cases during the previous year. The highest number of incidents were reported in district Kangra, Mandi and Sirmaur (2 each), followed by Solan and Una (1 each). No case under this head was reported in rest of the districts of the State.

(iii) Dacoity: **Increase of 50%**

During the year 2023, 2 cases of Dacoity were registered an increase of 1 case over the previous year. One case under this head was registered in district Kangra.

2.2 Value of Property Stolen and Recovered:

Recovery increased by 43.3%

During the year 2023, property worth Rs. 2219.72 lakhs was reported stolen in 1171 cases, as compared Rs. 1722.91 lakhs in 1170 cases during the previous year.

Property worth Rs. 1222.17 lakhs was recovered during 2023. The percentage of recovery is 55.05%. The value of

property recovered showed an increase of 43.30% over the previous year.

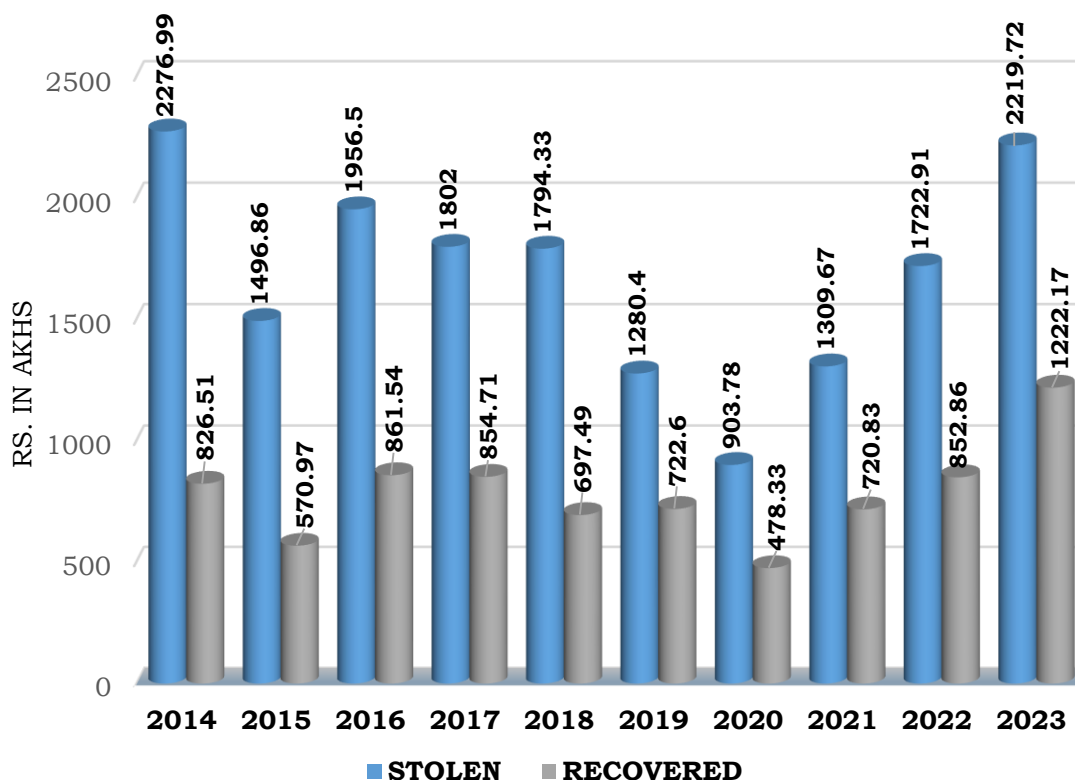

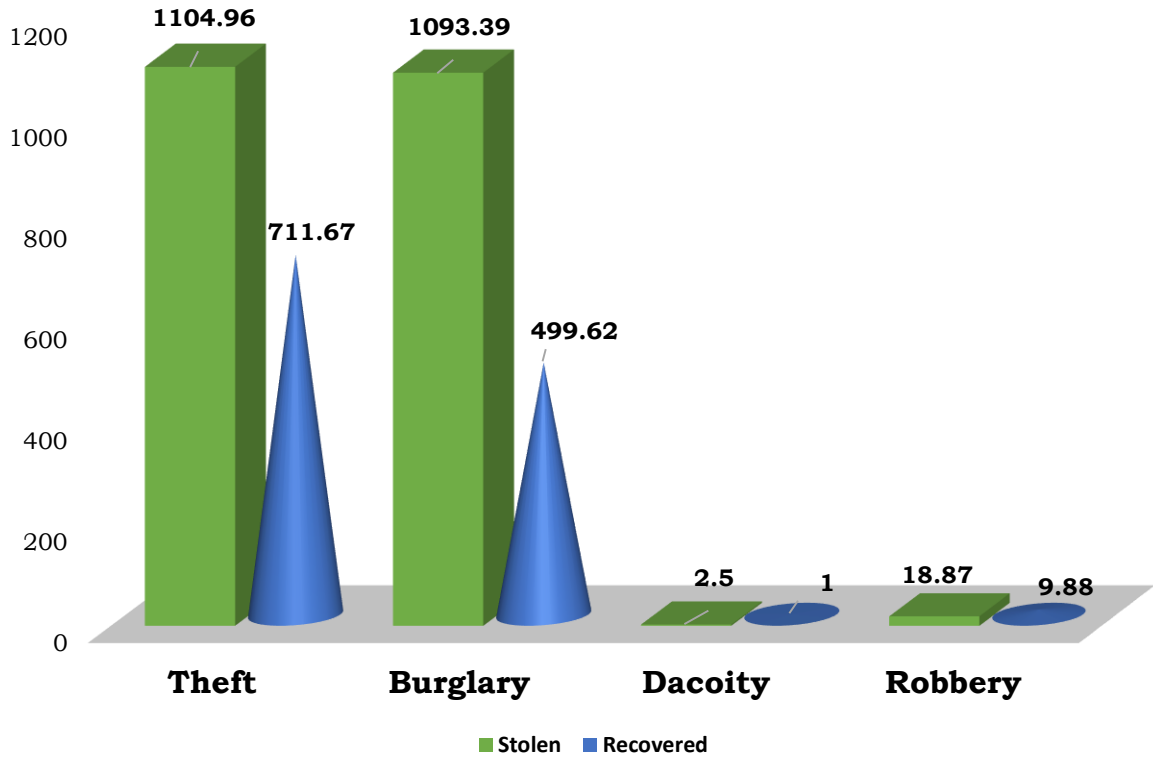
VALUE OF PROPERTY STOLEN AND RECOVERED DURING THE PERIOD 2014-2023

Crime head and district wise value of property stolen recovered, including percentage of recoveries, is presented in **Table 2.3**.

Shimla district reported the highest value of property stolen (Rs. 4,17,42,104/-) followed by Sirmaur (Rs. 2,76,02,058/-), Kangra (Rs. 2,59,43,399/-), Solan (Rs. 2,27,89,869/-), Bilaspur (Rs. 2,00,51,412/-), Mandi (Rs. 1,97,40,905/-), Una (Rs. 1,56,20,293/-), Baddi (Rs. 1,47,04,156/-), and Hamirpur

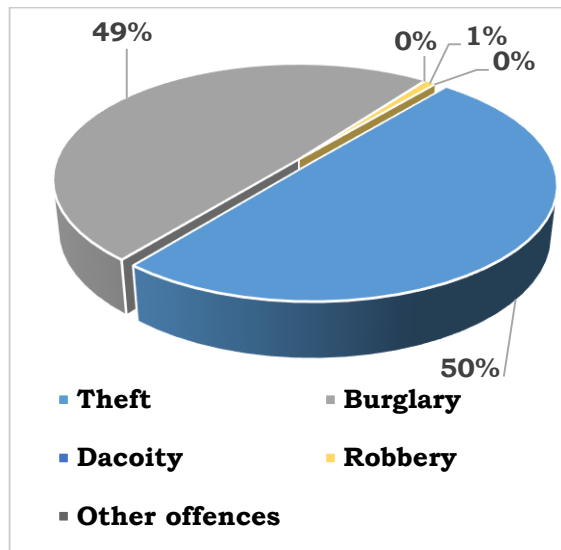
(Rs.1,11,60,202/-). Rest of the districts reported less than 1 crore value of property stolen.

The highest value of recovery was seen in District Shimla (Rs. 2,73,86,489 /-).

The highest recovery percentage of stolen property was seen in district Chamba (81.1%), followed by Kullu (71.2%), Bilaspur (69.8%), Hamirpur (69.5%), and Shimla (65.6%).

Chart 2.3 represents the crime head wise percentage of property stolen during 2023.

2.3 Category of Offences (Incidence and Value):

Among the four different types of property crimes, the maximum stolen value of property (Rs. 1104.96 Lakhs) and share (49%) were seen under the head Theft. The minimum stolen value of Rs. 2.5 Lakhs and share (0.11%) was seen under the head Dacoity.

The maximum value of property was recovered in Theft (64.40%), followed by Robbery

(52.40%), Burglary (45.70%) and Dacoity (40.00%). The crime head-wise value of property stolen and recovered over the last 10 years (2014 to 2023) is presented in **Table 2.4**.

2.4 Nature of Property :

Nature of property under heads Theft and Burglary have been classified into four different categories viz. Auto Theft, Theft of Cash and Jewelry, theft of Cultural Property, Theft of electronic items, Household articles/furniture. Properties other than the above specified categories are clubbed as 'other kind of property'. The category wise number of cases in which property was found stolen and recovered therein and percentage thereof has been calculated and presented in **Table 2.5**.

CRIME HEAD WISE PERCENTAGE OF PROPERTY RECOVERED DURING THE YEAR 2023

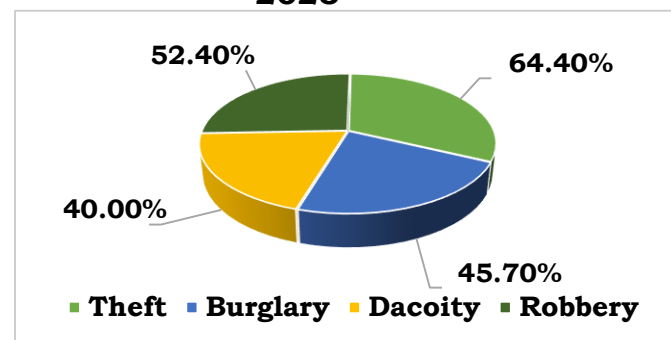

(WORKED OUT) - 2023**

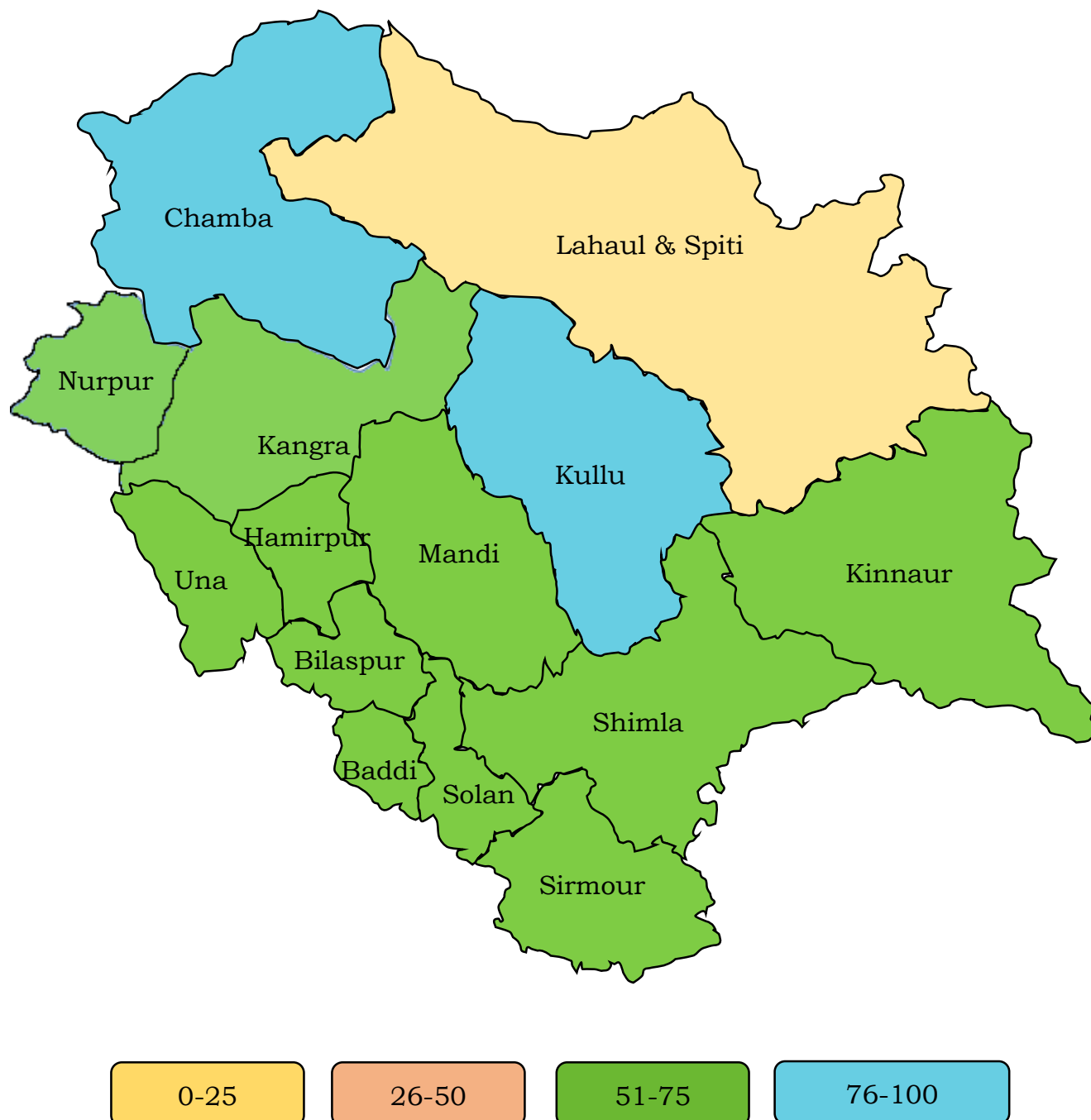

2.6 Crime against Persons:-

Crime against persons includes 10 different types of crime heads viz. Murder, Culpable Homicide not amounting to Murder, Attempt to Murder, Rape, Kidnapping & Abduction, Dowry Death, Grievous Hurt, Rioting and Cruelty to Women.

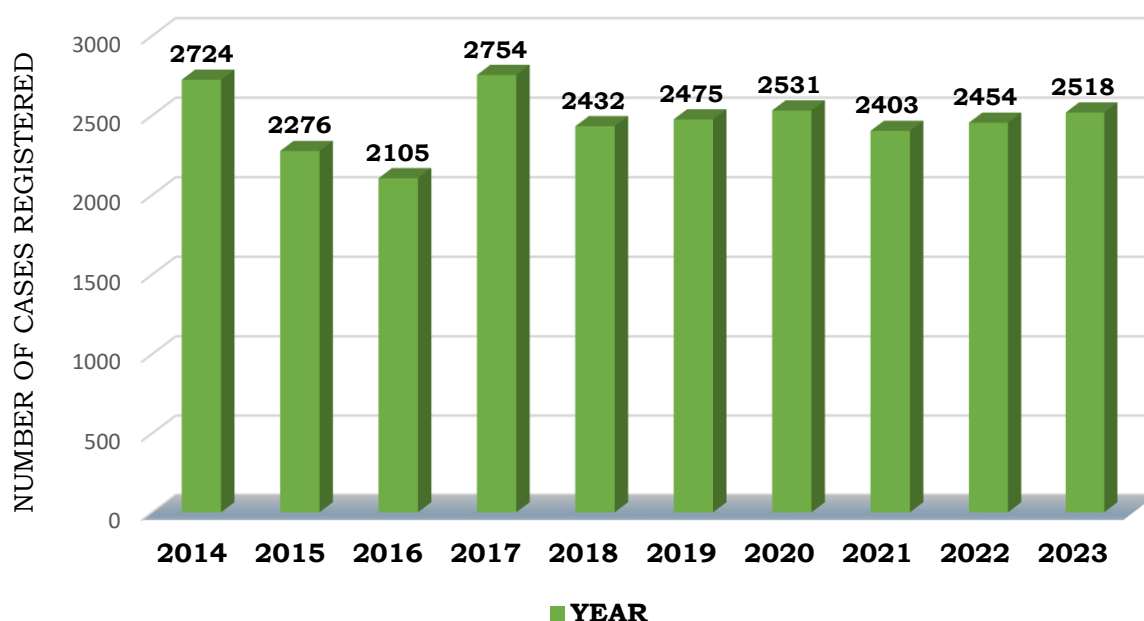
The analysis reveals that a total of 2518 cases of crime

against persons have occurred during 2023, which comprises 18.64% of the total IPC crime. The highest percentage of crime against persons over the total IPC crimes was recorded in districts Sirmaur (22.88%), Nurpur (22.38%), Chamba (20.94%), Kinnaur (20.90%), Una (20.66%), Hamirpur (19.36%), Kullu (18.99%), Baddi (18.59%), Shimla (18.37%), Mandi (18.25%) and L&S (17.50%). The district-wise details

have been calculated and presented in **Table 2.7**. The district-wise incidents and their percentage over

the IPC crime is depicted in **Chart 2.6**.

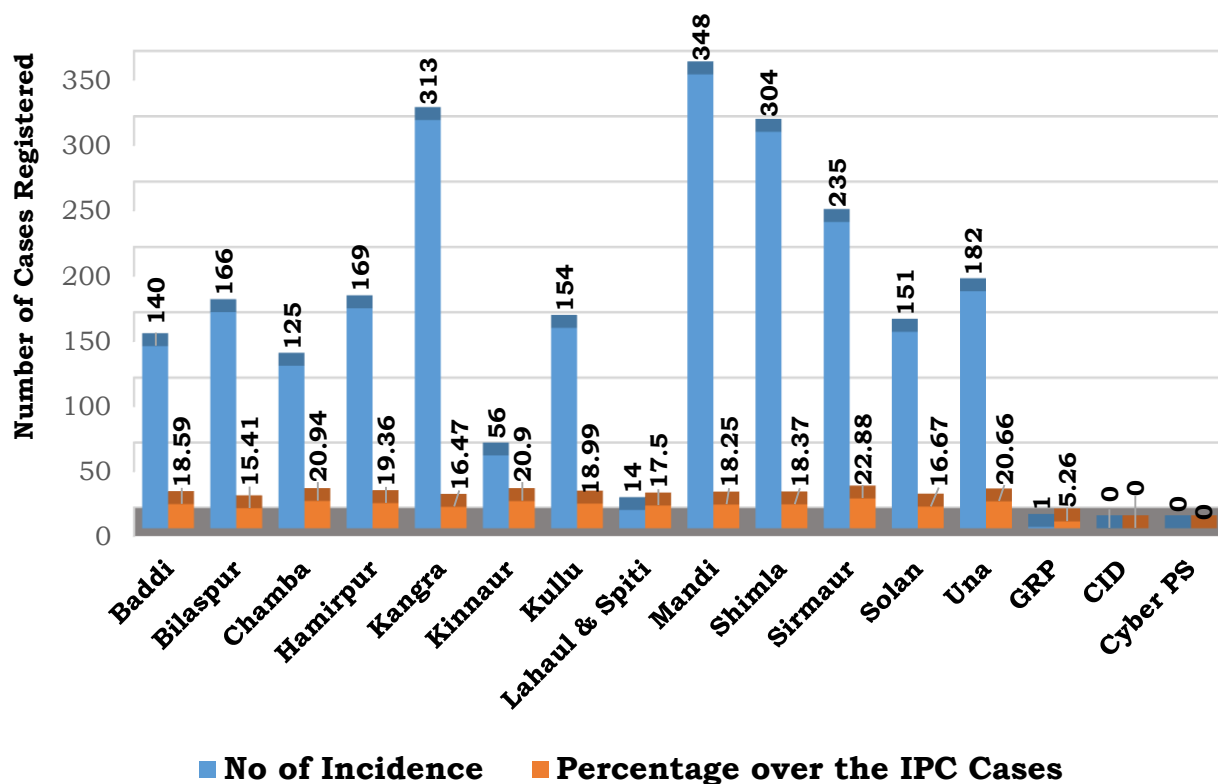
CHART 2.5

The highest number of incidents of crime against persons have been recorded in district Mandi (348), followed by Kangra (313), Shimla (304), Sirmaur (235), Una (182), Hamirpur (169), Bilaspur (166), Nurpur (160), Kullu (154), Solan (151), Baddi (140), Chamba (125), Kinnaur (56), Lahaul & Spiti (14) and GRP (1). No case were reported in CID & Cyber PS. The District-wise details have been calculated and presented in **Table 2.8**.

The head-wise comparative analysis of incidences of crime against persons for the last 10 years (2014 to 2023) has been reviewed. During the year 2023, 2518 incidents have been recorded; an increase of 64 cases over the previous year. The head-wise figures for the last 10 years are presented in **Table 2.9**. **Chart 2.6** shows the total crime against persons and its percentage over the total IPC crime.

The head-wise reported incidences of crime against persons and their comparison with those of the previous year is as under:-

(i) Murder: Increase of 9.4 %

During the year 2023, 93 incidents of Murder were reported, as compared to 85 cases of the previous year. Analysis of these cases has revealed that no organized gang is operating in the State. In most of these cases, crime is committed due

to various types of disputes, murder for gain, personal enmity, love affairs and illicit relationships. There was no class or caste factor involved in the commission of these murders.

(ii) Attempt to Murder: No variation

74 incidents of Attempt to Murder were reported during the year 2023 as compared to 74 cases during the previous year and there is no variation over the previous year.

The motive for the commission of this crime is also the same as mentioned under the head 'Murder'

(iii) Culpable Homicide not amounting to Murder:

Increase of 9.09%

12 incidents of Culpable Homicide not amounting to Murder were reported during the year 2023, an increase of 1 case over the previous year.

(iv) Rape: Decrease of 4.17%

344 cases of Rape were reported during the year 2023, a decrease of 15 cases over the previous year.

(v) Kidnapping and Abduction: Increase of 6.29%

During 2023, 439 cases were registered; an increase of 26 cases over the previous year. Analysis shows that 42.14% cases of Kidnapping & Abduction were reported in districts Mandi, Shimla and Kangra.

(vi) Grievous Hurt:

Increase of 5.02%

A total of 502 incidents of Grievous Hurt were reported during 2023. Analysis shows that

49.40% incidents of Grievous Hurt were reported in districts Kangra, Mandi, Nurpur and Shimla.

(vii) Rioting: Decrease of 3.47%

During the year 2023, 333 incidents of Rioting were reported in the State, as against 345 cases during the previous year; a decrease of 12 cases. Analysis shows that 45.04% incidents of rioting were reported in districts Sirmaur, Nurpur, Kangra and Shimla.

(viii) Cruelty to Women:

Increase of 10.7%

A total of 217 cases of Cruelty to Women were reported in the State during the year 2023, an increase of 21 cases over the previous year. The incidents under this head have been reviewed in detail in the separate chapter "Crime against Women".

(ix) Assault on women:

Increase of 2.43%

During the year 2023, 504 incidents of Molestation were reported in the State, as against the 492 incidents of the previous year; a decrease of 12 cases. The cases under this head have been reviewed in detail

in the separate chapter “Crime against Women”

(x) Dowry Deaths:

Decrease of 100%

During the year 2023, no case of Dowry Death reported. The incidents under this head have been reviewed in detail in the separate chapter “Crime against Women”.

2.7 Overall Review of Crime against Person:

The incidence of crime against persons is higher in districts Mandi, Kangra, Shimla and Sirmaur as compared to the other districts of the State. Offences of murder have however taken place in the entire State with no specific concentration.

(DISTRICT WISE)**

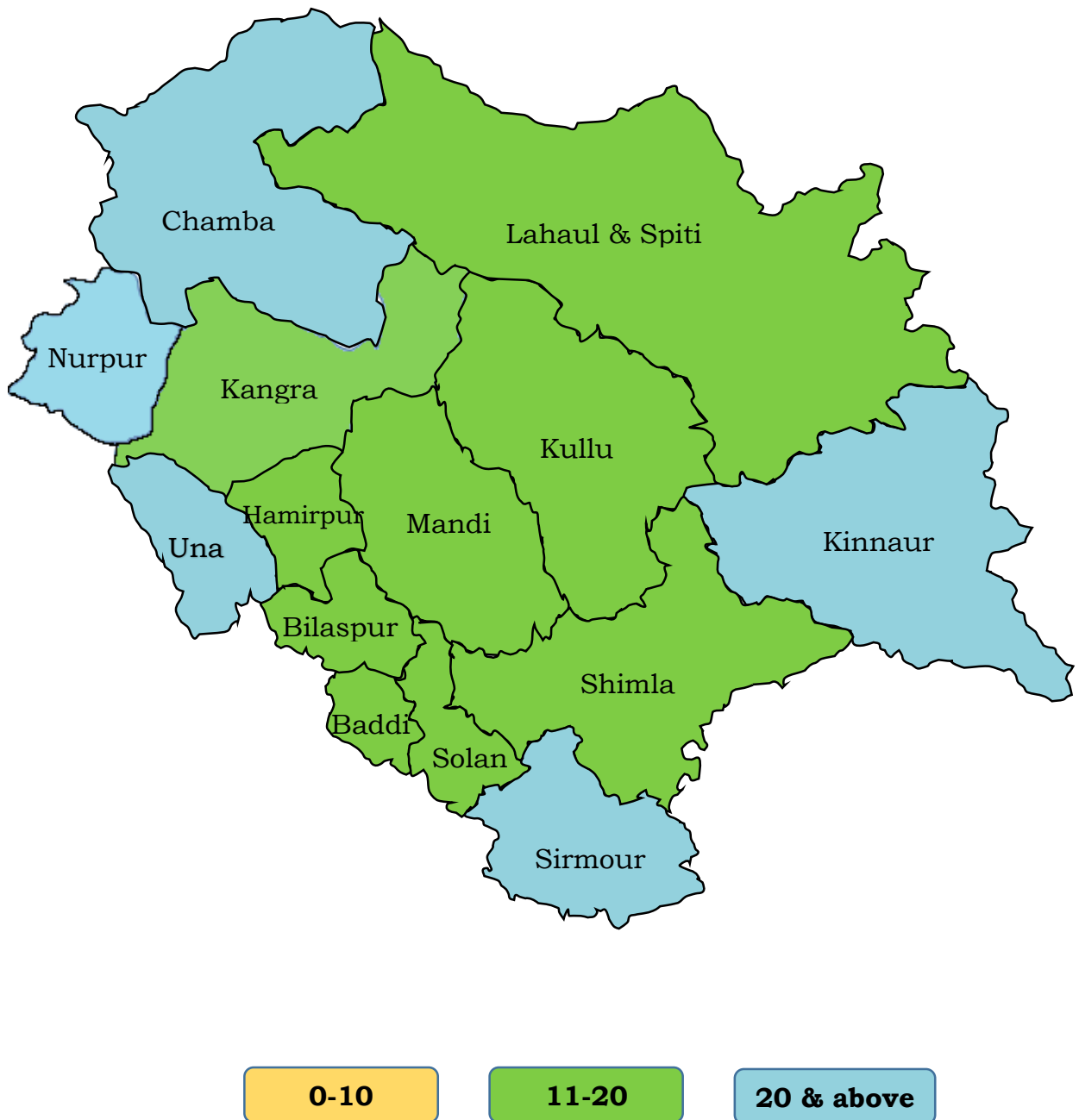

TRENDS IN DISPOSAL OF IPC CRIMES AND SLL CRIMES BY POLICE AND COURTS

3.1 Disposal by Police

3.1.1 Cases under IPC:

During 2023, a total of 16977 cases including cases pending from the previous years, were under investigation. Out of these, 13630 cases were disposed by the police during the year and 3347 cases remained pending for investigation.

Table-3.1 presents the details of crime head wise Police disposal during 2023. Tables-3.2 & 3.3 give district wise details of disposal and percentage of disposal respectively. The percentage and type of disposal of under investigation (IPC) cases by police during 2023 is depicted in Chart-3.1.

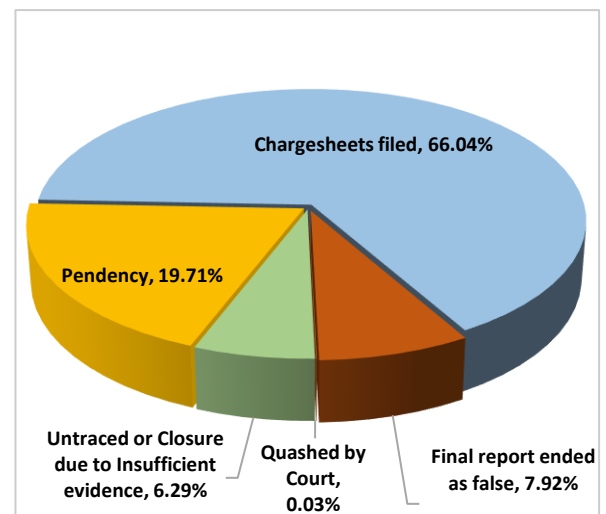
3.1.2 Pendency:

PERCENTAGE DISPOSAL OF UNDER INVESTIGATION (IPC) CASES BY POLICE DURING-2023

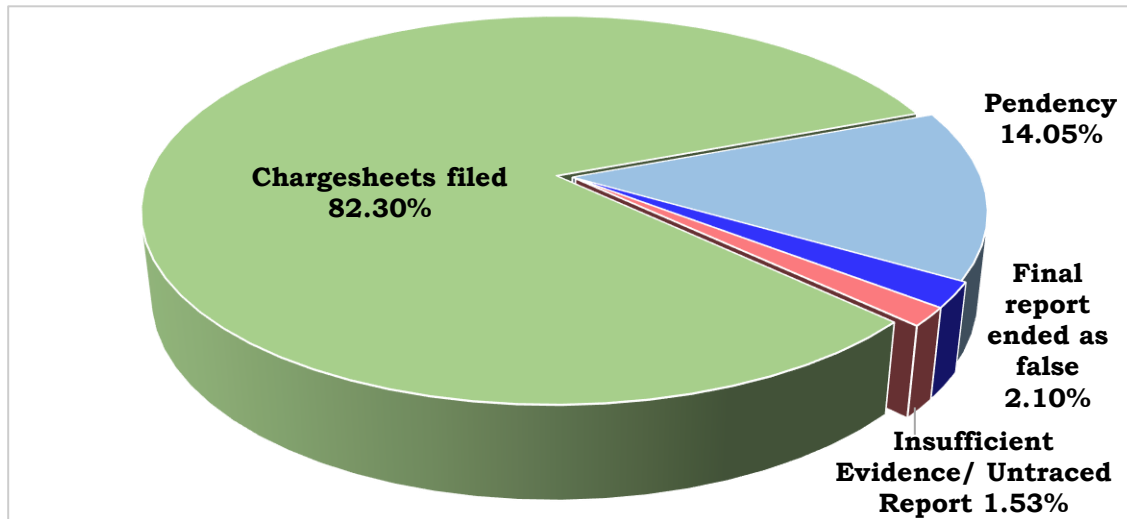


3.1.3 Cases under SLL:

The disposal of SLL cases by police under different crime heads is available at [Table-3.4](#) of the total 7359 cases (including pending

cases from the previous year) pending investigation, police disposed 85.94% cases. [Chart-3.3](#) presents the type of disposal of SLL cases.

BY POLICE DURING 2023



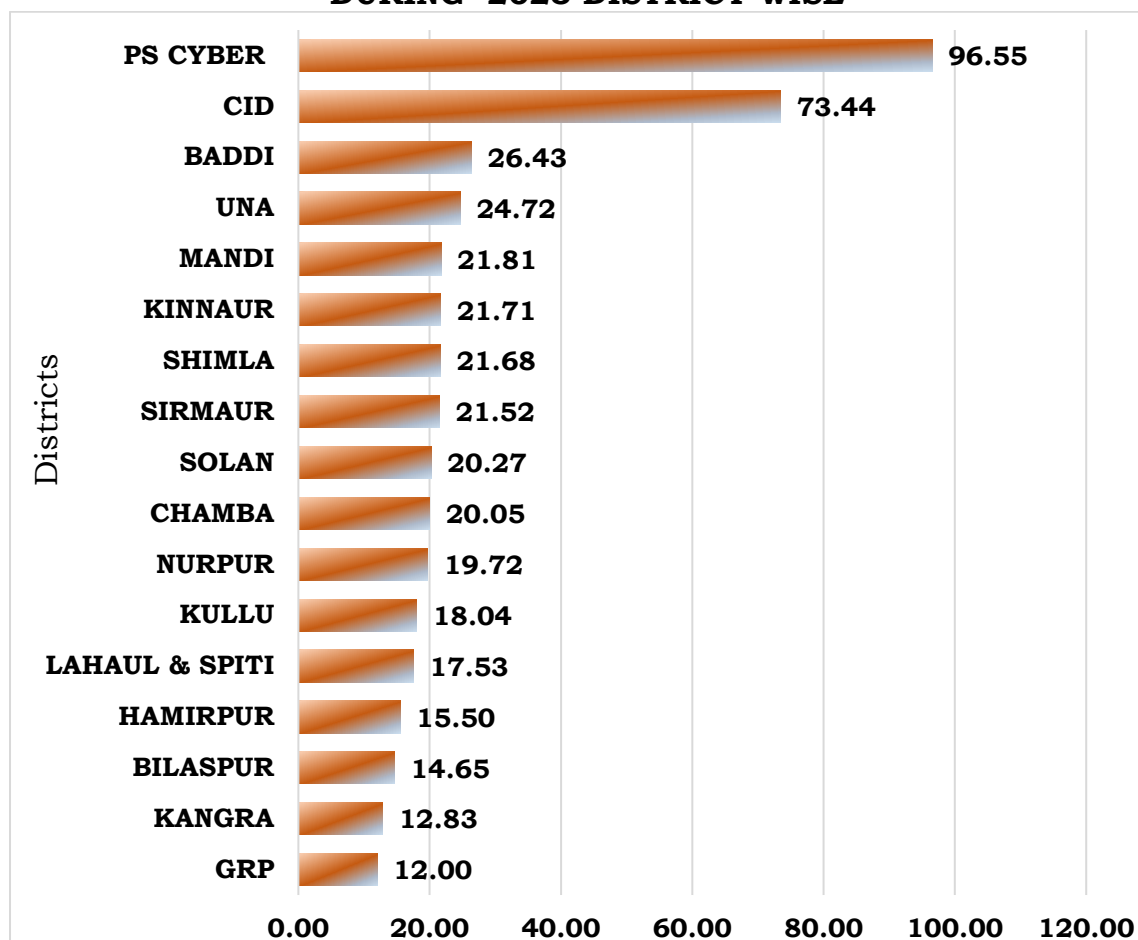

Disposal of IPC cases by the courts during 2023 is presented in [Table 3.7](#). During 2023, there were 126423 cases pending trial (including pending cases from the previous years). 118177 of IPC cases remained pending trial at end of the year. The percentage disposal during the year was 6.52%.

The District wise disposal figures are presented in [Table-3.8](#) and percentage of disposal is presented in [Table-3.9](#). The highest pendency percentage of cases is seen in Cyber (100%), followed by CID (98.63%). The largest number of cases are pending trial in Kangra district (30836), which has a pendency of 24.50% of State level.

Chart-3.5 depicts percentage disposal of IPC cases by the courts during 2022

3.2.2 Cases under SLL:-

Head wise disposal of SLL cases by the courts during 2023 is presented in **Table-3.10**. There were 36666 cases pending trial (including pending cases from the previous years) at the beginning of 2023. Cases which remained pending trial at end of the year were 31267. The percentage of disposal is 14.72%.

PERCENTAGE DISPOSAL OF IPC CASES BY COURTS DURING 2023

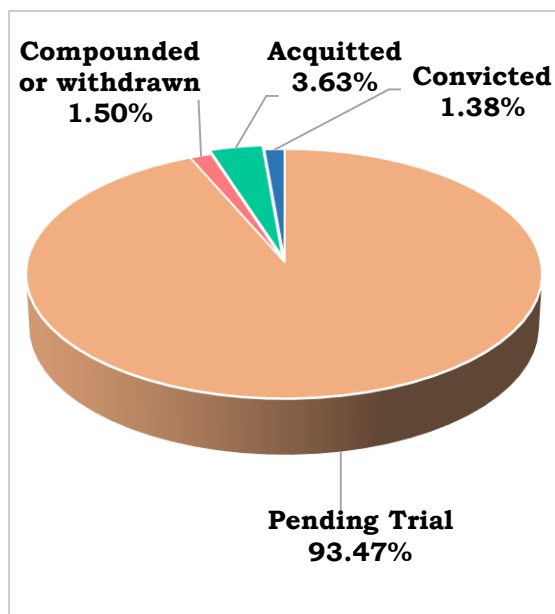

PERCENTAGE DISPOSAL OF SLL CASES BY COURTS DURING 2023

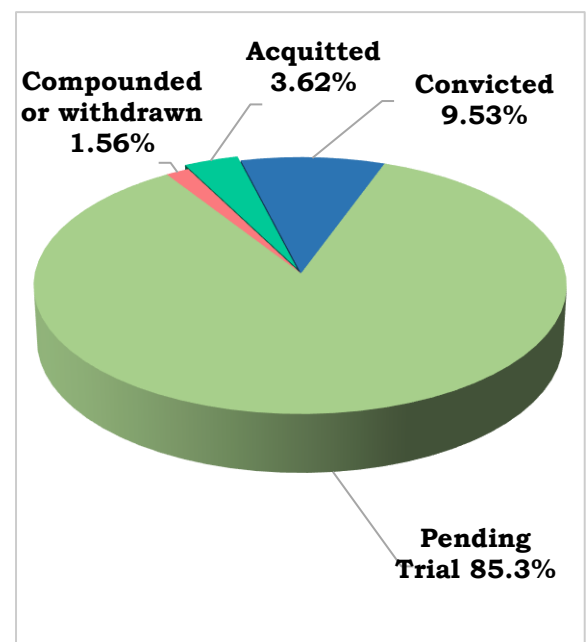

CONVICTED CASES (IPC) DURING 2023

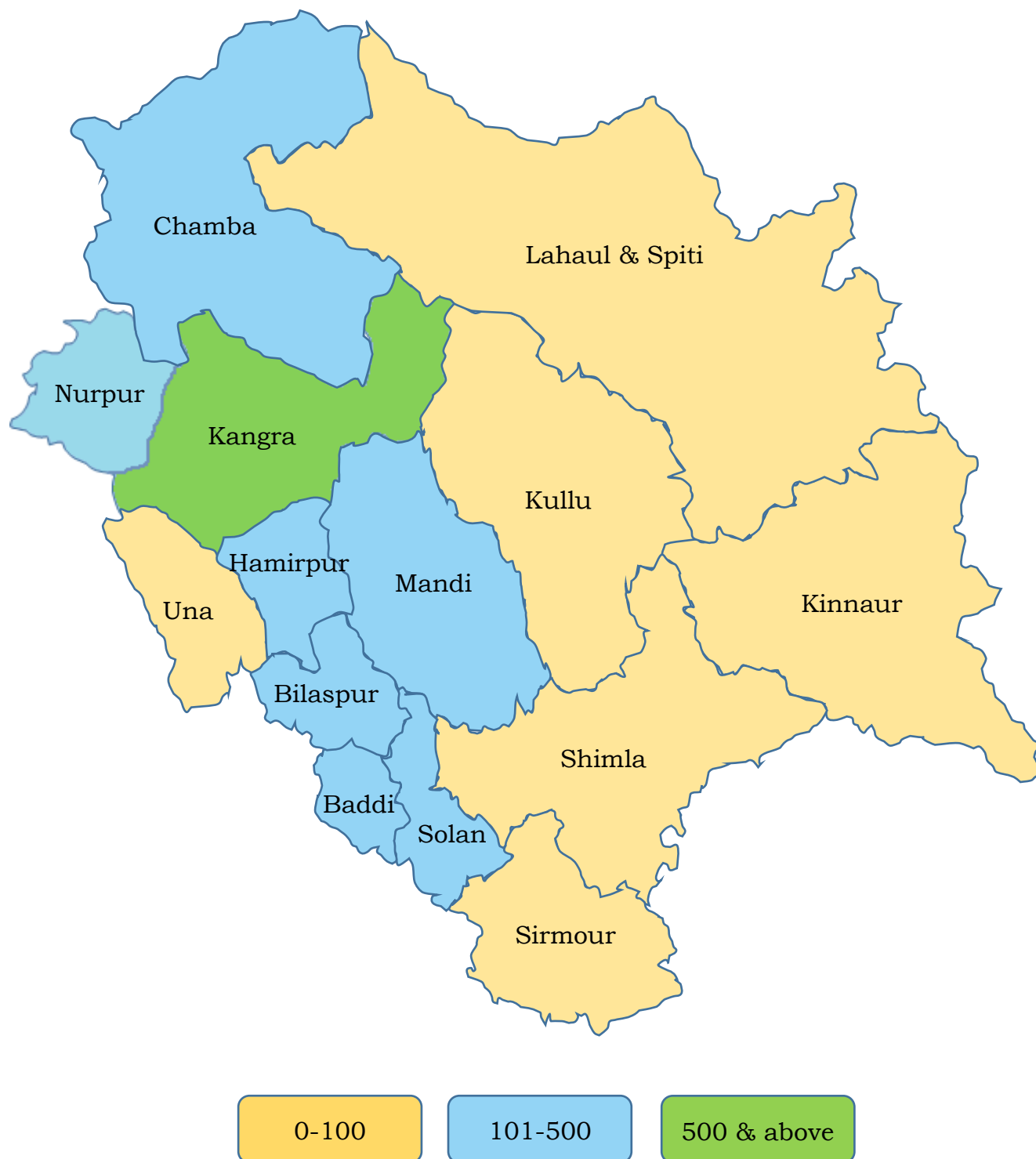

CHAPTER-4

CRIMES AGAINST WOMEN

4.1 General:

Crimes which are directed specifically against women are characterized as Crimes against Women. They may be broadly classified under the following two categories:-

1. Crimes against Women identified under the Indian Penal Code (IPC)

- (i) Murder (Sec. 302, 303 IPC)
- (ii). Dowry Deaths (Sec. 304B IPC)
- (iii) Abetment to Commit Suicide (Sec.306 IPC)
- (iv) Cruelty to Women (Sec. 498A IPC)
- (v) Kidnapping & Abduction (Sec. 363, 366 IPC)
- (vi) Rape
- (vii) Attempt to Commit Rape
- (viii) Assault on Woman with intend to outrage her modesty (Sec.354 IPC)
- (ix) Insult to the modesty of Women (Sec.509 IPC)

2. Crimes against Women Identified under the Special and Local Laws (SLL)

Although all laws are not gender specific, the provisions of laws affecting women significantly have been reviewed periodically and amendments carried out to keep pace with the emerging requirements. Some Acts which have special provisions to safeguard women and their interests are:-

- (i) Immoral Traffic (Prevention) Act, 1956
- (ii) Dowry Prohibition Act, 1961
- (iii) The Child Marriage Restraint Act, 1929
- (iv) Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act, 2005
- (v) Commission of Sati (Prevention) Act, 1987

Crimes against Women are being closely monitored in the State. Several measures have been undertaken to tackle this social menace. Special attention is being paid towards prevention of crimes against women by increased police vigil and by harnessing the community resources.

Crime against women witnessed an increase during the year 2023 in comparison to the previous year. The last 10 years annual average of crime against women is 1565. During the year 2023, 1604 cases of crime against women have been registered in the state. As compared to the 10 years state average, this increase is due to the fact that in past the women usually hesitated to report incidents which took place with them and there have also been certain changes of law. But now on account of increased awareness and change in social values, ethos and social reassurances being provided by the society, free registration of cases, opening of Women Police Stations and Suvidha Yojna started by the HP Police Department, women are more often coming forward to report the offences taking place against them.

The HP Police Department has initiated many steps in the recent years to ensure better police response. Women Police Stations have been opened in all districts except Kinnaur and Lahaul & Spiti to monitor quick disposal of cases of crime against women. A Women

Crime Unit has been constituted at the State CID Hdqrs. 06 Anti Human Trafficking Units (AHTU's) have also been established in Shimla, Kangra, Sirmaur, Kullu, Solan & Chamba. No particular area is prone to crime against women in the State. No special organized gang is operative in the State to commit crime against women.

4.2 Incidents of Crime against Women:

Increase of 3.41%

Head wise incidents of reported Crimes against Women during 2022 and 2023, along with percentage variation are presented in **Table 4.1**.

The cases of assault on women with intent to outrage modesty and cruelty to women together constitute the largest chunk of crime against women (44.95%). There were also a number of instances (21.44%) of rape and (21.88%) Kidnapping and Abduction of women and girls.

The district wise incidents and rate of crimes against women during 2023 are presented in **Table 4.2**, **Chart 4.3** and **Chart 4.4**.

PERCENTAGE DISTRIBUTION OF CRIME AGAINST WOMEN DURING 2023

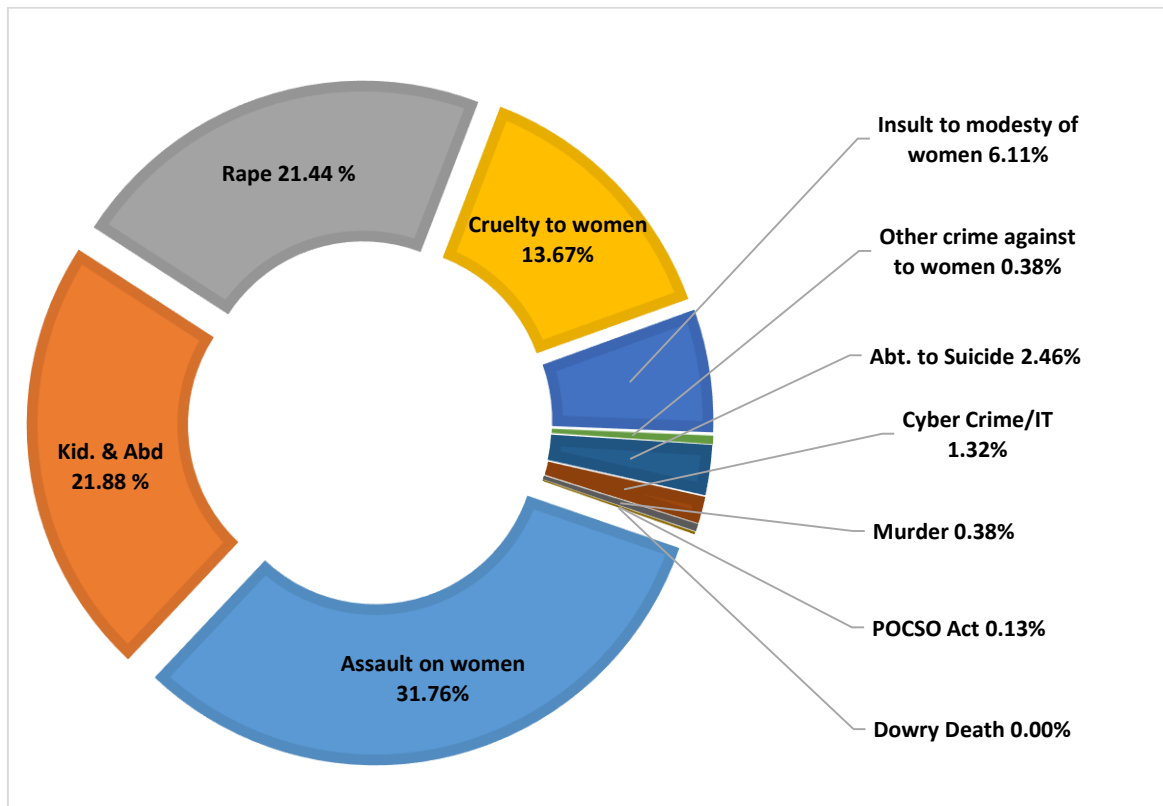


CHART 4.2
VARIATION OF CRIMES AGAINST WOMEN DURING 2023 OVER 2022

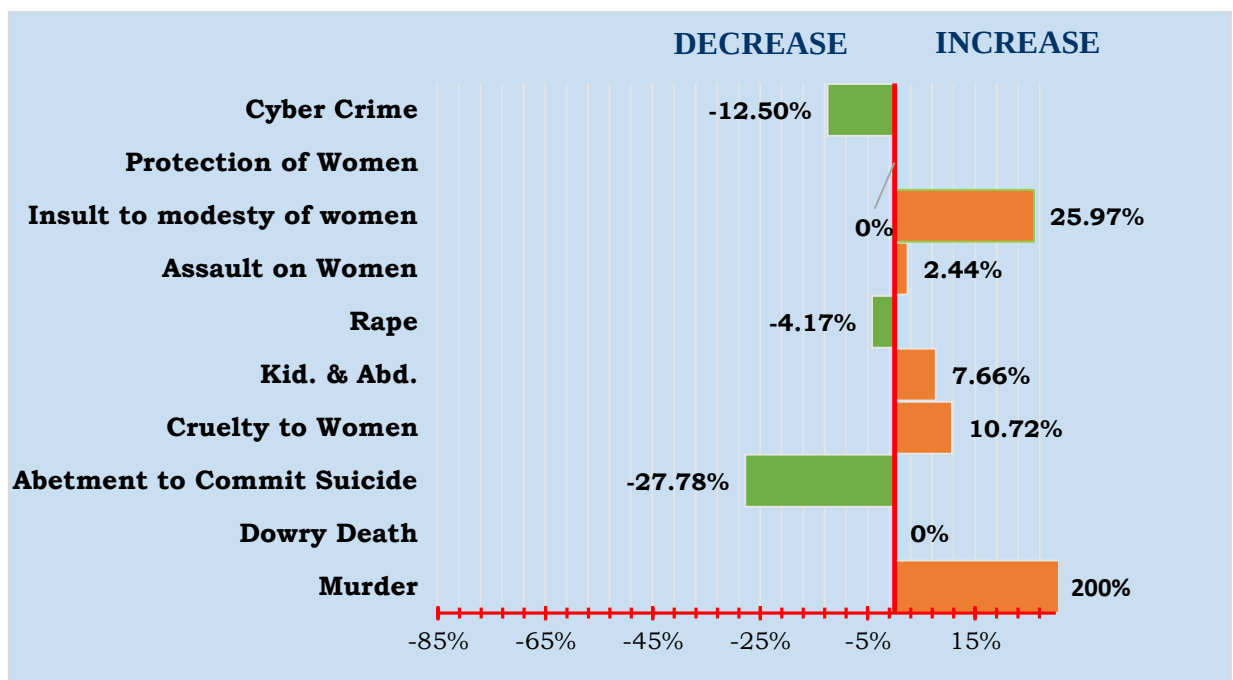
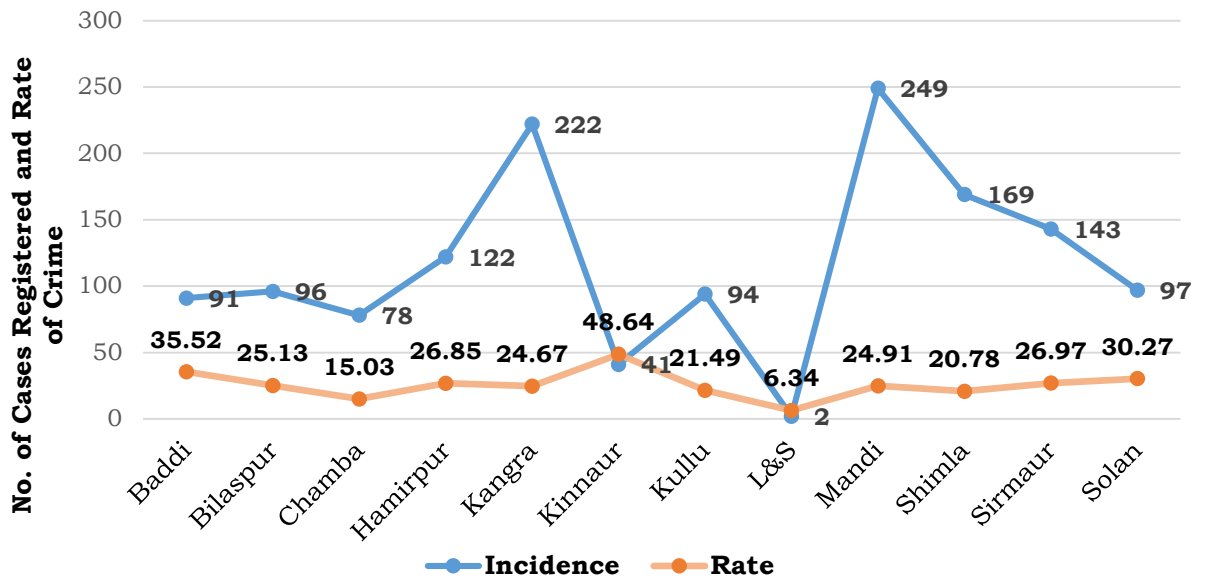
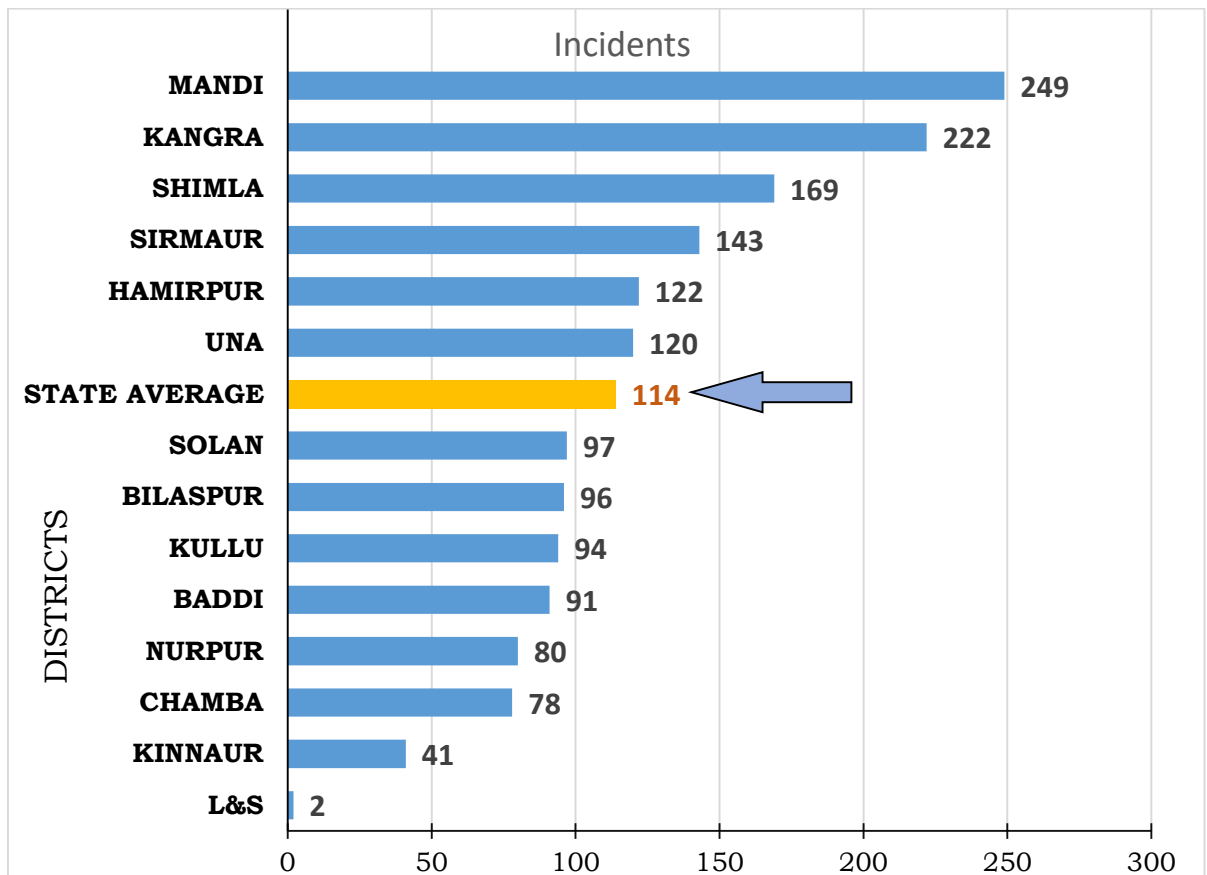
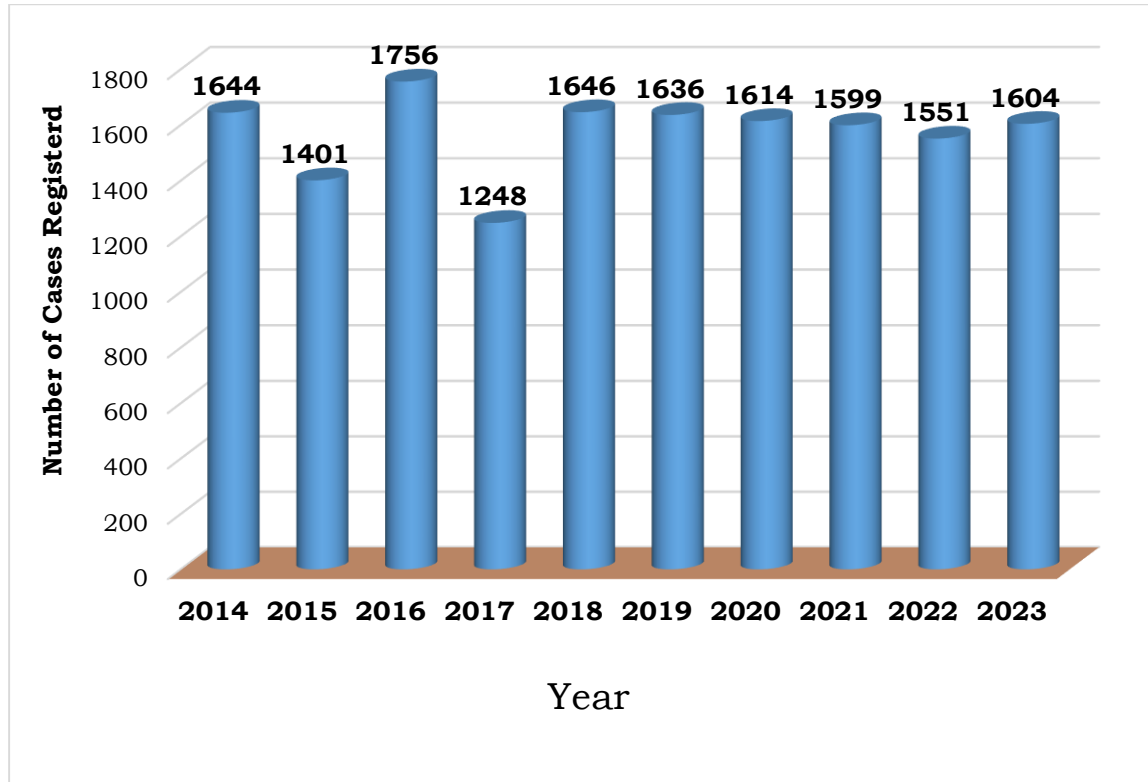

From the analysis of Crime against Women reported in districts, it is seen that registration of cases of Rape, Kidnapping & Abduction insult to outrage modesty, immoral trafficking was higher during the year 2023 as compared to the previous year.

The districts which reported the lowest incidents of crime against women are Lahaul-

Spiti (02) Kinnaur (41), Chamba (78) Nurpur (80) Baddi (91).

4.3 Head wise incidents of Crime against Women:

The brief of head wise status of Crime against Women during 2023 is as under:

(i) **Murder: (Increase of 200%)**

4 Cases under this head were reported in

District Chamba. 02 cases in district Sirmaur.

(ii) Rape: (Decrease of 4.17%)

A total of 344 cases of Rape were reported, which is a decrease of 4.36% over the previous year (359 cases). The highest incidents of rape were reported in district Mandi (54), Sirmaur (43), Kangra (39), Shimla (36), Baddi (33), Kullu (25), Bilaspur (23), Chamba & Solan (21 each), Una (20), Nurpur (14), Kinnaur (9), Hamirpur (6) No incidents under this head were reported in Lahaul & Spiti.

Reasons:-

1. Revelation Of illicit love affairs, intimacy and friendship between both parties leading to registration of cases.
2. Alluring for marriage and later on due to refusal of parents, refusal for marriage, resulting in registration of cases.
3. False registration due to enmity.
4. Rapes of minors.

**(iii) Dowry Deaths:
(Decrease of 100%)**

No incidents under this head were reported in all the districts.

**(iv) Kidnapping & Abduction:
(Increase of 7.66%)**

During the year 2023, 351 incidents of Kidnapping & Abduction were registered; an increase of 7.66% over the previous year (326 cases). Mandi district reported the highest incidents (58) under this crime head, followed by Shimla (48), Kangra (39), Kullu (28), Hamipur & Una (27 each), Sirmaur (26), Solan (24), Baddi & Chamba (17 each), Nurpur (13) and Kinnaur (11) No incidents under this head were reported in Lahaul & Spiti.

**(v) Assault on women with
intent to outrage
modesty (Sec.354)
(Increase of 2.44%)**

504 cases of Assault on women with intend to outrage modesty were registered during the year 2023; an increase of 2.44% over the previous year. Kangra district recorded the highest (81 cases), followed by Mandi (74), Shimla (57), Hamirpur (51), Sirmaur (44) Una (32), Solan, (30), Chamba, Kullu & Nurpur (28 each), Bilaspur (24),

Baddi (18), Kinnaur (7) and Lahaul & Spiti (2).

(vi) Abetment to Commit Suicide (Decrease of 27.78 %)

An increasing trend is seen under this head with a 27.78% decrease over the previous year. The highest number of cases were registered in Mandi (9), followed by Kangra (7), Hamirpur (5), Bilaspur, Nurpur and Una (3 each), Chamba, Shimla, Sirmaur and Solan (2 each), Kullu (1). No incidence under this head was reported in Baddi, Kinnaur and Lahaul & Spiti districts.

(vii) Cruelty to Women: (Increase of 10.72%)

217 cases of Cruelty to Women were registered during the year 2023. This head showed an increase of 10.72% over the previous year. The highest number of cases were registered in Mandi (32) district, followed by Kangra (28), Una (26), Bilaspur (25), Sirmaur (20), Shimla (17), Baddi (16), Hamirpur (15), Solan (14) Kullu & Kinnaur (7 each), Chamba and Nurpur (5 each) and no incident under this was reported in Lahual & Spiti district.

Reasons:-

1. Torture of married women for the purpose of dowry, her ill health etc.
2. Harassment and torture of women by her in-laws i.e. husband, mother-in-law, father-in-law etc. on the pretext that she is not capable to doing house hold and agriculture activities.
3. Harassment/torture of women by husband due to illicit relationship of the husband with another woman.
4. Torture/ harassment of women by husband or other male member of the family under the influence of liquor.
5. Love marriage without the consent of the other family members i.e. father-in-law and mother-in-law of the victims.

(viii) Insult to the modesty of Women (Sec. 509 IPC): (Increase of 25.97%)

There was an increase in registration under this head by 25.97% over the previous year. The

number of cases registered were Kangra (21), Mandi (18), Hamirpur (15), Shimla (9), Nurpur (8), Bilaspur, Solan & Una (5 each), Sirmour (4) Baddi, Kinnaur & Kullu (2 each) and Chamba (1). No incident under this head was reported in Lahaul & Spiti district.

(ix) Immoral Trafficking
(Increase of 233.3%)

Total of 10 cases of Immoral Trafficking were registered during the year 2023, as compared to 3 cases registered in the previous year.

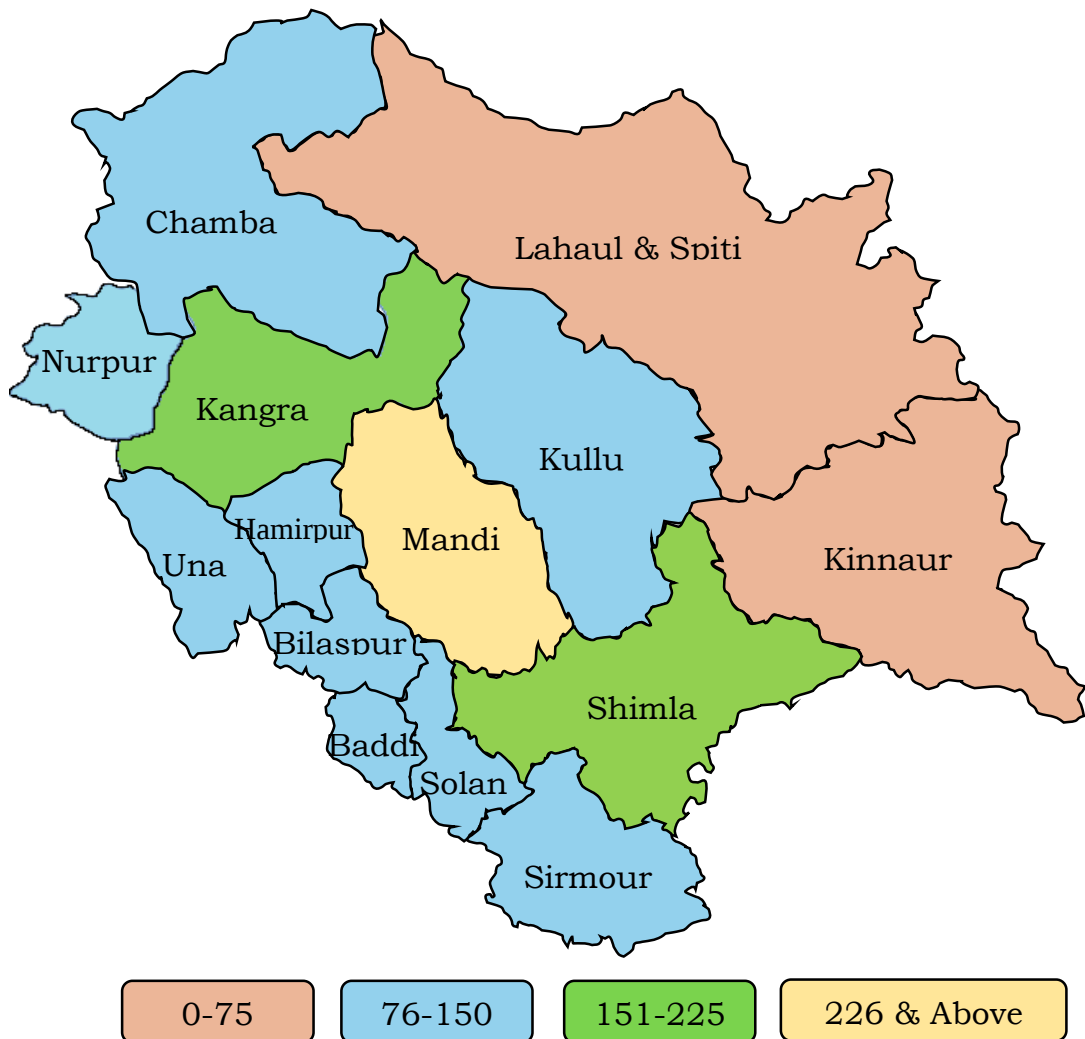

CHAPTER-5

CRIME AGAINST CHILDREN

5.1 General:

Crime against children includes violations under certain sections of the Indian Penal Code. For the purpose of this chapter, the following categories of crimes involving child victims have been included under this head:-

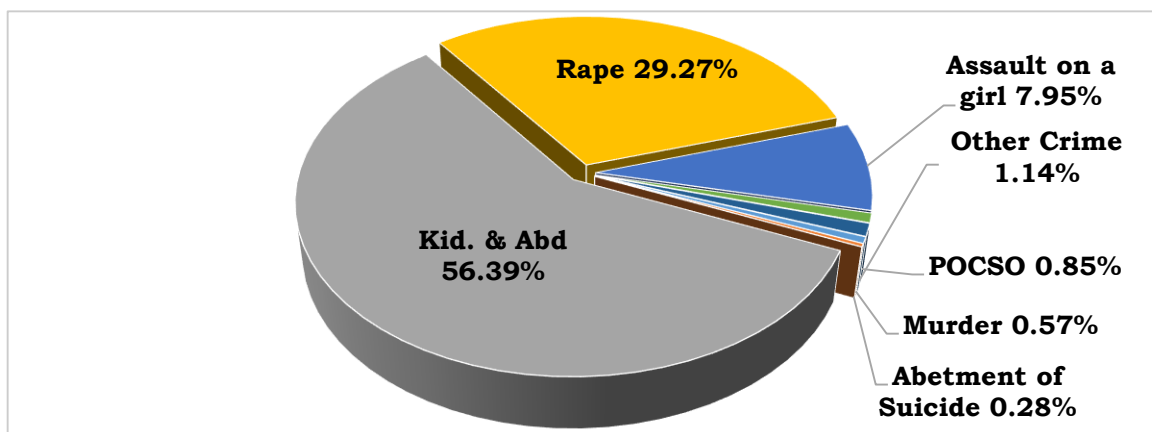
- i. Murder
- ii. Abetment to Suicide
- iii. Infanticide
- iv. Exposure and Abandonment
- v. Hurt/Grievous Hurt
- vi. Kidnapping and abduction
- vii. Rape
- viii. Attempt to commit Rape
- ix. Assault on girl

- x. Insult to the modesty of a girl
- xi. Protection of Children from sexual offences
- xii. Juvenile Justice (Care & Protection of Children) Act, 2000
- xiii. Prohibition of Child Marriage Act
- xiv. Other crimes committed against Children

5.2 Trends of Crime against Children:

Table 5.1 and **Chart 5.1** depicts the percentage distribution of crimes against children during 2023. **Chart 5.2** depicts the district-wise distribution of crimes against children during 2014-2023.

5.3 Incidents:

Table 5.1 shows the incidents and rate of Crime against Children, district wise including its rank.

704 cases were reported in the State under various sections of IPC. Kidnapping & Abduction constituted the largest category with 397 cases (56.39%) reported during the year. The maximum number of 'Kidnapping & Abduction' cases were reported in Mandi District (65) followed by Shimla (58), Kangra (46), Hamirpur (32), Kullu & Solan (30 each), Sirmaur & Una (28 each), Chamba (18), Baddi & Bilaspur (17 each) Kinnaur (14), Nurpur (13) and Lahaul & Spiti (1) under this head was reported.

The second most prevalent Crime against Children

was Rape along with POCSO Act, which accounted for 206 cases (29.27%). The highest number of Rape cases were reported in District Sirmaur (28), Mandi (26), Baddi (24), Shimla (21), Kangra (20), Kullu (19), Chamba (14), Bilaspur (13), Una (11), Solan (10), Nurpur (8), Kinnaur (7), Hamirpur (5) and no incident under this head was reported in District Lahaul & Spiti.

04 cases under the head Murder of Children were reported in the State. 1 each in Kullu, Mandi, Shimla and Una Districts. No case of Murder of children has been reported in rest of the districts of the State.

The incidence and percentage contribution of crimes against children head and district wise is presented in **Table.5.2**.

Total No. of Incidence = 704

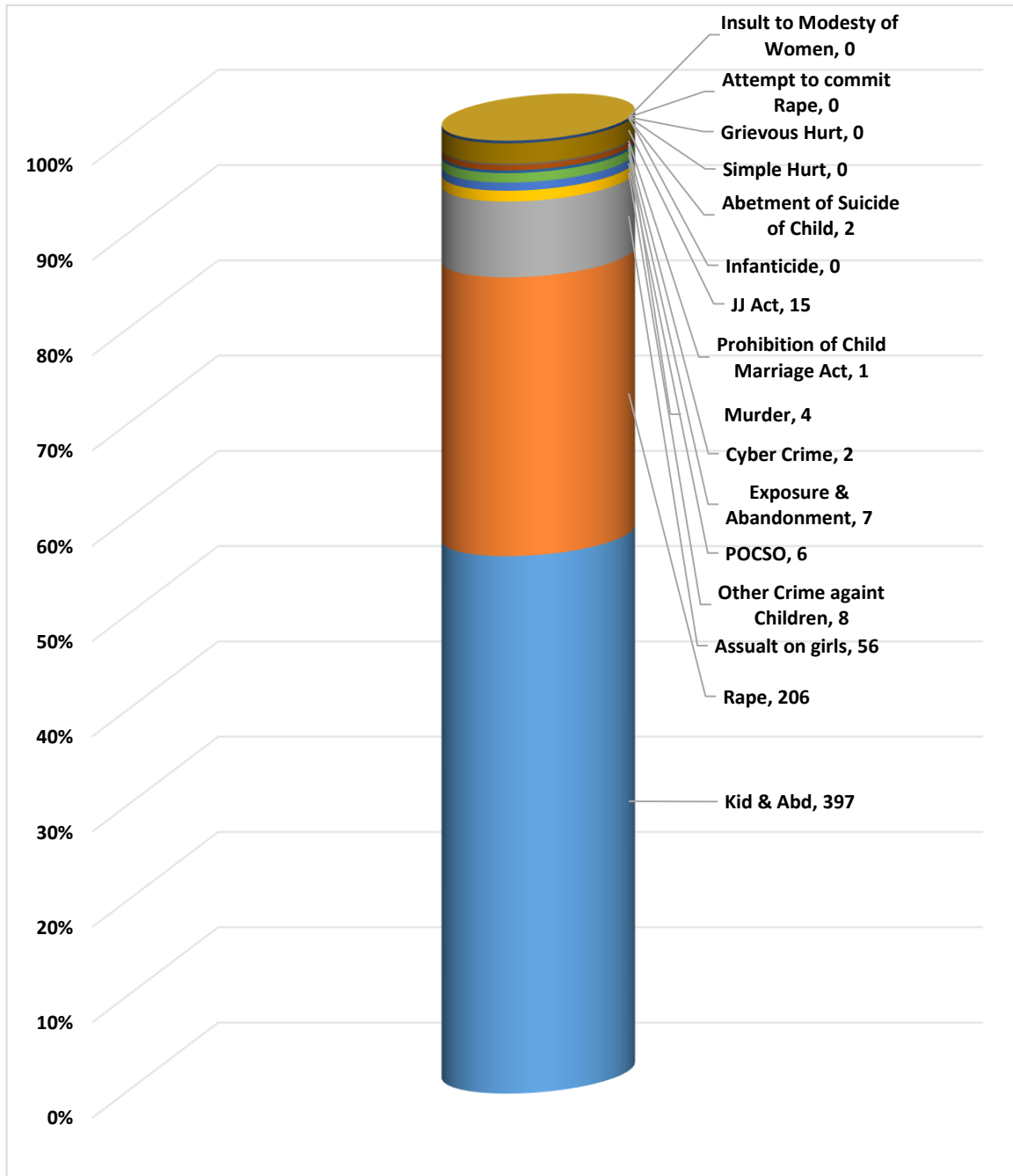

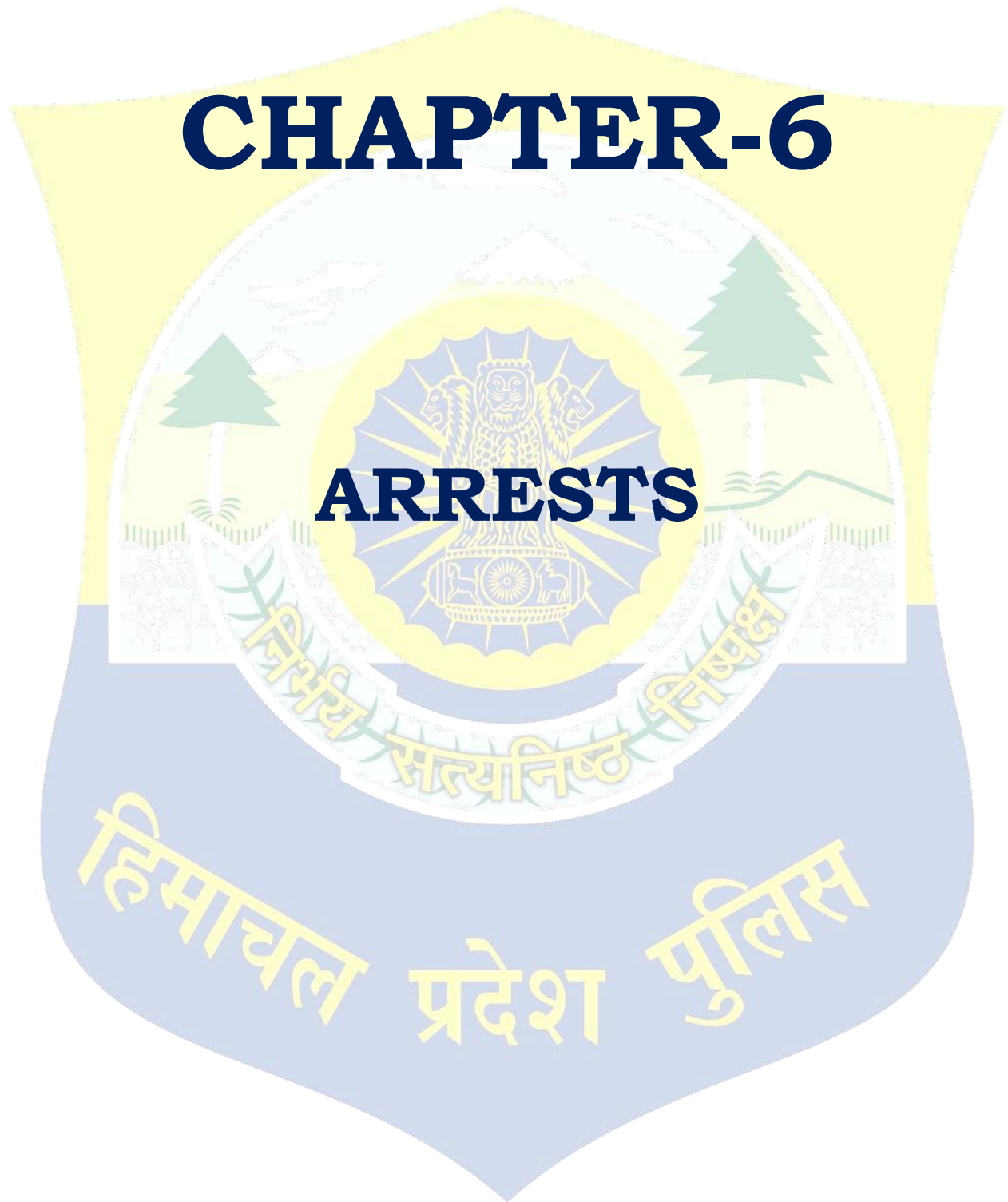

ARRESTS

6.1 ARRESTS:

A total of 13778 persons (8700 under IPC & 5038 under Local & Special Laws) were arrested during the year 2023 in 19987 cases (13505 under IPC & 6482 Local & Special Laws), which is a decrease of 5.29% when compared with the arrests of 14548 persons (9914 under IPC & 4644 under Local & Special Laws in the year 2022.

(i) PERSONS ARRESTED UNDER IPC CASES:

(Decrease of 12.24%)

During the year 2023 as many as 8700 persons were arrested in 13505 cases registered under IPC, as against 9914 persons in 2022. This is due to the reason that some cases registered in State fall under petty offences in which accused are released under section 41(A) Cr.PC. **Chart 6.1** depicts persons arrested under IPC crimes during 2021-2023.

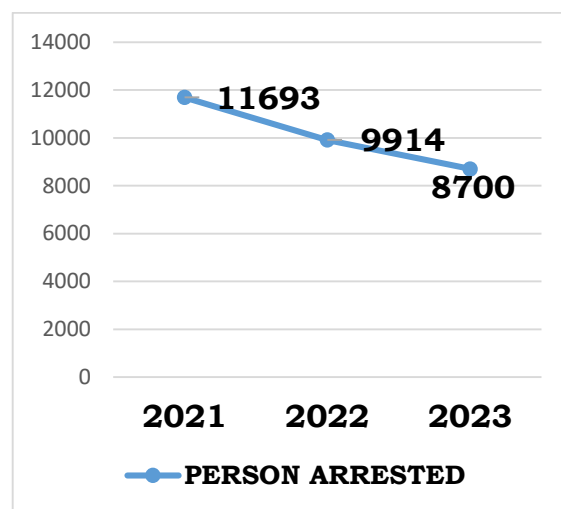

District Shimla tops in arresting 2376 persons in 1655 cases during 2023, followed by district Sirmaur by arresting 1430 persons in 1027 cases and Kullu by arresting 1133 persons in 811 cases.

In Una, 881 cases were registered and 993 persons arrested. District Solan has registered 906 cases and arrested 956 persons, in Baddi 431 persons were arrested against the registration of 753 cases during the year 2023. The details of

persons arrested under IPC crime head wise & gender wise are presented in Table 6.3.

AGE-GROUP WISE PERSONS ARRESTED UNDER IPC CRIMES DURING 2023

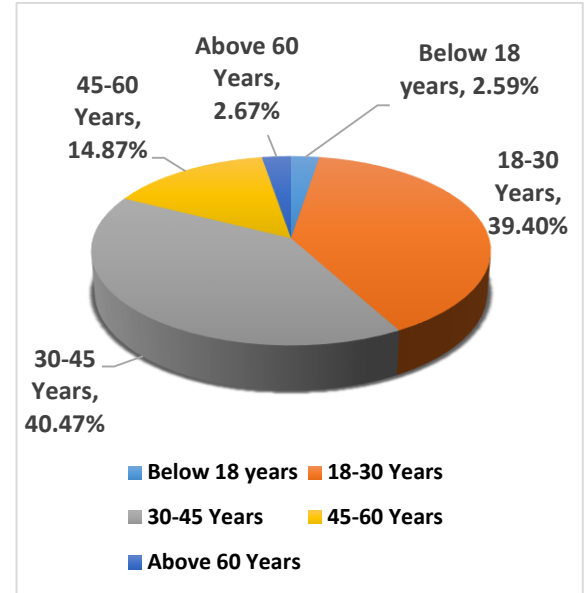
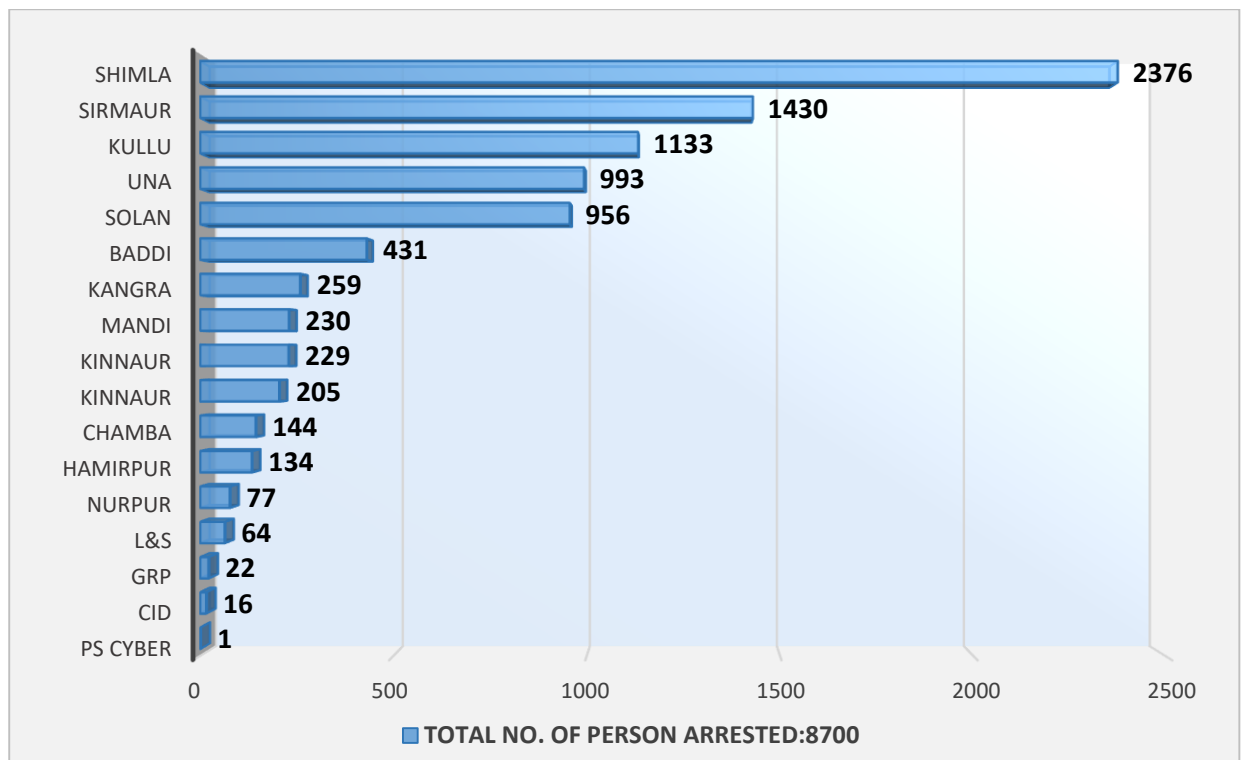

DISTRICT WISE PERSONS ARRESTED UNDER IPC CRIMES DURING 2023

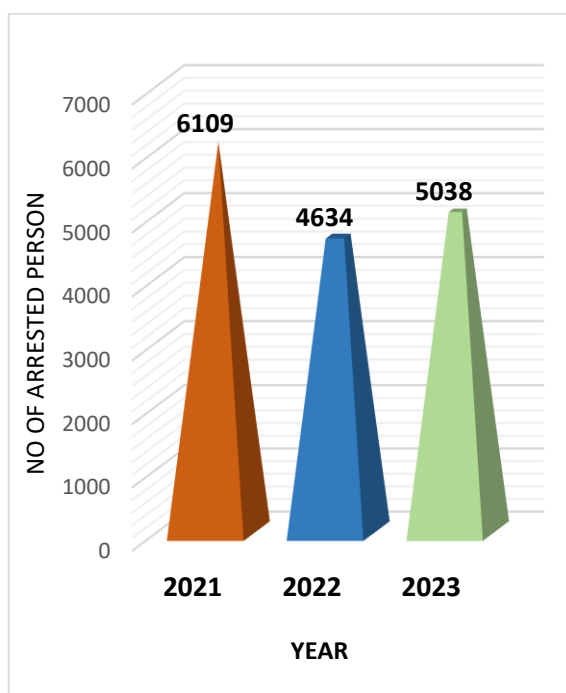


(ii) Persons arrested under SLL cases: (Increase of 8.72%)

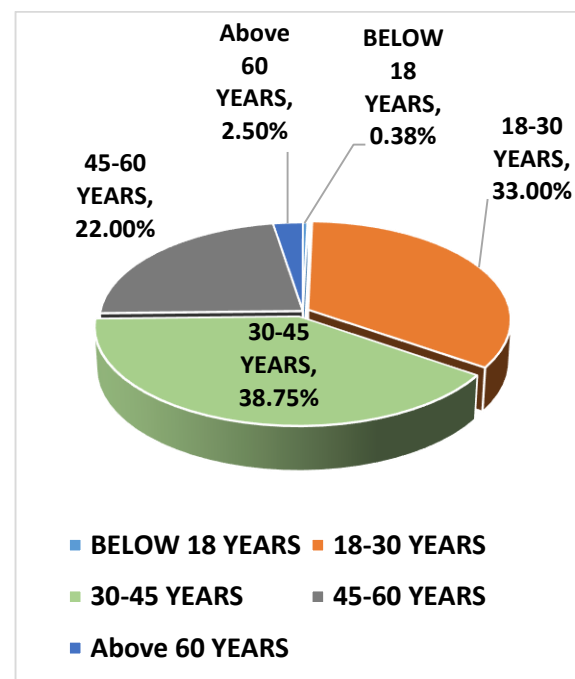
CHART 6.4

DISTRICT WISE PERSONS ARRESTED UNDER SLL CRIMES DURING 2023

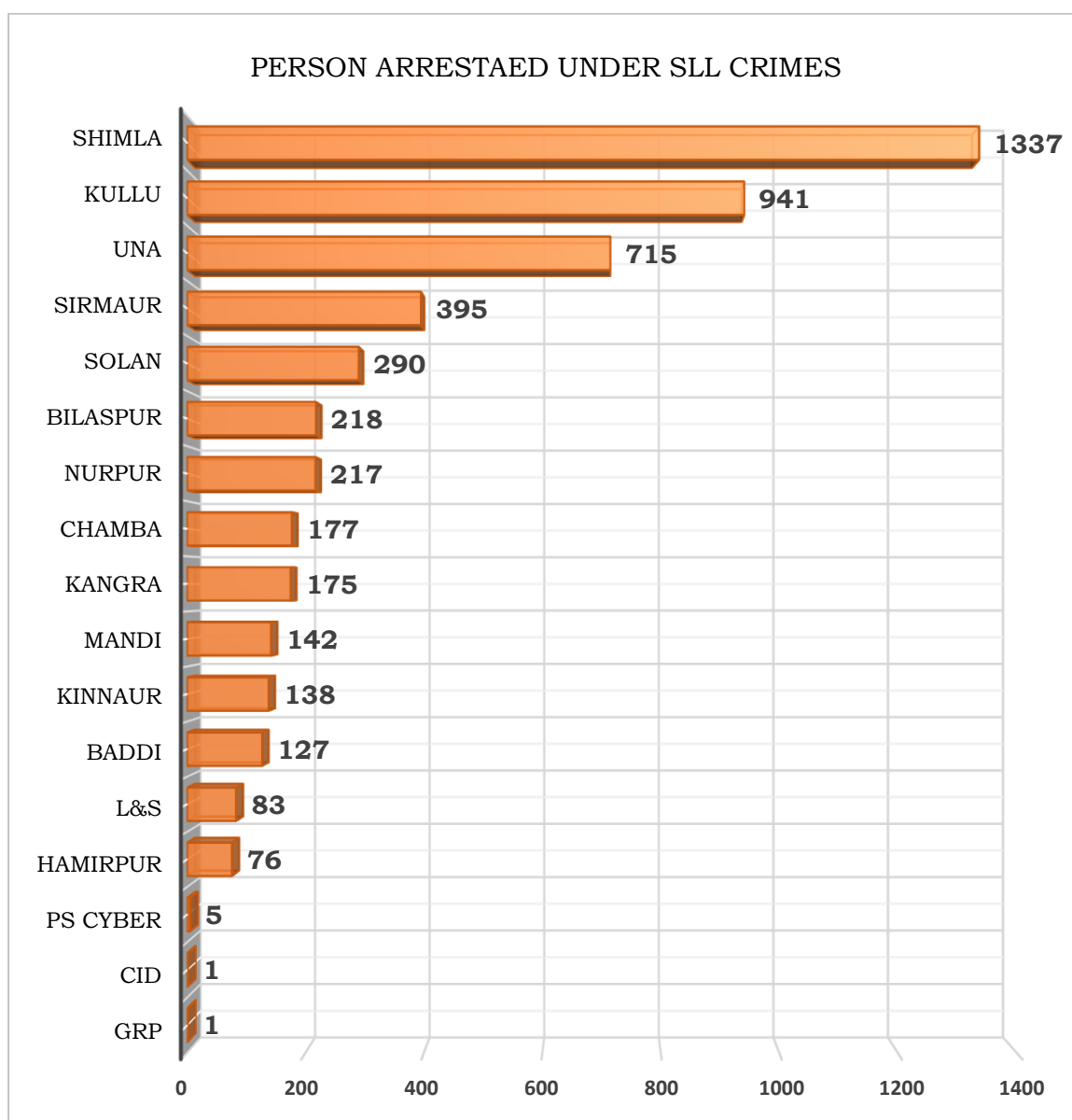

PERSONS ARRESTED UNDER (IPC) CRIMES – 2023

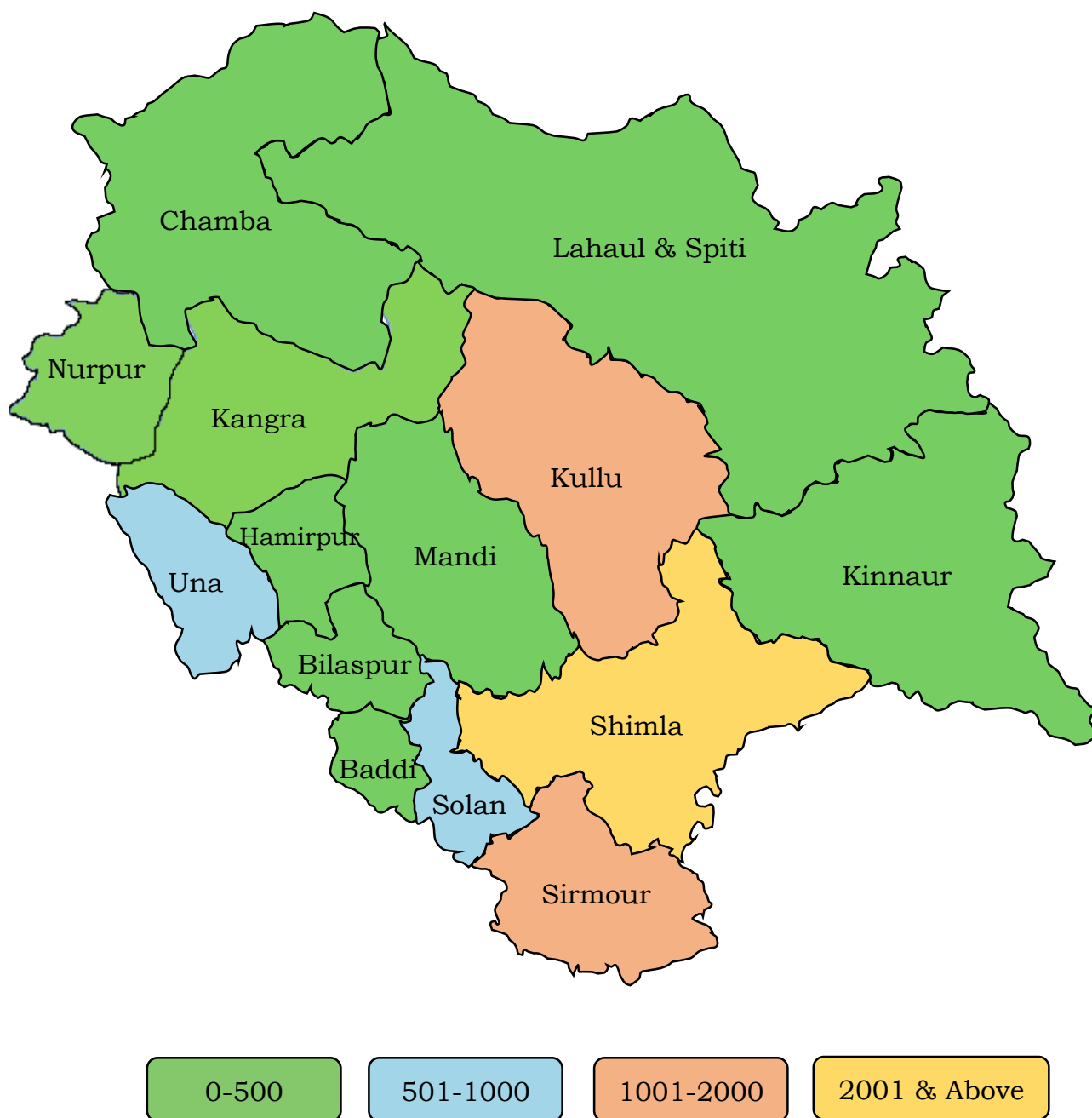

CHAPTER-7

CRIME AGAINST WEAKER SECTIONS OF SOCIETY (SC/ST)

7.1 General:

A complete harmony among different sections of society is prevailing in the State. No particular area of the State is notorious for the commission of offences against the SCs/STs. However, sporadic incidents of violence against the members of these communities do take place.

India is a welfare State. It is committed to the welfare and development of its people in general and of vulnerable sections in particular. Equality of status and opportunity to all citizens of the country are guaranteed by the constitution of India, which also provides that no individual shall be discriminated against on grounds of religion, caste or sex. Fundamental Rights and specific provisions, namely, Articles 38, 39 and 46 in the constitution of India stand testimony to the commitment of the State towards its people. The strategy of the State is to secure distributive justice and allocation of resources to

support programmes for social, economic and educational advancement of the weaker section in general and those of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in particular.

7.2 Constitutional Rights:

The Indian Constitution vide Article 15 lays down that no citizen shall on grounds of religion, race, sex or place of birth be subjected to any disability or restriction. It also guarantees that every citizen shall have equality of status and opportunity.

7.3. Legal Rights:

To uphold the constitutional mandate and to safeguard the interests of this section of the society, special social enactments have come into force from time to time, including privileges by way of reservations.

Following are two of the major legal enactments sponsored by Centre:

- (i) Protection of Civil Rights Act, 1955; and
- (ii) SC/ST (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989

The Protection of Civil Rights Act, 1955 was enacted in furtherance of Article 17 of the Constitution by which untouchability was abolished and its practice in any form is forbidden. Further, in order to check and deter crimes against SC/STs by persons belonging to other communities, the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989 was brought into force from 30th January, 1990. These enactments have extended the positive discrimination in favour of SCs and STs to the field of criminal law in as much as they prescribe penalties that are more stringent than for corresponding offences under the Indian Penal Code (IPC) and other laws.

In addition, in pursuance of the Constitution 65th Amendment Act, 1990, the National Commission for SCs and STs was

constituted w.e.f 12th March, 1992 with wide functions and powers of Civil Courts to take up matters which are of vital importance for socio-economic development of SCs and STs.

7.4 The Crimes against weaker sections identified under the Indian Penal Code (IPC) and Special & Local Laws (SLL):

- (i) Murder
- (ii) Rape
- (iii) Kidnapping & Abduction
- (iv) Dacoity
- (v) Robbery
- (vi) Arson
- (vii) Hurt
- (viii) Others (Other classified IPC crimes)

7.4.1 Under Special & Local Laws (SLL):

- (i) Protection of Civil Rights Act:1955
- (ii) The SC/STs (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989.

The crimes under IPC such as 'Murder', 'Hurt', 'Rape etc. or under Special Acts such as PCR Act & SC/ST (P) Act are already included in overall crimes reported under IPC and SLL respectively and have been

discussed in details in the preceding chapters. The data specific to crimes against SC/ST discussed in the following paragraphs is a part and parcel of total crimes but analyzed separately for better comprehension.

Population:

As per 2011 census of Himachal Pradesh, the Scheduled Castes constituted 25.19% of the total population in the State, while Scheduled Tribes constituted only 5.7%. District Kangra with the highest population share (22.03%) also represented the highest share of Scheduled Castes (21.15%), followed by Mandi (17%) and Shimla with (12.47%).

7.5 Incidents of Crimes against Weaker Section (SC/ST):

The incidents of these crimes (IPC+SLL) were reported to be 236 cases in the State during 2023. Head wise details of crime against weaker sections for the last 3 years, including percentage change over the previous years, is presented in **Table 7.1**. **Chart 7.1** depicts the head wise position of the crime incidents. The

district wise and head wise incidents including the rate of crime has been calculated and presented in **Table 7.2**.

The above data reflects that the incidents of most of the SC/ST (POA) Act and other crimes have increased.

7.6 Head-wise Crime:

Under most of the heads of IPC no incident has been registered during the year 2023. The head wise detailed analysis of all crime heads under which the cases have been registered during the year 2023 are given below:

(i) Murder: (Increase of 100%)

During the year 2023, total 2 incidents was reported in Bilaspur and Shimla district under the head Murder against weaker sections in the State.

(ii) Rape: (Increase of 12.5%)

During the year 2023, 9 incidents of rape were reported in the State. The highest numbers of incidents under this head were reported in district Kangra (3), followed by Hamirpur (2), Baddi, Bilaspur, Shimla and Una (1 each).

No case under this head was registered in rest of the districts.

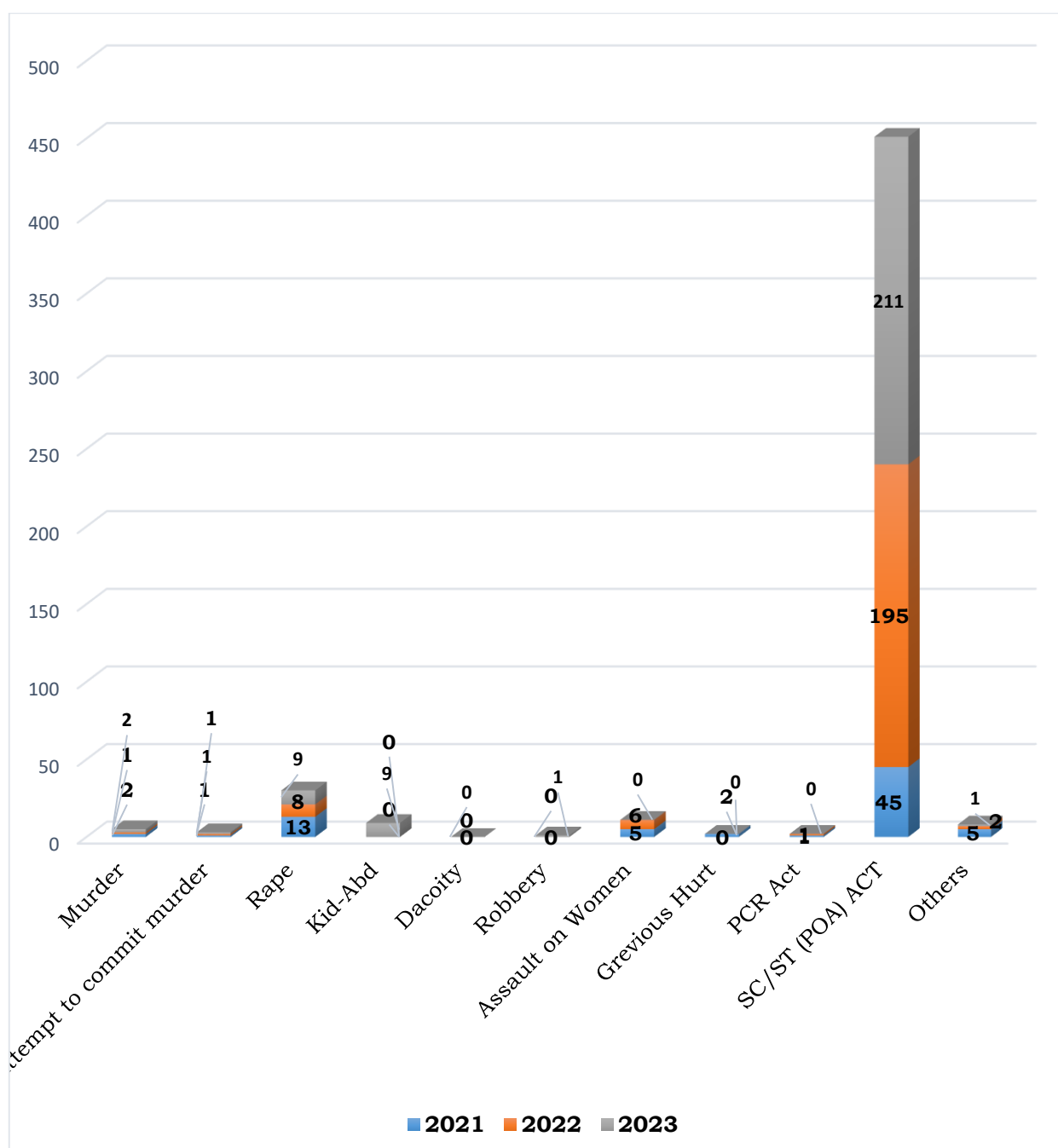
(iii) SC/ST Protection of Civil

Rights Act: (Increase of 100%)

During the year 2023, 2 incidents of PCR Act was reported in Kinnaur district under this head. No case under this head was registered in rest of the districts.

(iii) SC/ST (Prevention of Atrocities) Act 1989 only:**(Increase of 8.20%)**

During the year 2023, 211 incidents were reported under this head; an increase of 16 cases over the previous year. The highest number of incidents under this head

were reported in district Hamirpur (46), followed by Mandi (45), Shimla & Una (20 each), Kangra (17), Nurpur (15), Bilaspur (12), Kullu (11), Sirmaur (8), Baddi & Solan (6 each) and Chamba (5). No case under this head was registered in district Kinnaur and L&S.

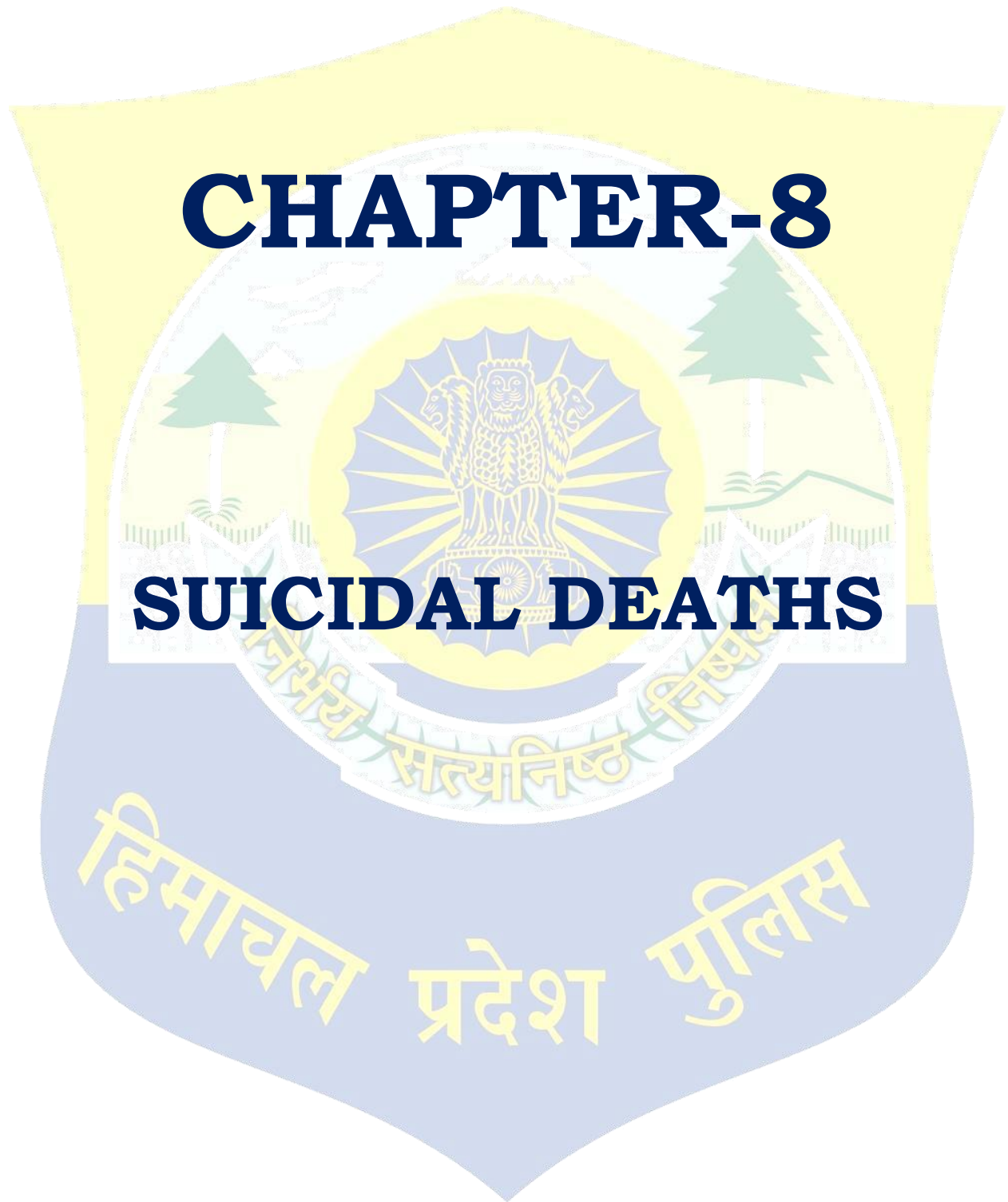

CHAPTER-8

SUICIDAL DEATHS

8.1 General:

According to the Oxford dictionary, 'suicide' means 'the act of killing oneself intentionally'. The word 'suicide' has its origin in the Latin word 'sui' (of oneself) plus 'caedere' [kill]. It is a step which is generally taken by one in an emotionally or mentally weak moment, when he or she feels that coping with life is impossible.

The number of suicides reported in Himachal Pradesh during 2023 was 818, as against 758 during 2022, indicating an increase of 7.91%.

Kangra district recorded the highest number of suicides during

2023 (148), followed by Mandi (125), Shimla (83), Hamirpur (70), Bilaspur (65), Solan (63), Una (58), Baddi (55), Sirmour (48), Nurpur (35), Chamba (28), Kullu (23), Kinnaur (12) and Lahaul-Spiti (4). Suicides during the period 2014-2023 are presented in [Chart 8.1](#)

District-wise break-up of suicides during 2023 is presented in [Table 8.1](#). Comparative suicidal deaths for the last 10 years (2014-2023) including male and female is presented in [Chart 8.1](#). [Chart 8.2](#) depicts the district wise incidence of suicidal deaths during 2023.

SUICIDE CASES (MALE AND FEMALE) DURING 2014-2023

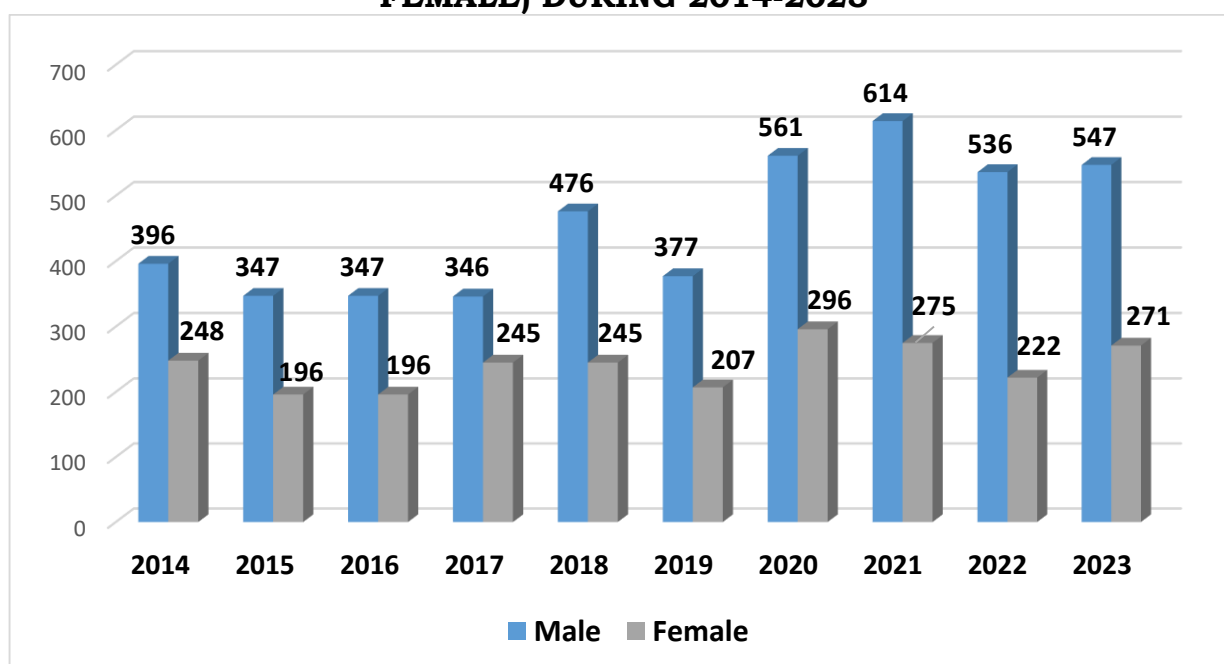
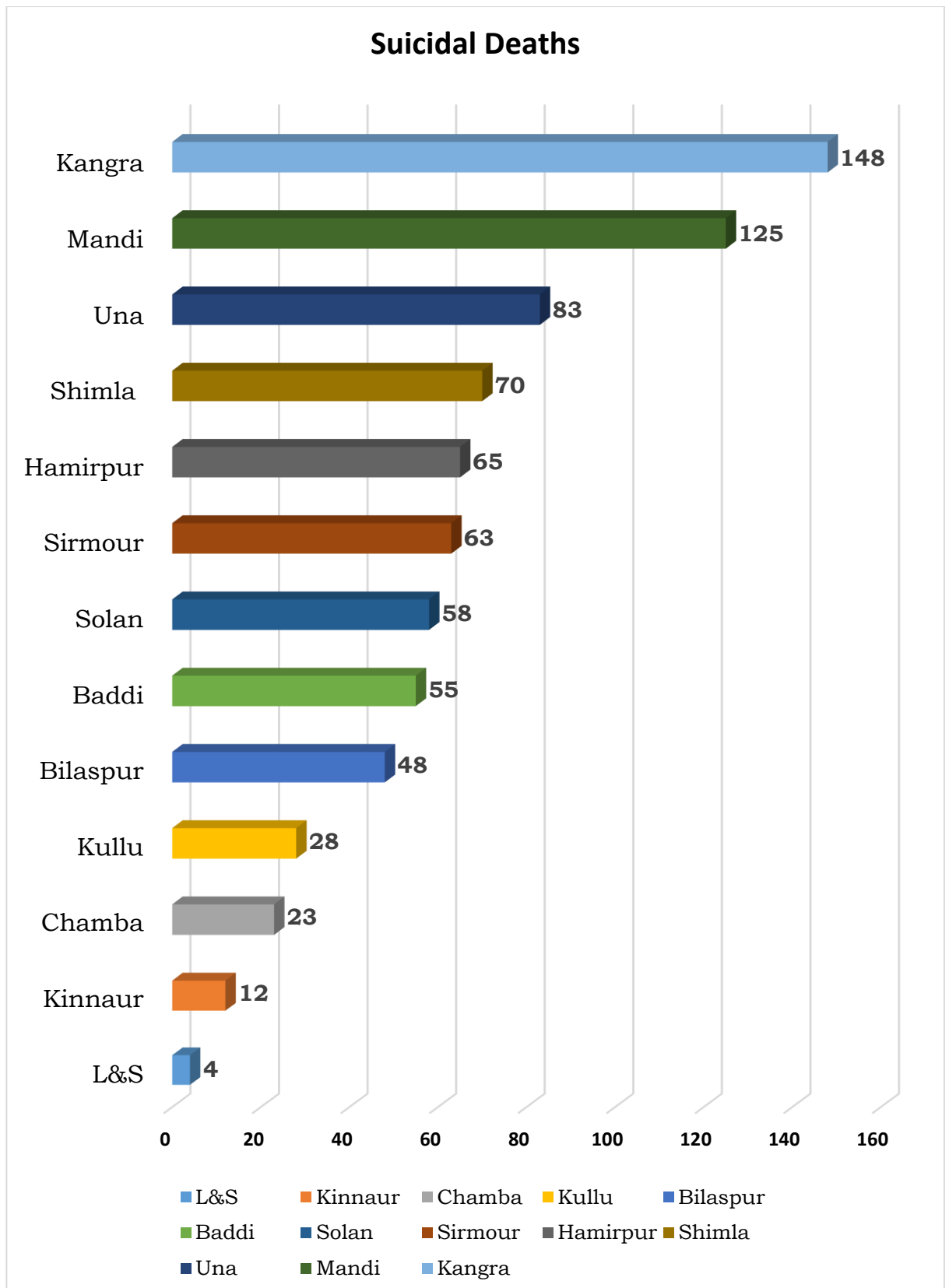


CHART-8.2

From the above table it is revealed that there has been an increase of 7.91% (from 758 to 818) in suicide cases during the year 2023 over the year 2022. The increase has been witnessed in Bilaspur (45 to 65), Mandi (112 to 125), Shimla (77 to 83) and Solan (48 to 63). However, there has been

a decrease in rest of the districts of the State.

District-wise percentage of suicide cases:-

The analysis of the above table reveals that percentage of suicide deaths in Baddi, Bilaspur, Solan, Kinnaur, Nurpur, Sirmour and Una has remained higher than the percentage of the population of the district concerned during the years 2022 & 2023. In other words, these 07 districts have higher rates of

suicidal deaths as compared to the other districts of the State.

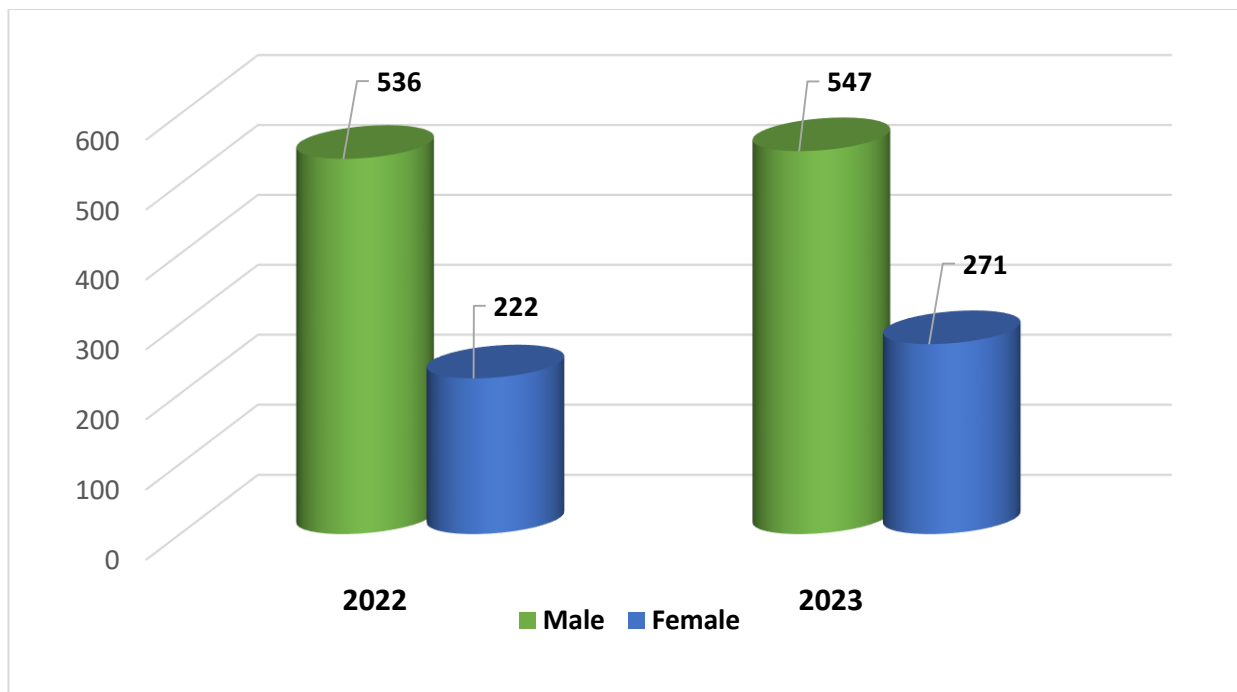

It is revealed from the above table that the number of males committing suicide outnumber the females (66.87% males as against 33.13% females in 2023) and males (70.71% males as against 29.29% females in 2022).

It is further revealed that there has been an increase of 2.05% in the male suicide cases (from 536 to 547) and an increase of 22.07% in the number of female suicides cases (from 222 to 271) during the year 2023 as compared to the year 2022.

From this table, it is revealed that most of those who committed suicide, whether males or females, were married (69.78% in 2022 and 69.07% in 2023).

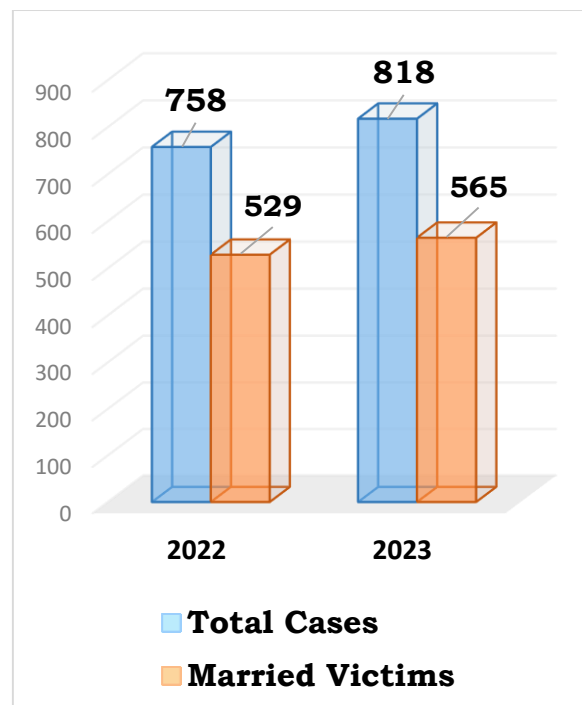

(40.58% in 2023), followed by illness (18.20% in 2022 and 19.55% in 2023).

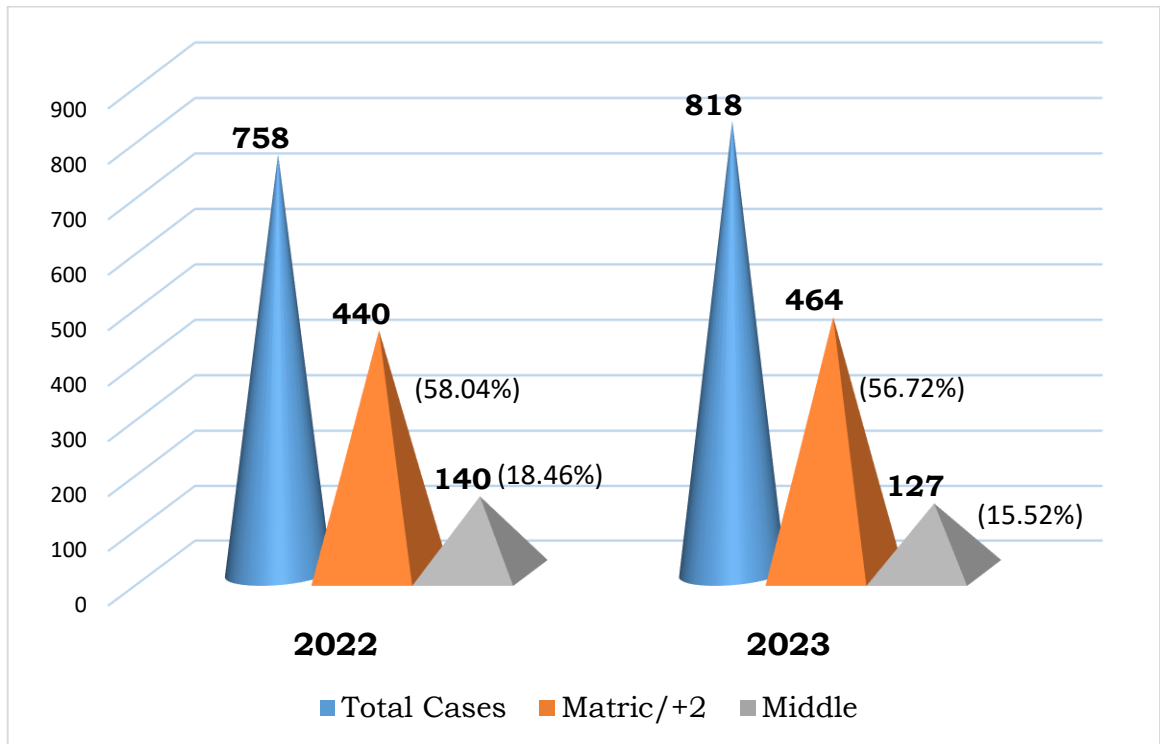
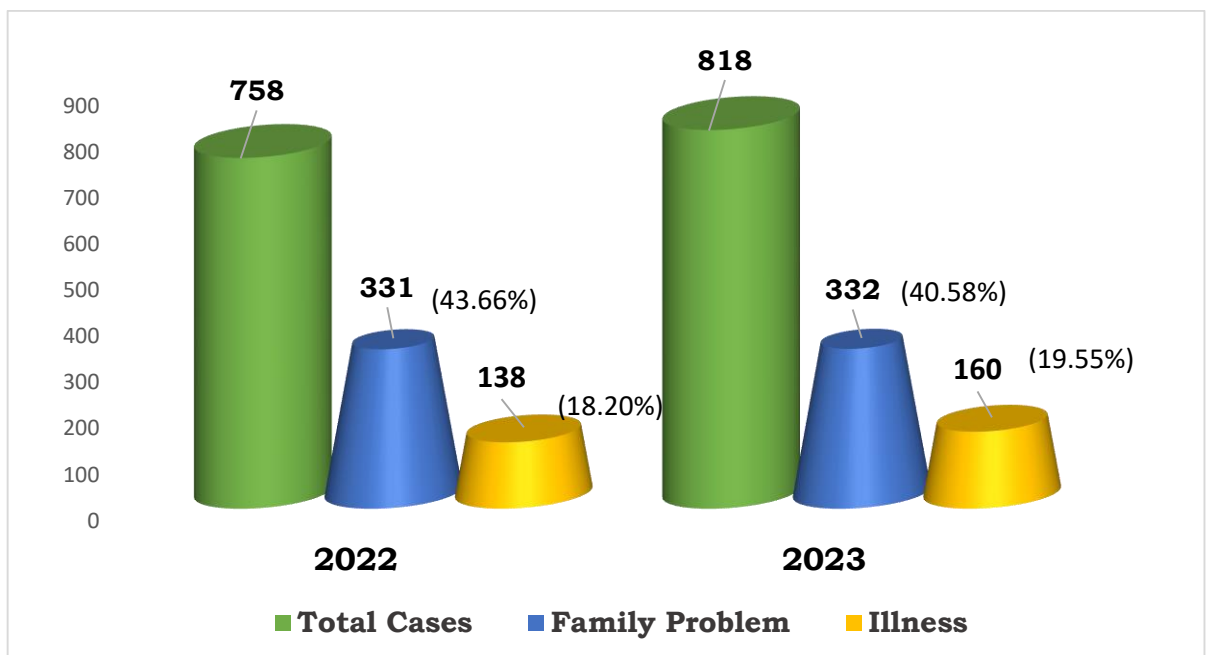

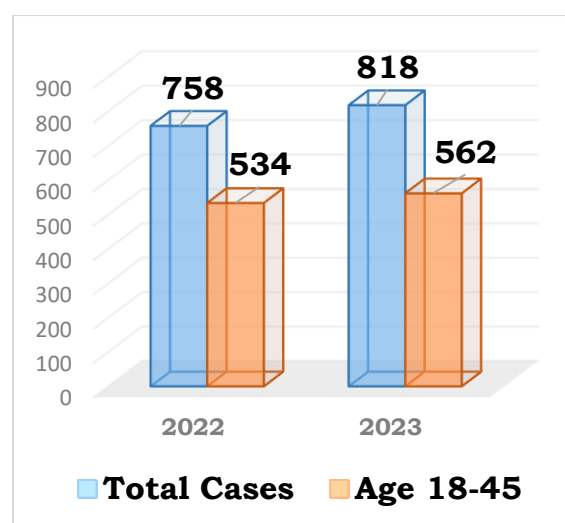

The analysis shows that the age profile of most of the suicide victims both men and women falls into two age-groups of 18-30 and 30-45 years. Thus, it can be said that most people who commit suicide do so in the prime of their lives between 18 to 45 years of age (70.44% in 2022 and 68.70% in 2023). This fact can be further co-related to the reasons for suicide i.e. 'family problems' and 'illness'.

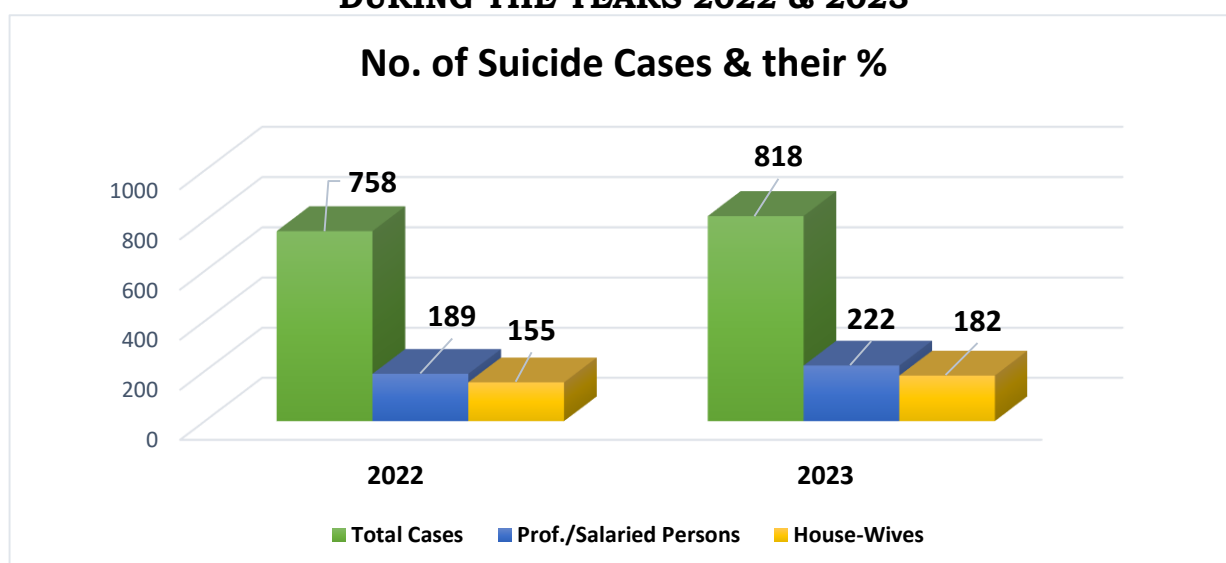

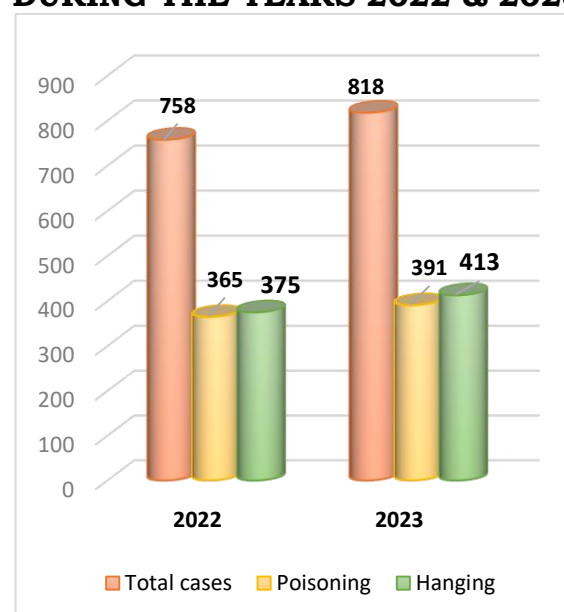

The means adopted for committing suicide range over several methods from drinking too much to jumping from high places. However, the maximum number have committed suicide by **hanging** (49.47% in 2022 and 50.48% in 2023). This is followed by **consuming poison** (48.15% in 2022 and 47.79% in 2023).

8.11. Conclusions:

- i) There has been an increase in the suicide cases committed by men during the year 2023 as against the year 2022.
- ii) Kangra, Mandi, Una, Shimla Hamirpur, Sirmour & Solan reported more suicidal deaths as compared to the other 07 districts of the State.
- iii) The major cause of suicides remained 'family problems', followed by 'illness'. 'Unemployment' is certainly not one of the major causes of suicides as it contributes less than 20% of total suicide cases.
- iv) Most of the women suicide victims were house-wives. The farmers/agriculturists do not form a major group of suicide victims as this group contributes only 0.5% to the total suicide cases.
- v) The majority of the suicide victims were married and in the age group of 18 to 45 years.
- vi) The most common means for committing suicide in the year 2023 was 'hanging' followed by taking 'poison'.

SUICIDES – 2023

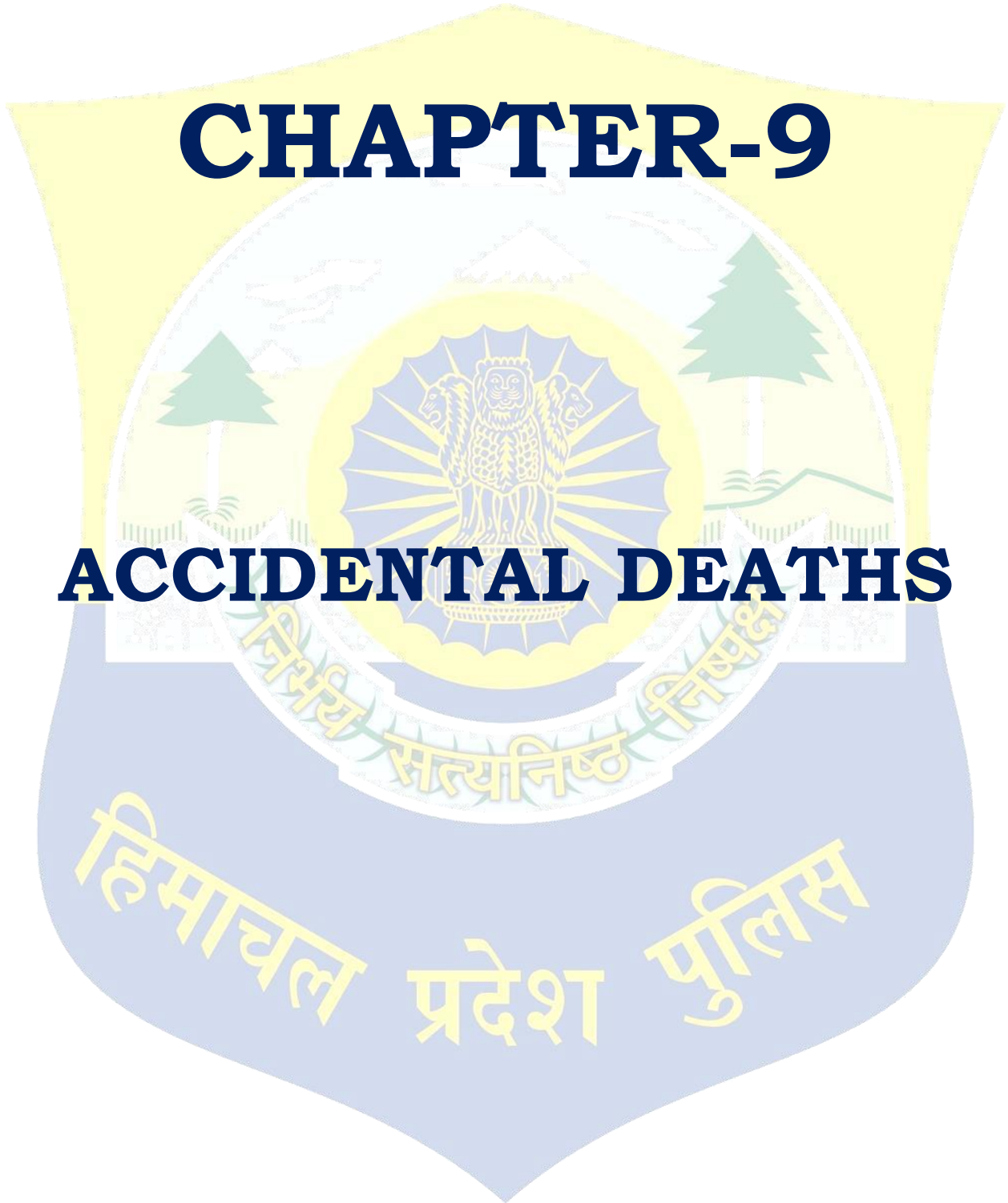

ACCIDENTAL DEATHS

9.1 General:

Incidents of road accidents in Himachal Pradesh show fluctuating trends. The break-up of accidents for the last ten years is shown in [Table-9.1](#)

Car/ Jeep/ Taxi/ Tempo account for the largest number of

accidents. During the year 2023, 44.1% of persons died/injured in road accidents were attributed to Car/Jeep/Taxi/Tempo. District wise comparative statement of road accidents during 2023 is presented in [Table-9.2](#). 2255 road accidents were reported during the year 2023 out of which 885 accidents were fatal.

Accidental Deaths:

Car/ Jeep/ Taxi/ Tempo were responsible for 44.1% of accidental deaths during 2023. Out of

the 885 persons who died due to accidents, as many as 390 were involved in accidents with these types of vehicles. [Table-9.2](#) gives details of road accidental deaths for the year

2023 with break-up of types of vehicles and due to other reasons. District Shimla reported the highest (129) numbers of accidental deaths, followed by Mandi (104), Kangra (97), Una (84), Sirmaur (78), Baddi (77) and Chamba (62). **Chart-9.1** depicts road accidents that occurred during 2014–2023.

Percentage of road accidental deaths according to type of vehicles during the year 2023 is presented in **Chart-9.2**.

PERCENTAGE OF ROAD ACCIDENTAL DEATHS (ACCORDING TO TYPE OF VEHICLES DURING 2023)

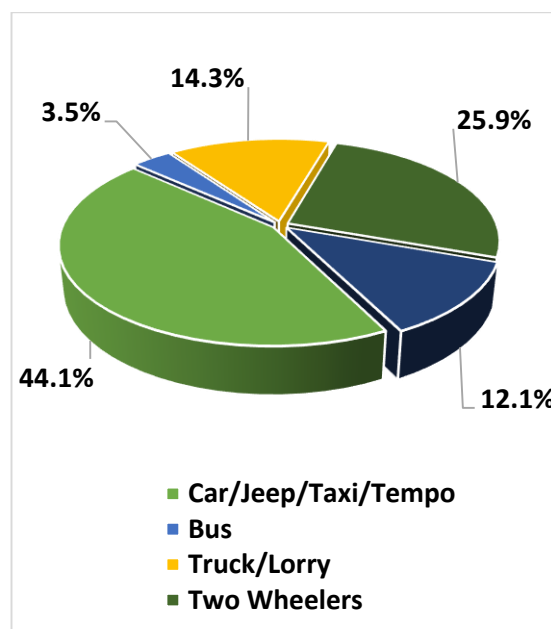

NUMBER OF ROAD ACCIDENTS (2014-2023)

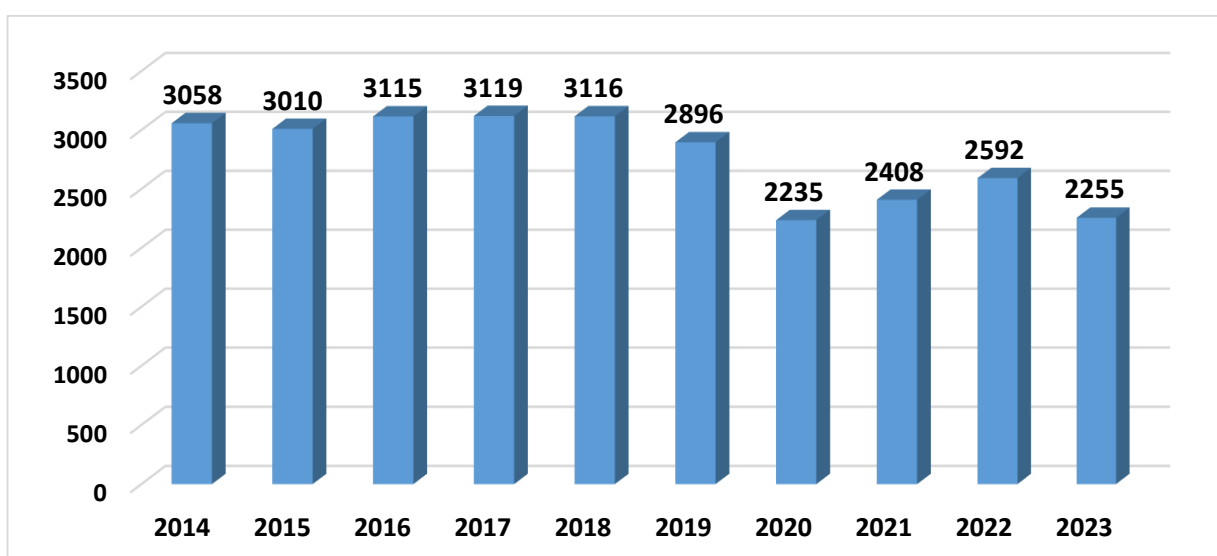

ROAD ACCIDENTAL DEATHS DURING-2023

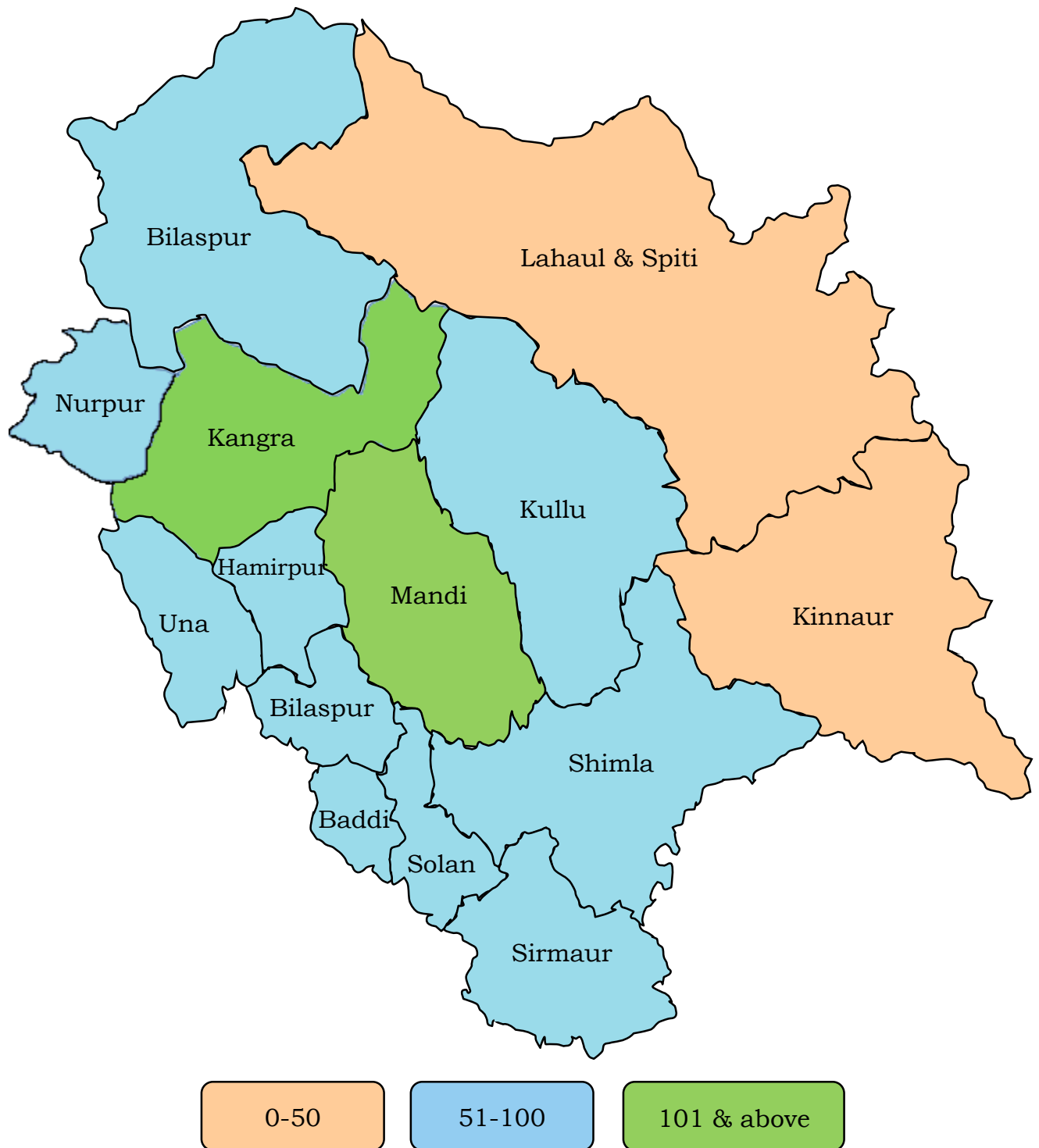

DISTRICT WISE TOTAL ACCIDENTS DURING 2023 (FATAL AND NON FATAL)

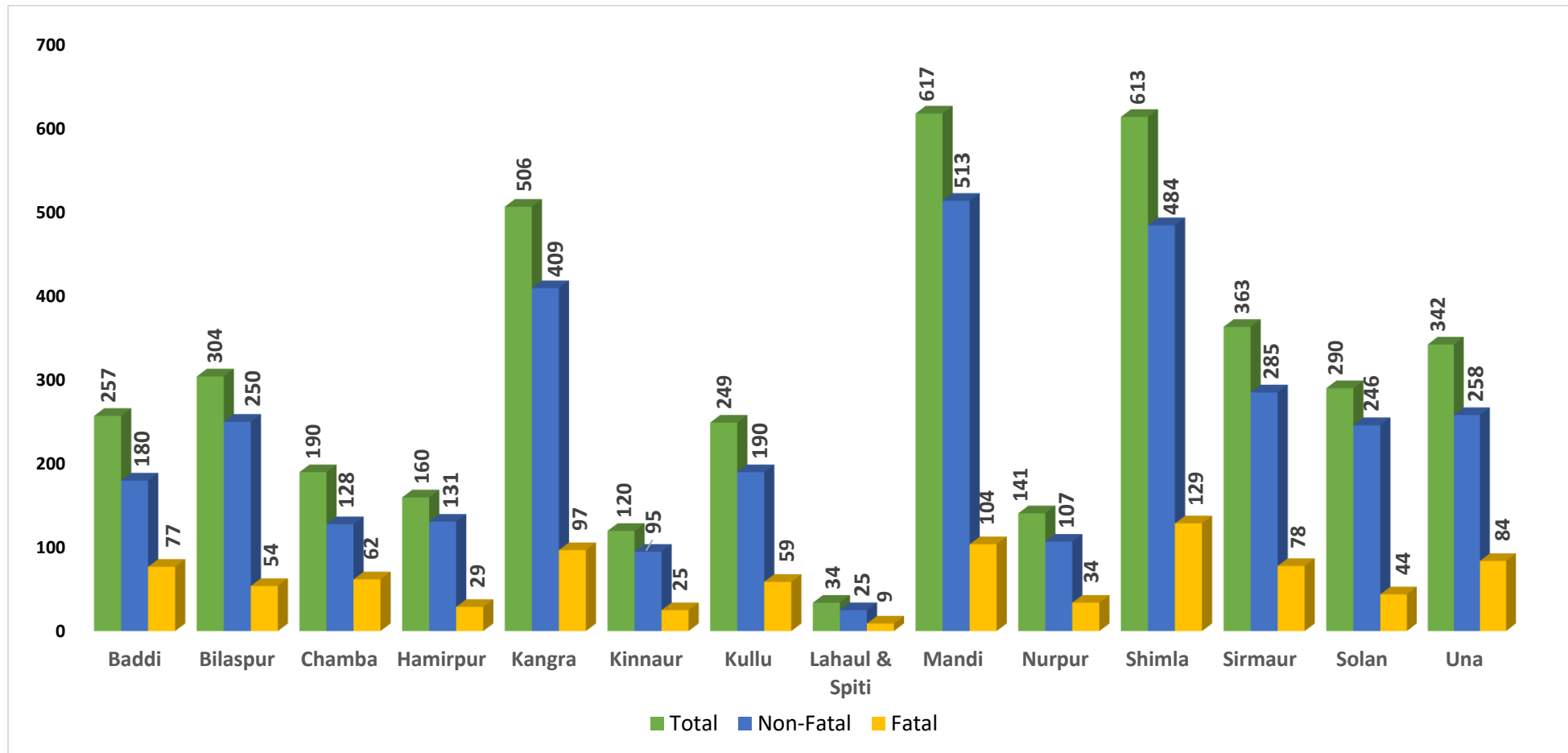
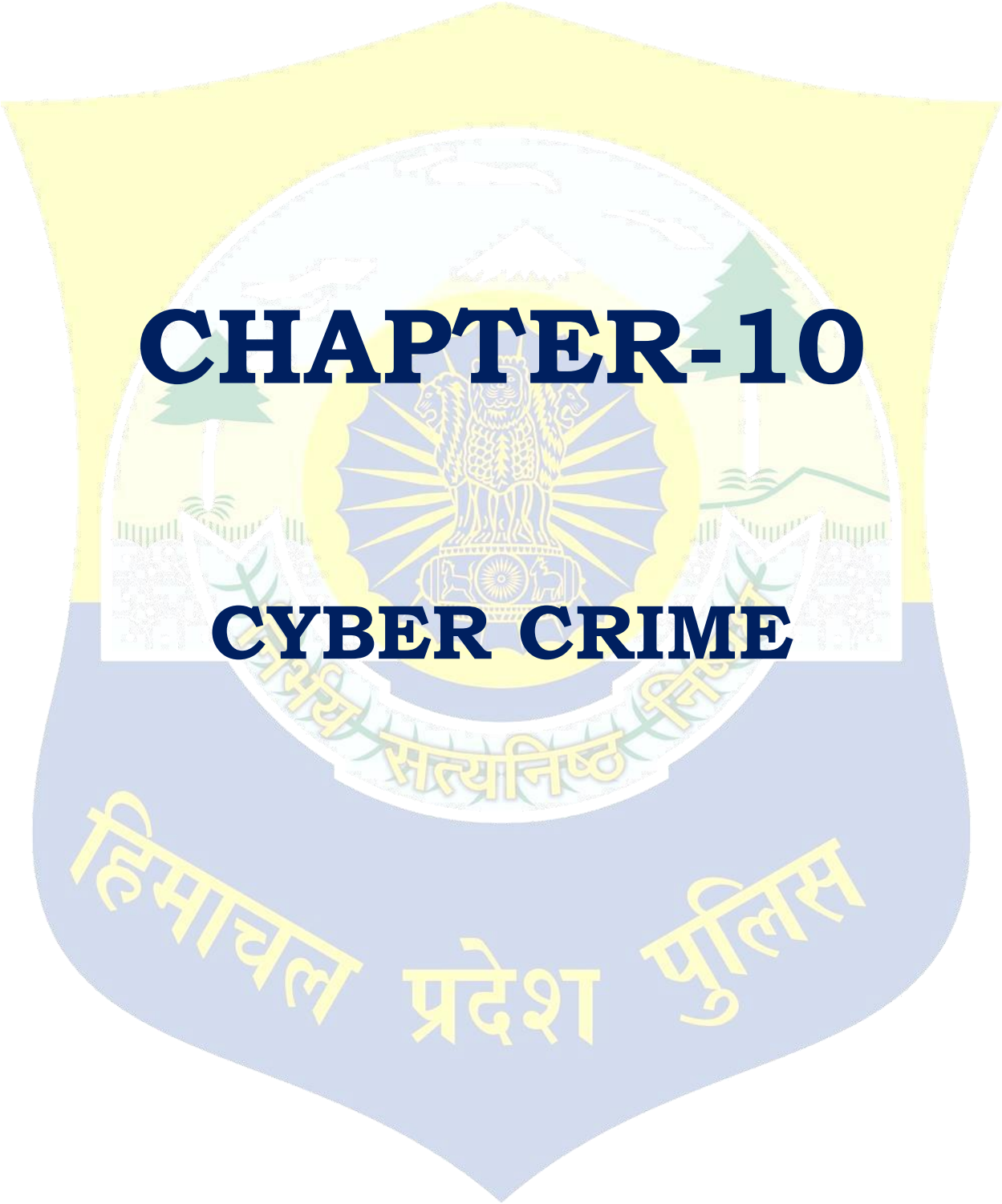

CHAPTER-10

CYBER CRIME

10.1 Definition of Cyber Crime:

“Any illegal action in which a computer is a tool or object of crime, in other words, any crime, the means or purpose of which is to influence the function of computer.”

Computer and Telecommunications are the key areas of Cybercrimes. In Cybercrimes, Computer is used in the following two ways:-

- i.) Computer as a target
- ii.) Computer as a tool

The computer becomes a target of Cybercrime when, by way of hacking or intrusion, the criminals access a Computer with a motive to impair, damage or alter the system. The hacking can evolve into other substantive violations, for example, alteration of accounts, drawl of money etc. by cyber intrusion into a bank.

Computer becomes a tool for Cybercrime when it becomes

a convenient method to commit crimes affecting large scale networks and programmes such as introducing virus into large scale reservation or financial network or unauthorizedly obtaining classified information from data stored in defense and security computers.

10.2 Classification of computer crimes:

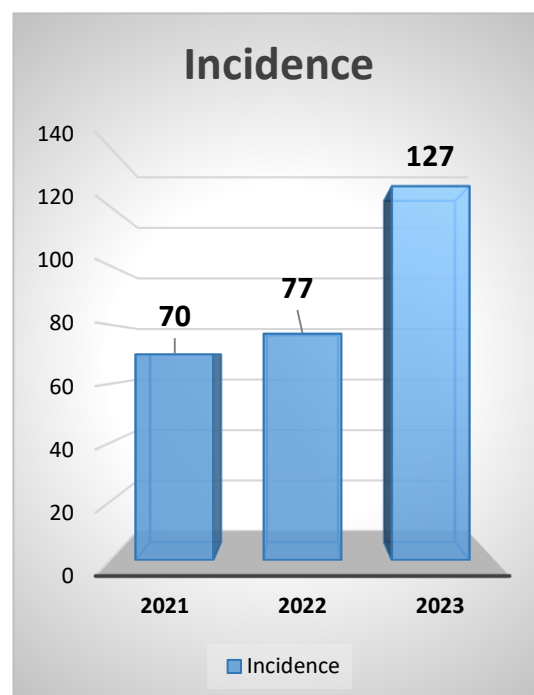

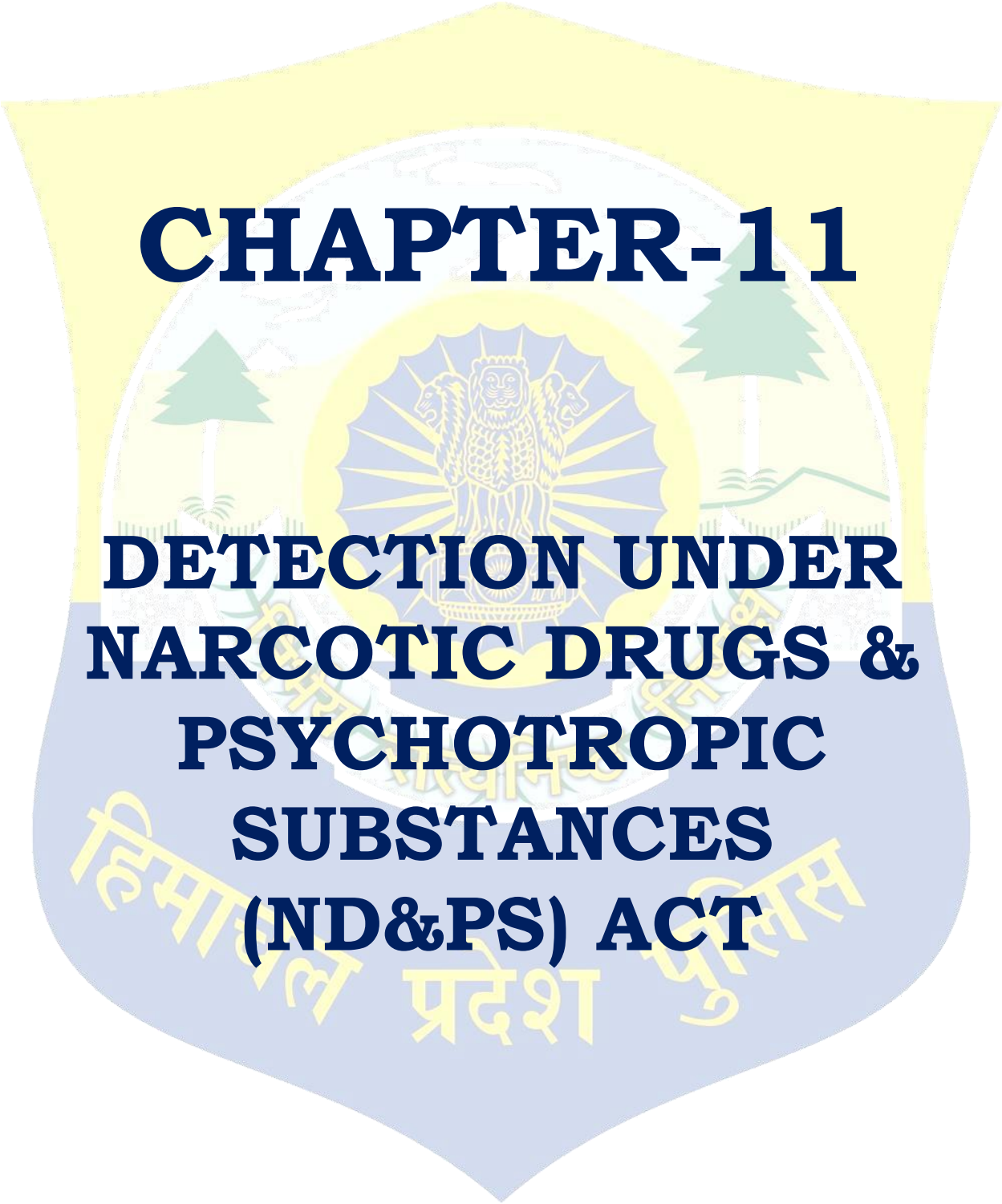

DETECTION UNDER NARCOTIC DRUGS & PSYCHOTROPIC SUBSTANCES (ND&PS) ACT

11.1 Drug Menace in Himachal Pradesh:-

The State of Himachal Pradesh is well known for its natural beauty and is one of the most popular tourist destinations in the world. Unfortunately, this beautiful State has also come to be known for illicit cultivation of cannabis and opium poppy. Illicit drugs produced in the State attract drug traffickers. Generally, the youth seem to be the target of this drug menace and its abuse. Drug abuse and the drug menace is the illicit, non-medical use of limited number of substances. Most of such drugs have the properties of altering the mental state of a being in ways that are considered by social norms and defined by statute to be inappropriate, undesirable, harmful threatening to the life of the user and to the society at large. Heroin, cocaine, opium, Charas, are some of the drugs abused.

In Himachal Pradesh, there are 17495 villages out of which in 402 villages of the following five Districts cannabis grows naturally. Analysis reveals that these five districts of the State have been identified by the drug traffickers for cultivation and transporting of Cannabis:

Narcotic Drugs:

The term 'narcotic' originally referred medically to any psychoactive compound with numbing or paralyzing properties. In large doses, such drugs can cause stupor (condition of insensibility), coma or convulsion. These would include:

- (i) Cannabis preparations like Bhang, Ganja and Charas.
- (ii) Opium and Opium alkaloids like morphine.
- (iii) Coca alkaloids like Cocaine.
- (iv) Synthetic narcotic drugs like Pethidine.

11.2 Psychotropic Drugs:

The Greek word Psycho means "Soul" and "Trope" means 'Turning', and drug having peculiar affinity for or effect on mind (Mind altering). The psychotropic drugs include:

- 1) Hallucinogens: There are both natural and synthetic Drugs like LSD (Lysergic acid Diethylamide) and tetrahydrocannabinols.

- 2) **Hypnotics:** Secobarbitone, Phenobarbitone.
- 3) **Stimulants:** These drugs induce and excitement in the body like amphetamines cocaine.
- 4) **Tranquillizers:** Methaqualone, Mandrax, etc.

11.3 Depressants: Under this class would fall drugs which are pain killers, analgesics, sedatives, like barbiturates and opiates.

11.4 Important (ND&PS) Drugs:

- Opium
- Morphine
- Codeine
- Heroin
- Cocaine
- Cannabis
- Ganja
- Hashish
- Marijuana
- Synthetic Drugs
- LSD etc.

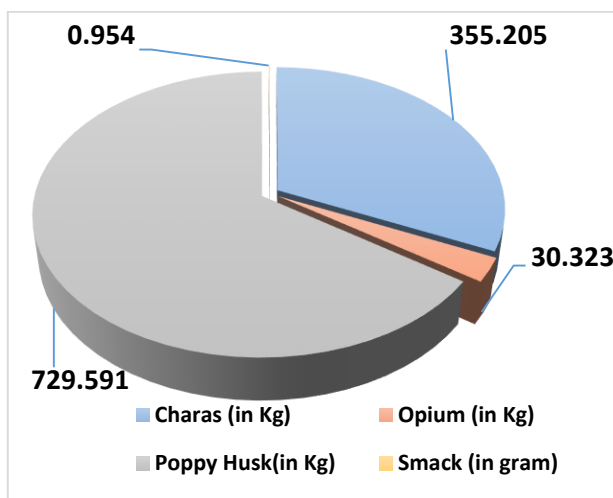

The drug-wise detection during the year 2023 according to the above mentioned table is presented in the **Chart 11.1**. The major detection of Charas (355.205 kgs.), has been made during the year 2023 followed by Poppy Husk (729.591kgs), Ganja (123.972 kgs), Opium (30.323 kgs). Detection of other drugs i.e. Smack/ heroin etc. has also been made during the year 2023.

11.6 Detailed Analysis:

The incidence (2146) under the ND&PS Act showed an increase of 41.5% over year 2022. Cases under this Act contributed 33.10% against the total Local & Special Law reported cases during the year 2023. The highest number of cases (424) under this head were

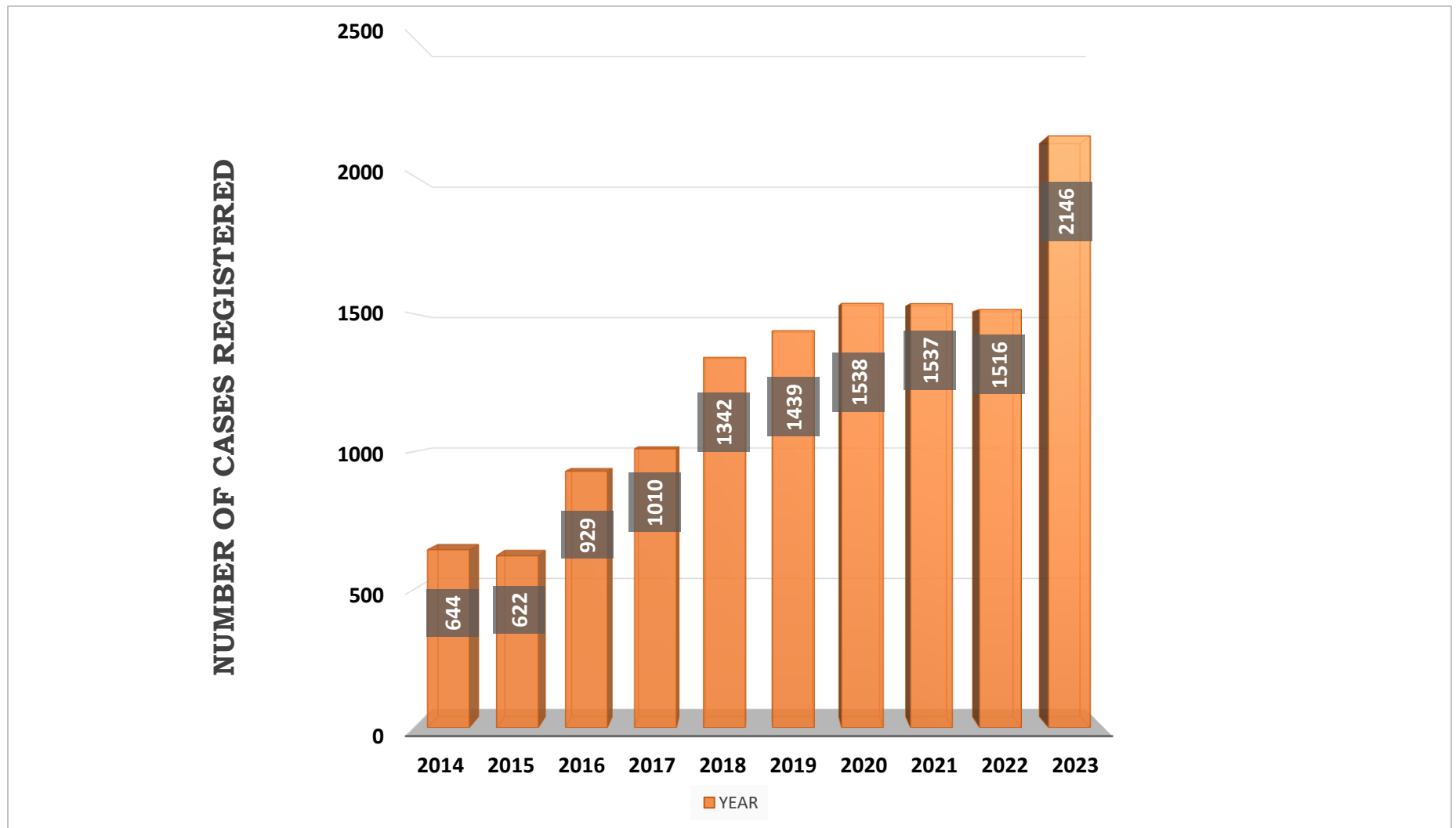
reported in District Shimla, followed by Kullu (242), Mandi (227), Bilaspur (208), Kangra (183), Una (174), Nurpur (133), Sirmaur (131), Chamba (117), Solan (108), Hamirpur (87), Baddi (82), Kinnaur (24), Lahaul & Spiti (6).

The main concentration on the cases registered under this Act remains in Shimla, Kullu, Bilaspur, Kangra and Mandi districts, with 59.83% of the total registered cases. The analysis reveals that the main source/area of drugs are districts Shimla, Mandi Bilaspur & Kullu. Further, carriers of this contraband are mostly agriculturists, laborers and poor people.

Study of age profile shows that mostly adults between 18-30 years of age are involved (51.07%). About 35.27% were in the age group of 30-45 years. Above 45 years were 13.16%.

The participation of children below 18 years is negligible (0.48%). Total 27 foreigners were involved in this activity. Previous 10 years (2014-2023) crime under this head is presented in **Chart-11.1**

POLICE STRENGTH, INFRASTRUCTURE AND EXPENDITURE

12.1 Police Strength:

The sanctioned strength of the Police personnel in Himachal Pradesh during the year 2023 was 19967, while actual strength is 17551. Total strength of (GOs) Class-I is 335, which includes 94 IPS and 193 HPS. Total Class-II GOs are 30. The strength of executive force is 18412, which includes 2281 NGOs Grade-I: Inspectors (306), Sub-Inspectors (752) Assistant Sub-Inspectors

(1223. The strength of Head Constables and Constables is 16131, (HCs-3079 and Const.-13052). The strength of ministerial staff (Class-III) is 348, Class-IV 559. The rank wise detailed sanctioned position and actual strength is presented in **Table 12.1**.

The strength of Women Police Inspector (18), Sub-Inspector (19), ASI (40), HC (97) and Constable (2213) is presented in **Table 12.2**.

12.2 Police Districts and Sub-divisions:

During the year 2023, there were 1 Zone, 3 Ranges (Northern, Southern & Central), 14 Districts (including two Police Districts at Baddi & Nurpur), 34 Police Sub-Divisions, 142 Police Stations (including 2 Police Stations of GRP and four Police Stations of CID. Detailed summary is given in **Table 12.2**.

12.3 Police Budget:

The budget allocation for Police department in Himachal Pradesh for the last 3 years is depicted in **Table 12.3**. During the budget year 2022-23, Himachal Pradesh Police Budget accounted for 2.87% of the total budget for Himachal Pradesh.

12.4 Equipment & Transport:

The district wise number and type of available equipment with Himachal Pradesh, during 2023 are presented in **Table 12.4**. There are 63 HF sets, 1207 VHF sets, 2422 Walkie Talkies and 104 other equipments available with the Himachal Police Department.

At present the total available (fleet) strength in Himachal Pradesh Police is 561 Motor Cycles, 227 (Gypsy/ Jeep/ Bolero/ Tata Mobiles), 25 Heavy vehicles and 08 Vans & others. The district wise details are given in **Table 12.5** and **Table 12.6**.

GLOSSARY

Arrest Rate:

Number of arrests per lakh of population.

Charge Sheet Rate:

Percentage of cases charge sheeted to cases in which investigations were completed.

Cognizable Offences:

A cognizable case means a case in which, a police officer may in accordance with the first schedule of the Code of Criminal Procedure 1973 or under any other Law for the time being in force, arrest without warrant.

Conviction Rate:

Percentage of cases that resulted in conviction to the number of cases in which trials were completed during a year.

Crime Against Women:

Rape, Dowry deaths, molestation, Cruelty by husband and relatives, Sexual harassment, Kidnapping & abduction of women and girls, dowry Prohibition Act.

Crime Rate:

Incidence of crime per lakh of population.

Disposal Rate by Police:

Percentage of cases investigated and Final Report presented in court to total cases meant for investigation during the year.

Disposal Rate by Courts:

Percentage of cases disposed to total cases pending/trial during a year.

Indian Penal Code:

A Penal Code for India listing out the offences and their punishments (Act No. XLV of 1860).

Local Law:

A law applicable only to a particular state/part of India.

Offence:

The word offence means any act or omission made punishable by any law for the time being in force.

Property Offence:

Includes Burglary, Theft, Dacoity and Robbery.

Special law:

A law applicable to a particular subject.
