CHAPTER-1

INCIDENT AND RATE OF COGNIZABLE CRIME IN HIMACHAL PRADESH

1.1 General:

Himachal Pradesh is a hilly and a peaceful State. There are sporadic incidents of crime taking place but no particular area of any district of this State is notorious for any class or category of crime. There has not been any abnormal fluctuation in the incidence of crime in the State.

The crime situation has remained peaceful and well under control during the year 2024 throughout the State of Himachal Pradesh. No alarming increase was noticed under any major head of crime.

1.2. The Parameters for Review and Analysis of Crime:-

The following parameters have been adopted while analyzing crime for the year 2024:-

- ➡ Geographical spread.
- ➡ Reasons for commission of crime, especially in offences against persons.
- ➡ Investigation process followed.
- ➡ Recovery of property.
- ➡ Profile of criminals.

1.3. Reported Incidents of Cognizable Crimes:

The ten years trends of incidence and rate of total cognizable crime under Indian Penal Code (IPC)/BNS and Local & Special Laws (2015-2024) is presented in **Table-1.2** at the end of the chapter. A total of 17915 cognizable crime cases were reported during the year 2024. These comprise 12071 cases under IPC/BNS and 5844 cases under Special & Local Laws (SLL). (**Table-1.1** and **Chart-1.1 & 1.2**)

FOR THE LAST 10 YEARS (2015-2024)

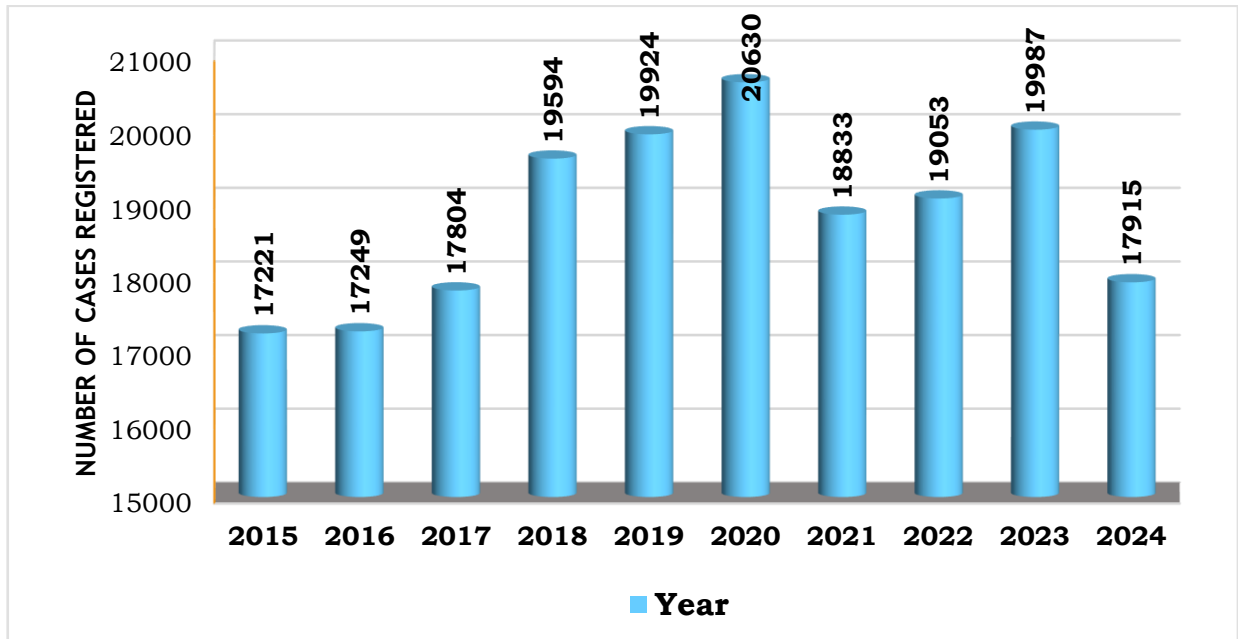
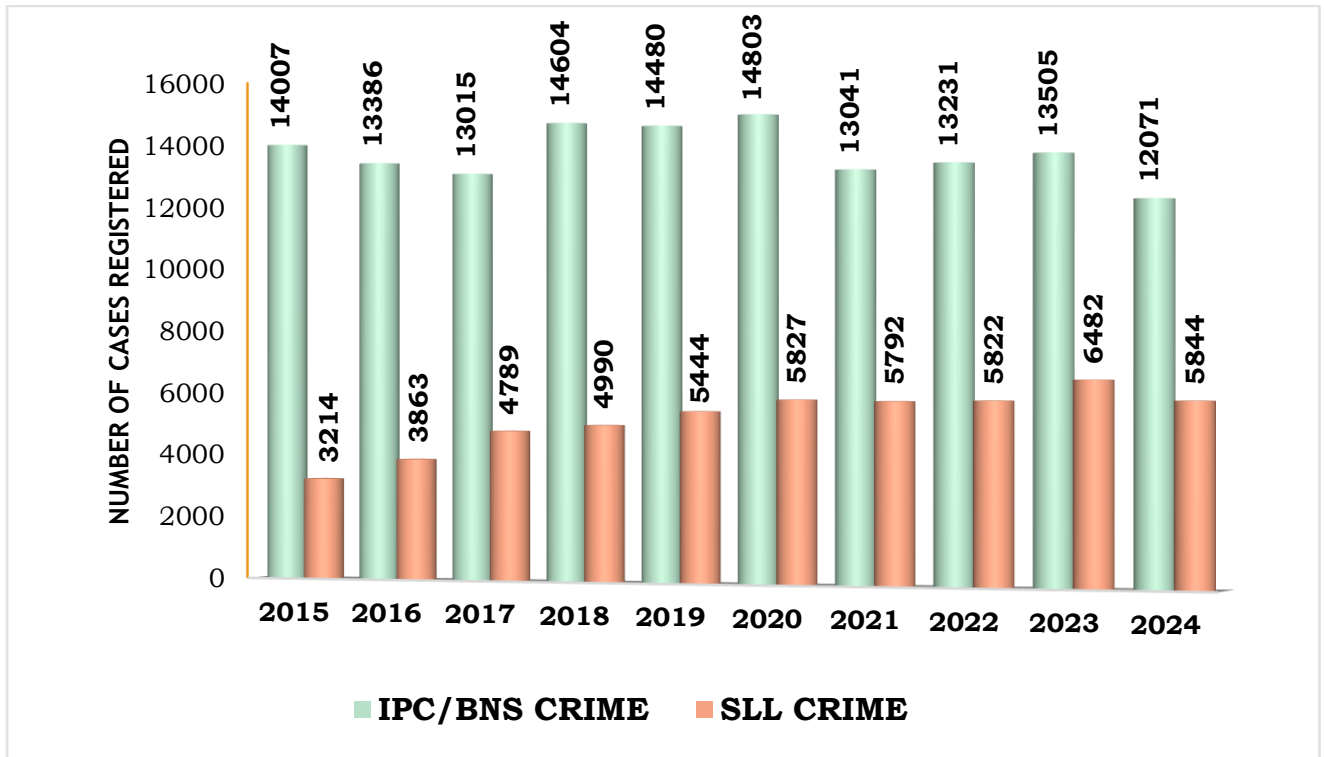


CHART-1.2

1.4. Crime Trends:

1.4.1. Crime Incidents:

During the year 2024, cases of cognizable crime have decreased by **10.4% (-2072)** as compared to the registration of cognizable crime cases of the corresponding year. The registration in IPC/BNS crimes has recorded a decrease of **10.6%** and Special & Local Laws crime has recorded a decrease of **9.8%** in 2024 as compared to the previous year.

A total of 12071 IPC/BNS cases were reported in the State during 2024, as against 13505 cases in 2023 (**10.6% decrease**). Mandi, Kangra & Shimla districts have recorded crime incidents between 1001 to 2000 IPC cases. Una, Solan, Bilaspur, Sirmaur, Kullu, Baddi, Hamirpur, Nurpur & Chamba districts have recorded crime incidents between 501 to 1000 IPC cases. The crime incidents in districts Kinnaur, Lahaul & Spiti, Railway & Traffic Unit, Cyber Units and CID have remained below the figure of 500 cases. The district wise volume of crime is depicted in **Table 1.3**.

1.4.2. District-wise IPC/BNS Crime Trends:

The highest occurrence of IPC cases was reported in Mandi (1705 cases) followed by Kangra (1532) Shimla (1372), Una (981), Solan (963), Bilaspur (959), Sirmaur (952), Kullu (776), Baddi (740), Hamirpur (688), Nurpur (606), Chamba (528), Kinnaur (174), Lahaul & Spiti (62), GRP (13) and Cyber PS (20). The details of number of districts falling under different ranges of incidents of IPC/BNS crimes during the year 2024 are presented in **Table 1.3**.

1.5. Crime Pattern: (IPC/BNS Crimes)

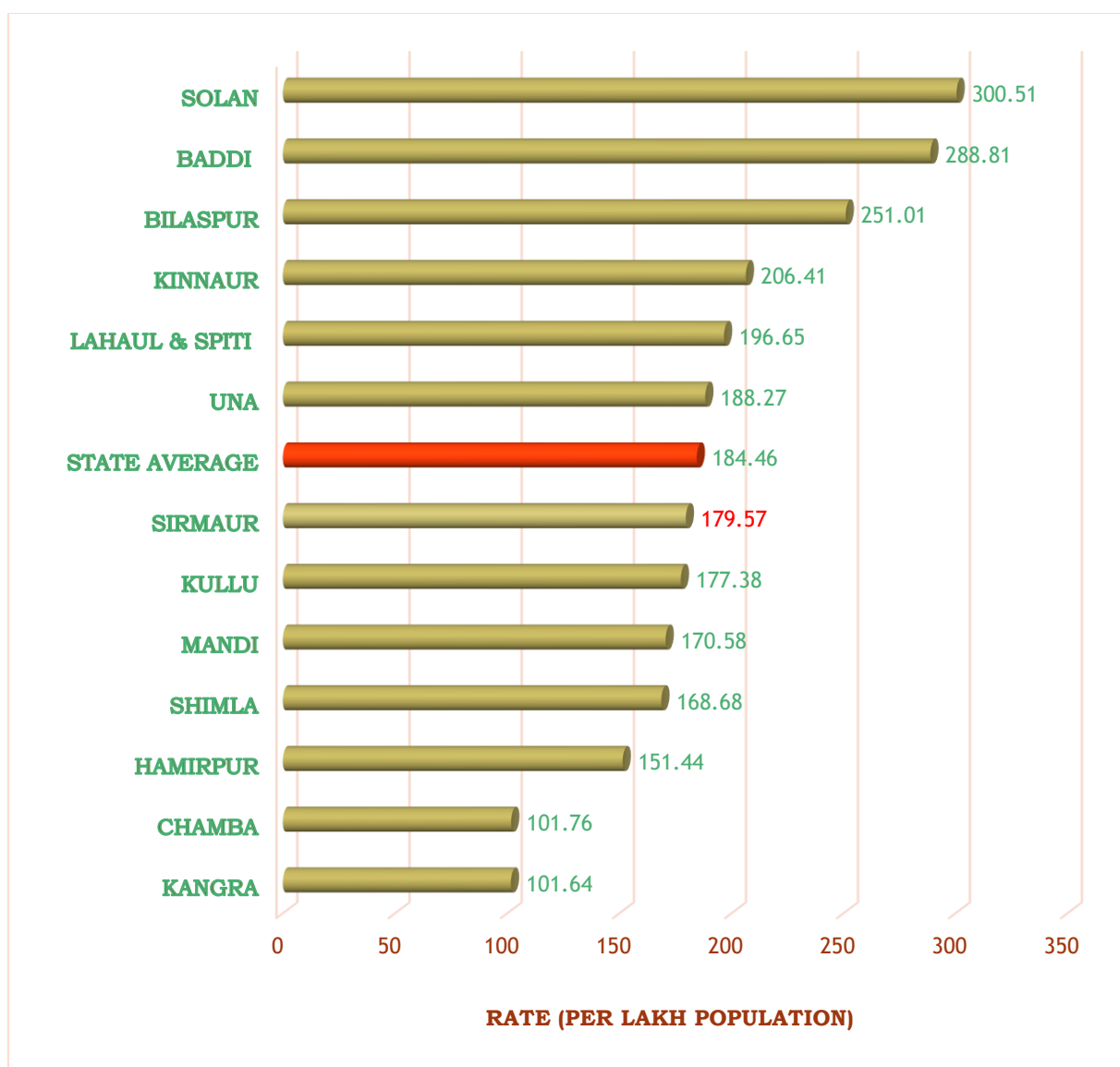
As compared to 2023, this year the incidents of Attempt to Murder, Culpable Homicide, Kid & Abduction, Dacoity, Robbery, Rioting, and Grievous Hurt have shown an increases, while incidents of Rape, Burglary and Theft have shown a decrease. There is no increase or decrease in Dowry Death case.

1.6. Crime Rate:

The District wise crime rate is presented in **Table-1.4**. The

average IPC crime rate in the State for 2024 was 161.28. The highest crime rate districts are Solan (300.51) followed by Baddi (288.81), Bilaspur (251.01), Kinnaur (206.41), Lahaul & Spiti (196.65), Una (188.27), Sirmaur (179.57), Kullu (177.38), Mandi (170.58), Shimla (168.68), Hamirpur (151.44), Chamba (101.76), Kangra (101.64) and Nurpur (99.79).

Head Wise Analysis of IPC Offences:

The head wise analysis of IPC offences is presented in Table-1.5. The head wise statistics shows the following trends:-

(i) Murder: (Decrease of 9.68%)

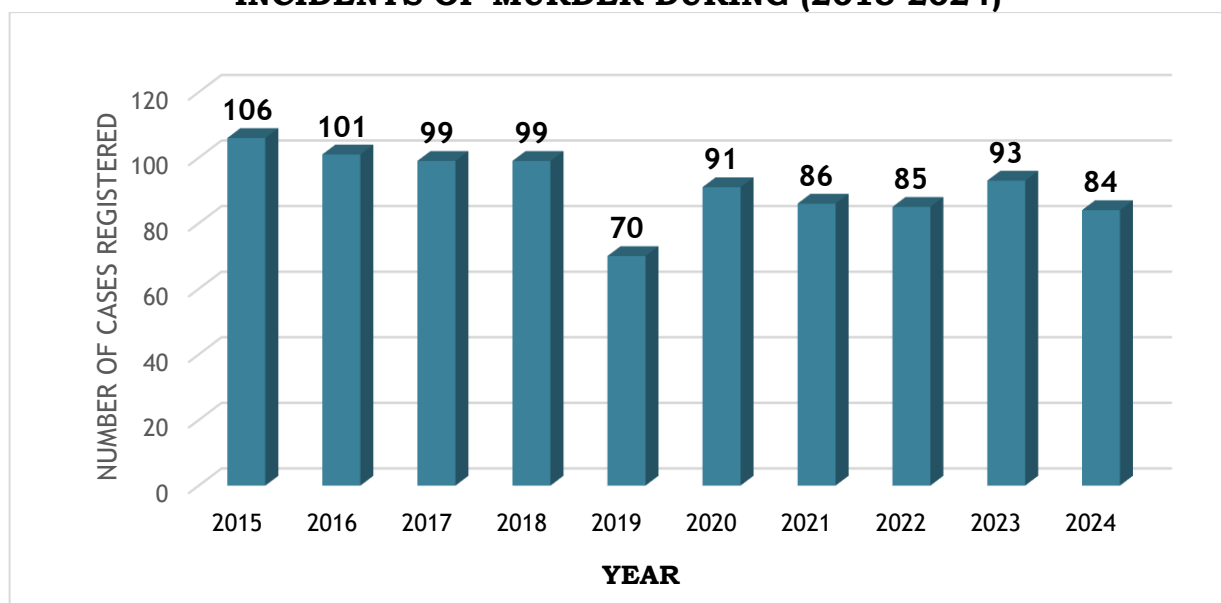
The incidents of murder (84) in 2024 decreased by 9.68% as compared to the previous year. The highest incidents of murder were reported in Shimla (15) followed by Kangra (12), Baddi (11), Mandi (7), Bilaspur, Solan & Una (6 each). The lowest number of incidents of murder were reported in Chamba & Hamirpur (5 each),

Kullu, Nurpur & Sirmaur (3 each), Nurpur (4). No incident under this head was reported in Lahaul & Spiti, CID, GRP & Cyber. The number of cases registered in the previous 10 years (2015-2024) under this head are presented in Chart-1.4.

The analysis of the causes has revealed that no organized gang was operating in the State. In most of these cases, crime is committed due to various types of disputes or murder for gain or personal enmity, love affairs and illicit relationships. There was no class or caste factor involved in the commission of murders.

INCIDENTS OF MURDER DURING (2015-2024)

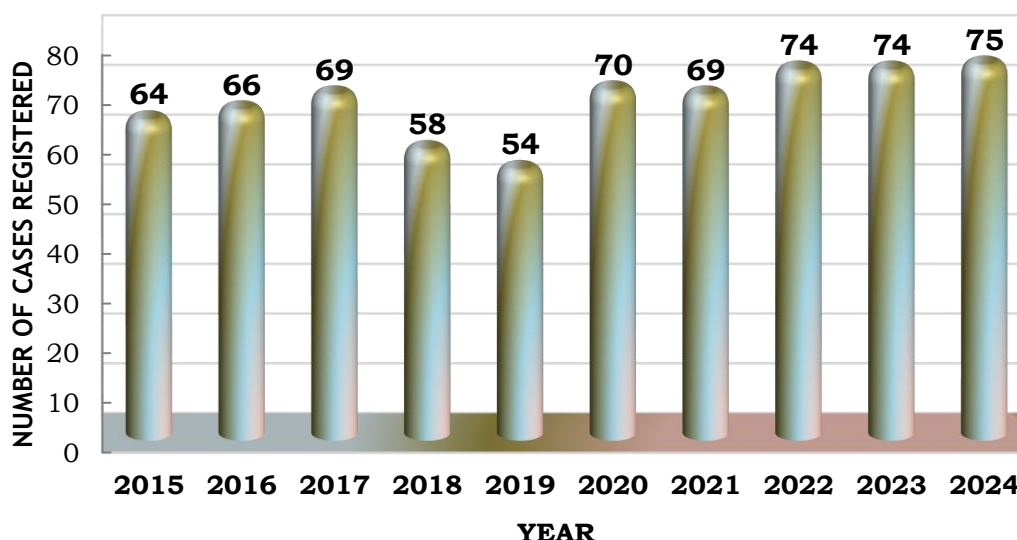


(ii). Attempt to commit**Murder: (Increase of 1.4%)**

The incidents of Attempt to Commit Murder (75) reported during this year increase by 1.4% as compared to the previous year. The highest incidents under this head were reported in districts Mandi (12), followed by Kangra (9), Nurpur (8),

Baddi, Shimla & Solan (7 each), Bilaspur & Hamirpur (6 each), Kullu (4), Sirmaur (3), Chamba & Una (2), Kinnaur & L&S (1 each). No incident under this head was reported in GRP, CID & Cyber Units. Previous 10 years (2015-2024) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.5](#).

INCIDENTS OF ATTEMPT TO MURDER DURING (2015-2024)

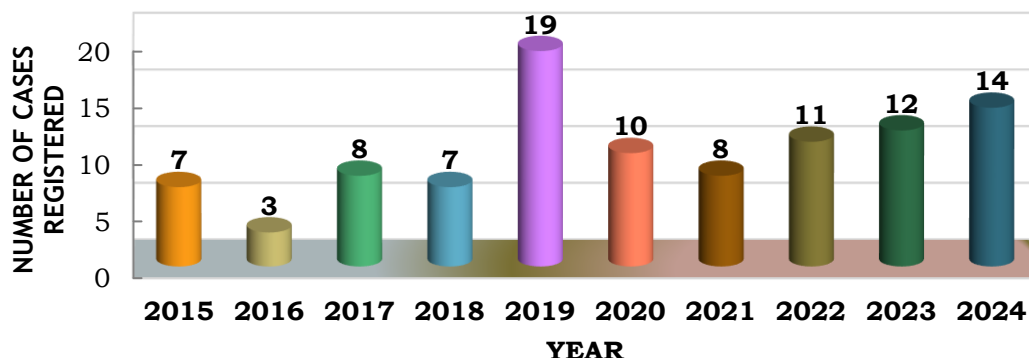


(iii). Culpable Homicide not amounting to Murder: (Increase of 16.6 %)

Total 14 cases of Culpable Homicide not amounting to Murder were reported during 2024, showing an increase of 16.6% over the previous year (14 cases). The highest number of incident 03 cases were reported in

Hamirpur & Solan district followed by Shimla (2), Baddi, Kinnaur, Kullu, Mandi, Nurpur, & Sirmaur (1 each). No incident under this head was reported in the remaining districts/Units of the State. Previous 10 years (2015-2024) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.6](#).

DURING (2015-2024)

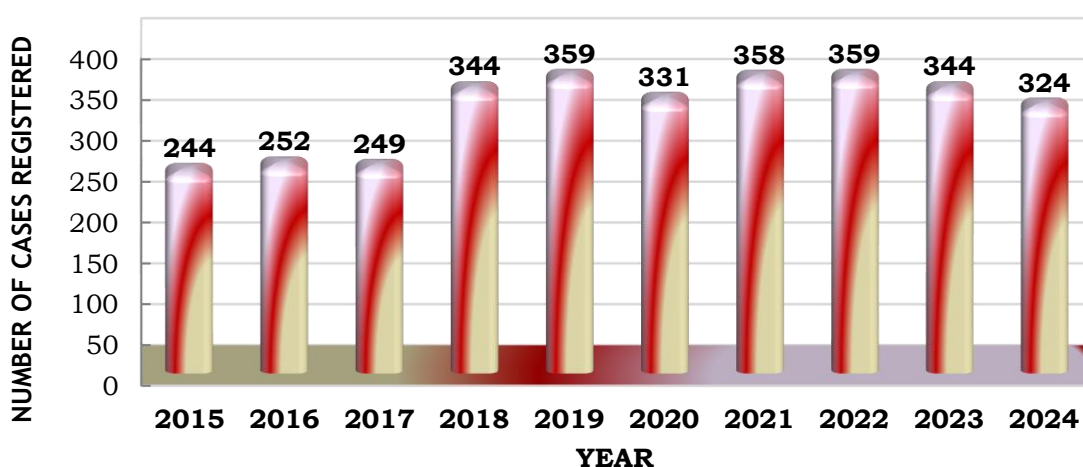


(iv). Rape: (Decrease of 5.81%)

Total 324 cases of Rape were reported during 2024; a decrease of 5.81% over the previous year (344 cases). The highest incidents of Rape were reported in district Mandi (54), followed by Sirmaur (49), Shimla (46), Hamirpur (37), Chamba (26),

Solan (24), Baddi (23), Kullu (17) Una (15), Bilaspur (12), Nurpur (8), Hamirpur (7) & Kinnaur (6). No incident under this head was reported in the remaining districts/Units of the State. Previous 10 years (2015-2024) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.7.

INCIDENTS OF RAPE DURING (2015-2024)

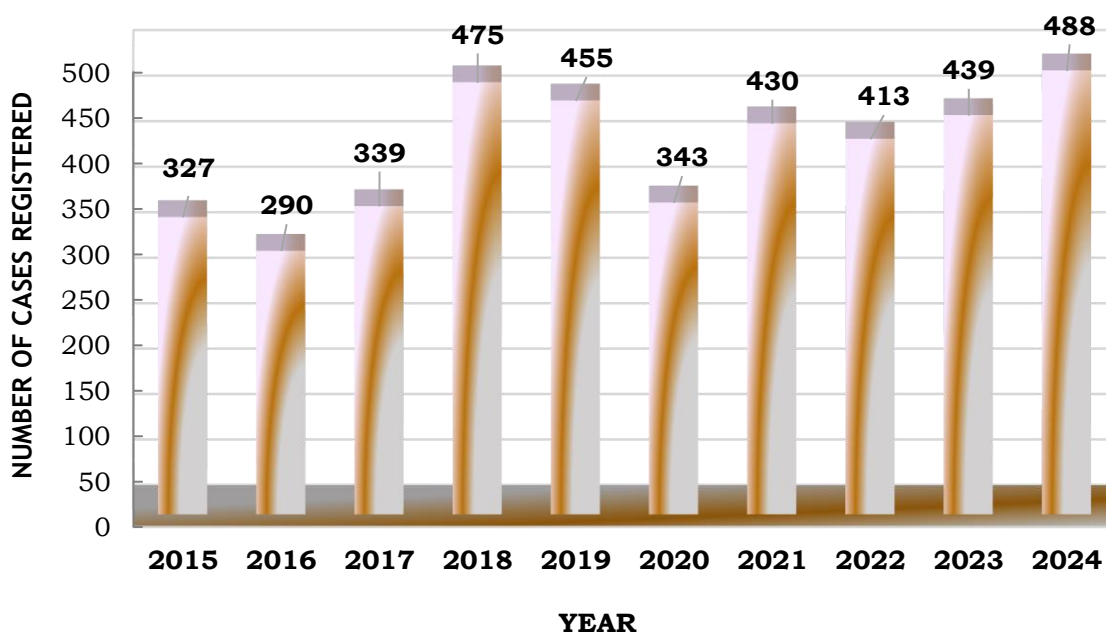


(v). Kidnapping and Abduction:
(Increase of 11.2 %)

During the year 2024, a total number of 488 cases of Kidnapping and Abduction were reported; an increase of 11.2% as compared to the previous year. The highest number of incidents were reported in district Mandi (83), followed by Baddi (50), Kangra (46),

Shimla (45), Chamba & Sirmaur (33 each), Hamirpur & Una (32 each), Bilaspur (25), Nurpur (21), Kinnaur (08). No incident under this head was reported in the remaining districts/Units of the State. Previous 10 years (2015-2024) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.8.

DURING (2015-2024)

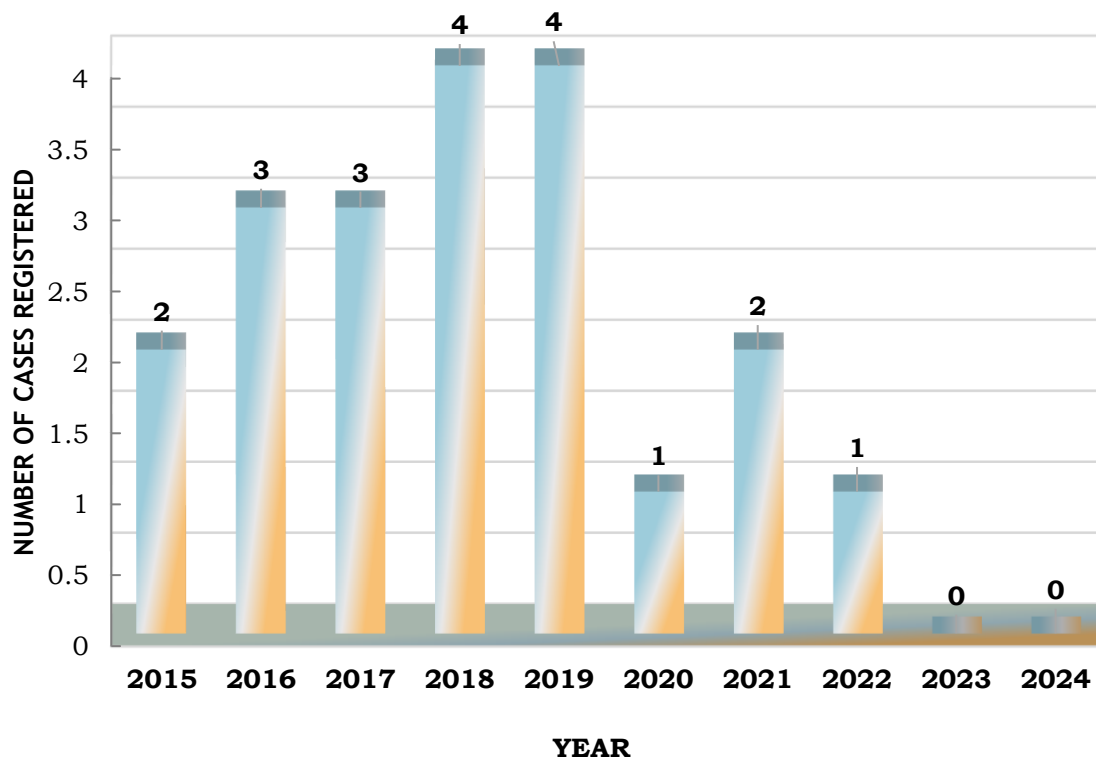


(vi). Dowry Death: (No variation)

No incident under this head was reported 2024 as compared to

DURING (2015-2024)



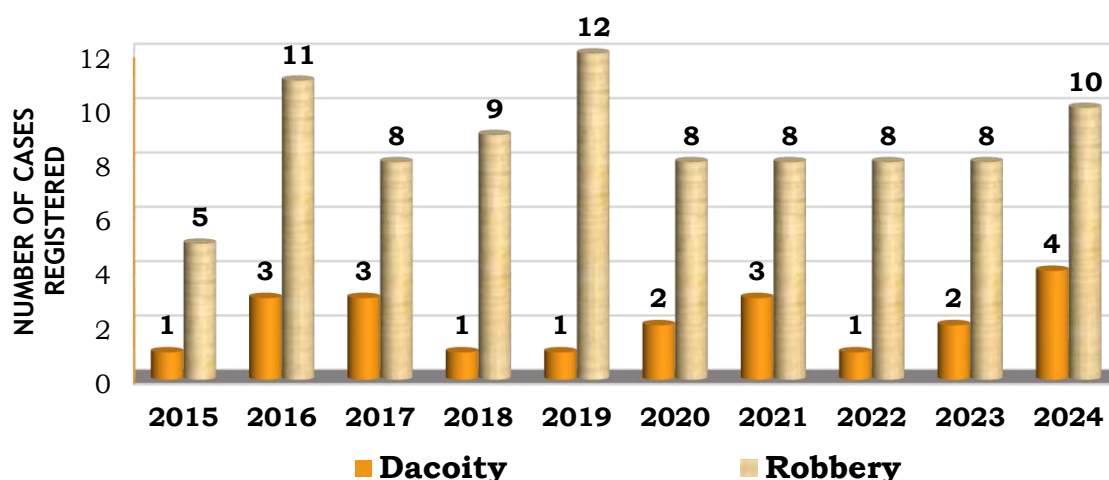
(vii). Dacoity: (Increase of 100%)

During the year 2024, 4 cases were registered in the State as compared to the previous year (2 case). Baddi, Mandi, Sirmaur and Solan registered (1 each), no incident under this head was reported in the remaining districts/units of the State. The previous 10 years (2015-2024) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.10](#).

(viii). Robbery: (Increase of 25%)

During the year 2024, 10 cases of Robbery were registered in the State. The highest number of incidents were reported in district Mandi & Solan (3 each), followed by Bilaspur, Kangra, Sirmaur & Una (1 each). No case under this head was reported in rest of the districts of the State. Previous 10 years (2015-2024) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.10](#).

INCIDENTS OF DACOITY AND ROBBERY DURING (2015-2024)

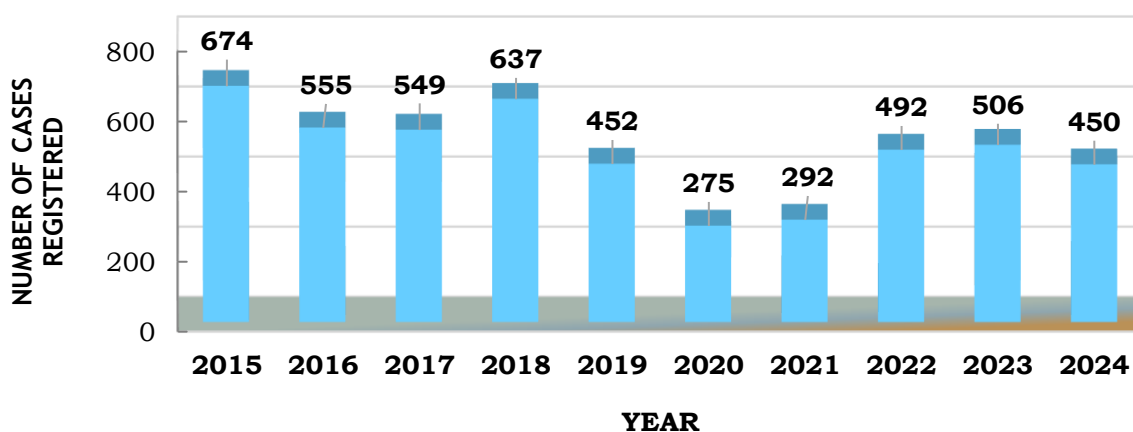


(ix). Burglary: (Decrease of 11.1%)

The incidents of Burglary (450) recorded a decrease with 11.1% during the year 2024 as compared to the previous year. The highest number of Burglary cases were reported in district Kangra (64), followed by Shimla (54), Solan (49), Una (45), Mandi

(42), Baddi (40), Bilaspur & Sirmaur (32 each), Kullu (28), Hamirpur (26), Nurpur (23), Chamba (13) and Kinnaur (02). No case under this head was reported in rest of the units of the State. Previous 10 years (2015-2024) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.11](#).

INCIDENTS OF BURGLARY DURING (2015-2024)

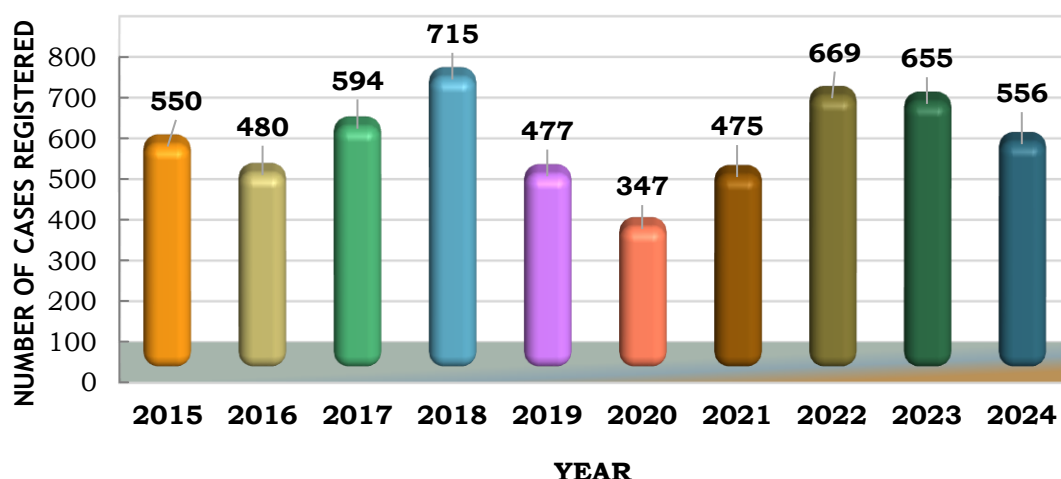


(x). Theft: (Decrease of 15.1%)

The incidents of Theft (556) recorded a decrease of 15.1% during the year 2024 over the previous year. Baddi district has reported the highest incidents (85), followed by Mandi (69), Shimla (66), Sirmaur (61), Una (56),

Bilaspur & Solan (54 each), Kangra (38), Hamirpur (22), Nurpur (19), Kullu (13), Chamba (08), GRP & Kinnaur (04 each) and Lahaul & Spiti (03). Previous 10 years (2015-2024) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.12](#).

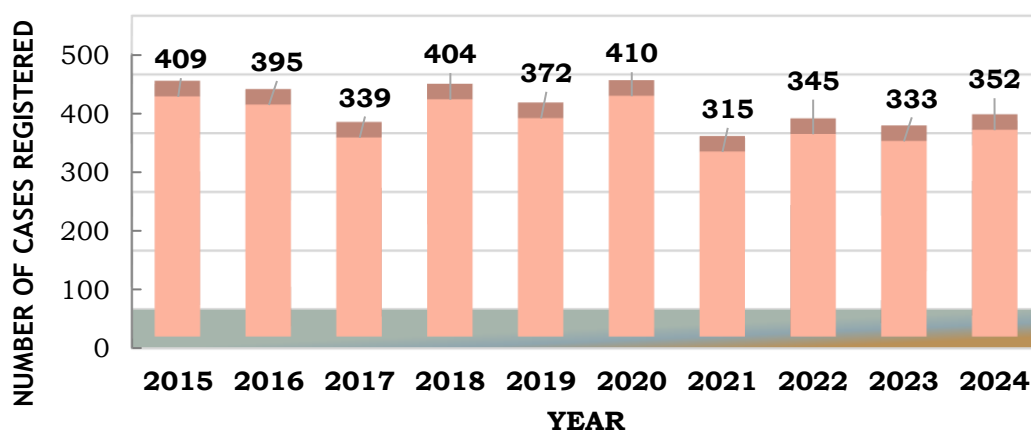
CHART-1.12

**(xi). Riots: (Increase of 5.7%)**

Incidents of Riots (352) registered during the year 2024 recorded an increase of 5.7% over the previous year. The highest number of incidents were reported in district Sirmaur (53), followed by

Baddi (42), Mandi (40), Nurpur & Solan (33 each), Una (32), Kullu (26), Bilaspur (24), Kangra (23), Shimla (22), Hamirpur (13), Chamba (09) and Kinnaur (02). Previous 10 years (2015-2024) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.13](#).

INCIDENTS OF RIOTING DURING (2015-2024)

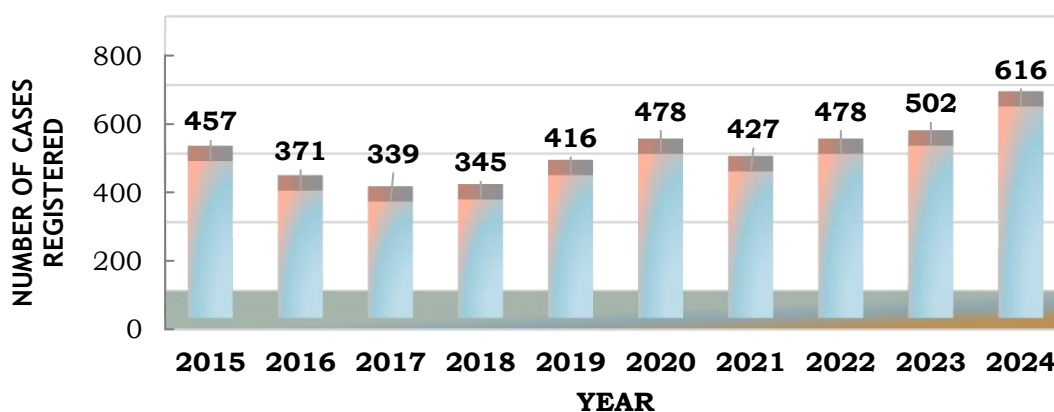


(xii). Grievous Hurt: (Increase of 22.7%)

A total number of 616 cases under the crime head Grievous Hurt were reported during 2024; an increase of 22.7% over the previous year. District Mandi has reported the highest number of incidents (83) under this

head, followed by Shimla (71), Kangra (65), Narpur (57), Una (51), Hamirpur (50), Bilaspur (48), Sirmaur (45), Chamba (34), Baddi (33), Kullu (31), Solan (28), Kinnaur (12), Lahaul & Spiti (08). Previous 10 years (2015-2024) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.14.

INCIDENTS OF HURT DURING (2015-2024)

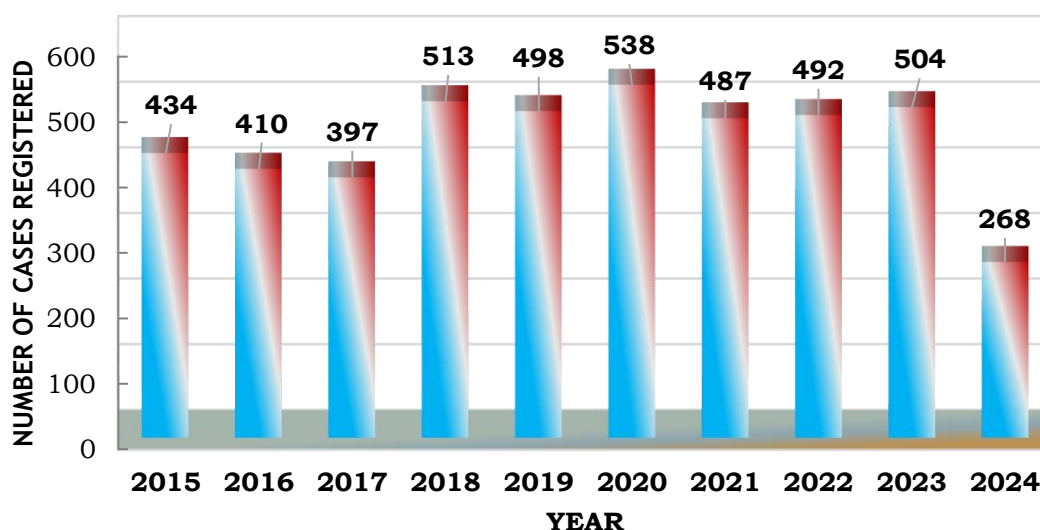


(xiii). Assault on Women:
(Decrease of 46.8%)

A total of 268 cases were reported during the year, showing a decrease of 46.8% over the previous year. District Mandi has reported the highest number of incidents (44), followed by Kangra (41), Sirmaur (33), Shimla (31),

Solan (25), Kullu (18), Chamba (17), Hamirpur (14) Bilaspur & Nurpur (13 each), Una (09), Baddi (08), Kinnaur (02). No incident reported in rest of the district/units. Previous 10 years (2015-2024) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.15](#).

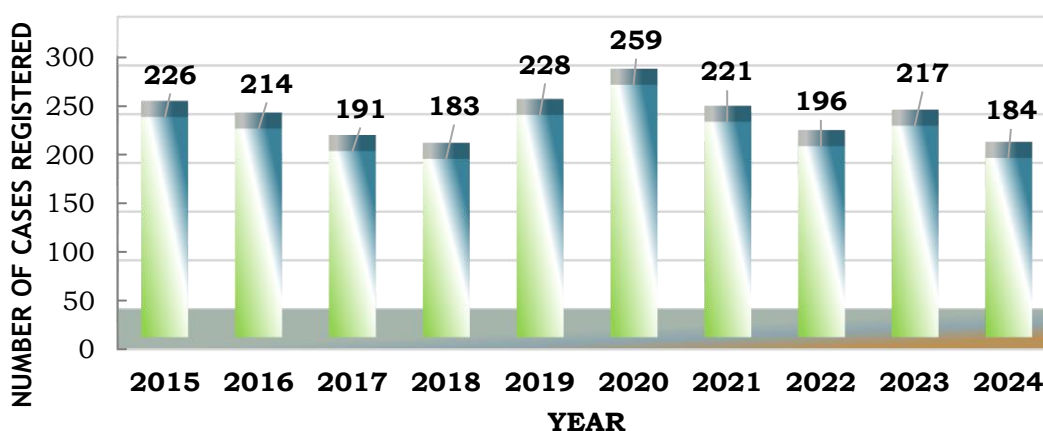
CHART-1.15

(Decrease of 15.2%)

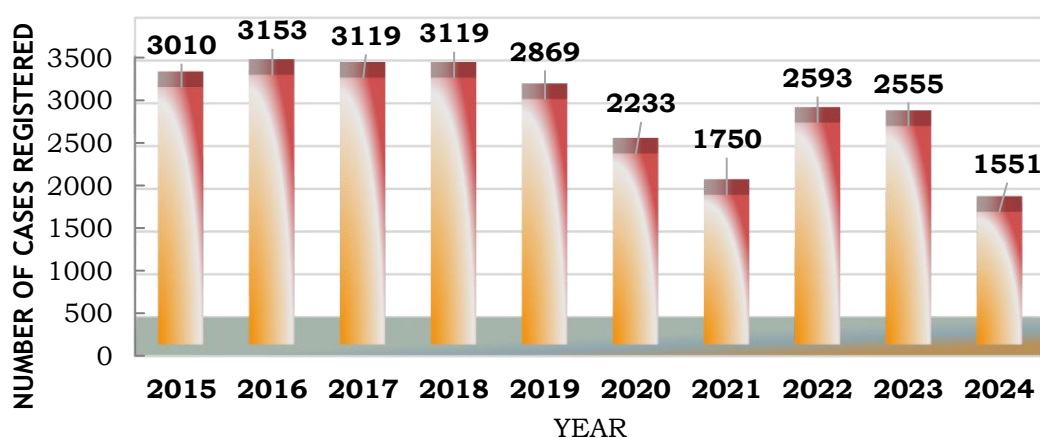
A total of 184 cases were reported during the year, showing an increase of 15.2% over the previous year. 28 cases were reported in district Mandi, followed by Una (27), Kangra (23), Bilaspur (22), Shimla (16), Baddi & Sirmaur

(12 each), Kullu (11), Solan (10), Hamirpur (09), Chamba (07), Nurpur (06) and Kinnaur (01). No incident reported in Lahaul & Spiti district and other units in the State. Previous 10 years (2015-2024) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.16](#).

A total of 1551 cases of accident were registered during the year 2024 showing a decrease of 31.2% over the previous year. The highest number of accidents were registered in district Shimla with 219 cases, followed by Mandi (218),

Solan (162), Una (156), Kangra (155), Kullu (132), Sirmaur (128), Bilaspur (116), Baddi (90), Hamirpur (62), Nurpur (50), Chamba (37), Kinnaur (14), Lahaul & Spiti (12). Previous 10 years (2015-2024) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.17](#).

CHART-1.17**INCIDENTS OF ACCIDENTS DURING (2015-2024)**

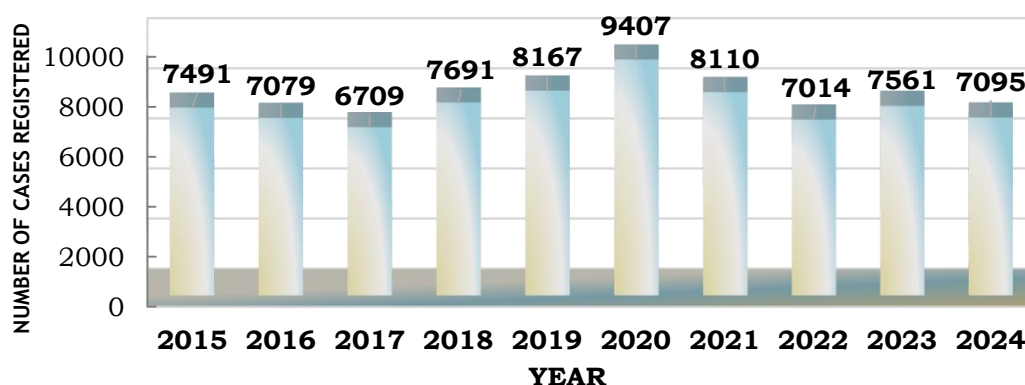
**(xvi). Other IPC/BNS Crimes
(Decrease of 6.2 %)**

Cognizable IPC/BNS Crimes which do not fall under any of the above specified categories are termed as “Other IPC Crime”. As many as 7095 other IPC crimes, accounting for 58.8% of the Total IPC crimes, were registered in the State during 2024.

Incidents of IPC Crime (Head-wise), along with percentage

share, are presented in Table-1.6. The ten year trend in percentage change (head-wise) is presented in Table-1.7. District-wise and head wise details of IPC offences are available in Table-1.8 and Table-1.9. Previous 10 years (2015-2024) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.18 and percentage of Other IPC cases against IPC cases for the last 10 years is presented in Chart. 1.19.

FOR THE LAST 10 YEARS (2015-2024)**

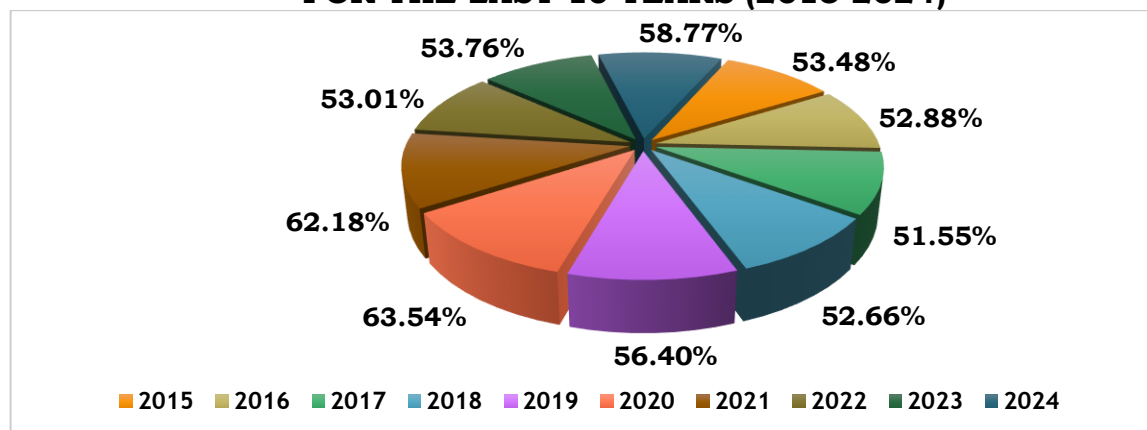
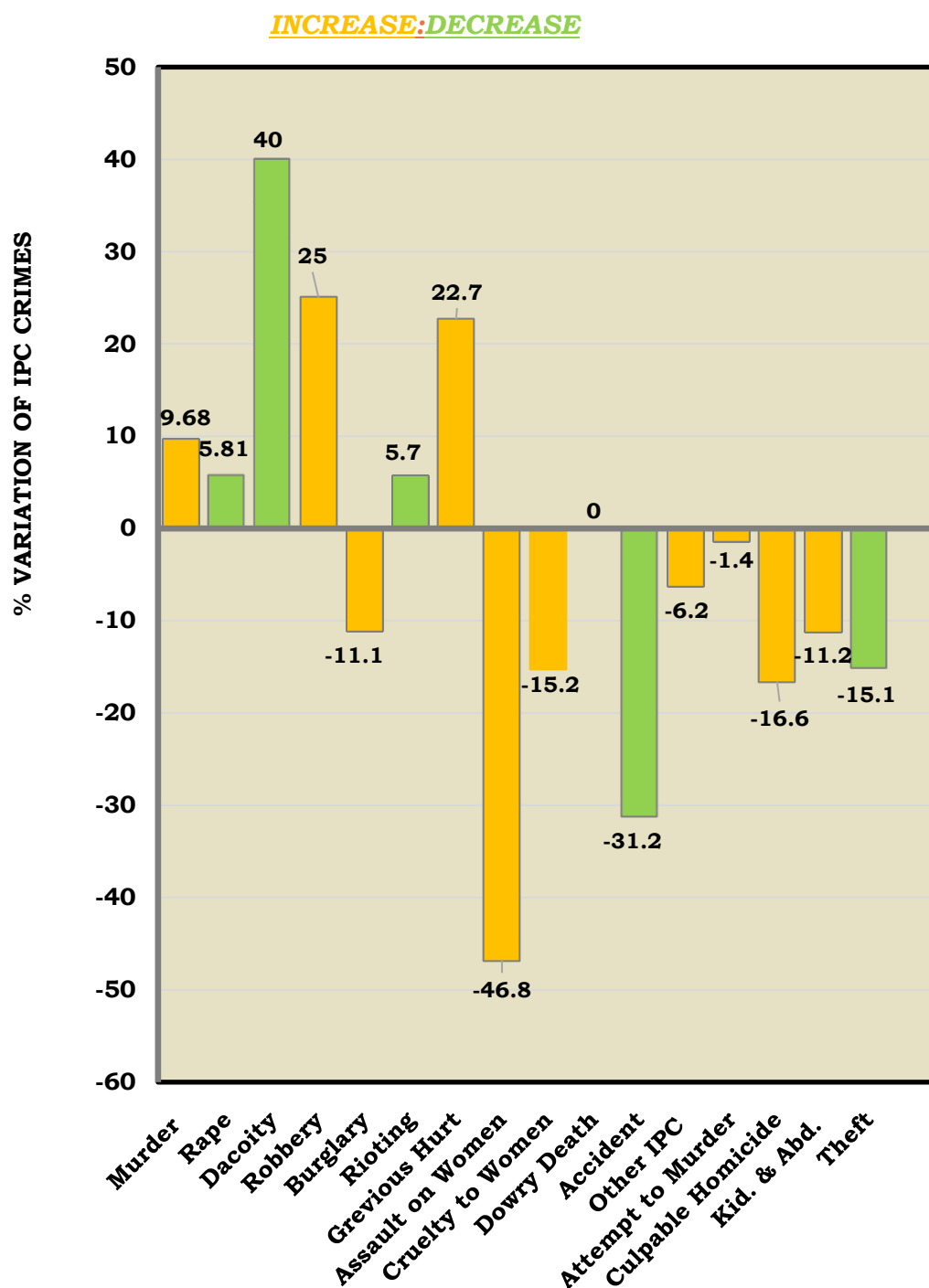


CHART-1.20

1.8 Crime under Local and Special Laws:

A list of Special and Local Laws is available at Annexure-II. Incidents and rate of cognizable Local & Special Law crimes during 2015 to 2024 are presented in **Table-1.10**.

A total of 5844 cognizable Local & Special Law (SLL) crimes were registered in the State during 2024. The head-wise percentage distribution of various cognizable crimes under Local & Special Law for 10 years from 2015 to 2024 is presented in **Table-1.11**. There is an increase of 20.8% in registration over the previous year.

The crime head-wise incidents and rate of cognizable Local & Special Law crimes in different districts are presented in **Table-1.12**.

Incidents of Local & Special Law cases under important Special and Local Laws are elaborated below:-

1.8.1 Head Wise Analysis of SLL Offences:

(i). Arms Act: (Increase of 20.8%)

During this year, 29 cases of Arms Act have been registered, depicting decrease of

20.8% over the previous year. The highest number of incidents under this head were reported in districts Kangra, Kullu & Una (4 each), followed by Bilaspur & Nurpur (3 each), Baddi, Mandi, Shimla, Sirmaur and Solan (2 each) & Kinnaur (1). No case under this Act was reported in the remaining districts.

(ii). Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act (ND&PS): (Decrease of 20.1%)

A total of 1715 cases were registered under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act in the year 2024, as compared to 2146 cases during previous year, showing a decrease of 20.1%. Cases under this Act constituted 29.3% against the total Local & Special Law cases reported during 2024. The highest number of incidents under this head were reported in district Shimla (267), followed by Kullu (241), Mandi (227), Bilaspur (196), Kangra (149), Una (105), Sirmaur (103), Chamba (85), Baddi (84), Solan (80), Nurpur (79), Hamirpur (65), Kinnaur (26) and Lahaul & Spiti (07).

The main concentration on incidents

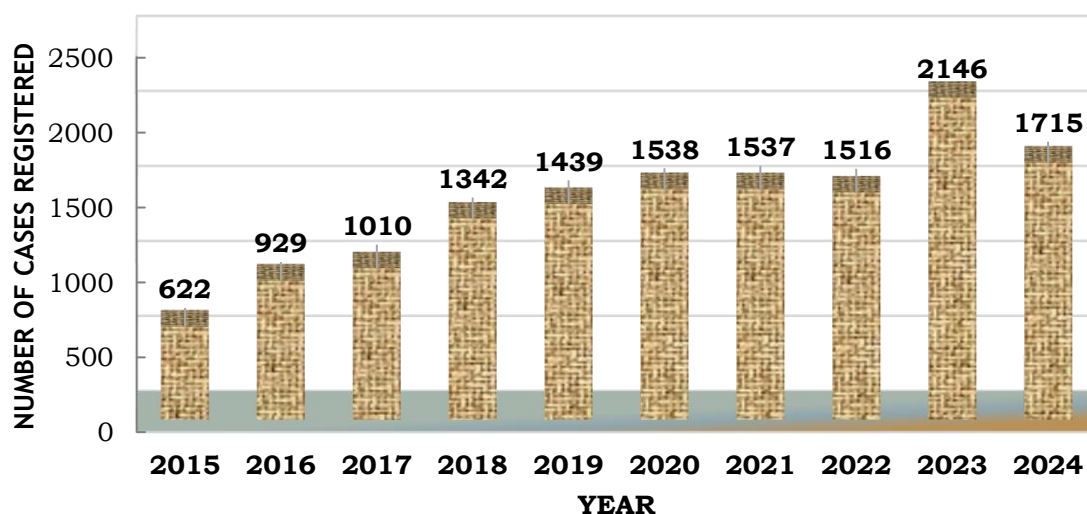
registered under this Act remains in Shimla, Kullu, Mandi, Bilaspur, and Kangra districts, with 54.3 % of the total registered cases. Analysis reveals that the main sources/areas of drugs are Shimla, Mandi, Bilaspur, Kullu and Kangra district. Further, carriers of contraband are mostly peasants, laborers and poor people.

Study of age profile of the accused shows that mostly adults between 18-30 years of age

are involved (53.3%). About 38.2% were in the age group of 30-45 years. Those above 45 years were 7.6%.

The participation of children below 18 years is negligible (0.38%). 19 foreigners were involved in this activity, which include 01 Israel, European (01) and 17 Asian (Nepalese). Previous 10 years (2015-2024) crime under this head is presented in **Chart-1.21**.

(iii). Gambling Act: (Decrease of 22.3%)

A total of 467 cases under the Gambling Act have been registered during 2024. The highest number of cases were reported in

district Una (148), followed by Baddi (140), Sirmaur (104), Kinnaur (22), Kangra (14), Kullu (11), L&S (10), Chamba (05), Hamirpur & Nurpur (3 each), Bilaspur, Mandi & Solan (2 each),

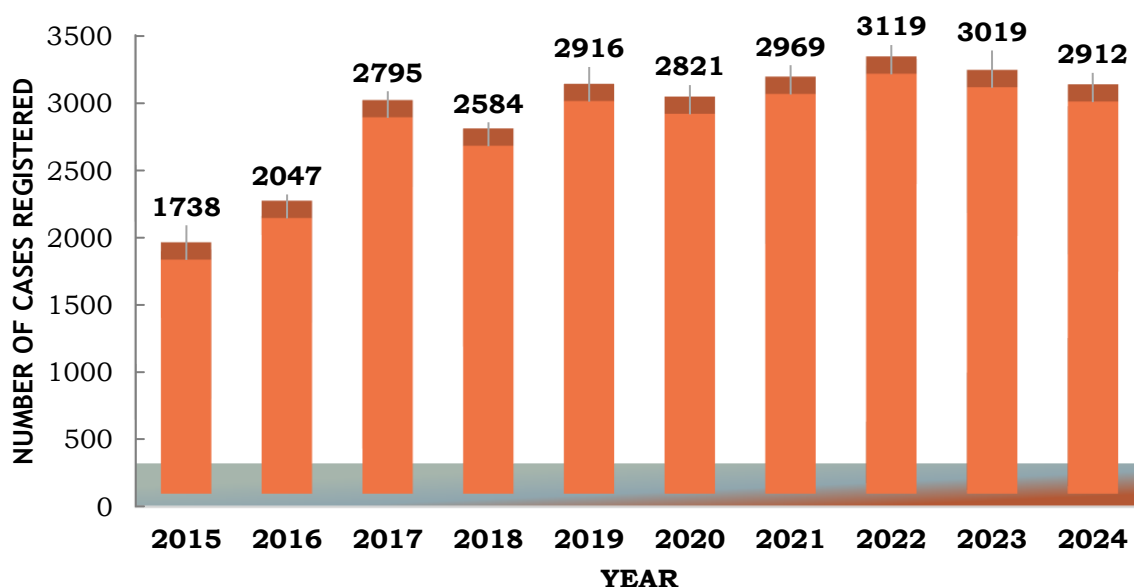
Shimla (1). No incident under this head was reported in CID, GRP and Cyber.

(iv). Excise Act: (Decrease of 3.5%)

The cases registered 2912 under the Excise Act showed decrease of 3.5% over the previous year. Cases under this Act contributed 49.8% against the total cases under Local & Special Law (SLL) reported during 2024. The

highest number of cases were reported in district Kangra (484), followed by Mandi (413), Kullu (357), Chamba (287), Nurpur (282), Shimla (226), Sirmaur (202), Bilaspur (121), Una (118), Baddi (113), Kinnaur (100), Solan (79), Hamirpur (75), L&S (54) and GRP (1). The lowest number of cases under this Act were registered in GRP (1). Previous 10 years (2015-2024) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.22](#).

DETECTION UNDER EXCISE ACT DURING 2015-2024



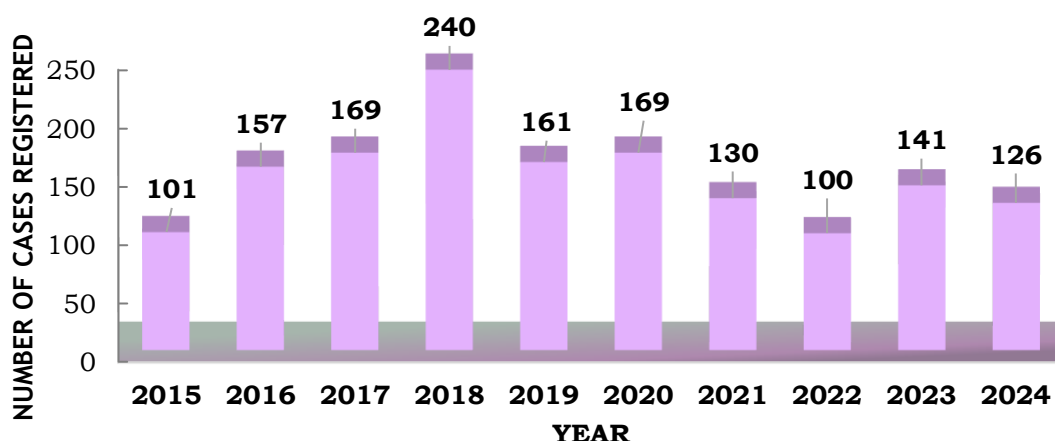
(v). Forest Act: (decrease of 10.6%)

The number of cases (126) registered under the Forest Act showed an increase of 10.6% over the previous year. Mandi district has reported the highest number of cases (24), Sirmaur (21), Una (18), Kullu (17), Shimla (12), Baddi (08), Kangra (07), Solan (05), Bilaspur & Nurpur (04 each), Hamirpur (03), Chamba (02) and L&S (1). The

lowest registration under this Act was seen in L&S (1). No case under this head was reported in districts/units.

The analysis reveals that majority of the cases have been registered in districts Kullu, Mandi, Una, Baddi, Sirmaur & Kangra. Previous 10 years (2015-2024) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.23](#).

**(vi). Protection of Civil Rights Act: (Variation 50%)**

During the year 2024, 3 incidents under the PCR Act was reported in Kinnaur district. No case under this head was registered in rest of the districts. Previous 10 years (2015-2024) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.24](#).

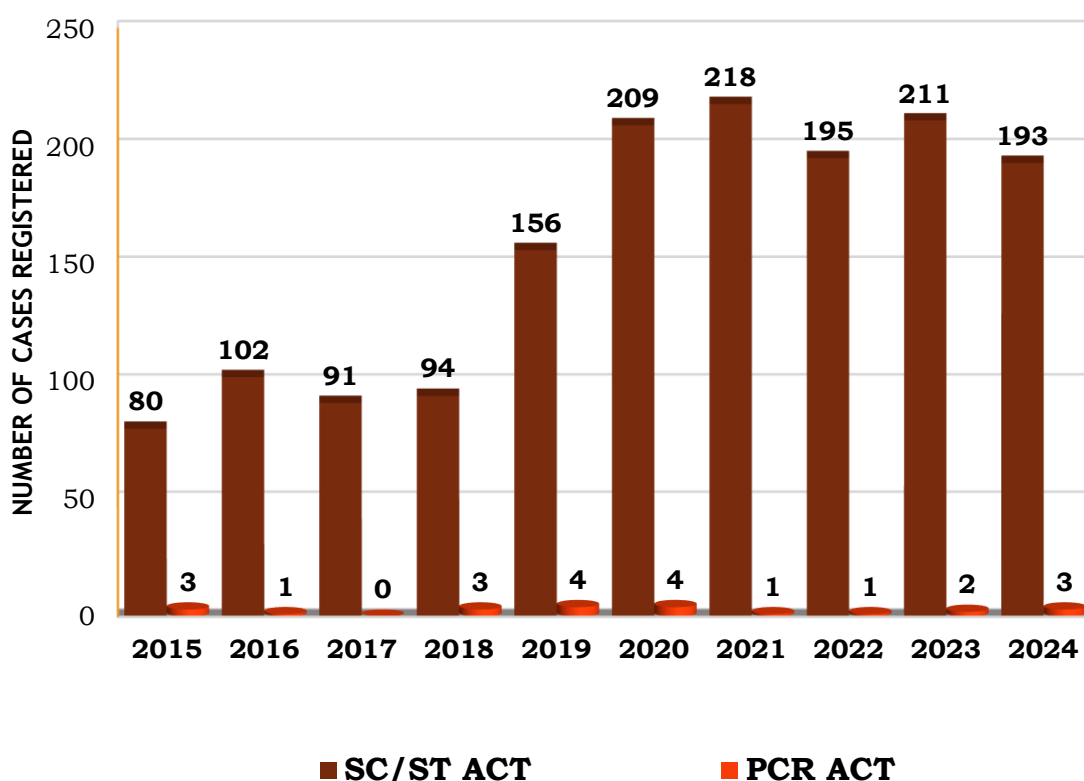
(vii). SC/ST (Prevention of Atrocities) Act: (Decrease of 8.5%)

A total of 193 cases were registered under the SC/ST Prevention of Atrocities Act, as against 211 cases during the previous year; a decrease of 8.5%. The highest numbers of (42) cases were reported in district Mandi,

followed by Shimla (28), Solan (22), Una (21), Hamirpur (20) Sirmaur (16), Baddi (10), Kangra (09), Kullu (08), Bilaspur & Chamba (6 each), Nurpur (04), and Kinnaur (01). The lowest number of cases under this Act were registered in Kullu, Sirmaur, Solan, Baddi and Chamba. No incident under this Act was reported in Districts L&S and CID, GRP and Cyber units.

The analysis reveals that crime under this head is high in Hamirpur, Mandi, Una, Shimla & Sirmaur. The most common reason for registering cases under this Act is a feeling of hurt when one is called by derogatory names. Previous 10 years (2015-2024) crime under this head is presented in Chart-1.24.

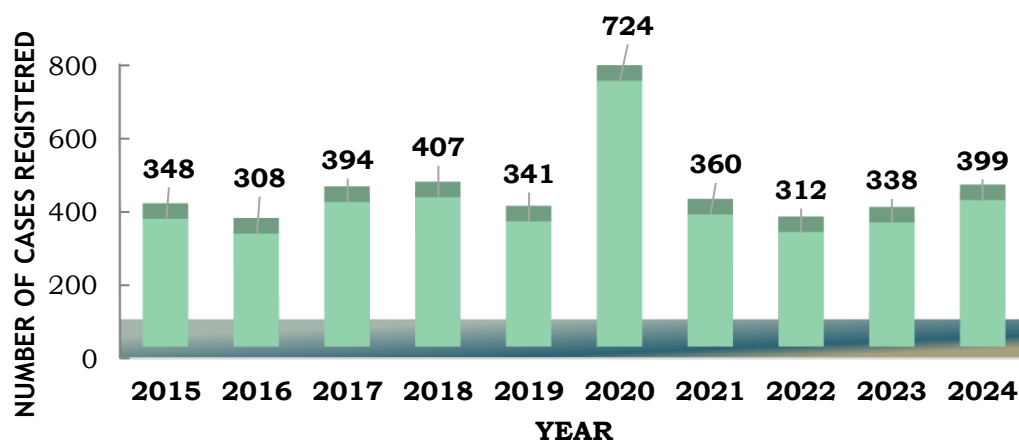
A total of 399 Other Local & Special Law cases were reported under the Acts mentioned above. These have shown an increase of 18.1 % over the previous year (338 cases). The highest number of cases were reported from Cyber Crime (91).

During 2024, a total of 5844 cognizable crimes were

reported in the State under various heads of Local & Special Laws (SLL), which shows a decrease of 9.84 % over the previous year.

It is observed that 7 specific crime heads accounted for 93.2% of the total SLL crimes while the remaining 6.8% were clubbed as other SLL crimes. Previous 10 years (2015-2024) crime under this head is presented in [Chart-1.25](#).

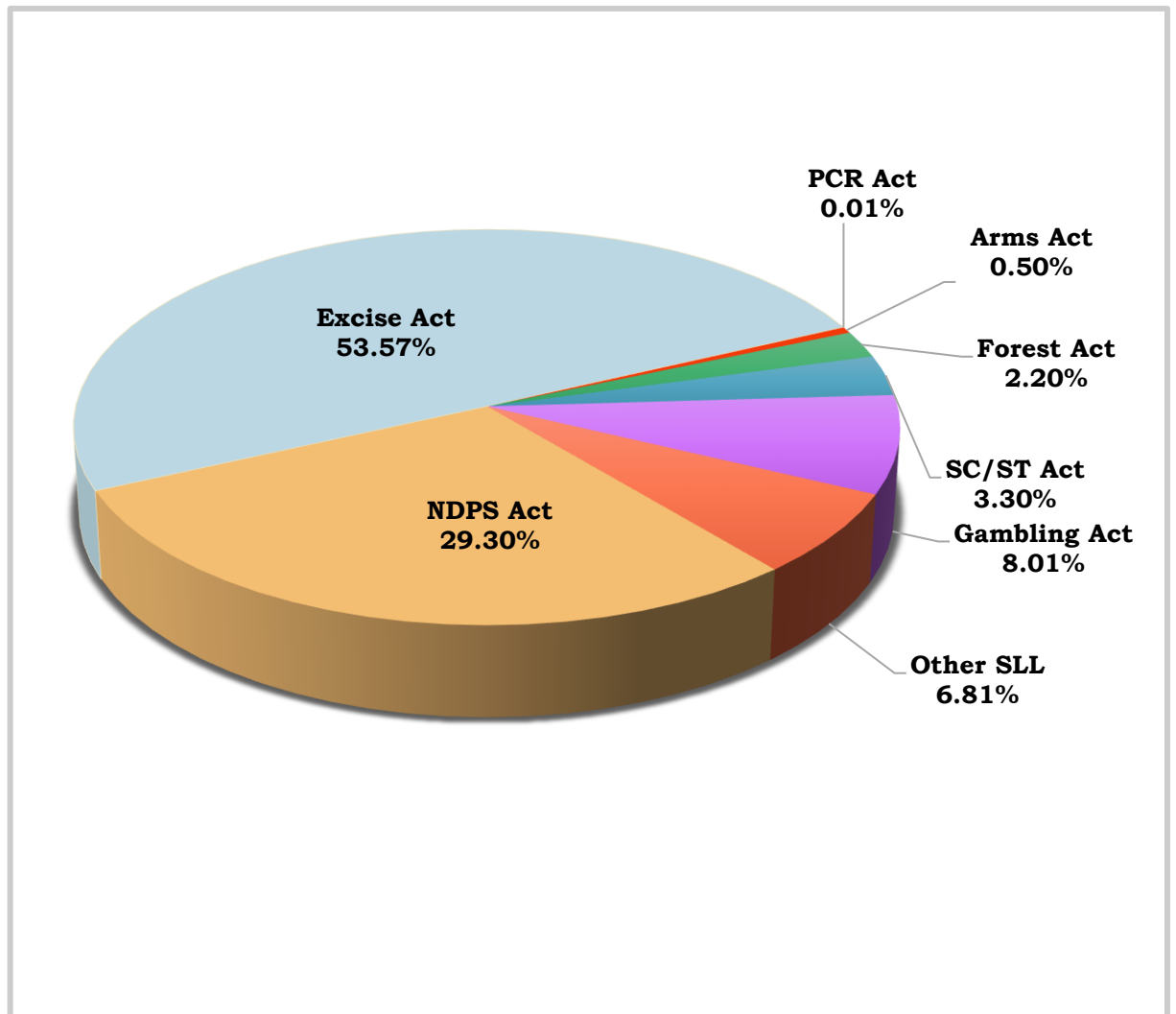
CHART-1.25

RATE OF COGNIZABLE CRIMES (IPC)/BNS DURING – 2024

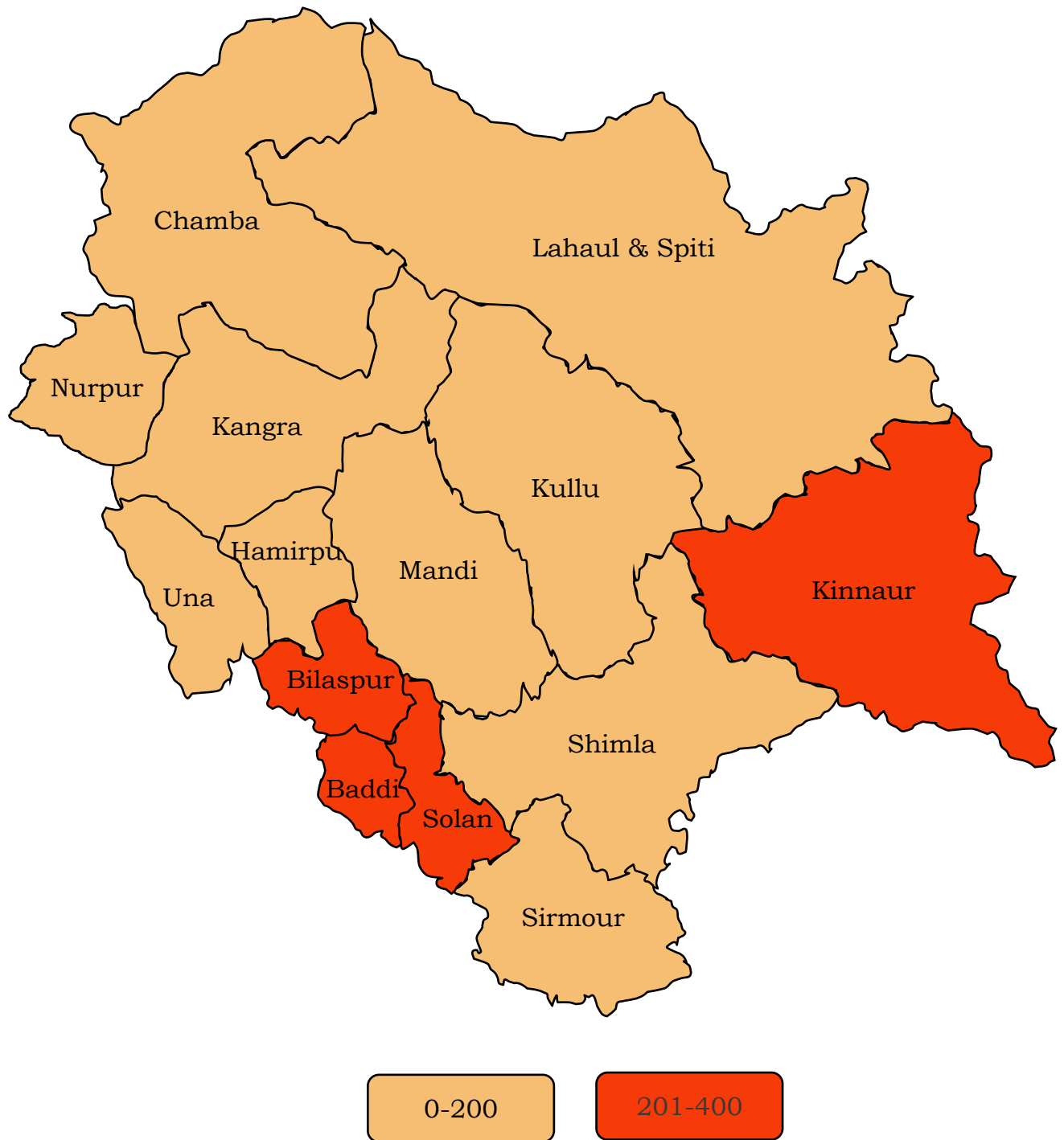

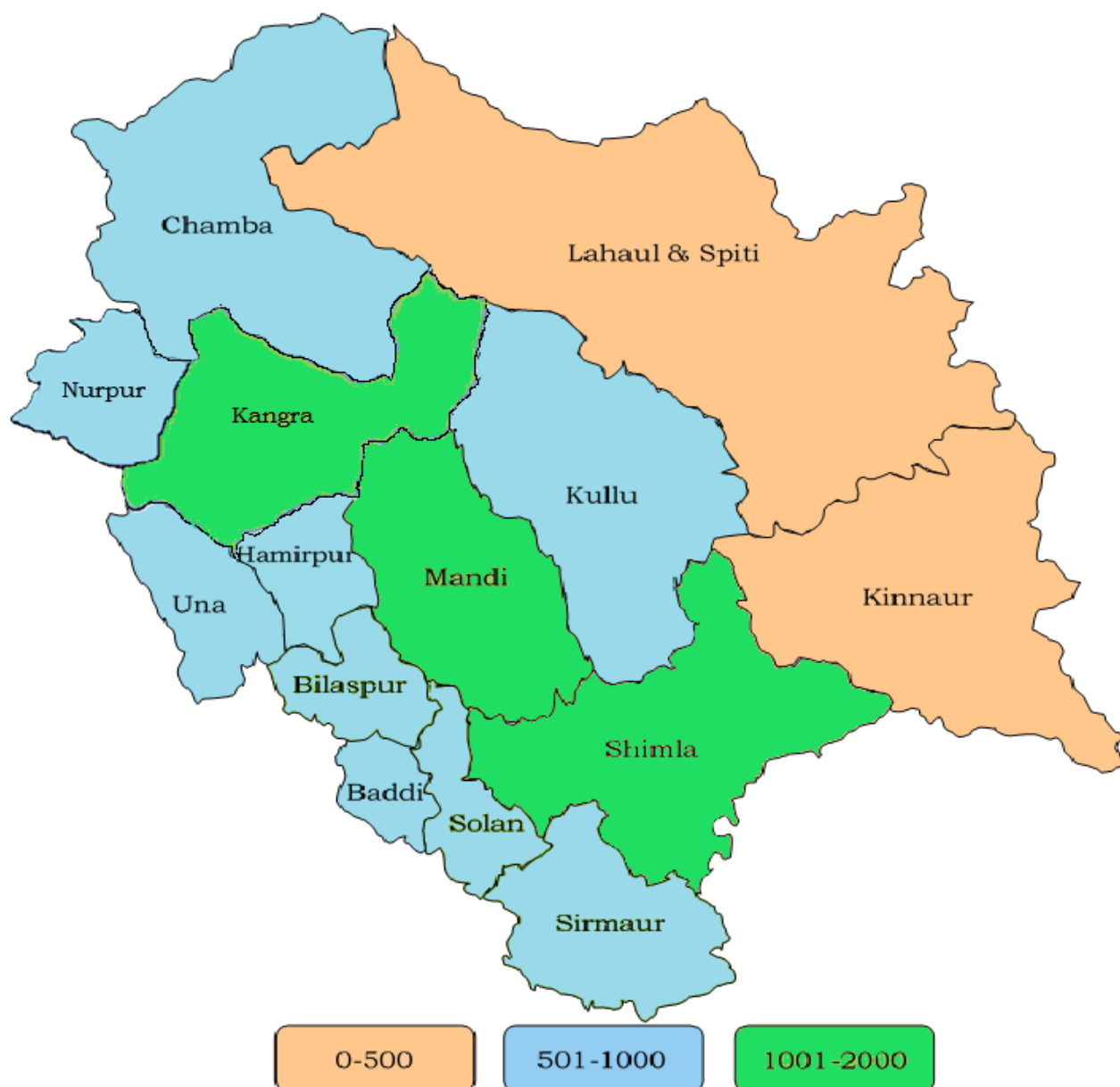

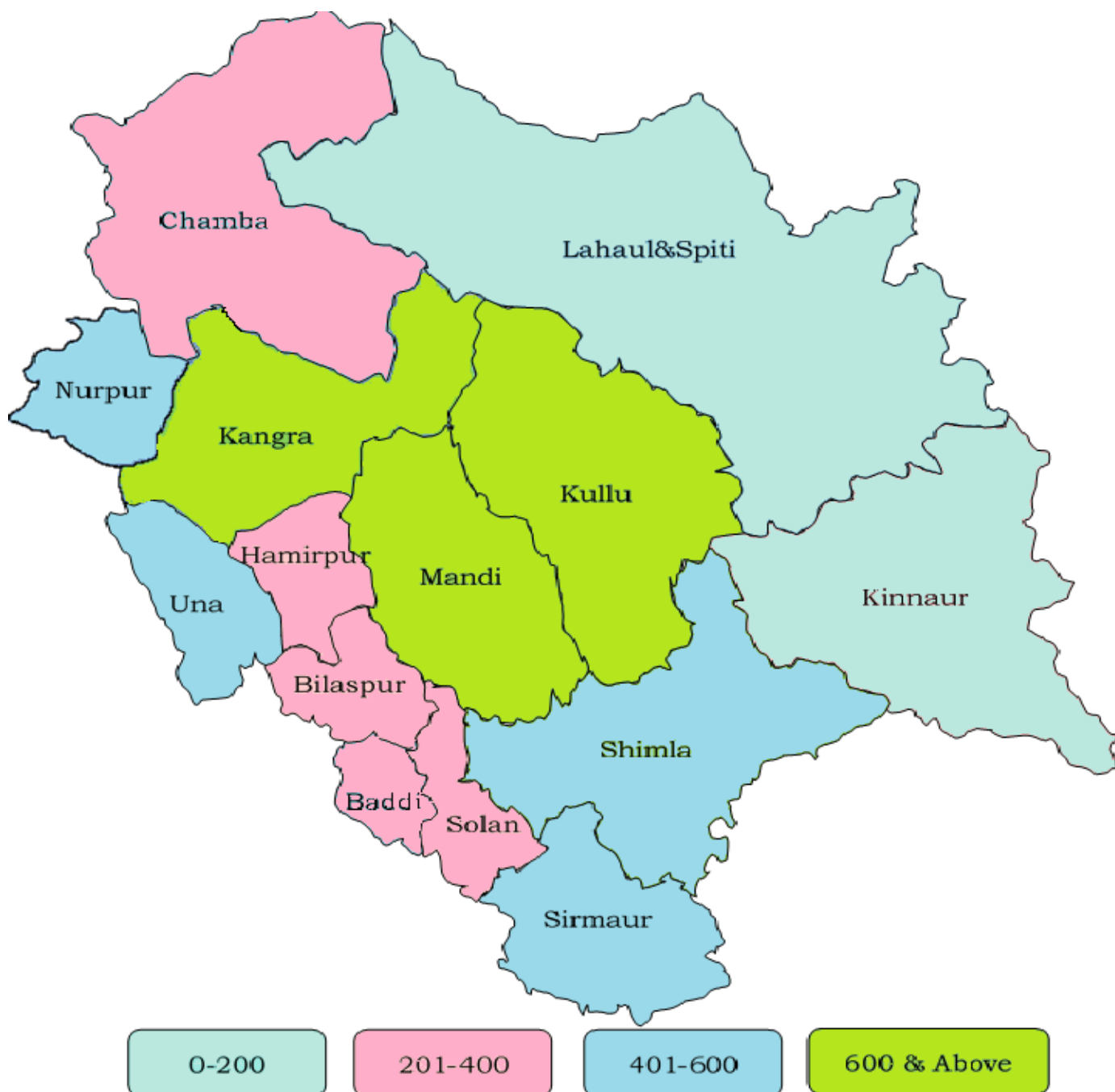
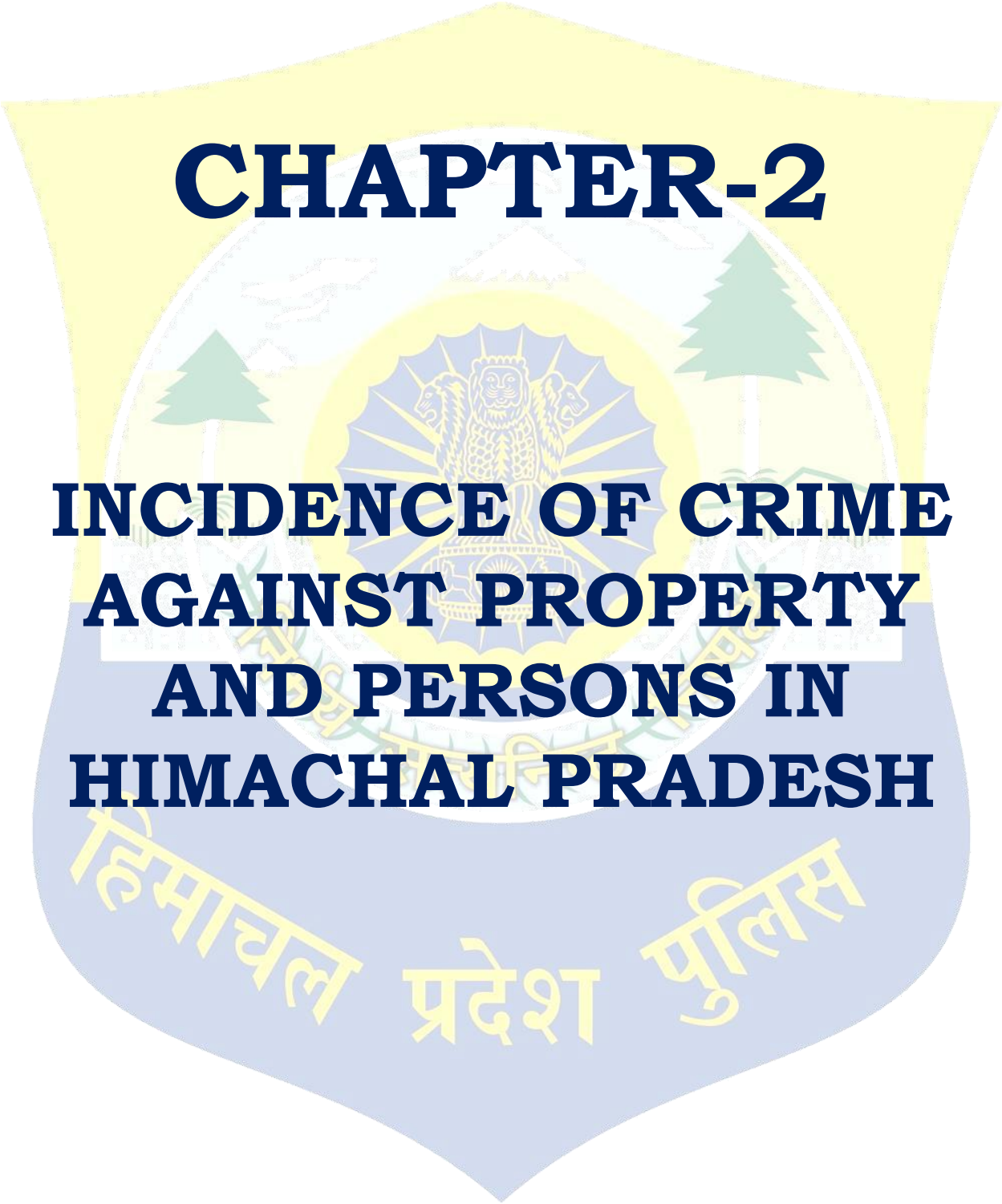

INCIDENCE OF CRIME AGAINST PROPERTY AND PERSONS IN HIMACHAL PRADESH

2.1 Crime against Property:

Offences under this head include the cases of **Theft, Burglary, Robbery & Dacoity**. The head wise analysis of crime against property for the year 2024 is as under:-

(i) Theft and Burglary:

(Decrease of 15.11% & Decrease of 11.06% respectively)

During the year 2024, 556 cases of theft and 450 cases of burglary were registered, which is a decrease of 99 cases in theft and increase of 56 cases in burglary over the previous year. The cases of both these heads have been categorized under major heads namely: - Auto theft, theft of Cash & Jewelry, Cultural Property theft, theft of electronic components and theft of other materials. Incidence of theft cases is concentrated mostly in the 7 districts i.e. Solan, Sirmaur, Una, Shimla, Bilaspur, Kangra, Baddi and Mandi.

(ii) Robbery: Increase of 20%

During the year 2024, 10 cases of Robbery were registered in the State as compared to 8 cases during the previous year. The highest

number of incidents were reported in district Mandi and Solan (3 each), followed by Bilaspur, Kangra, Sirmaur and Una (1 each). No case under this head was reported in rest of the districts of the State.

(iii) Dacoity: Increase of 50%

During the year 2024, 4 cases of Dacoity were registered an increase of 2 cases over the previous year. Case under this head was registered in district Baddi, Mandi, Solan and Una (1 each).

2.2 Value of Property Stolen and Recovered:

Decreased by 21.07%

During the year 2024, property worth Rs. 1751.87 lakhs were reported stolen in 1030 cases, as compared Rs. 2219.72 lakhs in 1171 cases during the previous year.

Property worth Rs. 872.11 lakhs was recovered during 2024. The percentage of recovery is 49.78%. The value of property recovered showed a decrease of 28.64% over the previous year.

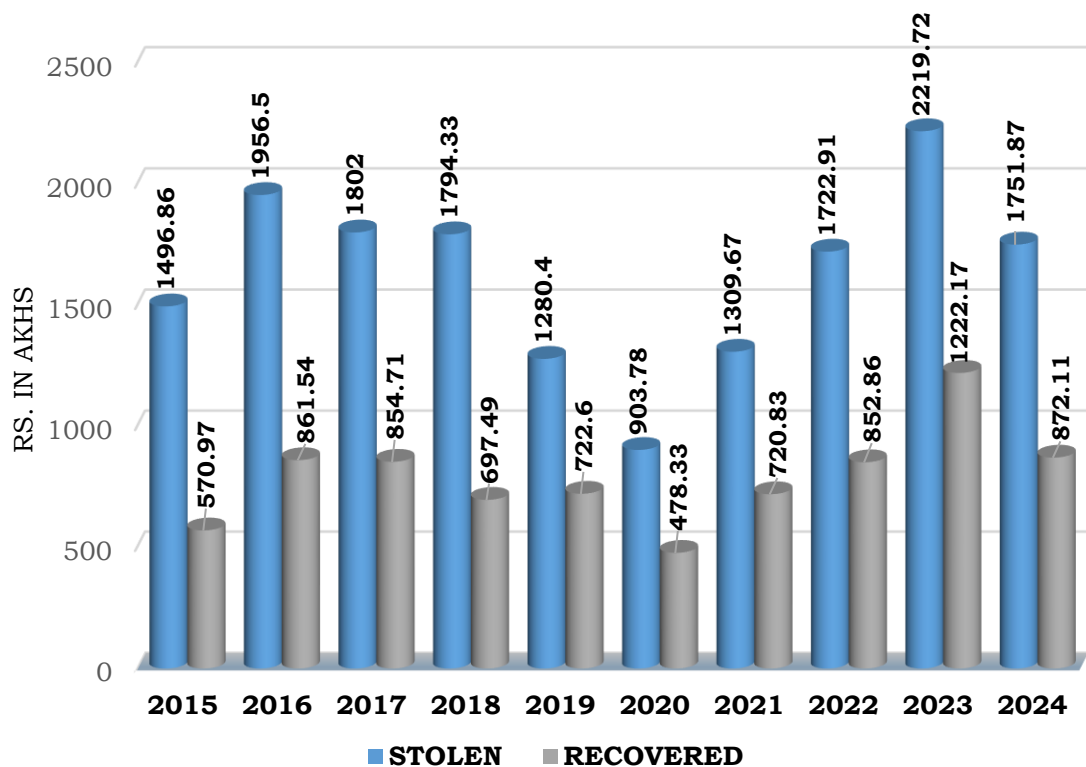

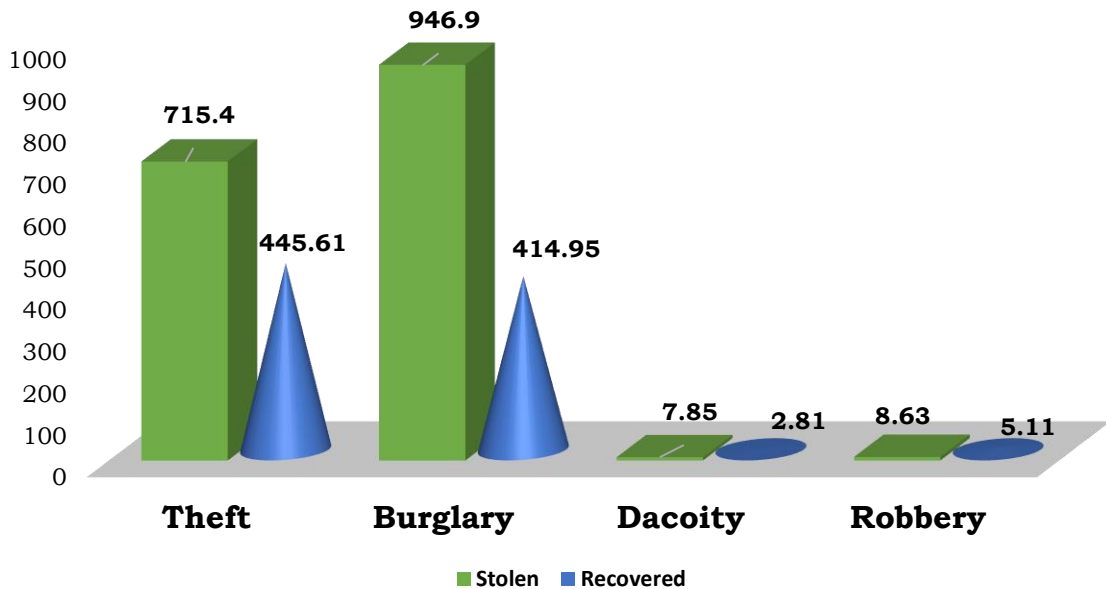
VALUE OF PROPERTY STOLEN AND RECOVERED DURING THE PERIOD 2015-2024

Kangra district reported the highest value of property stolen (Rs. 2,40,17,030/-) followed by Shimla (Rs. 2,38,72,730/-), Mandi (Rs. 2,34,67,364/-), Baddi (Rs. 1,67,63,062/-), Una (Rs. 1,67,13,076/-), Sirmaur (Rs. 1,34,87,470/-), Una (Rs. 1,56,20,293/-), Bilaspur (Rs. 1,26,04,922/-), Solan

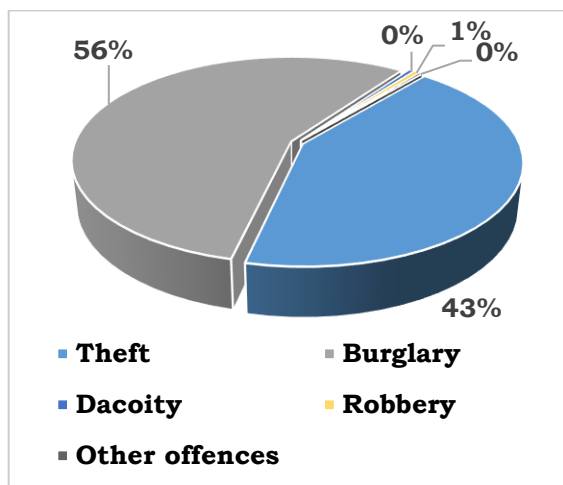
(Rs.1,16,12,658 and Hamirpur (Rs.10637139/-). Rest of the districts reported less than 1 crore value of property stolen.

The highest value of recovery was seen in District Mandi (Rs. 1,41,97,854 /-).

The highest recovery percentage of stolen property was seen in district L&S (83.33%), followed by GRP (74.84%), Bilaspur (64.43%), Mandi (60.5%), and Sirmaur (57.6%).

Chart 2.3 represents the crime head wise percentage of property stolen during 2024.

2.3 Category of Offences (Incidence and Value):

Among the four different types of property crimes, the maximum stolen value of property (Rs. 715.40 Lakhs) and share (49%) were seen under the head Theft. The minimum stolen value of Rs. 7.85 Lakhs and share (35.90%) was seen under the head Dacoity.

The maximum value of property was recovered in Theft (62.29%), followed by Robbery

(59.22%), Burglary (43.82%) and Dacoity (40%). The crime head-wise value of property stolen and recovered over the last 10 years (2015 to 2024) are presented in Table 2.4.

2.4 Nature of Property :

Nature of property under heads Theft and Burglary have been classified into four different categories viz. Auto Theft, Theft of Cash and Jewelry, theft of Cultural Property, Theft of electronic items, Household articles/furniture. Properties other than the above specified categories are clubbed as 'other kind of property'. The category wise number of cases in which property was found stolen and recovered therein and percentage thereof has been calculated and presented in Table 2.5.

CRIME HEAD WISE PERCENTAGE OF PROPERTY RECOVERED DURING THE YEAR 2024

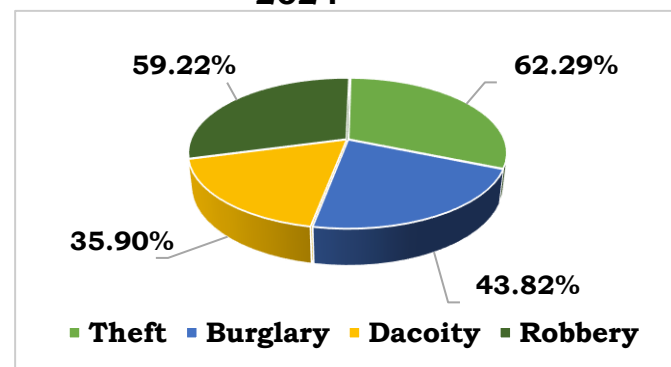

(WORKED OUT) - 2024**

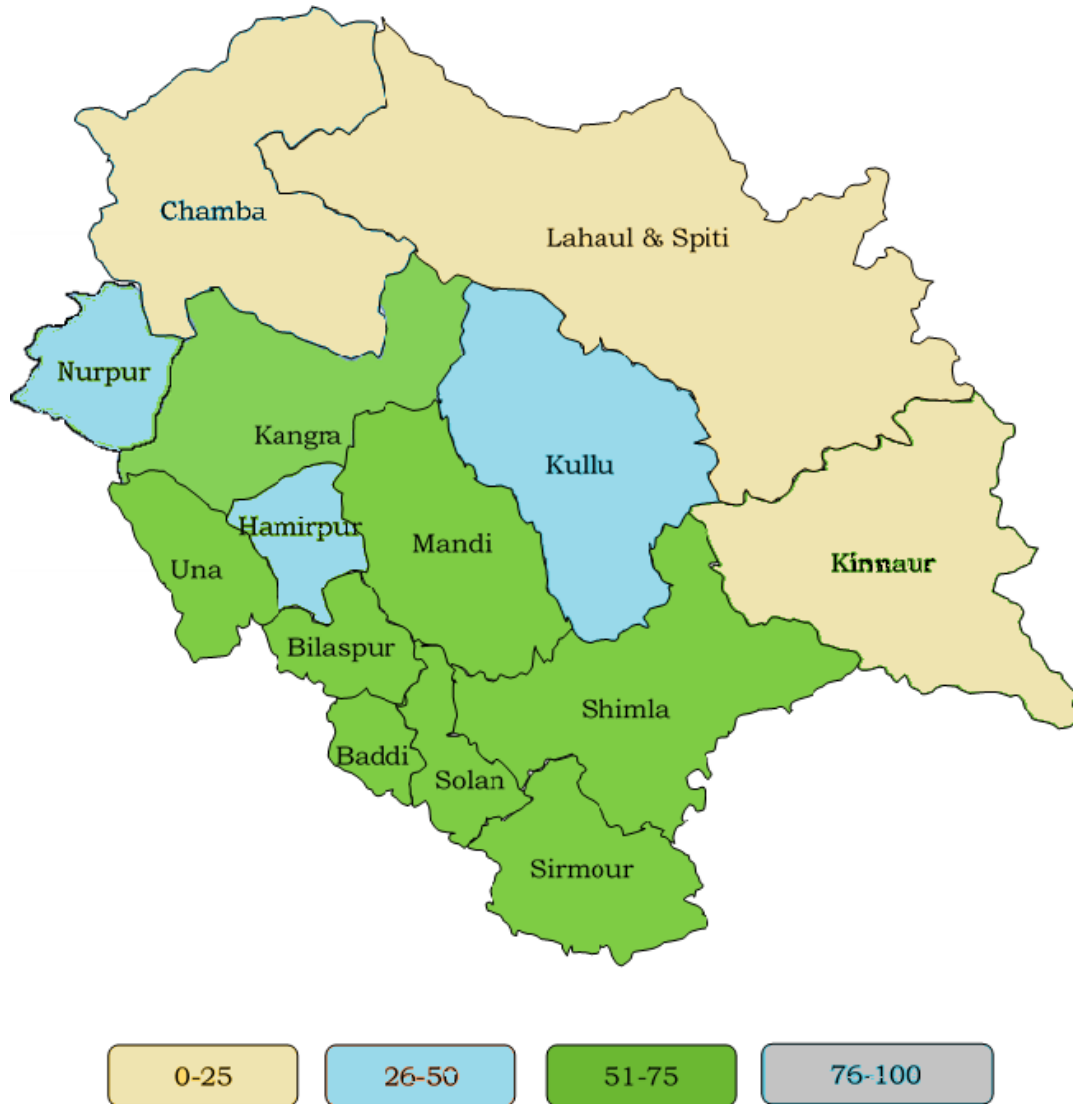

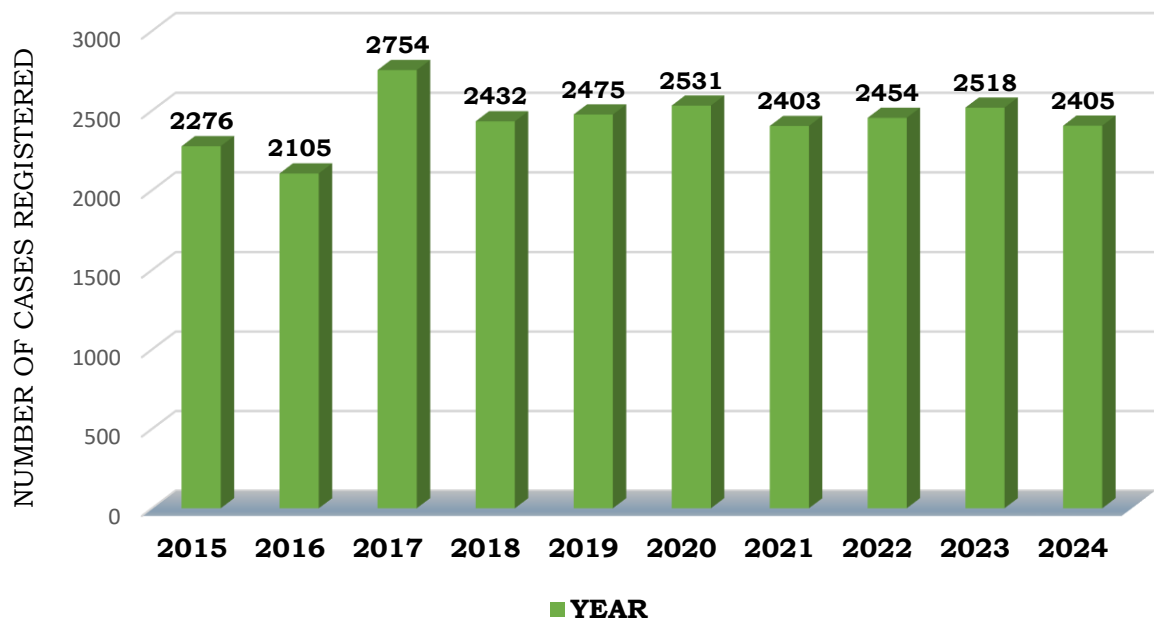
2.6 Crime against Persons:-

Crime against persons includes 10 different types of crime heads viz. Murder, Culpable Homicide not amounting to Murder, Attempt to Murder, Rape, Kidnapping & Abduction, Dowry Death, Grievous Hurt, Rioting and Cruelty to Women.

The analysis reveals that a total of 2405 cases of crime against persons have occurred during 2024, which comprises 19.92% of the total IPC crime. The

highest percentage of crime against persons over the total IPC crimes was recorded in districts Baddi (25.27%), Chamba (25.19%), Nurpur (24.75%), Sirmaur (24.37%), Mandi (20.65%), Hamirpur (20.20%), Kinnaur (20.11%), Kullu (18.94%), Shimla (18.59%), Una (17.74%), Kangra (16.71%), Bilaspur (16.27%) and L&S (14.52%). The district-wise details have been calculated and presented in Table 2.7. The district-wise incidents and their percentage over the IPC crime is depicted in Chart 2.6.

The highest number of incidents of crime against persons have been recorded in district Mandi (352), followed by Kangra (256),

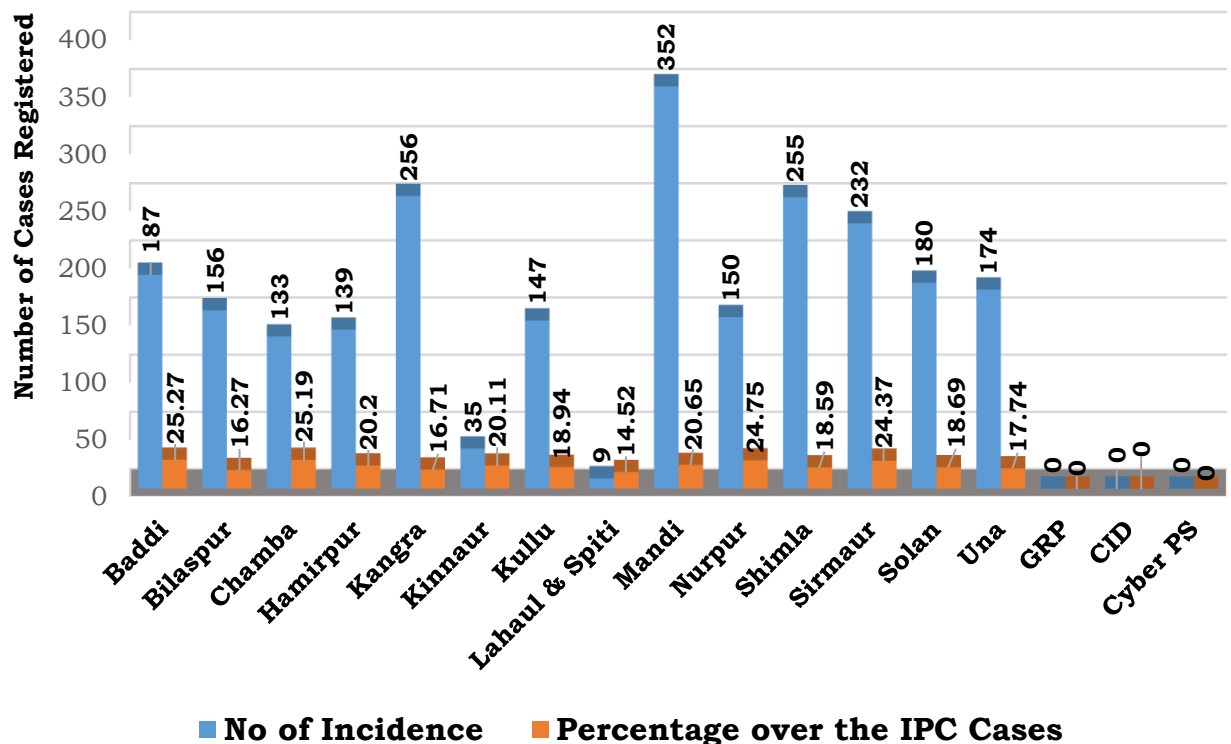
Shimla (255), Sirmaur (232), Baddi (187), Solan (180), Una (174), Bilaspur (156), Nurpur (150), Kullu (147), Hamirpur (139), Chamba (133), Kinnaur (35) and Lahaul & Spiti (09). No case were reported in CID, GRP & Cyber PS. The District-wise details have been calculated and presented in **Table 2.8**.

The head-wise comparative analysis of incidences of crime against

persons for the last 10 years (2015 to 2024) has been reviewed.

During the year 2024, 2505 incidents have been recorded; a decrease of 113 cases over the previous year. The head-wise figures for the last 10 years are presented in **Table 2.9**. **Chart 2.6** shows the total crime against persons and its percentage over the total IPC crime.

The head-wise reported incidences of crime against persons and their comparison with those of the previous year is as under:-

(i) Murder: decrease of 9.7 %

During the year 2024, 84 incidents of Murder were reported, as compared to 93 cases of the previous year. Analysis of these cases has revealed that no organized gang is operating in the State. In most of these cases, crime is committed due to various types of disputes, murder for gain, personal enmity, love affairs and illicit relationships.

There was no class or caste factor involved in the commission of these murders.

(ii) Attempt to Murder: Increase of 1.3%

75 incidents of Attempt to Murder were reported during the year 2024 as compared to 74 cases during the previous year and an increase of 1 case over the previous year. The motive for the commission of this crime is also the same as mentioned under the head 'Murder'

(iii) Culpable Homicide not amounting to Murder: Increase of 16.7%

14 incidents of Culpable Homicide not amounting to Murder were reported during the year 2024, an increase of 2 case over the previous year.

(iv) Rape: Decrease of 5.8%

324 cases of Rape were reported during the year 2024, a decrease of 20 cases over the previous year.

(v) Kidnapping and Abduction: Increase of 5.9%

During 2024, 488 cases were registered; an increase of 26 cases over the previous year. Analysis shows that 45.9% cases of Kidnapping & Abduction were reported in districts Mandi, Baddi, Kangra and. Shimla

(vi) Grievous Hurt: Increase of 22.7%

A total of 616 incidents of Grievous Hurt were reported during 2024. Analysis shows that 53.8% incidents of Grievous Hurt were reported in districts Mandi, Shimla, Kangra, Nurpur and Una.

(vii) Rioting: Increase of 5.7%

During the year 2024, 352 incidents of Rioting were reported in the State, as against 333 cases during the previous year; an increase of 19

cases. Analysis shows that 47.72% incidents of rioting were reported in districts Sirmaur, Baddi, Mandi and Nurpur.

(viii) Cruelty to Women:

Increase of 10.7%

A total of 184 cases of Cruelty to Women were reported in the State during the year 2024, a decrease of 33 cases over the previous year. The incidents under this head have been reviewed in detail in the separate chapter “Crime against Women”.

(ix) Assault on women:

Decrease of 46.82%

During the year 2024, 268 incidents of Molestation were reported in the State, as against the 504 incidents of the previous year; a decrease of 236 cases. The cases under

this head have been reviewed in detail in the separate chapter “Crime against Women”

(x) Dowry Deaths:

Decrease of 100%

During the year 2024, no case of Dowry Death reported. The incidents under this head have been reviewed in detail in the separate chapter “Crime against Women”.

2.7 Overall Review of Crime against Person:

The incidence of crime against persons is higher in districts Mandi, Kangra, Shimla and Sirmaur as compared to the other districts of the State. Offences of murder have however taken place in the entire State with no specific concentration.

TRENDS IN DISPOSAL OF IPC/BNS CRIMES AND SLL CRIMES BY POLICE AND COURTS

3.1 Disposal by Police

3.1.1 Cases under IPC/BNS:

During 2024, a total of 15419 cases including cases pending from the previous years, were under investigation. Out of these, 11718 cases were disposed by the police during the year and 3701 cases remained pending for investigation.

Table-3.1 presents the details of crime head wise Police disposal during 2024. Tables-3.2 & 3.3 give district wise details of disposal and percentage of disposal respectively. The percentage and type of disposal of under investigation (IPC/BNS) cases by police during 2024 is depicted in Chart-3.1.

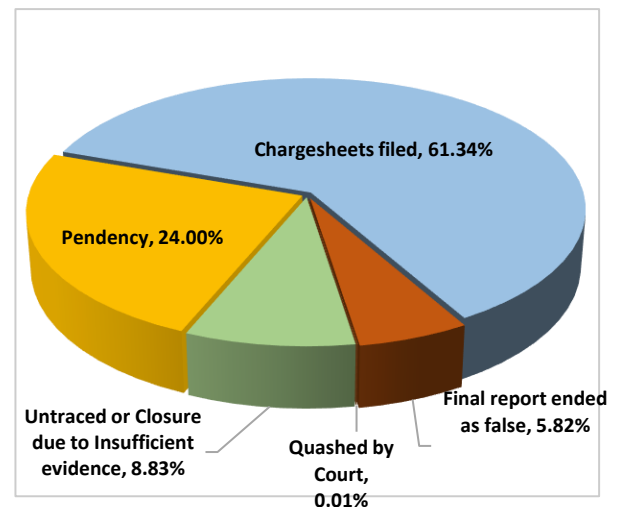
3.1.2 Pendency:

On an average, 24.01% cases remained under investigation. In the following units/districts, pendency was the highest:

PERCENTAGE DISPOSAL OF UNDER INVESTIGATION (IPC/BNS) CASES BY POLICE DURING-2024

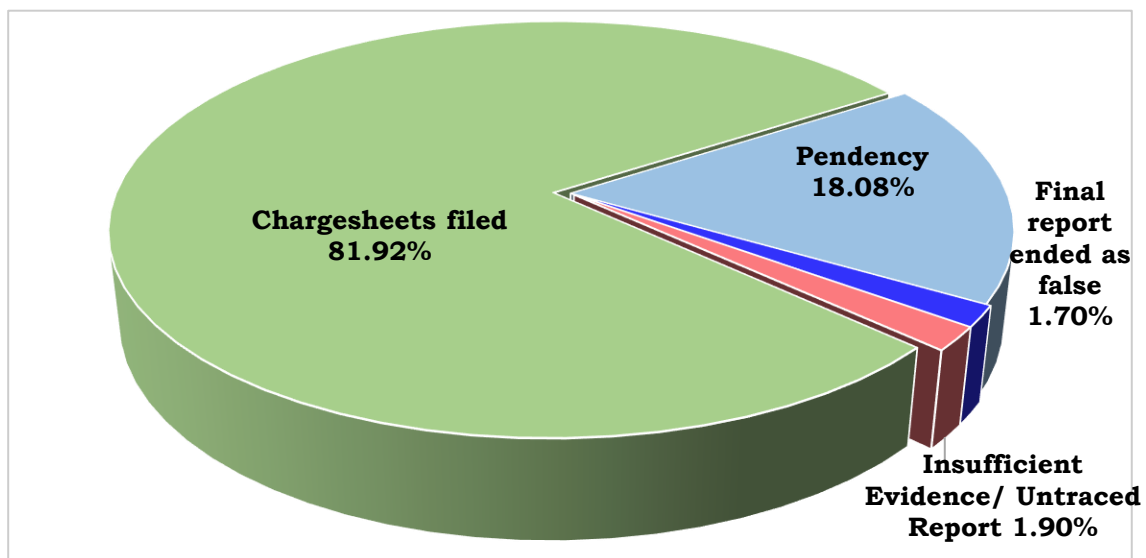


3.1.3 Cases under SLL:

The disposal of SLL cases by police under different crime heads is available at [Table-3.4](#) of the total 6880 cases (including pending

cases from the previous year) pending investigation, police disposed 81.92% cases. [Chart-3.3](#) presents the type of disposal of SLL cases.

BY POLICE DURING 2024

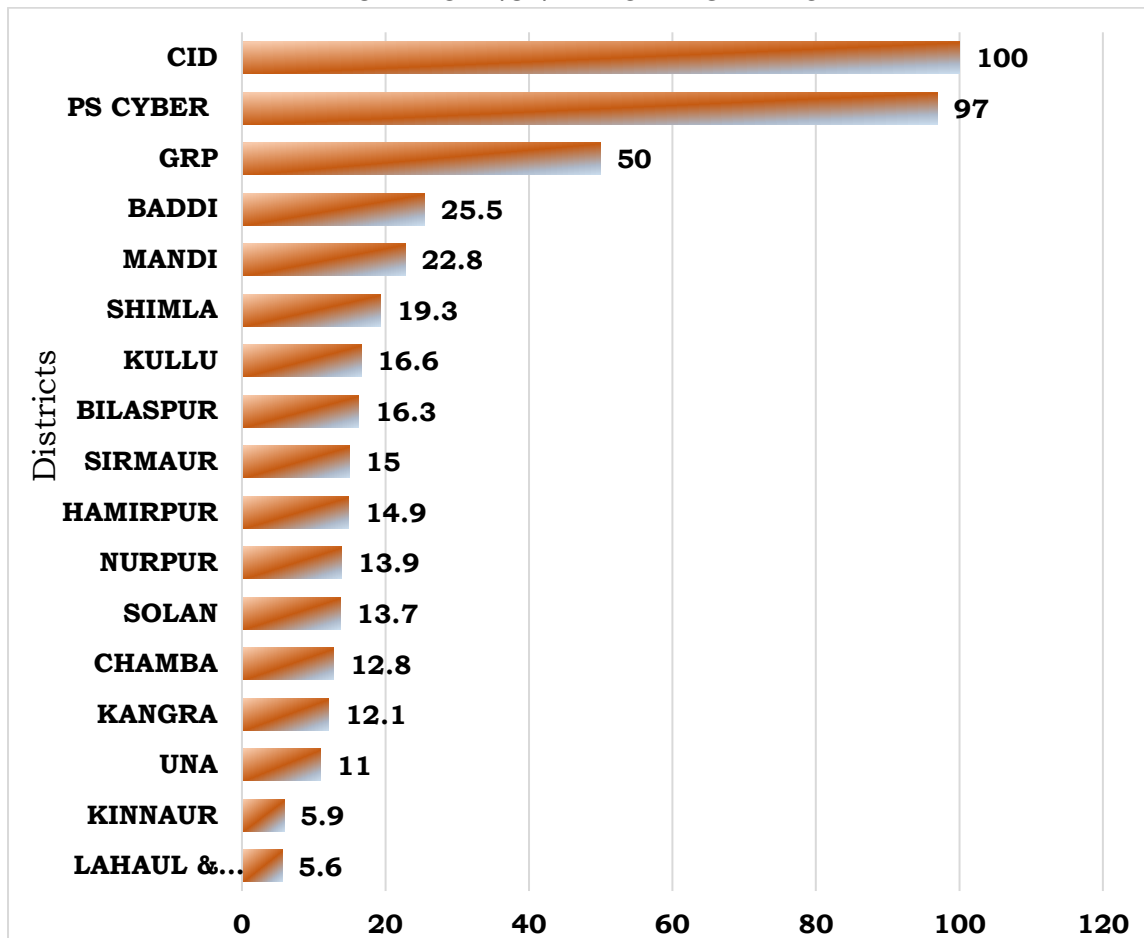

Disposal of IPC/BNS cases by the courts during 2024 is presented in Table 3.7. During 2024, there were 127678 cases pending trial (including pending cases from the previous years). 118969 of IPC/BNS cases remained pending trial at end of the year. The

percentage disposal during the year was 6.82%.

The District wise disposal figures are presented in Table-3.8 and percentage of disposal is presented in Table-3.9. The highest pendency percentage of cases is seen in Cyber & CID (100% each), followed by Bilaspur & Nurpur (95.9%). The largest number of cases are pending trial in Kangra district

(30174), which has a pendency of 23.63% of State level.

Chart-3.5 depicts percentage disposal of IPC/BNS cases by the courts during 2023

3.2.2 Cases under SLL:-

Head wise disposal of SLL cases by the courts during 2024 is presented in **Table-3.10**. There were 36655 cases pending trial (including pending cases from the previous years) at the beginning of 2024. Cases which remained pending trial at end of the year were 31769. The percentage of disposal is 13.32%.

DURING 2024

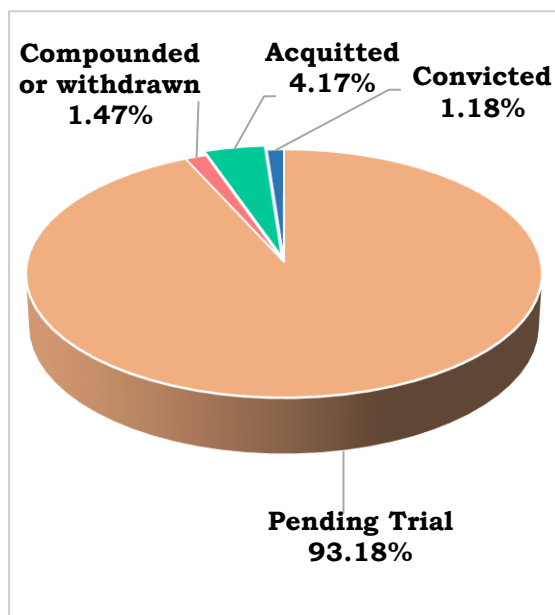

CASES BY COURTS DURING 2024

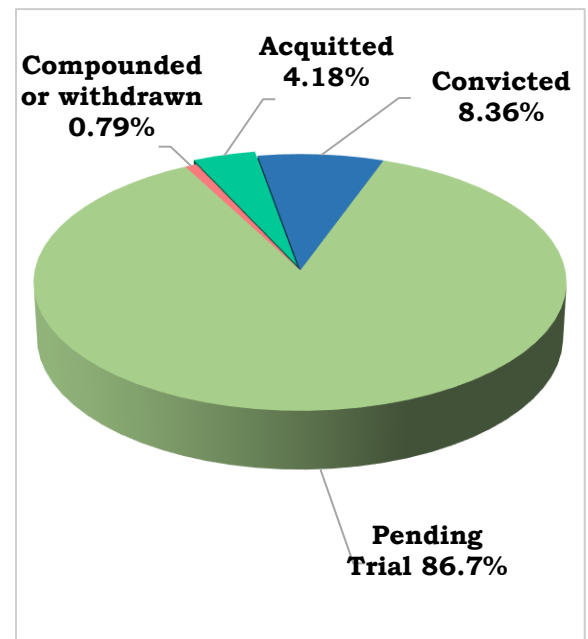

DISPOSAL OF (IPC/BNS) CASES BY POLICE DURING 2024

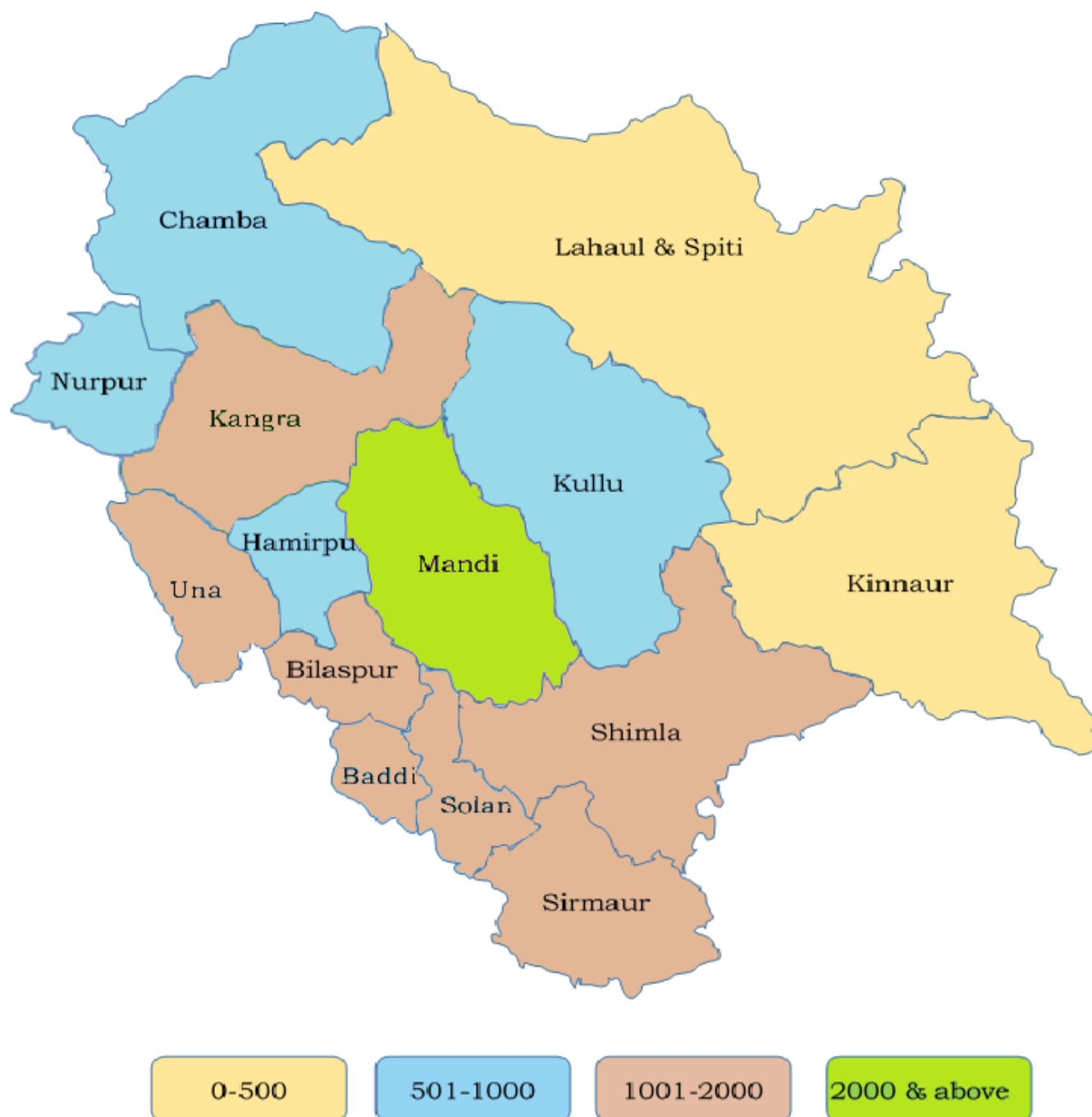

DISPOSAL OF (SLL) CASES BY POLICE DURING 2024

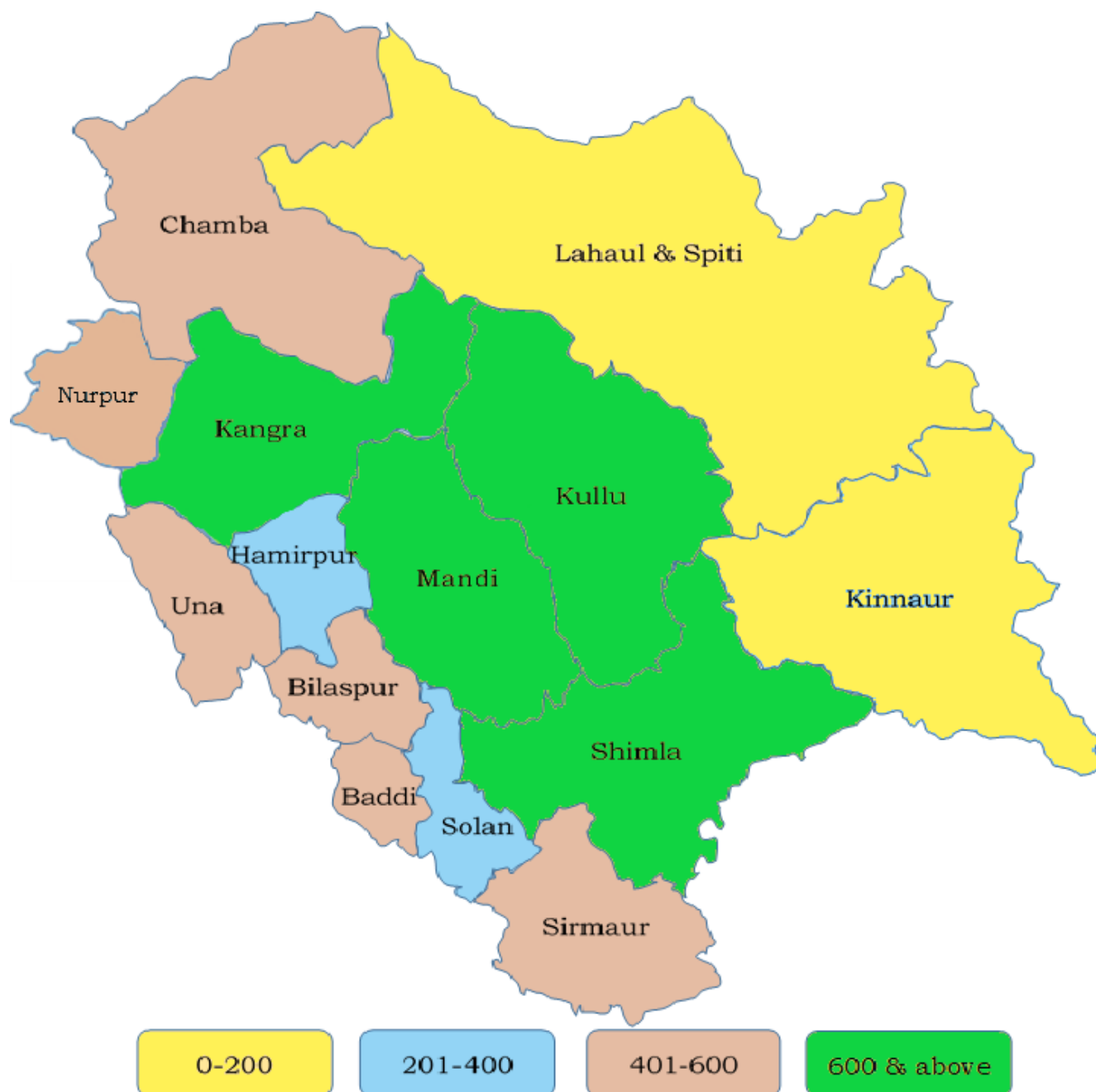

CONVICTED CASES (IPC/BNS) DURING 2024

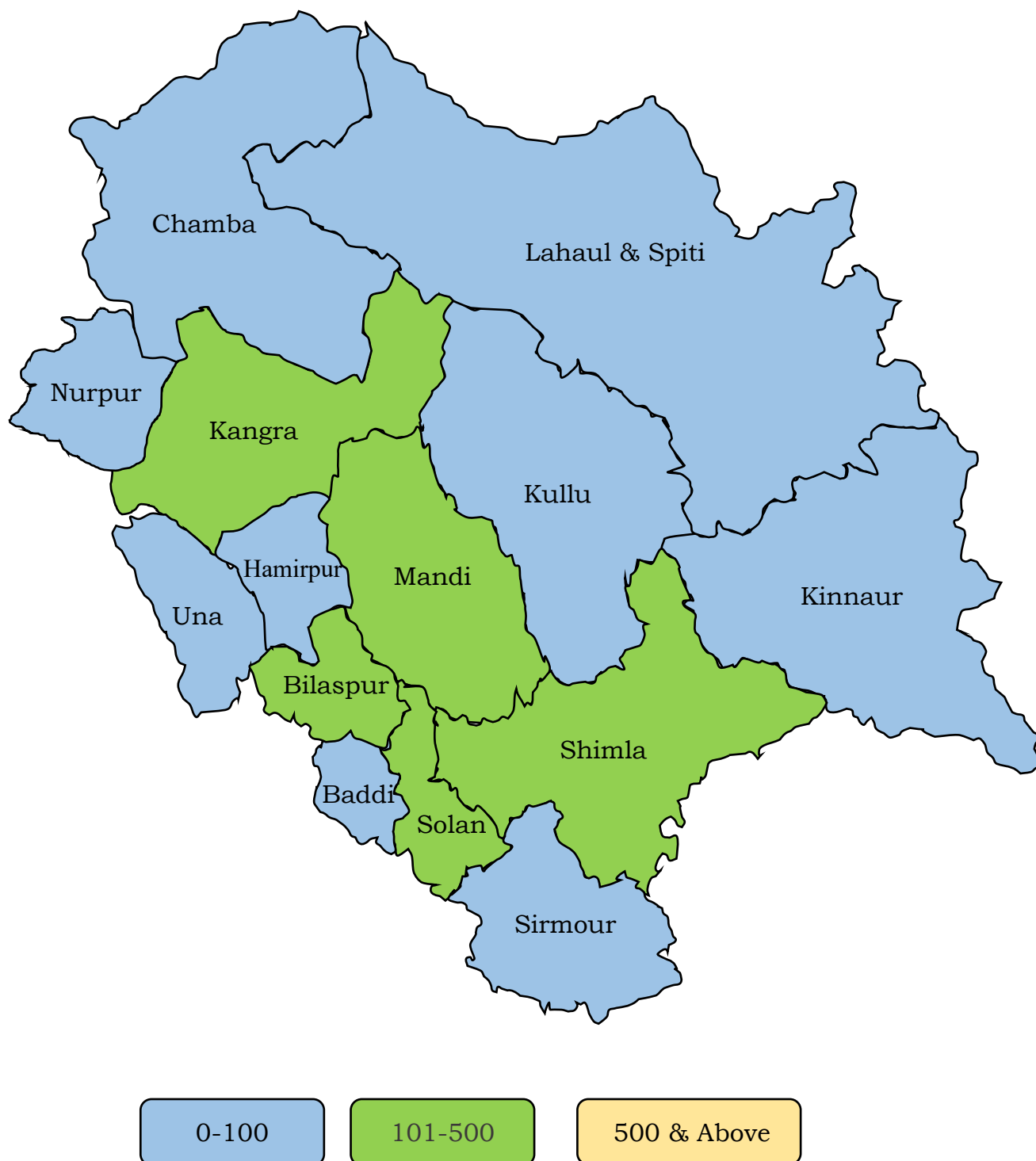

CHAPTER-4

CRIMES AGAINST WOMEN

4.1 General:

Crimes which are directed specifically against women are characterized as Crimes against Women. They may be broadly classified under the following two categories:-

1. Crimes against Women identified under the Indian Penal Code (IPC/BNS)

- (i) Murder (Sec. 302, 303 IPC)
- (ii). Dowry Deaths (Sec. 304B IPC)
- (iii) Abetment to Commit Suicide (Sec.306 IPC)
- (iv) Cruelty to Women (Sec. 498A IPC)
- (v) Kidnapping & Abduction (Sec. 363, 366 IPC)
- (vi) Rape
- (vii) Attempt to Commit Rape
- (viii) Assault on Woman with intend to outrage her modesty (Sec.354 IPC)
- (ix) Insult to the modesty of Women (Sec. 509 IPC)

2. Crimes against Women Identified under the Special and Local Laws (SLL)

Although all laws are not gender specific, the provisions of laws

affecting women significantly have been reviewed periodically and amendments carried out to keep pace with the emerging requirements. Some Acts which have special provisions to safeguard women and their interests are:-

- (i) Immoral Traffic (Prevention) Act, 1956
- (ii) Dowry Prohibition Act, 1961
- (iii) The Child Marriage Restraint Act, 1929
- (iv) Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act, 2005
- (v) Commission of Sati (Prevention) Act, 1987

Crimes against Women are being closely monitored in the State. Several measures have been undertaken to tackle this social menace. Special attention is being paid towards prevention of crimes against women by increased police vigil and by harnessing the community resources.

Crime against women witnessed an increase during the year 2024 in comparison to the previous year. During the year 2024, 1605 cases of crime against women have been registered in the state. As compared to

the 10 years state average, this increase is due to the fact that in past the women usually hesitated to report incidents which took place with them and there have also been certain changes of law. But now on account of increased awareness and change in social values, ethos and social reassurances being provided by the society, free registration of cases, opening of Women Police Stations and Suvidha Yojna started by the HP Police Department, women are more often coming forward to report the offences taking place against them.

The HP Police Department has initiated many steps in the recent years to ensure better police response. Women Police Stations have been opened in all districts except Kinnaur and Lahaul & Spiti to monitor quick disposal of cases of crime against women. A Women Crime Unit has been constituted at the State CID Hdqrs. 06 Anti Human Trafficking Units (AHTU's) have also been

established in Shimla, Kangra, Sirmaur, Kullu, Solan & Chamba. No particular area is prone to crime against women in the State. No special organized gang is operative in the State to commit crime against women.

4.2 Incidents of Crime against Women:

Increase of 0.06%

Head wise incidents of reported Crimes against Women during 2023 and 2024, along with percentage variation are presented in **Table 4.1**.

The cases of assault on women with intent to outrage modesty and cruelty to women together constitute the largest chunk of crime against women (33.64%). There were also a number of instances (20.01%) of rape and (14.24%) Kidnapping and Abduction of women and girls.

The district wise incidents and rate of crimes against women during 2024 are presented in **Table 4.2**, **Chart 4.3** and **Chart 4.4**.

PERCENTAGE DISTRIBUTION OF CRIME AGAINST WOMEN DURING 2024

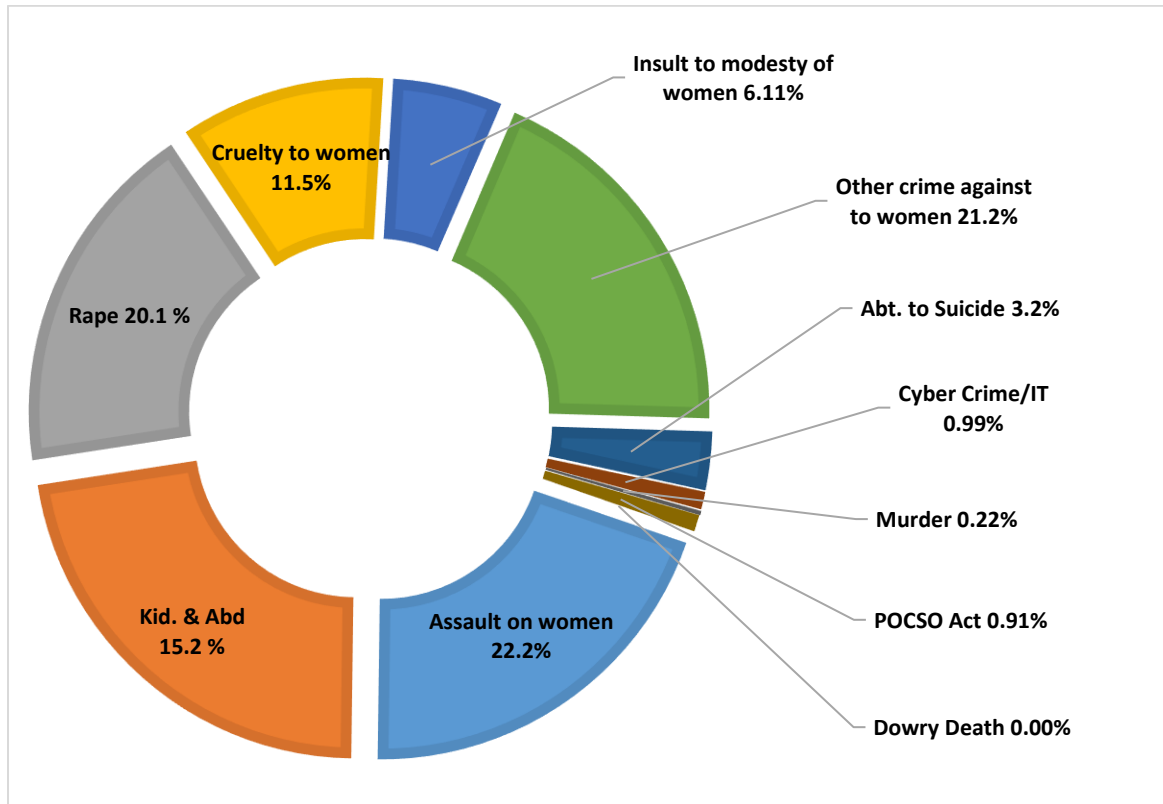

VARIATION OF CRIMES AGAINST WOMEN DURING 2024 OVER 2023

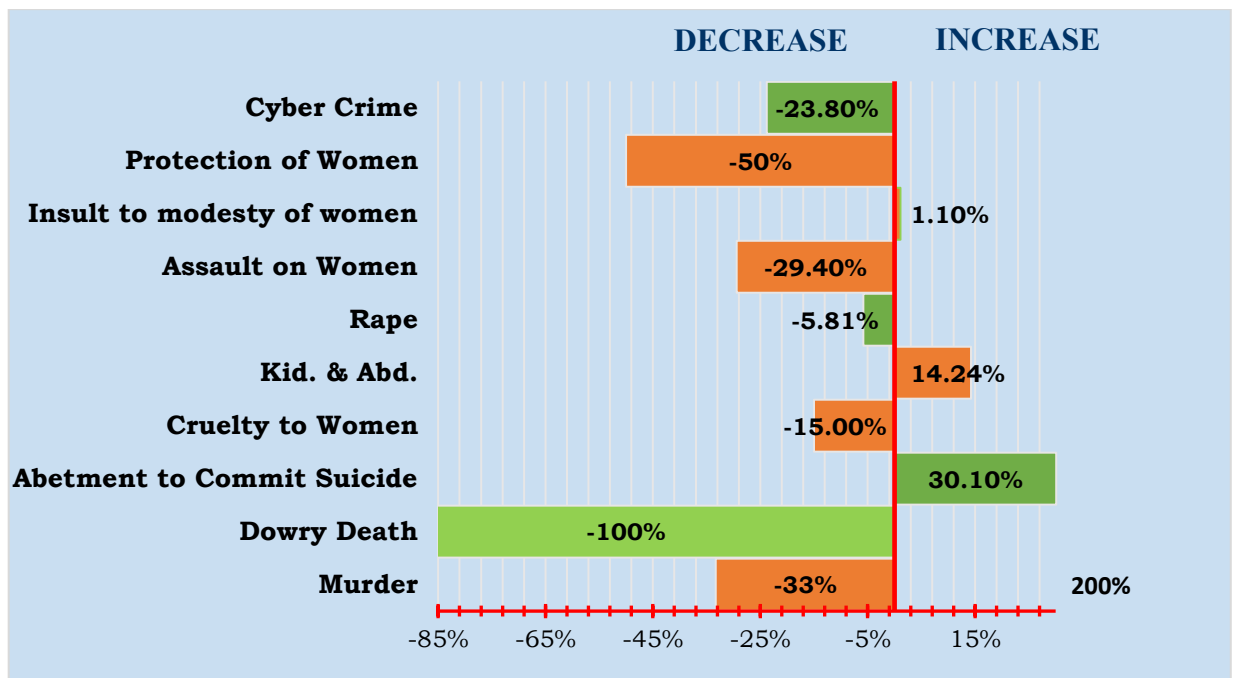
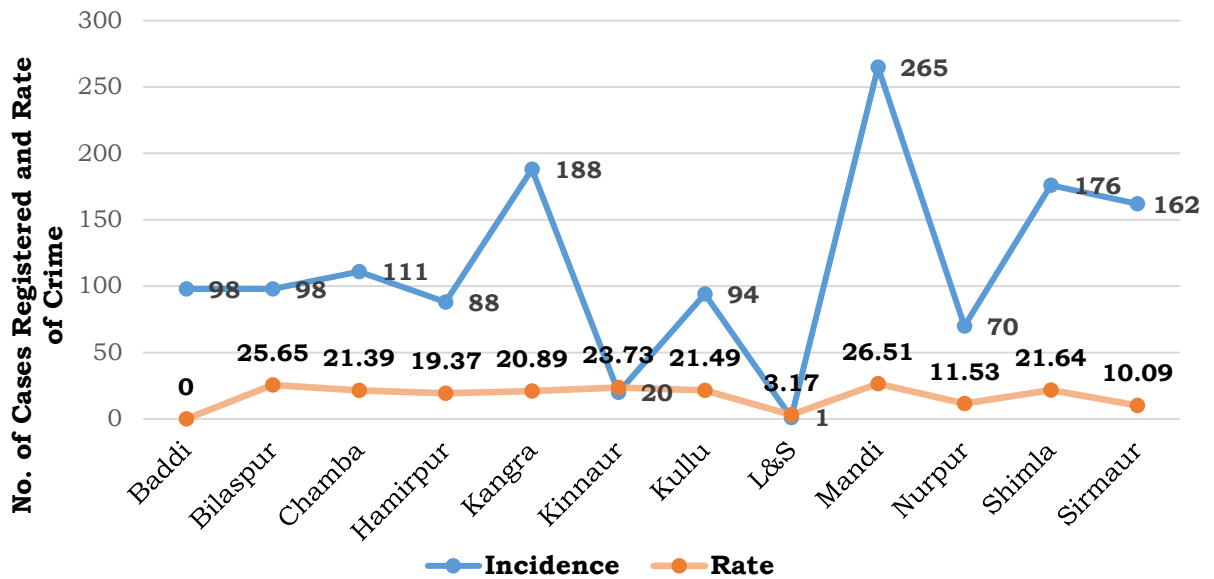
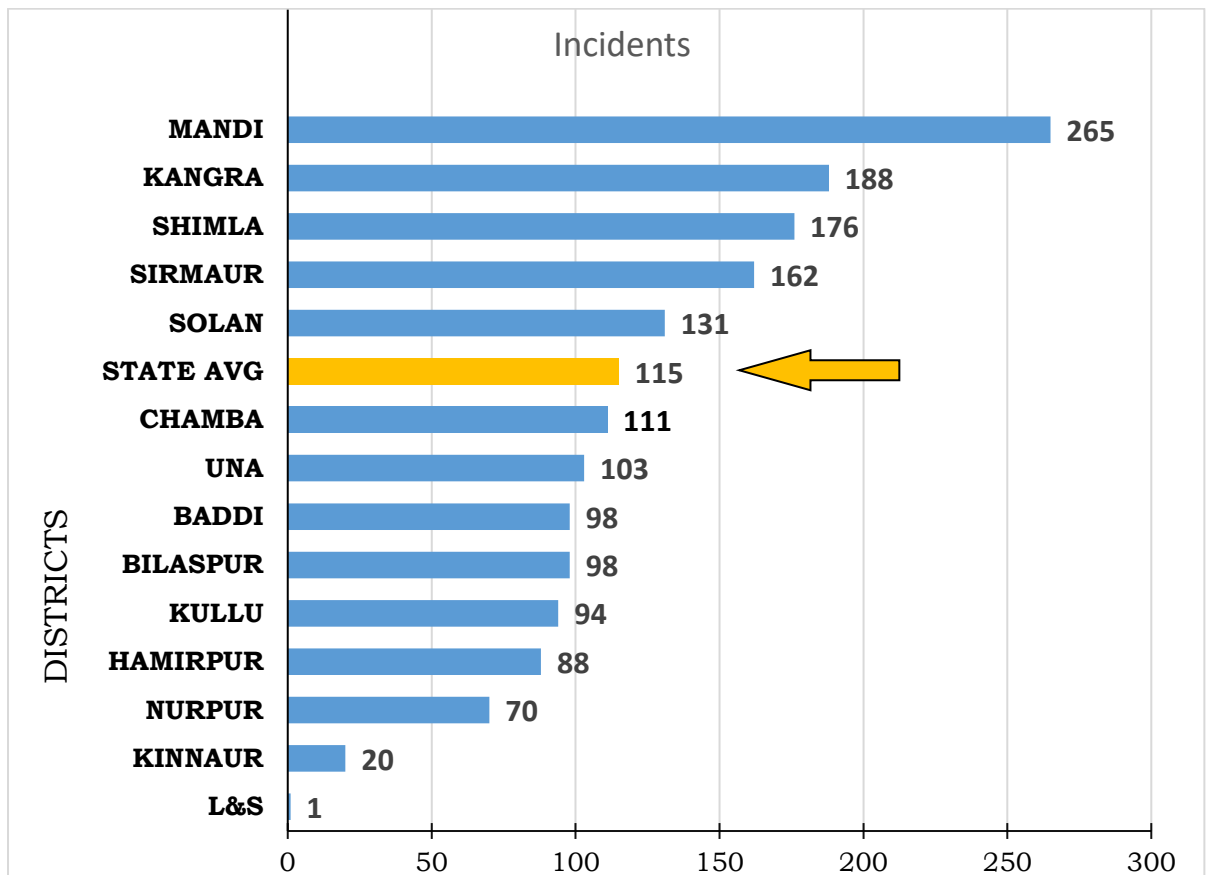
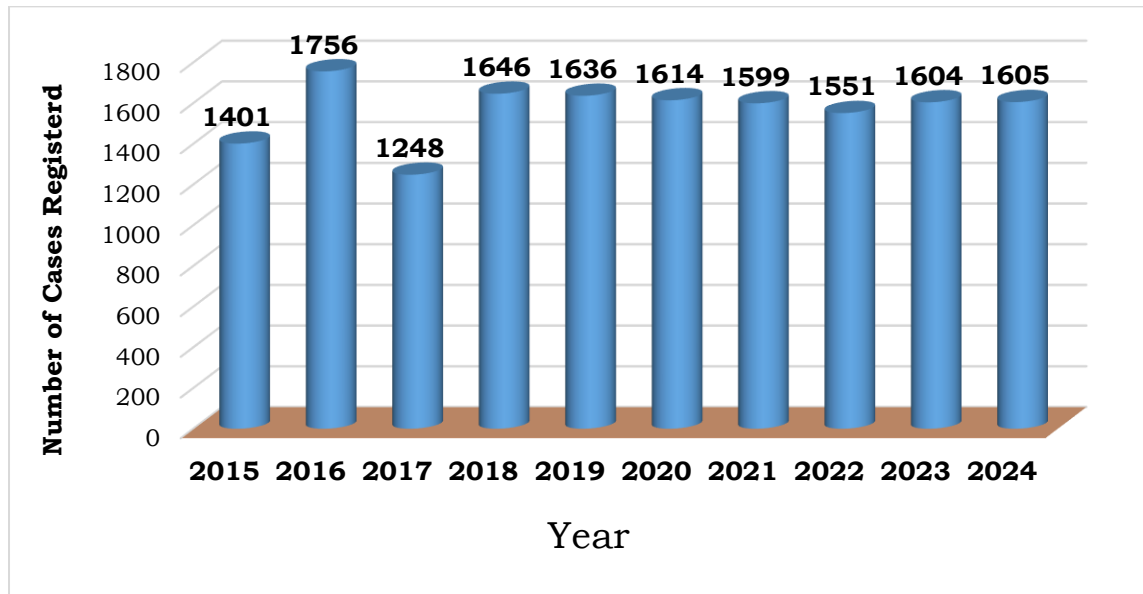

From the analysis of Crime against Women reported in districts, it is seen that registration of cases of Rape, Kidnapping & Abduction insult to outrage modesty, immoral trafficking was higher during the year 2024 as compared to the previous year.

The districts which reported the lowest incidents of crime against women are Lahaul-Spiti (01), Kinnaur (20), Nurpur (70) Hamirpur (88), Baddi (98).

4.3 Head wise incidents of Crime against Women:

The brief of head wise status of Crime against Women during 2024 is as under:

- (i) **Murder:** (Decrease of 33.3%) 1 Case under this head were reported in District Chamba. 03 cases in district Solan.
- (ii) **Rape:** (Decrease of 5.81%)

A total of 324 cases of Rape were reported, which is a

decrease of 5.81% over the previous year (344 cases). The highest incidents of rape were reported in district Mandi (54), Sirmaur (49), Shimla (46), Kangra (37), Chamba (26), Solan (24), Baddi (23), Kullu (17), Una (15), Bilaspur (12), Kinnaur (9), Hamirpur & Nurbur (7 each), Kinnaur (6). No incidents under this head were reported in Lahaul & Spiti.

Reasons:-

1. Revelation Of illicit love affairs, intimacy and friendship between both parties leading to registration of cases.
2. Alluring for marriage and later on due to refusal of parents, refusal for marriage, resulting in registration of cases.
3. False registration due to enmity.
4. Rapes of minors.

(iii) Dowry Deaths:

(Decrease of 100%)

No incidents under this head were reported in all the districts.

(iv) Kidnapping & Abduction:

(Increase of 14.24%)

During the year 2024, 401 incidents of Kidnapping & Abduction

were registered; an increase of 14.24% over the previous year (351 cases). Mandi district reported the highest incidents (54) under this crime head, followed by Sirmaur (49), Shimla (46), Kangra (37), Chamba (26), Solan (24), Baddi (23), Kullu (17), Una (15), Bilaspur (12), Nurbur (8), Hamirpur (7), Kinnaur (6). No incidents under this head were reported in Lahaul & Spiti.

(v) Assault on women with intend to outrage modesty (Sec.354 IPC/ 74 BNS) **(Decrease of 29.4%)**

356 cases of Assault on women with intend to outrage modesty were registered during the year 2024; a decrease of 29.4% over the previous year. Sirmaur district recorded the highest (54 cases), followed by Mandi (50), Kangra (48), Solan (35), Sirmaur (31), Chamba (28), Kullu, (24), Bilaspur (21), Una (15), Nurbur (13), Baddi (11), Kinnaur (2). No incidents under this head were reported in Lahaul & Spiti.

(vi) Abetment to Commit Suicide (Increase of 30.7%)

An increasing trend is seen under this head with a 30.7% increase over the previous year. The highest

number of cases were registered in Mandi (13), followed by Kangra (9), Una (6), Baddi and Shimla (4 each), Bilaspur and Solan, (3 each), Chamba, Hamirpur, Nurpur and Sirmaur (2 each), Kullu (1). No incidence under this head were reported in Kinnaur and Lahaul & Spiti districts.

(vii) Cruelty to Women:

(Decrease of 15.2%)

184 cases of Cruelty to Women were registered during the year 2024. This head showed a decrease of 15.2% over the previous year. The highest number of cases were registered in Mandi (28) district, followed by Una (27), Kangra (23), Bilaspur (22), Baddi and Sirmaur (12 each), Kullu (11), Solan (10) Hamirpur (9), Chamba (7) and Nurpur (9) and no incident under this was reported in Lahual & Spiti district.

Reasons:-

1. Torture of married women for the purpose of dowry, her ill health etc.
2. Harassment and torture of women by her in-laws i.e. husband, mother-in-law, father-in-law etc. on the pretext that she is not capable to doing house hold and agriculture activities.

3. Harassment/torture of women by husband due to illicit relationship of the husband with another woman.
4. Torture/ harassment of women by husband or other male member of the family under the influence of liquor.
5. Love marriage without the consent of the other family members i.e. father-in-law and mother-in-law of the victims.

(viii) Insult to the modesty of Women (Sec. 509 IPC/79 BNS): (Increase of 1.03%)

There was an increase in registration under this head by 1.03% over the previous year. The number of cases registered were Mandi (20), Kangra (13), Bilaspur (10), Kullu (9), Sirmaur (8), Una (7), Shimla and Solan (6 each), Chamba (4) Nurpur (3) No incident under this head was reported in Baddi, Kinnaur and Lahaul & Spiti district.

**(ix) Immoral Trafficking
(Decrease of 50%)**

Total of 5 cases of Immoral Trafficking were registered during the year 2024, as compared to 10 cases registered in the previous year.

INCIDENTS OF CRIMES AGAINST WOMEN DURING 2024

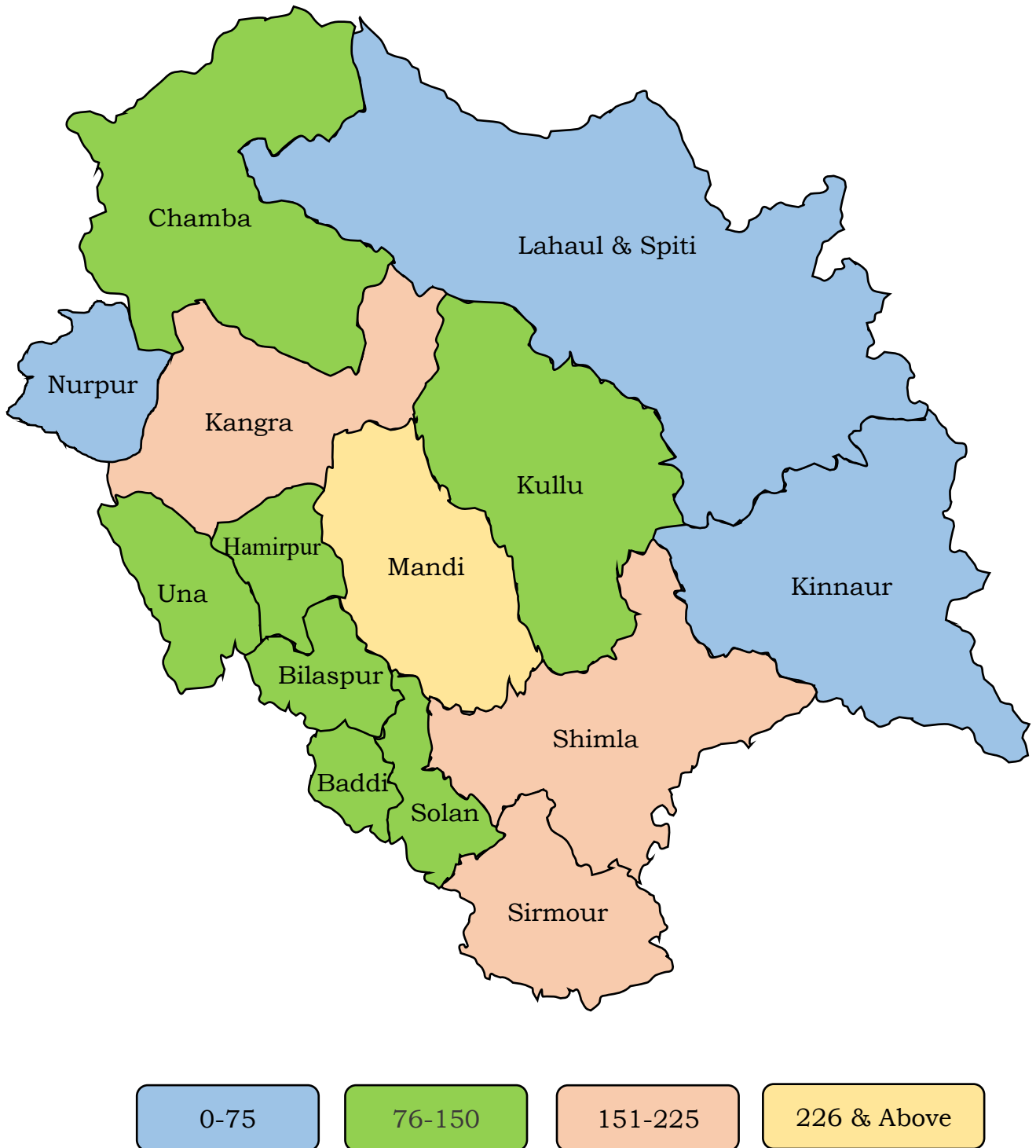

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CHAPTER-5

CRIME AGAINST CHILDREN

5.1 General:

Crime against children includes violations under certain sections of the Indian Penal Code & BNS etc. For the purpose of this chapter, the following categories of crimes involving child victims have been included under this head:-

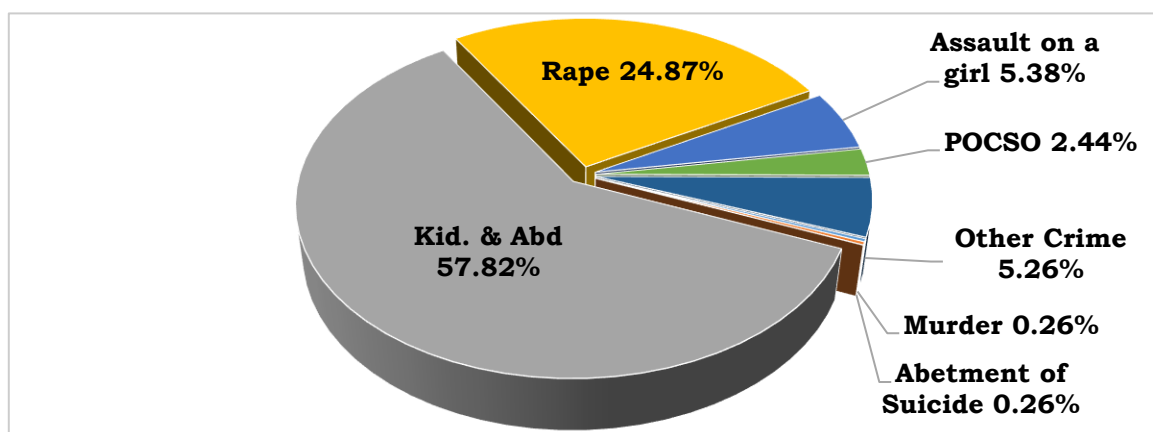
- i. Murder
- ii. Abetment to Suicide
- iii. Infanticide
- iv. Exposure and Abandonment
- v. Hurt/Grievous Hurt
- vi. Kidnapping and abduction
- vii. Rape
- viii. Attempt to commit Rape
- ix. Assault on girl

- x. Insult to the modesty of a girl
- xi. Protection of Children from Sexual Offences
- xii. Juvenile Justice (Care & Protection of Children) Act, 2000
- xiii. Prohibition of Child Marriage Act
- xiv. Other crimes committed against Children

5.2 Trends of Crime against Children:

Table 5.1 and **Chart 5.1** depicts the percentage distribution of crimes against children during 2024. **Chart 5.2** depicts the district-wise distribution of crimes against children during 2024.

5.3 Incidents:

Table 5.1 shows the incidents and rate of Crime against Children, district wise including its rank.

780 cases were reported in the State under various sections of IPC & BNS etc. Kidnapping & Abduction constituted the largest category with 451 cases (57.82%) reported during the year. The maximum number of 'Kidnapping & Abduction' cases were reported in Mandi District (78) followed Shimla (42), Kangra (42), Una (32), Sirmaur (31), Hamirpur (30), Chamba (30), Kullu (28), Nurpur (23), Bilaspur (4) and no incident under this head was reported in District Lahaul & Spiti.

The second most prevalent Crime against Children

was Rape which accounted for 194 cases (24.87%). The highest number of Rape cases were reported in District Sirmaur (38), Mandi (31), Shimla (25), Chamba (20), Kangra (16), Solan (13), Kullu (10), Bilaspur (7), Kinnaur (6), Una (5), Hamirpur (5), Nurpur (4) and no incident under this head was reported in District Lahaul & Spiti.

02 cases under the head Murder of Children were reported in the State. 1 each in Mandi and PD Nurpur. No case of Murder of children has been reported in rest of the districts of the State.

The incidence and percentage contribution of crimes against children head and district wise is presented in **Table.5.2**.

Total No. of Incidence = 779

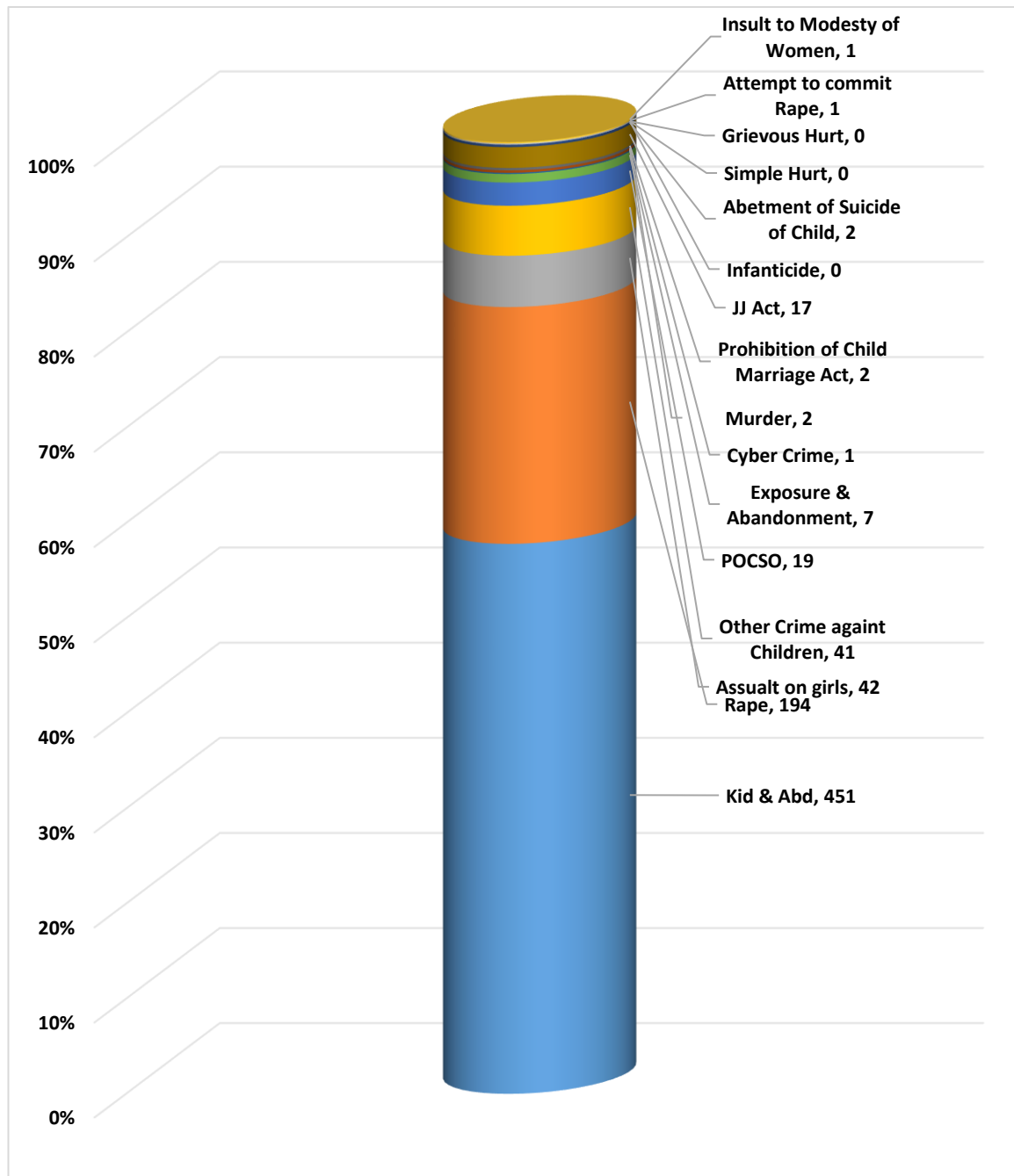

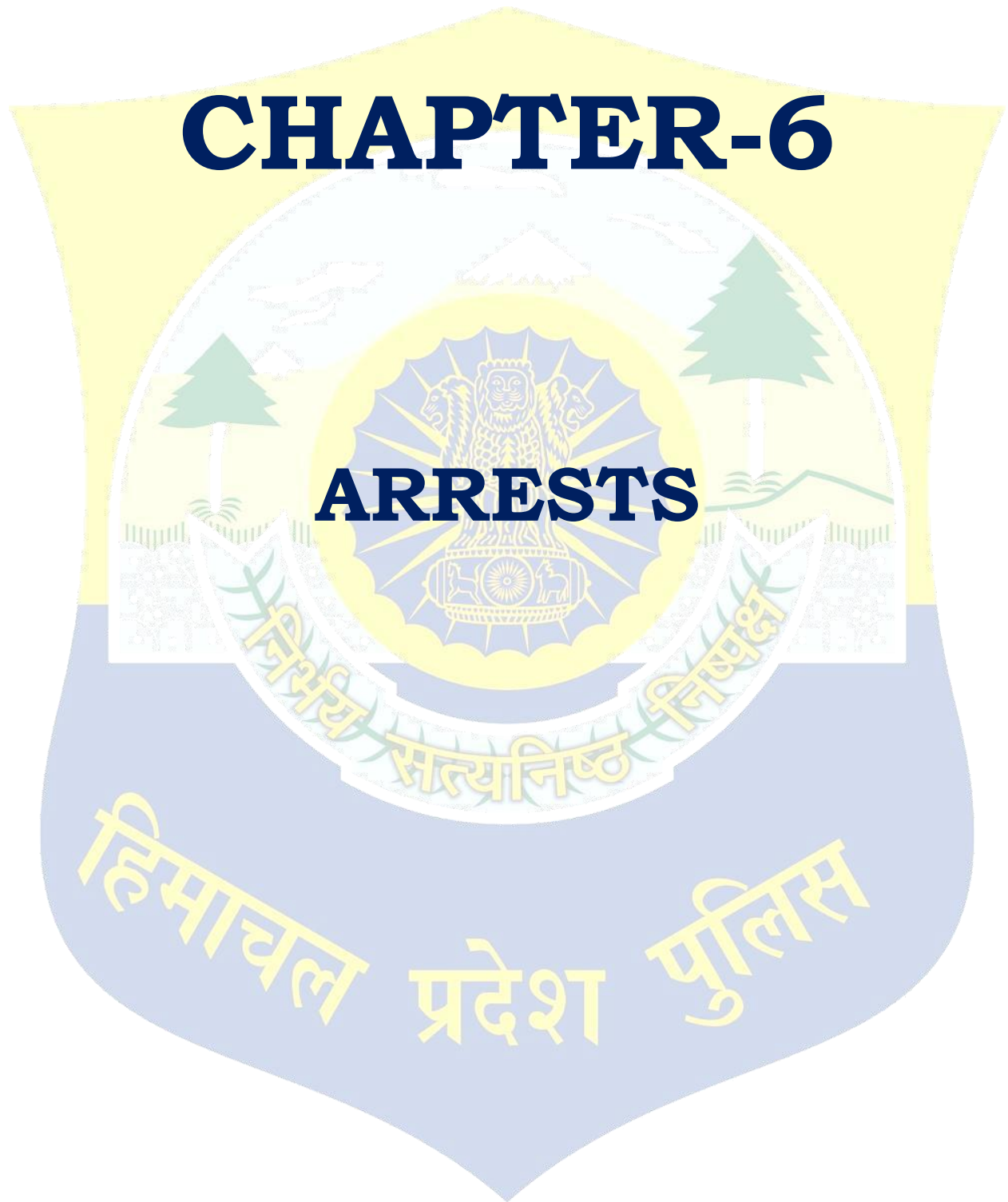

CHAPTER-6

ARRESTS

6.1 ARRESTS:

A total of 11040 persons (7047 under IPC/BNS & 3993 under Local & Special Laws) were arrested during the year 2024 in 17915 cases (12071 under IPC/BNS & 5844 Local & Special Laws), which is a decrease of 19.00% when compared with the arrests of 13778 persons (8700 under IPC & 5038 under Local & Special Laws) in the year 2023.

(i) PERSONS ARRESTED UNDER IPC/BNS CASES:

(Decrease of 19.00%)

During the year 2024 as many as 7047 persons were arrested in 17915 cases registered under IPC/BNS, as against 8700 persons in 2023. This is due to the reason that some cases registered in State fall under petty offences in which accused are released under section 41(A) Cr.PC/135(3) BNSS. **Chart 6.1** depicts persons arrested under IPC/BNS crimes during 2022-2024.

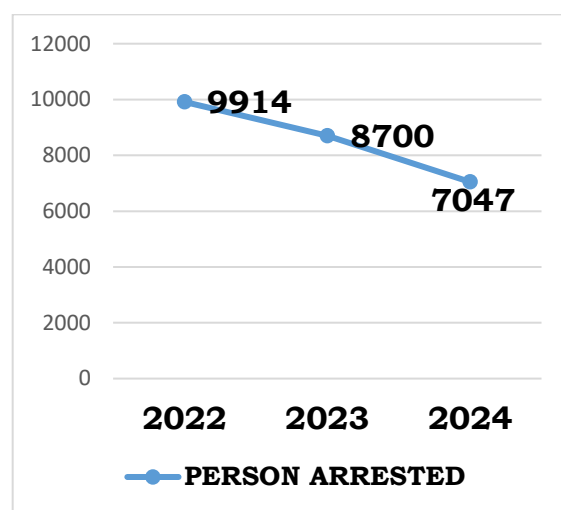

District Shimla tops in arresting 1586 persons in 612 cases during 2024, followed by district Sirmaur by arresting 1226 persons in 428 cases and Mandi by arresting 1144 persons in 754 cases.

In Kullu, 355 cases were registered and 1008 persons arrested. District Solan has registered 424 cases and arrested 414 persons, in Baddi 395 persons were arrested against the registration of 393 cases during the year 2024. The details of persons

arrested under IPC crime head wise & gender wise are presented in **Table 6.3**.

Chart 6.2 depicts age group wise persons arrested under IPC/BNS crime during the years 2024 and **Chart 6.3** depicts district wise persons arrested under IPC crime cases during the year 2024 in descending order.

AGE-GROUP WISE PERSONS ARRESTED UNDER IPC/BNS CRIMES DURING 2024

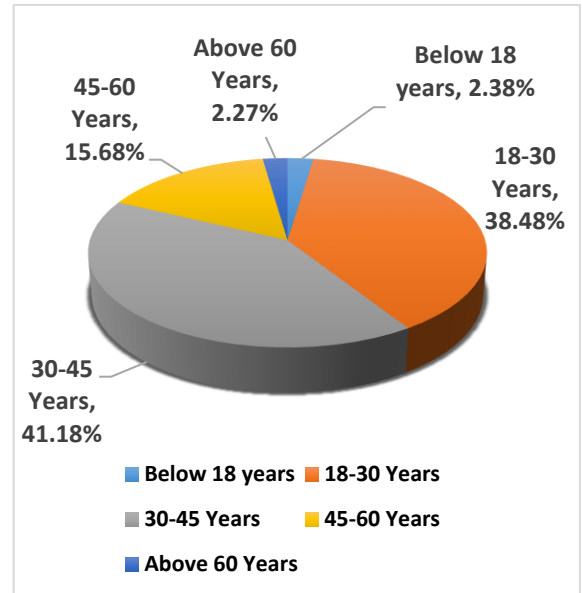
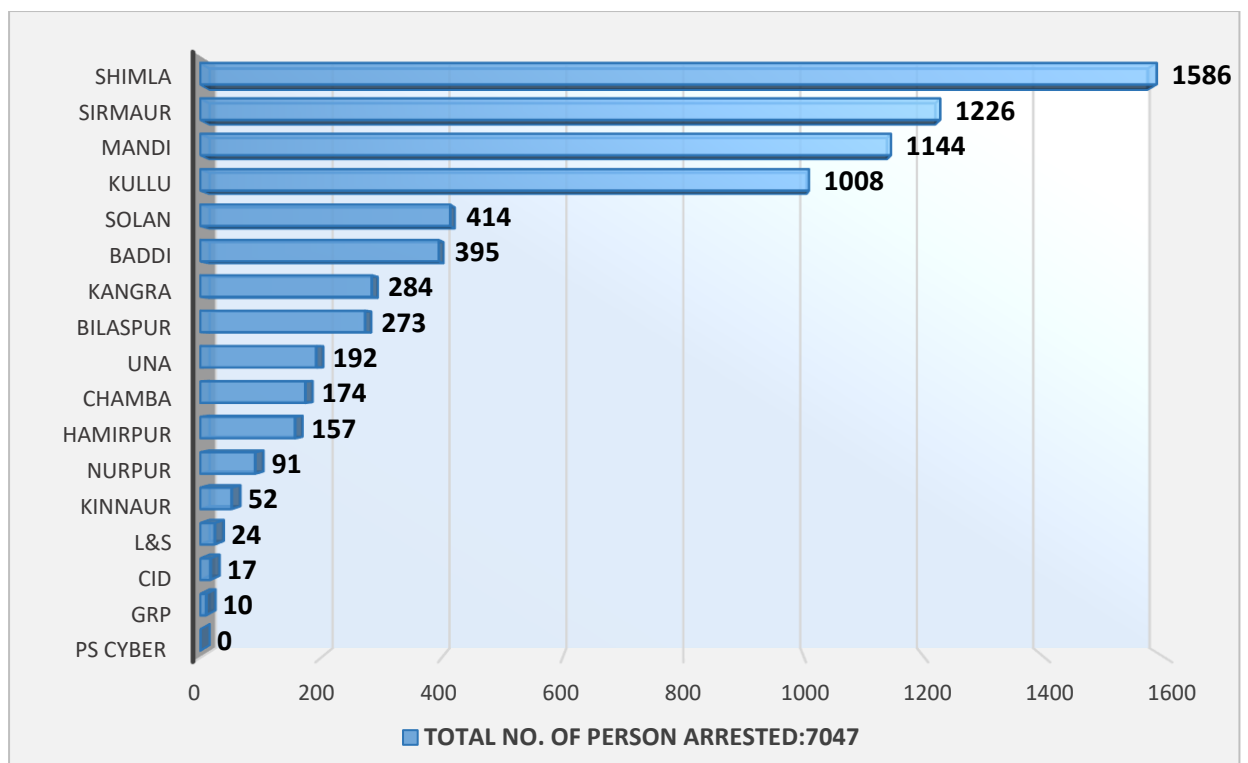

DISTRICT WISE PERSONS ARRESTED UNDER IPC/BNS CRIMES DURING 2024

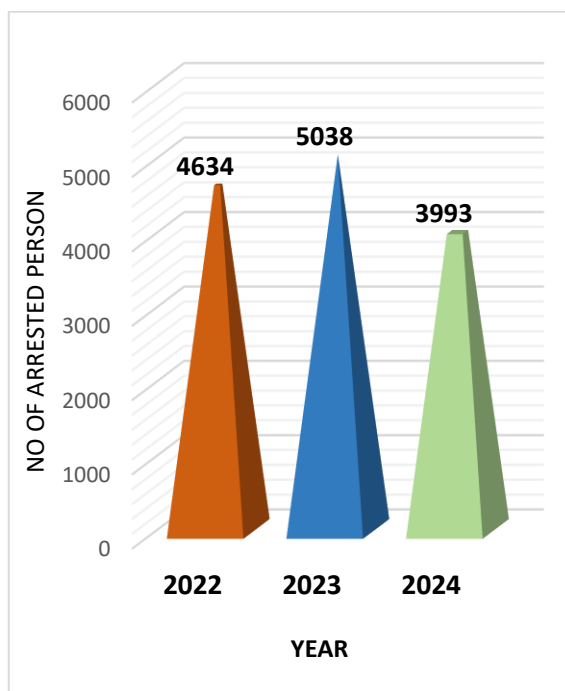


(ii) Persons arrested under SLL cases: (Decrease of 20.74%)

Total 3993 persons were arrested against 5844 SLL crimes during 2024, as compared to 5038 persons during the year 2023 a decrease of 20.74%. Persons arrested during 2022-2024 crime head wise and percentage variations (SLL) during 2024 over 2023 are presented in Table 6.6

Chart 6.4 depicts persons arrested under SLL Crime during 2022-2024.

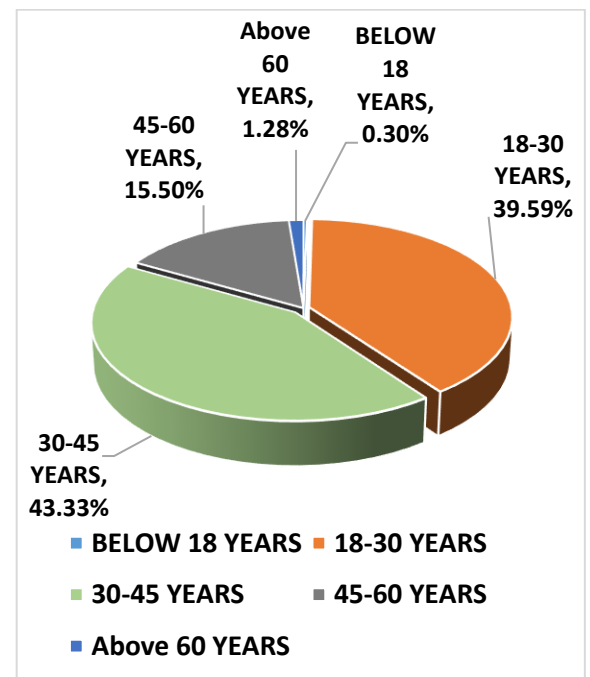
CHART 6.4

District Shimla has arrested the highest number 911 of persons with 570 cases registered during the year 2024, followed by district Kullu by arresting 721

persons in 654 cases, Mandi 506 persons in 738 cases, Sirmaur 416 persons in 464 cases, Solan has 265 persons in 204 cases registered.

Baddi has registered 391 cases with 250 persons arrested, Kangra has 690 cases with 196

person arrested, Una 433 cases with 149 persons arrested and Bilaspur 366 cases with 139 persons arrested.

DISTRICT WISE PERSONS ARRESTED UNDER SLL CRIMES DURING 2024

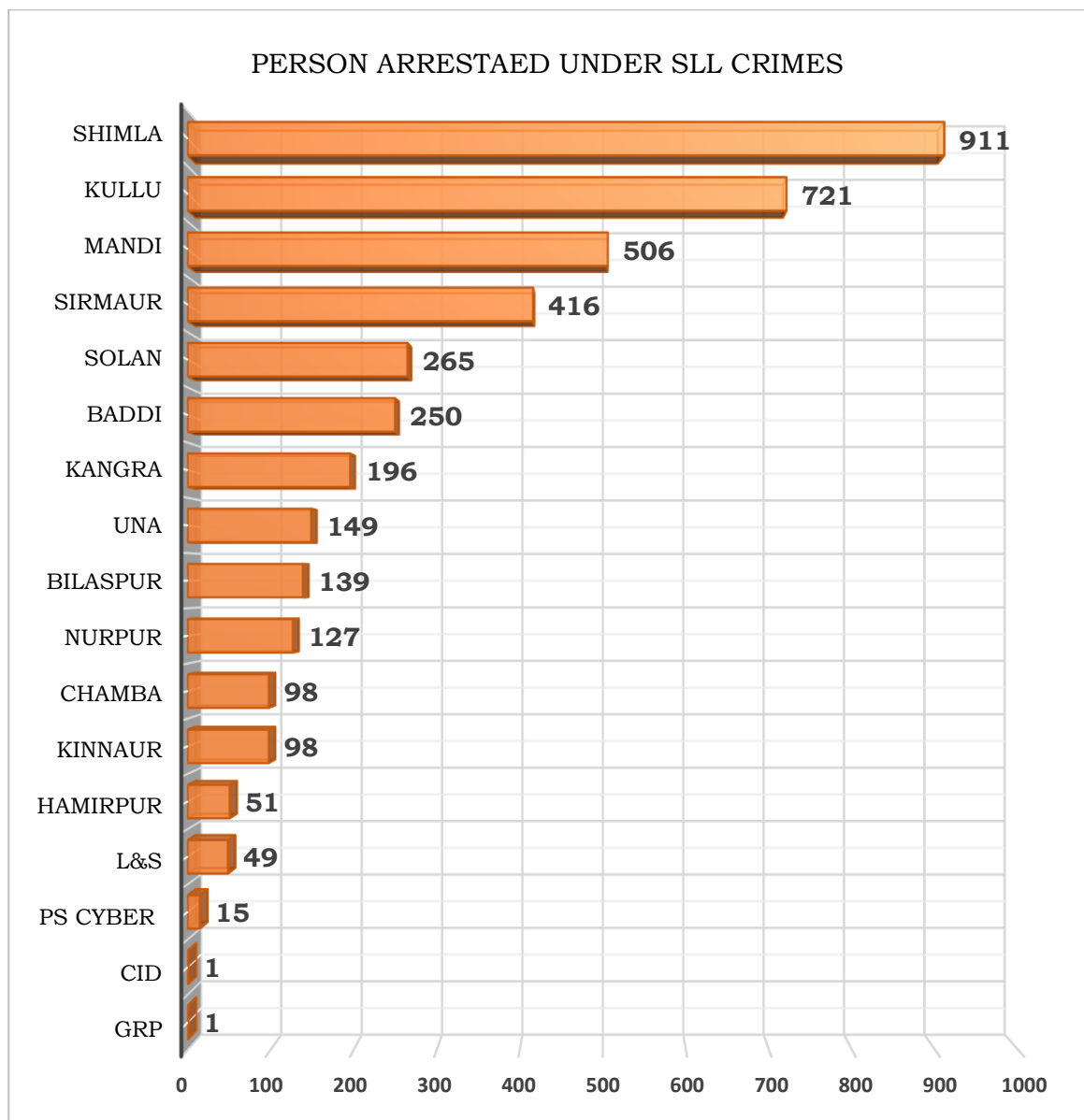

PERSONS ARRESTED UNDER (IPC/BNS) CRIMES – 2024

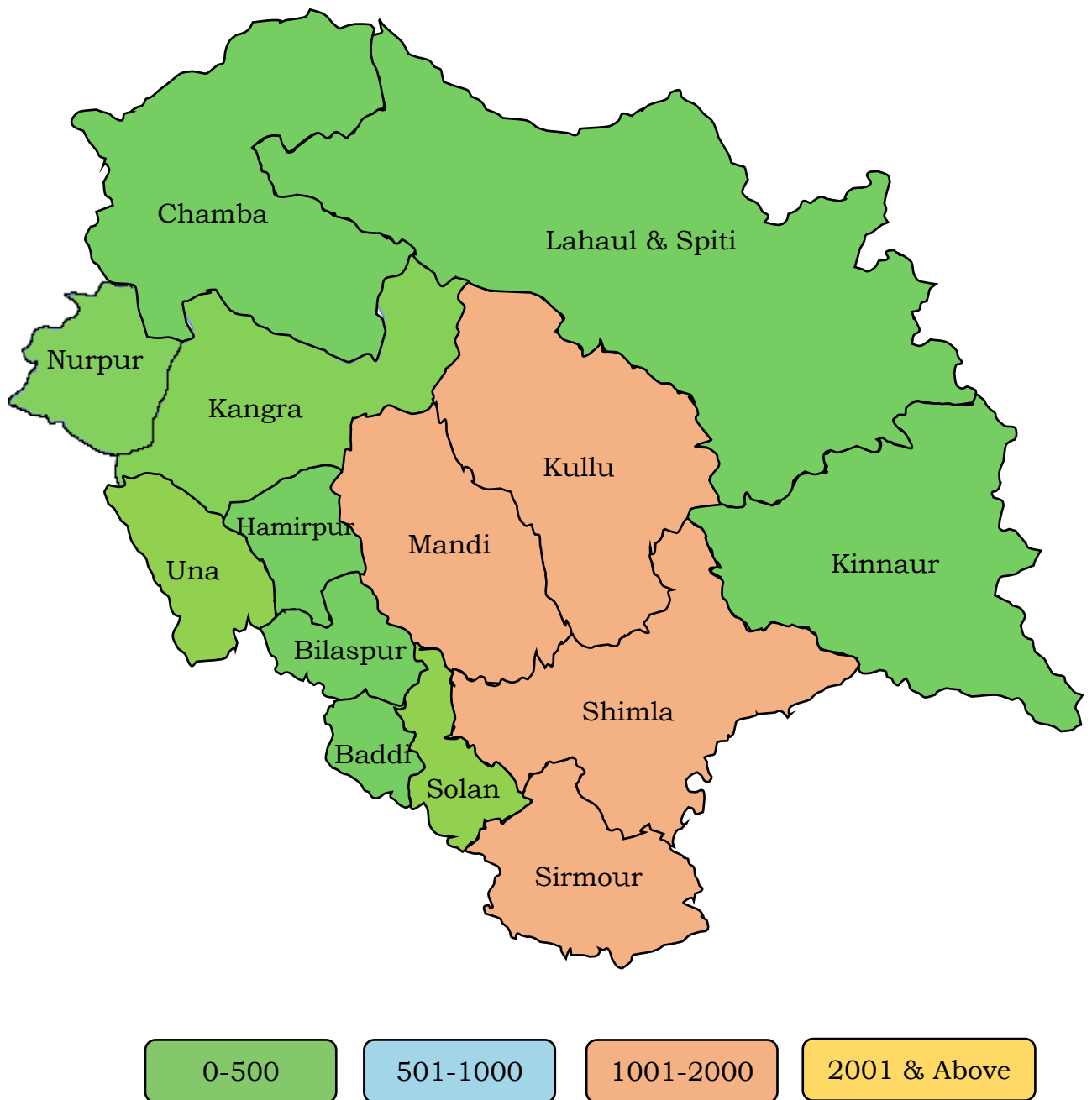

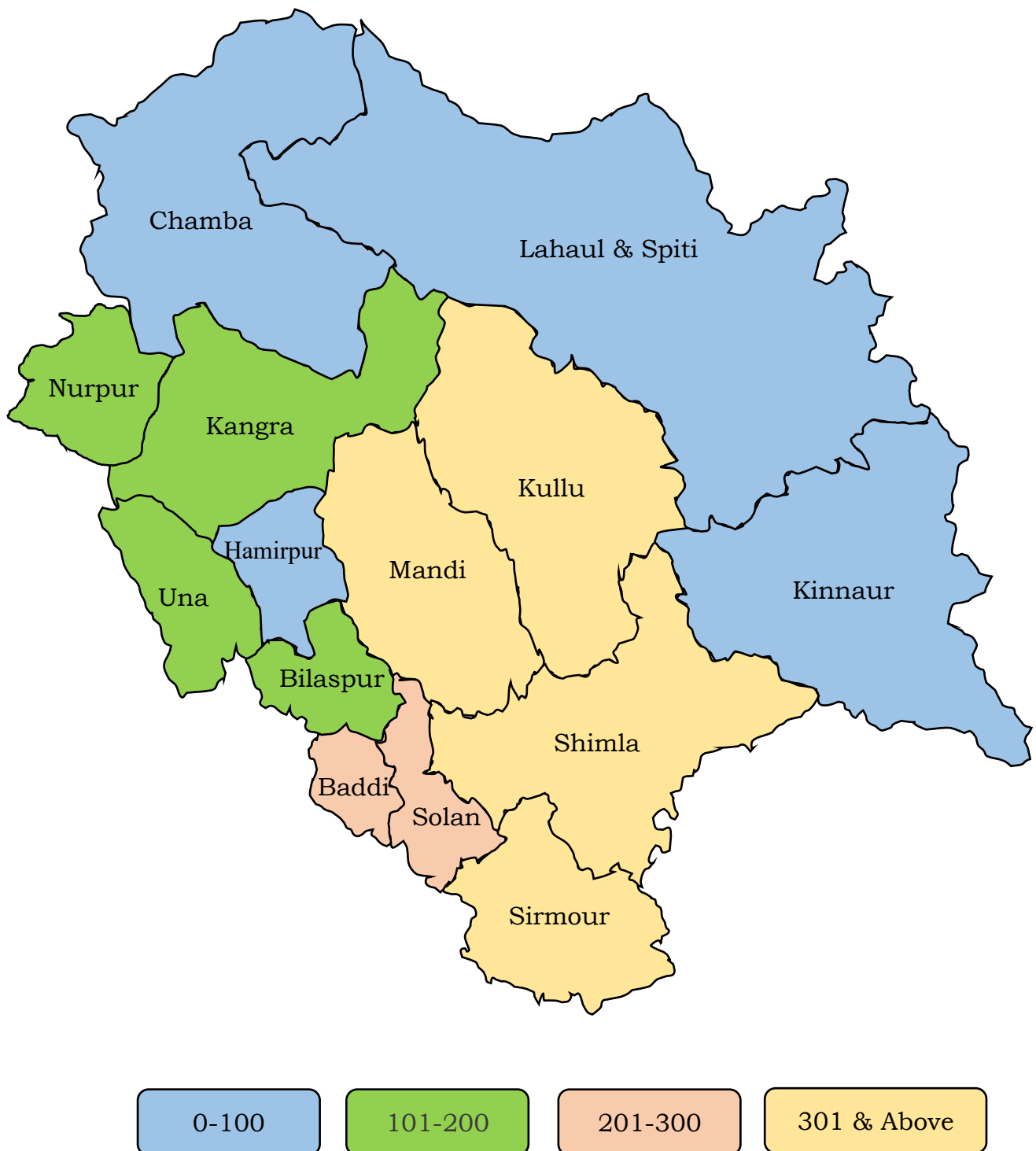

CHAPTER-7

CRIME AGAINST WEAKER SECTIONS OF SOCIETY (SC/ST)

7.1 General:

A complete harmony among different sections of society is prevailing in the State. No particular area of the State is notorious for the commission of offences against the SCs/STs. However, sporadic incidents of violence against the members of these communities do take place.

India is a welfare State. It is committed to the welfare and development of its people in general and of vulnerable sections in particular. Equality of status and opportunity to all citizens of the country are guaranteed by the constitution of India, which also provides that no individual shall be discriminated against on grounds of religion, caste or sex. Fundamental Rights and specific provisions, namely, Articles 38, 39 and 46 in the constitution of India stand testimony to the commitment of the State towards its people. The strategy of the State is to secure distributive justice and allocation of resources to

support programmes for social, economic and educational advancement of the weaker section in general and those of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in particular.

7.2 Constitutional Rights:

The Indian Constitution vide Article 15 lays down that no citizen shall on grounds of religion, race, sex or place of birth be subjected to any disability or restriction. It also guarantees that every citizen shall have equality of status and opportunity.

7.3. Legal Rights:

To uphold the constitutional mandate and to safeguard the interests of this section of the society, special social enactments have come into force from time to time, including privileges by way of reservations.

Following are two of the major legal enactments sponsored by Centre:

- (i) Protection of Civil Rights Act, 1955; and
- (ii) SC/ST (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989

The Protection of Civil Rights Act, 1955 was enacted in furtherance of Article 17 of the Constitution by which untouchability was abolished and its practice in any form is forbidden. Further, in order to check and deter crimes against SC/STs by persons belonging to other communities, the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989 was brought into force from 30th January, 1990. These enactments have extended the positive discrimination in favour of SCs and STs to the field of criminal law in as much as they prescribe penalties that are more stringent than for corresponding offences under the Indian Penal Code (IPC) and other laws.

In addition, in pursuance of the Constitution 65th Amendment Act, 1990, the National Commission for SCs and STs was

constituted w.e.f 12th March, 1992 with wide functions and powers of Civil Courts to take up matters which are of vital importance for socio-economic development of SCs and STs.

7.4 The Crimes against weaker sections identified under the Indian Penal Code (IPC) and Special & Local Laws (SLL):

- (i) Murder
- (ii) Rape
- (iii) Kidnapping & Abduction
- (iv) Dacoity
- (v) Robbery
- (vi) Arson
- (vii) Hurt
- (viii) Others (Other classified IPC crimes)

7.4.1 Under Special & Local Laws (SLL):

- (i) Protection of Civil Rights Act:1955
- (ii) The SC/STs (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989.

The crimes under IPC such as 'Murder', 'Hurt', 'Rape etc. or under Special Acts such as PCR Act & SC/ST (P) Act are already included in overall crimes reported under IPC and SLL respectively and have been

discussed in details in the preceding chapters. The data specific to crimes against SC/ST discussed in the following paragraphs is a part and parcel of total crimes but analyzed separately for better comprehension.

Population:

As per 2011 census of Himachal Pradesh, the Scheduled Castes constituted 25.19% of the total population in the State, while Scheduled Tribes constituted only 5.7%. District Kangra with the highest population share (22.03%) also represented the highest share of Scheduled Castes (21.15%), followed by Mandi (17%) and Shimla with (12.47%).

7.5 Incidents of Crimes against Weaker Section (SC/ST):

The incidents of these crimes (IPC+SLL) were reported to be 248 cases in the State during 2024. Head wise details of crime against weaker sections for the last 3 years, including percentage change over the previous years, is presented in **Table 7.1**. **Chart 7.1** depicts the head wise position of the crime incidents. The

district wise and head wise incidents including the rate of crime has been calculated and presented in **Table 7.2**.

The above data reflects that the incidents of most of the SC/ST (POA) Act and other crimes have increased.

7.6 Head-wise Crime:

Under most of the heads of IPC no incident has been registered during the year 2024. The head wise detailed analysis of all crime heads under which the cases have been registered during the year 2024 are given below:

(i) **Murder: (Increase of 0.3%)**

During the year 2024, total 2 incidents was reported in Shimla district under the head Murder against weaker sections in the State.

(ii) **Rape: (Decrease of 0.01%)**

During the year 2024, 8 incidents of rape were reported in the State. The highest numbers of incidents under this head were reported in district Shimla (3), followed by Mandi (2), Bilaspur, Sirmaur and Solan (1 each). No case

under this head was registered in rest of the districts.

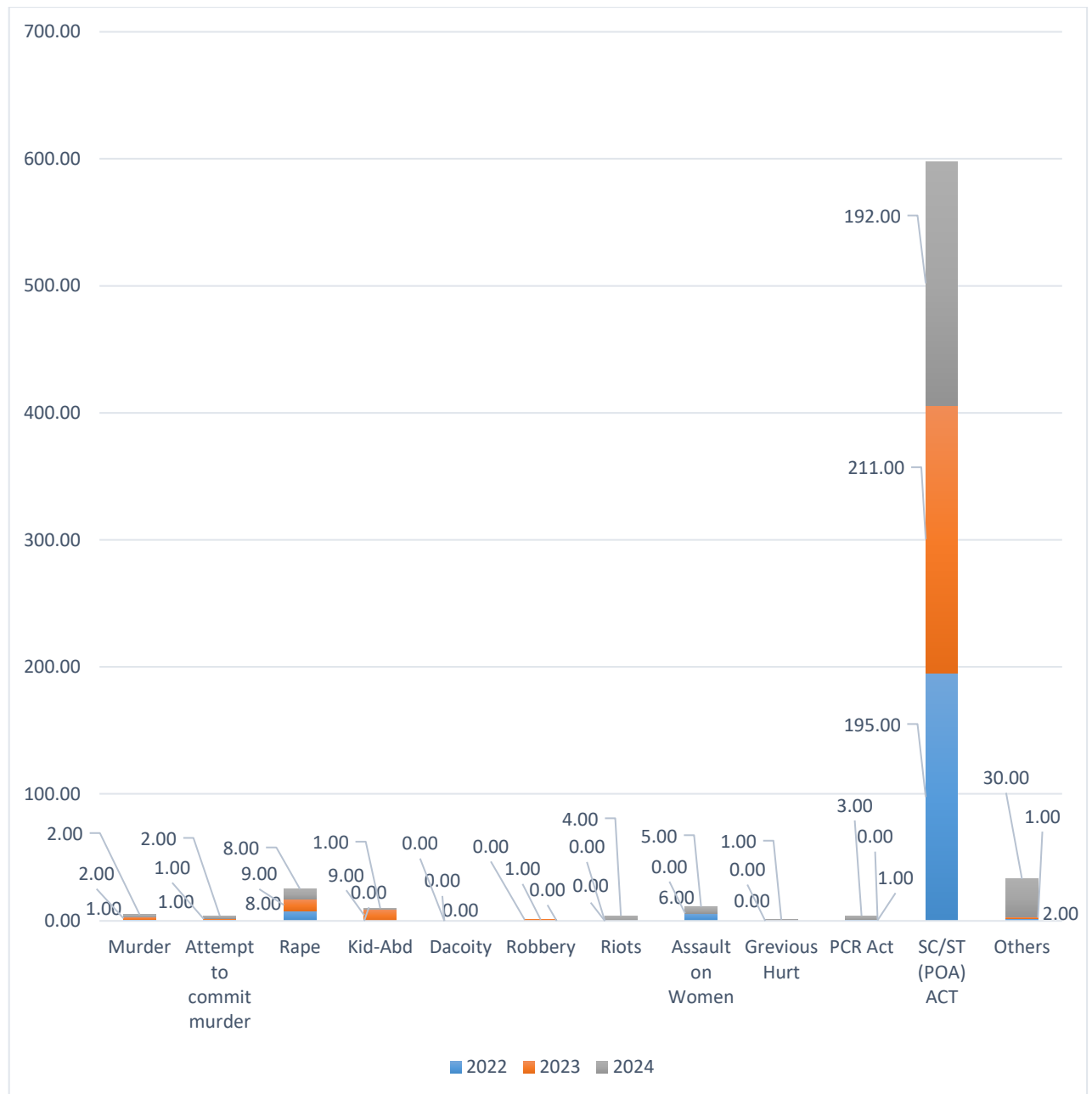
(iii) SC/ST Protection of Civil

Rights Act: (Increase of 1.15%)

During the year 2024, 3 incidents of PCR Act was reported in Kinnaur district under this head. No case under this head was registered in rest of the districts.

(iii) SC/ST (Prevention of Atrocities) Act 1989 only:
(Decrease of 9.00%)

During the year 2024, 192 incidents were reported under this head; a decrease of 19 cases over the previous year. The highest number of incidents under this head

were reported in district Mandi (42), followed by Shimla (28), Solan (22), Una (21), Hamirpur (20) Sirmaur (15), Baddi (10), Kangra (9), Kullu (8), Bilaspur & Chamba (6 each), Nurpur (4) and Kinnaur (1). No case under this head was registered in district L&S.

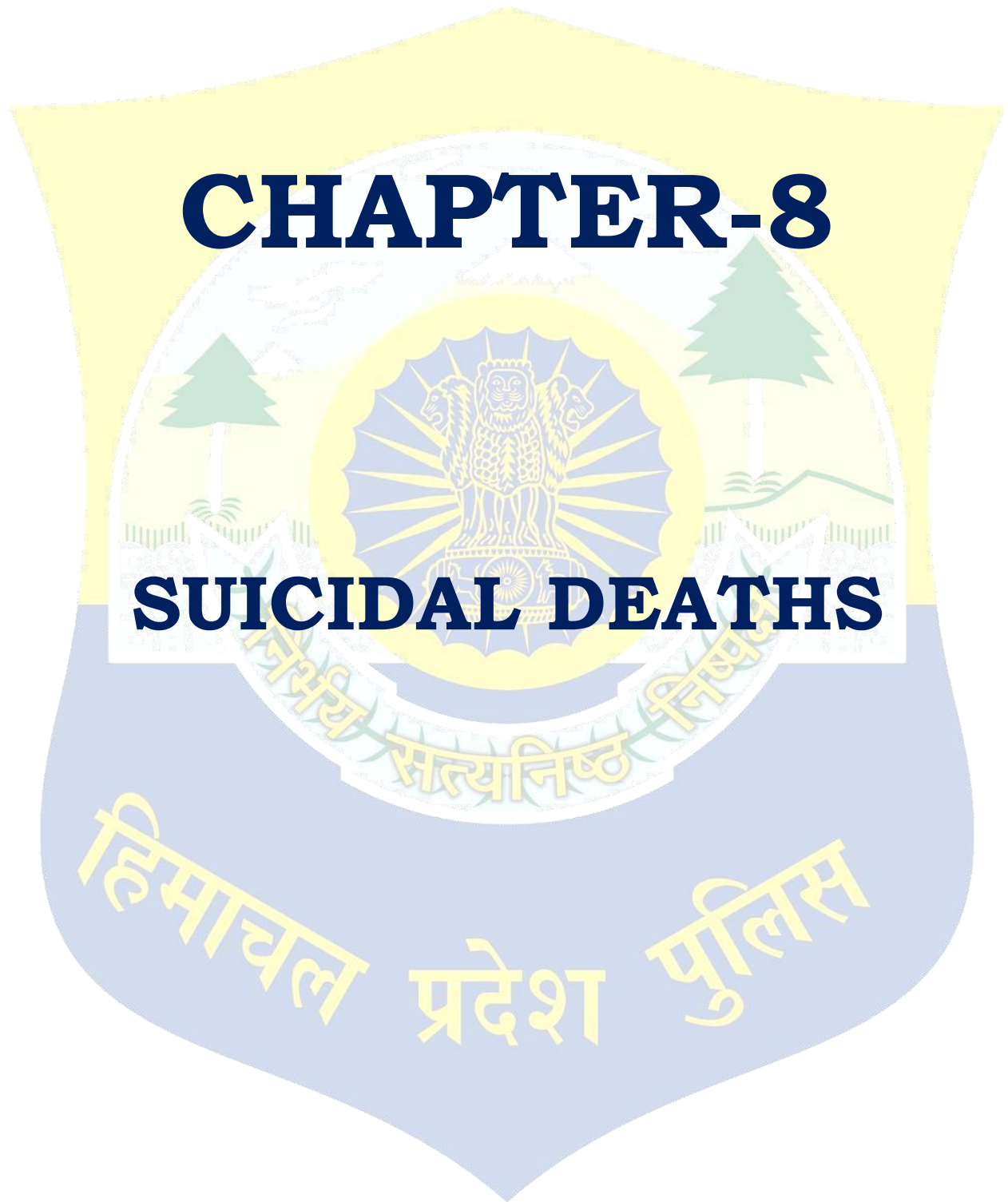

CHAPTER-8

SUICIDAL DEATHS

8.1 General:

According to the Oxford dictionary, 'suicide' means 'the act of killing oneself intentionally'. The word 'suicide' has its origin in the Latin word 'sui' (of oneself) plus 'caedere' [kill]. It is a step which is generally taken by one in an emotionally or mentally weak moment, when he or she feels that coping with life is impossible.

The number of suicides reported in Himachal Pradesh during 2024 was 813, as against 818 during 2023, indicating a decrease of 0.08%.

Kangra district recorded the highest number of suicides during

2024 (137), followed by Mandi (96), Shimla (83), Una (78), Baddi (78), Hamirpur (70), Solan (66), Bilaspur (63), Sirmour (48), Nurpur (33), Kullu (32), Chamba (27), Kinnaur (11) and Lahaul-Spiti (0). Suicides during the period 2015-2024 are presented in **Chart 8.1**

Year-wise break-up of suicides during 2024 is presented in **Table 8.1**. Comparative suicidal deaths for the last 10 years (2015-2024) including male and female is presented in **Chart 8.1**. **Chart 8.2** depicts the district wise incidence of suicidal deaths during 2024.

SUICIDE CASES (MALE AND FEMALE) DURING 2015-2024

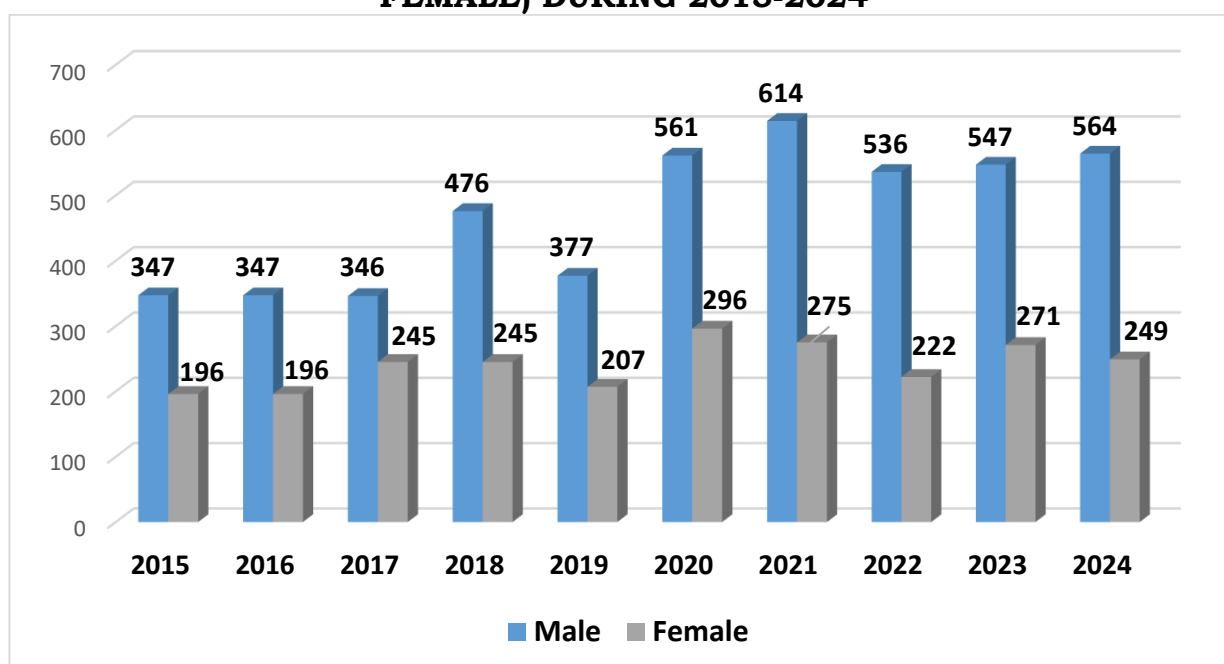
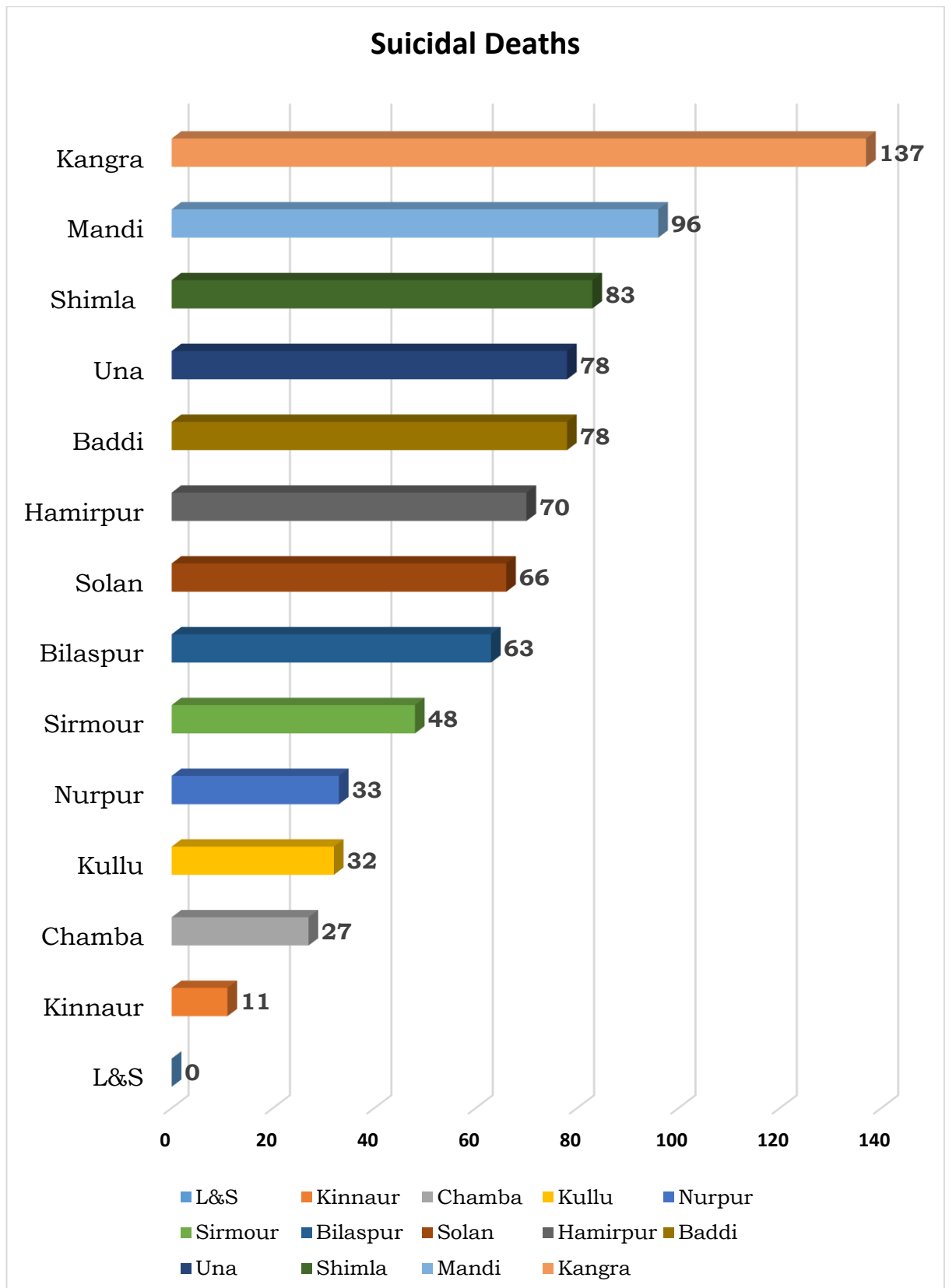


CHART-8.2

From the above table it is revealed that there has been a decrease of 0.08 % (from 818 to 813) in suicide cases during the year 2024 over the year 2023. The decrease has been witnessed in Kangra (148 to 137), Mandi (125 to 96) and Hamirpur (70 to 61). However, Una (58 to 78), Baddi (55 to 78) & Kullu (23 to 32) have been

increased in rest of the districts of the State.

District-wise percentage of suicide cases:-

The following table shows the percentage of suicide cases as compared to the percentage of the population of the district is presented in Table 8.2.

The analysis of the above table reveals that percentage of suicide deaths in Baddi, Bilaspur, Hamirpur, Kangra, Kinnaur, Solan and Una has remained higher than the percentage of the population of the district concerned during the years 2023 & 2024. In other words, these 07 districts have higher rates of

suicidal deaths as compared to the other districts of the State.

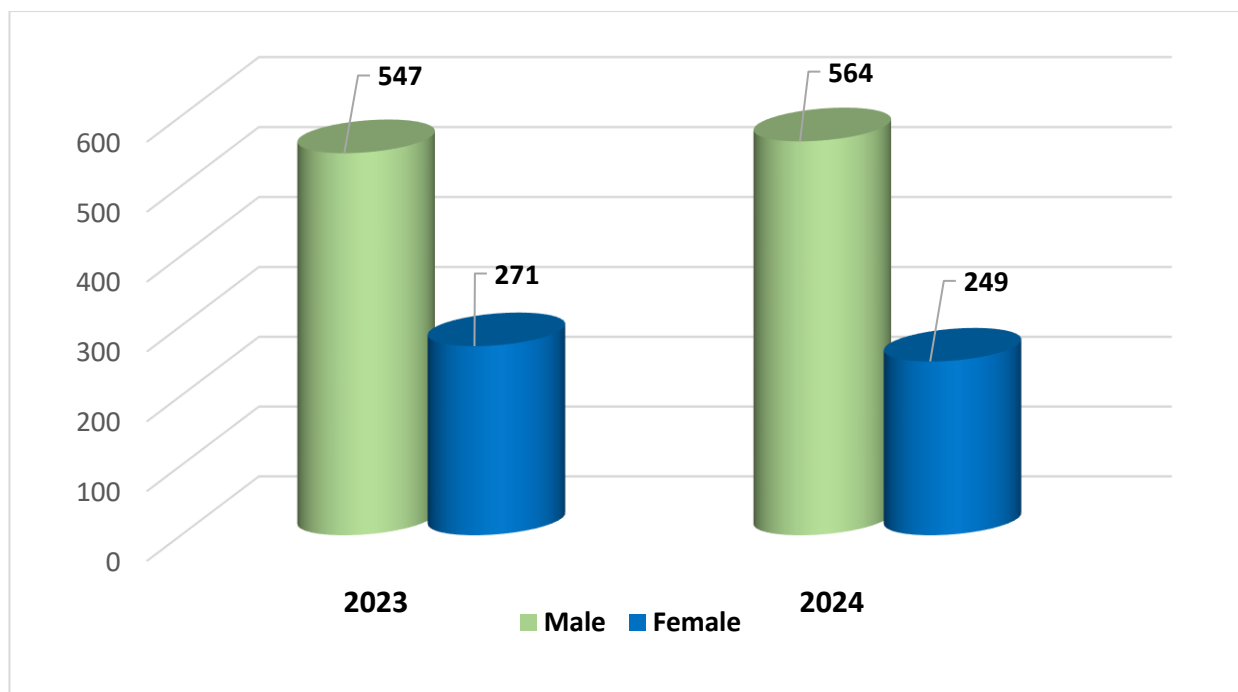

It is revealed from the above table that the number of males committing suicide outnumber the females (69.37% males as against 30.63% females in 2024) and males (66.87% males as against 33.13% females in 2023).

It is further revealed that there has been an increase of 2.5% in the male suicide cases (from 547 to 564) and a decrease of 2.5% in the number of female suicides cases (from 271 to 249) during the year 2024 as compared to the year 2023.

From this table, it is revealed that most of those who committed suicide, whether males or females, were married (69.07% in 2023 and 65.19% in 2024).

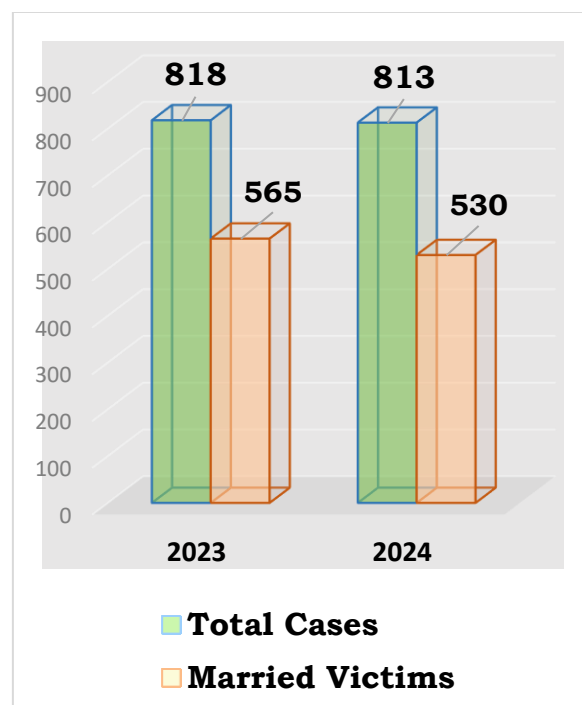

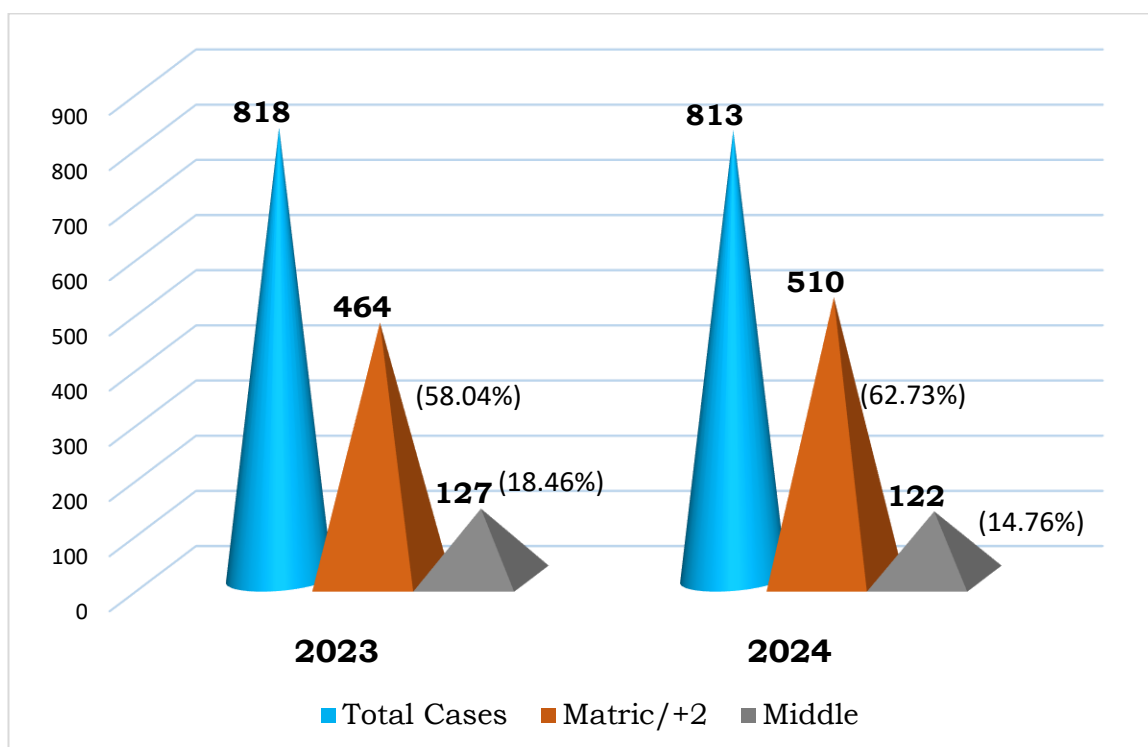

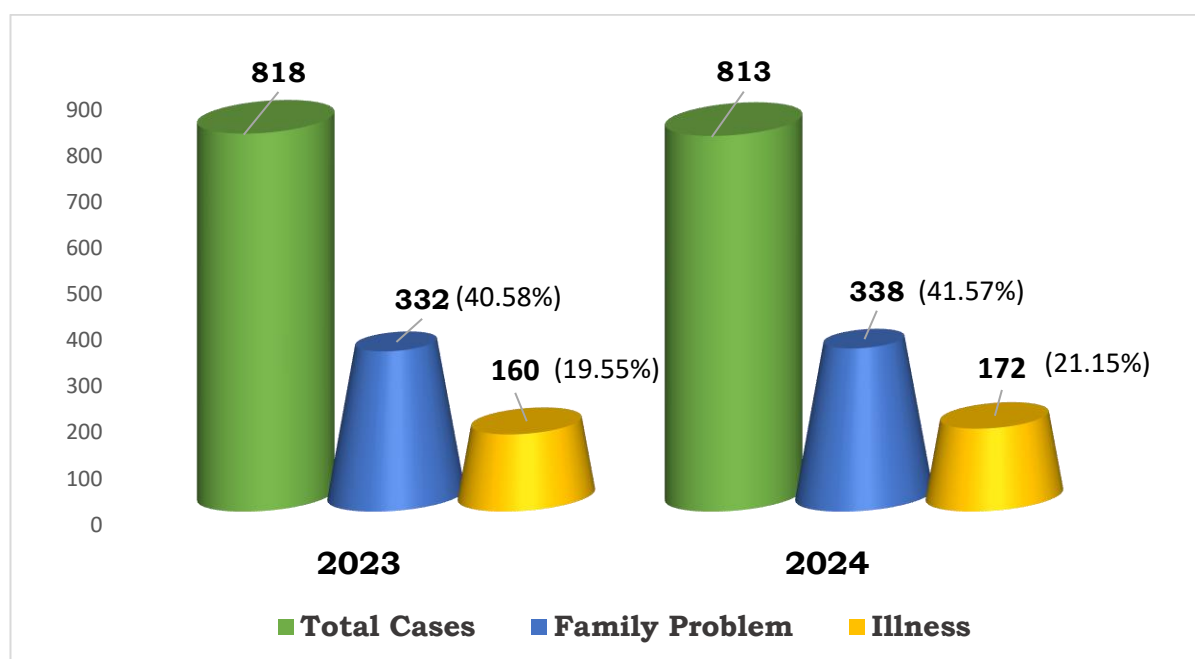

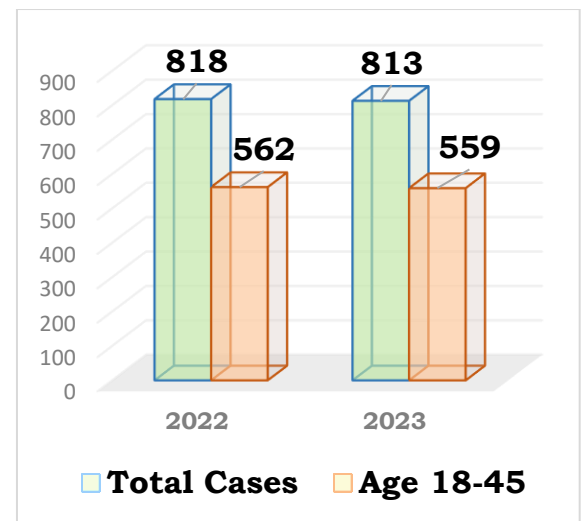

The analysis shows that the age profile of most of the suicide victims both men and women falls into two age-groups of 18-30 and 30-45 years. Thus, it can be said that most people who commit suicide do so in the prime of their lives between 18 to 45 years of age (68.70% in 2023 and 68.75% in 2024). This fact can be further co-related to the reasons for suicide i.e. 'family problems' and 'illness'.

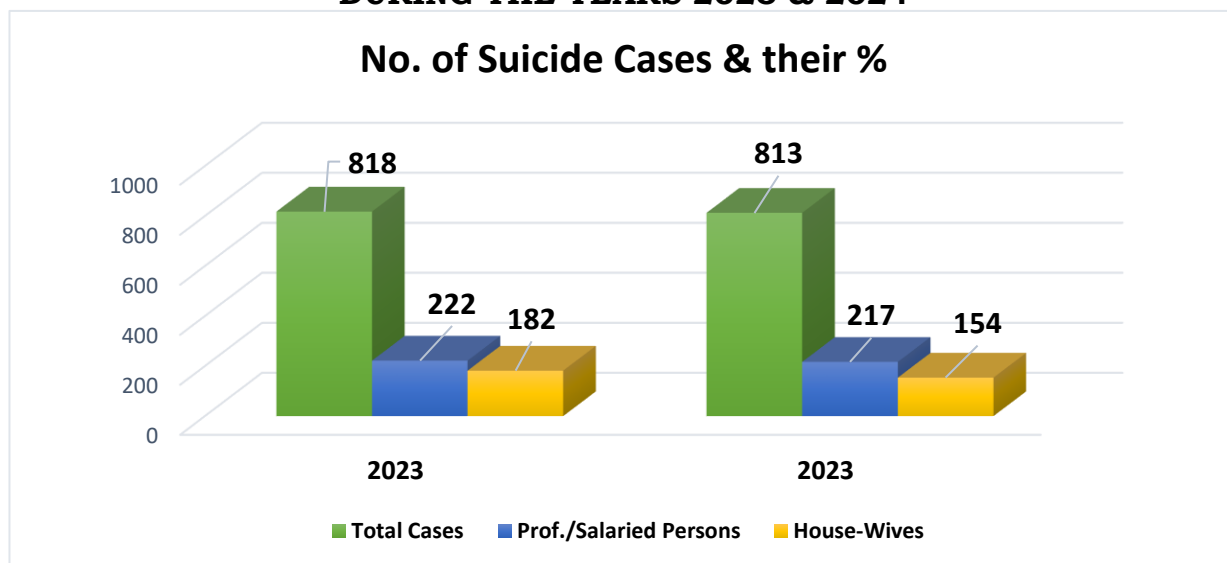

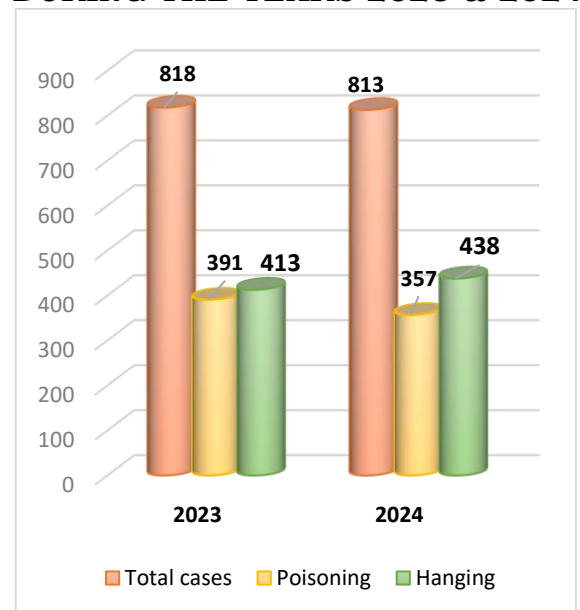

The means adopted for committing suicide range over several methods from drinking too much to jumping from high places. However, the maximum number have committed suicide by **hanging** (50.48% in 2023 and 53.87% in 2024). This is followed by **consuming poison** (47.79% in 2023 and 43.91% in 2024).

8.11. Conclusions:

- i) There has been a decrease in the suicide cases committed by men during the year 2024 as against the year 2023.
- ii) Kangra, Mandi, Shimla, Baddi, Una, Solan & Bilaspur reported more suicidal deaths as compared to the other 07 districts of the State.
- iii) The major cause of suicides remained 'family problems', followed by 'illness'. 'Unemployment' is certainly not one of the major causes of suicides as it contributes less than 13.28% of total suicide cases.
- iv) Most of the women suicide victims were house-wives. The farmers/agriculturists do not form a major group of suicide victims as this group contributes only 0.00% to the total suicide cases.
- v) The majority of the suicide victims were married and in the age group of 18 to 45 years.
- vi) The most common means for committing suicide in the year 2024 was 'hanging' followed by taking 'poison'.

SUICIDES – 2024

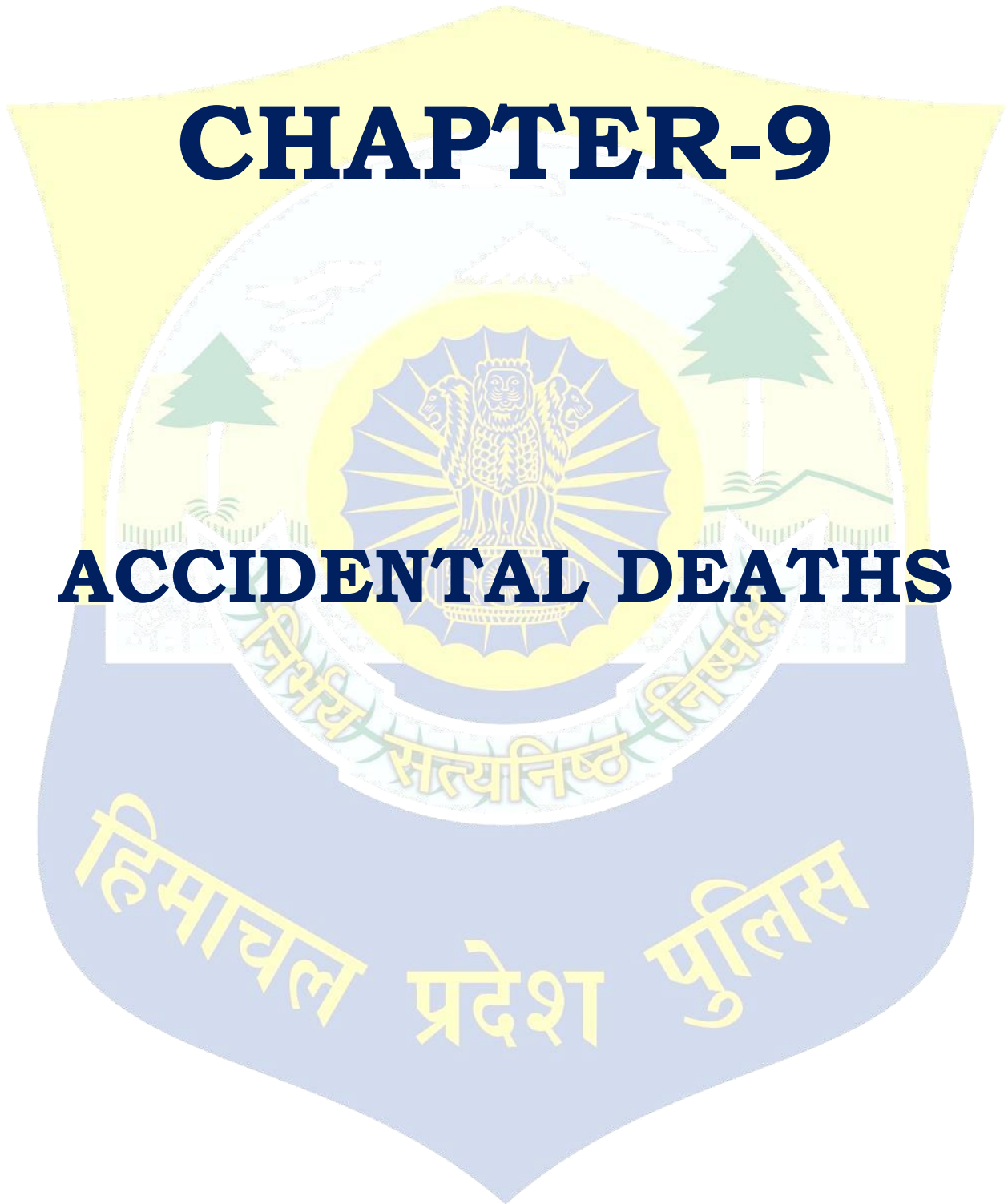

ACCIDENTAL DEATHS

9.1 General:

Incidents of road accidents in Himachal Pradesh show fluctuating trends. The break-up of accidents for the last ten years is shown in **Table-9.1**

Car/ Jeep/ Taxi/ Tempo account for the largest number of

accidents. During the year 2024, 44.9% of persons died/injured in road accidents were attributed to Car/Jeep/Taxi/Tempo. District wise comparative statement of road accidents during 2024 is presented in **Table-9.2**. 2158 road accidents were reported during the year 2024 out of which 864 accidents were fatal.

Accidental Deaths:

Car/ Jeep/ Taxi/ Tempo were responsible for 44.9% of accidental deaths during 2024. Out of the 864 persons who died due to accidents, as many as 388 were involved in accidents with these types of vehicles. Table-9.2 gives details of road accidental deaths for the year 2024 with break-up of types of vehicles and due to other reasons. District Mandi reported the highest (333) numbers of accidental deaths, followed by Shimla (284), Kangra (228), Chamba (204), Kullu (189), Sirmaur (185) and Una (152). Chart-9.1 depicts road accidents that occurred during 2015–2024.

Percentage of road accidental deaths according to type of vehicles during the year 2024 is presented in Chart-9.2.

PERCENTAGE OF ROAD ACCIDENTAL DEATHS (ACCORDING TO TYPE OF VEHICLES DURING 2024)

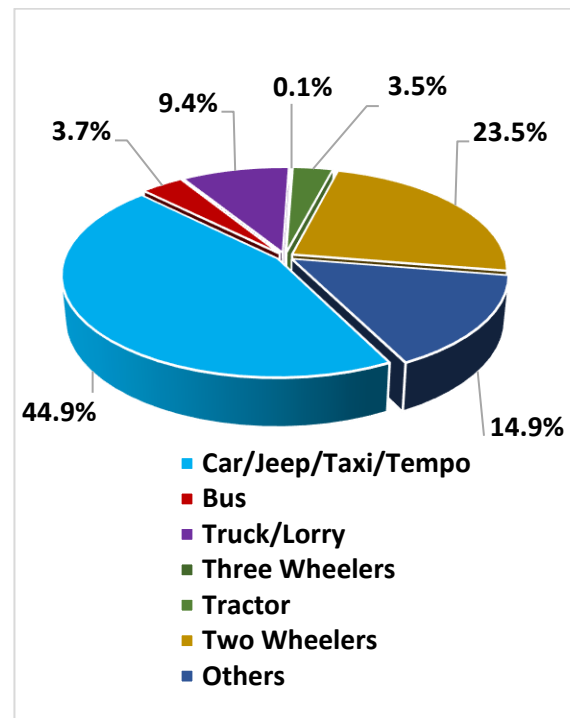

NUMBER OF ROAD ACCIDENTS (2015-2024)

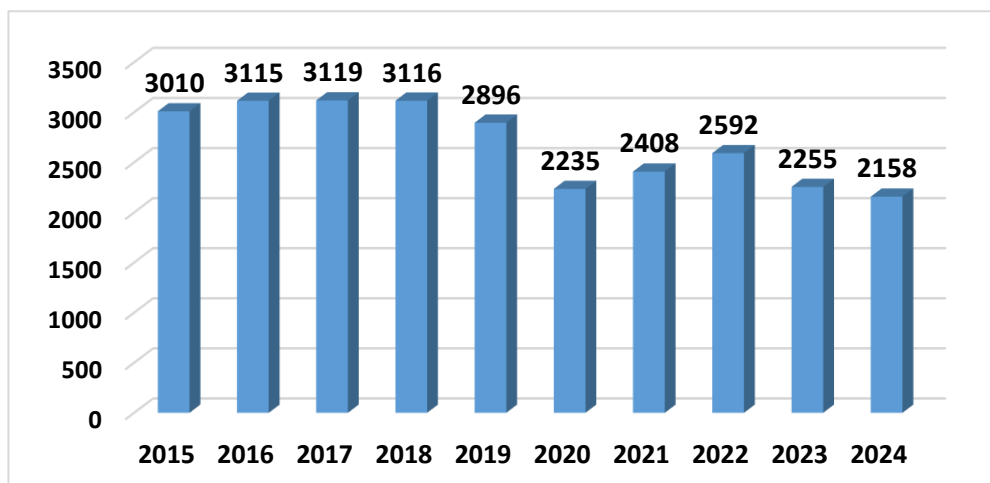

ROAD ACCIDENTAL DEATHS DURING-2024

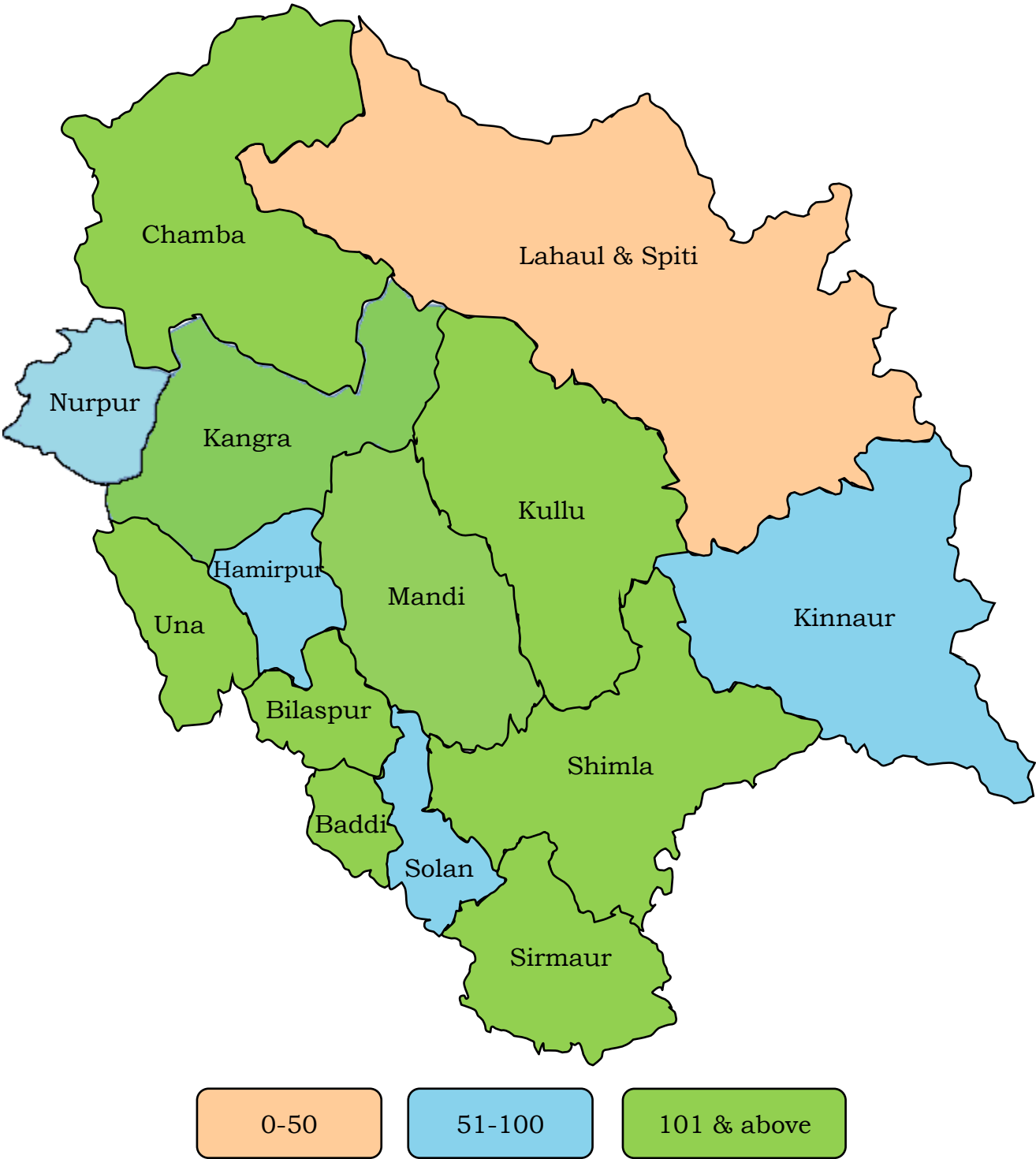

DISTRICT WISE TOTAL ACCIDENTS DURING 2024 (FATAL AND NON FATAL)

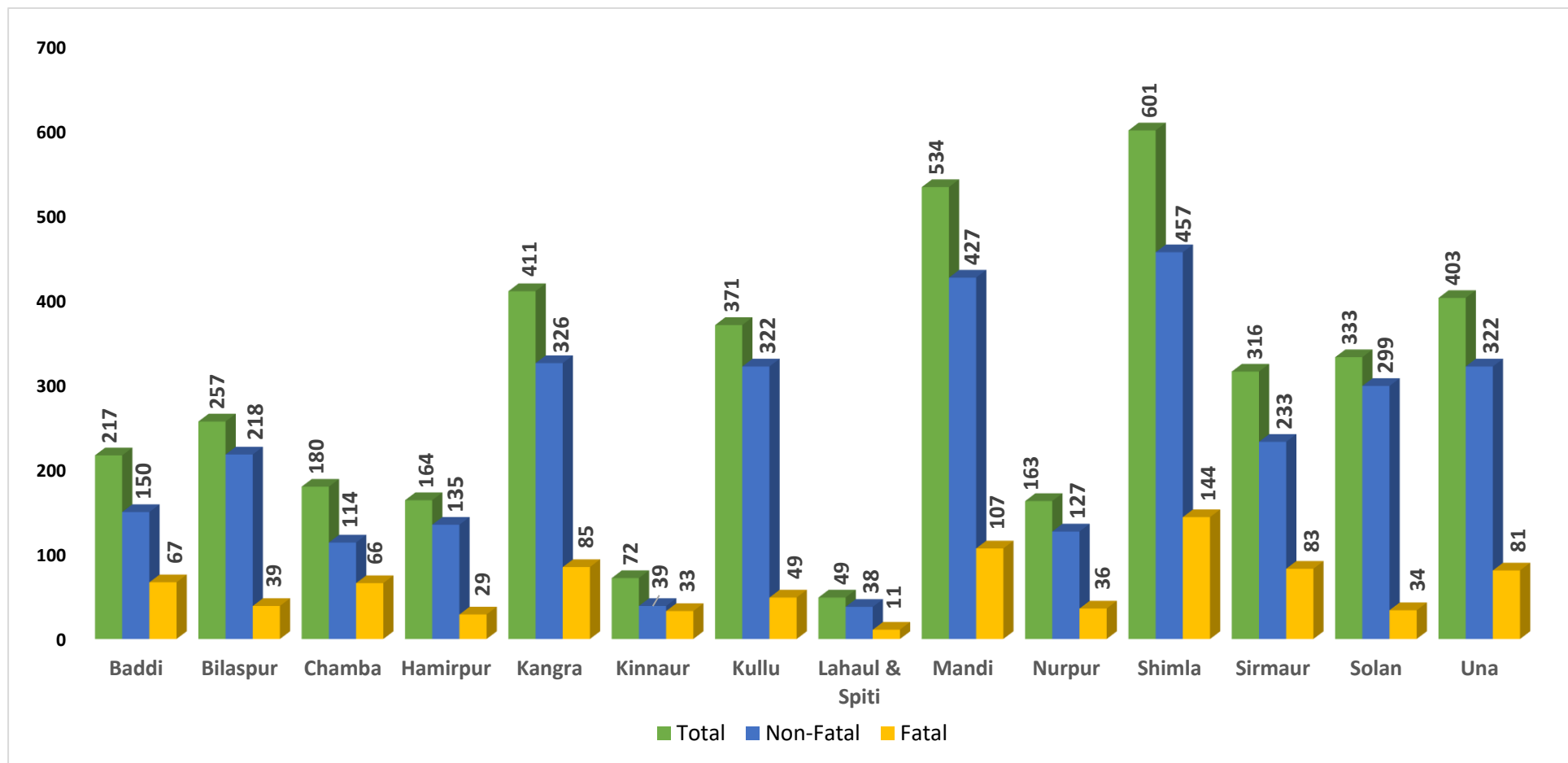
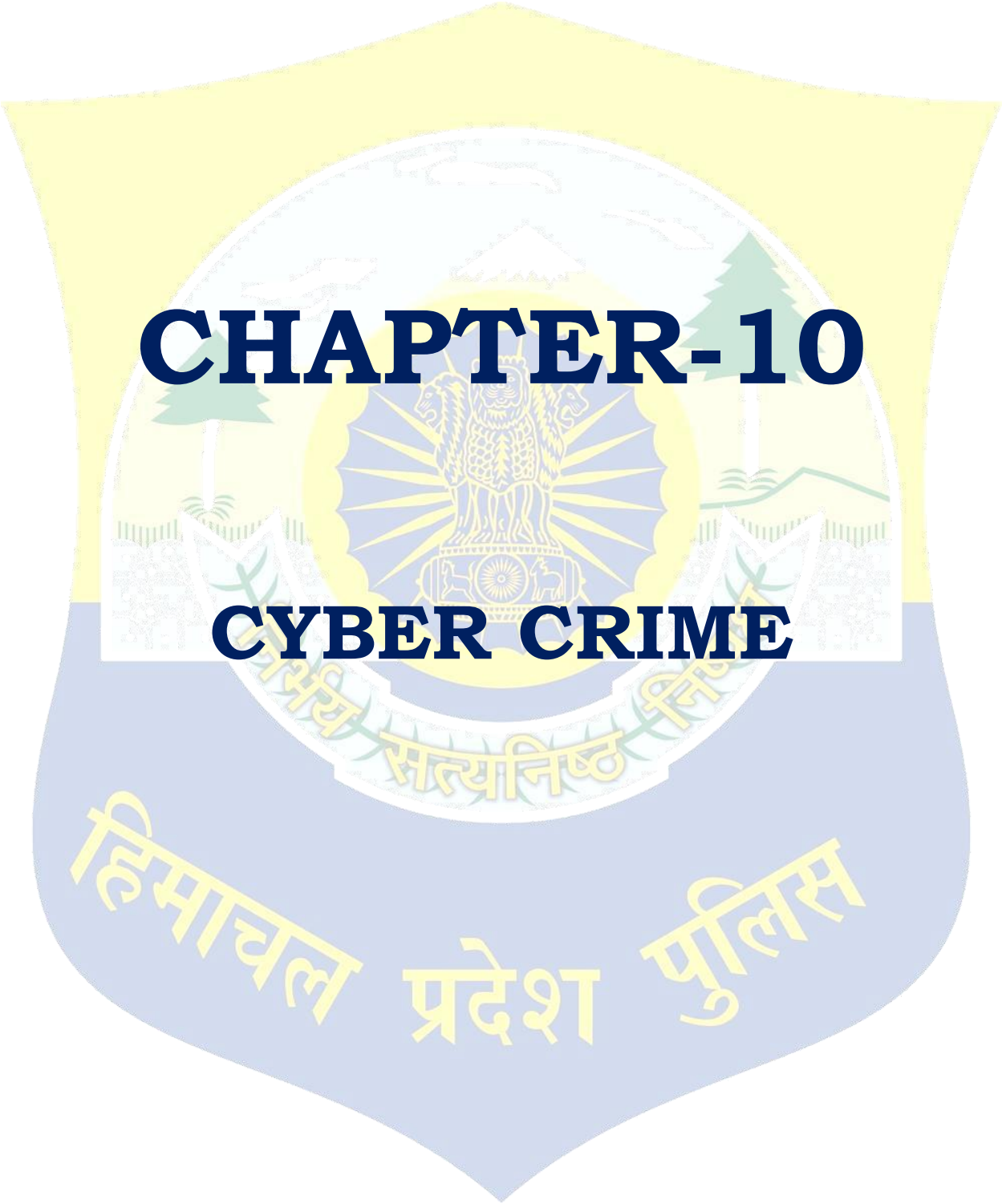

CYBER CRIME

10.1 Definition of Cyber Crime:

“Any illegal action in which a computer is a tool or object of crime, in other words, any crime, the means or purpose of which is to influence the function of computer.”

Computer and Telecommunications are the key areas of Cybercrimes. In Cybercrimes, Computer is used in the following two ways:-

- i.) Computer as a target
- ii.) Computer as a tool

The computer becomes a target of Cybercrime when, by way of hacking or intrusion, the criminals access a Computer with a motive to impair, damage or alter the system. The hacking can evolve into other substantive violations, for example, alteration of accounts, drawl of money etc. by cyber intrusion into a bank.

Computer becomes a tool for Cybercrime when it becomes a convenient method to commit

crimes affecting large scale networks and programmes such as introducing virus into large scale reservation or financial network or unauthorized obtaining classified information from data stored in defense and security computers.

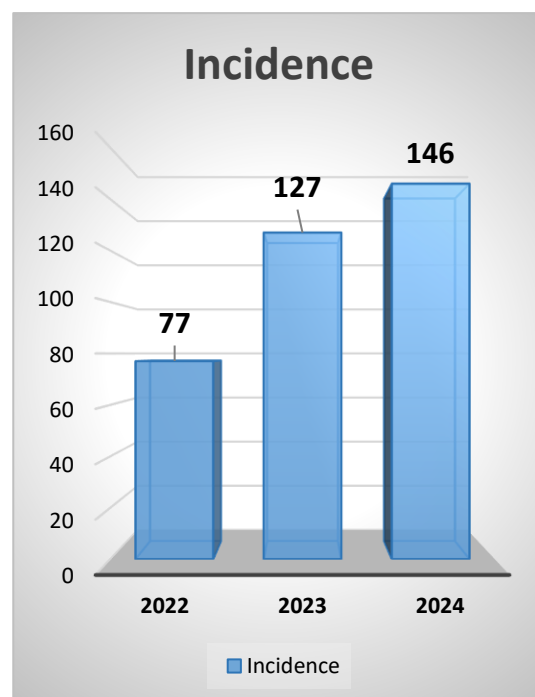
10.2 Classification of computer crimes:

The most accepted classification of computer crimes is as follows:

- (i) Computer related frauds.
- (ii) Computer forgery.
- (iii) Damage to computer data of computer programmes.
- (iv) Computer sabotage.
- (v) Unauthorized access.
- (vi) Unauthorized interception
- (vii) Unauthorized reproduction of a protected computer programmes.

- (viii) Unauthorized reproduction of a topography
- (ix) Alteration of computer data or computer programmes
- (x) Computer espionage
- (xi) Unauthorized use of a computer
- (xii) Unauthorized use of a protected Computer programmes.

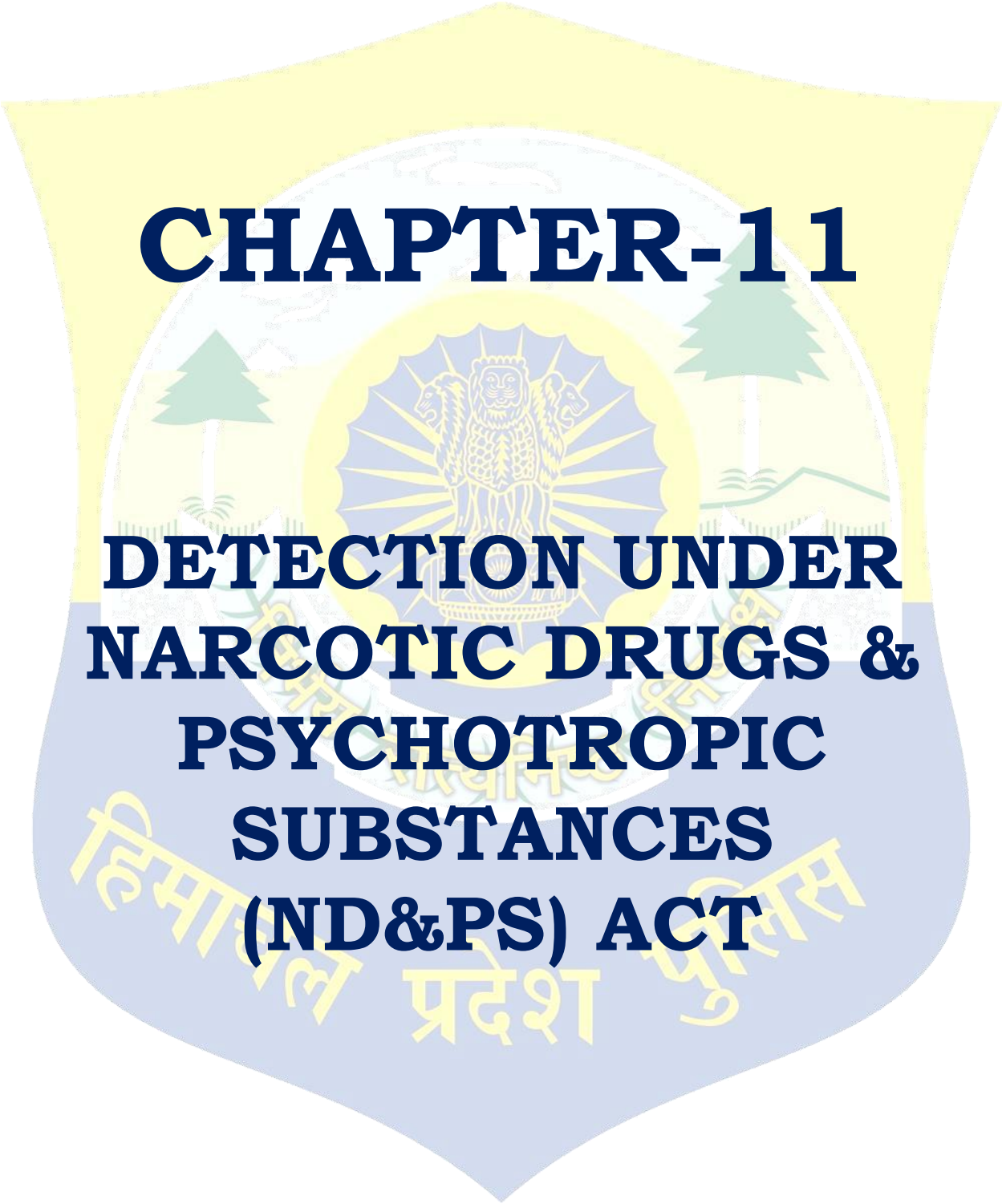

11.1 Drug Menace in Himachal Pradesh:-

Generally, the youth seem to be the target of this drug menace and its abuse. Drug abuse and the drug menace is the illicit, non-medical use of limited number of substances. Most of such drugs have the properties of altering the mental state of a being in ways that are considered by social norms and defined by statute to be inappropriate, undesirable, harmful threatening to the life of the user and to the society at large. Heroin, Cocaine, Opium, Charas, are some of the drugs abused.

In Himachal Pradesh, there are 17495 villages out of which in 402 villages of the following five Districts cannabis grows naturally. Analysis reveals that these five districts of the State have been identified by the drug traffickers for cultivation and transporting of Cannabis:

Narcotic Drugs:

The term 'narcotic' originally referred medically to any psychoactive compound with numbing or paralyzing properties. In large doses, such drugs can cause stupor (condition of insensibility), coma or convulsion. These would include:

- (i) Cannabis preparations like Bhang, Ganja and Charas.
- (ii) Opium and Opium alkaloids like morphine.
- (iii) Coca alkaloids like Cocaine.
- (iv) Synthetic narcotic drugs like Pethidine.

11.2 Psychotropic Drugs:

The Greek word Psycho means "Soul" and "Trope" means 'Turning', and drug having peculiar affinity for or effect on mind (Mind altering). The psychotropic drugs include:

- 1) Hallucinogens: There are both natural and synthetic Drugs like LSD (Lysergic acid Diethylamide) and tetrahydrocannabinols.

- 2) **Hypnotics:** Secobarbitone, Phenobarbitone.
- 3) **Stimulants:** These drugs induce and excitement in the body like amphetamines cocaine.
- 4) **Tranquillizers:** Methaqualone, Mandrax, etc.

11.3 Depressants: Under this class would fall drugs which are pain killers, analgesics, sedatives, like barbiturates and opiates.

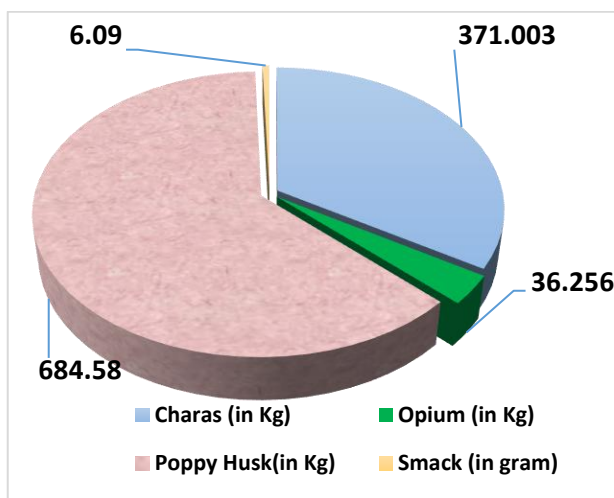

The drug-wise detection during the year 2024 according to the above mentioned table is presented in the **Chart 11.1**. The major detection of Charas (371.003 kgs.) has been made during the year 2024 followed by Poppy Husk (684.58 kgs), Ganja (33.71 kgs), Opium (36.256 kgs). Detection of other drugs i.e. Smack/ heroin etc. has also been made during the year 2023.

11.6 Detailed Analysis:

The incidence (2146) under the ND&PS Act showed an increase of 41.5% over year 2022. Cases under this Act contributed 33.10% against the total Local & Special Law reported cases during the year 2023. The highest number of cases (424) under this head were

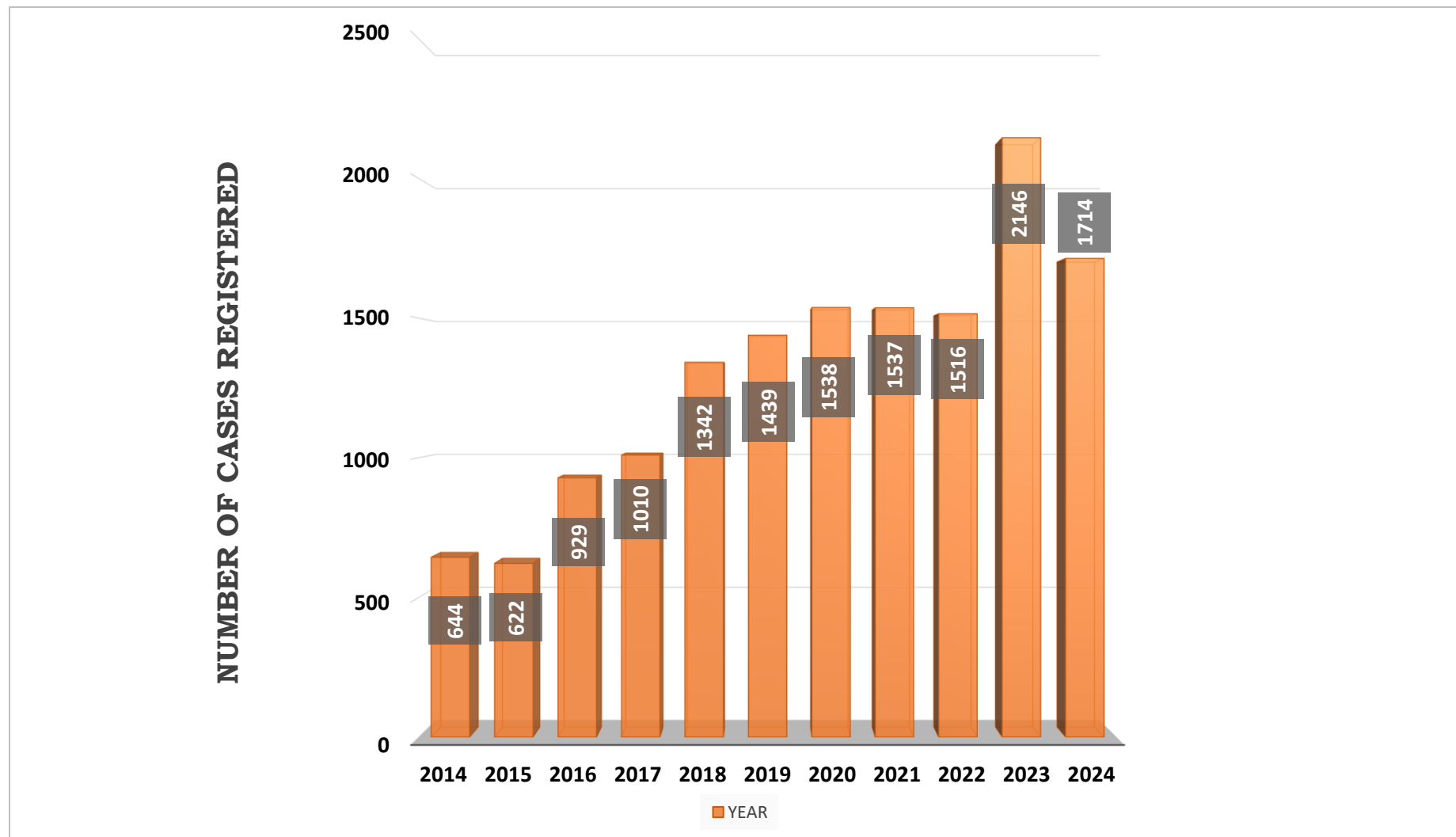
reported in District Shimla, followed by Kullu (242), Mandi (227), Bilaspur (208), Kangra (183), Una (174), Nurpur (133), Sirmaur (131), Chamba (117), Solan (108), Hamirpur (87), Baddi (82), Kinnaur (24), Lahaul & Spiti (6).

The main concentration on the cases registered under this Act remains in Shimla, Kullu, Bilaspur, Kangra and Mandi districts, with 59.83% of the total registered cases. The analysis reveals that the main source/area of drugs are districts Shimla, Mandi Bilaspur & Kullu. Further, carriers of this contraband are mostly agriculturists, laborers and poor people.

Study of age profile shows that mostly adults between 18-30 years of age are involved (51.07%). About 35.27% were in the age group of 30-45 years. Above 45 years were 13.16%.

The participation of children below 18 years is negligible (0.48%). Total 27 foreigners were involved in this activity. Previous 10 years (2014-2023) crime under this head is presented in **Chart-11.1**

POLICE STRENGTH, INFRASTRUCTURE AND EXPENDITURE

12.1 Police Strength:

The sanctioned strength of the Police personnel in Himachal Pradesh during the year 2024 was 20301, while actual strength is 16676. Total strength of (GOs) Class-I is 340, which includes 96 IPS and 196 HPS. Total Class-II GOs are 28. The strength of executive force is 18742, which includes 2359 NGOs Grade-I: Inspectors (321), Sub-Inspectors (789) Assistant Sub-Inspectors

(1249. The strength of Head Constables and Constables is 16383, (HCs-3115 and Const.-13268). The strength of ministerial staff (Class-III) is 348, Class-IV 561. The rank wise detailed sanctioned position and actual strength is presented in **Table 12.1**.

The strength of Women Police Inspector (26), Sub-Inspector (24), ASI (48), HC (90) and Constable (2341) is presented in **Table 12.2**.

2.2 Police Districts and Sub-divisions:

During the year 2024, there were 1 Zone, 3 Ranges (Northern, Southern & Central), 14 Districts (including two Police Districts at Baddi and Nurpur), 38 Police Sub-Divisions, 168 Police Stations (including 2 Police Stations of GRP and four Police Stations of CID. Detailed summary is given in [Table 12.2](#).

12.3 Police Budget:

The budget allocation for Police department in Himachal Pradesh for the last 3 years is depicted in [Table 12.3](#). During the budget year 2023-24, Himachal Pradesh Police Budget accounted for

2.74% of the total budget for Himachal Pradesh.

12.4 Equipment & Transport:

The district wise number and type of available equipment with Himachal Pradesh, during 2024 are presented in [Table 12.4](#). There are 77 HF sets, 1215 VHF sets, 2495 Walkie Talkies, Polnet 76, Satellite Phones 36 and total 3899 equipment are available with the Himachal Police Department.

At present the total available (fleet) strength in Himachal Pradesh Police is 988 the district wise details are given in [Table 12.5](#).

Arrest Rate:

Number of arrests per lakh of population.

Charge Sheet Rate:

Percentage of cases charge sheeted to cases in which investigations were completed.

Cognizable Offences:

A cognizable case means a case in which, a police officer may in accordance with the first schedule of the Code of Criminal Procedure 1973 or under any other Law for the time being in force, arrest without warrant.

Conviction Rate:

Percentage of cases that resulted in conviction to the number of cases in which trials were completed during a year.

Crime against Women:

Rape, Dowry deaths, molestation, Cruelty by husband and relatives, Sexual harassment, Kidnapping & abduction of women and girls, dowry Prohibition Act.

Crime Rate:

Incidence of crime per lakh of population.

Disposal Rate by Police:

Percentage of cases investigated and Final Report presented in court to total cases meant for investigation during the year.

Disposal Rate by Courts:

Percentage of cases disposed to total cases pending/trial during a year.

Indian Penal Code:

A Penal Code for India listing out the offences and their punishments (Act No. XLV of 1860).

Local Law:

A law applicable only to a particular state/part of India.

Offence:

The word offence means any act or omission made punishable by any law for the time being in force.

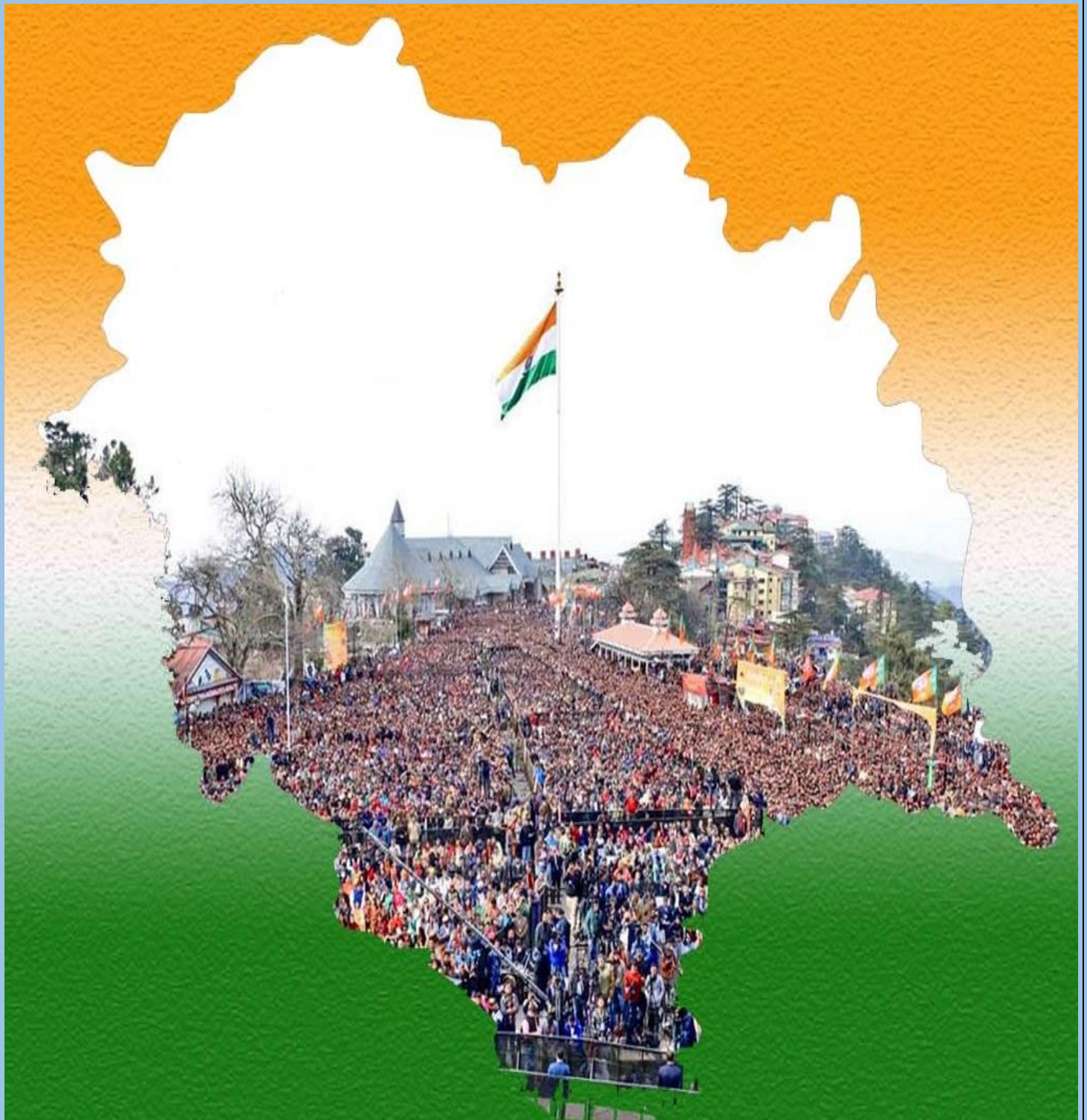
Property Offence:
