

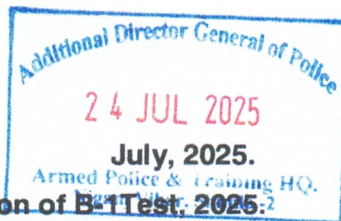

Sir,

This is in with reference to AP&T HQ's letter No. HOM. (PL) APT(TRG)C-1(B-1 Test)06/2024-14697-14732 dated 26.06.2025 and PHQ's order endst No.P-II(9)B-1 TEST/2024-25-17058-94 dated 17.07.2025, on the subject cited above.

2. You are hereby informed that the syllabus for the B-1 Test has been reviewed by the Police Headquarters. The updated syllabus now incorporates relevant sections of the three New Criminal Laws, Viz; **BNS**, **BNSS**, and **BSA** (including all amendments, whether enacted, with or without amendment), which shall form an integral part of the syllabus for the B-1 Test 2025 examination scheduled to be held on 21.09.2025. The final syllabus is enclosed herewith as **Annexure-A**.

3. Apart from the above, all are hereby directed as follows in letter & spirit:

- I. **Immediately bring into the notice of all eligible Police Constables** under your respective control about the updated syllabus, the cut-off dates relevant for willingness, and the Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) established for conducting the B-1 Test, 2025.
- II. **Obtain a written acknowledgement from each eligible Police Constable, who are to appear in the B-1 Test, 2025 as per the Annexure-B**, confirming that:
 - a) They have been informed of the updated syllabus,
 - b) They understand the examination process, including the cut-off dates,
 - c) They have read and understood the SOP related to the B-1 Test 2025.
 - d) They are aware about the final date of examination.

Further, to safeguard against any future disputes an acknowledgment from each eligible Constable shall be retained in your respective offices/Districts/Units for your own record please.

7. MEDICO LEGAL ASPECTS OF DEATH & INJURIES ARISING OUT OF TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS, DRUNKEN DRIVING.
8. SEXUAL OFFENCES - RAPE, CRIMINAL ABORTION AND INFANTICIDE.
9. MEDICO- LEGAL ASPECT OF POISONS, COMMONLY USED IN INDIA IN THE COMMISSION OF CRIME (LIVING SUBJECT AND DEAD BODIES).

Besides the above specific provisions, questions from the syllabus prescribed for Recruit Basic Training shall also form part of the B-1 Syllabus.
